County health office offers shots, family planning and a lot more

A number of health-related services are available free of charge at the Ruidoso Health Office, located in the Lincoln County Sub-station behind village hall.

According to Theresa Luna, public health nurse for Lincoln County, the health office offers services to anyone, not just those on a low income.

Services offered at the health office include a family planning services clinic, immunization and TB skin tests, a prenatal clinic, diabetic screening, pregnancy testing, sexually transmitted disease testing, a WIC program, and children's medical services.

The health office can even provide you with a certified copy of birth certificates of anyone born in Lincoln County. The office can provide you with the necessary paperwork to get a birth certificate from Santa Fe for births in other counties.

Various programs are available at the health office on certain days and all programs are available by appointment only.

Luna said the Family Planning Services Clinic is the only program in which there is a charge. She said this is because it is a federal pro-

gram, she would not say fees for the Family Planning Clinic are based on a person's annual and monthly income. She said any services the person receives are only charged at 10 to 50 percent of the actual costs.

The Family Planning Services Clinic is offered on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday by appointment only.

Luna said the immunization program is not designed for people who are going to travel abroad. She said the health office can provide people with shots for measles, mumps, rubella, DTP and polio.

The health office also offers flu shots and has special clinics during the year to immunize senior citizens.


One of the things Luna said the health office is trying to do is get infants and children, between 18 months and five years of age, immunized with the Haemophilus Influenza B Vaccination (HIB).

Luna said the HIB vaccination is a flu shot for children and is recommended particularly for youngsters in the high risk groups, that include native Americans, blacks, children who attend day-care facilities, have functional or

PROPOSED COURTHOUSE ANNEX

Annex could end courthouse crowding

There's a good chance Lincoln County will receive matching funds from the state for a courthouse annex.

The new structure will be a solution to a problem that has plagued the commission for several years. And it may be possible to build without raising new taxes, said county manager Nick Pappas.

The proposed structure would be about 4,800 square feet and will include a law library, jury room and space for records and microfiche storage.

District Judge Richard A. Parsons informed the commission at the time of his election the judicial district did not have adequate space for record storage, or for handling witnesses and visiting attorneys or judges. Dissatisfied with the commission's response, the judge ordered the commission to remove record boxes from the storage area because they were stacked so high they presented a hazard to employees.

The records were moved to the courtroom foyer in August 1989, and some still remain there.

The commission discussed several options, including a new annex, at commission meetings and assured Parsons every attempt will be made to find a solution.

Then the situation took an interesting turn. The district judge in Eddy County sued the county commission there to provide adequate space for record storage, witness rooms, and other necessities. District Judge Parsons presided over the case.

And the judge in Eddy County won his case. A Writ of Mandamus was filed that ordered the Eddy County Commission to make the necessary changes to provide for witness rooms, office space for the

court clerk and the judge, and for a law library.

"A legal precedent has been established in New Mexico whereby county commissions must abide by court order to provide basic needs of the courts," stated Lincoln County Commission Chairman Karon Z. Petty in a letter to the State Legislature.

Parsons presented his request to the county commission again quietly and matter-of-factly during a regular meeting of the commission January 8. Plans began to take form that a courthouse annex would be part of the county's legislative wish list.

Pappas and Commissioner Robert E. Hemphill presented the county's idea for an annex to the Taxation and Revenue Committee in Santa Fe Friday, February 2. The presentation included a proposed plan for an annex to be built on the southwest side of the courthouse complex.

The total cost would be about \$465,000, but to successfully receive assistance from the state on the project, the county will need to match state money dollar for dollar, said Pappas.

County money could come from juggling current tax levies, he said.

"This commission feels it does not want to raise taxes," said Pappas.

A new contract with Southwest Disposal for solid waste disposal could free up monies from the solid waste mill levy. It is possible also for the county to renew current levies, but change their purpose to fund an annex without having to enact additional levies.

The cost would be a one-time situation. Once the annex is built, if the legislature agrees to assist, the mill levies could be renewed for other purposes, or dropped.

"We need a landfill!" Downs mayor is determined on dump

Ruidoso Downs Mayor Jake Harris is not giving up in his efforts to get a landfill for the Village of Ruidoso Downs.

Harris, just back from Santa Fe, wants to know why the Environmental Improvement Division (EID) hasn't taken action on the village's application to place a landfill on property owned by Kenneth Nosker. Harris said Ruidoso Downs and the City of Albuquerque are the only two municipalities to go through the EID application process since the new environmental regulations were put in place last year.

Those new regs prompted many towns and counties to close existing landfills, and the closure of the Lincoln County/Ruidoso landfill is what prompted Harris and the Ruidoso Downs trustees to apply for a landfill permit.

Harris said Ruidoso Downs contracted with a well-qualified engineer and followed all the steps required by EID that are supposed to result in a landfill permit. He wants to know why EID hasn't taken any action.

Dave Bollschweiler of Bollschweiler Engineering in Las Cruces is working with the Village of Ruidoso Downs. Bollschweiler has written a letter on behalf of Ruidoso Downs. In that letter he reviews the events that left Ruidoso Downs without a place to dump its trash and led the Downs to apply for a landfill permit.

"On behalf of the Village of Ruidoso Downs, I have prepared an application to obtain a permit for a replacement landfill which includes a comprehensive set of engineering drawings and engineering reports containing detailed technical support material," said Bollschweiler in his letter. "This application has been reviewed by the NMEID on two occasions. Both of these reviews have resulted in requests for additional technical information. All of the requested technical information was submitted to the EID on December 11, 1989. Since that time, virtually no action has

been taken by the EID to evaluate and review this submittal," continued Bollschweiler.

He goes on to list concerns that include, in part:

"The current Lincoln County landfill appears to be operating in violation of the new rules and regulations of the NMEID. Should this landfill be ordered to close, the Village of Ruidoso Downs will have no feasible place to dispose of their solid waste.

Bollschweiler says Ruidoso Downs needs a landfill of its own, and adds that the site selected meets or exceeds all requirements.

Bollschweiler also says EID staff in Santa Fe indicated in August that Ruidoso Downs' application has a priority rating of three, right behind Albuquerque/Bernalillo and McKinley County. He says on January 16, EID staff indicated the Downs had a priority rating of seven or lower.

Meanwhile, between the first and second ratings, the village had drilled test holes, as requested by EID, that Bollschweiler says establish the groundwater depth to be 197 feet.

"The village has not been treated with fairness nor courtesy throughout their endeavors," says Bollschweiler.

He adds that at the January 16 meeting it was established that the special waste section does not have a licensed engineer on staff.

Bollschweiler lists other concerns about EID staffing. He and Harris are asking state lawmakers and others to intervene and help get Ruidoso Downs' application approved.

"The Village of Ruidoso Downs wants to have a new solid waste facility approved and operational by the start of the horse racing season which begins on Memorial Day weekend (May 26-28)," says Bollschweiler.

Harris, in a conversation Thursday, said he believes the EID doesn't have the technical expertise required by the new rules and regs. He said his village has followed all the requirements and he wants to know why EID hasn't issued his

landfill application.

Harris is convinced that the Village of Ruidoso Downs can save money with its own landfill. He said the \$100 a load being charged to dump garbage at the Fort Stanton (county) landfill is much too expensive.

That landfill, which was closed and then reopened on a temporary basis, is nearly full, according to information provided by Harris. He also questions the way it is being operated.

"It is extremely important that we have a landfill in Lincoln County," said Harris.

"Recycling and regionalizing is a good concept within reason. But solid waste is more than paper and table scraps, and that is basically what Ruidoso is transporting to Roswell."

Harris said there are all kinds of garbage items, including dead animals, that need to be economically disposed of near the source where they are generated.

"When we transport our waste out of the county some of our finances will go with it," he said, noting that Carrizozo, the only town in the county using an outside contractor, pays the highest garbage fees.

As Harris, his board of trustees and engineer are working to get a landfill on the Nosker land, neighbors of that land are working just as hard to put a stop to his plans. They say the area is visible from U.S. Highway 70 and will be an unsightly entrance to the Ruidoso area.

They also disagree with contentions by Harris and his engineer that the groundwater level is a safe distance from where the landfill will be located.

That group went to the Lincoln County Commission to put a stop to the landfill.

But Harris said the EID process requires the state to review an application and issue a permit, much as the Department of Motor Vehicles accepts applications for a drivers license or car registration and issues permits.

The landfill that Harris wants to

use, to be owned and operated by Nosker, is also the subject of a court case arising out of illegal dumping. When the Village of Ruidoso Downs didn't have a place to dispose of trash, Harris, with Nosker's permission, dumped municipal garbage on the site being proposed.

EID has ruled the dumping was illegal, and has cited Nosker and Harris into court for not allowing their agents on the land for an inspection. The case was further complicated when the Lincoln County Sheriff, with a search warrant, searched the land and found additional dumping.

Harris said he is working so hard to get his village a landfill that he is concerned that people won't realize all the other things that are going on in Ruidoso Downs.

He said over the past couple of years the town has paved more than seven miles of streets, finished a water improvement project and attracted six new businesses.

But trash is the one subject that just keeps coming back to haunt Ruidoso Downs. For instance, the agreement that Harris and the board reached to haul garbage for Ruidoso Downs Race Track is still a matter of debate. Some Ruidoso Downs citizens believe the agreement where the village hauls racetrack trash in exchange for a used truck is what put the sanitation budget in the red, and may lead to an increase in garbage pick-up rates.

Harris disagrees.

"With the help of the owners and management of the race track, i.e. a compactor truck and 150 three-cubic yard dumpsters, we have been able to upgrade our garbage collection system," said Harris, adding that the village has always had an obligation to collect the track's garbage.

Harris attended a meeting in Roswell last week on landfills, and can name off a long list of meetings he has attended this year on the subject.

"We need our own landfill," said Harris.

Titled the Equal Rights Gaming Act, SB448 would let the voters of Ruidoso and Angel Fire decide whether to allow in their towns the operation of any game of chance now conducted on Indian reservations.

Currently, high-stakes bingo, pull tabs and some video gambling machines are run on Indian reservations.

"This recognizes that there is a

certain amount of gambling on Indian reservations," said Aragon.

The New Mexico Coalition Against Gambling issued a fact sheet Saturday stating that the question of video gambling on reservations is one that will eventually require judicial interpretation.

But the effect of SB448 would be to take an illegal act and make it legal, said the coalition.

The bill drew bipartisan support

and opposition. Thirteen Democrats and five Republicans voted for the bill, while four Democrats and nine Republicans opposed it.

Sen. William Davis, R-Albuquerque, said the measure would bring tourist income to New Mexico in an experimental way.

"In this limited circumstance, where we are going to run a small experiment, I think this is a good piece of legislation," said Davis.

However, Sen. L. "Skip" Vernon,

R-Albuquerque, suggested that if the United States government ever legalizes gambling on Indian reservations, it would become legal in Ruidoso and Angel Fire.

Aragon agreed that would be the case but said he doubts such legalization would ever occur.

SB448 reverses the effect of the federal Indian Gambling Act, which lets Indian tribes conduct the same form of gambling on the reservation that is allowed in the host state.

Downs officers capture Jefferson

Ruidoso Downs Police captured Greg Jefferson in a rented trailer at 106 North Central in the Downs on Thursday.

Jefferson, 38, had been on the run since he was arrested in Ruidoso Downs last summer and charged with residential burglary. Jefferson, whose home is Ruidoso Downs, is now charged with escape from custody and with aggravated assault, as well as the burglary charge.

He eluded police about three weeks ago, and led officers from the Sheriff's Office and the Downs on a foot chase through the village.

"We got a Crimestoppers tip and then we hit the trailer house," said Ruidoso Downs Police Chief Skip Hazel. The trailer is a rental unit owned by Greg Baca.

Hazel said Jefferson's girlfriend was in the trailer with him when he was picked up.

Hazel, who had asked for information from the public in locating Jefferson, said the suspect threatened the arresting officers Thursday.

"I went nose to nose with him," said Hazel.

Hazel said Sergeant Bobby Angermiller and officers Frank Cooper and David Hightower of the Ruidoso Downs Police Department, State Police officer Jim Long and Lincoln County Sheriff's deputy Orlando Montes all took part in the capture.

Jefferson was booked into Lincoln County Jail, where he remained early today (Monday).

"On our part, we are through with all our hearings," he said.

He said the village is fortunate, so far, since none of its bills have died in committees. Potter said the Ruidoso bills still have to make it past the Senate and House Conference Committee before the village could see any money from the Legislature.

"Money is tight," said Potter. He said 1,222 bills were introduced in this legislative session asking for \$400 million in funds. The Legislature only has \$35 million.

"Municipalities are there daily," he said. On Monday last week, Potter said 73 of New Mexico's 100 municipalities were represented at the Legislature.

But, Potter believes the Village of Ruidoso could do quite well with funding during this legislative session because a lot of the legislators have shown a favorable attitude toward Ruidoso.

"The legislators are in tune with what is going on in Ruidoso," he

said. "A lot of people are really interested in Ruidoso."

Potter said one of the reasons he believes the village could do well in the legislature is because Ruidoso is trying to help itself.

He said every legislator has a financial impact statement which tells how much, as far as mill levies, gross receipts taxes and advertising money, a particular municipality or county already has in place. Potter says, since the village has all these things in place already and is using privatization instead of state funding for things like the golf course and hotel project, it is more likely to get things from the Legislature instead of a municipality which asks the Legislature for everything.

"We are, if not the highest, then among the highest taxed communities in the state," said Hall.

In addition to the three bills directly affecting Ruidoso, Potter said there are several bills the village is watching which effect all municipalities in New Mexico.

Number one among the bills the

village is watching is the Solid Waste Act. The Solid Waste Act, Senate Bill 2, passed the Senate but was amended in a final House bill. Potter said the bill would allow local governments to impose a gross receipts tax increase of one-sixteenth percent in order to comply with Environmental Improvement Division regulations on landfills.

Hall said the landfill bill that passed the Senate was amended about 125 times before it passed, and he predicted more amendments on the house side. He said the 1/16 mill should provide about \$12.5 million, but Hall said nobody knows how much it's going to cost to implement and enforce the new environmental regulations for landfills.

Hall said the Environmental Improvement Division is also asking for the right to implement a fee on landfills to generate funds for that state agency, the same one that came up with the expensive rules and regulations, to inspect and enforce those regulations.

"I don't think they're going to get it," said Hall, adding that he would be against it.

"I don't want them out there taxing people," he said.

Hall said legislators are getting a lot of calls and letters on an obscenity bill that is tabled in committee.

Potter said the other bills the village is watching involve retiree health care, the tort claims act, gasoline tax distribution and lease purchase.

Representative Hall introduced a bill that would trade the Wortley Hotel for the Montafio Store in old Lincoln, and that bill passed the House last Wednesday by 68-0.

"I've got to get it through the Senate now," said Hall. The bill would turn the Wortley over to Lincoln Heritage Trust, and the historic Montafio Store would become state property. Hall said the state is looking to get out of the hotel business.

This 30-day session is scheduled to end at noon Thursday.

Addressing system speeds up emergency response time

The county commission today (Monday) will hear a recommendation to initiate a rural addressing project paid for largely by public utilities.

There are many benefits to having a rural addressing system throughout Lincoln County, said county manager Nick Pappas.

One benefit is faster and more reliable response times in emer-

gency situations. Another is the cost to the county for establishing a rural addressing system will be minimal.

Pappas, along with county road supervisor Tommy Hall, chief appraiser Paul Baca, county EMS director Maggie Bohks, and financial administrator Mignon Sims met Wednesday with Larry Bigler of Conel to discuss the timing and implementation of a rural addressing system.

The telephone company would pay for the house numbers and signs for each residence and business in the county, at a cost to the utility of about \$7,000 to \$10,000, said Pappas.

The county would provide two or three county employees and the use of a pickup truck for the actual mapping necessary to establish a numbering and naming system. The county would also need to pass an ordinance requiring an address

sign on each home or business, said Pappas.

Once initiated, the entire process would take about one year to complete, he said.

A rural addressing system would enhance response times in emergency situations.

For example, if a fire or explosion occurred at a specific gas meter, the number on the meter would provide an exact location to

the gas company only, said Pappas.

In such a situation other emergency units would be needed, such as the fire department, and possibly the EMS. With a rural addressing system in place, the meter would be identified with a specific address available to all pertinent entities.

Pappas envisions a system in Lincoln County designed in such a way that once an address is provided, utility or emergency person-

nel would immediately know the county quadrant, the site was located in, whether it was on an east-west or north-south route, how far from a major intersection the residence was, and what side of the road it is located.

The county is working toward establishing emergency 911 lines throughout the county and a rural address is necessary for expediting such calls, said Pappas.

Search and rescue is on the lookout for new volunteers

Search and rescue is one of the most rewarding volunteer service organizations anyone can join, according to a news release provided by White Mountain Search and Rescue.

Seeing a mother reunited with her lost child is a moment one will never forget, says David H. Travis, an officer in White Mountain Search and Rescue (WMSAR).

That organization is seeking new members and invites anyone interested in helping other people, hiking and backpacking, horseback riding or climbing to join.

"If you would like to learn orienteering, person tracking, ICS management, survival, first aid, radio communications or horseback riding you should consider joining White Mountain Search and Rescue," invites Travis.

WMSAR is called on to search and, when needed, rescue lost hunters, hikers and persons who have wandered away from homes or rest homes. Searchers are also asked to help locate downed aircraft, sometimes by electronic direction finders, and, if necessary, evacuate the occupants.

Sometimes an aircraft is guarded by club members until the authorities have released it.

Occasionally WMSAR assists the U.S. Forest Service, State Forest Service, county and city fire departments, and area law enforcement agencies in traffic control and other services during emergencies.

WMSAR does not become involved in law enforcement of any kind.

Requirements for being an active member include attending a set number of meetings, mis-

sions and training programs each year. Volunteers are not expected to spend a great deal of money on equipment. The club has some equipment available.

Dues are \$12 a year which pays for a training manual and postage. If a volunteer uses personal vehicles the state will reimburse gas and oil.

Meetings are 7 p.m. the third Monday of each month at the Lincoln County Sub-Office behind Ruidoso Village Hall. For more information call 258-4006.

Travis, in a news release, listed some myths about search and rescue that he believes need to be corrected.

Myth: One needs a four wheel drive vehicle to belong to search and rescue.

Wrong! says Travis. WMSAR has two four-wheel drive vehicles for transportation and other suitable vehicles are available.

Myth: One has to be in good physical condition to be in search and rescue.

Wrong! WMSAR is an equal opportunity volunteer organization. Male, female, young, senior citizen, strong, the handicapped, and even trained dogs have a place in search and rescue, says Travis, adding people in wheelchairs have participated in search and rescue.

Travis says a need exists for good strong persons (male and female) for such operations as victim evacuation by litter. Many jobs which can be done by the average person. These jobs include maintaining trail and roadblocks, checking roads by vehicle, base camp operations, figuring coordinates on maps, logging, radio communications and events, cooking for the searchers and many others.

Apache Trails are off and running

Representatives of towns and villages who form the Apache Trail organization have a brochure roughed out and will apply for state tourism department residual funds to help finance it.

The Apache Trail group gathered at the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce at noon Thursday to further consolidate the fledgling, loose-knit organization.

Eventually, the group hopes to have Arrowhead signs marking points of interest along the trail which would include tourist attractions in Alamogordo, Tularosa, Cloudford, Bent, Mesalero, Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs, Hondo, Lincoln, Capitan, Carrizozo, Ocurra, Three Rivers and back to Tularosa. A loop within the loop would include on one side Nogal, Angus, Alto, and back to Ruidoso. Tourists could join the trail at any given point.

Jerry Watts, executive director of the chamber of commerce, suggested the group apply for some state tourist department funds which are up for reallocation. April 1 is the deadline.

Some \$20,000 will be sought to help pay for 100,000 or so brochures advertising the Apache Trail and its many historic and fun

attractions. Represented at the Thursday meeting were Alamogordo, Cloudford, Ruidoso, Hondo, Valley, Lincoln and Capitan.

Bob Hart, director of the Lincoln Heritage Trust, and Lisa Ratliff of the Space Center in Alamogordo, presented the rough draft of a proposed brochure.

Gary Wood of the Mountain Monthly in Cloudford will do art work for an area map that will go in the brochure.

The group previewed a set of color slides of area attractions. A number of four-color pictures will be in the brochure.

Watts complimented committee members.

People who volunteered did their thing. I think we are well on the way to seeing Apache Trail becoming a reality, he said.


Next meeting will be in Cloudford at the Civic Center at noon Thursday, March 8.

Hubbard art travels to Russia

U.S. Senator Pete Domenici (R-NM) has helped initiate an exciting cultural exchange between the Hubbard Museum of Ruidoso and the Soviet Union.

According to a news release from Domenici's office, the Hubbard Museum will premier its Duhney Collection in the Soviet Union this fall.

Tuesday night, February 6, Domenici attended a Washington reception to welcome Tair Salakov, the First Secretary of the Artists Union of the Soviet Union, and four other members of a delegation from the Soviet Union. The delegation was in Washington for the announcement of the 1990 Soviet Premier of the Hubbard Art Award for Excellence.

"I'm pleased that an exciting cultural exchange will be taking place later this year between the Hubbard Museum and the Artists Union in the Soviet Union. Frankly, I believe that this exchange will enhance the more open relationship that is developing between our two countries. This is a most appropriate time for such an exchange to take place, and I'm certain that the program will prove educational for all those involved."

The staff of the museum contacted Domenici after they experienced difficulty making contacts in the Soviet Union to set up the exchange. On the museum's behalf, the senator contacted the American Embassy in Moscow and the Ministry of Culture in the Soviet Union.

The museum has signed a letter of intent with the Artists Union to host an exhibition from the Hubbard Museum's collection in the fall of this year.

"The exchange then allows members of the Artists Union to compete for the Hubbard Art Award for Excellence, a \$250,000 prize that is awarded to one artist."

"I am proud to note that there are eight New Mexico artists in a field of 30 competing for this prestigious award," Domenici added.

Hubbard Museum director John V. Hall visited Moscow earlier this year to make arrangements for the Russian tour. He then traveled to Germany where he set the stage for the art to be displayed in Germany.

The Hubbard Art Award for Excellence will be presented in June during a weekend of festivities at the Hubbard Museum located in the Turf Club at Ruidoso Downs Race Track.

Hall announced recently that William Acheff, Glenna Goodacre, Woody Gwyn, Clark Hulins, Henriette Wyeth Hurd, Michael Hurd, Wilson Hurley, Gary Niblett, Jean Parrish and Gordon Snidow—all New Mexico artists—have accepted nominations for the award for realistic art.

"These New Mexico artists, true American masters, are among those notables," said Tina Hall, assistant to the museum director.

scored 13 points in the contest.



On Saturday night, the Lady Warriors faced a much taller and quicker Oñate team.

With 6-foot-2-inch Tera Salopek at center and 6-foot Gwynne Dawdy, Oñate jumped out to a quick 10-0 lead. The Lady Warriors committed a number of turnovers on passes which helped the Knights build on their lead.

Ruidoso finally got on the scoreboard at the 1:40 mark when junior guard Jennifer Parker hit a jumper from the left side. The Warriors managed to cut the lead at the end of the quarter to eight, thanks to two free throws and a good inside basket by Comanche. The Lady Warriors only put up five shots in the entire first quarter.

The Lady Warriors hung with the taller Knights through most of the second quarter. When Miranda hit two free throws with 2:25 left, the Knights lead was whittled to

Although the Warriors didn't bring home a win from state-ranked Oñate, Hood said the team played some good basketball.


The final score was 85-66. "All in all I was quite pleased with our effort Saturday night," said Hood. "We got good shots, we just didn't convert on them."

The Warriors scored 13 points to Oñate's 24 in the first quarter, and were faced with a 34-47 score at intermission.


"The third quarter was really our best," said Hood, whose defense held the fast-moving Oñate Knights to 14 points during that segment.

Warriors participate in NMMI tourney

The Ruidoso Wrestling team participated in the New Mexico Military Institute tourney this weekend.

According to Warrior Coach Gerald Ames, the Warriors started the day with only nine of the 13 weight classes filled and three of the team's senior wrestlers absent taking the ACT test.

"We did very well with a very young team," Ames said.

The Warrior team was made up of only one senior, four juniors and four freshmen.

Fernando Lopez led the Warriors in the smaller weight categories. Lopez, wrestling in the 119-pound weight class, got off to a quick start, pinning Eric Smith of Roswell at the 2:45 second mark of the first period. He finished fourth in the weight class, with two wins and two losses on the day.

Ames said freshman Chris Carusona lost two matches, but gained valuable varsity mat time.

Junior Mario Portillo finished first in the 140-pound weight class. He defeated James Pana of Deming

in a close and exciting match.

This is Portillo's first tournament championship and he takes over the team leadership with 20 wins and 10 losses. He also leads the team with 37 takedowns and 14 pins for the season.

His brother, freshman Pancho Portillo, wrestled in three matches and won his first varsity match.

Freshman Lee Nanz also won his first varsity match in the 152-pound weight class. For the day, Nanz was 1-2 in his matches.

Junior David Stephenson had his best finish of the season, placing second in the 160-pound weight class. For the day, Stephenson was 2-1 in his matches.

Ames said Stephenson started the season off poorly, losing nine out of his first 11 matches. But, during January and February, Stephenson has won 10 matches and lost 5 matches, bringing his season record up to 12 wins and 14 losses.

Ames said junior Albert Florez lost two matches in the 171-pound weight class, but wrestled well.

Able Montelongo took second place in the 189-pound weight

class, losing in the championship to Abel Leal of NMML. This was Montelongo's highest finish and extended his record to 6-5.

Junior heavyweight Shawn Mendoza wrestled well, according to Ames. Mendoza's only loss was to Roswell's Charles Cunningham. Mendoza has improved his record to nine wins and four losses.

"He is really exciting to watch," Ames said.

The Warrior team finished last in the tournament with 69 points. Carlsbad won the tournament with 168 points, Tucumcari edged Deming by one point for second place.

Next up for the Warrior wrestling team will be the district tournament, next Saturday at NMML. Along with the Warriors, participating in the tournament will be Silver City, Bayard Cobre, Deming, NMML, Goddard, Oñate, and the New Mexico School for the Visually Handicapped.

The top four finishers in the district tournament qualify for the state tournament on February 23-24 at Belen High School.

Lincoln's Birthday
Abraham Lincoln, our sixteenth president, was born in a log cabin on a farm in Kentucky February 12, 1809. It has been said that more words of praise have been written about Abraham Lincoln than about any mortal man.

Yet praise was the least of his wishes. He became the living embodiment of the American dream by rising from humble origin and poverty to become one of the most beloved men of all time.

At 6 feet 4 inches, he was, second to George Washington, our tallest president. He was also a giant in physical strength, being the champion wrestler of his part of the country. Still greater than his physical strength were his strength of character, his high intelligence and, most of all, his abiding sense of compassion and spiritual insight.

With hardly any formal schooling he still became a master of the English language. His Gettysburg address is considered one of the great orations of all time.

From early childhood Lincoln surely somehow knew, deep in his soul, of his great destiny, and had a strong yearning for knowledge. He would walk miles to borrow a book, and soon had read all books in his wide neighborhood. His favorite book was The Bible.

His honesty was legendary and led to his nickname: "Honest Abe."

The central spirit of his tender heart beat with kindness for all God's creatures. His friends told of the time he was riding horseback through the country in his Sunday clothes and saw a baby bird fallen from its nest. Dismounting, he waded in the mud and put the bird back in its nest.

The state of New Mexico came very close to being named "Lincoln." However, early Lincoln County was the largest in the United States, equal in area to the state of Indiana and taking in seven present-day counties.

We live in a beloved spot of the original county. Let us be thankful for this, and let us say a prayer of



thanks to God for Honest Abe Lincoln.

"That's over a mile of cruising,"



commented a self-described "cruiser."



Bundick promoted, Shaw heads EDC

Ruidoso News Business Editor Don Shaw, vice president and manager of Pioneer Savings and Trust in Ruidoso, will head up the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County until next January 1.

Carroll "Buddy" Bundick, who has been president and chairman of the board of the organization, has been promoted and transferred by his company to Silver City.

Bundick will become division manager of Texas-New Mexico Power Co. on June 1. He currently is division manager-elect. He has headed the Ruidoso office of Texas-New Mexico Power Co. for a number of years and has lived in Ruidoso for 17 years.

Bundick submitted his resignation at a Thursday night board of directors meeting at the EDCLC headquarters in the Ruidoso Finan-

cial Center. Shaw was elected by acclamation after being nominated by board member Cindy Lynch.

"I regret having to do this. I have been with this organization since the beginning," said Bundick. "We really regret losing someone of Buddy's caliber," Shaw said.

A vacancy on the executive board will be filled by the new president.

George Puckett, executive director of the EDCLC, reported that he has been in Santa Fe working on two items. One is to try and get matching funds for training employees of businesses.

Another matter of interest is a revolving loan fund for businesses.

Another objective is to try to get New-Mexicans to see that the turnover in the tourism department each change of administration is bad for New Mexico.

Puckett said several trade shows are on the agenda for this year, that he has spent some time with a Business Quarter ad campaign.

"Southern California is the target area," Puckett said. He said electronics and possibly furniture manufacturing are types of businesses and industry needed in Lincoln County. He said EDCLC will be calling on several industries in the Los Angeles area.

Shaw commented that EDCLC is not the least bit interested in any industries or businesses which would have an adverse effect on the environment.

Only clean industry will be considered, this is the policy of EDCLC, Shaw said.

Puckett outlined a plan whereby a private corporation would be formed in Business Quarter territory to provide venture capital. Stock would be sold to build a fund

to assist (through a type of merger) industries needing financial help.

Investments probably would be in the form of an acquisition of a privately held corporation through what is termed a reverse merger.

The resulting corporation would be publically traded and would have the benefit of expansion capital.

The capital would come from a public offering of stock.

Shaw asked that the staff prepare a report on "all of the accomplishments" of EDCLC to present to the county commission when budget time rolls around.

Meanwhile, shareholders will be encouraged to talk with commissioners on possible additional support for EDCLC at the county level.

In the meantime, shareholders will be given a chance for additional financial support.

Gourd dancing will kick off the powwow from 5-7 p.m. Friday, with the grand entry, featuring inter-tribal dancing, at 7 p.m. Friday.

Gourd dancing is scheduled from 12:30-5 p.m. Saturday, and again from 6-7 p.m. Saturday, with the grand entry at 7 p.m.

According to a news release, the St. Valentine's Day Memorial Powwow is an observance to recognize and memorialize Indian people, those living as well as those who have died.

"Loved ones cannot be forgotten, they may be here with us on this beautiful and precious earth or they may have left us to dance and sing with the Great Spirit," reads the powwow announcement.

"Be it a dear friend, relative, husband, wife, chil-

dren and those veterans who fought and lost their lives so that we Indian people can live in this free country; we, Indian people are a great family to the Great Spirit," continues the announcement.

"So come dance with us in Mescalero on this weekend of good friendship and love toward another," invite the powwow planners.

Weston Weller of the Caddo Tribe in Tulsa, Oklahoma, will be the head man dancer; and Helen Little of Mescalero, a member of Santa Domingo Pueblo, will be the head lady dancer.

Tim Teyah of Dallas, Texas, a member of the Comanche Tribe and the Comanche Indian Veterans Association, will be the head gourd dancer; and Nipper Tiddard of Apache, Oklahoma, a Comanche Tribe member, will be the master of ceremonies.

anatomic asplenia, such as sickle cell disease or splenectomy; or have malignancies associated with immunosuppression.

The immunization and TB skin test program is only available on Monday from 8:30 until 11 a.m.

The Prenatal Clinic is for pregnant women who are unable to get services through a private physician. Luna said the program is especially targeted towards pregnant teenagers. She said often teenagers who are pregnant do not receive much medical care and attention during the first few months they are pregnant.

"This is one of our pet projects," Luna said.

The Prenatal Clinic is offered on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday by appointment only. Pregnancy testing is offered at the health office on Monday and Thursday by

appointment only, from 8 until 8:30 a.m.

"The diabetic screening is for anyone who has a history of diabetes in their family or wants to find out if they are in a high risk group," Luna said.

The diabetic screening program is offered on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday, by appointment only.

Luna said the health office offers confidential testing for anyone who believes they might have a sexually transmitted disease. She said the clinic also offers testing for HIV, which is the virus responsible for AIDS.

The children's medical service is for children whose parents think they might have a medical problem, such as hearing difficulty, diabetes or even trouble walking. Luna said the health office will try and test the child and if there is a problem will recommend a physician to the

parents.

The children's medical service is on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday, by appointment only.

Luna said one of the things she has to stress to people is there is no doctor available at the health office. Dr. Arlene Brown does come in on a part-time basis for the Family Planning and the Prenatal clinics.

She said all testing is done right in the health office and the results of any test are available to the patient within a few minutes.

The Ruidoso Health Office has been open since 1984, and is a state funded office. For the past two years, Luna has been the only public health nurse in Lincoln County. She said there is a part-time position open for a registered nurse in the Ruidoso office. As it is, Luna divides her time between the Ruidoso office and the Lincoln County Health Office in Carrizozo.

Luna said one month she saw

around 650 people in the health office. She said, because of the number of people the office serves, it is important for people to make an appointment and to try and stick with the appointment.

"I try and get people in as soon as they call," she said.

The Ruidoso Health Office is open from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday. It is located in the Lincoln County Sub-station behind the Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center. People wishing to make an appointment with the health office should call 258-3252, not the sub-station number.

Luna said she believes the health office has helped a lot of people, but she also believes there is a lot more to do.

"I really think we have accomplished a lot, but I also feel we have not accomplished enough," Luna said.

She said the number of teenage pregnancies shows her they have not accomplished as much as they would have liked.

One of the other programs available through the health office is the WIC program. WIC stands for Women, Infants and Children.

According to nutritionist Sharon Miller, the national nutrition program is to help mothers have healthier pregnancies, healthy babies, and healthy children through better nutrition.

"We try to help them have healthier babies and keep the children they have healthy," Miller said.

Miller said the WIC program is for pregnant women, breast-feeding women and infants up to age three.

The WIC applicant must have an income which falls at or below 185 percent of the Federal poverty level.

The WIC program will provide

formula for an infant for one year. The child is evaluated in the program every six months. In addition to formula, the WIC program will also provide food to increase the nutrients of a mother and her family. Items it will provide are: milk, cheese, eggs, beans, cereal, fruit juice and baby formula.

Anyone who qualifies for the program should contact Miller at the Ruidoso Health Office. The number is 258-3252.

The WIC office is open on Monday and Thursday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. It is open on the second and fourth Tuesday of the month and on Fridays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

On Wednesdays, the WIC office is at the Mescalero Clinic from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. It is in Carrizozo at the Lincoln County Health Office

on the first and third Tuesday of every month from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

EDITORIAL

It's no accident that National Child Passenger Safety Awareness Week is during Valentine's week, the time when our thoughts turn toward ways to show our loved ones how much we care.

Buckle up for love is the theme for this year's observance. We're reminded that making sure the people we love use safety seats and safety belts is an act of love as it will safeguard their lives and limbs.

Governor Garrey Carruthers has proclaimed Child Passenger Safety Awareness Week in New Mexico, too; and urges New Mexicans to routinely use child safety seats and safety belts for youthful passengers to provide them with the best protection from motor vehicle crashes.

In 1989, 24 children under the age of 11 were killed in motor vehicle crashes in New Mexico, and of that number only three were found in child seats or safety belts. Transportation Secretary Dewey Lonsberry said most of the other 21 killed might have been saved if child seats or safety belts were used. Across the U.S. several hundred children are killed in accidents each year whose lives might have been saved if safety equipment had been used.

Every child has the right to be as safe as possible in a car, and we adults are responsible for protecting their lives. Buckling up takes just a moment, but that minute could be the most important of some child's life.

A seatbelt could save your life, too; and because you're somebody's Valentine, buckle up.—fj

EDITOR:
"Not In My Backyard" (NIMBY), "Get Out Of My Backyard" (GOOMBY), "Locally Undesirable Land Use" (LULU), "Not In My Election Year" (NIMEY). These acronyms, taken from Newsweek, may very well summarize the many problems we are facing the great landfill dilemma of Lincoln County. Recently The Ruidoso News has reported a number of possible solutions to our landfill problem, the most popular of which seems to be the joint venture with Roswell for a regional landfill. Perhaps the regional landfill will be the solution of choice, or the choice will fall to a better idea not yet conceived. I, like most other Lincoln County residents, hope for the solution that will best suit our long-term needs with the most cost effectiveness and convenience, and with the least environmental impact. I certainly don't envy the conscientious, hard-working individuals who are making these decisions. Therefore I will not argue for or against the proposed sites thus far. It's "not in my backyard"—YET.

Regardless of the landfill location chosen, recycling is a must. Perhaps it would be easier to adapt if we thought of it simply as sorting

and reprocessing. Presently the percentage of our trash that is reprocessed into new products is very low.

To increase this percentage, I see three initial steps that should be taken. First, use the local recycling service (H & H Enterprises) to its fullest capabilities, and in return receive payment for your efforts. Secondly, look for alternatives to "convenient" disposable items that are not yet regionally recyclable (styrofoam, plastic grocery bags, and disposable diapers). I realize that we cannot always say "no," but we can at least say "not so much." Even using things twice, such as jelly jars or coffee cans, will help decrease the tonnage of trash that we must eventually find a home for. Thirdly, properly directed government intervention (although it sounds scary to me) has the potential to be very effective in saving our tax dollars that will inevitably be tossed into the dump.

Our village government sits in the driver's seat. For instance, by using only recycled paper at the village, and by specifying the use of recycled products to our contracted architects and builders in developing village funded projects, our vil-

lage can set a strong example and send a strong message to both the private and public sector throughout the state.

Consider the following implementations of recycled material:

—glassfalt to pave our new jogging trail that is proposed for the Sierra Blanca Resort

—high strength fence posts and boat docks at Grindstone Dam made from plastic (according to Popular Science, ordinary milk cartons are used.)

—decorative cushioned tile for the lobbies in our buildings made from recycled tires.

—compost or mulch made from our daily organic matter (20% of which is presently going into our dump). By recycling our pine needles, tree trimmings, cut grass, etc., we will significantly reduce ongoing erosion while naturally fertilizing and enhancing the great outdoors that attract so many visitors to Lincoln County.

We live in a truly unique and beautiful corner of the world. The need is here, the knowledge is here. Let's take the lead by ensuring that this natural beauty is here for centuries to come.






