## Just one more thing—Ruidoso Downs leaders call one last meeting Friday

It's not over until the fat lady sings and apparently she hadn't even taken the stage yet Friday in Ruidoso Downs.

Just two days away from leaving office, the lame duck mayor and four trustees had a quick special meeting to take care of some last minute business.

A new mayor, five new trustees and one re-elected trustee will take office today in the Downs, but Mayor Jake Harris and

trustees Travis Hicks, LeVerne Cole, Alice Allison and Tony Parker conducted a special meeting at 5 p.m. Friday, to dedicate a street and approve payment on an engineering bill.

Hicks, Cole and Parker were unsuccessful candidates for another term on the board. Allison will serve for two more years. Trustee Wilma Webb, the only incumbent re-elected in Ruidoso Downs, was absent from what was probably the last meeting of the present board.

Mayor Harris and the four trustees, being a 19-hour horse that included the incoming mayor and most of the incoming trustees, made quick work of the short agenda. Ruidoso Downs village attorney Richard Hawthorne, assistant district attorney Scott Key, Two 9th Judicial District investigator Leonardo Vega and Ruidoso Downs Police Chief Skip Hazel were also on hand for the special meeting.

Even who has been conducting an investigation of the operations involving Ruidoso

Downs village operations didn't speak during the meeting. He and Hawthorne conferred privately before the meeting began.

Harris ignored questions and comment from the audience until the board acted on the two agenda items, and then he opened the floor for comments and he and the board listened to complaints from newly-elected officials about the last four meetings.

The board, in a unanimous vote, agreed to dedicate Parker Street to Parker.

Followed by Trustee Parker, who during previous meetings had been included on the tax roll. Parker, during a meeting, had said he didn't know his name was on the tax rolls since he is a Ruidoso Downs resident.

The village seems to have been dedicated to its own service, said Harris.

## Grizzlies take two in state

The Carrizozo Grizzlies finished a fabulous season in Albuquerque as the State Class A runners up for 1990.

Carrizozo won a close game Saturday to Springer 50-48 in the championship match for the Class A title.

The Grizzlies carried the championship to the final game by first beating Coronado Wednesday, and Cliff Thursday in overtime.

The 62-58 victory for Carrizozo over Cliff came from the sure free throw shooting of Abe Padilla, whose two free throws off an intentional foul with eight seconds left in overtime gave the Grizzlies the win.

Padilla's score on an off-balance shot with three seconds left in regulation time tied the game at 55-55, and sent the game into overtime.

The Grizzlies scored six of seven free throws during the overtime period to polish off a 22 of 26 performance at the line.

Padilla hit the decisive free throw after Cliff sophomore Josh Tye missed the front end of a one-and-one free throw situation with 20 seconds left and the Cowboys down 59-58.

Carrizozo rebounded the miss and Padilla was surrounded by Cliff defenders and fouled. The officials ruled the foul intentional, awarded Padilla two free throws and the Grizzlies the ensuing possession.

Grizzly guard Mike Chavez then added a final free throw with four seconds left.

Chavez was high scorer in the Cliff game with 18 points. Chris Schlarb had 17, and Padilla 14.

## Apache Trails are taking off

A trip along Apache Trails will someday take visitors on a historical journey with visits to the haunts of Billy the Kid and Smokey the Bear. The trails will showcase recreation that varies from skiing to fishing and horse racing, as well as the sights and scenes of the Mescalero Apache Indian Reservation, Cloudcroft, Tularosa and on to Alamogordo.

A format for a brochure advertising the Apache Trails was approved at a meeting Thursday noon at the Cloudcroft Civic Center.

Bob Hart of the Lincoln County Heritage Trust in Lincoln heads up a brochure committee. Also, Gary Wood, Cloudcroft publisher, has shaped up an illustrated map of the Apache Trail routes which will be a part of the brochure.

The Apache Trail plan is for markers to denote the paths of the trails so that tourists can follow historic paths through Otero and Lincoln counties. The brochure would explain what attractions are to be seen along the trails. The brochures would be available at chambers of commerce along the trails and elsewhere, including restaurants, service stations, and such.


Wendell Chino, president of the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe, is a prime mover of the Apache Trail idea. Mescalero is on the trail. The idea is to keep tourists in the area one or two more days by pointing out attractions which may otherwise be overlooked.

By the next meeting of the Apache Trail group on April 11 at the Space Center in Alamogordo, a logo featuring an arrowhead with "Apache Trail" superimposed will be designed for inspection. Jerry Watts, executive director of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, is in charge of this project.

Also, Watts told **The Ruidoso News**, the group will have an idea whether or not it was successful in obtaining "reverting funds" in the amount of \$11,000 from the New Mexico Tourism Department. The \$11,000 would be matching funds.

The Apache Trails route includes Alamogordo, Cloudcroft, Mescalero, Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs, San Patricio, Hondo, Lincoln, Capitan Carrizozo and Tularosa.

Also points along SR37 and SR48 would be secondary stops.

## Mayor Alonso takes on new duties

Victor Alonso has been on the go since he won Tuesday's mayoral election in an overwhelming and convincing fashion.

For the 44-year-old Alonso, the realization he was elected the next mayor of Ruidoso was finally sunk in.

"I can tell you I'm working very hard with lots of meetings, lots of discussions and lots of thinking, so it has definitely sunk in," Alonso said. In the midst of all this, he is still running his restaurant.

He doesn't have long to wait before he is officially sworn in as mayor Alonso and the three new councillors, Barbara Duff, Bill Karn and Ron Andrews, will all be sworn into office in a special organizational meeting of the village council at 7 p.m. tonight (Monday) at Village Hall.

The mayor and the village council will have a number of difficult issues facing them in the coming years. Issues like landfills, recycling, the civic center, airline service and the village budget will all have to be addressed in the next four years.

Having served on the village council before and being familiar with the workings of local government, Alonso is already at work on many of these issues.

On landfills, Alonso said he has been in contact with the new administration in Ruidoso Downs and officials at the county level. He said following Tuesday's election, their is a view

toward working together among the three entities.

Alonso said he will call for a public meeting to gain information on the recently signed Senate Bill 2, and from the Environmental Improvement Division. Senate Bill 2 was recently signed by Governor Garrey Carruthers and deals with landfill regulations.

Gaining more and better information will help as the new leaders meet again and set policy, said Alonso.

He added he and the council will review the work already done with the City of Roswell on a regional landfill site and see how it will fit into and work for the greater community of Lincoln County.

During his campaign for mayor, Alonso said he wants to see Ruidoso implement recycling before it is mandated by the state.

Alonso said he understands the new law. Senate Bill 2, has a section dealing with recycling. That is why he wants to have a meeting to find out what Senate Bill 2 is all about.

"The ballgame is changing rapidly on this," he said of recycling.

He said, with the law as a reference, he intends to appoint a small committee, made up of environmentalist and solid waste department head Leonard Corona, to gather information about implementing a recycling program, identify recyclables, evaluate the village's present capacity to handle recycling, and to recommend a course of action to follow.

"Had we not had the law passed, we'd be

doing the same thing. Alonso said he is a good about getting his stance on the recycling project out to the public.

The 100 percent commitment to the resort, golf course, civic center, and performing arts center, he said, "I don't want to do anything to impede their progress."

A private pilot, Alonso said he is considering into the new airport that he did the old one. He said he feels it was essential the new airport be located where it is for safety considerations.

Alonso said he is excited about the possibilities of airline service into the airport. He said it will be a positive step for Ruidoso. He added he will soon be asking for an update of the possibilities of airline service and will try and keep the project going. He said he would like to see other entities in the area help with subsidizing the cost of an airline.

"The economic impact of airline service would affect all of us positively," he said. "I would expect that we could find common ground to finance it collectively."

The village's budget drew lots of criticism during the recent campaign. Alonso and the other elected councillors ran on a platform of reducing taxes and reducing village spending.

"I would like to reduce it," said Alonso in referring to the budget.

"Anytime anybody gives me something, I'm going to take it," said Trustee Cole making the motion to dedicate the street. Trustee Hicks dedicated the motion and Cole and Hicks joined trustees Allison and Parker, who offered the land to the village, in voting in favor of the motion.

Also Friday, the board voted unanimously to pay engineer David Bollschweiler \$11,948.63 for work he's completed toward obtaining a municipal landfill permit for Kenneth Nusker's land in Glencoe.

During the meeting, Harris said the engineer had made innumerable trips and performed a lot of work for the village.

"He needs to be paid," said Harris.

Trustee Parker made the motion, Hicks seconded and all four trustees voted to approve the engineering bill.

After the meeting, members of the board noted that they all voted some time ago in favor of pursuing the landfill application. The News was unable to locate minutes of a public meeting in which that action took place.

"It's really a shame not to pursue it," said Harris. "We're not 90 days away from a permit." Without a landfill, Harris predicts that area residents will begin to dump garbage in arroyos and bar ditches.

Harris told The News on September 19, 1989, that Bollschweiler was not employed by the village. Bollschweiler also told The News that he was working for Kenneth Nusker as a friend.

On Wednesday November 15, while on Nusker land drilling test wells, Bollschweiler said he wasn't under contract or being paid.

But on Friday, the board agreed to pay his bill as submitted for \$11,948.63.

Incoming officers were dismayed that the lame duck board acted on the street dedication and the engineering bill. The newly-electing officers all agreed that the business

could surely wait until tonight's (Monday) meeting.

"I want the people to know, this is the last meeting you'll ever see conducted like this," said incoming trustee Bonnie Addy.

"Y'all ought to be ashamed," said newly-elected Jim Rethmel.

Ray Fredrickson, also elected Tuesday, warned the mayor and the board that they will have to face the new officers and the citizens.


Dean Brewer, a Ruidoso Downs resident present for the meeting, criticized the way the meeting was

called, and complained about the road dedication.

"It's not fair," said Brewer. "This man hasn't paid city taxes up until lately, now you dedicate a road, maintain and build him a bridge."

Mayor Harris and members of his outgoing board predicted that the new officers won't find their jobs as easy as they think.

New officers will be sworn into office during a meeting at 7 p.m. today (Monday), March 12, in the municipal building in Ruidoso Downs.

That is why he said reinstating the budget review cycle with the council and the department heads will be a priority. He said he wants to see the council reach a consensus, with the concurrence of the department heads, of what is achievable in the budget, with the aim being to reduce the overall budget.

Alonso said he is not prepared at this time to grade each of the village's departments on performance. He did say he feels the village employees are doing a good job.

"Overall, the city is in good hands, personnel wise," he said. "I would say the vast majority of employees are doing a good job. At this point, I don't see any reduction in hourly personnel. I think cuts can be accomplished without reducing personnel."

Alonso will continue to be a busy man. In addition to being the Mayor of Ruidoso and operating his restaurant, Don Victor's, with his wife, Virginia, he is also a lay presider and lector for the Spanish masses at Saint Eleanor's Catholic Church.

Alonso was born in Mexico City

in 1946. His family moved to El Paso, Texas, and obtained legal status following World War II. He grew up in the San Juan section of town and he went to Guardian Angel Catholic School his first year.

After learning to speak English, he went on the public school. He attended Ysleta High School where he was an honors graduate, as well as playing fullback on the football team and being student body president.

Alonso attended the University of Texas at El Paso and graduated with a bachelor of science degree in metallurgical engineering and a commission as a second lieutenant in the U.S. Army.

After the service, he worked as a material's engineer at IBM in Austin, Texas. He and Virginia were married in 1972, and they lived in Round Rock, Texas, raising their two children, Victor David and Angela Mari, until 1975.

In that year, they took a trip to Ruidoso and decided to buy a restaurant. They have been here ever since.

As a businessman, Alonso said he would like to see the private sector become more involved with local

government.

"One of the things that has come about as a result of the election has been people in the private sector are offering to become involved and to offer their assistance in whatever possible way," Alonso said. "I fully intend to call on private citizens to get involved and to take advantage of their expertise and their offers to become involved."

He said he hasn't even started as mayor yet, but already he has received several offers of assistance from private citizens. He said several civic-minded business people have decided to support the televising of village council meetings. He said another individual has said he would donate the labor to build a skateboard ramp for the village's youth.

"I think with offers like that there's no telling where we can go with private sector involvement," Alonso said.

Alonso said some of his objectives in the next four years are obvious ones.

"I would like to see the exodus of businesses and people stop," he said.

# Adult bookstore court case causes changes here

People appearing in the future before the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission may think they are in a courtroom.

Well, in a sense they will be.

Because of a decision last year by the New Mexico Court of Appeals, all public hearings in front of commissions, like the Planning and Zoning, have to be held in a quasi court manner, with the witnesses sworn in and the right of the applicant to cross-examine the witnesses against them. The ruling could also apply to public hearings before governing bodies, like the village council.

The decision stems from an appeal by an Albuquerque man to a decision by a district court, which affirmed the City of Albuquerque's denial of a conditional use permit.

Jay Battershell for a number of years operated an adult bookstore in Albuquerque. In 1981, the city enacted an ordinance requiring adult bookstores to relocate from certain areas and established restrictive criteria for the location and operation of such businesses.

In 1986, Battershell and co-petitioner Stuart Tapper purchased an unimproved half-acre tract of land for re-establishment of their store. They filed an application with the city for issuance of a conditional use permit to operate an adult bookstore on their property. The site which they sought to relocate their business was zoned M-2 and designated as a heavy manufacturing zone.

The City of Albuquerque zoning code did not expressly designate any zone wherein an adult bookstore could be established. Under the zoning code, in order for the ap-

pllicants to establish an adult bookstore in an area zoned M-2, they had to apply for and obtain city approval for a conditional use permit.

After public notice was given, a hearing was held by a zoning hearing examiner on Battershell and Tapper's application. The examiner approved the application for the conditional use permit and determined the application met the requirements of the zoning code and the business would not injure adjacent property, the neighborhood or the community.

The decision of the hearing examiner was appealed to the Environmental Planning Commission (EPC) of the city by a number of individuals and entities.

At a hearing in front of the EPC, the petitioners objected to the presentation of testimony by individuals who had not previously been a party to the first public hearing. They also requested the right to cross-examine witnesses against their application. Both the objection and the request were denied by the EPC, who voted to overturn the hearing examiners decision and deny the conditional use permit.

The petitioners appealed the EPC decision to the city council. The city council referred the matter to its Land Use Planning and Zoning Commission. That commission reviewed the appeal on the record, but heard additional testimony and arguments before recommending to the city council they affirm the denial of the conditional use permit.

The petitioners appealed the decision to district court, which dismissed the appeal.

They then appealed it to the Court of Appeals contending the decision of the city council and EPC were not supported by

substantial competent evidence, the hearings were arbitrary and capricious in that they were based upon inadmissible evidence. They also said the procedures used by the two bodies did not comply with the zoning ordinances and that they were deprived of due process of law.

In its decision on the appeal, the Court of Appeals said because the petitioners appeal before the EPC was a quasi judicial proceeding and was not conducted in accordance with the zoning ordinance adopted by the city, it failed to accord the petitioners due process. Because the ruling of the city and the district court were based upon evidence improperly presented before the EPC, the decision of the district court and the city had to be reversed and the case remanded to the district court and the city council for a new hearing to be held consistent with the requirements of the zoning ordinances and the court's opinion.

In a specially concurring opinion, Judge Harris Hartz said, "it appears to be customary practice in the United States to permit cross-examination at hearings before zoning agencies. This right to cross-examination sometimes is based on constitutional considerations or explicit statutory language, but it is also considered to be implicit in the grant of a right to a public hearing."

Because of the decision by the Court of Appeals, Ruidoso planning administrator Cleatus Richards developed a series of hearing procedures for the local commission. Richards and village attorney John Underwood went over the procedures with the P&Z commissioners in a workshop before last Monday's regular meeting.

Underwood told the commissioners the

decision essentially turns any public hearing into a quasi court hearing.

He said the commission needs to decide what parties and witnesses should actually be a part of the hearing. Underwood suggested the applicant and everyone within the 100-foot notification area be considered a party to the hearing. He said everyone outside the 100-foot notification area would have to convince the chairman that he is effected by the decision of the commission.

Underwood said the applicant will have the right to cross-examine the witnesses against his application. He went on to say the chairman and the commission need to decide what evidence will be admissible and what will be hearsay.

In a public hearing, the commissioners will have the opportunity to ask questions of the witnesses, until a motion is made. Once the motion is made there can be no more questions of any witnesses.

Underwood said the new procedures are really not that difficult.

"I think what it boils down to is common sense," he said.

Under the new procedures, each party or witness will be placed under oath at the time of speaking before the commission. They will be offered a reasonable opportunity to present evidence and arguments, and cross-examine witnesses on all relevant issues.

The commissioners can impose limitations on the number of witnesses heard and on the nature and length of testimony and questioning.

Richards told the commissioners that the workshop, if someone appeals their decision to the village council, all the village council can base their decision on is the

record of the P&Z hearing.

"If there is vague testimony, they can review it with the witnesses," Richards said.

He added the council can call another public hearing, but they can only hear the same witnesses as the P&Z heard in their public hearing.

Richards said after the public hearing, the council can do one of three things—uphold the P&Z decision, send it back to the P&Z because of a flaw in the hearing, or can overturn the P&Z decision. He said if the council does overturn a decision, the minutes must state the councilors' reasons for doing so.

"In a way it will be more beneficial and in the other way it will be quite cumbersome," said Underwood of the hearing procedures.

He said it would be more beneficial in that it would allow for greater control over public hearings, but it would be cumbersome in that it may leave someone out of the process.

Richards said if the hearing procedures were approved by the village council, an applicant or his agent will have to be present for the public hearing, otherwise the issue will be tabled until the next meeting.

Richards will be sworn in at every public meeting as a witness for the village ordinance and his staff report will be part of the official record. Applicants will be able to cross-examine Richards about the ordinance and the staff report.

The hearing procedures will be part of the building and zoning code amendments which will be considered by the village council at their regular meeting of March 27.

## Health advocates organize

New Mexico Health Decisions, a not-for-profit organization established late last year, was founded to facilitate state-wide citizen input into New Mexico's health policy decisions, according to a new release. ments of New Mexico's diverse society in setting health and health care policies that will affect them now and in the future. Everyone is invited to participate," said Walters. 





### C.H. "Sonny" Wood

Services were held at the First Christian Church and Forest Lawn Cemetery March 7 for C.H. "Sonny" Wood who was called home by Our Lord on March 5.

The Reverend Mr. Jones, of Tinnie, read a fond tribute to Sonny in which he was described as a gentle loving father, a devoted husband, and a faithful brother and son.

The Reverend Mr. Jones also read from the Twenty-Third Psalm: "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. He maketh me to lie down in green pastures, he leadeth me beside the still waters. He restoreth my soul... Yea though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for Thou art with me..."

The congregation sang the favorite hymn "How Great Thou Art."

And the tape was played of "Daddy's Hands" by Holly Dunn.

### Boyhood Ranch Life

Sonny often told me of his boyhood on a ranch in the San Andres Mountains, just east of Salinas Peak. The ranch was homesteaded by his grandfather, John Henry Wood in 1907. John Henry had first come to New Mexico in the 1880s.

Sonny said that his grandfather was a good friend of the well beloved western writer, Eugene Manlov Rhodes who made the San Andres Mountains and the Tularosa Basin world famous in his novels. It is quite possible that Sonny's grandfather found his way into Manlov's pages, since they were close neighbors in the early days.

While a lad of about 10 years of age Sonny helped out in ranch life such as breaking



horses and working cattle on horseback. He told me that there were many mountain lions in the San Andres in the early times, and wolves, which kept them busy protecting livestock.

Sonny's daughter, Janice, says that Sonny and his brother Fred went to school in a little one room school house in the San Andres where one teacher taught grades one through six.

When the family moved to Tularosa Sonny and his wife-to-be, the former Jane Chalk, were graduated from Tularosa High School in 1946. They were married the following year.

Sonny's father, H.A. Wood, age 92, is remarkably young at heart and clear in his memory. By telephone from his home in Alamogordo, he said that Sonny was a top hand cowboy and loved every minute of cowboy life.

Sonny was a true son of the pioneers and a true friend in western tradition. He will always hold a fond spot in our hearts and we rejoice that he is safe and happy with our Lord in Heaven.

### Spring Stirs In Its Slumber

This is being sent to you in early afternoon on March 8, and will reach you on March 12, eight days away from the first day of Spring.

The west wind is singing down the valley under a sky of white and blue, with the temperature at 74. There is a flavor of new grass and the very first flowers in the light breeze—and you feel something awakening in your heart and you hear a softly whispered voice, long familiar back through the years.

This is the stirring and the murmuring of Queen Spring in her sleep, just before awakening to set the world rejoicing in the new leaves, blossoms, and fragrance drifting in the air.

On the small apricot tree there is one gloom that early in the day showed a bit of pure white of a bloom-petal looking out cautiously from its pink winter bud.

By the end of the day this fruit bud blossom leader will be full blown, while all its companions on the branches will be in all stages of beginning to bloom, in colors of snow white and crimson pink.

Down at San Patricio the willows have come out with the first green in the valley, getting the world ready for the celebration of Saint Patrick's Day.

Mother Earth is breathing a gentle prayer of welcome as Lady Spring begins her procession from the low country up into the mountain land.

## County considers change in form

The first of two public hearings on changes to the Lincoln Historic Preservation Ordinance will be conducted at 4 p.m. today (Monday) during a regular meeting of the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners (LCBC).

The proposed changes to the ordinance will make Lincoln County a certified local government (CLG), as part of the National Historic Preservation Program.

The second hearing will be conducted at 7 p.m. Tuesday, March 13, at the Dr. Wood's Annex in Lincoln.

Representatives of the Lincoln Historic Preservation Board and the Lincoln Heritage Trust approached the LCBC at a previous meeting and suggested the proposed changes to the ordinance.

Through designation as a CLG, Lincoln County is eligible for money already available through the National Historic Preservation Program.

Newspapers, throughout history, have looked on the business of studying issues, forming opinions and then publishing them as an obligation as well as a protected right. That's why we write and publish editorials. This is where we say what we believe.

We share the Opinion Page with readers, publishing letters to the editor on a regular basis. We don't print every letter we receive; for instance, we can't print libel, and potentially libelous statements don't become libel until they are printed. We also don't print advertisements (whether for a business or a political candidate) disguised as letters to the editor. You see, freedom of the press protects our right to publish a newspaper with an opinion page, but it doesn't ensure that readers will have the right to have all their opinions printed. We do print 95 percent of the letters we receive, so long as they are signed and authorship can be confirmed.

Editorials by their very nature are one-sided—they are opinion and do not cover all the sides of any issue or belief. We don't expect anybody, much less everybody, to agree with our editorials. If you want to read our opinions, that's great; but if you don't, that's OK, too.

The rest of the newspaper is where we print the news, and we work very hard to keep our news coverage straight as an arrow. We believe we do that very well. Why else, during this past election would we have given EVERY candidate a picture and story stating their views? Why else would we have sponsored a candidate forum for Ruidoso candidates? We gather information, check it out and present all the unvarnished facts to readers on the news pages.

So remember, the news goes on page 1 and throughout the rest of the news pages, and opinions go on the Opinion Page.



## Letters to the editor

DEAR EDITOR:

I realize in writing this letter, I am inviting much criticism from football players and their families. However, not to write it would mean not to support a friend. Coach Doug Ragsdale is a friend and a fellow church member. I have sat in a Sunday School class with him for almost a year. His family members have become my friends, and I have worked with all of them in one capacity or another. 


