Village division director resigns

Village of Ruidoso infrastructure division head Becky Bell-Durham resigned on Thursday.

Interim village manager Leon Eggleston said Bell-Durham resigned after a meeting with Mayor Victor Alonso.

Alonso said Bell-Durham sought assurances from him about her position. He said, since he and the village council are in the process of evaluating the high end positions of the village management, he could not give her any guarantees.

The Village of Ruidoso, during the past four years, was reorganized into three divisions with the three division directors reporting directly to the village manager.

Eggleston said he had up the

operations division, with Tim Morris heading the Airport and Transportation Services Division. Budgeted salaries for the three division heads are \$36,053 each, with the village manager's salary at \$46,014.

Before the reorganization, the village was set up with a village manager and assistant manager, with some department heads reporting directly to the assistant manager.

Eggleston, who was appointed interim manager when village manager Frank Potter was not reappointed, is currently carrying out the responsibilities Bell-Durham previously had. He said he has met with all the department heads in the division.

Warning welcomes visitors

A large billboard in Ruidoso Downs welcomes visitors to the town of Ruidoso. Just 200 yards past this sign is another that warns "Radon Is Deadly In This Area."

But the sign isn't there because of documented evidence that radon levels are dangerously high in Lincoln County.

In fact, the most recent evidence published by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in 1989, the same agency that has the sign in Ruidoso Downs, shows only a four percent chance a home site in Lincoln County has radon gas levels high enough to cause concern.

If there is no basis of fact to the sign, ought to be removed immediately, said county manager Nick Pappas.

Radon is a radioactive gas that enters a home through cracks in the floor, through foundations, or sumps.


Radon awareness is important to the EPA because the gas is the second leading cause of lung cancer, said Roger Meacham at the EPA district office in Dallas, Texas.

"Radon is one of the most serious environmental hazards we have," said Meacham.

But a statewide survey coordinated by the EPA and conducted jointly with the state Environmental Improvement Division (EID) in January 1989, discovered only four sites out of 100 tests to have levels of radon gas greater than four pCi/l.

Zero sites were found in Lincoln County with levels greater than 20 pCi/l, a level considered to be dangerous by EPA standards.

School board gets set to search for superintendent

Choosing a new superintendent could be one of the most important tasks ever faced by a board of education.

Noted last month of the retirement of superintendent Sid Miller, the Ruidoso board got an idea Thursday of the intricate process it faces in seeking a replacement to head the school system.

Jim Miller, a consultant with the New Mexico School Board Association, was on hand for a board meeting Thursday and offered his views on choosing a new superintendent.

"I don't know how much you want to say in front of these folks," said Miller, pointing to the room full of people who attended the public meeting. Asking if the board wanted to hear from him during the public meeting or if it was a closed session, Miller quickly added that there was nothing to hide.

The audience and the board listened to his lengthy presentation, which apparently was a pitch for a consulting contract to lead the board in a seeking a new superintendent.

Miller said the school superintendent can affect a school system positively for good or for bad, adding that the superintendent is the person who sets the tone and the pace for a district.

"I'm prepared to help you with all these tasks," said Miller.

He went on to describe a process that begins by determining how to advertise, how much to pay, deadlines and minimum qualifications for the job. It continues with implementing the advertising and

posting new board members. Miller will be wanted.

Although the board can take it to consider on the wishes and desires of teachers, parents and others, Miller reminded members that the law leaves the decision of who to hire, and the actual hiring of a superintendent in the hands of the board.

The process goes on with screening, picking semi-finalists and interviewing the candidates.

"I will help you build an interview," said Miller, listing a number of items he believes he can help the board accomplish.

The board took no action after hearing from Miller.

The board also heard a request from Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce president-elect Ron Wall for permission to use White Mountain school grounds and parking areas for the annual Ruidoso Art Festival July 27-29.

Wall and chamber executive director Jerry Watts were at the meeting, not only to ask to use school property, but also to ask for a waiver to allow the sale of wine and beer on school grounds.

For the last several years the chamber has used the wine and beer concessions as its major

attraction. Wall said the chamber submitted applications for the 1990-91 season of the art festival. The area is 11,000 square feet of lot area.

Members of the school board and other parents supporters of the Art Festival had many questions over parking and the beer and wine.

Students have been decorated during the home, said associate superintendent Mike Gladden. He said he knows of no dispensation as to who that is.

Don Swander and Lynn Wall had just passed on the legal title search, deed and other school grounds, and heard from the State of New Mexico about the problems school grounds would be in possession of.

Red Adams, who was particularly concerned over damage to school grounds by parking of the art.

Wall said he was going to try to work with the state and Edwards Wall said the chamber needs an answer by March 25.

cent, with the state funding decreased from \$1,811.55 last year to \$1,609.89 this year.

Gladden said the school budget is due in Santa Fe April 25, with final approval set for May 9.

First and foremost we need to convince people and business that these matters are important," said Gladden, predicting that the quality of education will suffer if the board doesn't work on these matters.

Miller then said that a new tax on the age of the property was being considered, just as the night was to go. He said it would be a tax would disproportionately educate the state.

It was hello to the new and goodbye to the old as the board of directors of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County (ED-

CLC) met Thursday at the Texas-New Mexico Power Company building.

Before Tuesday night's meeting, board members surprised former president Carroll "Buddy" Bundick

with a surprise party. Current president Don Shaw presented Bundick with a plaque in appreciation for his service to EDCLC.

Bundick said he couldn't have done things without the other board members and he encouraged them to continue to support EDCLC. Bundick is leaving Ruidoso to become district manager for Texas-New Mexico Power Company in Silver City.

During the meeting, executive director George Puckett said he is working on a reception seminar, to be within the next month or so, for all the counties newly elected officials. Puckett said the event will be to inform the officials on where the EDCLC is going, and to do some long-range economic planning for the future.

He said he wants to have a dinner with the seminar and bring in a well-known speaker to speak on economic development. Puckett said the dinner would be open to the public and could become a fundraiser for EDCLC.

Shaw asked Dorothy Smith, Pat Huey, Crystal Luemas, Hal Sims, Tina Hall and Jennifer Hutton to serve on a committee to help Puck-

ett plan the reception seminar.

In his executive director's report, Puckett told the board about War Speed Light Partners business partnership with IBM. He said the company's quarterly sales figures were up more than 200 percent for the same period last year.

Puckett said he had recently come back from a trip to California with two prospects for relocation to Ruidoso. He said one was a computer firm and that both prospects would be visiting the area over Easter.

"Southern California is really ripe pickings," he said.

He said the Rancho Ruidoso Industrial Park had gone through its first hearing in front of the county planning and zoning commission. He said a company out of Lubbock is considering the industrial park site for relocation. He said he wants to stress to the public, that the industrial park is not in Ruidoso but it was located closer to Capitan.

Puckett announced that EDCLC will sponsor a seminar on how to handle your own patents on Saturday, April 14, at Cree Meadows. He

Ruidoso group takes Holloman tour

A Ruidoso group had an opportunity Tuesday to see firsthand how their tax dollars are spent.

Brigadier General Travis Harrell welcomed a group of Ruidoso residents with words to that effect before beginning a tour of Holloman Air Force Base, outside of Alamogordo.

Thirty-nine people made the trip to Holloman aboard an Air Force bus for an afternoon tour of the base, sponsored by the Military Affairs Committee of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce.

General Harrell, the commander of the 833rd Air Division and top man at Holloman, welcomed the visitors to the base and told them a little something about the mission of the various units at the base. He also told the group about the possibility of the 37th Tactical Fighter Wing (TFW), with the F-117A Stealth Fighter, coming to Holloman.

After showing a videotape on Holloman, the public affairs officer, Captain Judy Scott took the group to the training center of the 479th Tactical Training Wing (TTW), one of the two flying units based at Holloman.

The 479th TTW trains pilots in fighter tactics and principles before the pilots transition into the larger and faster fighter in the Air Force's inventory.

At the training center, the Ruidoso people were shown what happens to a pilot when he is forced to bail out of an aircraft. An Air Force sergeant showed the group the materials, like a signal strobe, a radio, water and a rubber raft, which go into a survival kit that accompanies every pilot in the aircraft.

The idea of a pilot having a rubber raft with him in the desert caused a few laughs throughout the crowd. But, the sergeant told the group the raft could be valuable in the desert. He said because of the heat from the ground, many pilots receive burns from, not only the sun, but also the ground. The raft can be used as an air mattress to keep the pilot off the ground, the sergeant explained.

After the training center, the group went by bus to the Physiological Training Center. At the center, the commander, Lieutenant Colonel Jeff Hill, explained the importance of physiological fitness in withstanding the G forces a fighter pilot must take. G-forces are the weight of gravity on a body. Standing still on ground, a person experiences one G. In a high speed turning maneuver, a pilot in a modern jet fighter can experience forces up to nine G's. Or more simply put, his body weighs nine times what it normally weighs on the ground.

Hill showed a video that dramatically illustrated what can happen when a fighter pilot passes out due to excessive G forces while flying an aircraft. Hill explained one of the first signs a pilot has of excessive G forces is a gradual loss of peripheral vision.

After a question and answer session, the group was given a tour around the Physiological Training Center. One of the main stops on the tour, was the centrifuge chamber, one of only three in the Air Force.

The centrifuge is simply a long mechanical arm which spins around with a box, containing the pilot, at the end. The purpose of the

centrifuge is to expose the pilots, under a controlled situation, to the tremendous G forces they will experience under actual flying conditions.

Monitors situated around the centrifuge, allow the center personnel to view the pilot inside the box and monitor his reactions. A printed display on the monitor gives the pilot's name and the G forces he is experiencing. It also allows the visitors to see first-hand the contortions and grimaces a pilot's face goes through when experiencing a high G load.

Pilots who come to Holloman to attend the Lead in Fighter Training (LIFT) with the 479th, are required to take a spin in the centrifuge.

Hill told the group, the pilots all wear a G suit, which is like a rubber pair of chaps with air bladders that expand. The bladders squeeze the pilot's legs, preventing blood from pooling in the lower extremities during a high G maneuver. In addition to the G suit, Hill said the pilots are taught to strain when they are in a high G situation.

The group were also given a tour of the high altitude chamber and the weight room, where they were given a briefing on the physical fitness program the pilots go through.

Following the Physiological Training Center, the Ruidoso group was taken to a hangar and introduced to the flying elements of Holloman, the AT-38 and the F-15.

Lieutenant Greg Clark of the 49th Tactical Fighter Wing explained to the group a little bit about the F-15 Eagle, which he flies.

The McDonald Douglas F-15 Eagle is an extremely agile tactical fighter designed for air superiority. It

is powered by two Pratt and Whitney F100-PW-100 turbofan engines with afterburners. Each engine is capable of producing 25,000 pounds of thrust. With a high engine thrust to weight ratio and a low wing loading (the ratio of an aircraft's weight to its wing area) the F-15 is able to accelerate even while in a vertical climb. It

also enables the aircraft to turn tightly without losing speed.

The F-15's usual armament is four AIM 9L/M Sidewinder heat seeking missiles and four AIM-7F/M Sparrow radar-guided missiles. The F-15 also carries a 20mm multibarrel internally mounted gun with 940 rounds of ammunition.

The F-15 is used by three operational tactical fighter squadrons, the 7th, 8th and the 9th, of the 49th TFW. The 49th TFW has been flying the F-15 since 1978.

The other aircraft based at Holloman is the Northrop AT-38B Talon, which is operated by the 479th TTW. The twin seat aircraft is designed to prepare pilots and weapon system officers in the fundamental procedures and techniques of operating fighter aircraft.

It is powered by two General Electric J85-GE-5 turbojet engines with afterburners. Each engine is capable of producing 3,850 pounds of thrust in the afterburner mode.

The AT-38B carries external armament and associated weapons delivery equipment for training purposes only.

The 479th TTW is the largest wing in the Air Force, with over 100 aircraft. However, it is this wing which could be disbanded or moved from Holloman to make room for the 37th TFW and their stealth fighters.

After looking at the two aircraft up close, members of the Ruidoso group were guests at a dinner at the Officer's Club, hosted by Gener-

al Harrell and his wife, Judy. Also joining the group for the dinner were Lieutenant Colonel John Blythe, the commander of the 833rd Security Police Squadron, and Lieutenant Colonel Howard Donaldson, the Judge Advocate at Holloman. The two colonels were also accompanied by their wives.


Not all the people who went on the tour, were from Ruidoso. Retired Colonel and Mrs. John Wise of Colorado Springs, Colorado, were visiting in Ruidoso when they learned of the tour through *The News*. They had to get on a waiting list, but were able to make the trip. Colonel Wise used to fly the B-47 strategic bomber when he was in the Air Force.

After the dinner, Tracey Moran of the Chamber's Visitors and Convention Bureau presented General Harrell a bronzed pine cone from Ruidoso. The pine cone has special significance because it was made by Walter Rawley of the Crucible Art Foundry in Ruidoso. Rawley served in the 479th fighter squadron before it was a training wing.

General Harrell gladly accepted the gift and thanked the Ruidoso group for the support of the local communities. He promised he would get up to Ruidoso soon.

General Harrell asked for comments about the tour from the group. One woman raised her hand and spoke.

"I have been educated greatly," she said. "I know where my tax dollars are going."

Wishard finished fourth with a time of 66.23.



He said the teams will be looking to improve over the next couple of weeks.



Earth Day project to improve Bonito Lake

Earth Day will be Sunday, April 22, and if you want to participate, there's plenty to do.

A multitude of public and private agencies and an army of volunteers will team up for a multi-beneficial Earth Day project.

The objective is to improve Bonito Creek from the White Mountain Wilderness boundary to and including the Fort Stanton area. The project site is located north of Ruidoso.

Various teams will work on projects on Saturday, April 21, such as building stream structures, stabilizing the stream bank, planting trees and shrubs, sprucing up the hiking trail and cleaning up litter.

Task forces are now being organized for willow tree planting along the Bonito River in Lincoln County, as well as litter pick-up and stream bank improvement.

According to a news release, the results will be an improved watershed condition, better recreation opportunities, a more beautiful and healthy stream and stream banks, plus the satisfaction of giving mother nature a hand.

The primary goal of the volunteer work along the Bonito, for this, the 20th Earth Day, is to educate the volunteers on watershed conservation and stream bank improvement. The secondary goal will be improved conditions along the Bonito by the removal of trash and log jams, and by planting willows, a native species to protect the banks from erosion.

Non-native species have invaded many riparian areas and have choked out native species while at the same time consuming more water than the native species. Piñon, juniper, salt cedar and

tamarisk are examples of these invasive species.

Water shed improvement can improve in-stream quality of perennial streams, and increase in-stream flow.

Representatives from the Soil Conservation Service (SCS), the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), and the U.S. Forest Service (USFS), are organizing volunteers for the tasks to be completed on Earth Day, and for additional work to be completed the following day.

The Lincoln County Sheriff's Posse will be one of the many volunteering groups that will lend a hand on Earth Day.

Task force organizers hope to have between 300 and 500 volunteers.

The volunteers will assemble at their prospective work sites Saturday, April 21, to receive assignments, tools and instructions. That evening, speeches, awards, ceremonies, and supper will take place at Bonito Lake. Those who are willing may continue working on the project April 22.

The project task force includes the BLM, USFS, State Land Office, SCS, City of Alamogordo, New Mexico Department of Game and Fish, and the Upper Hondo Soil and Water Conservation District.

Groups or individuals interested in participating in the conservation effort can call the Smokey Bear District office of the USFS in Ruidoso.

According to Jim Anderson of the Smokey Bear Ranger District, everyone is invited to volunteer for this worthwhile effort. He and Peg Crim may be contacted at the Smokey Bear Ranger District, (505) 257-4095, for more information.

IBM sees the light; joins forces with Warp Speed Light Pens

The future only keeps getting brighter for Warp Speed Light Pens Incorporated.

Since moving to Ruidoso from Culver City, California, in September 1989, Warp Speed's net profits for the first quarter of 1990 have exceeded their most conservative estimates, and the small "David-type" computer company has concluded a year-long negotiation to become a business partner with the "Goliath-type" computer giant, IBM.

In a recently released report, Warp Speed reported total sales for the quarter of \$255,174.08. That is an increase of 250 percent over the total sales of \$98,686.40 for the same period in 1988.

The most dramatic figure from the Warp Speed report is the net profit of \$75,145.72 for the quarter.

President Craig Rawlings credits the company's move to Ruidoso as contributing to the net profit figure.

"We have a much lower overhead in a number of areas which allows us to realize these outstanding figures," said Rawlings.

Right now, Warp Speed is enjoying a current gross profit margin of 69.5 percent, and a current net profit margin of 32.9 percent.

"Thirty-two point nine percent, no one in the world does that," Rawlings proudly said.

The small company, located on Gavilan Canyon Road, is a manufacturer of light pens and light pen associated hardware and interface boards. It is also a publisher and developer of light pen related software.

Warp Speed is enjoying a resurgence of light pens in the com-

puter industry. IBM has included light pen control on most of the medical software products it offers.

The company has taken advantage of this resurgence by creating a communications software which can link a personal computer (PC), which has full light pen control, to a mainframe system.

By using this communications package and a light pen, a doctor, sitting in his office and using a PC, would be able to access information from the hospital's mainframe computer system. Warp Speed believes this software will significantly increase sales.


Another medically related use for the light pen is a system called Bedside Terminals. For years, hospitals have wanted to have a computer input terminal next to every bed. Warp Speed has been working closely with Shared Medical Systems (SMS) and IBM to incorporate light pen control into just such a system.

The joining of the Warp Speed Light Pen and the IBM computer has been such a success, the two companies announced a business partnership last week.

In a news conference on Wednesday, March 14, at the Albuquerque Hilton Hotel, Rawlings and IBM representative Karl Bergstrasser announced the business partnership.





LCMC will remain open, says acting director

Lincoln County Medical Center is not going to close.

That's the message the board of trustees wants to get out in the community, and during a regular meeting Thursday, the board began to develop a strategy.

Board member Sally Avery told the other members she was approached by someone in the community claiming they heard the hospital was going to close.

"You may laugh now, but this is a serious perception throughout the community," said Valerie Miller, interim administrator at Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC). "It is simply not true."

Miller began the discussion of public relations by sharing her own information after meeting with various members throughout the community.

Residents in Ruidoso and in the county believe all the good doctors are gone, and with the administra-

tor gone, the hospital is about to close its doors, said Miller.

Administrator Steve Keller submitted his resignation last month, and Miller is serving as interim administrator.

The board must work to change this perception in the community and inform people of the active recruiting going on and the continued plans to upgrade services, said Miller.

"We have four new doctors possibly coming by June," she said. "I think that's an excellent turnaround."

In spite of a \$424,581 deficit, LCMC will remain open, but the community will have to show more support than it has in the past, said board chairman Dub Williams.

Recently the county commission voted to free up some of the mill levy funds for LCMC to be used for operations, which the facility may come to rely on more heavily in the future.

"The only way these rural hospi-

tals will survive is with the mill levy," said Williams.

The Belen hospital failed to pass its mill levy and as a result drastically reduced services, said Williams.

"We will have to sell a mill levy," he said. The next mill levy may also have to be redefined to allow for more money for operational expenses.

The current mill levy is not up for renewal until 1992, but if it isn't passed, at least \$500,000 could be pulled from the budget, said Gary Mitchell.

The current mill levy balance is \$1.1 million, most of which is slated for capital purchases. LCMC no longer receives the interest from the levy funds, which was another point of discussion during Thursday's meeting.

Avery asked Lincoln County Commission representative Karon Z. Petty in a previous meeting to see if the interest could be returned to LCMC in the next county budget

process. Petty reported she instructed the county manager to use two employees to research the minutes and tapes of all commission meetings in which the hospital mill levy funds were discussed. It was the conclusion of the research that the interest was never a specific topic of discussion, except one time, she said.

During one discussion, then commissioner Kenneth Nosker asked what would happen if a new hospital were not built right away. Then LCMC administrator Ken Moore replied that at least the county would have the interest, said Petty.

This statement was interpreted to mean the county was always to have the interest for its general fund.

"I think you took his remark wrong," said John Hightower.

"If you pull \$80,000 out of our budget ... you're taking it away from all the county services," said

Petty. "At least you don't have a \$400,000 deficit," said Cal Cowden.

Petty said it is possible to begin repaying the interest to the hospital, but the money has been budgeted for so long in the county budget, the impact could be significant.

The discussion concluded with the feeling the board may ultimately have to approach Lincoln County voters for a renewal of the mill levy to support the operations of the hospital.

In other financial business, the Carrizozo Health Clinic posted a net income of \$18,555 for the first eight months of the fiscal year, after receiving \$141,691 from the mill levy tax to support the clinic.

Jim Ann Rasco reported to the board on a new childbirth class to be offered at LCMC.

The first class of the six-week course will begin Wednesday, March 21. The cost is \$25 for each couple. Information on the class can

be obtained by calling Rasco at LCMC on Mondays, Tuesdays or Wednesdays.

In a "Pay for Performance" evaluation, 94 LCMC employees were rated with only one receiving a rating of unsatisfactory, which resulted in the employee's resignation.

Nine were rated as needing improvement and these employees have been contacted with corrective action taken. Improvement has already been documented.

Eighty-one employees were rated as either excellent or outstanding, and three were rated as superior.

The safety committee annual reported stated LCMC will receive an award for the greatest reduction in injuries to employees. The award will be presented by the Hospital Services Corporation of New Mexico.

Employee injuries were reduced at LCMC from 32 in 1988 to 16 in 1989.

RHS students plan to "practice" law in April

The Ruidoso High School Mock Trial team will be going to state competition on April 6-7. The team won both qualifying rounds last Saturday against Carrizozo and Cibola.

The students role played attorneys and witnesses in a hypothetical case about the juvenile death penalty. The seven Ruidoso students who participated in mock trials are Maribel Mendez, Sherry Shade, Jennifer Brillante, Andy Orantia, Logan Stirman, Will Rooney and Chaitanya Pai.

Supreme Court Justices Seth Montgomery, Richard Ransom and Kenneth Wilson are scheduled to serve as presiding judges during the state finals of the 12th annual high school Mock Trial competition set for April 6 and 7 in Albuquerque.

The competition is administered by New Mexico Law-Related Education, a program of the New Mexico Bar Foundation.

Students have prepared and will argue a hypothetical case on the juvenile death penalty. The 1990 case

was developed by Sigrid E. Olson, executive director of the New Mexico Bar Foundation and Linda Andre Wells, UNM Law School student.

More than 400 students and teachers from 36 high schools participated on March 10, at regional competitions which were conducted in Albuquerque, Gallup, Las Cruces and Santa Fe. Based on the regional results, the top 20 teams will advance to the state finals. Other schools that will participate in the state competition include Capitan.

Governor Garrey Carruthers has for the fourth consecutive year declared the last day of competition, April 7, as New Mexico Mock Trial Day. The day will culminate in an awards banquet featuring keynote speaker Professor Mike Dale of Nova University, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida.

Trophies will be presented to the top five teams, and the first place team will represent New Mexico at the National Finals scheduled May 9-13, in Portland, Oregon.

Ironhorse Railroad is tracking for funding





grams, such as the penal system, economic development and human services, as an excellent educational program.

All agreed that the only way to such a program is through increased funding.

Two local educators were at the meeting to ask for changes to the teachers' benefit package. Rob Dillon described a sick leave bank where teachers could help each other out in case of catastrophic illnesses; and principal Roger Sowder described a play for teacher to be paid for sick leave that is unused when they leave the system.

Dillon said his plan is truly a humanitarian plan.

Sowder's plan, a deferred sick leave payment plan, is designed to increase an employee's desire to work when feeling "marginal."

"I don't think we have a problem," said Sowder, asking the board to establish a fund to pay \$25 a day for unused sick leave days. Employees have a cap of 100 days on the number of sick leave days that can be accrued.

The board also approved the school calendar Thursday, with school to start on August 23. Students will have holidays on September 3, November 22-23, and December 24 through January 4, 1991.

Students will be out on February 18 for President's Day and on February 28 for a teacher in-service. Spring break will be March 25 through April 1, and the last day of school will be May 31, 1991.

Edwards, saying he makes this same speech every year, wanted to know why the schools can't respond to continuing requests by businesses and parents to delay the start of school until after Labor Day. He said in this resort economy, many businesses rely on teenagers to work through the Labor Day weekend, one of the very busiest of the year.

Dillon, reporting for the teachers' advisory committee, said the early start is to allow teachers to get out of school in time to enroll for summer school classes.

Edwards cast the only dissenting vote in approving the calendar.

Also Thursday, the board postponed calling for bids on remodel-

ing the sixth grade building, re-roofing the White Mountain school gymnasium and on an activity bus.

The board will consider bids during a special meeting at noon March 28.

The board awarded the re-roofing contract for White Mountain Intermediate School to All American for \$48,000. Superintendent Sid Miller said that bid was negotiated down to that price.

The board learned that the first \$1 million was received on the bond sale, and authorized a budget increase for those funds.

The board got word that Ruidoso Middle School was named New Mexico Middle School of the Year.

"We're proud of you and your staff," said Edwards to the mid school principal Mike Gladden.

Also Thursday the board accepted the resignations of second grade teacher Karla Thornley, head football coach Doug Ragsdale, middle school special education teacher Mariellen Patrick and high school secretary Pam Hough. The board accepted, with regret, the retirement of superintendent Sid Miller.

The board approved hiring Ann McCoy to replace Thornley, Susan

Randle as high school secretary and Kathy Dickerson as a bus driver.

Board members also approved a one-time substitute pay increase for high school teacher Ralph Tiscareno. He was hired and resigned before the board could act on his contract.

A long discussion followed, with explanations by Miller and finance director Caron Snow as to why the teacher should be paid about twice as much as other substitutes for the period of December 11 through February 1.

Miller said, even though the board didn't hire him, the teacher was verbally hired, and it would be easier to do the one-time substitute adjustment than to add him on the faculty only to be dropped.

The board OK'd the one-time pay increase which will amount to about \$1,000.

"I have no idea what I voted on," commented Swalander after the discussions and explanations.

The board, with a motion and a second, but without a roll call vote as required by the Open Meetings Act, then retired into an executive session to discuss personnel.

deadly in Lincoln County could have serious and negative effects on the local economy which largely depends on tourism, say some county officials and local businessmen.

"This is too serious a charge to be treated frivolously," Pappas said of the sign. "Fact or not, you are going to scare people. In terms of selling property and growth, this could be detrimental to the local economy."

"I feel the sign's misleading," said Mark Doth, marketing director at the Ruidoso Downs Race Track. "It shouldn't be there."

But the fact the sign is there appears to be a matter of chance, rather than planning.

The billboard on which the warning is printed is owned by Newman Signs, which has an office

in Roswell. The company provides free public service announcement billboards on a space-availability basis, said Barbara Isler of Newman Signs.

This means a particular public service announcement (PSA) will turn up wherever a billboard becomes available, and the PSA will remain on the sign until the space is rented for pay, or it is removed because of complaints, said Isler.

"If it's a nuisance or a problem, we'll be happy to cover it up," said Isler.

Had a Newman sign become available somewhere else, the radon sign could have turned up there just as easily as it did in Ruidoso Downs.

The EID recently conducted another radon test program in which private individuals were able to obtain a test kit for their home. The kits were then mailed to the state office and the results returned to

the homeowner or occupant. While the complete results were not available to The News by press time, the general feeling at the EID is that there are no serious problems with radon in the area.

Even if one home does turn up with a high level of radon gas, it doesn't mean the entire neighborhood is necessarily contaminated, said Meacham.

"Radon is spotty," he said. "One home can have dangerously high readings, while all the others in the neighborhood register nothing."

The reason the EPA has taken such an alarming approach in its advertising campaign is to err on the side of caution, said Meacham.

The agency hopes people will be aware of the problem and seek to test their homes. If levels are high in a home, the problem can be very easily and inexpensively rectified, said Meacham.




