areas along the road might be affected.

The S-2 alternate, the 45 mph design, would have the same improvements, but would require the acquisition of three commercial businesses.

The two northern alternates would have the same improvements and affected areas, but the N-1 alternate would require the acquisition of two single family houses and four businesses. The N-2 alternate would require acquisition of the same two family houses, as well as eight commercial businesses.

The Highway Department had a public hearing on October 5 at the White Mountain Intermediate School Cafeteria to gain input from the public on the four possible design alternates.

At that meeting, concerned citizens asked a number of questions regarding when construction would actually begin, acquisition of right of way, where the traffic was coming from that required the expansion of the roadway, and wouldn't a series of traffic lights

help existing traffic congestion. Representatives of the Highway Department and Boyle Engineering gave no definite answers to the questions except to say the Highway Department wanted property owners' input and that a decision on which design alternates would be selected would be made from that input.

Of particular concern to many people at the meeting was when the Highway Department would begin construction. At the time of the public meeting, the final design and awarding of contracts for the southern half was to be done by April or May 1990, and construction was scheduled to begin in June 1990. The village administration and many of the merchants along Mechem felt that the construction would affect them during their busiest time of the year.

Later it was learned from the Highway Department the acquisition of right of way, the first steps in the project, wouldn't begin until August 1990.

One month after the public hearing, the village administration received word from the Highway Department that the 45 mph design

had been selected for both halves of the project.

In January of this year, the Highway Department had a field design inspection on the project with representatives of Boyle Engineering, the Federal Highway Administration and the village administration.

At that meeting several major changes in the design were developed. The design now called for a continuous left hand turn lane all the way from Sudderth to the bottom of Alto Hill. Also there would be six foot wide sidewalks along both sides of the roadway over the same distance.

It was also decided because some of the highway cuts in the southern half would be six feet tall and some in the northern half would be up to 60 feet in height, the Highway Department would do the subgrade in one effort, instead of one side at a time.

This meant instead of having traffic driving on one side of the roadway, while the other is under construction, traffic would have to be detoured. The Highway Department representative originally said they would try and keep traffic

flowing on one side of the road during construction.

The expansion of Highway 48 finally came up for discussion with the village council. During a February 27 council meeting, merchants along Mechem Drive approached the previous village council for help in dealing with the Highway Department.

Several merchants expressed their opposition to the project in its current form and once again questioned the need for such a drastic expansion. They also said the Highway Department did not listen to the citizens concerns at the first public hearing and they went ahead and chose the design they wanted.

The merchants and property owners at the meeting were upset with Boyle Engineering. Despite written objections to the 45 mph alternate, all the property owners along the road received letters thanking them for their input, but the 45 mph alternate had been selected. The letter was not from the Highway Department, but from Boyle Engineering.

The open forum meeting on Tuesday night will be in the council chamber at village hall.

A search is on for new head coaches

Ruidoso High School will have new head coaches for both football and basketball next year.

Head football coach Doug Ragsdale resigned last month and head basketball coach Dean Hood resigned his coaching duties this week.

RHS principal Tom Hansen said Hood will continue teaching at Ruidoso Middle School, but asked to be replaced as head basketball coach, a position he has held for two seasons.

Ragsdale confirmed after his resignation was accepted, that he was told his contract would not be renewed.

A search committee has narrowed the field for the head football coaching job from 24 applicants to six finalists.

Those finalists include one Ruidoso coach and one former Ruidoso coach. RHS assistant football coach Ridge Bowden and former RHS assistant Mike Speck are among the top six.

Speck moved to Artesia when former head football coach Cooper Henderson left Ruidoso to coach the Artesia Bulldogs.

The other finalists are Clement Mancini of Wichita Falls, Texas; Tom Pannell of Grand Marais, Minnesota; Dale Fullerton of Clovis; and George Frederick of Loving and formerly

of Carlsbad. Hansen, superintendent Sid Miller, associate superintendent Mike Gladden and School Board member Lynn Willard will evaluate those six, set up interviews and make a recommendation to the board. Hansen said the plan is to make that recommendation on April 10.

He said he moderated the search committee that included two business people, two coaches and two classroom teachers. That committee reviewed the 24 applications and called references as part of the process of elimination.

Besides looking at the applicants' coaching experience and records, the committee will be faced with finding a coach with a teaching specialty that fits into the RHS needs.

Although the past several head football coaches have also served as athletic director (AD) for the schools, the new football coach will be hired strictly to coach that sport and to fulfill classroom teaching duties.

"That's the goal ... to separate the AD from a main sport," said Hansen, who has been acting athletic director since Ragsdale resigned.

Hansen said the AD has to be certified as an administrator and has to be able to act in an administrative capacity over the entire sports program.

Presently property is located only by lots and subdivisions, but the new programs will make it possible to identify and locate property by street address.

"I look forward to seeing that installed," said Serna.

She said she works closely with the appraisers and the deputies, and looks forward to continuing the good working relationship she has within the assessor's office and with other county offices.

Serna is a member of the National Federation of Republican Women, the Carrizozo Chamber of Commerce, First Monday (Republican), New Mexico Association of Assessing Officers and St. Rita Catholic Church.

"If elected I will continue to serve the people in a professional, equal, fair and courteous manner, and will seek ways to make the office more efficient in all aspects," said Serna.

April weather is unpredictable

In addition to income tax and daylight savings time, April normally brings a wide variety of weather to our unique mountain community.

While it is statistically the driest month of the year (average precipitation only 0.63 inch), in 1942, 3.43 inches was recorded, and over 2 inches was measured in 1977 and 1983. No precipitation was observed during the Aprils of 1956

and 1981, and less than 0.25 inches fell in 15 of the last 38 years.

It has snowed during the month in 25 of those 38 years with the greatest amount of 24.3 inches falling in 1983. On April 4, 1983 (the big EL NINO year) 15 inches fell 24 hours, the 2nd greatest snowfall in our weather records. Average snowfall for the month is only 1.5 inches.

April's normal temperatures range from an average low of 23.5 degrees on the 2nd to an average maximum of 57.6 degrees on the

24th. The coldest recorded was +4 degrees on the 5th in 1974. The warmest 85 degrees on the 21st and 22nd of 1965.

The normal low temperature for Easter morning (the 15th in 1990) is 28 degrees but has been as cold as 12 degrees in 1972, and up to 41 degrees in 1969. No precipitation has fallen on the 15th since 1982.

Sunrise in Ruidoso this Easter morning is 6:32 a.m. Mountain Daylight Time.

The National Weather Service's

extended outlook of March 15, 1990, calls for above average precipitation (greater than 0.63 inch) in Ruidoso during April of this year. The Farmer's Almanac indicates a warm dry month with minor storm periods on the 7th to 9th, 17th to the 19th, and on the 28th thru the 30th.

While the weather outlook is open to some doubt, one fact is for certain: Mercury (the evening star) will be at its brightest, low in the western evening sky on the 13th.

Patricia Madrid is seeking Democratic nomination for AG

Patricia Madrid was the first woman attorney in New Mexico to be elected to the District Court bench. This November, she hopes to be the first woman elected as the state's attorney general.

The Las Cruces native is running for the attorney general's position in June's Democratic primary, and was in Ruidoso on Tuesday to attend the regular meeting of the Lincoln County Democrats.

Madrid, in a visit to *The News*, said the people of New Mexico face an important decision in selecting their next attorney general. She said since the next state officials will be able to run for re-election and will probably be in office for eight years, the voters need to carefully select their officials.

"That's a lot of time to do something positive for the state and see through a lot of programs you might like to initiate," said Madrid. She said she has the best legal qualifications and experience to be the next attorney general.

At the age of 31, Madrid was elected as a District Court judge in Bernalillo County. She was subsequently selected by her fellow judges to serve as the Chief Presiding Judge for the Second Judicial District, the largest in New Mexico. Madrid said her background in

is the best qualified candidate for the attorney general's position.

"The attorney general is the chief law enforcement officer for the state and works closely with the district attorneys in prosecuting criminal cases," she said.

Madrid said as a chief judge she heard hundreds of serious felony cases and has sentenced both men and women to life in prison without parole.

"I'm a lady who is used to making tough decisions," Madrid said.

She said of the four Democrats running for attorney general, as far as she knows two have never tried a criminal case and the other has only been responsible for the deportation of illegal aliens and minor offenses.

Madrid said she also has trial experience in business litigation. She is currently an attorney specializing in civil litigation with the Albuquerque firm of Messina, Madrid and Maynez.

Madrid said, besides crime, the attorney general needs to address a number of other important issues to New Mexico. Control of utility rates, the environment and Indian law are three issues Madrid has made central to her campaign.

She said the attorney general is the chief representative of the state's rate payers. She said in this respect she would be a strong at-

torney general, independent of the utility companies.

"It is my belief my independence from these types of interest will allow me to be a strong effective advocate for the people against excessive utility rates," Madrid said.

She went on to say one of her opponents is actually a lawyer for one of the utility companies.

Madrid said New Mexico is a beautiful area, but because of its vast expanse of space, outsiders look to it as a place for garbage dumps, toxic waste dumps and private prisons where prisoners are imported to New Mexico.

She said as the attorney general she would work to stop the exploitation of New Mexico by these outsiders. She said the problem is not out of control yet, but lobbyists from the solid waste industry are starting to appear in Santa Fe. She said the attorney general needs to be vigilant with the problem and start immediately on the problem.

As the attorney general, Madrid said she would have people on her staff with knowledge of Indian law. She said in the future, outsiders might attempt to place garbage dumps on Indian lands which could compromise clean air and water statewide.

She said as the attorney general she would attempt to better the economy on Indian lands where they would not be vulnerable to

such developments.

"As the attorney general I would attempt to aid the Indian tribes in their taxation policies to prevent double taxation on Indian lands," Madrid said.

She said she would promote economic development on Indian lands instead of harming them as the current attorney general has.

Madrid said she is the only candidate for attorney general with connection to southern New Mexico.

Madrid was born and raised in Las Cruces. She graduated from the University of New Mexico in 1969 with degrees in English and philosophy. She received her law degree from the University of New Mexico School of Law in 1973 and was a member of the *New Mexico Law Review*.

"I think that this state has for too long been run by people who are only knowledgeable and sensitive to the needs of Albuquerque and Santa Fe," she said.

She said coming from a farming and ranching family she knows the importance of water to this area of the state. As the attorney general she said she would prevent other states from gaining any of New Mexico's water.

Madrid is married to attorney Michael Messina. They have an eight-year-old son, Giancarlo Anthony.

Take a trip through history at Ruidoso Public Library

Ruidoso residents will have the opportunity to experience the thrill of crossing the Santa Fe Trail in 1846 as actress-singer VanAnn Moore will portray Susan Shelby Magoffin at 3 p.m. Sunday, April 8, at the Ruidoso Public Library.

Sponsored by the Friends of the Library and the New Mexico Endowment for the Humanities, Moore will dramatize and bring to life the real-life character of Susan Shelby Magoffin.

Magoffin was only 18 years old when she set out with her husband, Samuel Magoffin, a fur trader, from Independence, Missouri, on one of the most memorable frontier journeys ever made by an American woman.

This journey was an extended honeymoon safari, since Susan was only a bride of eight months when they departed in June of 1846. She kept an excellent journal of her travels as their rugged trip took them across the great plains and then through the mountains of New Mexico to the capital of Santa Fe, where they stayed for six months.

Their journey continued south to Chihuahua for a stay of several months. Magoffin was hailed as the first white woman to ever traverse the Santa Fe Trail.

However, the rigors of losing two babies, coming down with yellow fever, and the severe conditions of

travel on the trail took a toll on her health and Susan Magoffin passed away at the age of 28.

Moore's background includes more than 30 major roles in musicals, plays and operas.

She graduated Cum Laude with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Communications and Theatre, and the "Best Actress of the Year" award

from the University of Colorado. She holds a Masters in Theatre and Music from the University of Denver. Moore has traveled the world on concert tours as a soprano soloist.

Her versatile performances require an eager audience and on most occasions, a piano and her accompanist.

Zia Natural Gas begins constructing new building

Natural gas customers in Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs may notice a change on their next monthly bill.

As of Sunday, April 1, Ruidoso Natural Gas Company will be changing its name to Zia Natural Gas Company.

According to manager Ken Johnston, the name change is all part of an ownership change which occurred in December 1988. That's when David Hamilton of Worland, Wyoming, bought the company. Hamilton owns five natural gas distributing companies in Wyoming, but the company in Ruidoso is his only company outside Wyoming.

The name is being changed from Ruidoso Natural Gas to Zia Natural Gas to give the company a more regional nature and identification.

Along with the name change, the company will soon be changing locations. It will soon be moving from its current location on Carrizo Canyon Road to its new location at the corner of Short Drive and Highway 70 in Ruidoso Downs.

Johnston conducted a special groundbreaking ceremony at the new building site on Tuesday, March 27. Accompanying Johnston at the groundbreaking were Ruidoso Downs Mayor C.L. "Bones" Wright, Ruidoso Mayor Victor Alonso, Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce executive director Jerry Watts and a representative of the contractor.

Johnston, who has been the gas company's manager for the past six years, said since the company serves both Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs, the owners looked for a lot on one of the main streets in town with access to both villages. The four-acre lot in Ruidoso Downs had the necessary space for both the company's new building and the needed storage area, Johnston said.

The new building will be approximately 75,000 square feet in size. It will have a red brick veneer outside and part of the building will have a second story. It will have a circular driveway and landscaping out front of the building and along the highway.

The building will cost \$750,000 and is scheduled for completion in August or September of this year.

Archer Building Company of El Paso, Texas, is the prime contractor. Eric Taylor of Archer Building Company said they will be hiring a number of local subcontractors to work on the project.

There will be three games each night, the first at 6:30 p.m., the second at 7:30 p.m. and the final game at 8:30 p.m.


The championship game will be at 8:30 p.m. next Thursday, April 12.



Trinity Site tour takes off Saturday

A tour of the Trinity Site, where the first atomic explosion occurred on July 16, 1945, will be available this Saturday, April 7.

The Stallion Gate entrance to the site will be open from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. to allow visitors to enter unescorted during these hours. The Stallion Gate is located on US Highway 880, 12 miles east of San Antonio and 54 miles west of Carizozo. Visitors will be allowed to exit anytime by using this gate.

For those who don't want to drive their own vehicle to the site, a tour will depart the Otero County Fair Grounds parking lot in Alamogordo at 8 a.m. on Saturday. This tour will enter through the Tularosa Gate at 8:30 a.m. and ar-

rive at the Trinity Site about 10 a.m. It will depart the Trinity Site parking lot by caravan at 12:30 a.m.

There is no charge or reservation required for the tour.

Tour participants may bring a picnic lunch. Food, soft drinks, souvenir, and drinking water will be available at the site. Pets are allowed, but have to be on a leash.

Everyone should ensure they have a full tank of gasoline and a spare tire prior to starting on the tour. Travel distance is approximately 150 miles.

While the degree of radiation is extremely low, less than that of a radium dial watch, pregnant women and parents of extremely

small children are advised that the decision to visit the actual site is their own responsibility.

There are a few rules and regulations the visitors to the Trinity Site are asked to follow.

No weapons or alcohol of any kind are permitted while on White Sands Missile Range. Photography on White Sands Missile Range is prohibited except at the Trinity Site.

No digging is permitted within the area and visitors may not dig or pick up Trinitite. Sand in the explosion crater was fused by the intense heat into a glasslike solid the color of green jade and called Trinitite.

Refuse must be placed in containers provided, and visitors are

asked to stay on marked road and do not deviate.

Persons wishing to depart from the range through a gate different from

the one through which they entered should advise the MP controlling parking at the site.

Semi-annual visits to the site are sponsored in April and October by the Alamogordo Chamber of Commerce and the White Sands Missile Range. The site remains

closed to the public except for those visits. It lies within the impact areas or safety zones for missiles fired into the northern part of the White Sands Missile Range.

Mayor Victor Alonso addresses the AARP

Ruidoso Mayor Victor Alonso spoke to about 40 members and guests of the Lincoln County chapter of American Association of Retired Persons Wednesday at a regular meeting.

The new mayor began his talk by stating that he and the village council had "hit the ground running" with four public meetings in two weeks since the village election.

Alonso said he and the council have been spent 40 hours working with department heads reviewing the budget and, as a result, cutting six and a half per cent of the budget for the last quarter of this year. This amounts to a \$260,000 reduction in the village budget.

According to a news release, Alonso said the review meetings also served as the best way for the new council members to learn how the municipal money is spent.

The village administration is now getting ready to plan the 1990-91 budget starting on May 24 and Alonso said he and the council hope

to reduce the budget by another ten per cent. In other words, Alonso said, they are trying to correlate the village income with the outgoing revenue.

In commenting on items of interest to the audience, Alonso said the new golf course, being built by private enterprise, is on a very aggressive schedule and is set to open in October 1990. The Radisson Hotel and the municipal civic center are both scheduled to open in July 1991.

Alonso also stated that Grindstone Dam is now holding water eight times better than the last time it was filled.

In regard to the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport, talks are now in progress about the possibility of airline service, according to Alonso.

The new mayor made a point to say that townspeople are invited and urged to attend council meetings where they may voice their opinions.

Fuelwood areas open

The Smokey Bear Ranger District will be opening several areas for personal use fuelwood gathering on April 2.

The first area to open will be the Big Pine area near Ancho. That area has dead/down fuelwood which is generally scarce and hard to locate.

The area that will be open is in a juniper push area which provides a somewhat heavier concentration of material. A permit is required for removal of all fuelwood.

A green fuelwood area will be opening the same date in the north Capitan area about 28 miles north-east of Capitan near Copland Canyon.

According to a news release provided by the forest service, the harvesting of standing trees as fuelwood creates openings in the piñon/juniper type. This provides additional forage for livestock and wildlife which is the management's

emphasis for the area as directed by the Lincoln Forest Plan.

The cost of a permit is \$10 a cord for dead/down wood and \$14 a cord for green wood. Fuelwood must be removed with a permit in possession and from the designated area shown on the permit.

Removal of fuelwood when soil conditions are wet and soil disturbance results is a violation of the terms of the permit. This can result in seizure of fuelwood and the issuance of a violation notice.

Maps of the open areas and fuelwood permits will be available beginning April 2 at the district office at 901 Mechem, Ruidoso. Office hours are 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Questions, comments and concerns regarding the Smokey Bear District Fuelwood Program are welcome and will be addressed by district personnel during business hours, reads the release.

Wheeler on Friday afternoon and was ordered held without bond for violation of probation and the court order.

"I put him in a vehicle, I picked up deputy John Hutchinson and while we were transporting him he escaped from the vehicle," said McSwane. "He jumped out of the car while it was moving down the road about 20 mph. I guess he decided to jump out of the car at 37 (and Gavilan)."

McSwane said he usually handcuffs prisoners, but he agreed not to restrain Culley because he is extremely claustrophobic.

"In order to get him to turn himself in, I advised him I would transport him and get his first appearance and during that time I would not handcuff him," said McSwane. "He was completely agreeable, real calm. As a matter of fact he was no problem at all."

"He broke out in a rash the last time he was in jail," added McSwane.

"I didn't expect any trouble from him because he had turned himself in," said McSwane.

Culley is described as 5'5", thin-faced with shoulder length blond hair and brown eyes. He weighs 135 pounds. His family lives in Carrizozo.

"He's not charged with any violent crime," said McSwane. "Now we have another warrant, another charge of escape from custody, a felony."

Culley was being taken to the Lincoln County Jail in Carrizozo when he escaped again.

"He doesn't like to go to jail, it's as simple as that."



You're already a day late, but it's not too late to complete in the 1990 census questionnaire you should have received in the mail.

The men who drafted the U.S. Constitution had good reasons for establishing this population count that takes place every 10 years. In a government based on representation, it's important to know the numbers on who lives where.

Facts and figures developed by the 1990 census will affect the entire nation. Political representation; federal, state and regional economic assistance plans; business and marketing projections; educational improvement programs; and regional growth analyses all hinge on the statistical profiles the census generates.

We live in an area that is changing all the time; we think it's growing. Those new and larger population figures will be important when we try for scheduled air service, transportation grants, small business loans and the like. Who knows? New Mexico may even get an additional congressional representative after this 1990 count.

That's why making the numbers as complete and accurate as possible is so very important. Don't be left out.

Without their grandiose chambers, microphones and electronic voting, the House and especially the Senate seemed curiously like we have learned it might have sounded at the First Continental Congress.

Here are a few of their *hon mots*, some more hon than others:

On Friday, March 16, just after convening:

Senate Majority Leader Tito Chavez: It is my intention, Mr. President, to have the Senate meet at 1 p.m. tomorrow and work until...

Senate Minority Leader Les Houston: We'd like to leave at 4:30. Some of us have serious obligations...

Chavez: At night?

Saturday afternoon, State Sen. William Davis, R-Albuquerque, who is running for attorney general: We need to remember, ladies and gentlemen, that when these laws go on the books, they're gonna be laws just like any other laws.

Later, Sen. Houston to Sen. Tito Chavez, as the Democrats head for a private caucus once more: You know, if the majority party would tape those caucuses, you could sell those boogers and have a nice fundraiser.

Chavez: Thank you. We'll keep

that in mind.

By Sunday night, tempers were flaring, at least in the Senate. They were squabbling over whether it was allowable, under the rules, to blast a "tabled indefinitely" bill out of a committee. (The answer: Yes. But the motion-to-blast failed.)

I. Gov. (President of the Senate) Jack Stahl to Senate President Pro Tempore Manny Aragon: We've gotten along for three years now but I'm going to tell you that I'm getting a little tired of you bouncing up and down every time anybody tries to speak.

Aragon: That's too bad.

Stahl: Well—fine. You just keep bouncing up and down. I'm just telling you, I'm getting a little tired of it.

Still later, on the tax bill:

Davis: I don't know what is so horrible about somebody standing up and shedding a little light on this \$50 million hickey we're going to pass on to the people of New Mexico.

State Sen. Shannon Robinson, D-Albuquerque: It's fine to have debate, but what we have here is sophistry. If you don't like the rules, you shouldn't play the game. We are an elected body that determines its own rules. We're here to vote on a tax increase. The majority rules—that's the American way, that's the democratic way, and that's the way this Senate is going to operate!

Still Later:

State Sen. Johnny Morrow, D-

Capulin: Mr. President, I've stood up five times to be recognized. You recognize one or two on this side and everybody on that (GOP) side. What do you have to do to be recognized in this Senate?

Stahl: I apologize. I didn't realize you wanted to be recognized, Senator.

Morrow: What did you think I was standing for—just to wave and say, "Hello, Jack?"

State Sen. Victor Marshall, R-Albuquerque: Maybe we should all go on retreat and take along a few bottles of "Expediter" and we'll get this thing worked out between us...

By Monday night, everyone was dragging. The House members were sitting in clumps in their auditorium, singing harmony versions of "Amazing Grace" and "Red River Valley" and when their Speaker hove into view—"Mañana Is Good Enough for Me." The House was waiting for the Senate to act.

And in the Senate, Senate Minority Whip Billy McKibben, R-Lovington, was as irrepresible as ever: Mr. President, I rise to say hats off to a certain Republican who went down and got a tax increase from the Democrats. He's got money for his education package and the Democrats are going to be stuck with a tax increase they're going to have to live with, and he's going to ride off into the sunset January 1 saying, "I picked a fine time to leave you, Lucille."

On The Record By Frankie Jarrell

A Carlsbad Current-Argus columnist wrote a column the other day, that I really wished I had written. His theme was "don't you just love it when ..." and it reminded me of all the things I "just loved" about our recent municipal elections.

Like, don't you just love it when somebody who has never spoken to you before, would even turn around and walk the other way to keep from speaking all of a sudden gets real friendly? That newfound friendliness is the first sign that somebody has been transformed from the honest guy who loved to hate you into somebody who is counting every single vote—by name!



Some things I really loved during the campaign:

...Like Hoss Garvey. He got eight votes, and the poll watchers tell me he didn't even show up to vote for himself.

...Like Bobby Thomason. He probably got a lot of votes when he came right out and said he didn't much like lawyers or insurance men.

...Like Councillor Al Junge. Even though he wasn't running for office, he campaigned harder than anybody in town. Al was upset about the mill levy passed by the council, and wanted to see that his fellow councillors were defeated. Al said the tax increase passed five-to-one, and he was the only one voting against it. This is the part I love: Al voted for the mill levy he's so mad about! Maybe he forgot, but I looked up the minutes and there it was. Only four councillors were present on June 21, 1989, councillors Elmer Pirelli and Jess Stinson were absent. And so it was Al, Tom McNeil, Larry Simon and J.D. James who cast the four "aye" votes. Here's what the minutes say after describing discussion on the budget, the proposed mill levy

and the uses for the money:

"Councillor Simon moved to adopt Resolution 89-18 and to implement the 5.425 mil levy to be dispersed as discussed. Councillor James seconded. Upon discussion Councillor Junge stated that further study and budget cuts should be done before implementing the mill levy. Councillor James stated that he would agree to the adoption if a portion of the mill levy goes for payroll increases. Mayor Davis called for the vote and the motion carried by roll call vote of all ayes. Mayor Davis stated that he was also in favor. Maybe there was a mistake in the minutes? I don't think so, because the council, including Al, approved those minutes, with "no exceptions," at the next meeting.

...Like John A. White, who used "freedom of the press" as his watchword throughout his campaign for the council. Is this the same John A. White who kept trying to conduct executive sessions when he served as an appointee to Planning and Zoning?

...Like Charles Hawthorne, our municipal judge, who didn't know you had to live in town to serve, but if you did have to live in the village limits that was OK, too, because his intention was to move to Ruidoso anyway. As a matter of fact he already had moved, and it was really none of my business anyway.

...Like the people in town who were set on their ears when The News endorsed candidates for municipal offices. The very ideal! Since newspapers have for years made their choices for office known through endorsements, it kind of surprised me when so many folks were shocked. And, no, it's not the end of the world if our candidates don't win. Just like voters we review all the candidates' records (not just what they say, but what they have done) and make our choices according to who we believe is best for the job. If the voters disagree, we can live with that. That's democracy.

Don't you just love it?

DEAR EDITOR:






