



Cats and dogs crowd local animal shelter

One problem sometimes leads to another. And recently, the Village of Ruidoso has suffered from the problem of a number of dogs running loose.

This has been a big problem, but according to Ruidoso Animal Control Officer Mark Hughes and Randy Basch of the Lincoln County Humane Society, the really big problem comes about when the dogs, which are loose, produce unwanted litters of puppies.

A lot of people think it is all right to let a female dog run loose but when the dog gives birth to a litter they think the Humane Society should take care of them, Hughes said.

Basch said people are under the impression there are a number of

happy families waiting to adopt these litters. He said this isn't always the case and people need to understand the problem the Humane Society faces.

He said young animals are highly susceptible to diseases such as parvo virus and distemper. He said even though he inoculates every litter the Humane Society receives there is a 10-day period before the inoculation takes effect. Basch said during that 10-day period a healthy animal might be exposed to a sick animal at the shelter. With the limited amount of kennels available and overcrowded conditions, there is no way to isolate both animals from the sick animals.

Basch said the Humane Society, which operates all operations, struggles to care for and feed the animals. It is the society and adopt-experts who care for the

According to Hughes, a vet's bill can run as high as \$400 and an animal has only about a 50 percent chance of surviving distemper.

Basch said many people will bring an animal or a litter to the shelter and say they are not sick. But he added it is easy to tell the animal is sick just by looking at them.

Basch said he has vaccinated several healthy animals which people have brought to the shelter and then asked the people to keep the animal at home more work to be done. Some people have agreed and some people just didn't care and dumped the animals over to the shelter anyway, Basch said.

He went on to say the Humane Society has a very busy shelter that is several days in the water that

Visitors return to Ground Zero site

The caravan of cars all went toward the same isolated spot in a region called the Jordana del Muerto by the early Spanish settlers: the Journey of Death. The passengers were on their way to witness the place where the country, and the world, was abruptly ushered into the nuclear age.

Almost 1,000 people Saturday visited the place where the first atomic bomb was exploded.

Trinity site, the spot where the first atomic bomb was tested at 5:29:45 a.m. Mountain War Time, July 16, 1945, was open to the public Saturday. All that remains of this historic explosion are a footing from the 100-foot tower from which the bomb was suspended, and some radioactive trinitite lying in the original crater beneath a protective covering.

The site is open to the public twice each year on the first Saturdays of April and October. Visitors may arrive there on their own if they enter the White Sands Missile Range at the Stallion Station entrance about 53 miles west of Carrizozo, or via escorted caravan from Alamogordo, entering through

the Oscura Bombing Range. There is no admission fee.

Ground Zero, the area where the bomb was exploded, is fenced off and marked with signs warning of radioactivity.

A brochure presented to visitors at Stallion Station entrance stated the radiation in the Ground Zero area is about 10 times greater than the region's natural background radiation. If a visitor stayed in the fenced area for an hour, he or she would be exposed to one-half to one milliroentgen.

The average U.S. adult receives about 90 milliroentgens each year from natural and medical sources.

The 51,500 acre Trinity site area was declared a National Historic Landmark in 1975. The site includes the base camp where the scientists and support group lived; Ground Zero where the bomb was placed for the explosion; and the McDonald ranch house where the plutonium core to the bomb was assembled.

Visitors may visit Ground Zero and the McDonald ranch house. While driving to the site, visitors pass by a half-buried, broken down instrumentation bunker west of Ground Zero within a quarter mile.

From the parking lot, visitors may take a short bus trip to see the McDonald ranch house, built in 1913 by Franz Schmidt. The ranch was abandoned in 1942 when the land was taken by the Alamogordo Bombing and Gunnery Range. The house remained empty until Manhattan Project personnel arrived in 1945.

One room of the house was cleaned and sealed with plastic for the construction of the plutonium core used for the bomb. Radiation detectors were placed around the house to detect excess levels of radiation.

And in the event problems arose, jeeps were parked close by the house, ready for a quick get-away if necessary.

The events leading up to the first atomic test began in June, 1942, with the formation of the Manhattan Project. The project began because intelligence reports claimed the Germans were about to construct their own atomic weapon.

Plutonium for the weapon was produced in Hanford, Washington, and the uranium 235 was generated at Oak Ridge, Tennessee. The bomb itself was constructed in Los Alamos

by Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer and the scientists at Los Alamos. It consisted of two atomic bombs, one with a uranium core and one with a plutonium core. The scientists were certain the uranium model would work without testing.

The plutonium weapon worked by compressing the plutonium into a critical mass, which will sustain a chain reaction. This compression would occur after the detonation of conventional explosives surrounding the core. The TNT used to initiate the nuclear reaction was designed and placed so it would explode all at the same time and drive its force toward the center of the bomb and the plutonium core, smashing the plutonium and initiating the necessary chain reaction.

In the atomic explosion, the chain reaction accelerates as atoms are split, releasing neutrons and extreme amounts of energy. The escaping neutrons strike and split more atoms, creating more neutrons and still more energy.

This all occurs in a millionth of a second and creates the tremendous explosive power of an atomic

According to Ruidoso meteorologist Bill Hostetter, today's forecast is for sunny skies and warm temperatures with westerly winds gusting to 25 mph in the afternoon. Tonight will be clear and cooler and Tuesday will be fair and mild.

have been there for two years. Basch stressed he tries to keep all the animals for adoption but he said if an animal cannot be adopted because it is sick, injured or unadoptable, it will have to be put to sleep.

According to Basch, from 50 to 75 animals a month are put to sleep.

The Lincoln County Humane Society Shelter on Gavilan Canyon Road has 24 kennels for dogs and 14 for cats. As of Friday, April 6, there were 63 dogs and 27 cats at the shelter. Both Hughes and Basch said the overcrowding at the shelter is nothing new, it stays overcrowded 365 days a year.

Each month the shelter receives around 127 new animals and Basch said the busy season has not even hit yet. He said when the racetrack closes for the season, the shelter is bombarded with animals.

During the warm weather of summer and early fall, Basch said the shelter has received two or three litters, of five to six animals, a day.

Unwanted litters not only show up at the shelter in warm weather, but in cold weather as well. Basch

said someone placed a litter outside the shelter on Tuesday night. The next morning the animals were covered with frost. Basch said he would prefer people bring animals by the shelter during business hours, but he said he is on the premises most times 24 hours a day.

Hughes said he has picked up and brought to the shelter, six puppies from six different locations in town that are obviously from the same litter. He said someone deliberately took the litter and released the animals throughout town.

"They all end up here," Hughes said referring to the Humane Society.

The more animals the shelter receives, the more problems the Humane Society has with disease, overcrowding and funds.

"As soon as they come in that door, they cost us money," Basch said.

The Humane Society does receive some money through adoption fees and impound fees, but the amounts are small and the shelters main source of funds continues to be donations.

It costs \$70 to adopt an un-neutered female dog and \$60 for an

un-neutered male dog. Of that \$70, the majority goes toward the neutering of the animal, rabies shots and village licenses, the Humane Society receives \$12. The cost is \$57.50 for un-neutered female cats and \$40.50 for un-neutered males.

Adopting neutered animals at the shelter, costs \$32.50 for females and \$30 for males. The Humane Society receives the same \$12 for the animal.

The shelter does receive funds from the Village of Ruidoso for every animal which Hughes brings in and it takes care of.

Hughes advises anyone who is missing an animal to get in touch with him at the Ruidoso Police Department or Basch at the Humane Society.

It costs a pet owner a \$25 impound fee plus \$5 a day board to get an animal out of the shelter. The Humane Society requires an owner provide proof of rabies vaccination and village license before releasing the animal. If there is none, the animal will be held at the shelter and the owner will have to pay for the vaccination or license.

Basch said people who lose pets need to be aware the shelter will hold an animal for 72 hours. If the

weapon, and temperature greater than found on the sun.

The location of the Trinity site was chosen because the property was already government owned, and its isolation in the Jordana del Muerto made the site very suitable for secrecy, but still kept it close to Los Alamos.

The bomb was assembled underneath the tower at Ground Zero on July 13, 1945. On July 14, the bomb was raised to the top of the tower. Nervous workers piled mattresses underneath the bomb as it went higher up the tower in case it fell for some reason.

The original detonation time was

set at 4 a.m., but this was delayed because of rain and lightning storms. At the time the scientists were already aware that rain and wind would carry the radioactive fallout too far away, and the rainy weather would also interfere with observing the test.

No information was released on the test until after the first weapon was used on Japan, but area residents knew something was going on. The test explosion reportedly broke windows up to 120 miles away, and could be felt up to 160 miles. The Army explanation at the time was that the munitions storage area exploded in an accident.

Although the 19 kiloton explosion made only a slight depression in the ground, the heat of the blast melted the desert sand and created a green glassy substance called trinitite.

Most of the trinitite was removed, but visitors can see some of the radioactive material through an enclosed structure at Ground Zero. All the manned bunkers were bulldozed and burned after the test.

Common questions asked by visitors include why the site was called Trinity. One story comes from a response made by Oppenheimer while reciting a devotional poem by John Donne containing the line "Batter my heart, three person'd God ..."

Another common misconception is the bomb was dropped. Not the case. The bomb was stationary at the top of the tower when it exploded.

The first Trinity site open house was conducted in September, 1953, with about 650 people attending. A few years later a group from Tularosa visited the site on the anniversary of the explosion to conduct a religious ceremony and pray for peace.

Subsequent visits have been made in April and October because the desert temperatures are too great during July for visits.

Building totals a half million dollars

After two months of increases, the number of building permits issued by the Village of Ruidoso decreased in the month of March.

A total of 22 building permits for \$556,183.97 were issued in March by the village, down eight from the total of 30 permits for \$939,950 issued in March 1989.

The decrease came in the number of single family developments and commercial additions and alterations.

Five of the 22 permits, valued at \$437,604, were for single family developments, 13 of the permits for \$82,579 were for residential additions and alterations. There were no commercial permits issued and only four permits issued commer-

cial additions and alterations, at a value of \$36,000.

The Federal Home Loan Bank of Dallas is a \$27 billion bank serving credit and correspondence banking needs for the five-state area including New Mexico, Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana and Mississippi.

The bank board is composed of 15 directors, six appointed by the federal government.

Volunteers needed for Earth Day

Volunteers are still encouraged to sign up to participate in the Rio Bonito Riparian Enhancement Task Force for Earth Day 1990.

Task force volunteers will assist in important improvement projects along the Rio Bonito, Bonito Lake and Salado Creek. The scheduled activities include tree planting, streambank stabilization, fence construction, hiking trail maintenance and litter clean-up.

Volunteers will begin the day at 8 a.m. Saturday, April 21, at the Bonito and Fort Stanton base camp areas. Work begins at 9 a.m. and continues until 4 p.m. Participants will be treated to a barbecue dinner at 4:30 p.m. at the Fort Stanton base camp area.

The Rio Bonito Riparian area is a unique and important ecosystem, providing food, water and cover for wildlife, natural flood control and recreational opportunities, said a news release from task force chairman Dan Baggao.

Healthy riparian areas are especially critical to New Mexico because they comprise less than two percent of the state's land, said the release.

The watershed begins in the White Mountain Wilderness at the headwaters of the Rio Bonito. From there, the stream tumbles down the mountain and enters Bonito Lake. It then flows eastward across private lands and crosses the Fort Stanton reservation.

Through its course, the Rio Bonito flows through lands managed by the U.S. Forest Service, the City of Alamogordo, Bureau of Land Management, State Land Office and private individuals.

Riparian areas are the green zones along rivers and streams and around springs, bogs, wet meadows, lakes and ponds. They are unique and among the most productive and important of ecosystems in New Mexico, said a news release from the New Mexico Game and Fish Department.

These areas absorb and reduce the energy of flood water, provide food, water, cover and shade for many wildlife species and are focal

points of recreation.

Specific projects in the day-long event include planting willows and watercress, construction of erosion control structures, in-stream improvement structures, streambank stabilization, juniper control and hiking trail maintenance.

Volunteers may also continue work on the project on Sunday, April 22, which is the official day for Earth Day, 1990.

Edith Coe Rigsby, daughter of Lincoln County pioneer Frank Coe, was one of the founding members and served as the club's first president.

In those early days, the club met

in members' homes or at the Navajo Lodge. One of the club's first projects was to start a Ruidoso library.

The women took part in providing more books for the local school and also purchased playground equipment.

One of the Woman's Club's proudest achievements was the purchase and installation of a large school bell.

The Year of The Apricot





EDITOR:

Last week's "On the Record", an opinion column, once more presents us with the freedom of the press issue. I am subject to a personal, rather vindictive, attack by the editor, but my response will be printed or not at the whim of the newspaper.

What is wonderful about an opinion column is that you don't need any facts. You just need to be clever. "John A. White ... who kept trying to conduct executive sessions ... on P&Z".

I will try to respond in a reasonable manner although I very much resent even having to write this letter. While on P&Z I did suggest we conduct workshops, open to the public, prior to regular meetings. I did suggest we conduct some evening meetings so that interested working persons could attend. I did suggest a committee of P&Z be formed to conduct on-site reviews of properties requesting variances. They could then make recommendations, along with the administrator, and we might have had more informed voting procedures. I do not believe you will

find, if you bother to check it out, that I had any history of "trying to conduct executive sessions." I think Mr. Richards, the current planning administrator, could verify these statements. Even though he and I differed at times, I believe the previous chairperson, Mr. Smith, could also verify the situation.

My problem is I believe you are aware of this, so the personal attack is a mystery to me. Except that I tried continuously to bring to light the biased reporting by The News (I'm beginning to think The Not Necessarily The News is more appropriate) in favor of the incumbents and that brings us to the freedom of the press issue.

During the election campaign (you were out of town), in order to meet a deadline on Letters to the Editor, I hand delivered a letter to The News challenging them on an issue of freedom of the press. I allege freedom of the press to The News is freedom to "report" in a biased manner when the bias should be confined to the OP-Ed page where it belongs. In the same letter I named the candidates The News

would endorse. Not difficult to do because the biased reporting had been so obvious. On that point, your allegation that the town was "set on their ears" because of your endorsements seems odd. It was quite common knowledge The News was supporting the incumbents.

Nevertheless, that letter was not published. So in spite of your announced policy of openness in your Letters to the Editor policy, and you do reserve the right to edit, it does seem a bit more like censorship.

So an explanation or verification or a basis for your allegations as to my conduct on P&Z should be printed. If I am wrong, I should be called on it. If not, I would appreciate a retraction.

EDITOR'S NOTE: From the official minutes of the July 6, 1987, Planning and Zoning Commission

meeting: "White suggested placing an executive session on the next regular scheduled meeting to discuss personnel."

From The News story published on July 9, 1987, over that July 6 meeting: "During discussions after regular business, Commissioner John A. White asked how members can go into executive session to discuss personnel, and Underwood said ... technically the group has no personnel."

From the official minutes of the November 16, 1987, Planning and Zoning Commission meeting: "White asked (attorney Mike) Runnels for clarification concerning open meeting laws and whether the commission could meet on a specific issue without having to call a public meeting. Runnels responded that he had no knowledge of any state statutes or village ordinances which would permit the body of the planning commission to meet other than in an open public meeting. White then stated that there had been a tremendous amount of turnover of staff, and he stated that the

commission may have a problem with staff that may not come to the attention of the city council; he also mentioned the need for certain reports which would be helpful to the commission. He asked whether that would make a difference for calling a meeting not open to the public."

From The News report published November 19, 1987, over that November 16 meeting: "In the discussion phase of the meeting, Commissioner White continued to press for an opportunity to speak in closed session of problems with village staff. Acting village attorney Mike Runnels explained the Open Meetings Law to White, who was advised to take personnel problems to the Ruidoso Village Council."

Capitol Comments by Kate McGraw

April 9 Will Be The Anniversary...

Of the fall of the peninsula of Bataan on the Philippine Island of Luzon. It is a date that all New Mexicans should know and remember.

Bataan Peninsula, about 30 miles long and 15 miles wide, was the scene of bitter fighting between the American and Philippine soldiers defending it and the invading Japanese Army that spring of 1942. When the island was surrendered, nearly 37,000 Americans and Filipinos were taken prisoner, and marched 70 miles from Mariveles, at the tip of the peninsula, to San Fernando, a concentration camp for prisoners of war on the main island. Hundreds of men died on that march.

The survivors of the Death March, as it is called by veterans, lived in sordid deprivation and were treated cruelly by their captors until the Philippines were retaken by American Forces in February 1945. Many thousands more died in the camps before freedom came...

Why Should New Mexicans Care Particularly?

...Because among the defenders of Bataan, among those who died and endured the battle, the Death March and the camps, was a whole unit of the New Mexico National Guard.

In fact, it was the loss of that whole unit at one blow that prompted the War Department to split up subsequent Guard units sent into combat, so at least the department wouldn't have to be dealing with a whole statefull of grieving parents, wives and children...

I Have Been Privileged To Know...

...At least two Bataan veterans of that National Guard Unit. One was the late state Sen. Tom Lee, a Navajo. One is state Rep. Thomas Foy, D-Silver City, who came back and got a

law degree and established a dynasty of attorneys in Grant County.

I can say of both men that they were/are soft-spoken, not blustery or chest-beating ... not "Professional Veterans" ... they did what they had to do, and then got on with their lives. They were proud of their comrades, and loved their country...

But It Was Important, And Healing...

...To Sen. Lee and Rep. Foy and to the other Bataan survivors that New Mexico established a special monument in their honor. The old Capitol, when it was replaced by the current State Capitol in 1966, was renamed the Bataan Memorial Building. A memorial of sorts had existed outside that building since the fall of Bataan. It was the molded-concrete symbol of their unit that the New Mexico National Guard had made while they were in training at El Paso before going overseas.

In 1966 the Bataan Veterans Organization added an eternal flame and a flagpole and a plaque to explain the marker.

Here is what that plaque says:

TO THE MEMORY OF THE MEN OF THE 200TH. This marker served to designate the location of the Regimental Headquarters of the 200th Coast Artillery (Anti-Aircraft), New Mexico National Guard, while stationed at Fort Bliss, Texas, during 1941. It was made by the men of that regiment. Later that year, those same soldiers participated in heroic defense of the Philippine Islands on Bataan Peninsula and were captured when it fell. They took part in the infamous Death March, then went behind the curtain of secrecy of prison camps imposed by their captors, the Japanese. Anxiety and uncertainty was the lot of their relatives and friends. This marker was moved from Fort Bliss and placed on the State

Capitol grounds at Santa Fe. Made by their own hands and thus representing an intimate link of memory, this marker became a shrine where friends and loved ones prayed for their deliverance. To perpetuate this sacred memory and to honor the heroic men of the 200th, both living and dead, the people of New Mexico dedicate this monument.

How Could Anyone Read That...

...And not be moved? Well, some can. When I walked by the Bataan Memorial the other day, I noticed that there were scuffs from skateboard tires all over it, and someone had used red and black spray paint to vandalize the bronze plaque with the message above.

The skateboard marks don't worry me so much -- a little Comet and water will clean them off. But I really don't know how to get spray paint off bronze without ruining it.

Oh, I know, in a general sense, who it was. We have a teenaged gang of would-be "Anarchists" in the Capital City. They painted that "A" in a circle that they have decided stands for anarchy.

These children are obviously deprived of things far more important than mere material goods. They obviously have no parents or teachers worth having -- none, at least, who can teach them the importance of knowing our collective history, of respecting the actions of the people who've come before us.

To respect the dead is to respect life, to honor it and acknowledge its preciousness. These vandals don't know that, and that's their loss. They are to be pitied, because they have no resources.

Without respect for the men of the 200th, their families and friends, these poor children will never know what it means to be a New Mexican...
