Refrigerator wins cool million bucks

RUIDOSO DOWNS- Refrigerator, running every bit as big as his namesake, exploded away from an elite field of nine other juveniles en route to a smashing victory in Monday's 32nd running of the All American Futurity.

Refrigerator, the horse James Helzer purchased for \$150,000 in June and then supplemented to the All American Futurity for an additional \$50,000, was simply smashing in victory. He outran undefeated filly Quick Fun, the runnerup in the race, by 1 3/4-lengths of daylight, and in the process shattered the stakes record by covering the distance in a sizzling 19.39.

Unfortunately, the world's richest quarter horse race — which was worth \$1 million to the winner — was marred by a nasty incident about 50 yards into the 400 yard dash.

The betting favorite, Strait To The Bank — winner of the July 15 Rainbow Futurity — hit the inside rail and threw jockey Jacky Martin onto the fence. Martin, who was seeking his sixth All American victory, escaped injury.

All American day, which has been so glamorous for the team of trainer Jack Brooks and Martin over the years, was lined by a black cloud all the way around. Brooks, who also qualified a two-horse entry for owner Walt Fletcher, had one of his horses, Special Record, break down following the finish of the race.

While the last two All Americans belonged to Brooks, this one belonged to trainer Dwayne "Sleepy" Gilbreath, who also captured the prestigious event in 1983

with On A High.

"You've got to be surprised to win an All American that easily," said the soft-spoken Gilbreath, a Frisco, Texas, native. "But he ran a super race."

When asked what were the immediate plans for the powerful Oklahoma bred son of Rare Jet, Gilbreath said simply, "We're going to take him home and pet him."

Everybody will probably have to stand in line behind Helzer, who took a gamble with this horse, and hit the jackpot.

"I liked this gelding the first time I saw him," said Helzer, who just missed making the finals in 1984 when Dash For Destiny logged the 11th fastest qualifying time. "He is a fierce competitor. He just had a look about him that he didn't want to get beat."

His final time shattered the 400-yard stakes record of 19.65 set by Mr Kid Charge in 1971.

"He went super the whole way," said jockey Kip Didericksen, who was riding in his third All American and aboard his first winner of the race. "He broke sharp. I thought it was all over from the word go. He ran a lot better than he ever has before."

Refrigerator, who has now won seven of nine career starts, increased his lifetime earnings to \$1,089,903.

Jockey Jerry Nicodemus, who was riding in his record 21st All American aboard second favorite Quick Fun, made no excuses for his filly.

"I was very proud of her. She ran a big race," Nicodemus said. "I can't make any excuses for her. The win-

ner ran a jam-up race."

See Me Gone checked in third, a half-length behind Quick Fun. Ahfax was another 3/4-length behind in fourth.

In the All American Futurity First Consolation, Royal Bushwhacker pinned a nose decision on Signed To Fly in the \$315,000 400-yard dash.

Royal Bushwhacker, who had captured the Grade I Firecracker Futurity at Delta Downs July 4, broke perfectly under regular jockey Alvin Brossette. The duo then outdueled Signed To Fly — winner of the Grade I Kansas Futurity here May 27 — and jockey Alex Baldillez to the wire.

Royal Bushwhacker, who is owned by John Soileau of Grand Isle, Louisiana, and trained by Mike Lyles, covered the distance in 19.70. Royal Bushwhacker has now captured five of nine career starts. He increased his earnings to \$182,906.

Signed To Fly, who is trained by Arnold Simmons, finished a neck in front of Breeze By Yawl. Hot Colours was another head back in fourth.

In the \$29,800 550 Championship, Aloulou outbroke the field and led every step of the way en route to a 1/2-length victory. Aloulou, who had finished 10th in the World's Championship Classic in his last start, was ridden by Larry Payne and is trained by Dwayne Gilbreath.

Aloulou, who has won seven of 17 career outings, covered the 550 yards in a brisk final time of 26.93.

Warriors lose season opener — gain respect

It was a perfect way to start. First play, first game, first season for Mike Speck as a head coach. A 99-yard kickoff return for a touchdown on a beautifully executed, double-handoff, run-for-glory sprint for six. The stuff of dreams.

But this was reality. When the Ruidoso Warriors received the kickoff from the Artesia Bulldogs last Friday night, speedy senior halfback Chris Torres blazed from one goal line to the other to ignite the large home crowd and provide a stunning introduction to the 1990 football season.

But the shocked visitors, led by former Warrior head coach Cooper Henderson, refused to panic. They went on to score 27 unanswered points before two late touchdowns by the Warriors ended the game, 27-19.

It was an impressive win for the Bulldogs, a tough loss for the Warriors, and a great night of prep football for fans on both sides of the field. As predicted, it was an exciting, hard-fought, well-coached, and dramatic game. Both teams have a right to be proud.

The visitors, clad in orange and

black, led in most statistical categories, including first downs (18 to 8), rushing yards (180 to 45), and total offense (323 to 220).

The hosts, wearing blue and gold, led in passing yards (175 to 143) and big plays (a 99-yard kickoff return, a 50-yard touchdown pass, a successful onside kick, etc.), and they had fewer penalties (six for 60 yards, compared to nine for 70 yards for Artesia).

Bulldog senior quarterback Chris Reynolds had a big game. He hit 15 of 29 passes for 143 yards and one touchdown. He threw one interception. He also ran the ball very well, mainly on the quarterback draw.

Warrior junior quarterback Manny Guardiola produced some big plays and some exciting near-misses. He completed nine of 25 passes for 175 yards and one touchdown. He also threw one interception.

Senior transfer Heath Huey performed well in his first game as a Warrior. From his split end position he made six catches for 130 yards and one touchdown. Warrior coaches have selected him as the Offensive Player of the Week.

Senior safety Jamie Candelaria

has been named the Defensive Player of the Week. He made, for example, a thrilling goal-line solo tackle to prevent a Bulldog touchdown on a fourth down at the 1-yard line in the third quarter.

Warrior coaches also have recognized junior Tony Aguilar, who threw his 5'4" 135-pound body at opponents with reckless abandon. His big hits on Bulldog punt receivers and an onside kick recovery have earned him the Kicking Game Player of the Week.

The fourth Warrior category of recognition is the Scout Team Player of the Week. This week the call has been given to junior transfer Richard Rippey, whose hard work in practice helped prepare the starters for the game.

The kickoff return by Torres was one of those plays that worked exactly as the coaches drew it up. In the middle of a three-deep alignment, senior fullback Kief Johnson caught the ball at the 1-yard line and ran straight ahead. At about the 15, he handed off to Huey, who was standing with his back to the onrushing defenders. Then senior halfback Steve Dankert and Torres

Ruidoso Downs Race Track recorded crowds of 11,132 on Labor Day, Monday, and 10,408 on Sunday. Saturday track attendance was 7,953.

Most of those visitors, who come to the area not only for the races, but also for a "last summer fling" in the cool pines before schools begin, arrived by vehicle. Those vehicles filled village streets and area highways over this busy

weekend, with Midtown parking at a premium.

In spite of the great number of people and vehicles in the area, the Ruidoso Police Department had a fairly quiet weekend, with the night sheets dotted with reports of "suspicious activities," animals and public relations (assistance) calls.



Third time is the charm ... council picks another architect

When the Ruidoso Village Council selects a designer for the municipal civic events center this week, it will be the third time proposals from architects have been considered.

The Village Council and its attorney recently negotiated out of its contract with the architectural firm selected in the second set of proposals. Holmes, Sabatini and Eeds was selected that time and entered into a contract for \$81,000 to design a civic center at least 12,000 square feet capable of handling around 700 people and with two additional building phases.

Since then, a new council and mayor took office and determined the village needs a bigger center. This council also determined, mainly through a presentation they heard from Speed Fab-Crete of Kennedale, Texas, near Fort Worth, Texas, that the available money will go further if the center is designed for pre-fab or tilt-wall.

The council asked the architect-

tural firm to give that construction process special consideration, and later paid the firm off for \$61,000. Mayor Victor Alonso said the village and architects had "irreconcilable differences."

Alonso said the \$61,000 was not wasted since the village owns the plans for the first phase. However, a committee appointed to make recommendations on the civic center, told the mayor and council last Tuesday that those plans are inadequate.

The first set of proposals was received by the previous council and all were rejected.

This time the council is reviewing 11 proposals, with plans to interview the top three today. A special meeting had been called for today to review those proposals, but that meeting was cancelled and the reviews were conducted privately by the councilors.

Apparently the village manager and the purchasing agent will compile the councilors' ratings to come up with the top three.

In past projects the proposals

have been opened and logged in an open meeting. Village manager Charles Norwood told The News that the contents of proposals are private until a firm is selected, and so these 11 proposals apparently were opened by village staff.

Both Norwood and purchasing agent Fonda Hazel quoted from state statutes, saying that the contents of any proposal shall not be disclosed until after the negotiations are completed. Proposals for services differ from bids in that the village bases its decision on a set of criteria and doesn't have to select the lowest price.

Although the top three firms will be invited to participate in interviews, according to state law, the negotiations don't take place until the top firm is selected.

The 11 firms that submitted proposals this go-round include several that offered proposals during the second round when Holmes, Sabatini and Eeds was chosen. Those making proposals again include Alley, Mendez, Shelton of Las Cruces; Leeds-Herkenhoff, Inc.,

of Albuquerque; Chambers, Campbell and Partners, Inc., of Albuquerque; Waggoner Architects of Roswell; Stanley J. French and David Smith of Ruidoso.

Speed Fab-Crete of Kennedale, Texas, the firm that was invited to make a presentation to the council before the specifications were rewritten to include pre-fab, made a proposal the second go-round, but didn't submit a proposal this third time.

Another Fort Worth, Texas, firm, Lee Stuart and Associates, is among the 11 design firms this time. That firm and Speed Fab-Crete are apparently neighbors, since they have the same street address.

Other new firms submitting proposals this third time include Nims, Calvani and Associates of Albuquerque; Carroll, Dusing and Rand of El Paso, Texas; Masterworks Architects Inc. of Albuquerque; John R. Phenix and Associates of Ruidoso; and Nolan and Associates of Alamogordo.

Maurice "Don" Blaugrund

That resort, Alto Village, is a 3,000-acre private residential community and country club developed by Blaugrund and the Lakeside Corporation.

He is survived by his sister, Ann Blaugrund Marks, a nephew, Alan Marks, and a niece, Jan Marks.

Blaugrund was a World War II Army Air Corps veteran.

Slow down, say Lincoln residents

Lincoln residents ought to write down the license plates of speeders and report them to the State Police.

That's the recommendation from the New Mexico State Highway Department as a solution to the speeding problem through historic Lincoln.

In a letter to Governor Garrey Carruthers, Ann Buffington, president of the Lincoln County Historical Society, requested the speed limit in Lincoln be reduced from 35 mph to 25 mph.

The request came after a seismographic study indicated heavy

truck traffic through Lincoln was contributing to accelerated deterioration of the buildings there, in particular the old Lincoln County Courthouse.

But the highway department's response doesn't address the issue, Buffington told The News.

"It's one of their little evasive answers they give without doing anything," she said.

Buffington's letter to the governor sought to inform the highway department of the damage caused to historical buildings by heavy truck traffic.

"The study clearly demonstrates a direct correlation between the

speed and the amount of damage done," Buffington said in her letter.

The letter was referred from Carruthers' office to the highway department and a response was sent from that office to "Mr. Buffington," in spite of the fact it stated Ann Buffington at the top.

In the response, John J. Nitzel, traffic bureau chief, stated a speed study was conducted in the Lincoln area in June 1989. The study indicated there were no reported accidents in the years 1986, 1987 and 1989.

Pedestrian safety was another factor proponents of a reduced speed limit are concerned with.

However, the area under study was the main historic district through town. Several traffic accidents have occurred in the outer zone, including one with a fatality in 1988.

Nitzel also stated if the speed limit was arbitrarily reduced, the number of speeders would increase. Therefore, stricter enforcement of the speed limit is suggested.

A petition of Lincoln residents is under consideration to be sent to the governor, said Buffington.

"We've had absolutely no cooperation from the highway department," she said.

Midtown planners are on the job

John Mason, planning engineer for Carter & Burgess, Inc. of Fort Worth, Texas, spent the Labor Day weekend looking over Ruidoso with a view toward redevelopment of the downtown area.

He also took in some of the special entertainment events of the holiday period. It wasn't all work and no play.

Carter and Burgess, an engineering, planning and surveying firm, recently was retained by MainStreet Ruidoso through the Village of Ruidoso to accomplish a renewal and redevelopment plan for the Midtown area of Ruidoso.

The 1990 New Mexico Legislature approved \$40,000 for the project, but the New Mexico Highway Commission reduced that amount to \$36,000.

Urban design is Mason's first love and specialty. Ruidoso grew so quickly, certain problems developed. Pedestrian and auto movement are problems, Mason says.

"This is unique area, and I love it," he declared.

Mason has been involved with urban renewal since the 1960s. He has done work in Tucumcari,

Deming and Gallup in New Mexico.

Later in September a team composed of land planners, architect, civil engineer, hydrologist and electrical engineer will move into Ruidoso to query merchants in the affected area and others about their concerns and desires for the Midtown area.

Mary Maul, MainStreet Ruidoso project director, says she is looking for downtown space for the team which will be "highly visible" to the public for several days.

"We'll be looking at what we can do and where we're going with it," Mason says.

A space 10 by 20 or 10 by 30 is

needed in a Midtown building, Mason says.

The team will be looking at foot and auto traffic patterns, sidewalk renovation, public restroom facilities, a possible riverwalk, landscaping and many other facets of urban renewal.

P&Z to consider development plan

Two new business items are on the agenda for the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission meeting scheduled for 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, September 4, in Village Hall.

C. Warren Franklin, veterinarian, is seeking conditional use of Block 1, Lot 2 Airport West, second addition. The address is 1216 Mechem.

Franklin is asking to establish a veterinary hospital and residence in the commercial district. Franklin intends to use part of the Fox Plaza building as a residence.

Franklin intends to operate an animal hospital and possibly a boarding facility for small animals. "Of course, this activity will be inside the present building where the office of the lumber yard was located."

"I will need to have recovery stalls and/or runs for large animals with a portion of the pens covered. ... the facility will have an oper-

ating room for large animals ... the remainder of the building will be modified for a residence to be occupied by myself and my family."

A second new business item is a request for vacation of plat in the Deer park Woods Subdivision at Alto.

Richard G. and Ann H. Scribner request the action and the replating of three lots.

Platted areas to be vacated include Tract 1 consisting of 24,3401 plus acres and Tract 2 consisting of 86,5485 acres.

"The property in question is the subject of complaint for declaration of judgment No. CV90-145 in which the Village of Ruidoso is named as defendant. I have therefore requested that John Underwood, village counsel, review the complaint and requested vacation of plat so as to advise the commission on appropriate action," a staff report reads.

Mark began drawing pictures before he could talk, and his favorite subject was the horse that pulled the wagon that brought groceries to our Valdez home. Mark would laugh with delight when the wagon driven by Mr. Perkins appeared, and would be carried out to pet the horse.

His early fondness for horses and horseback life has continued to this day. In Ashland, Oregon, he watched the rodeos starring Sunlight and Rolland Jackson and Verne Dollarhide.

After we came to the Ruidoso Valley in 1925, Mark was in his true element, working as a cowboy and ranchman, and taking part in the New Mexico and El Paso Rodeos along with Bill Dick Browning, Jack Casey, Fletcher Hall, Gerald Tully, Porfirio Gonzales, Joe Herrera, Roy Coe, Buzz Casey, Dude Browning, Cecil Massey, John Thomas, Jack Forrester and many others.

And we all wish him many Happy returns of the day and all God's blessings.

Special Project wins the All American Derby

RUIDOSO DOWNS-Jack Brooks has always been high on Special Project.

So when his big 3-year-old scored a smashing victory in Sunday's All American Derby, Brooks was not the least bit surprised.

"Heck, I not only thought this was my best 3-year-old this year," Brooks said, "I thought he was my best 2-year-old last year."

Special Project, who was somewhat of a washout as a 2-year-old, has put it all together in this, his sophomore season. He became only the third horse in history to win both the Kansas Derby and the All American Derby.

Special Project, who is not a great gate horse, broke well enough

under jockey Gary Sumpter. Star Of Sierra Leone broke best of all, and Special Project spent nearly the entire 440 yards catching the speedy miss.

Sumpter and Special Project, however, collared Star Of Sierra Leone in the last 50 yards en route to a neck victory. Another head back in third was the longshot, Do No Wrong. The heavily favored entry of Reckless Dash and Special Leader finished ninth and 10th in the field of 10.

Special Project became only the third horse in history to capture both the Kansas Derby and the All American Derby. Ironically, Sumpter also rode My Easy Credit, who pulled off the double in 1977.

"He didn't step away from the gate all that well," Sumpter said. "But he never does. He's a big ol' horse, and you can't rush him. You have to let him get himself together. Once we got down here, I really got into him left-handed. He really responded. He gave everything he had."

Special Project's winning time of 21.37 was the fourth-fastest All American Derby in 16 previous runnings of the Grade I race. The winner's share of the \$512,999 purse increased the colt's earnings to \$428,580.

In Sunday's 23rd running of the Ruidoso Mile, Grey Bed pulled off a stunning upset, closing boldly through the lane for a 3 1/4-length

victory against the top older thoroughbreds on the grounds.

Grey Bed, winner of the Sunland Park Handicap last spring, woke up in his previous start to capture an allowance race impressively. Despite his recent win, the large holiday weekend crowd overlooked the 5-year-old Kentucky bred son of Bedford. He returned \$25 for a \$2 win ticket.

Grey Bed's long shot price, however, was not a huge surprise. After all, he was facing three-time stakes winner at the meeting A Bit Of Style, classy Salud Y Pesetas and the hard-knocking Classy Deer.

The race set up perfectly for the big roan gelding, who is trained by Mickey McMillan. As expected, the

two fillies in the race-Ruffetta and Irishly-shared pacesetting chpres. When they tired from their early efforts, favored Salud Y Pesetas moved quickly to the lead.

Salud Y Pesetas, who had hammered an allowance field by six lengths in his only start here this summer, however, was quickly joined by A Bit Of Style on the turn for home.

In the meantime, Grey Bed and jockey Louie Gomez were rolling on the outside. They collared A Bit Of Style midway through the stretch and pulled away to the wire. A Bit Of Style finished second, two lengths in front of Classy Deer, who came from dead last to third through the stretch run.

Grey Bed, who has now captured 14 of 42 career outings, increased his lifetime earnings to \$108,688.

Grey Bed's final time of 1:39 flat was the third fastest mile time in the history of the stakes race.

In the \$155,000 All American Futurity Second Consolation, Valid Proposal snapped a fretful string of three consecutive second place finishes by posting a nose decision against First Prize Dash in the 400 yard dash.

Valid Proposal, who had run second to the undefeated filly Quick Fun in the time trials in his most recent start, covered the distance in a snappy 19.76.

See Me Do It sets a stakes record in Gold Cup victory

RUIDOSO DOWNS-Jockey James Lackey and his mount in the All American Gold Cup Saturday were involved in a photo finish. Unfortunately for Lackey and his mount, Dasha Dimples, the photo was for second place.

As has become commonplace when See Me Do It is involved in a race, second place is about all anyone can hope for. The reigning World Champion quarter horse left no doubt as to her superiority once again Saturday, powering away to a 1 3/4-length victory in the Grade I dash, and setting a stakes record in the process by covering the 440 yards in 21.26.

"We were having our own race in the back," quipped Lackey, who edged stalemate Wicked Wind for second place.

See Me Do It was devastating in victory. She sped away from the gate on the lead and simply drew off under only moderate urging from regular pilot Larry Layton.

"She did everything super

today," said Layton, who has teamed with the mighty mare for 15 victories in 18 career outings. "I asked her a little bit about midway through the race and she just opened up."

Ironically, See Me Do It shattered the stakes record set by Dash For Speed last summer of 21.32.

Dash For Speed, who won the Los Alamitos Championship on July 21, figures to be the only horse in the country standing between See Me Do It and a repeat World Championship crown. No horse has captured back-to-back World Championship honors since the legendary Dash For Cash in 1976-77.

The two mares, who have never met before, are expected to clash for the first time in the Breeders' Championship Classic Nov. 17 at Los Alamitos.

See Me Do It added the winner's share of the \$79,490 purse to her earnings, increasing her lifetime bankroll to \$884,613.

In the \$116,615 Ruidoso Thoroughbred Futurity, Next Step scooted through along the rail on the turn for home and closed stoutly through the stretch to score a 1 1/4-length victory in the stakes record time of 1:12 flat for 6 furlongs.

The victory by Next Step earned trainer Bill Leach his second consecutive Ruidoso Futurity victory and his third triumph of the stakes overall in 23 runnings of the race. Leach won the race last year with Captain Drake.

Next Step's final time of 1:12 flat tied the stakes record established by Arrowhead's Fro in 1987.

Cagney And Lace, who powered away to a commanding lead entering the lane, finished second. Combate, who rallied late, finished third, another 3 1/4-lengths back. Brent Davidson, who won the Santa Fe Futurity last week with Crimino, trains both Cagney And Lace and Combate.





Timing is everything when you're scheduling a big project.




