Mesa contract is back up in the air

The level of flights to Ruidoso, continued subsidy and the village debt to Mesa Airlines were the key issues of a special meeting at Village Hall Thursday called by Mayor Victor Alonso.

Although no official action was taken, Johnathan Ornstein, vice president of planning with the airlines, agreed to take back to his company a proposal that includes a \$9,256 reduction of the total subsidy agreement. The council also asked for a 30-day extension of its arrangement with Mesa which would carry it to the beginning of ski season.

Alonso said the extension would give the council time to meet with the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce and discuss past financial commitments that would allow a further continuation of the flights.

Ornstein summarized Mesa's short history with Ruidoso starting

with a Caravan's power failure that caused an emergency landing of a mid-morning flight on a county road four miles south of the Sierra Blanca Airport on July 27.

Ornstein said the plane sustained \$70,000 in damages and was out of service during the busiest time of the year which cost Mesa heavily. The airline carried a \$50,000 deductible insurance policy.

Ornstein said in order to maintain some level of service, Mesa had to pull a 19-passenger Beech 1900 from other areas, and lower Ruidoso's service to one flight a day until the next summer season when regular frequency would be resumed.

Ornstein said that although the 1900 cost twice as much to operate as the Caravan, Mesa would absorb the additional cost. The Caravan returned to service on September 17, but will continue at one flight a

day during the projected slow season.

The Mesa executive said Ruidoso was approaching a break-even status after the first month of operation with fares lower than the rest of the system. He said the load average was 38-40 percent before the accident. He said he was sure a certain amount of bad publicity because of the accident created a downturn that will take time to recover.

Alonso said that all shared in the excitement of introducing Mesa Airline to the community, but after the accident there was a lack of communication between the airline and Ruidoso.

Alonso felt the decision to reduce flights to one a day should have been a shared decision by Ruidoso instead of a unilateral determination by the airline.

Campaign '90: state candidates visit Ruidoso

GOP welcomes Bond

"Jump ahead to 1998 and think about what kind of state you want to provide for your children," advised Republican gubernatorial candidate Frank Bond on a campaign swing through Lincoln County Friday and Saturday.

The governor elected this November will be the first to have the opportunity to run for two consecutive terms, and Bond intends to be that history-making governor.

Speaking at several functions in four communities, Bond stressed his triple themes of education, economic diversity and leadership. He told the capacity crowds who came out to meet him that those themes clearly highlight the differences between the two major party gubernatorial candidates.

"New Mexico must develop a consensus not to be poor anymore — not socially, economically or educationally," said Bond who went on to develop his three themes.

Education

"Education will be my number one priority from the day I'm elected until the day I leave office," said the former state legislator and member of the House Education Committee.

He sees a total system from kindergarten through college and believes early childhood years are the most critical in a child's development.

"This is where we can identify and help the 'at-risk' child," said Bond, emphasizing smaller classes, increased parental involvement and drug education.

"After the primary I met with President Bush at the White House and discussed education and drugs," said the candidate. "I pledged our state's law enforcement would assist federal drug enforcement, but insisted our chief role to be educating kids about the dangers of drugs."

Bond announced that Bush will join him in New Mexico during the

Chemical spill disrupts traffic

A one-vehicle accident near Corona early Thursday resulted in a chemical spill.

A pickup truck hauling a goose-neck trailer with 55 25-gallon drums of various chemicals wrecked after the driver fell asleep at the wheel at about 6 a.m. Thursday one mile east of Corona on State Route 247, according to police reports.

Seven drums were damaged and leaked chemicals when the wreck occurred and the road was closed for about 19 hours as crews cleaned up the spill to avoid the formation of toxic gases in the event the chemicals mixed, said State Police officer Steven Standridge.

"We were lucky this occurred in a rural area," he said.

Citations are likely in the accident because the truck transporting the chemicals was not properly labeled and the driver should have proceeded to Vaughn to the port of entry to register his load, said Standridge.

Corona Mayor Ernie Lueras expressed concern that drivers were frequently using State Route 247 to avoid registering their loads,

The route, which is unpaved for a large portion, is also a school bus route.

"They have their routes they are supposed to follow," said Lueras. "This is not the first time this has happened."

The Corona mayor recounted an event five or six years ago when a truck wrecked and spilled chemicals between Corona and Carrizozo.

The truck that overturned Thursday is owned by ACE Transportation of Lafayette, Louisiana, and was carrying the load of 25 55-gallon drums from an oil field in Midland, Texas, to another field near Grants, New Mexico, said Standridge.

The load included a surfactant blend, methanol and sodium hypochloride, said Mike Ryan of the National Response Center of the Environmental Protection Agency in Dallas, Texas.

Ryan said he was notified of the accident by Richard Yandel of ACE Transportation. The EPA did not become involved in the clean-up or investigation because the New Mexico State Police were on the scene to investigate the accident, and the New Mexico Environmental Improvement Division was also

responding, he said.

Yandel is employed by ACE Transportation in the insurance department of the company, and was unavailable for comment when The News called early Friday.

Yandel also did not return calls early today (Monday).

Two of the chemicals by themselves are not considered immediately dangerous to human health, but if the three had combined at the scene, toxic gases could have resulted and that would have been a more serious problem, said Standridge.

The surfactant blend is similar to detergent, and the sodium hypochloride is a bleaching agent, said Ryan of the EPA.

Calcium hypochloride is a more common form of bleaching agent and is used for chlorine pellets for swimming pools and is the agent found in household bleach.

The sodium form is more reactive and in the presence of water, will release chlorine gas, a highly noxious and poisonous gas, said Carl Stubbs of the EID office in Ruidoso.

There were widely scattered showers throughout Lincoln County Thursday.

Methanol is also known as wood alcohol, and is a vaporous, flammable and poisonous chemical, according to the Webster's Third New International Dictionary.

There was the potential for an explosion and/or a severe fire at the scene with all these chemicals present, said Stubbs.

IT Corporation of Albuquerque, who was contracted with ACE Transportation, sent the crew out to clean the spill.

Vehicles carrying loads of hazardous chemicals are supposed to be properly identified with placards on the vehicle. However, the ACE truck did not have the proper placards identifying the load, said Standridge.

Also, the driver should have proceeded on U.S. Route 285 to Vaughn and register at the port of entry, said Standridge.

"He was taking a short-cut," said the state trooper.

Corona Mayor Lueras said he was concerned truckers with hazardous loads were taking Route 247 on many occasions without registering and this poses a threat to school children riding buses on that road.

Program set to help fight drug abuse

Community mobilization to combat drug abuse, including alcohol, is a primary goal for a program in the Ruidoso School District.

The program is paying for Tim Burns, from Santa Fe, to speak to parents and teens on the impact of drug use on brain development at 7 p.m. Wednesday, September 26, at the Ruidoso High School.

Burns will also speak in Capitán Thursday, September 27.

The Region IX Cooperative Center is overseeing a new program,

Drug Free Schools and Communities, and hopes to enhance cooperation and teamwork between the schools and homes to combat drug abuse, said Kathy Echols, the program coordinator.

The program was made possible through a federal grant and enables the six school districts in Region IX to cooperatively administer the program, sharing the expenses for speakers.

The free program presented by Burns Thursday will include an explanation of how drug use interferes with brain development and

emotional development in adolescents.

The program is designed primarily for parents because of its level of presentation, but teens are encouraged to attend as well, said Echols.

The Drug Free program also makes available curricula for teachers to use in their classrooms, she said.

Materials are available at the Region IX lending library and Echols said she is happy to train

teachers to use the materials, which are designed for grades kindergarten through six.

Burns will also be in the schools during the day to train teachers to identify possible problems attributable to substance abuse, said Echols.

Drug Awareness week will be from October 22 through 26 and any businesses or individuals interested in purchasing red ribbons for the program may contact Echols at the Region IX office. The telephone number is 257-2368.

Harold was a charter member of the Ruidoso Lions Club, and the Tularosa Meth-



Micrographics is new

Micrographics, a firm which specializes in printed circuit design and fabrication, is a relatively new business in Ruidoso.

The company, with Sylvia Miller as president and chief executive officer, is located on the ground floor of the Stroud Building, 1096 Mechem.

Sylvia and Gary Miller, vice president, were a part of Silicon Valley in California when they heard that an engineering company in Ruidoso was for sale.

They came to this mountain community last year and checked out that firm. But instead of acquiring the engineering firm, they decided to move their California company to Ruidoso. They say the mountain community captivated them. The company still maintains an office in the Silicon Valley.

Gary Miller is an electrical engineer whose expertise has helped make the company successful. Many well known names in the electronics field do business with Micrographics.

The Millers' daughter, Jeri

Doneen, also is with the company. She is design manager.

The company acts as an extension of engineering, providing the technical support needed to design and produce high quality finished printed circuit boards.

The firm offers technical consulting and support as well as designing and fabricating printed circuit boards.

Fast turn around even on six to 10-layer boards, is a company service.

Currently the fabrication and board assembly is "farmed out," but the Millers hope to move that facet of the business to Ruidoso in the future. That would result in 25 to 30 skilled positions being created here.

The boards are used in telecommunications, telemetry and in high-tech applications of many kinds.

Both commercial interests and the military are customers.

Boards can be designed for an oil well control system, for instance.

Miller obtained his electrical engineering degree from the University of Minnesota.

Tough Tulie topples Warriors 14-12

The Tularosa Wildcats matched the Ruidoso Warriors ground game and added a third down air attack to grind out an upset over the Warriors on a rain soaked field last Friday, 14-12.

Warrior head coach Mike Speck had nothing but praise for the Wildcats after the game.

"They had a great game plan, knew our weaknesses, exploited them and controlled the ball. My hat's off to them," Speck said.

The crippled Warriors never seemed to get on track except for Kief Johnson who proved an offensive juggernaut crashing the line 25 times for 187 yards.

The Warriors outrushed the Wildcats by a 256 to 83 margin, but were constantly plagued with miscues and penalties.

The Wildcats, not known for their passing, hit 7-9 passes for 64 yards and most of those connections were on third down conversions.

The two teams matched touchdowns, but the winning edge was a 2-point conversion by Louis Montoya which gave Tularosa a 14-6 lead in the third quarter.

Several previously injured Warriors saw action in the game, but were without the services of two key players, Chris Torres and Steve Dankert. Torres didn't suit up and Dankert was out of the game early with a badly twisted ankle.

Speck said he was convinced that once the Warriors built enough time as a unit, the poise and timing necessary to produce a consistent four quarter team would materialize.

"I'm confident that this team can win," he said.

GAME SUMMARY

Tulie received the opening kick by Ryan Wright and marched down the field to the Ruidoso 15-yard line, fumbling three times, but recovering each time. The Warriors

held and a fourth down field goal attempt was short.

After seven minutes and 33 seconds into the first quarter, the Warriors took over on offense.

The Wildcats' defense shot the gap repeatedly and coupled with a penalty, Ruidoso was stopped without a first down, deep in their own territory.

A good kick by Jose Marquez was returned by Kevin Zamora to the Warriors' 26-yard line. The Wildcats worked themselves to a second and 10, on the Warrior 15-yard line when time ran out on the first quarter. The Warriors' possession of the ball amounted to barely a minute.

Tulie opened the second quarter with a pass to the 3-yard line. The receiver fumbled and a Wildcat was there to fall on the ball. Zamora then powered the ball off center for the touchdown. The conversion failed and Tulie had the lead, 6-0.

Kief Johnson blasted through the left side of the line and scrambled down the sidelines for a 43-yard run and the Warrior's first, first down of the game.

Marquez picked up a quick five yards, before he bolted down the sidelines for huge gain that was called back because of holding.

Guardiola then found Heath Huey with a pass to the 47 and the Warrior's second first down.

Johnson stumbled through the line, but maintained his footing and was finally stopped on the 37 for another first down.

Johnson, running like a crazed bulldog, fought his way down to the 6-yard line, for a first and goal.

The Warriors then shot themselves in the foot with an offside penalty.

On fourth and goal from the ten, Ryan Wright's attempt slides to the right of the pole and the drive

ended. The Wildcats ran out the clock with a 6-0 halftime lead.

The Warriors started the second half on their own 36. Johnson broke through the middle on a trap play and raced to the Wildcat 27, good for 35 yards. Johnson then picked his way to the 10 on three plays for a first and goal. Johnson then jammed the left for two plays before Marquez ran right for four yards and the touchdown. The ball skipped back to the punter, Wright, who missed the punt left, for a 6-6 tie.

The Warriors held the Wildcats on the next series of plays.

After moving the ball into Wildcat territory, Ruidoso fumbled on their own 39.



Tulie cashed in on the miscue and drove down the field for a touchdown by Montoya, but not before the Wildcats recovered their own fumble on the two-yard line. It

was their fifth fumble recovered of the game. Montoya then successfully ran the point after for two points and the Wildcats were in the driver's seat, 14-6.

The Warriors answer. Marquez, Johnson and Walberto Murillo take turns marching the Warriors down the field. Johnson broke through the left side from the five-yard line and scored standing up. Johnson then tried to repeat the play on the extra point, but was stopped short. Wildcats led 14-12.

The Warriors were successful on an on-side kick with 6:10 remaining.

The Warriors worked themselves to the Tulie 19. On fourth and ten, Guardiola rolled to the right and headed for the first down marker. Guardiola came up a yard short. Tulie fumbled a sixth time, but recovered and ran out the game clock for the victory.


