

Building permits top last year's 9-month totals

A building permit for a single family dwelling in Alto for \$321,136 helped boost September building permits to \$669,189 for the month. September permits issued at Ruidoso Village Hall were over \$500,000 more than for those issued in August, while a year ago, September permits totalled \$644,568.

August permits this year totalled \$358,050.

Building permits in Ruidoso for the first nine months of the year are running \$2,000,000 above the same period in 1989.

The figure for January-October this year is \$7,306,015. For the same nine months in 1989, the figure was \$5,281,628.

Single family dwellings in September of this year added up to \$597,582; for August, the amount was \$270,000. September of 1989 showed a \$489,845 figure for single family dwellings.

Jim Colbert, developer of the new golf course, obtained building permit in the amount of \$36,317 to fence what is listed as Wild Fire Golf Course.

Texas-New Mexico Power Co. at 1100 Mechem is spending \$17,830 for sidewalk repair and to add a canopy.

Residential additions/alterations this year added to \$150,870 in September compared to \$80,050 in August of 1990. The figure for September of 1989 was \$136,923.

One new commercial building appeared on the building permit list for September of this year. That permit was for \$66,000. It is for Whitfield Enterprises at 410 Mechem Drive. One grading permit for \$600 was issued in September.





Economic Development, By George!

Economic development is up to you

Perhaps the single most important ingredient in a successful economic development program is community support. Unless the community (in this case the entire county) is behind the effort, the economic development organization will begin to feel that it might as well be trying to be Ronald Reagan elected president of the Air Traffic Controllers Union.

The history of economic development is littered with unsuccessful efforts, especially by smaller towns. On the other hand, there are a few glittering successes. Those few communities that rise above the trash heap of failed efforts usually have extraordinary community support.

One of the earliest, and clearly the most inspirational, economic development efforts in the Southwestern United States occurred in Fort Worth just after the Civil War.

The Texas and Pacific Railroad had reached Dallas in 1872, thus becoming the railroad for the shipment of cattle from all points west; including those, by the way, that came inching down the Chisum Trail. The businessmen and residents of Fort Worth were obliged to watch as herds of cattle passed through their city on the way to Dallas. There were some economic benefits to the fledgling "Cow Town" in the form of entertainment for the thirsty and trail weary cowhands. In an area known in Fort Worth as "Hell's Half Acre," saloons and houses of prostitution flourished.

Not exactly the kind of economic development that would prove to be of long term benefit to the community.

Between cattle drives the town was virtually dormant. The story was told that a Dallas businessman, on his return from

Fort Worth, passed the word that the town was so dead he had seen a panther lying on the courthouse steps. Thus Fort Worth was nicknamed "Panther City."

As a matter of interest, this columnist is a graduate of Paschal High School in Fort Worth... home of the "Paschal Panthers."

Determined to do something about bringing business to their community, city leaders pledged three and one half acres to Jay Gould and the Texas and Pacific Railroad in order to induce the extension of the railroad from Dallas to Fort Worth. Further, the Texas Legislature gave the railroad a land grant for the right of way, which amounted to sixteen sections of land per mile of track... a significant inducement indeed.

The grant, however, was conditioned on the arrival of the first train in Fort Worth prior to January 1, 1885.

To the dismay of the citizens of Fort Worth, the market crash and collapse of the national economy in 1873 left Jay Gould and the T&P in serious financial trouble. The funds to complete the 28 miles of track were no longer available.

In the wake of the original announcement of the railroad's plan to come to Fort Worth, the town had experienced a boom. Entrepreneurs had descended on the city bringing with them workers, some of whom came on pure speculation that jobs would be available. A tent city sprang up just outside the town to house many of the new residents who could find no other place to live.

When word leaked out that Gould had abandoned his plans, almost overnight the newcomers left town, leaving business owners who had invested heavily to ac-

commodate the new business in worse shape than before the boom.

Alarmed about the fate of the town, an organizational meeting was held. The Tarrant County Construction Company was formed with an initial capitalization of \$25,000. A delegation was sent to Marshall, Texas, to meet with the rail officials for the purpose of extending an offer for the community to complete the construction of the right of way, provided the steel railing would be supplied by the T&P. The stunned rail officials accepted without hesitation, no doubt remembering the rich land grant that awaited the arrival of the train in Fort Worth.

Again, almost overnight the town came back to life. Stage coaches arrived full of lawyers, businessmen, doctors, and prostitutes. In no time at all the vacant real estate was occupied. In order to finance the Tarrant County Construction Company, nearly everyone in town mortgaged real estate holdings and invested everything in the project.

But there was a cloud on the horizon. The project was running out of time according to the limit imposed by the Texas Legislature for the land grant.

Tarrant County Representative Darnell was carried daily on a stretcher into the House chambers to vote against the resolution. This continued for 15 days during which Darnell lapsed in

Nicholas Darnell was able to secure that passage of an extension of the agreement until the adjournment of the legislative session the following year.

The first session of the Texas Legislature convened on the second Tuesday of January, 1876. Once again Representative Darnell attempted passage of an additional extension but met with serious opposition, leaving only the few months of the session for completion of the line.

To make matters worse, Darnell fell ill from some unknown disease; he was not expected to recover.

But, unexpectedly, things began to ease up for the T&P. The economy had shown marked improvement, and new money was available to assist in the construction. Operations manager General John C. Brown and engineer Major D.W. Washburn were on the job day and night.

T&P crews laid track behind the construction company's completed right of way. The contractor, Morgan Jones, is reported not to have changed clothes or gone regularly to bed during that frantic period of construction.

Early in July the legislature had completed its labors; the Senate had passed a concurrent resolution of adjournment and sent it to the House.

But the rail was still seven miles to the east of the town at Sycamore Creek.

Then commenced the most strenuous parliamentary battle recorded in the history of any state. The friends of the T&P refused to adopt the resolution to adjourn and, since every vote was critical, Representative Darnell died.

Faced with dreams (and cash) going down the tubes, the citizens of Fort Worth went into action. Never was there any

mention of giving up.

Every man in town left his occupation and reported for work at the construction site bringing picks and shovels and other tools that might be useful. The women and children were charged with the job of supplying food and water. The food was cooked in homes and transported by wagon to the 500 weary men who, by this time, had developed blisters and other injuries.

When dark fell work was continued by lamplight. Gamblers who had rarely seen the light of day rolled up their sleeves and went to work. Prostitutes who had almost forgotten their last names labored beside matrons who had never seen the inside of a dance hall.

Construction of a proper right of way was abandoned. Creeks were filled with logs on which the rails were laid, and the line left the grade and took to a dirt road. Ties were laid on the ground, supported at either end by stones, and the rails were spiked to them.

It was crooked as a dog's hind leg, but it held up the rails.

On July 10, 1886, at 11:23 in the morning, the first train, its whistle blowing and smoke billowing from its stack, ran into Fort Worth amidst a celebration of monstrous proportions, undaunted by an accidental fire that burned down the court house or the arrival of the news of the disaster at Little Big Horn.

There, my friends of Lincoln County, is the challenge of the Southwest.

Are we as tough as they were? Or maybe the question is... do we want to control our own destiny as much as they did?

It's up to you!

Apache Trails finally realized

Apache Trails came to life a few months ago as a result of a dream held by Wendell Chino, president of the Mescalero Apache Tribal Council.

Donald W. Moeller, columnist for the New Mexico Business Journal, says that Chino tried to get the Apache Trails idea off the ground time and again the last 20 years, but "the idea languished."

But recently, Moeller wrote, the idea came to life.

He says that Apache Trails is a relatively simple idea: a regional marketing effort for

Ruidoso, Alamogordo, the Space Center, Cloudcroft, Lincoln, San Patricio, Capitan, Carrizozo, Tularosa, Ruidoso Downs, the Mescalero Apaches and the Lincoln National Forest.

Moeller tells how Apache Trails came about.

"When Chino brought up the idea last December at the Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce, president Ronnie Paulger urged Jerry Watts of the chamber to respond to Chino's request ... There are common concerns to

attract tourist dollars through a pooled effort that would benefit all of the communities ... and without Wendell Chino, who knew a good idea when he conceived it 20 years ago, it might well have never gotten off the ground."

The columnist says somebody around the state capitol must be listening and watching. He says the state has offered \$6,000 in matching funds and that Apache Trails people have "answered with a positive nod; no problem to raise the matching dollars."

Chango's offers special "extras"

Jerrold Flores is a collector and artist in many media — sculpture, acrylics, oil painting, antiques — and fine cuisine. He presents all media at his restaurant, Chango's near the corner of First and Lincoln streets in Capitan.

Diners enjoy food artistry Flores creates while surrounded by antiques he collects and sculptures he fashions.

"It's really an extension of my home," offers the versatile Flores as he shows an antique Chinese snuff bottle to one guest while defining a bechamel sauce to another.

"I've created an environment to work in that I enjoy."

Food is the main attraction at Chango's. Although he offers only a few entrees per night, Flores changes the menu weekly, "sometimes daily if I feel like it."

Perennial favorites such as Greek lemon chicken and paella might share menu space with shrimp in lemon-dill-sauce, all served in a platter adorned by several side dishes and a salad.

Flores' menu resists labeling. "It's really a mixed bag of classic dishes and those I create on a whim."

A memorable sole with pistachio and asparagus sauce came from one such "whim," as did manicotti sauced with pinon nuts and a puff-pastry empanada.

"I try to create dishes that remind guests of exotic places they've visited - or would like to," he says.

The Italian-inspired pastas, Spanish-style paella and Paris market-derived salads.

"It's the most unique dining spot in the area," says an El Paso guest, admiring a Flores sculpture between bites of empanada with ancho sauce.

"We get clientele from Arizona, California and all over Texas, as well as faithful locals," says Flores.

Perhaps it's the individual touches that highlight the dining experience: herbs from his garden,

freshly baked bread, individually made desserts.

Trained as an artist, Flores inherited a talent for cuisine. He is a third-generation Lincoln County resident and restaurateur.

"My grandfather home-steaded in Arabella and, after his death in the flu epidemic (in 1918) grandmother opened a hotel and restaurant in Roswell. My mother's first restaurant was in Capitan in 1938."

Born in Fort Stanton, Flores grew up in San Francisco and was enjoying a successful art career when called back to Capitan on family business. He thought to remain here only to settle the business then return to his career on the west coast but found himself unable to stay there.

"I came back because I wanted a quality life style and to get away

from being a machine."

So in the mid-eighties, he opened his restaurant-gallery not far from the location of his mother's 1938 restaurant and named it Hotel Chango after his pet cat.

Moving to New Mexico has not meant a reduction in work for Flores, who runs his kitchen nearly single-handedly while continuing to produce art for exhibits on the West Coast and Santa Fe.

"I don't work any less than I did in California, but the choices I make are for aesthetics, not to satisfy external demand."

Chango's is open Thursday through Sunday evenings from 5 p.m. until "whenever." Flores will accommodate private parties at any other time when asked. Reservations are encouraged but not required, telephone 354-4218.

Suede collars are specialty

Southwest in the Ski West Center is a family operation. The new shop features leather and suede collars, in fact "anything with fringe on it."

Sallye and Wes Day, mother and son, will greet you at the shop, while a daughter and sister, Stayce Cochran, also is involved. She handles wholesale sales where she resides in Texas.

All of the merchandise designed and created by and for the shop is made from suede and leather. No synthetics are used.

The Day collars are on display in two showrooms in Dallas at the World Trade Center and in a showroom in Tokyo, Japan.

"We ship anywhere," West Day said. He said a shipment just went out to a western store in Italy.

Southwest is open from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m. seven days a week.





Warriors win 7-0; but lose flag war

In a game that had more flags than Aristice Day, the Ruidoso Warriors turned the greatest goal line stand in the school's history into their first victory of the season by defeating St. Pius of Albuquerque 7-0.

The bizarre ending of the game included a frozen clock, an untimely offside and a muffed snap all on the 2-inch line on the final play of the game.

The frozen clock occurred after the Sartans had pushed the ball to the goal line for a first down. The clock started, wound down to 11-seconds, and then inexplicably stopped for ten seconds. The Warrior coaches and players started waving their hands to the referee who then signaled for the clock to continue. The Sartans, realizing that time would run out before a play could be made, quickly lined up as the clock hit two seconds. At that time a flag was thrown and the Warriors were called for lining up offside, stopping the clock for the final play.

It was that kind of night for Ruidoso. Clocks wouldn't stop the first half and had to be reset. Flags fell like yellow rain all game long. Pius coughed up the ball like it was a bitter pill.

Ruidoso head coach Mike Speck praised the defensive squad's effort, but said the team killed themselves on the big plays and lacked the discipline to put Pius away.

Speck said the positive side of the column was the victory, a strong ending, and a heightened confidence that should prove beneficial to the Warriors as they enter district play next week at home against Deming.

The game seemed destined for a "blowout" shortly after the opening kickoff with Kief Johnson on a merry romp 40-yards for the game's only touchdown. It was too easy.

After the opening kickoff, the next five plays represent the scoring of the game.

Keif Johnson grabbed the hand-off from Manny Guardiola on the starburst and shot out to the 35-yard line. From the T formation,

Guardiola hit Heath Huey in the flats for five yards. Guardiola repeated the play to Huey and the Warriors picked up the first down.

Johnson then knifed through the middle on a trap play for two yards. Jose Marquez swept the right corner for another Warrior first down. On a quick pitch to Johnson on the left side, Johnson turned on the burners and skirted the sidelines 40-yards for a Warrior touchdown.

Sam Gumbert split the uprights for the extra point and the Warriors led 7-0 with 9:19 left in the first quarter.

Those five plays culminated in all the game's scoring, but it didn't really tell the story.

Pius was FLAGGED for line up offside and the Warriors kicked off from the 45-yard line. On their first possession, the Sartans fumbled to the Warriors.

Heath Huey dropped a Guardiola pass in the end zone on first down. An eight-yard gain by Marquez is nullified because the Warriors were FLAGGED for clipping. Guardiola was sacked for eight yards. Johnson drove hard for 13, but fell 12-yards short. A bad snap shot 15 feet over Marquez's head and after chasing the ball to the 30, he managed a boot back to the 50.

The Warriors held and the Sartans punted to the 20-yard line. Marquez's great 13-yard gain was snuffed out when the Warriors were FLAGGED for clipping. The Sartans held and the Warriors kicked.

On second and long, the Warriors were FLAGGED for encroachment. The Sartans were then FLAGGED for illegal procedure. The Warrior defense stiffened and the offense took over on the 40.

On fourth down, the Warriors were FLAGGED for illegal procedure. Marquez knocked a sky high punt to the Pius 40.

Pius was FLAGGED for movement. On fourth and 15, the Warriors were FLAGGED for a face mask violation and the Sartans moved to a first down.

On second and long, both teams were FLAGGED for personal fouls. After the offsetting penalties, the

Sartans fumbled to the Warriors. Ruidoso was FLAGGED for holding. On first and 25 from the 40, Guardiola hit Huey for 24. Guardiola found Chris Torres in the flats and Torres juked his way for a first down. The Warriors were in a hurry up offense as the half neared.

Guardiola hit Huey for eight yards. The Warriors were FLAGGED for holding and the first half ended.

Pius opened the second half with a fine run to their own 40. After a first down, the Sartans fumbled the ball to the Warriors.

Johnson grabbed a pitch on the left side and thruned the corner for 18 yards. Marquez swept left for five more yards. Johnson picked up another five for a first down. On fourth down, Huey caught a Guardiola pass, but was FLAGGED because of an illegal forward lateral.

Pius ran twice for a first down to their own 41. On fourth and one at midfield, the Warriors were FLAGGED for a face mask violation and the Sartans moved to a first down. On third and long, Jamie Candelaria intercepted the ball at the goal line, but the Warriors were FLAGGED for clipping and the forced deep in their own territory.

Marquez picked up most of the first down, but the run was voided when the Warriors were FLAGGED for holding. Marquez pounded the center again for 15 and the first down. On second and three, Marquez drove hard for another 12 yards and a first down. The Warrior drive stalled and Ruidoso kicked to the Pius 20 where Luis Jimenez flattened the punt receiver.

The Sartans were helped when Ruidoso was FLAGGED for encroachment. Pius then marched straight up the center for two quick first downs. A Sartan screen was good for a 20-yard gain, and 15 more yards were added when Ruidoso was FLAGGED for hitting the ball carrier out of bounds. The ball was moved to the 20 with 3:19 remaining.

Torres crashed the line for a great tackle behind the lines, but



Ethics is generally an accepted code of behavior that can and should be adopted along with being put in use. Ethics is the difference between right and wrong, dealing primarily with the gray areas between lawful and illegal. Some actions may be legal but unethical.

These traits are especially important when we consider an office as important as magistrate judge. A judge not only should have a commanding knowledge of law, but also have uncompromising morality and ethics.

Reviewing the minutes of the Eagle Creek Inter-Community Water Supply Association, Inc. (March 8, 1988; March 28, 1988; May 22, 1989; June 5, 1989) it becomes obvious that Mr. Benny

Coker cared very little about ethics by accepting a \$30,000 per year job as manager of the association while maintaining his voting, board membership; approving and condoning the use of another board member as broker to purchase water rights for the association; and condoning the hiring of the president of the board at the rate of \$22.50 per hour for 20 hours of maintenance per week. These acts were considered legal because work was being done under a contractual basis.

Being a mayor of a municipality at the time and having appointed himself as board member might also be considered.

During this same time period Mr. Benny Coker also sought to protect the people of Capitan by reorganizing the volunteer fire department stating it was operating illegally according to state law. During this episode he authorized the expenditure of Fire Protection Funds to pay for legal expenses. These funds were replaced only after rulings from the Attorney General were received.

People of Lincoln County, please consider not only honesty, but morality and ethics when you make your choices on election day.

Reflections on the affects of mental illness

Mental Illness Awareness Week is the week of October 7-13, but if you have a mentally ill person in your family, your "awareness" lasts all year long...

(This is my personal account of how mental illness affects my own family, and how we are dealing with it today.)

Mental Illness Awareness Week may not mean much to you unless a member of your family suffers from a mental illness. Illnesses are something we'd rather not think about, especially those so illusive and strange as ones which affect our minds.

But knowledge is a powerful tool if one is submerged in a situation of confusion, literally "digging your way out" to help a loved one or a friend.

Fourteen years ago, my family was suddenly subjected to this world of confusion when our youngest daughter became ill. She was 14, a happy outgoing girl, liked by everyone. She was an average student who excelled in reading and hated math. Nobody could have predicted that after a week-long illness that seemed to be "flu" she would suddenly turn "strange," hearing voices and staring into space.

Sleep habits changed. She would be up at night, wandering around the house, unable to rest. At school, grades fell, teachers called me about her behavior, students made fun of her. This was our initiation into the world of mental illness.

We did not accept it. We knew it would go away. In this modern world, we thought that there was a cure for most of the illnesses we knew about, or at least medicines to help. Soon we were spending time with doctors: first, a neurologist; then to a hospital for tests. Next we were sent out of state to a Seizure Clinic, where after 10 days and another spinal tap, it was determined that our daughter did not have seizures. Then we were sent to a psychiatrist, which seems to be where you are sent when all else fails. About six months later, we took our daughter to Stanford Medical Center, thinking surely we could get a diagnosis. More tests were run, and another spinal tap, with a tentative diagnosis of "schizo-affective disorder."

We returned to our home, followed the ad-

vice of a psychiatrist who was in a town 160 miles from where we lived, and tried some of the medicines he prescribed. Results were disastrous. We decided to stop seeing doctors and use our own judgment, taking one day at a time, doing the best we could.

Our daughter improved enough to return to school, but was placed in Special Ed classes. Her brothers and sister defended her against school bullies and tormentors. Only a few friends tried to understand her illness.

My husband and I became "textbook psychiatrists." (Could that be the reason our second-oldest son has since become a real doctor of psychiatry?) We had thought all along that her illness was caused by a chemical imbalance, perhaps even a virus. This seems to be the current theory, but 14 years ago there were other ideas. One psychologist hinted strongly to me that he thought I was over-protective, and wanted her to be forever dependent on me! We were aware that our daughter definitely needed protection and help while she was ill.

There is much to be learned about the human brain. The chemical imbalance that affects the nervous system can send false messages, can cause severe depression, panic or paranoia, or can even overload the system, shutting it down completely. Have you ever felt that you couldn't cope with noise, babbling people, urgencies of your job, or even the well-meaning advice of a friend? This is a type of overload called stress, and it can trigger intense emotions.

When our nervous system is out of order, things begin to deteriorate: judgment, behavior, personal grooming, relationships. People

avoid you because you act strange; you are not yourself. Some are afraid of you. You become isolated and alone.

Could this happen to you or a member of your family? Statistics say that about two percent of our population is affected by some form of mental illness. That would mean about 100 persons in a town of 5,000. In Ireland, one out of every 25 persons has schizophrenia. Why? There are some theories, from dietary implications to genetic factors. Much research needs to be done, but for those of us waiting, we do the best we can do with what we have. Some mental illnesses can be helped greatly with medications, particularly the depressive conditions.

What many people don't know is that a third of the people with mental illness will recover completely. The other two-thirds will have various degrees of difficulty, made more unbearable by the stigma that other people place on them. Society can be very cruel, particularly a society without knowledge or compassion.

My husband and I have joined a support group called Alliance for the Mentally Ill. It is fairly new in the state, and it now has 14 affiliates in New Mexico. There is no affiliate in Lincoln County, so we drive to Roswell to meet with the Chaves County Alliance. (There is also a support group in Alamogordo which meets once a month.) The Alliance groups consist of families and friends of the mentally ill.

For many years, we did not join a support group. One reason was because our daughter was still living at home and we didn't want to leave her alone. Also, we were running a small business, and had no time. We were finally able to place our daughter in a group home, sold our business, and joined the support group in Roswell. Now we are actively trying to help create some housing for the mentally ill, who have been so neglected in the State of New Mexico. There are only a few safe, affordable, supervised homes in the state which offer support services in the community.


