## Council takes one more look

Councilors and architects got together Thursday to take one more look at the program for a municipal civic center.

After a page-by-page review of the program document, architects from Nolan & Associates and Garland & Hilles got the go-ahead to go forward with schematics and plans that will fit into a schedule calling for construction to be completed on the civic/events center November 29, 1991.

Mayor Pro-tem Barbara Duff presided at the special meeting, and councilors Al Junge, Bill Karn, J.D. James and Jess Stinson were joined by a half a dozen architects, a couple of members of the Lodgers Tax Advisory Board, and about a half dozen citizens.

The council will hear another report from the architects during a workshop at 2 p.m.

Monday, November 26.

On Thursday, the council discussed the plans for a 32,690 square foot building with a complete budget of \$1.5 million. That budget includes a \$130,000 allocation from the state.

Councilor Al Junge encouraged the architects to plan the largest building possible, and architects responded by asking if there is more money available. They assured the council they're planning the biggest facility possible within the budget.

"It's our intention to design some expansion capabilities," said one of the planners. Charlie Nolan, of Nolan and Associates, also said the bidding documents will include some alternate items.

In further discussions over size, Ed Hyman, chairman of the Lodgers Tax Advisory Board, said the facility needs as many loading docks as possible to facilitate users' ability to move

in and out for special events. He told of a center he visited where he saw 30 trucks parked at the loading dock.

Jerry Watts, executive director of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, said the amount of loading space needed is dictated by the size of the facility itself.

Some discussion centered on the relationship of the hotel and the planned center. Nolan said one constraint in building a large center is keeping the design compatible with the hotel design.

Asked by Junge if they are considering prefabricated construction, Nolan said he and the other designers haven't ruled anything out yet.

In discussions over air conditioning, councilors recalled the large system included in the original designs, and Nolan said some form of ventilation plan will be needed.

## County says "yes" & "no" to EDCLC

Questions over match-funds for the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County (EDCLC), use of private property and alleged damage to property by the Lincoln County Roads Department were the center of attention at Friday's special meeting of the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners.

Lincoln County has a contract with the EDCLC which includes the imposition of a two-tiered mill tax levy to generate funds. The first tier is a one quarter mill tax expected to raise \$54,395 payable directly to the corporation. The second tier is another one quarter mill tax payable to the corporation on a required dollar for dollar match by the EDCLC.

For the corporation to collect on this second tier, it must show the county proof of receipt of donations made to the EDCLC. In the request for matching funds made Friday, the corporation showed only three that were approved to be matched, two checks from the Village of Ruidoso totaling \$37,500 and one from the Village of Capitan in the amount of \$1,000. These three items were approved to be matched by county dollars.

Three other sources of funding were presented to the commissioners as well. A check for \$155 from Lincoln County and one for \$15 from the city of Hopkins, Minnesota, were rejected for funds-matching. The inclusion of these checks in the request was called a "staff error" by EDCLC executive director George Puckett.

A decision to match or not is pending on four checks totaling \$1,200 from Steve Stroud, to whom the EDCLC pays \$700 a month in rent for the office in the Stroud Building.

According to Puckett, Stroud has made monthly donations of \$300 to the corporation for at least the last two years.

This "rent-rebate," as it is called by County Commissioner Robert Hemphill, doesn't really qualify as "new funds" and shouldn't be matched by the county.

"These rebates don't fit the intent of our contract, and I don't feel the county should match the money," said Hemphill.

With county-matched funds, the EDCLC would, in essence, be paying only \$100 a month rent for office space of approximately 500 square feet.

The county Road Department came under fire near the end of the meeting from Patricia Salcido, a Hondo Valley.

Salcido claimed that road building material was improperly taken from her property by the county roadbuilders, and that damage to some trees on her property was done. She also alleged that once the material was taken out, the county failed to leave the remaining material packed properly. She said now a dike will be needed to prevent seepage into her water well.

She also reported a discrepancy in the work done to repair and improve County Road B10.

Salcido requested that her complaints be addressed and answers sent to her attorney, but commissioners Hemphill and Karon Petty intervened to solve the problem without legal action.

Hemphill will inspect the road and the property damaged and then meet with Road Superintendent Tommy Hall to see what has to be done. Reportedly, the county thought it was obtaining the material from public property, but that a mistake has been made and will be corrected.

In other business conducted by the commissioners, the canvass of votes from Tuesday's general elections was accepted, thereby making official the ballot results.

## MainStreet planners heat up board meeting

The board of directors of MainStreet Ruidoso and the project manager for planning development of Midtown Ruidoso dealt with concepts at a meeting, Friday morning.

The going got a little heavy at times after board member Alden Deyo said, "I am looking for factual justification for this plan."

The project manager for Carter & Burgess, Inc., planners, engineers and surveyors, retained to draw up a plan, is William M. O'Brien Jr., senior landscape architect.

Board members met with O'Brien in the MainStreet Ruidoso offices on Sudderth to see what progress has been made since Carter and Burgess first surveyed the project area and made tentative suggestions some weeks ago.

Deyo objected most strenuously to the plan presented by O'Brien to install several traffic lights at main intersections in the target area. That area runs from about the Fifth Street Mall to below the Gazebo Shopping Center.

O'Brien said the plan presented Friday is not the final plan. "Keep in mind we're just talking concept here."

Most board members agreed that properly timed traffic signal lights would slow traffic down on Sudderth and would provide more safety for pedestrians.

O'Brien dealt with parking problems, sidewalks, right-of-way nightmares and outlined plans for a museum, public restroom, extra parking, an open air pavilion and community park area.

Those features would be located

at the four-plus acres across from the Gazebo Shopping Center if that land can be acquired.

The final plan will contain alternatives, O'Brien said.

The plan as presented Friday would result in widening of sidewalks in the project area mostly where they are too worn or narrow to be safe.

Sidewalks would be expanded at key intersections where people would gather to wait for traffic lights to change.

O'Brien outlined plans to take advantage of potential parking areas on side streets including the large public parking lot across from the police station. A public restroom would be located there, also.

Parking on Sudderth under the plan as presented, O'Brien said, would be reduced by 25 to 30 percent, but probably not 30 percent.

Lighting was another consideration. The plan contains "two levels of lighting," one at pedestrian level, another to light the whole area.


Landscaping and strategically located benches (with light poles) are shown in the plan. Carter and Burgess also are charged with helping to uncover sources of financing for the past plan.

Deyo said he doesn't believe traffic needs to be slowed down, that traffic lights would create a problem for other areas of the village by slowing down passage through Midtown.

"Are you looking at this plan as a 20-year plan?" Deyo asked.

O'Brien answered in the affirmative and said the plan "should be

## Two young hunters die in accidents

An Albuquerque youth became this season's first hunting fatality in Lincoln County Sunday morning after he was shot once. The 17-year-old died at the hospital in Moriarity while waiting for a care flight to take him to Albuquerque.

Brigido Munoz was hunting with seven friends below Cougar Mountain, approximately seven

miles west of Corona. While breaking camp shortly after 11 a.m., one of the youths was carrying several guns when a .22 calibre rifle went off, hitting Munoz in the left shoulder.

Munoz was taken to Corona and transferred to Moriarity before he died.

Sheriff's deputies responded to the call at 11:42 a.m. At this

time, the incident is being ruled an accidental death, but an investigation is pending to determine whether any charges should be filed.

In Otero County, a seven-year-old boy was accidentally shot and killed Saturday afternoon while in camp from a deer hunt with his father, uncle and another young friend.

Victor Baros of Albuquerque was shot once in the face by a .22 calibre rifle and taken to Gerald Champion Hospital in Alamogordo where he died shortly after 6 p.m.

Reportedly, the youth either grabbed the rifle by the barrel when it went off or the gun fell over and discharged.

## Who says you can't fight village hall?

When you ask for help from village hall, you may get more than you bargained for.

A couple of years ago a group of Ruidoso residents went to the Village Council and asked for some road repairs and improvements. Last week those same people were surprised to see village workers getting ready to widen their street.

Ethel Walton, 215 Carter Circle, mother of Marilyn Smalley, said she called the village manager when stakes outlining apparent right-of-way appeared in her front yard.

She feared for a stone fence which outlined the yard. Stakes were inside the fence.

"We don't need a freeway up here," she said.

Walton said she and her late husband had lived in the subdivision in the house she occupies since 1977. They first purchased property there in 1955 when they lived in Lamesa, Texas.

Village manager Charles Norwood told The Ruidoso News he

assured Walton that her fence would not be touched.

She said that relieved her mind, but that her daughter, who lives just up the hill from her, was very concerned about cutting down "100-year-old trees."

Even as Norwood was assuring Walton and Smalley that their rock wall wouldn't be destroyed, village crews were at work cutting trees to make way for the road project that reportedly has been in the works for some time.

Street Department head Charlie Armstrong said the project was approved for state cooperative funding two years ago, but the state didn't approve the funds for the close to \$60,000 project until this year.

Norwood, who has been with the village for just a few months, said Friday that he wants to initiate a plan to notify residents in areas where road project will impact on their property. That hasn't been part of the process in the past, and accounts for the shock of looking

out to see trees falling.

But Walton and Smalley weren't the only ones in that subdivision concerned over the loss of trees. Mary Ann Stark and four sisters who have property just below the Walton home were distressed.

One or more of the sisters were due in Ruidoso Sunday to check on the situation because several trees on what they apparently thought were on their property had been cut.

"We're not allowed to cut trees on anybody's private property," said Norwood, who was joined at the work site by Armstrong, village consulting engineer John Shaw and village planning administrator Cleatus Richards.

He also said the right-of-way stakes are at the right-of-way line and don't indicate which trees will be cut. Norwood said the tree cutting will be kept at a minimum.

"We maintain the street trees wherever we can," said Richards, noting that citizens are required to get a tree-cutting permit before cut-

ting trees in Ruidoso.

Smalley also questioned those right-of-way stakes, saying she disagrees with the survey.

Shaw said the surveyor set the stakes according to widths on the official plat, but he also agreed to meet with Smalley to compare her survey with village records.


"I believe you should check everybody's," said Smalley.

Residents admit they need some improvements on the street, but they believe the improvements planned are too extreme.

"You better pray before you drive it," said Smalley, pointing out one curve on the bumpy road. But, she said the need is for better drainage and another access route out of the area, not for a 22-foot wide paved street.

Armstrong said his plans call for paving a 22-foot area, and since the project is in cooperation with the state, then state standards must be used.

Residents will be talking to Norwood and Shaw this week.

updated yearly." The project manager told board members he can't guarantee a completely accurate view to 20 years in the future. The world situation, possible war, recession and other factors were mentioned. "If the economy spurts and we need more parking, we will have

the physical space to take care of this," O'Brien said. "Are you saying we don't have a traffic problem now?" Deyo asked. He said the plan looks to him as though it would "impede traffic with no regard for people in the village." Board member Don Dutton said Artesia, which he said should have dried up and blown away years ago,

has traffic lights at most intersections. Motorists, he said, have time to look in store windows because traffic is slowed down. Deyo, finally, after other exchanges said, "I will take my loss and get out." And he did; he left the meeting. Board member Stan Cape said the exchange "is not too bad a

thing. It gets concerns addressed." Board member Margaret Lahey said she has some concerns about emphasis. She said she is concerned that the potential river walk is not thoroughly addressed and that some people feel that heavy emphasis on the east end of the project area is not enough. "We would like to see other potential parking areas addressed,"

Lahey said. She said smaller parking areas scattered throughout the project area would be desirable. Lahey said the village has for years tried to get the State Highway Department to put in a traffic light at Mechem and Cree Meadows Drive and indicated it would be very difficult to get additional traffic lights for the Midtown area. Carter and Burgess will con-

tinue to work on the master plan using information and feelings from the meeting here. A final plan is expected after the first of the year. The master plan for downtown is possible because of a \$36,000 allocation by the 1990 Legislature. "My priorities always will be based on your priorities," O'Brien told the board at one point.

# Local schools report on Indian education

"Two new teachers will be added to the Ruidoso schools payroll next year to keep up with the rising student population," said Ruidoso Schools superintendent Mike Gladden Thursday in a meeting with members of the Parents Advisory Council at the Old Road Restaurant in Mescalero. The teachers will come aboard next year to comply with the state regulation concerning student/teacher ratios. By the regulation, no teacher may see more than 160 students per day. One of the new teachers will instruct home economics, while the other will teach science classes, some shop, and bilingual classes. Gladden's meeting with the PAC came on the heels of a favorable review from the state board of education. Penny Bird, a member of the team sent from Santa Fe to inspect the Indian services provided the native American students, said that the Indian students were interacting very well in the Ruidoso schools, more so than at some of the schools with a native American population in the northern half of the state. Chairperson Pearlita LaPaz reported that she and other mem-

bers of the council made a monitoring visit to the White Mountain Elementary School and were "very impressed" with the computers set up in the library for the students. She was also encouraged to see that several of the Indian parents had signed up to attend some of the computer sessions offered by the school. The White Mountain Elementary School library's computers have a complete encyclopedia program and have been a real boon to the children. Gladden reported that the new programs put into the computer labs at the schools will help tremendously with individual student needs. The Josten's Learning System keeps up with the learning pace and facilities of each student, therefore allowing greater comprehension of the material studied and encouragement to learn more. "With the cognitive instruction these computers now provide, we should see a big difference in the program at the end of the year," said Gladden. The Title VII grant application was also discussed at the meeting. This year's grant request will also include funds for more computers

at the middle schools as well as monies to finance a math sciences summer school session. Gladden also explained to the parents in attendance that the \$35 shoe allowance for the Indian students was per sport, and not just for the year. This will allow the student/athletes to have the proper footwear for the various sports. Parents wanting to buy more expensive shoes may receive the money from the school toward the purchase of the shoes. A science fair for Native American students is scheduled in Las Cruces later this school-year. Gladden reported that the Ruidoso teachers involved with the science projects are being encouraged to help the Indian students with their work so that they may attend. The next meeting of the Parents Advisory Council will be at 6 p.m. Thursday, December 13, in the Ruidoso Schools Administration's boardroom. A walk-through of the White Mountain Elementary School is planned for 7 p.m. Tuesday, November 13, and a meeting of the Ruidoso Board of Education to discuss Indian education will be at 7 p.m. Thursday, November 29.

pumper/tanker fire truck for the Glencoe-Palo Verde Volunteer Fire Department was also approved, clearing the way for the ordering of the truck. The departments will now have annual payments under \$16,000 for the truck, which will allow them to pay for it out of their normal operating annual budget. A bid to perform a survey of the county's emergency radio communications system was awarded to Fire Administrative Consultant Services and Communication Services. The \$5,500 survey will be paid for by grant money provided specifically for the survey. County EMS Coordinator Maggi

Bobbs said that Motorola Communications and Electronics offered to perform the survey for free, but wasn't going to address the needs of the county as described in the request for bids. The county also adopted two resolutions electing to participate in the Enhanced 911 program. The newly elected county-commissioners were appointed to a special committee formed to orient them on the workings of county government. Bill Elliott was the only commissioner-elect present for the appointment. The amendment of a plat and disclosure statement and the allowance of a road width variance on

Juniper Road was also approved by the board of commissioners. The amendment allows the Agua Fria subdivision legal status after the completion of roadwork. Final payment was made to the Twin Mountain Rock Company for materials provided during the Sierra Blanca Airport Road Project. The final payment had to be revised because the gross receipts tax already paid by the county was included in the final bill total. All bids for the installation of bleacher canopies at the Lincoln County Fairgrounds were rejected, mainly to keep the Fair Board operating within its budget and out of the county's general funds.

# Economic Development group goes back to committees

The Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County hopes to cash in on an anticipated Free Trade Agreement (FTA) with Mexico. Such an agreement would mean, EDCLC board members were informed Thursday night, that some management portions of businesses and industries could be located on this side of the border while plants would operate across the border. Jack Burke of Ruidoso, who has been following the movement toward a FTA and who has attended meetings in El Paso, Texas, spoke to the EDCLC board at a regular meeting. The November meeting was in council chambers of the Village of Ruidoso Downs, and was hosted by board member Bonnie Addy, who is Ruidoso Downs mayor. Don Shaw, president of the EDCLC board, told board members he is deeply concerned that the committee portion of the EDCLC operation is not functioning to any degree except for one committee.

Shaw presented a plan involving 12 committees and recommended that Anita Sanders, assistant to the EDCLC Director George Puckett, coordinate committee development and operation. One of the committees, if the board approves Shaw's plan after study, will be a Free Trade committee. This committee would "be in the forefront of understanding, decision making and implementation of the coming free trade agreement with Mexico." Its members would attend state and regional meetings to gain all possible knowledge, keep the EDCLC informed and to formulate a policy whereby Lincoln County can benefit from this agreement, Shaw's proposal states. Shaw and the EDCLC staff formulated the outline of the 12 committees, members' qualifications and such last week. Shaw told the board that in his opinion it is essential that more EDCLC members and others become more involved with making the effort to attract industry to Lincoln County successful.

He said that after Puckett was appointed executive director and when Sanders was named assistant, the board may have relaxed and let the committee system "kind of collapse." He said he is concerned about an apparent decline in enthusiasm. Shaw said that it seems that "the only people who are really concerned about economic development are in this room." The one committee which is functioning expertly is the Retention and Expansion/Small Business Assistance committee, Shaw said. Roy Seay heads up that committee. Other committees he and the EDCLC staff want formed and prodded are Prospect, "A Team," Membership/Public Relations/Advertising, Community Development, Hospitality, Transportation, Recycling, Free Trade, Corporate Finance, Fund Raising and Research/Marketing/Data. Board members tentatively planned a Christmas season open house where businesses and industries which EDCLC had a part in bringing to Lincoln County

would have booths showing products or services. This would be at the Stroud building, and it is hoped it will be in concert with Christmas events planned by other tenants in that building. Board member James Hobbs is following up on the proposal. Puckett reported that EDCLC is receiving \$4,000 plus each month from the county, but there is no formal contract. Board member and county commissioner Robert Hemphill said he will check on the status of the contract. Puckett said Sanders' emphasis will be on getting new committee members "on stream and trained." The board heard a proposal to hire a full-time secretary for EDCLC to give Sanders time to deal with the committee system. The value of committee members' attending various seminars and training sessions was brought out. Addy said attending even one seminar is valuable in making people a part of an effort. Sometimes they "don't feel

knowledgeable and in a lot of cases they aren't." "I think it is a necessary situation," Shaw said of training for committee members. Puckett said he will be meeting with prospects in San Diego, California, this week, followed by his attendance at a trade show in Las Vegas, Nevada. Meanwhile, Sanders will be representing the EDCLC at a trade show in Los Angeles, California, this week. Board members and treasurer Frank Sawyer said it is important that the EDCLC staff provide an itinerary and purpose statements on trips out of the area. In other action, the board acknowledged acceptance of an independent auditor's report by Dean, Barraclough, certified public accountants. In a statement, the audit firm says, "In our opinion, the financial statements referred to ... present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County as of June 30, 1990, and the results of its operations

and its cash flows for the year then ended in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles." Total expenditures for the year were \$113,818. This includes \$55,117 in salaries; travel and prospect development, \$11,528; rent, \$8,400; telephone, \$7,354; insurance, \$6,288; auto expense, \$3,216; contract services, \$2,760; professional services, \$2,748; payroll taxes, \$5,669. Other expenses were for office supplies, printing and advertising, postage and office equipment. The "A Team" committee would be a special task force "to provide highly concentrated, focused efforts on a given task from beginning to completion." The hospitality committee would provide lodging and meals to prospects who are visiting in Lincoln County. The recycling committee would be concerned with finding markets for recycled material, in effect, creating an industry for the county. Each committee should have a director assigned to act as liaison.





Banding together and pooling resources is allowing several South-eastern New Mexico communities to attract new businesses to the region and strengthen their business sectors, a New Mexico State University Cooperative Extension Service specialist said.

The Business Quarter, an organization that aims to improve economic conditions in sparsely populated areas of the state, is celebrating its fourth year. It supports advertising and other promotional efforts such as trade shows and target mailings.

There is strength in coopera-

tion," said Robert O. Coppedge, extension economic development project leader. Coppedge said the Business Quarter has generated economic growth in Southeast New Mexico and a similar approach could be beneficial elsewhere in the state.

Business Quarter member cities are Ruidoso, Clovis, Hobbs, Portales, Carlsbad, Tucumcari, Artesia, Roswell and Lovington.

Southwestern Public Service Co., which provides electricity to much of the area, facilitates and funds a portion of the activity. Some state funds also are used.

"Increased cooperation among smaller communities is critical to survival," said Coppedge. Programs such as the Business Quarter should be incorporated into an area's promotion plan.

When communities share their resources, they can afford to buy exposure for a variety of business or tourist attractions throughout the region.

"Communities are encouraged to call on outside economic development agencies, such as Cooperative Extension Service, to overcome obstacles to regional cooperation," said Coppedge.

## RHS Warriors football season ends at Cobre

Riding a roller coaster of emotions from frustration to hope then despair, a fine Ruidoso Warrior football team fell one possession short on a freezing Cobre Indian squad on a freezing cold night in Cobre, 34-28.

It was a Jekyll and Hyde performance for the Warriors. Blown out the first half in complete humiliation, the Warriors roared back the second half like a ravenous tiger. Cobre's prevent defense nearly backfired when the Warriors picked them apart late in the game.

It was a game filled with "ifs" on this night. If the Indians hadn't run back the opening kickoff for an 80-yard touchdown. If the ball would have been marked an inch shorter for that critical fourth down that allowed Cobre to run out the clock.

Two weeks ago, after the big Silver win, the Warriors had a lock on the district championship. Now after a forfeit of that Silver game due to an ineligible player and this loss to Cobre, the Warrior season has come to an abrupt and rude end.

### SUMMARY

Sam "the ham" Gumbert kicked and the Indians using the starburst formation to run the ball all the way back for an 80-yard touchdown. The extra point was good, and after eight seconds of play, the Warriors are down 7-0.

Starting on the 45, Kief Johnson runs twice for six yards and Manny Guardiola misses Candelaria with a short pass. The Warriors kick.

Cobre fails to move and kicks short to the Warrior 45.

Jorge Marquez drags a couple of Indians to Cobre's 42 for a first down. Marquez is stopped for no gain. Guardiola overthrows Huey. Johnson loses a yard. Warriors kick.

The Indians start on their own 13 and begin to march through holes and around the Warriors with huge sweeps. A key to Cobre's drive is consecutive off sides penalties against the Warriors that allowed the Indians a first down instead of forcing them to kick. The Indians threaten as the first quarter ends,

7-0. Cobre's Estabar, stopped for two downs, hits his man in the end zone for a TD. The point after is good and the Indians lead jumped to 14-0.

The Warriors start on their own 22. Guardiola hits Heath Huey for seven yards. Marquez drives for 11 to the 40, but drops a yard on the next play. Johnson gains seven. The ball is popped loose from Marquez and the Indians recover.

Cobre capitalizes. A drive for the first down at midfield is followed by a pitch right and the Indians sweep for the distance and TD. A 2-point conversion is good and the scoring gap widened, 22-0.

The uptight Warriors fumble the kickoff, then cover the ball on their own 15. Johnson runs hard for 15 to the 33, but Guardiola misses Chris Torres. Marquez is stopped after a yard and on third and long, Guardiola is sacked for a 2-yard loss. Warriors kick.

Cobre fails to move and the Warriors get the ball back on their own 24.

Guardiola overthrows Huey twice and on third and 10 he throws an interception that is returned to the 29.

Estabar, on a keeper, takes the ball to the six. A Warrior offside moves the ball to the three. Two plays later, the Indians score. The point after fails and the Indians lead was 28-0.

With little time before the half, Guardiola overthrows Torres, then hits Huey to the 35. Guardiola then throws the ball away, before he hits Torres for 12. Guardiola overthrows Shane Eidson, misses Huey, overthrows Huey and misses on a Hail Mary as the half ended 28-0 Indians.

Warriors start the second half with authority. Marquez races 13 to the 33 and then bulls his way down field for 17 yards to the 50. Guardiola hits Jamie Candelaria over center and Candelaria picks up yardage to the 13. Johnson takes the handoff and finds a big hole good for the distance and a Warrior touchdown. Gumbert's sure foot drives home the extra point and Cobre's lead is cut to 28-7.

The next possession was a killer

for the Warriors. Gumbert's kick is returned to the 42 and after a short 4-yard pass, the Warriors are lagged with a face mask infraction and 15 yards is tacked on. Another short pass picks up 11 and the Warriors are hit with a movement penalty. The Warriors are then called for interference and the ball is placed on the eight. Two plays later the Indians score. The extra point is blocked, but the score widened 34-7.

Guardiola fires a 20-yarder to Marquez to the 43. A chop block nullifies a fine 9-yard run by Guardiola and sends the Warriors back 15 yards. The Warriors game on fourth down with a Guardiola pass to Huey, good for the first down. Guardiola finds Huey with another long pass to the 9-yard line. He then finds an open Candelaria in the end zone for the TD. Gumbert splits the sticks and the score narrowed, 34-14.

Cobre begins play on the Indians own 32, but a short pass on a Warrior unsportsmanlike conduct penalty moves the ball to the Warrior 38. Cobre fumbles for the first mistake of the game and the Warriors recover.


Johnson runs a draw, good for 13 yards as the quarter ended 34-14, Cobre.

Working with no huddle, Guardiola hit Huey at the 30, Candelaria at the 25 and then Huey again inside the 10. Guardiola then reaches the five on a keeper, before Marquez squirts untouched into the end zone for a TD. Gumbert's kick is true and the score read 34-21, Cobre.

Guardiola then hits Marquez on the 10 and Huey for the TD. Gumbert rams it home and the margin stood at 34-28.

The biggest play of the game took place in the next series of plays. Ruidoso needed the ball and time was near the two-minute mark. The Warriors stopped the Indians for three downs with short yardage. Cobre gambled on fourth and a yard. The Warriors jumped with joy as they thought the Indians came up short.

It came down to the mark and the chain. The Warriors season ended by an inch.





The Capitan Lady Tigers rode a streak of nine straight service points by Kerrie Runnels in the fifth game to defeat the Fort Sumner Vixens in the Region D championship match.

The girls had trailed in the match two games to one before charging back for the victory, 15-9, 12-15, 8-15, 15-8 and 15-3, during the regional tournament Saturday at Capitan High School.

"It took a lot of integrity and character for these girls to win," said a happy Coach Pam Allen. "Coach McMath has a very good, physical squad in Fort Sumner this year."

Capitan won the first game of the match 15-9. The Lady Tigers had a slim 9-7 advantage when Runnels came in and served up five straight service points, moving them to the edge of victory. Possession went back and forth several times before Karie Cox served up the game winner.

Fort Sumner won the second game 15-12 in a marathon contest.

Possession was exchanged 40 times during the game, and neither team was able to run off more than three straight points until the Vixens rallied from a 10-12 deficit to take a 14-12 lead. Fort Sumner's controlled passing and some good serves eventually won out.

Capitan lost their edge in the third game when the Vixens put on a hitting display and won 15-8. The Lady Tigers charged back from a 2-8 deficit midway through the contest behind the serving of Vicky Sedillo to close to 7-8, but Fort Sumner later closed the match with six straight points for the win.

But the Capitan girls have a long tradition of playing under the gun, and came back in a scrappy fourth game. Behind early 1-2, Lesley LaRue put over six straight service points, one an ace, to shake the confidence of the Vixens. After several changes of possession, Vicky Sedillo picked up the pace and reeled off four straight points to give the Lady Tigers a commanding 12-3 lead.

Neither team was able to get control of the ball the second half of

the game, although Fort Sumner did put together a short streak to close to within 7-14. Possession was exchanged 18 times between Sedillo's serves and Kerrie Runnels game-winner for the final 15-8 margin.

New line judges were summoned for the final match, but Fort Sumner needed more than that to hold off the driven Lady Tigers.

Cindy Castillo served up the first two points of the game before Runnel's long streak, then Lesley LaRue sent a screamer over the net for an ace, giving the Lady Tigers an insurmountable 12-0 lead. The Vixens put up a semblance of a comeback in their next two possessions, making the score 12-3, but Karie Cox whipped over three straight to finish off the game and the match.

"I didn't feel too good after the second and third matches," said Coach Allen. "But our girls have been through a lot of heat. Four state finals in the last four years, and several of them were on the state championship team in 1988. They've also gotten clutch experi-

ence in their performances at high levels in track and basketball, so when they're backs were against the wall, they pulled it out."

Cindy Castillo and Karie Cox performed steadily throughout the match, setting up Lesley LaRue and Jennifer Eldridge for many big hits, and Vicky Sedillo covered the floor like a tarp.

Crystal Dalton also put in a workman's day on the court, saving several slams from Fort Sumner and taking control of the ball on Capitan's side of the net. Kerri Runnels, of course, was the server of note, rotating in when it was Eldridge's turn to serve, and coming out when it was time to go up to the net.

Capitan defeated Carrizozo earlier in the day to set up their match with Fort Sumner. The Vixens defeated the Loving Lady Falcons to reach the championship match.

The state tournament begins Thursday in Roswell at the Roswell High School Auxiliary Gym. Capitan faces Rehoboth that afternoon at 3:15.



If you want to cut down trees in Ruidoso, you'd better get a permit at village hall. A village ordinance requires that anyone cutting trees within village limits obtain a permit.

...Unless you're the village. That's right. The citizens have to get a permit, but the village can cut down trees in the right of way and on public property without recording those plans or getting a permit. The village doesn't even have to notify people of such plans.

The people who looked out the window Thursday to see village crews cutting trees in an area off Paradise Canyon Road were surprised, and they were angry. That's when they called Norwood and asked for his help. Whatever happens now, whether the trees have to go to make way for an improved street, or whether they stay, these folks have made an impact at village hall.

Norwood said Thursday that he'll take a close look at how street projects are implemented, and he agreed that people whose property is affected should be notified.

He turned a problem into an opportunity to improve the way the village deals with its citizens. That's good.

Katherine Finley is the one person most responsible for putting together the League of Women Voters of Lincoln County. That group will continue to provide a valuable service to voters in years to come by sponsoring forums and distributing information on issues.

We appreciate the candidates who will ask for your vote, but they'd better be prepared to hear the truth. A few years ago, Bud was asked to vote for one candidate, and replied by telling him, thanks, but we would be voting for his Democratic opponent. That was the end of a friendship and the beginning of animosity between that man and our family.

But, the candidates we talked to this time around didn't take that attitude.

As a matter of fact, Chuck Rominger and Mike Morris both made a point to say there would be no hard feelings if the newspaper didn't endorse them. Those guys have a lot of class.

Another candidate didn't like his story, and said, three weeks after the story ran, that he was too mad to call and complain. There wasn't much we could do about it by that time. In a case where a candidate is interviewed, the reporter and the candidate are the only ones who know what was said between them. The candidate talks and the reporter takes notes, with those written notes the best record of what was said.

If the people we write about won't talk to us, how will we ever get it right.

Most of the time, we got it right, writing thousands and thousands of words about the upcoming election and the candidates for office. We believe we performed a valuable service by giving our readers as much information as we could about the candidates.

And now, the election is over. Let's work with our elected officials and keep the lines of communication open so they can serve us well.




