Capitan man dies at home

Lincoln County sheriff's deputies were called to a remote residence outside of Capitan Friday to investigate the death of 42-year-old Richard Sellers.

Sellers was found dead in his home Friday morning by friends concerned after several efforts to reach him by telephone failed. The investigating officers speculated no foul play was involved in the death, as Sellers had a history of health problems and no indications of violence were found. He is believed to have been dead for two or three days.

Sellers' body was taken to the Office of the Medical Investigator (OMI) in Albuquerque for an autopsy to determine the actual cause of death. Unattended deaths are routinely taken to the OMI for investigation.

Authorities withheld the name of the deceased until late Friday afternoon when Sellers' sister was located in Arizona.

cerned," Gladden said. "By law, we are expected to hire Native Americans for the positions when they have equal or better qualifications for the position. Unfortunately, we have not received as many qualified applicants as we would have liked to."

Head football coach Mike Speck was also present at the meeting and said his primary goal is to get the Native American students more involved in the athletic programs.

"We want to keep them involved and help to develop the complete athlete," said Speck. "We'd also like to get the parents of the students more involved — one way might be to form a Mescalero Booster Club — and get their input on the programs."

Gladden detailed the federal programs during the meeting also. The Ruidoso Schools receive \$491,617 in federal grants for the education and aid of the Native American students. Another \$15,000 grant is still tentative.

The 874 Program grant, which amounts to \$132,641, makes up the largest portion of the grant monies. The main objective of this program is "to raise the academic level of the Native American population by maintaining the traditional values and stature of the total enrollment, also to raise their self-esteem and to develop programs to aide in the research and discovery of the talent that exists."

This is achieved through the study of the current academic achievement of the 874-program students, consultation with tribal officials, performing an informal survey of district staff and conducting formal discussions between the district's elected officials and tribal members.

Native American special education students receive the benefit of a \$71,295 grant aimed at improving the materials and tutoring provided them. The Region IX Co-op also receives federal monies totaling \$71,212 to supplement other spe-

Candidates count campaign costs

The general elections may be more than a month in the past, but Lincoln County candidates are still paying the bills for winning and losing campaigns.

The 30-day reports after the general election were due into the office of the county clerk Thursday, reflecting expenses and contributions from October 23 to November 29.

Candidates spent at least \$4,791.84 in winding up their campaigns this year, with county assessor-elect Pat Serna (Republican) leading the way with expenditures of \$913.64.

Serna's opponent, Democrat Wayne Townsend, dropped \$525.77 in a losing cause.

Contributions for the two didn't put much of a dent in the bills, though. Serna collected contributions amounting to \$283.33, while Townsend collected only \$55.

Republican Stirling Spencer's successful campaign for the District II County Commissioner's seat cost \$842.61. Democratic opponent C.O. "Chuck" Rominger has not yet filed

his report. Bud Payne, the Republican elected to the probate judge's position, reported expenses of \$636.66 with contributions of only \$33.33.

Democratic opponent Ruth Hammond filed a report stating that she had no expenditures nor any contributions totaling more than \$500.

Democrat Ralph Dunlap's unsuccessful campaign for the District I County Commissioner's seat set him back \$563.54, while Republican opponent Monroy Montes reported no expenditures or contributions greater than \$500. Dunlap reported no contributions in his statement.

In the sheriff's race, Republican incumbent James McSwane reported expenditures of \$413.51 with contributions totaling \$383.33. William Butts, the Democratic challenger, has not yet filed his report.

Republican Gerald Dean successfully defended his Division I Magistrate's bench against Benny Coker, the Democratic challenger. Dean reported expenses of \$330.92

for the past 30 days, with contributions of \$600. Democrat Coker's report has not yet been filed.

Incumbent Division II Magistrate J.R. "Jim" Wheeler was re-elected and reported spending \$278.25 with no contributions. The Republican's challenger, Democrat Harold Mansell, has not filed his report at this time.

Republican Janice Ware will move to another office in January, having defeated Mike Morris for the county treasurer's job. Republican Ware reported expenses of \$127.98 for the last 30 days, while Morris, a Democrat, spent \$158.96. Ware reported contributions over that period of \$50 compared to Morris' total of \$150.

County clerk Martha Proctor, who ran unopposed, filed a report stating she received no contributions nor had any expenses totaling more than \$500 over the last 30 days.

District III County Commissioner candidates Tomny Valliant and Bill Elliott also filed the \$500 report. Elliott, a Democrat, narrowly defeated Valliant in the race.

Lujan taps Chino for BIA re-organization

The Mescalero Apaches will have a strong voice in the reorganization of the Bureau of Indian Affairs next year, as Tribal President Wendell Chino will be on the national task force being formed for the job.

Chino will join Laguna Pueblo Tribal councilor Chester Fernando and Bernie Teba, executive director of the Eight Northern Pueblos Council on the task force, according to published reports.

Interior Secretary Manuel Lujan proposed the reorganization of the bureau to better serve the tribes,

and will choose 24 to 36 Indian delegates to the Tribal Advisory Task Force by January 2. The delegates will come from each of the bureau's 12 areas nationwide.

Chino has voiced opposition to Lujan's plan, saying that it is unacceptable because "it is still fraught with increased personnel, increased regulations and increased bureaucratic costs."

Lujan proposes the formation of a Bureau of Indian Education and wants a separate office to oversee the trust responsibilities of the United States to the tribes.

Ruidoso building permits holding steady near \$1 million

Building permits issued at Ruidoso Village Hall continue to run far ahead of those issued in 1989. Permits issued in November showed seven for single family dwellings at an average per unit cost of over \$100,000.

Total permits added to \$874,378 in November compared to \$1,073,188 in October of 1990.

The figures for November of 1989 was \$1,126,275, but there was one \$900,000 permit obtained by the Village of Ruidoso that month.

The \$900,000 item was for ripping up asphalt at the old airport, demolition there and such to get ready for golf course construction.

Single family permits for No-

vember added to \$743,288.

Residential additions/alterations accounted for the other \$131,090. There were no other categories in November.

In October, permits also were issued for new commercial buildings, commercial additions/alterations, repair of fire damage, a major retaining wall and sidewalk.

Single family dwellings added only to \$351,250 in October.

Dutch teen-ager gets a taste of American school, home life

The foreign exchange student program has brought many new students to the United States. This year the Ruidoso High School has four exchange students attending here.

Mariël Simons is a foreign exchange student from Holland. Simons is 17 years old and has already graduated from her school in Holland.

In Holland they have a different school system than they have in the United States. They start kindergarten at the age of four and go to kindergarten for two years. After kindergarten they go to middle school for six years. From middle school they go to high school.

Depending on how well a person learns they go to high school for either four, five or six years. The smarter the person is, the longer they go to high school.

Simons said schools in America are easier than in Holland for her. She was required to study more and her subjects were harder. For instance, students are required to take three years of Dutch, English, German and French in high school in Holland. After three years of these languages they may drop two and continue with their choice of two languages.

There are no athletic programs in the schools in Holland, only P.E.

is offered. If students want to participate in sports they must pay for them and join clubs outside of school.

There is no curfew for students in school activities. Ruidoso athletic's program has a curfew. Soccer is the most popular sport in Holland, said Simons.

They have many clubs in high school such as a school newspaper, chess club, biology club, gymnastics club and many more that are similar to the ones in the United States. They also have a movie once a month and a dance once a month.

The colleges and universities are also different in Holland. A university is higher than a college. If a person goes to four years of high school when they graduate they can go on to a special school or get a job.

If a person graduates after five years they may go to a college. After six years of high school the person may either go to college or a university. Simons also said 99.9 percent of all students go to college.

Teenagers are different in some ways here also. Simons said mostly here they are concerned with people of the opposite sex.

In Holland, the girls do not use much make-up. They also seem more independent in Holland than here. In the United States when friends meet they usually give each other a hug, in Holland they give

each other three kisses.

There are also no cowboys there.

In the United States teenagers may receive their drivers license, depending on which state you're in, at age 15 or 16. In Holland they must wait until they are 18 years old.

There is a legal drinking age in Holland, however, the night clubs and bars do not follow it. Most teenagers spend their weekends at the night clubs. Their parents usually give them a curfew of 1-2 a.m.

Teenagers also go to the movies. The movies are American movies in the English language with lines in Dutch underneath. They also go to the beach or shopping. It is easy for them to shop in different towns, and shopping is popular because as Simons says, "You can't drive for an hour without passing two or three towns."

There are also many different customs in Holland. In the United States, Christmas is the main family holiday, where the families get together and have a special dinner.

In Holland New Years is their special family holiday. On New Years the family gets together and has a special dinner. Then at midnight they all go outside to watch fireworks and to go around the neighborhood to tell their neighbors Happy New Year.

Simons also said in Holland

everyone in the family eats dinner at a specific time and at the table. In the United States many people put something in the microwave and eat in front of the television. Many people also cuss and no one thinks anything about it, whereas here it is often offensive.


There are only about five places with drive through windows in Holland. People do not usually eat in their cars. There are no commercials during movies either. The commercials come either before or after the movie. There is also no Mexican food.

Simons wanted to come to America because she knew the English language very fluently and she saw many movies about America that interested her. Also, because people in Holland always told her, "There is were the big things happen."

She said she was not expecting there to be this many burger places in America and did not know that teenagers could not go to the night clubs, or that Americans drove so slow.

Simons' host family here in Ruidoso is Ray, Rosemary and Anje Gann. She is here through the Rotary exchange program.

Simons' last comments were, "I like it here a lot, and I like my host family a lot."

Foreclosures decline in county

Residential foreclosures in Lincoln County are tapering off over 1989 and are dramatically less than in 1988, statistics from the district court clerk show.

District Judge Richard A. Parsons says we "used to have eight or nine every Monday."

That was during 1988, when, Judge Parsons says, out of 442 civil cases filed, 203 were mortgage foreclosures.

Foreclosures that year were 46 percent of all civil documents filed. Total cases that year were 1,040 including civil, juvenile, criminal, domestic and sequestered. Of the 1,040 cases, 1,038 were closed.

It appears that total foreclosures this year will be about 110.

Last year, the figure was 115, according to Margo Lindsey, district court clerk.

Bankers, savings and loan people and abstract and title company people generally agree that the residential housing market is

pretty much on the road to recovery.

David King, president of Sun World Savings, flatly declared: "The housing market is coming back. We have only one REO (Real Estate Owned). We can't complain about that."

Don Shaw of Pioneer Savings and Trust, agrees.

"The rate of foreclosures dropped off since late August ... there seem to be fewer problem properties ... the trend is definitely there," Shaw says.

That is the general opinion about residential properties, but commercial real estate "is still not good," Roy Seay of First National Bank declared.

"We are down to the normal rate on residential foreclosures," Seay says.

He said the delinquency rate is one percent compared to the five percent experienced the last five years.

Commercial property gets into trouble, he said, because of "not

enough cash reserves" and management problems.

"Businesses that are undercapitalized can't survive the highs and lows of the business cycle ... the margin of profit is not that high in this area," Seay says.

He said he doesn't see "the commercial side coming back as rapidly as we'd like to see."

Jim Atwood of Ruidoso State Bank said his bank has experienced a downturn in foreclosures and in real estate held which started in late 1989 and which continues into 1990.

Fred Vega of Lincoln County Abstract and Title says residential real estate activity was very good "until the last three weeks." He, too, said foreclosures have declined.

"We need snow," Vega said of what is needed to enhance the commercial side.

Mike Seelbach of The Title Company said that sale of larger homes (over \$150,000) is slow, but that those priced under \$150,000 "have

picked up quite a bit over last year."

Fanny Mae and Freddy Mac-held properties seem to be selling more quickly, he said.

Occasionally, he said, a seller will be forced to come up with the money to close a real estate transaction, but not as often as previously. He indicated money in buyers' pockets is not quite so tight.

With gross receipts income up, there appears to be a silver lining in the economic gray cloud.


This apparently is true on several fronts including residential real estate.

Realtors at an annual awards banquet next week will hear how the year ended up in real estate sales.

Reportedly, after a slump in late summer, sales have been improving.





L.C. Cowboy Symposium is only the beginning for Reed

After he got through with the successful Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium in October, Ray Reed didn't give himself much time to sit back and rest on his laurels.

Reed, who lives in Ruidoso Downs, just about wore himself out putting together the county's first Symposium. But, after putting together the event that drew 5,000 people, Reed was raring to go and headed off to some more cowboy get-togethers.

Just back from a cowboy meeting in Tucson, Arizona, Reed is on the road again, heading first for the Battlement Mesa Poetry Gathering in Grand Junction, Colorado, in December and then to the Arvada Poetry Session in Denver, Colorado, in January.

"I have acquired a reputation in the new poetry circles as a great emcee," says Reed. He's also in demand as an old-time western singer.

Reed has been well-known in the cowboy poetry and music world for years, and all his contacts came through for him in the Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium. Those cowboy poets and musicians showed up in force to entertain the 5,000 visitors.

Reed took time last week to look

back on that Symposium.

"We are considered, after our first one, numero uno in the nation," said Reed proudly.

He said there are a lot of reasons for that.

Reed said Lincoln County is in the perfect geographic position — the home of the Lincoln County Wars and Billy the Kid, and an area with the scenery and topography for a series of trail rides.

The Symposium — poetry, music, chuckwagon cookoffs, trade show, concessions and all — took place at the Super Select Sale Barn in Glencoe. The trail rides started and ended at the same location and the ropings were just down the road.

That good location was a factor in the success of the Lincoln County event, and the reason that Reed expects even more people to attend next year.

Other cowboy events, like the one in Tucson, have to be spread out all over the place, said Reed.

Elko, Nevada, the place where it all started, is noted for "working cowboy poetry," the kind favored by cowboy purists. Elko is still noted as perhaps the best cowboy gathering in the world.

But, Reed noted proudly, Elko started out its first year with just 1,000 people, a lot less than the

Lincoln County event with its 5,000 first year crowd.

"We added the swing music here," said Reed.

"The time was right, the weather was beautiful, it was the right place," said Reed, who dreamed of the Cowboy Symposium for years before finding the right people to make it a reality.

He's got even bigger plans now — an extensive trail system with all kinds of amenities for campers and visitors.

"I've preached to you about this trail system for years," said Reed, who has great plans for camping areas for multi-use that would lead riders throughout the county with overnight stops along the way.

"Rough it in comfort," said Reed, whose plans include restrooms and shower facilities, roping arenas and a dance pavilion at the camping areas.

"We have the opportunity to be the focal point of music — trail rides — the whole bit — right here in Lincoln County," said Reed. He shared his dreams with Walt Disney some years ago before that dreamer died. He and Disney talked about making Lincoln an exact replica of what it was in the old west, including removing the state highway through the center of the historic village.

The Dreamer

North wind blows in memories

North Wind Brings Christmas Memories

This is being sent to you right exactly at high noon on December six. From here in the little sunroom you look out upon a mountain world all sunny and bright under a blue sky; and you would wonder if you were really in the month of December.

Except for the golden grass on the mountain meadow out near the bluebird tree; and the river trees bare of leaves; and north wind blowing a breath of snow into the vale from away to the north in my native Alaska. Along with the voice of the north wind came memories of more than 80 years ago of Christmas time.

The snow birds — little messengers of Christmas blessings — are all around the house their little happy chirping songs harmonizing with the long-familiar harmonies of the north wind.

I say more than 80 years ago, because I can just barely remember my first Christmas when I was not quite two months old. The Christmas tree was bright with small candles which baked out an evergreen incense all through the room. There was the sound of a small toy horn blown by my brother John. The sound of the voices of my mother and father singing to the strains of a small pump organ. I remember a little turquoise colored drum, which seemed almost as large as myself.

Then on my second Christmas, here was the little drum now seeming much smaller, now that I had reached the age of one year and two months. I called this my "Greenish-Blue drum" (Trying to say "Greenish Blue"). The tree was full of little holders. (I have one here in the house left from those days.) The little flames baked a fragrance out of the tree twigs

that has remained with me to this day, and returns each Christmas as the Christmas lights bring out a faint flavor of the piñon tree.

On my third Christmas I was a little over two years old. Mother and Father and brother John and I walked from the house over the snow shining in the moonlight, to the Christmas evening services in the little Episcopal Church of the Epiphany, in Valdez.

Father carried me into the little porchway to the church, and here was a Christmas tree decorated with large stockings made of a gauze-like network. Inside was an orange an apple, and gum drops, candy canes, walnuts, and round hard candies we used to call jaw breakers. Father handed me one of the stockings.

During the service, the stocking broke and my jaw breakers went rolling all along the floor under the pews. I went gathering my jaw breakers, crawling around through the feet of the folks at the service. I came out in the front of the church and looked up into the face of the minister who gave me a kindly smile.

This was Father Zigler, pioneer Alaska priest, who kept holding services all over Alaska up into his nineties.

Early New Mexico Christmas Celebrations

The Early Spanish pioneers developed many Christmas customs which reached back into ancient times in Spain, yet showed forth the creative gifts of these people in making use of whatever was close at hand in the unsettled regions of their new homeland.

Among these were the "Luminario" (Lighter of the way); and the "Nacimiento" (The Nativity Scene).

The Luminarios originally were lighters of the way to midnight mass. Old timers used to tell of a great fire on Christmas Eve on top of the hill just north of the village of San Patricio. This was to let travelers know that mid-night services were being held at the Church of San Patricio.

Then all around the church and on the pathway leading to the door way, lighted torches of pine wood be driven into the ground. In later years other forms of luminaries were used.

A favorite form which is popular even to this day is a paper bag half filled with sand with a lighted candle inside. These are placed along walkways, on the edges of roofs, and all around the house; they send out a special cheery and inspiring light into the darkness of the night.

Of late years luminaries have taken the form of electric lights. All these luminaries welcome our Infant Saviour into the world and into our lives. Next time or so we will have something on the Nativity Scenes of early times, in New Mexico.

Let us be on the look-out for someone we can help to have a blessed Christmas. Let each one of us in his own way be a "Luminario" a Lighter of the Way.

Pipeline project should dry up most water leaks

Lane Plumbing Co. of Alamogordo is progressing somewhat slowly on a 3.2-mile pipeline project which will cut down severe leakage in the line.

The 18-inch pipe being put into the ground along the 3.2-mile stretch located along State Road 48 replaces old steel pipe which has caused terrible leakage problems, according to Keith Kessler, manager of the Bonito Lake area recreation area and pipeline overseer for the city of Alamogordo.

A pipeline from Bonito Lake to Alamogordo and Holloman Air Force Base supplies a good portion of water consumed in that area.

The current project which is ex-

pected to be completed in mid-January replaces old steel pipe which was originally installed in 1930.

Kessler said a nine-inch line which will feed Capitán also is being put into the same ditch as the 18-inch line made of blue plastic.

Kessler told The Ruidoso News that he has repaired 250 to 300 water leaks this year in the old line which the blue pipe is replacing.

The current project is Phase 2 of a pipeline replacement project by the city of Alamogordo which has water rights to Bonito Lake and which owns the campground above Bonito Lake.

Phase 3 will replace another two miles which will result in new pipe from the picnic area on SR48 above Nogal to the Bonito turnout on the same highway.

Holloman Air Force Base in the 1950s put in new pipe from the picnic shelter on to Alamogordo. That line has held up reasonably well, Kessler indicated.

The pipeline goes on up Nogal Canyon from the picnic shelter.

Original lines were put in place in the 1880s and 1890s to provide water for steam locomotives.

Those lines were made of wood with 3-8-inch wire cable wrapping.






