Survey says no n-waste

Respondents to The Ruidoso News' survey over nuclear waste disposal on the Mescalero Apache Indian Reservation were almost unanimous in their opposition to any such storage in this area.

The survey, although unscientific, asked for "yes," "no" or "undecided" responses to five straightforward statements:

1. I'm in favor of a plan to have nuclear waste stored temporarily on the Mescalero Reservation;
2. I'm against a plan to have nuclear waste stored temporarily on the Mescalero Reservation;
3. I don't think it's anybody's business what the Mescalero people do on their land;
4. I need more information on

Elections will dominate 1992

They're back. And some political candidates are just as scary as poltergeist.

It seems like one election is barely over in New Mexico before another campaign period begins.

Candidates for statewide and congressional offices have to file in March. Candidates for county offices must turn in their papers the following month.

The primary election which weeds out the also rans, is scheduled for June 2. And the day toward which all the big fuss is directed, the general election, is set for November 3.

EXPANSION

The Lincoln County election this year will be especially interesting because it will expand the county commission from three to five members. Along with that expansion, the terms of commissioners and other elected county officials will be extended from two to four years.

The election rules also allow county officials like County Clerk Martha Proctor and Sheriff James McSwane a chance to run for office again even though they both will be serving the last year of their second, two-year term.

Under the three-commissioner system, Proctor and McSwane would have to step down at the end of their second terms. But with the enlargement of the commission and the enactment of four-year terms, they get a shot at two four-year terms on top of their two, two-year terms.

Proctor actually will have an extra bonus opportunity.

To create staggered terms for county officials under the new system, the Secretary of State drew lots determining which officials will run for two-year terms in 1992 and who will run for four-year terms. In subsequent elections, all will be after four year terms.

Proctor said she recently received information on the drawing. Commissioner Monroy Montes in district five, the county treasurer, the county clerk and the two new commissioners in districts two and four will be running for two-year terms. All other elected county officials will be running for four-year terms.

For Proctor that means she has the potential of winning an additional two-year term in 1992 and then two subsequent four-year terms, a possible grand total of 14 years in office.

McSwane could serve for 12 years. Those elected officials in their first two-year terms could serve as much as 10 years.

"State officials felt that since the treasurer and the assessor work so closely together they should not be elected at the same time," Proctor said. "So the treasurer is elected at the same time as the clerk and the assessor with the sheriff."

Lincoln was one of three counties this year to vote to enlarge its commissions to five members. The other two were Luna and Taos.

PETITIONS

Nominating petitions are required from all candidates for statewide office, for state senators, state representatives and magistrate judges, Proctor said.

The number of signatures required is three percent of the votes cast for governor in that candidate's political party in the previous primary. If the candidate is running for a state office, the total number is statewide, but if the candidate runs within a district, the total number is drawn from there.

Statewide, 181,240 Democratic votes were cast in the last governor's primary, requiring 5,437 signatures. The Republican total was 80,971, requiring 2,429 signatures.

Candidates for county offices pay a \$50 filing fee and file in the county clerk's office. Candidates for state office or districts that include more than one county file with the Secretary of State.

PARTY SWITCH

Another change in the election law covers the time frame for voters to switch political parties.

Although candidates cannot change after January 27, voters can switch up until 28 days before the primary election, June 2.

"Actually, this is a good decision because so many would change (after the January deadline) and they didn't know why they couldn't vote in the primary," Proctor said.

QUALIFICATIONS

Different offices also carry different qualification requirements.

A candidate for U.S. senator must be at least 30 years old and a citizen for nine years or more; a candidate for U.S. representative must be 25 or older and a citizen for seven years or more. To be governor, no citizenship requirement is listed, but a candidate must be at least 30 and have resided in New Mexico for five years, the same qualifications for lieutenant governor, commissioner of public lands, secretary of state, state auditor and state treasurer.

Corporation commissioner candidates must be at least 18, a citizen and not employed or a registered agent of the types of industry the board regulates.

Candidates for the state board of education must be at least 18, the same minimum age as candidates for district attorney (DA). However, DA hopefuls also must be residents of the state for at least three years, residents of their districts and "learned in the law."

Supreme Court justices must be at least 35, must have resided in the state for at least three years immediately preceding the election and must have been engaged in the actual practice of the law for 10 years.

The age stays the same for candidates for the court of appeals and district judge. Appeals candidates also must have practice law for 10 years and lived in the state for three, the same residency requirement for the district judge. But the number of years of actual practice drops to six for that position.

No citizens requirements are specified for the remainder of offices. State senate candidates must be at least 25 and live in their districts. State representative candidates must be at least 21 and district residents.

County office holders must be 18 years or older. Commission candidates also must reside within their districts. Magistrate judge candidates for counties with less than 200,000 residents must have either graduated from high school or have earned a general equivalency diploma. Candidates for magistrate in counties larger than 200,000 people also must be members of the New Mexico Bar and engaged in the practice of law.

Below are some election-related dates:

—January 27: The last day before the primary election for a candidate to change or indicate party affiliation on an existing affidavit of registration.

—March 3: Up until 9 a.m., it is the last day the Governor may amend the primary proclamation with reference to statewide and congressional offices for which a declaration of candidacy must be filed.

—Filing day between 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. for declarations of candidacy and required nominating petitions with the Secretary of State for statewide and congressional offices.

—Filing day for declaration of retention for Supreme Court and Court of Appeals for the general election.

—March 6: Last day candidates for congressional and statewide offices may withdraw from the primary election.

—March 10: By 5 p.m., the Secretary of State has to verify by mail whether papers were properly filed for candidates who filed March 3.

Downs will elect judge, 2 trustees

The election this year in Ruidoso Downs will be a big one, with two seats open on the Board of Trustees and the municipal judge position open.

Candidates who want to run for these positions can file from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on January 7 with Ruidoso Downs Municipal Clerk Maurice Gudgel. She said the candidates must bring a current affidavit of voter registration from the county clerk to be able to file.

These affidavits must show the address as a street address or rural route, not as a post office box. This is the only time a person may file to become a candidate for municipal office unless the person files to be a write-in candidate.

Write-in candidates can file between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on January 21 following the same procedure.

In November, Downs residents

voted to reduce the number of trustees from seven to four to save money for the village, according to petitioners who asked for the vote. The vote turned out 70 "for" and 34 "against" reducing the board.

Trustees Jackie Brannum and Ray Fredrickson will remain on the board because their terms have not expired. The two other positions will be filled by the winners in the March 3, 1992, election.

Alice Allison's four-year term will have expired, and Margie Morales, Pam Bernard, Charlotte Craig and Karen Stevens all were appointed when elected members of the board resigned.

A mayor will also be elected as current Ruidoso Downs Mayor Bonnie Addy's term ends. Addy was appointed as mayor in July 1990 to

Time to take out the old tree

Christmas is over but there are still several chores to do before it can be forgotten, such as taking down decorations and getting rid of the Christmas tree.

For residents of Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs the task is simple. Place the tree by the dumpster or polycart, and the sanitation department will pick it up. Do not put it in front of the dumpster or in the dumpster because it may get stuck.

People may also take the trees to the dumpsters in the free parking area in Ruidoso to be picked up by the department. The village can chip the trees and use it for landscaping and fertilizing.

Residents of the unincorporated portions of Lincoln County may leave their trees besides the nearest dumpster for collection since most can be compacted, said County Manager Nick Pappas.

Mescalero health agency adopts "None for the Road" campaign

Russ Warwick, director of Mescalero Environmental Health and Safety has announced his agency's support of the Indian Health Services program of None For the Road Campaign.

The program is a five step approach for reducing the magnitude of alcohol-related motor vehicle crashes and the subsequent deaths and injuries. The campaign includes:

-Systematic Approach: IHS supports community based programs involving all agencies (health, law

enforcement, judicial, tribal administration) when seeking to remove drivers from the roads.

-Epidemiological Studies: IHS promotes the investigation of all alcohol-related motor vehicle injuries to determine what factors precede such incidents and to develop appropriate methods to prevent these injuries in the future.

-Regulations: IHS promotes the development of tribal laws controlling liquor sales (i.e. sales to intoxicated people, minors, and laws controlling hours of sale). IHS also

promotes tribes entering into agreements with off reservation taverns and liquor stores.

-Enforcement for deterrence: IHS promotes tribal adoption of strict drunk driving laws. This may include adoption of state laws or adoption of stricter tribal laws.

-Community Action Groups: IHS endorses tribal alcohol coordination committees taking the lead role in promoting the development of special community outreach initiatives.

According to Warwick the most

effective programs are those that are community based, aimed at a specific community hazard and aimed at the people that are at risk.

In this regard the Mescalero Law Enforcement Department has just received a radar gun and components to make its breathalyzer machine operative.

It is hoped that by enforcing Driving Under the Influence (DUI) laws, loss of life and injuries will decrease on the reservation as well as alcohol abuse.

Reading opens doors for new U.S. citizen

Busy raising two young children and adjusting to a new culture, Sara Gonzalez didn't have time to think much about her personal future.

But she was bothered by the fact that she couldn't read and write English. She wanted to be able to sit down in the evening and read stories to her children, Monica 12, and Martin, 10.

Four years ago while she was doing some housework for Leota Pfingsten, a retired school teacher with 26 years of elementary-level experience, Mrs. Gonzalez mentioned her literacy problem.

It was like waving a red flag in front of a bull. Mrs. Pfingsten charged at the challenge and, at the appropriate time, enlisted Ofelia Salas, a retired junior high school teacher of 40 years, in the effort.

After one year, Mrs. Gonzalez felt comfortable with her new language. In 1990, she went to work for Home Health Care, finally able to fill out all the necessary forms and reports.

At 1 p.m. December 6, she became a citizen of the United States. And now she is working on earning her general equivalency (high school) diploma.

"She won't let us quit," Mrs. Pfingsten said. "I've never done this before. Both of us fell into it, but with her enthusiasm, there's no way Sara would let us quit."

The day after Christmas, the women and other friends celebrated at Mrs. Salas' home in the settle-

ment of Lincoln. Mrs. Gonzalez had just registered to vote.

"I had gone to school in Mexico, I just couldn't read English," Mrs. Gonzalez said. "I mentioned it to Mrs. Pfingsten and she asked me why I hadn't said something before. It was about a year before I could read comfortably."

She applied for naturalization

because Lincoln is her home. Her husband, Manuel Gonzalez, is assistant fire chief of the local volunteer fire department and works for the state museum in Lincoln.

Mrs. Salas took over part of Mrs. Gonzalez' instruction for the last two years, especially in preparation for her citizenship test.

Mrs. Gonzalez, 29, said all the materials for her lessons were provided by the Literacy Council in Roswell.

Thanks to that organization, the interest of two friends and her own enthusiasm, Mrs. Gonzalez has accomplished several of her goals already and is well on her way to conquering another.

Ski Apache reported excellent ski conditions all weekend with no power outages and smooth operations. Roy Parker, manager of Ski Apache, reported less than a record number of skiers on the slope but never-the-less a busy weekend.

fill the position vacated by the resignation of C.L. "Bones" Wright.

The term of Municipal Judge Harold Mansell also will expire and leave a vacancy.

On January 9 the clerk will post a list of the individuals who have been certified as candidates, as well as those who have not been

certified with the reasons they have not. They will then draw by lot to determine the order the candidate's names will appear on the ballot for the March election.

The Village of Ruidoso, with three vacancies to fill, will have the same filing deadlines and rules and regulations for its municipal elections. (See story published in The Ruidoso News on Monday, December 23.)

and whether their names will appear on the ballot.

—March 31: Write-in candidates must file before 5 p.m. for specified offices for which a declaration of candidacy must be filed on April 7 and excluding the offices of U.S. senator and representative and statewide offices.

—April 7: The last day that the governor may amend the primary election proclamation in reference to offices for which a declaration of candidacy must be filed today, to include offices left vacant by removal, resignation or death.

Filing day between 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. for declaration of candidacy and required nominating petitions

for legislature, judicial district offices, state board of education and all county office.

—April 10: The last day candidates who filed April 7 may withdraw from primary election.

—April 14: By 5 p.m., notices shall be mailed to candidates who filed April 7 as to whether their documents were properly handled and whether their names will appear on the ballot.

—May 5: Voter registration closes at 5 p.m.

—May 26: Last day for candidates and treasurers of political committees to file the "10-day prior to election" report of contributions and expenditures.

—June 2: Primary election day from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

the plan;

5. I need more information on nuclear waste.

The survey didn't address any questions over nuclear waste storage operated by the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe on non-tribal land, but instead dealt with the reservation. Plans may include a land-swap where the tribe will operate a temporary site to store spent fuel rods off the reservation. Three sites have been discussed, all within about 100 miles of Ruidoso.

But, that's another question, since the feasibility study undertaken with a \$100,000 Department of Energy grant originally spoke of Indian land.

Of the 66 surveys returned to The News, 61 respondents said "no" to the first question, three said "yes," one was undecided and one was returned blank.

One of the three respondents who favors nuclear waste stored temporarily on the Mescalero Reservation was critical of the survey.

"I think your survey lacks the accuracy that could have been gained from you own pieces and will tend to incite," said Marshall F. Conover of Austin, Texas.

"Mescalero Reservation needs to be defined and does not necessarily mean next door to Ruidoso. In this case the land will most likely be elsewhere in New Mexico and not close to anyone," continued Conover, who also owns property in Ruidoso.

Jack Johnson of Capitan also favors the plan.

"If handled right I see no problem with this," said Johnson. "Also, I support WIPP," he added.

The other person in favor of the temporary storage of nuclear waste on the Mescalero Reservation responded to the question of whether it's anybody's business what happens on the reservation: "Under the condition it does not violate the rights of others and does not pose a safety/health problem."

Many of the people surveyed had

comments to make, with many noting that what happens on the Mescalero Reservation does concern their neighbors.

"Nuclear waste should be stored near where it is produced or even better around Washington DC or the mountains surrounding Camp David," said Ben E. Faytik.

Janice Hatton said "no way!" to nuclear waste storage in Mescalero.

"Thank you for allowing others to voice their opinion," she added. "You know there are Okies, Californians and, oh yes, Texans, that have an interest in the future of Ruidoso."

"This, if it occurs, along with Bandido Bikers, will influence us very much regarding retirement in Ruidoso," said E.J. Sutherland of Kingsland, Texas. "We already own our home on Hull Road, but it can be sold. The Village Council should do something positive to get rid of Bandido visits en masse."

"Five years ago we purchased a home in Ruidoso anticipating retirement in a beautiful pristine community," said Don and Vici Zick. "We've now retired to Ruidoso and are tremendously disappointed with this development," they added.

"I purchased a second home in Ruidoso in 1990 because of the beauty and natural environment," said Harry L. Bennett. "I know the temporary nuclear waste site would only have negative affect on Ruidoso, period!"

"We do not need or want this waste in our mountain village," said Patricia G. Adkins, a Ruidoso business owner. She noted that it is Ruidoso's business what goes on in Mescalero — "we co-exist!"

Frank Potter, former Ruidoso village manager, is opposed to the plan.

"Recently PBS ran a documentary on Chernobyl, and it was the most devastating thing I have ever seen," said Potter.

"We have a summer home in Ruidoso since 1979," said J.M. and Viola Townley. "We plan on spending more time up here since we retired. We are against any nuclear waste on Mescalero Reservation."

"I wonder how the Mescalero

people would react if Ruidoso was placing a nuclear waste stored facility adjacent to the reservation," said Bill Smith of Ruidoso, who added that he thinks it's everyone's business.

Rae Nell Grimes of Ruidoso called on the people of Ruidoso to unite.

"Let's band together as a people and oppose this thing strongly," said Grimes. "Who is going to live in a high-risk dangerous area by choice? or even visit?" she asked.

"If the 'temporary' disposal site goes in, I will leave Ruidoso," commented one area resident.

"It is the worst possible thing that could happen to our area and New Mexico," commented Vernon H. Beckley.

One survey respondent commented: "I do not want to be anywhere near the stuff — I will sell my home and move very far out of state if this nuclear waste comes in."

This person is against nuclear waste anywhere around Ruidoso — not just on the Mescalero Reservation. But as far as what goes on on the Reservation, this respondent noted that it could affect Ruidoso through a spill or an accident.

"I don't need anymore information. Nuclear waste is dangerous and whoever produces it should take the responsibility to take care of it themselves — not pawn it off on people that are supposed to worship 'Mother Earth' and 'Father Sky.'"

This same person accused the Mescaleros of caring only for money.

"They already have one of the most beautiful reservations in the U.S. and they still want more — they see money signs over the beauty of their land."

One writer, who signed themselves "very concerned," wrote "The Mescalero Native Americans speak with forked-tongue! How often do we hear about the sanctity of their Land? And yet, they are considering what could be THE absolute abomination of their sacred land, and all for the almighty dollar!"

"The land was GIVEN to them;

we paid for our land in Lincoln and Otero counties. It is not fair for the Indians to jeopardize the value of our land or the safety of our families by depositing dangerous waste in this wonderful area. Not one human on earth can ABSOLUTELY guarantee that this waste process is safe forever."

"Think about the investments the Indians have made at Ski Apache and the Inn; tourists could stop using these facilities because of atomic fear. Those investments would be down the drain; jobs lost; all that revenue gone."

"We have a fabulous place to live. Chino, don't ruin it for everyone with this insanity and greed! have you wondered why no other tribes in New Mexico are jumping at the chance for this site?"

"That question is easily answered!"

"These mountain resulted from uplifting by earthquakes, which makes the area too dangerous for such storage no matter how long they (the mountains) have been quiet," said John E. Hall Jr.

"A far more reasonable and practical solution to this 'temporary' nuclear storage problem would be to place it in one of the isolated plains areas of the White Sands Missile Range. It is already a secure area both from humans and from probable earthquakes and would have less objections and cost," he continued.

"I believe that we all should be involved in what the Mescalero people do on their land," said Geraldine Oswald. "It would be a disaster if they are allowed to dump nuclear waste so close to us."

Retirees spoke out vehemently against storing nuclear waste in the area where they intend to spend their golden years.

"We plan on retiring to Ruidoso in a couple of years, but not if there is a nuclear waste dump there," said one.

"It is dangerous and even transporting by tanker trucks is extremely dangerous. Do you want that in your beautiful area? I sure don't."

Shanta needs some tender loving care Visit the animal shelter; you'll be glad you did

With a friendly face right out of a Little Rascals episode, Shanta's engaging personality would brighten any home.

The two-year-old female was brought into the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter about six weeks ago wearing a bandana and caring for a litter of 10 puppies.

She had been found wandering as a stray several times before, said Randy Basch, shelter manager. This time her owner wasn't interested in reclaiming her.

Many of the pups didn't survive because they had not been given protective shots and were ill.

"She's very gentle, but good with other animals and kids," said Basch. "She'd be a good family pet."

Shanta shows some German short hair pointer traits.

"I believe she's housebroken," Basch said. "She doesn't mess in her pen."

If Shanta's appearance appeals, but a male is preferred, Basch has the answer.

Doc, a classic bird dog, is short-hair basically white with brown spots, and is available for adoption.

A new resident, a two-year-old male with markings and hair-length similar to Shanta, also is ready for a home. He was brought in as a stray.

"He's a little more aggressive with other male dogs and probably wouldn't be good with cats," Basch said. "But he would be good with kids."

And then there's a three-month-

old pup with a brown spot over his eye who's been living at the shelter for the past two weeks. He was found wandering.

For the remainder of the month, Dr. Lynn Willard of the Ruidoso Veterinary Clinic has offered to pay 25 percent of the total adoption fee for animals from the shelter.

That fee includes the cost of the animal's rabies shot, city license and neutering or spaying procedure.

All animals adopted from the shelter must be spayed or neutered to prevent the production or more unwanted litters that could end up abandoned or have to be destroyed. Shanta already has seen most of her litter die from lack of caring by her former owner.

Shanta or any of her look-alikes are sponsored for adoption by a generous contributor to the shelter who will pay for her spaying.

Sponsoring an animal is just one of the ways a person can help the unfortunate animals at the shelter. They enjoy being taken out for walks by visitors or receiving special treats and some conversation on inclement days.

Don't forget the many felines in the cattery next to the main building. They range from kittens to adults, tiger striped to pure white or black and just about everything between.

While Duran said the staff welcomes challenges to create unique hairstyles for the holidays and other events, they also cater to everyday preferences of their clientele.


"We welcome everyone and appreciate the community's support," he said.



"Robo-Warden" is on night watch


Inside the Outdoors

he tries to make his getaway. He doesn't get far though before being stopped by the flashing lights of a patrol vehicle. The driver and passenger are ordered from the vehicle, handcuffed and searched for weapons. They don't even ask why.

This scene is just one of many such incidents that occurred during this year's deer seasons. The use of the deer decoy by conservation officers is putting a bit in the ranks of the night hunter. The poacher that hunts, not with stealth, but with a blinding light.

The good news is that conservation officers are apprehending lots of poachers, the bad news is that this shows night hunting is a serious problem. How many other folks are out there doing the same thing and are not getting caught? How many deer are lost, either killed or crippled, each year after legal shooting hours are over?

Use of the decoy has also uncovered another interesting bit of information. What is the profile of the night hunter? Is he rich or poor, young or old, resident or from out of state, man or woman? The answer is that there is no profile. People aged from 13 to 70, unemployed and respected members of the community, men and women, Texans and natives of the state have all been cited for night hunting. It seems the urge to "get that deer" is the only prerequisite of the night hunter.

Maybe though, there is something that can be done about the problem. In the past these folks would face a fine of up to \$300 and the remote possibility of a stint in jail. Looking at statistics, the average fine paid by spotlighters was around \$100. Not the kind of figure to put a stop to spotlighting.

However, this year it's different. Conservation officers have a new deterrent for night hunters. The poacher's vehicle and firearms are seized immediately. To date, conservation officers have seized 29 vehicles and the total of firearms is still being added up. Hopefully, this new deterrent will help stop poachers that hunt at night. Paying a small fine is one thing, losing that \$15,000 vehicle is quite another.

That's the bottom line. Let's stop the folks from poaching our deer at night. Prevention is the way we can keep live deer in the field instead of crippled and dead deer lost to poachers.

Hunters are for the birds during fowl season

The cold temperatures have folks bundling up with clothing, but it also marks the arrival of northern visitors. Not people, but birds. The fall waterfowl migration is in full swing and hunting seasons are open.

Those planning on heading out to the old familiar duck blind with the favorite retriever as well as beginning waterfowl hunters should take time out to pick up a copy of the regulations. There have been some changes this year.

New this year is the state duck stamp. This stamp is required of all waterfowl hunters in New Mexico. The good news is that the stamp is available free of charge to anyone that purchases a small game or

combination hunting license. All hunters need to do is pick it up when they purchase a license. For those that didn't pick one up, it's no problem. Just go to any license vendor and get one free-of-charge.

Waterfowl hunters will also need a federal duck stamp. These may be purchased from post offices around the state at a cost of \$15. In addition to these stamps, hunters who utilize U.S. Forest Service or Bureau of Land Management properties will need a Wildlife Habitat Improvement Stamp.

Once again this year all waterfowl hunters must use steel or non-toxic shotshells. Those hunting in the Central Flyway, which encompasses most of the state, will be

under a point system for the bag limit on ducks.

The following values have been assigned to the duck species:

—Northern pintail, female mallard, redhead, hooded merganser and mottled duck are worth 100 points.

—Male mallard and wood duck are worth 50 points, while all other ducks on which season is open are worth 35 points.

The bag limit is reached when the point value of the last duck taken, when added to the sum of the point values of other ducks already taken that day meets or exceeds 100 points. This means that a hunter who shoots a 100 point bird is through for the day and the max-

imum number of ducks that may be taken in any one day is three.

Goose hunters once again have a liberal bag limit of three dark geese and five light geese per day.

There is some other good news for waterfowl hunters. Rains came up north which led to a record number of ponds available for nesting ducks. Unfortunately, they did come too late for early nesting species, but did help late nesters, such as mallards.

Their numbers are expected to increase in this year's migration from 8.3 million birds last year to 10.2 million mallards this year.

More ducks and geese are arriving every day, so get out the gear and head out to the fields or ponds.

Go back to school in 1992

Let's all go back to school in 1992.

Educating the next generation is too big a job for the schools' paid staff. It's a job that requires the support of all segments of society — not just in tax money, but also in time and energy.

Some of us — parents and other taxpayers — would have been counted absent over the past few years if the schools were to call roll.

Visiting in Ruidoso schools, it's apparent that parental involvement is highest at Nob Hill Elementary School, drops off a little at White Mountain Elementary School and then more at White Mountain Intermediate School. Parents have very little involvement at Ruidoso Middle School and they're even more scarce at the high school level. That's true in other school districts as well.

And that's significant when you consider that the most severe problems — in drugs, violence, truancy and general behavior — reach a peak at the Mid School level. It's the time when parents and teachers make a strong pitch for independence and personal responsibility, but that doesn't mean those vulnerable youngsters don't need adults as role models.

You don't have to be a parent to get involved in the schools, even though parents have a big stake in making sure that teachers have enough help and support to provide a good education. All of us have a stake in the education process, because those who don't learn reading and other basic skills become productive members of society are likely to become dependent on the government for subsistence.

And so, in 1992, volunteer to spend some time in the schools. Teach a kid something that you do well; listen to a young reader or just listen to a young person talk; be a volunteer sponsor for a club or class; you probably have a skill that's needed in the schools and could enhance educational opportunities for some young person. Just being there will tell students that they are important and that education is important. Call a school principal and ask what you can do to make education better in your town's school system.

If you've ever wanted to make a difference, now's your chance. Go back to school.


