Court decision could impact Fort Stanton

The Fort Stanton State Hospital and Training School will be undergoing some changes soon, according to a decision passed down by United States District Judge James A. Parker in Albuquerque.

Parker's 175-page opinion was written after eight weeks of testimony in a class-action lawsuit filed against the state by Protection and Advocacy Systems, Incorporated (P&A) on behalf of a Los Lunas State Hospital and Training School resident.

The federal judge's opinion sparked a story by the Albuquerque Sunday Journal and renewed local fears that the Fort Stanton facility might be shut down.

Fort Stanton State Hospital and Training School is located in Lincoln County on the grounds of the historic fort.

The facility employs 235 people and provides care for 150 residents.

Parker found the state to have violated hospital residents' constitutional rights to due process and unlawful discrimination against the most severely handicapped.

Critics of the state institutions claimed that residents were "warehoused" in the facilities and not provided the safety, education or training due them according to the law. The critics argued that the handicapped would be better served under smaller communal conditions.

Fort Stanton administrator Ervin Aldaz defended against the warehousing charge and said Friday that a report made by the New Mexico Attorney General's office would be released this afternoon (Monday). The report should provide more detailed information about how the state schools will address changes.

The main demand put upon the state facilities is the removal of some residents who are most capable of being cared for by their families or in a smaller community setting.

About 20 percent of the residents at Los Lunas and Fort Stanton would be affected by the ruling.


This decrease in the number of residents would change Fort

Stanton's population by 30, but would only cost nine employees their jobs.

"This is due to the way the residents are spread out around the facility," said Aldaz. "Also, the residents that would be transferred out are the ones with the smallest care needs."

The state is due to provide a transfer and correction plan by April 1 and is supposed to have all problems cited in the lawsuit corrected by September. Representatives of the state and members of the opposition from the lawsuit are expected to spend some of the next three months working on the timetable for the changes to be made.

According to the judge's opinion, the state must design a community service system that will adequately care for citizens with developmental disabilities outside an institutional setting. Mentally and physically disabled residents with symptoms such as retardation, epilepsy and cerebral palsy will be affected by the changes.

What's in, what's outside Ruidoso village limits?

The Stroud building, the largest structure in Ruidoso, is not technically in Ruidoso according to Cleatus Richards, village planning and zoning director.

In fact, Richards said many properties considered to be within the city have never been annexed.

Richards said that very often, years ago, a plat of an area, pro-

posed for annexation, wasn't included in city records.

"A long time ago, it was done by metes and bounds type of description," he said. To correct that situation means Richards will be working with surveyors Tim Collins and/or consulting engineer John Shaw to try to trace out those actual legal descriptions and to figure

out what's included.

"There's an area on Gavilan Canyon that our ordinance shows to be annexed, but the metes and bounds description doesn't cover everything we show on our maps as being annexed," Richards said.

The correction sequence would be to first analyze all of the annexation records to determine what is

properly and legally annexed to the village, Richards said. Then he will consult the city's legal counsel to determine a course of action, either working through an annexation commission or under state statute to annex the properties.

"The Stroud building and a few of the others have been under a general assumption that they were

in the village. They are receiving full village service. They're connected to our water system, getting garbage pickup, police protection, fire protection. They're getting the benefits of a property under annexation," Richards said.

"There won't be any interruption of service. No one will be given bills for past service. We will take it

from the point when they are finally annexed," he said.

The tax rolls will be changed on completion of the annex. Richards said the city's tax levy would apply to the property once annexed.

The annexation process under the boundary commission takes a minimum of a six months, he said.

Judge advocates tougher drunk driving sentencing

The New Mexico court system drops the ball when it comes to drunk drivers with multiple offenses, according to Ruidoso Magistrate Judge J.R. "Jim" Wheeler.

He advocates tougher laws to deal with repeat offenders.

The maximum penalty now, whether it is a person's second or 102nd offense, is one year in county jail and a \$1,000 fine, he said.

"I feel that on a fourth offense, when the person has had counsel or knowingly waived counsel on the first three, it should be at least a fourth degree felony," Wheeler said.

"The person should be facing 18 months in the New Mexico State Penitentiary and a \$5,000 fine or both."

Every time the State Legislature changes the DWI (driving while intoxicated) laws, it adds extras such as impounding the offenders' cars; extras Wheeler says have little positive impact.

He said the law would be more

effective if after the first, second or third offense, repeaters could be sent to district court where they might face much tougher penalties.

"The only reason magistrates handle the second offenders on DWI is a 1975 attorney general's opinion that says they have the authority," Wheeler said. "I'd like to see the statute give magistrates specific powers to handle repeaters to a point, but then run the multi-offenders to the district court. Let them face the penitentiary. I believe that, I think that's where we drop the ball."

The state recently increased motor vehicle homicide from a fourth degree felony to a third degree offense, but the maximum penalty still is only three years in the state penitentiary or a \$5,000 fine or both, Wheeler said.

"I think homicide by motor vehicle should probably carry a nine- or 10-year penalty," he said.

On the other hand, New Mexico has one of the toughest statutes in the country for first DWI offenders, he said.

"People gripe because they see the court report and see that I've sent a first offender to DWI school," he said. "They forget that he also has to pay \$100 to go to that school. He's going to pay \$175 to get his license reinstated. If he registered 1.0 or higher (on the alcohol breath test), he's going to lose his license for a minimum of 90 days under another statute that doesn't have anything to do with court," Wheeler said. "In Lincoln County and Ruidoso, that's pretty good punishment because we don't have taxis and buses."

The offender's car insurance premium also will go sky high, Wheeler said. "And it should, he said. "I have no compassion for drunk drivers just because homicide by motor vehicle is a crime of no specific intent. It's the fact that a person got intoxicated and drove an automobile and he killed someone. It is a crime, a felony, and you don't have to prove that he intended to commit this crime."

Groups to meet here

The first Ruidoso Planning and Zoning commission meeting of the year is scheduled for today in the council chambers at 2 p.m.

The commission will hear a preliminary concept plan presented by Main Street director Mary Maul. Other business will include a request by James Williams to replat lot 20, block A of Navajo subdivision, to shift the roadway and utility easement.

G.H. Hufford and R.R. Harper requests the replat of lots three and four of block one in the Highwood Addition, for a property line adjustment to cure encroachment.

The Ruidoso Village Commissioners will meet in the council chambers for its regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday at 6:30 p.m. A 5:30 workshop will precede the meeting.

The Ruidoso Board of Education will kick off the new year with its first regular meeting at 7 p.m. Tuesday, January 8, at Ruidoso Middle School (RMS). The meeting is tentatively scheduled in the RMS library.

According to the Ruidoso meteorologist Bill Hosteler, today will be partly cloudy and cool with a chance of a few mountain snow flurries. MainStreet planners are back

Carter & Burgess people were presenting further concept ideas and drawings on revitalization of downtown Ruidoso at a public meeting this morning.

John H. Mason, senior vice president, and William M. O'Brien, project manager and architect, were making the presentation at Cree Meadows Country Club to interested persons.

The Fort Worth-based planning firm has been working on parking, lighting, traffic and other aspects of upgrading the MainStreet Ruidoso project area which is the heart of the shopping district in Ruidoso.

MainStreet through the village of Ruidoso retained the firm via a \$36,000 planning grant from the 1990 New Mexico Legislature.

Today's public hearing was the second one on concepts for improving the viability of the downtown area.

And in November, O'Brien met with MainStreet board members and outlined a preliminary plan which would include additional traffic lights, sidewalk widening, improved lighting and landscaping.

One major part of the plan is identifying potential parking area off of Sudderth Drive.

Also presented were rough plans for an open air pavilion and community park area.

Public restrooms are a priority in the preliminary plan, also.

Some of the aspects of the plan have been opposed by some business people on Sudderth.

Debate was expected to be hearty this morning as the plan is becoming more crystallized.

Future considerations will be how to finance planned improvements. Carter and Burgess is committed to help with that aspect of the plan, also.

Cooperation was key to county successes in 1990

Cooperation was the key to Lincoln County's many important accomplishments in 1990, said county manager Nick Pappas.

Public and private citizens, as well as the various governing bodies in the county, put aside personal goals to join together and meet more all-encompassing needs for the county, said Pappas.

Solid Waste
Far and away the most important accomplishment for the county is the establishment of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority (LCSWA).

The first such governing body in the state, the authority will oversee the collection, transport, disbursement and billing of solid waste in Lincoln County.

Capitan Mayor Frank Warth explained that new rules set by the Environmental Improvement Division (EID) regarding waste disposal and landfills were going to make it nearly impossible for small, rural communities to afford to make the changes necessary to meet the stringent environmental codes.

In Lincoln County, the waste disposal situation was as varied as the communities. Capitan had its own landfill (and still does). The county landfill was going to be shut down. Ruidoso's new mayor, Victor Alonso, offered to help Ruidoso and Downs with its waste disposal, and both communities' waste was taken to a landfill near Roswell.

Alonso is given much credit for helping get the authority off the ground. A county solid waste committee was formed to provide a forum for discussion of the project, and after many meetings the Lincoln County Special District Commission was approached to approve the formation of the LCSWA.

Joint powers agreements were signed by Capitan, Carrizozo, Corona, Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs and Lincoln County, creating a body from which representatives could be selected and a gross receipts tax for the county and municipalities was set to begin collecting funds for the project.

Based on population and amount of waste created for disposal, Ruidoso was awarded five seats on

the 11-member board of directors. Lincoln County will be represented by two members, and the other four communities will each have one representative. Any motions voted on the board will be carried by a pure majority.

Some citizens expressed concern over the possibility that Ruidoso would dictate policy and rates with its majority on the board.

Members of the solid waste committee hashed out this problem several times; once they even proposed that rates and changes could only be passed with a majority vote coming from at least three entities represented on the board, thus limiting Ruidoso's ability to lead the authority.

In the end, the simple majority rule was set, primarily to simplify voting procedures and partially to evince a symbol of cooperation formed by the group.

On New Year's Day, the gross receipts tax went into affect and now the authority will begin the process of selecting representatives and pool all county and municipal resources together.

County Morale
Pappas said the second most important accomplishment in the county was the strengthening of morale in the county offices and the increased cohesiveness of county departments.

"It's been such a good thing at the courthouse," Pappas said. "Everybody has put their problems to bed and is truly working together to achieve the same goals. We're all here to take care of the public in one way or another; the best way for all of us to get there is to have open lines of communication and a spirit of cooperation between the offices."

A minor change to help the situation was the installment of new telephone programming equipment. Phone calls to the county complex can now be transferred to any office; previously, a caller had to be put on hold while another line was tied up making a connection to the office that needed to take the call.

County Road Department
Pappas claimed that another of the most important achievements in the county last year was the

rebuilding and reorganizing of the county road department.

Former road superintendent Tommy Hall was given credit for making the department more efficient and from some reports, for cutting down on losses due to theft and low productivity.

Ironically, Hall was let go last week by the new county commissioners in a 2-1 vote on whether to renew his contract. The road superintendent's position has been changed to that of road manager, and is currently filled by Joe Vega Jr.

The commissioners expect to have a new county road manager before the end of February.

County Fire Board
In another case of uniting separate entities, area firefighting units are in the process of forming the Lincoln County Fire Board.

The organization will be made up of representatives from each of the fire departments in the county, including forest service departments.

"The dialogue and the willingness of the individuals will help a lot," Pappas noted. "The initial benefits of the board will provide the county residents better fire protection through clearer communications and better coordinated

the county opted into the enhanced 911 emergency telephone service.

With the establishment of the addressing system, emergency phone calls will be made from anywhere in the county by simply dialing 911. An emergency dispatcher will automatically have, with the aid of a computer, the address from where the call comes and be better able to direct assistance to the location of the emergency.

Some opposition to the addressing came from some of the county's ranchers. They expressed concerns over anybody being able to "find out where they live."

Lincoln County Civil Defense Director Maggie Bohks said the fair coming along, but also remarked that the project was a little bigger than expected.

"Besides making the E-911 system so much more effective, there are other benefits," Bohks said. "The county maps currently being used are eight years old. The rural addressing will create a new, more accurate map of the county and its streets and roads."

The rural addressing project is due to be finished by December 1, 1991.

Lincoln County Fairgrounds
Over in Capitan, the Lincoln

competitions, an event that has grown in popularity in the area. The arena work is due to be completed by April 1.

The improvements don't end here, though. In 1991, the fair board hopes to get some grant money to build new fences around the grounds and generally clean-up the area.

Also scheduled for this year is the covering of the bleachers. The fair board already has the \$25,000 necessary for the project earmarked. The date for the start of the project has yet to be determined.

Subdivision Developments
Pappas also put subdivision developments on his list of major county accomplishments.

"We really got a good start on resolving some of the problems in the 17 red-tagged subdivisions in the county," Pappas said. "We've worked successfully with four of the groups so far, and they have brought their roads and easements up to county standards."

Pappas said the county planning and zoning commission and the board of commissioners would be working hard with the other 13 subdivisions this year.

Elections

Lincoln County Republicans nearly made a clean sweep of the November elections. Of 10 county positions, nine went to the Republican candidates. New County Commissioner Bill Elliott was the only Democrat elected to a county post.

District 56 State Representative Ben Hall was unseated by Democrat John Underwood in the elections.

In the county, all eligible incumbents kept their posts rather convincingly. Sheriff James McSwane and magistrate judges J.R. "Jim" Wheeler and Gerald Dean Jr. each won convincingly, while County Clerk Martha McKnight Proctor ran unopposed.

The other new county officials elected are County Assessor Pat Serna, County Treasurer Janice S. Ware, District I Commissioner Monroy Montes, District II Commissioner Stirling T. Spencer and Probate Judge J.O. "Bud" Payne.

Transportation District
Proponents of the Iron Horse

Railroad had gone as far as they could with their project without facing a county transportation body, but Lincoln County didn't have one.

The transportation district was created and six board members from the three districts plus one at-large member heard the Iron Horse proposal to request state funding for a feasibility study.

The district was awarded a \$40,000 grant from the state transportation authority and had the distinction of being one of only two of the six districts requesting funds to receive a grant.

Superfund Cleanup
Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) representatives homed in on representations to the cyanide contamination around the Cimarron Superfund Site — the old Carrizozo mining and milling operation.

Operations at the site were closed in 1982, but over the years, cyanide from the precious metal recovery operations seeped into the shallow groundwater around the site through an unlined discharge pit.

The EPA will pump the groundwater to the surface and transport the contaminated water to the local treatment plant for purification.

Once at the treatment plant, the cyanide will be reduced through the natural degradation processes including aeration, photo-decomposition and the addition of chlorine.

During remedial investigations at the Cimarron mill, another site known as Sierra Blanca was discovered. Preliminary tests have thus far shown the new site to be much cleaner and safer than the Cimarron site.


Treatment at the Cimarron site is scheduled to begin sometime in the spring of this year.

Law Enforcement

Lincoln County Sheriff James "Jay" McSwane reported a better year for Lincoln County residents.

McSwane reported a decrease in traffic deaths, homicides, reported rapes and violent crime overall from the previous year.

Drug seizures increased from 1989.

firefighting efforts."

One benefit of getting the forest service involved is that now the county departments have access to federal program benefits. The combined departments also have greater access to training programs that will increase the capabilities of each volunteer fire department in Lincoln County.

The participating departments already are learning some of the advantages that will be made available to them, and 1991 promises to see complete representation on the board and an opportunity for the coordination of fire fighting efforts county-wide.

E-911
Another accomplishment related to the fire departments is the establishment of rural addresses. The process was made necessary when

County Fairgrounds received a much-needed facelift in 1990.

The county commissioners awarded bids to several contractors on three projects: new bleachers, insulation for the hall and arena enlargement.

Jack King Jr. of the Lincoln County Fair Board said the improvements will make the fairgrounds for use by Lincoln County residents.

"The old bleachers were just wore out and were beginning to be a safety hazard," King said. "By putting insulation in the hall building, we'll have a facility that can be used during winter months as well as the spring, summer and fall."

King noted that the enlargement of the arena is targeted specifically at attracting more team roping

1990 in review


The year 1990 was a fast-moving one in Ruidoso on the business and economic scene. That's nothing new for Ruidoso which sees a lot of fluidity on the business scene because of the nature of a resort community which often is on an economic roller coaster.

Much of the economic news was positive during the year. It wasn't all good, however.

On the plus side, for instance, Steve and Joan Stroud purchased the Financial Center on Mechem Drive in a multi-million-dollar deal and renamed it The Stroud building. It houses tenants and Stroud Crop, Inc. and Stroud Prairie State Insurance, which were moved here by the Strouds from Oklahoma.

Having an impact on the economic climate here was the fact that some 250 Stroud insurance agents from 17 states came to Ruidoso to train for a few days. Such training will occur periodically.

Having a tremendous impact during the year was the construction of a new golf course, Sierra Blanca Resort, on the site of the old airport. Plans are proceeding for a Radisson Hotel on the site, also, and for the civic center which is in planning stages. All of this puts money in local coffers.

Toward the end of the year, Chapter 7 bankruptcy was declared by L.F. Jennings Oil Co. headquartered in Ruidoso. The company which had outlets in Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs, Capitan and Carrizozo, was a gasoline wholesaler. The filing listed debts of \$1,062,211 and property of \$449,944.

Two Midtown Marts in Ruidoso owned by the company were closed Wednesday.

Another plus factor for the area was the announcement that Ruidoso Natural Gas Co. would build a new \$250,000 complex at Ruidoso Downs. The name was subsequently changed to Zia Gas Company and the complex is complete and awaiting an open house.

Real estate sales in 1990 showed a gain of 11 percent over the previous year. The 1990 figure was announced at a Multiple Listing Bureau awards banquet.

During the year, the Ruidoso Bank Corporation sold the Bank of the Rio Grande in Las Cruces for \$3.5 million. Now the Ruidoso Bank Corporation owns only the Ruidoso State Bank. James Atwood was named president of Ruidoso State Bank this year.

Ruidoso State Bank last racing season had a branch operation at Ruidoso Downs Race Track in the first level concourse, a first.

MainStreet Ruidoso and the Village of Ruidoso obtained a \$36,000 grant for a study of how downtown Ruidoso (MainStreet project area) can best be enhanced and revitalized. A Fort Worth planning and architectural firm is doing the study currently.

Boca Grande Pass, Inc., recently purchased the old Gibson site and buildings and land in that complex at the "Y" and is planning a fun park there. Planned is a miniature railroad, miniature golf course, go-kart layout, car wash, possible laundry and other improvements, all to occur in 1991, according to the Y-Knot Park developer.

Carroll "Buddy" Bundick, manager of Texas-New Mexico Power Co. here, was promoted to division manager during the year and moved to Silver City. He was replaced by James L. Bassett.

Bundick also had to step down as president of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County and was replaced by Don Shaw.

Sammy Lopez, publisher of The Ruidoso News, during the year was promoted to manager of Rajlon's six newspapers in New Mexico, Arizona and Colorado. He remains as publisher of The Ruidoso News and continues to reside here with his family.

During the year, real estate companies and individual realtors won several regional and even national awards.

Warp Speed Light Pens, a manufacturer here, announced during the year an affiliation with IBM; Craig Rawlings also announced a short time ago a

contract with Methodist Hospital for light pens worth over \$400,000. IBM will be furnishing monitors for the project to the hospital.

A lot of property changed hands during the year. Truman Barnett purchased Territorial Abstract & Title Co. and renamed it The Title Company.

Real estate realignments are fairly common these days.

For instance, Karon Petty recently announced her association with Donald D. Miller, certified property manager, and announced a new name, PM Realty. Petty is a county commissioner until January 1.

Miller is the husband of Valerie Miller, new administrator of the Lincoln County Medical Center. The couple came here from Albuquerque.

During the year, Bill Hirschfeld was elected president of MainStreet Ruidoso, replacing Herb Brunell.

In June, MainStreet program directors from across the state met in Ruidoso for roundtable discussions and assessment of programs.

In October, MainStreet Ruidoso and the EDCLC both received recognition for superior work at the Governor's Rural Economic Development Forum.

The Hondo Valley apple industry was spotlighted when a record crop was produced. Every apple tree, even in Ruidoso, appeared loaded. Other fruit trees produced bountifully, too.

The building industry in the county is showing a trend toward rejuvenation. Many single family dwellings were started during the year. Commercial construction and sales still are lagging.

In September, ground was broken for a new \$90,000, 1,500 square foot building for the local office of the Special Services Division of the New Mexico Human Services Department.

In May, the EDCLC sponsored a development symposium at the Inn of the Mountain Gods. Henry Cisneros, three-time mayor of San Antonio, Texas, was the keynote speaker. Economic development was the theme of the successful event.


In October, it was announced that Foxworth Galbraith would acquire T-Bird Home Center in Ruidoso. Also during the year the Capitan-Carrizozo Gas Association began operating as a public entity.

The association attorney advised the action to protect assets and accounts.

By becoming a public entity the association came under the New Mexico Opening Meetings Law and opened its board meetings to the public.

During the year action was taken which could affect the community both beneficially and negatively.

This is the Mechem Drive widening project planned for the future. The project will pour some highway dollars into Ruidoso, but it could have a negative impact for a time on businesses along the route because of business interruption.

The Cowboy Symposium in October drew many visitors to the area.

All America Festival Week in late August and through Labor Day was a first and a plus economical.

On the negative side, Ruidoso saw its second bank closure, that of The Bank of Ruidoso.

The FDIC moved in last February and took over the bank. United Bank New Mexico Bank consequently arranged to take over the site and accounts of the defunct bank.

Apache Future growing fast

From putting propulsion systems into and applying finishing touches to double-decker shell rail cars to repairing transit buses, Apache Future, Inc., is alive and well and growing.

Gary Bousquet, president of the Ruidoso based company, told *The Ruidoso News* that the company did approximately \$1.98 million in sales this year and expects to do \$5 to \$6 million in business in 1991.

Apache Future up until the spring of 1990 was located on the Mescalero Apache Indian Reservation at an old Job Corps site, but the headquarters was moved to the North Creek Professional Center at 1221 Mechem last spring.

Apache Futures has mobile teams of specialists who specialize in maintenance and repair of transit buses and rail cars in many cities.

Bousquet said Apache Future recently was awarded a contract by the Billig Bus Corporation to repair structural problems, exterior and interior, of buses in Washington D.C., Salt Lake City, Utah and Youngstown, Ohio.

Billig manufactures transit buses.

For Transportation Manufacturing Corporation of Roswell and Rockwell International, Apache Future teams have just completed rear axle repairs to transit buses in 30 cities. The job involved removing rear axles, welding a portion of the innards, and reassembling the transit buses which are manufactured in Roswell.

Before Apache Future, Inc., was formed over three years ago, Bousquet had a company in the east which took delivery of shell commuter rail cars from Japan, with Bousquet's company adding propulsion systems and finishing the cars.

Currently Apache Future has an electrical engineer in Japan doing design work on double-decker rail cars which will be finished in the United States.

The company also currently has a crew in New Haven, Connecticut, doing warranty work on M-4 rail cars.

Apache Future began expanding in 1990 with the opening of offices in New York City and New Jersey.

Offices are planned for Los Angeles in 1991 and possibly in Florida, Bousquet says.

The company has 46 employees,

with seven office personnel in Ruidoso and 20 or more mobile team members who call Ruidoso or the Mescalero reservation home.

During a training phase at the old Job Corps site, a number of Mescalero Apache tribe members were trained to be on mobile maintenance and repair teams.

Bousquet says Apache Future will get into tele-communications in 1991.

He said the company will be redoing old buildings or constructing small buildings which house or will house cellular telephone equipment.

Work will be done in New York, New Jersey and along the Rio Grande Corridor in New Mexico, he indicated.

In a brochure, Apache Future says it is "a small business enterprise providing services and expert personnel to the Transit, Heavy Equipment and Nuclear Industries ..."

Mechanical, electrical and welding skills are utilized most. The company eliminates "permanent work force overhead," the brochure states.

Tietboll says the carwash will have four "do-it-yourself" bays and one automatic bay. It will be located west and north of the Ruidoso State Bank branch on the property. The bank outlet will remain. The Swap Mart remains viable.

Prutsman, a competition winner at the 1990 Tchaikovsky Festival in Moscow, has performed in much of the United States and Italy and has


recently returned from a tour of Central America, sponsored by the United States Information Agency.

Warriors lose to relentless Goddard Rockets 96-63

The Ruidoso Warriors outmanned, but not out spirited, never gave up as the Goddard Rockets two-platoonned their way to a 96-63 victory.

Down by 35 points late in the fourth period, the Rockets continued to press to drive up the score. To the Warriors credit, they didn't lose their composure and fought valiantly to the last second.

Warrior head coach Norman Wright had the Warriors prepared for the game. The game itself was close for the first half, 41-38. But the 1200-student enrollment school had too much depth for the 300-student enrollment Ruidoso.

Ruidoso's guard Cody Willard was brilliant, until the double and triple guarding finally wore him down.

The Warriors were exhausted as evidenced in the second half when their shots continually hit the front of the rim.

First half statistics had the Warriors hitting 12-21 for 57 percent of their shots. In the second half, Ruidoso shot 1-9 for 11 percent.

When Wright was forced to give Willard a breather, the relentless Goddard attack continued. The Warriors are simply too thin without Willard.

Ruidoso played Goddard even the first half. Mashon Swenor grabbed eight rebounds, mainly in the first half, and the team managed 17 steals.

Goddard's head coach Leon Sims seemed determined to rub it in when the Warriors ran out of gas, pushing for the highest possible point count. Shifting in his first team, Sims pressed to the final second. Unlike Warrior teams of the past, no one stood still in despair and defenseless. Wright's team was tired, but they didn't let down until the final buzzer.

Both teams seemed to suffer from an unusually large amount of traveling violations, 17 at last count. That coach Wright was

whistled for a traveling violation as he walked to the locker room at halftime was not substantiated.

Willard was top scorer for the Warriors with 23 points, 16 in the first half. Swenor found the double

digits with 10 points, eight in the first half.

Dan Holt popped in eight points for the Warriors and grabbed several steals.

Manny Guardiola, who had to sit out the second half, scored eight first half points.

Defensive whiz Heath Huey was a horse on the boards the first half and managed a bucket and a free throw for three points.

Eric Evans played his best game of the year and picked up five points. Robert Sayner, Boone Denny and Syrus Wheeler all added a bucket each to the Warrior scoring cause.

The Warriors will face the Tularosa Wildcats in Tulie this Tuesday, January 8. The first game will begin at 5:30 p.m.

The next home game will be against T or C on Friday, January 11. The "B" team plays at 5:45 p.m.

Coach Wright said the numbers for basketball are so low that he may have to rearrange or even cancel some of the schedule of the freshman team.

Most coaches agree that Ruidoso, although small in enrollment for a Class 3-A school, has a number of good students that could help the teams compete.

Although the coaches say they are unsure of the reason why good athletes don't try out for sports, all agree motivation is tied in to a winning team and program.

Ruidoso Athletic Director Ronny Maskev said with a winning varsity season, student participation would increase.

"It's always like that when you have a winning team," he said.

The girls' volleyball team is a good example of increased participation through a winning program. For years Ruidoso girls' volleyball struggled with few girls and little gym attendance. At the Roswell tournament during the state championships, there were more Ruidoso fans than any other team.

With 35 players on the football team, the school is assured of enough parents and relatives to make a decent gate. With eight basketball players, the stats change.

Commentary Running up the score

You are the coach. Your team leads by 35 points with a couple of minutes to play. Your second team is on the court and you have called a time out. What will be your final game strategy?

If you are Kathy Bull, girls' C team coach at Alamogordo, you put your first team back in and press the opponents to run up the score.

For some reason, running up points in today's sporting events seems to be the rule rather than the exception and it sends a message that most coaches would find abhorrent and school superintendents would say was counter-productive.

First, it says you don't care if you embarrass your opponent. Secondly, it says as a coach and a teacher of young players, those players must learn to kick their opponent when they are down.

Some players are not as talented as others, but they still work hard in the gym, give of their time, and try their best to play in the game. Those bench warmers look for opportunities to play, like when the team is enjoying a 35-point lead in the fourth quarter.

Imagine how they must feel, or how their parents must feel, when no matter what the score their children do not get to play.

Let's say you are the captain of a football team that has been penalized nine times for unsportsmanlike conduct or personal fouls. What do you say in defense of such blatant disregard for rules?

If you are the Miami Hurricane captain, you say they are misunderstood.

According to the wire services, the Reverend Leo Armbrust, a Roman Catholic priest, said of the Hurricanes, "A good percentage of the team is black. They have a way of expressing their values, personalities and culture that a good part of society does not approve of. Why should it be a surprise to sportswriters that Miami could act in a way that seems taunting, aggressive and civilly offensive? Some people stand in support of 2 Live Crew because of First Amendment rights and freedom of expression. You can't defend it on one hand and criticize it on the other."

The reverend seems to be saying not to condemn or try to change such actions, but recognize them for what they are, part of the black culture. If I were black, I'd be invited.

It becomes difficult to understand those who run up the score, or defy good gamesmanship by habitually breaking the rules unless you also identify those people as being clueless. Then it becomes understandable.

"I'm sure the Knights are favored to win," said Ames. "But we're sure going to give them a run for the money."





Editorial

Let's not forget. Most federal elected officials and judges had plenty to celebrate when they rang in the new year last week. They got hefty pay increases as of January 1.

Rank-and-file House members' salaries went up 29.5 percent, from \$96,600 in 1990 to \$125,100 in 1991. At the same time the salaries of Vice President Dan Quayle, House Speaker Thomas S. Foley and Chief Justice William Rehnquist went up nearly 30 percent to \$160,600 a year. Federal district judges and Supreme Court judges got the same kind of pay hikes, with federal judges now making \$132,700 and associate justices getting \$153,600.

Those pay increases were part of a legislative package supported last year by President George Bush. It's a done deal.

But, let's not forget that the benefit to us, the taxpayers, was to be that our elected representatives would no longer be collecting honoraria and such from various special interest groups. The pay hike was sold as an investment in better and more representative government. If we're the ones paying our officials a fair and living wage, then they should be less tempted to take special deals in exchange for favorable treatment in the Congress.

If pay increases help cure the kind of faulty decisions that led to the S&L debacle, funny book deals and such, then it's worth the investment.

We'll be waiting and watching.

NOTICE OF PROPERTY TAX REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Property which was valued in 1990 in this county by the county assessor is not required to be reported or rendered for 1991 or subsequent years, EXCEPT FOR:

1. mobile homes
2. livestock, and
3. land used for agricultural purposes

If, for any reason, your property was not valued last year and it is subject to valuation this year, you are required by law to report it to the county assessor on forms provided either by mail or at the assessor's office.

All non-governmental entities (property owners) which claim to be exempt from the property tax must report their property and claim their exemption for 1991 if the exemption was not claimed in 1990.

Reports for mobile homes, livestock, land use for agricultural purposes, property not valued last year and claims for exemptions by non-governmental entities must be completed and mailed or delivered to the county assessor not later than the last day of February.

If you made improvements to your real property and:

1. the improvements cost more than \$1,000 and
2. a building permit for the improvements was not issued;

you must report the nature of the improvements and their cost to the assessor not later than the last day of February. These reports must be on forms provided by that assessor.

If you believe your property decreased in value during the preceding year, you must report, on forms provided by the assessor, a signed statement which:

1. describes the property affected,
2. states the cause and nature of decrease in value, and
3. states the amount you contend the value has decreased.

This statement must be filed with the county assessor no later than the last day of February.

The Veterans exemption claim must be made by the last day of February by filing with the Assessor the Veterans Certificate of Eligibility.

If the head-of-family exemption was claimed and allowed in 1990 no new claim for that exemption is required to be filed. However, if that exemption was not claimed and allowed in 1990 and it is now claimed, claim must be made by the last day of February by filing with the assessor the form provided by the assessor.

Beginning in the 1982 tax year, taxpayers are responsible for declaring their property classification to the assessor, as residential or nonresidential. When the declaration is accepted by the assessor, it shall remain as such and need not be made in subsequent years unless the classification changes. If a taxpayer has not declared their property to be residential in 1990 and desires that classification for 1991 they must complete a declaration of residential classification and return the signed declaration to the county assessor's office by the last day of February, 1991.

Certain mineral property and personal property of contractors operating in more than one county are required to be reported to the Taxation and Revenue Department, Property Tax Division of the State of New Mexico in Santa Fe. Information about property to be reported to the Taxation and Revenue Department, Property Tax Division can be obtained from the county assessor or the Taxation and Revenue Department, Property Tax Division, Central Assessment Bureau, P.O. Box 630, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87509, Phone: (505) 827-0896.

THIS NOTICE is only a brief statement of the provisions of Section 7-38-3, 7-38-8.1, 7-38-13, 7-38-17 and 7-38-17.1 NMSA 1978 of the Property Tax Code. For water meters ordered by tenants the person in whose name the water meter is ordered shall be required to post a deposit of \$100.00 prior to the installation of water service. In the event a water meter serves more than one unit, then the

deposit shall be multiplied by the number of units serviced by the water meter. Delinquent charges may be satisfied in whole or part by drawing upon the deposit. No notice of drawing upon the deposit need be given by the Village.

Commercial/Institutional Commodity Charges: Meter size 3/4" \$18.00 1" thru 2" meter size shall be \$30.00; in excess of 3,000 gallons but less than 100,000 gallons \$2.75 per 1,000 gallons; \$3.75 per 1,000 gallons after 100,000 gallons.

Industrial Commodity Charges: Meter size 3/4" \$23.00; 1 1/2" \$55.00; 2" \$80.00. In excess of 3,000 gallons but less than 100,000 gallons \$2.75 per 1000 gallons; \$3.75 per 1000 gallons after 100,000 gallons.

Outside City Commodity Charges: All water sold by the Municipality to persons outside the Village of Capitan's corporate limits shall be assessed at rates two times the amounts charged above.





