D. Hubbard wins his Hollywood proxy fight

The proxy fight for control of Hollywood Park horse racing track near Los Angeles apparently is over. R.D. Hubbard, co-owner of Ruidoso Downs Race Track, is the victor.

Hubbard, according to a report in the Los Angeles Times, used the backing of Merv Griffin and John Forsythe, Hollywood celebrities, to gain control of the track.

Griffin and Forsythe previously had supported Marjorie Everett who Hubbard had opposed in the proxy battle.

Under an agreement announced over the weekend, Everett will not be on the new board of directors. She has held the corporate reins at the track for almost two decades.

Griffin, television producer and Forsythe, who formerly starred in the TV show, "Dynasty," have resigned as Hollywood Park vice presidents but will remain on the board along with Allen Paulson, who backed Everett.

Aaron Spelling, television producer, and Stan Seiden, who also support Everett, have resigned from the board.

The park's board recently had elected Las Vegas casino owner Steve Wynn as board chairman and chief executive officer. Hubbard reported that Wynn "is no longer in the picture."

Hubbard announced at a news conference that Everett had retired from all of her positions.

Hubbard's negotiations with Griffin and Forsythe gives Everett a lifetime stipend of \$150,000 a year, plus health benefits and access to Hollywood Park track, according to a published report.

Everett is 69 years old. Hubbard wouldn't comment on the amount Everett is to be paid.

Everett's campaign to remain in control reportedly cost the corporation \$5 million, while Hubbard spent an estimated \$3 million to unseat her along with the current board of directors.

Hubbard will be reimbursed by the track for his expenses since his takeover bid for the track was successful.

Hubbard is new chief executive officer.

He said all litigation between the parties will be dismissed and reciprocal releases exchanged.

Voters will rule on tax to fund college here

Top officials with Eastern New Mexico University (ENMU) were in town Friday to throw their weight behind the proposal for an off-campus instruction center in Ruidoso.

With voters set to decide the fate of the center Tuesday, they joined Ruidoso School Board Member Rod Adamson and steering committee co-chairman Sandy Gladden in a last minute pitch for a one mill property tax levy to help support the college and community classes.

"This could be an important economic development tool and it is the first opportunity people have had for self-determination," Gladden said.

Dr. Thomas A. Bond, ENMU president, and Dr. Robert C. Dawson, vice president, said they think it's time for advanced educational opportunities in Ruidoso. If the voters agree, classes would start in September, they said.

The local millage would generate about \$150,000, but, to be on the safe side, only \$134,000 is being budgeted as the local contribution. The state would contribute \$84,000 toward the total estimated annual budget of \$240,000, and another \$28,000 would come from anticipated year-around student tuition. But Eastern already has pledged to financially supplement the center if initially fall short.

One mill is equal to each \$1,000 of taxable property value. For example, a person with a \$60,000 home, which has a tax valuation of \$20,000, would pay \$20 a year toward the campus operation. The mill would be levied annually unless the center was dissolved or a new avenue of

financing was secured.

Although Bond said the State Legislature has not yet agreed to the appropriation, he feels confident it will, if he can go to the February 12 budget hearing with a commitment for the one mill from Ruidoso voters.

Bond said the off campus center will be a brand new approach to education for Eastern and the university is excited that Ruidoso approached it to provide the educational opportunity at a reasonable cost. The fee per credit hour would run about \$19, slightly higher for students from outside the Ruidoso school district.

Gladden said students at the center will be eligible for all types of financial aid available to those on the regular campus.

One of the first posts to be filled will be student services coordinator, she said. That person will be responsible for counseling, scheduling, recruiting and helping arrange financial aid.

Under the terms of a national articulation agreement, all academic courses would transfer to any other accredited university in the United States, Gladden said.

"That's with the possible exception of Harvard," Dawson said, smiling. "They're not accredited."

Students will be able to earn an associates degree at the center, take technical, vocational and continuing education classes as well as preparation study for the General Education Development (GED) test. Non-credit classes in personal development also will be offered, Gladden said.

The center would be supervised by a full time administrator on site.

Glasses would be conducted in district school facilities after 4 p.m. and during the summer, she said.

But the local school district would have no financial obligation in the endeavor, Adamson emphasized.

Junge lambasts spiraling costs, shrinking civic center

"We have met the enemy, and they are us!" - Pogo

"The building is costing too damn much," complained Ruidoso Councilor Al Junge. History seems to be repeating itself regarding costs of the new civic-events center.

Junge's disappointment over spiraling center costs during last Tuesday's regular council meeting was remarkably similar to dialogue during a series of meetings in 1990 that culminated in the termination of the highly touted original architectural firm of Holmes, Sabatini and Eeds.

The history of the center has been one of continual escalating costs since its inception.

Architect Bill Sabatini reported to the Village of Ruidoso's Economic Development Advisory Board on March 26, 1990. His firm's original phase one development had called for 12,600 square feet of building space at a cost of \$729,629. An operable wall system would run \$75,000 to \$90,000 more.

Sabatini had told the council three months later on July 2, that the latest figure for center construction was \$59 per square foot. His firm had also come under criticism by the council for not examining a Fab-crete system to the council's satisfaction.

Junge reminded Sabatini he had given him information on a Speed Fab-Crete company in Fort Worth, Texas, to check.

Speed Fab-Crete President David Bloxom, Jr., told the councilors during one meeting that his company could construct the center for \$50 per square foot, tops.

Councilor Ron Andrews said the village

could not afford the high cost per square foot that Sabatini was proposing. However, he said the village planned to use his concept plans for the center. The village proceeded to negotiate out of their contract with Sabatini.

The village's original contract with the firm was for \$81,000 and called for them to design a civic center of at least 12,000 square feet in what was to be the first of several phases. When the village decided to build several phases of the building at once, the contract was renegotiated to \$134,000.

Since only 35 percent of the work had been completed, the village agreed to pay Holmes, Sabatini and Eeds the total amount of \$61,304.

Councilor Andrews said one of the problems the council had with the architectural firm was that the contract had escalated, and Holmes, Sabatini and Eeds had wanted the contract to go to \$167,000.

After terminating those architects, the village requested proposals for a new design firm. Requesters were advised the village construction costs were not to exceed \$50 per square foot. And the council wanted size.

"We want to build the most we can the first time," Alonso said at the time. He added that it appeared to be a building between 30,000 and 35,000 square feet.

At a public meeting on August 22, Alonso proclaimed the civic center was back on track. It was learned during the meeting that the village's \$935,000 in revenue bonds had been sold. That, added to the \$600,000 in the building fund, gave the village \$1.5 million to go forward.

Enter Nolan and Associates, Alamogordo architects and part of a joint venture with Garland and Hillis of El Paso, Texas. The firm was recommended by a selection committee made up of Mayor Alonso, then State Representative Ben Hall, village manager Charles Norwood, and councilors J.D. James and Junge.

At a special council meeting on September 7, Alonso said a contract was negotiated for \$90,000 plus tax.

Last Tuesday, Junge said he was not satisfied with the new architects he helped recommend.

"During the recent council meeting with the architects on the civic center, we discovered an ever increasing construction costs," he said.

"We have accepted a decrease in size from 40,000 square feet to around 33,000."

"We find however, and this is true of the previous architects, that every time we meet, the cost is up a little bit more," Junge said.

"We've now been advised that in order to get to 33,300 square feet, we're going to spend our million and a half, and have to get another half million somewhere else. I don't like it at all."

"Although the council agreed to fund the State Legislature for additional asks, we didn't have a happy situation," he said.

"I asked the architect (Nolan) to confer with the Speed Fab-Crete company of Fort Worth. They thought the building could be bought at the high forties or low fifties. We're now at \$58-\$59 a square foot."

"I asked them (Nolan) if they conferred with these people, just as a matter of trying

to check. They said they would," Junge said.

"If you read The Ruidoso News report of the council meeting you got the idea that the council sat here, talked pro and con about some changes in the program, accepted the fact that 33,000 was OK, and accepted the fact that we're going to have to go to the Legislature for a half million dollars. I don't think that was true. I don't think that was the atmosphere at all."

"We asked the architect a number of pointed questions about what are you doing about the cost of this building."

"The thing that disturbs me, is I think the building is costing too damn much. I assume we're going to build a building. I hope we do."

"I don't know what we can cut out of the building to bring the costs down. There's not many things you can do. It's very expensive. In fact the year that we've been into this thing, the costs have gone up again. I hope we can build a building. Something is going to have to give before we build it, and as of right now, Mr. Mayor, I don't know what that's going to be," Junge said.

In a recent letter to the commission, Nolan and Associates asked for more money, six percent of two million dollars or about \$120,000. With the \$61,000 already paid to the Sabatini firm, that would make \$181,000 paid out in architectural fees, if the village agrees.

Nolan's architectural plans have shown little progress since taking over from Sabatini. Some professional planners feel the changes have not been for the best.

Fort Stanton future remains up in the air as school leaders work to abide by court order

The families of clients at Fort Stanton and Los Lunas training centers contend that none of the developmentally disabled residents of the institutions should be moved until more is known about services available in the community and the overall cost.

"They're getting ready to push these clients off a cliff and they don't know how far down they'll fall or if anyone is there to catch them," said Kent Winchester, the Albuquerque attorney representing the families.

Winchester said Thursday their appeal of a December federal court decision ordering the transfer of those clients, will challenge a specific portion of the ruling.

"After meeting with leaders of the group, the decision was made to appeal that part of the order that says there are constitutional and statutory requirements that treatment professionals cannot consider what is available in the community before removing people from Fort Stanton and Los Lunas," Winchester said Thursday.

Although the group had filed the notice of appeal January 28, he will submit the basis of the appeal early this week, he said.

"We had hoped it would not be necessary to appeal or to seek a stay, but now I expect we will have to do both," he said. "I had been en-

couraged by statements by leaders (of the group pushing through the courts to close large institutions and relocate clients to community-based programs). But I'm getting a far different story from their attorneys. I would still hope we could mediate."

U.S. District Judge James A. Parker's order last December directed the parties to try to agree on a plan to flesh out the corrective actions he ordered, Winchester said. Parker established deadlines for approval of the transfer and correction plans in April and September, respectively. A stay would stop the judicial clock.

State legislators and officials face many difficult decisions, Winchester said.

"Who will provide the care for clients?" he asked. "There are some programs in the state, but their records are not sterling. The judge said the state has to renegotiate their contracts because, while they collect \$30-million a year from the state to provide care, they traditionally have not taken the more challenging clients. They will have to do so in the future."

The state could decide to provide care directly at Fort Stanton or Los Lunas, he said. While it is under no legal obligation to do so, it may be politically necessary.

There is no constitutional requirement that clients be served in community-based programs, he said.

Winchester said he was surprised by state-

ments from John McKean, one of Governor Bruce King's spokesmen, who said the state decided not to appeal the court decision because the King administration essentially agrees with the shift to treatment in community-based programs.

That represents an 180 degree turn from the impression King conveyed in his election campaign, Winchester said.

The families, who intervened in the suit brought by Protection and Advocacy Systems Inc. against the state in 1987, are not saying there shouldn't be other treatment options, he said. But they do contend that institutions can play a role in treatment.

The families group, which represents the relatives of 177 clients at the two institutions, was delighted with some of the corrections ordered by Parker, he said. They included staffing improvements. The judge also specified that measurable goals should be set up for each client, a program plan established to accomplish those goals and the program plans should be implemented.

Parker ordered the quality of medical records to be improved, although the judge had no criticism of the quality of medical care, Winchester said. He also ordered additional training in behavioral management for the psychologist.

While the interveners appeal, the staff of Fort Stanton is moving ahead

Lincoln County schools stack up in state-wide comparison reports

All schools in New Mexico are required by the State Legislature to publish accountability reports. Some of those reports have appeared recently in various publications and are compared below. More than half of the state's budget is allocated for public education.

Lincoln County schools are faring well according to comparisons of recently published school accountability reports.

The reports are published as mandated by state law so that communities can make some sort of evaluation of how well their tax dollars are being spent and what changes in direction might be needed.

As in any type of operation, input and output are the two primary avenues to look at in evaluating performance.

Budget distribution and teacher salaries and benefits provide one view of input, while test scores give the most concrete information on evaluating the strength of the education being received by the students.

Budgets

In Lincoln County, school budgets for the school year 1988-89 ranged anywhere from \$782,005 in the Hondo Valley Public Schools to \$6,107,263 in the Ruidoso School District. The total in itself isn't any type of indicator (due to the varied number of students in each district) until you break it down into how much is spent per student and then how the budget is broken down for expenses.

Corona spends the most money

in the state per student, thanks mainly to the size of the student body and the number of services and programs they must offer. \$8,094 was spent per each of the 101 pupils in the 1988-89 school year, with administrative costs averaging \$658 per pupil over the same period.

At the same time in Carrizozo, \$5,146 per student was being spent overall and \$393 in administrative expenses. This ranked Carrizozo 16th and 14th, respectively, out of the 88 school districts in New Mexico in the amounts spent on each of the 288 students from 1988-89.

Outside of Lincoln County, Cimarron School District numbered 392 students for that year, and was near the bottom of the first third of schools in the state. \$4,535 was spent per pupil over all (ranked 30th) and \$261 per pupil for administrative expenses (ranked 33).

Although no exact figures were available, Ruidoso spent approximately \$3,626 per each of 1,684 students in 1988-89. Compared to some other districts, this would place Ruidoso somewhere in the second half of the districts in the state. By comparison, the Bernalillo School District, with a 1989-90 budget of \$10,909,267, spent \$3,429 per student overall.

From some of the reports turned in by larger districts across the state, Ruidoso still fares well in the amount spent per student. Los Lunas Schools, with a student population of 5,412 in 1989-90, spent \$2,911 per student, several hundred dollars below the state average of \$3,225.

Teacher pay

Education is in many cases as good as the teachers who provide it, and one indicator as to the quality of instructors a district can attract is the pay offered.

The average salary of a returning teacher in New Mexico schools last year was \$25,076, well below the national average of \$31,304.

Lincoln County schools fall on either side of the average, headed by Capitan's \$27,377, which ranks 10th in the state. Carrizozo's returning teachers averaged \$25,379 in salary and ranked 34th, indicating the small amount of money it takes to gain or lose position in the state ranks.

Hondo Valley School teachers received an average yearly pay of \$23,160 last year, while Ruidoso teachers received the highest average pay in the county with an annual salary of \$27,828.

Compared to some of the larger schools, student enrollment seems to not have as much bearing on salary as one might think. In the Belen Consolidated Schools, where they had a student population of 4,177 last year, the teachers had an average pay of \$24,288, still below the state average. Magdalena, with enrollment of 303 last year, had an average teacher's salary of \$25,009.

Testing

The end result of all the figures is how well the students are readied for their future, be it preparation for college and beyond or vocational training.

In the 10th grade, students are

administered the High School Competency Exam. The schools reported on the number of students passing all phases of the tests, also stating that students failing any part of the exam are scheduled to take the test the following year to see if the deficiencies are made up.

Capitan 10th graders have shown a decline in the percentage of students passing all the tests over the past three years. In 1987-88, 85.7 percent passed all the tests. In 1988-89, 82.8 percent passed the tests. Last year, only 77.1 percent did not fail any part of the exams.

The state average has fluctuated in those three years, though. The first year the average was 70.4, the second year, 66.2, and last year 72.8. While Capitan's scores are descending, they still remain above the state average for tenth graders. Last year, the district ranked 31st out of the 88 districts statewide.

In comparison, only 45 percent of the tenth graders at the Hondo Valley School passed all phases of the test. Three of the nine will have to retake one part of the test, while two will have to retake two or more parts of the five part test.

Carrizozo's tenth graders have been on a roller coaster the last three years. From 1987-88, the percentage of students passing the exam were 66.7, 56, and 83.3. Corona has shown a steady increase in the percentage of students passing all phases of the test. Over the last three years, the percentages have gone from 66.7 to 75 to 85.7.

Ruidoso's scores from last year

were broken down into the various tests that make up the exam, and results showed that the students there scored very well. 93 percent passed the reading comprehension exam, 86 percent passed the English test, 96 percent passed the math test, 94 percent passed the science test, and 93 percent passed the social studies exam. In each test administered, the Ruidoso percentage surpassed the state average.

Outside of Lincoln County, some schools aren't faring nearly as well. In the Bernalillo Public Schools, only 56.4 percent passed the tests, and 42.7 percent passed the exams the following year. Last year, the district average was 51.3 percent of students in the tenth grade passing the exams. That's a long way from the state average percentage of 72.8 for the same year.

ACT scores

Another test, although not required, is the American College Test (ACT) that students take to judge their skills and meet requirements for the different colleges and universities.

Out of the possible score of 36, Capitan students have reached an average score of 19.6, attained last year. The school has shown a steady increase in the scores of the students, and the last two years the scores have been above the state average. Last year, the average score was also above the national average of 18.6. New Mexico's average score last year was 17.8.

Hondo Valley students taking the exam last year scored a com-

posite 16.7, below both national and state averages. While Ruidoso's average score of 18.2 was below the national average, they were still above the state average last year.

Students at Corona taking the ACT's showed a sharp drop in their average score. Last year, the average score was only 15.8, preceded by an average of 20.6.

Carrizozo has maintained a fairly high average the last two years, on the other hand. Last year's average score was 20.7, preceded by an average of 20.9. These scores were well above the average score of 15.2 from the 1987-88 school year.

Overview

Overall, the schools in Lincoln County fare very well against their statewide counterparts.

Teacher salaries are fair, budgets are sufficient to adequately provide for the students, and activities are varied enough to give each of the students a means of expressing themselves outside of the classroom. Test scores of the students remain, in most cases, well above the state averages, and dropout rates are far below the state average.

School boards in the county, in particular Capitan and Ruidoso, have recently undergone state evaluation and received high praise from their Santa Fe supervisors.

Also, the communities seem to remain supportive of the students in their efforts to excel and learn in and out of the classroom.

Public schools are funded with public money through the state and local property taxes, and the allocation of those funds, including salary amounts, is public information. The information published on this page was provided by the separate school districts.

Lincoln County is divided into five separate districts, each with its own voters, budget, facilities and administration. The districts are listed below, followed by student count (as of the 40th school day) and total budget for this school year.

School districts overlap municipal and county lines, with the numbers designated on each voter's registration form. The voting precinct on that form (#1-17) is different than the School District. The map at right, provided by the Lincoln County Clerk, shows Lincoln County's five school districts.

Ruidoso, District #3

Ruidoso School District is #3, and the 3,852 registered voters in that district will vote at Ruidoso Middle School in the foyer outside the gymnasium.

District 3 includes Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs and some parts of voting precincts 1, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16.

Ruidoso voters will be electing three school board members from among 10 candidates.

For Position 1, candidates are Jeff L. Chapman, Dennis R. Lloverin, Lee A. Bucchan, Roger W. Buckley and Susan Marie Luterman.

For Ruidoso Position 2, candidates are J.A. Bertramsen and Mike Morris; and Position 3 candidates include Kent Beatty, Rosemary A. Gann and Ronnie L. Hemphill.

Ruidoso voters will vote "yes" or "no" on a proposal to fund a higher educational instructional center with a one mill levy. The levy would raise about \$150,000 to operate an off-campus center to provide local college and technical classes.

Carrizozo, District #7

Carrizozo School District is #7, and includes all of the Village of Carrizozo and extends into areas in voting precincts 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5. Carrizozo school voters, with eligible voters numbered at 911, will cast their ballots at Carrizozo school administration office.

Corona school district's 248 registered voters are being asked to continue a two mill capital improvement levy that generates an estimated \$18,200 a year. The levy must be reauthorized every three years.

Corona voters will elect three board members from among five candidates. For position 1, candidates are James M. Parker and Beatrice L. Chavez; and for Position 2, Jeffery L. Wells is unopposed.

For Corona, Position 4, candidates are Joe Allen Sultemeier and Jim H. Ross.

Hondo, District #20


Hondo School District is #20, with voters registered in voting precincts 16 and 17. Balloting Tuesday will be at Hondo School.

A cozy red-trimmed log cabin nestled in the deep woods makes the perfect home for teddy bears.


It seems appropriate, then, that Ruidoso's Black Forest headquarters its newest business, Teddi Bear Book Co., publishers of personalized children's books.

For eclectic tastes, Black also has carried a selection of rare books, antique frames, antique quilts, Kachina dolls, geodes, petrified wood, record collections, etc.

Sally's Old Lincoln Town Art Gallery is the only gallery in Lincoln and opened in the summer of 1990.

Black is a member of the Lincoln Hospitality Group. She will head a series of one man shows coming up in the fall of '91.

The spring artists are Gazy Morton in February, Walter Henn in March and Russell Waterhouse in April.

Lincoln retains ghosts of its colorful history

This town, Lincoln, like Arizona's Tombstone, occupies a special place in the annals of Western gunfighters.

Here it was Billy the Kid and Sheriff Pat Garrett. In tombstone, it was the Clanton gang and Marshal Wyatt Earp.

But Lincoln, unlike highly commercialized Tombstone and its garish tourist traps, is an authentic Western town, with its 100-year-old buildings preserved and its history still fresh in the minds of the local residents.

"Many of the old-timers in this area are descendants of some of the principal players in the Lincoln County War and they still have strong feelings about the justness of the cause their relatives fought for," said Robert L. Hart, director of the Lincoln County Heritage Trust, which operates a museum in Lincoln and owns many of the historical buildings.

Colleen Salazar, a member of the Salazar family that allied with Billy the Kid, said, "You've got to be careful of who you are talking to when the subject of the old gunfights comes up."

Hart, a professional historian who formerly worked for the National Park Service said, "Both sides, of course, think they are right."

The young outlaw, who was shot to death by Garrett on July 14, 1881, in Pete Maxwell's home near Fort Sumner, had several aliases, but his real name was Henry McCarty.

The most famous photo, long thought to be the only original picture of Bill, shows him as a buck-toothed, loutish, even "moronic looking" cowboy.

This photo, Hart said, has been re-photographed so many times and has been altered by various publications so that its image is clouded and false-looking.

The photo was a tintype taken by an unknown traveling photographer.

Because of the processes of early photography, images were reversed. Thus, in the famous photo of Billy it appears that he is left-handed because his six-gun is on the left side.

"He was right-handed, no doubt about that," Hart said. "You can see that when the tintype is properly printed. We also have examples of his handwriting that show he was right-handed."

"But, more importantly, we have found another copy of that tintype. The unknown photographer used a camera that had four lenses. It took four photos at one time, each made into a tintype," Hart said.

"When the photos were made, probably at Fort Sumner, Billy kept one, the one that has been published so many times, and he gave another one to his friend and fellow outlaw, Dan Dedrick," Hart said.

"Dedrick, or maybe it was Billy, put the tintype, which was still wet from being developed, into his pocket, we think, because there are imprints of fabric threads that stuck to the tintype after it had been dried."

After Billy was killed, Dedrick left New Mexico and became wealthy, law-abiding citizen," Hart said.

"His family kept the tintype all these years until Dedrick's grandnephew, Frank T. Upham of Orinda, California, decided it should be preserved in our museum."

Few residents of the town of Lincoln appreciate its history more than Ofelia Salas.

She was born in one of the houses still standing on the main street. With her husband E.R. "Cy" Salas, she lives in the home next door to her birthplace. It was constructed in 1904 and her mother lived there before her.

Her grandparents, the Aragons, operated a store in town. When the county seat was moved to Carriazo, they realized Lincoln's heyday was over and packed up for El Paso, Texas.

But Mrs. Salas' mother stayed behind and so did she, teaching in the local school system for 40 years.

As they have added on to the main house, the Salases attempted to preserve the architectural integrity of the community by using adobe bricks.

When they decided a few months ago to add a carport to a back building for Salas' 1965 GMC pickup, they chose adobe again.

"We used the adobe halfway up and decided we liked it left open," Mrs. Salas said. "That's the way they used to make them. Of course, back then, they used corn stalks for the roof."

The Lincoln Historic Preservation Board was so pleased with the way the truck port blends in with the rest of the town's architecture that they selected it as their preservation project of the month.

Planners work on the details of river walk

The Ruidoso Village Council will decide today if a plan hammered out Friday morning on "river trail" or "river walk" development is the way the council wants to go.

The "river trail" project, part of the MainStreet redevelopment program, is just getting off the ground. Some MainStreet board members, village officials including parks and recreation director Moe Masters and Village Councilor Ron Andrews, met Friday.

They worked out a plan outlining procedures to obtain permission from river frontage property owners to do a preliminary study of the area in question. That area is from Fern Street to Country Club on the Rio Ruidoso.

Ruidoso Springs and Riverside subdivisions are involved with about 80 property owners on a trails development list.

Three land surveying firms will be involved in seeking permission

to cross land in the planned study. The group which met Friday decided, if the council approves Monday, that the surveying firms first contact property owners in person or by telephone to tell them what the river trail project involves.

That would be followed up by a letter asking permission to cross properties on the river to do a land survey. An aerial survey also is involved.

The trails committee emphasizes that a river walk (a simple walking trail with some landscaping) would enhance property values and would be a real asset to the quality of life in the area. No commercial development is envisioned along the trail.

The proposed river trail in all probability would cross the river one or more times via foot bridges because of terrain problems or easement problems.

The village council has allotted \$15,000 for the river property study and a preliminary feasibility study.

20 apply for county road boss

By the deadline Thursday, more than 20 people had submitted applications for the post of Lincoln County road manager, according to Acting County Manager Martha Guevara.

Commissioners will meet in a special session at 2 p.m. Wednesday, February 6, in the commission room to review the applications and to narrow the field for personal interviews.

Commissioner Bill Elliott said Friday the board probably will pick about five applicants for personal interviews.

"We're talking an annual salary range of roughly around \$25,000, depending on qualifications," he said.

Former county road superintendent Tommy Hall was earning about \$29,000 a year before the commission decided earlier this month not to reappoint him.

The commission split 2-1 on the vote not to keep Hall, with Elliott and Commissioner Monroy Montes voting together and Chairman Stirling Spencer voting alone to retain him.



Swearingin said in the 1930s Ruidoso was three different towns: Skyland east of Chamber of Commerce, Carter Town near the wild Snail Building and Wingfield Area.

Ike Wingfield, postmaster for Wingfield Area, lived where the Blue Goose Restaurant is now. The post office was across the street where the Pine Tree Shopping Center is now.

The Bennetts also had a grocery store next door.

Swearingin said, one night Wingfield heard a noise at the Post Office and went over with his gun.

"The guys from Carter Town were trying to steal the post office equipment but he averted the attempt." He said the first Ruidoso Municipal election was held in 1945 and it was a rouser. S.M. Johnson, an old-timer was the first lobbyist in Washington. He was successful in getting Highway 70 to come through this area.

Ruidoso was recognized as a tourist town after World War I. Roswell and El Paso supported Ruidoso. The Ski Area was started in 1962. Swearingin said Ruidoso had open gambling before 1951.

The Woman's Club organized the first Chamber of Commerce, and helped get paving, garbage collection and the library started.

Warriors split with wildcats: Willard hits 42

Wildcats for three quarters Saturday, before faltering down the stretch, 67-61. It was the Warriors best game of

the year, better than the Tularosa win earlier in the week. Coach Norman Wright had coached this Wildcat team last year. He wanted a win badly and he did a brilliant job of raising the level of Ruidoso's badly outmanned squad.

Deming fans actually outnumbered Ruidoso fans and they were able to drown out the Warrior cheering section easily. At least for the first half, they had little to cheer about.

Wright said he was very proud

of his team and also felt the game was the Warrior's best of the season.

Cody Willard was sensational. Not only did he score 43 of the Warriors 61 points, but he was the leading rebounder as well. Willard made six 3-pointers, 7 field goals and 13-15 free throws. Willard hit 50 percent of his shots.

The Warriors as a team hit a remarkable 22-27 free throws.

The Warriors first half couldn't have been better. Ahead 18-12 after the first period, Ruidoso stretched

their lead to 35 to 24 on a long Hail Mary shot by Willard.

The Wildcats triple teamed Willard to start the second half. The Warriors tried to feed Willard in the post and the ball was intercepted several times before they finally decided to shoot to loosen the defense.

Willard was not to be denied. If he got the ball, he drove for the basket to either score or pick up a foul shot. His long range bombs only shortened a bit in the fourth frame when the team, only seven strong,

began to tire.

As a team, the Warriors committed 24 turnovers to Deming's 17. That could have well spelled the difference.

Robert Sayner scored six points; Boone Denny, five points, including seven rebounds and four assists; Syrus Wheeler scored four points; Evans, two points, and Huey one point along with 10 rebounds.

The Warriors will travel the long road trip to Cohe to meet the Indians Friday and then return Saturday for a game with Silver City.

It was the Wildcats 23-16 in the first quarter and things looked dim for the flat Warriors. The turn around began in the second quarter when the Warriors closed the gap at half time, 39-35.

The Wildcats matched the Warriors point for point in the third quarter. Ruidoso did manage to eek out a 3-point advantage and Tulie's edge after three frames was a scant one point, 54-53. That edge remained with only two minutes left in the game. The Warriors grabbed the lead for the first time.

The Warriors have been there before, and lost. This time Ruidoso took charge and when Willard

turned into Dr. Dunk with his two-hand power jam, the crowd cheers rivaled the state champion volleyball teams winning point.


The Wildcats continued their hot shooting ways from the last game, scoring nine 3-point bombs.

Williams scored 13 points. Miller dropped in 11, including a long range 3-point bomb.


Other Chief scorers were Dennis Davis, 8; Billy Morrison, 6; Stan Williams and Bunker Perryman, 2 each.





Editorial

Lincoln County voters will be selecting school board members on Tuesday, November 5. These elected officials will take on an important task of setting policy for schools and seeing that their philosophies are carried out by their employees. All of the candidates have stressed in their campaigns and election forums that young people hold the future of this world in their hands. It is agreed that a good educational system is vital to that future.

VOTE!

That's why it is so important that every registered voter take the time to learn about the candidates and cast a ballot on Tuesday.

Of course the candidates' friends and families will vote; of course the school administrators and their families will vote; and, it would only make sense for all school employees and their families to vote. And that leaves the rest of us — the taxpayers at large who fund the more than \$16 million educational enterprise in this county — the parents of the students who put their futures in the hands of the educational system — the business people who look to the schools to prepare a literate and able workforce. We owe it to ourselves to vote.

OUR CHOICES

We have read what the candidates had to say, talked to some of them, attended candidate forums in Capitan and Ruidoso and looked into the qualifications and backgrounds of the candidates. We found that among all five school districts — Capitan, Carrizozo, Corona, Hondo and Ruidoso — voters have a good selection of competent people. We weighed and balanced business and educational backgrounds, knowledge of this area gained through residency and participation and the candidates' present relationship with the schools. The choices were tough in some cases, but we've chosen the people that we believe will serve best on the five separate school boards.

RUIDOSO

In Ruidoso, for Position 1, we're endorsing Jeff Chapman, a 20-year Ruidoso School district resident with a strong business background. While he has ties to the school system, those ties are not so close that he will fail to ask questions and think for himself as a member of the board.

For Ruidoso, Position 2, our choice is incumbent Mike Morris. That endorsement is not a stamp of approval for all that the present board has done, but it is a vote of confidence for Morris who is willing to listen to his constituents and knows the difference between setting policy and administering it.

For Ruidoso, Position 3, our choice is Ronnie L. Hemphill, a CPA with personal experience in school finances. Hemphill stressed the importance of moral and social values, as well as book knowledge. We were impressed with Hemphill's strong stand against manipulation of the school system by special interest groups.

CAPITAN

For Capitan, Position 3, we're endorsing incumbent Thomas R. Trost. He has the education, knowledge and flexibility to continue to serve Capitan Schools well.

Kenneth A. Cox is unopposed for Position 4. He gets our vote, anyway.

For Capitan, Position 5, our choice is Jack A. King. His past experience as an educator will add a balance to the Capitan board.

CARRIZOZO

For Position 1, Carrizozo, we're supporting Jan Barham, a former elementary school teacher with strong ties to this area and children in the school system.

Gary Hightower has our vote in Position 2. He has served the county well in other organizations and will be a reasonable and dedicated school board member.

For Carrizozo, Position 5, we're endorsing J.C. Richmond. His masters degree in school administration will help him meet the challenges of declining enrollment.

HONDO

In Hondo, we support Thurman Sanchez for Position 1. He's an educator and a lifelong resident of the Hondo School District.

For Position 4, our choice is Alberto G. Montez, a current board member who calls on citizens to share responsibility for the success or failure of the schools.


CORONA

For Corona, Position 1, we're endorsing James M. Parker. We like his stand on alternatives to traditional classroom educations — like satellite systems, four-day week and sharing teachers.

For Position 2, Jeffrey L. Walls is unopposed. He gets our vote.

For Position 4, our choice is Joe Allen Sultemeier, a lifelong district resident. He has strong ties to the district, but is willing to consider changes.

Introducing a liberal among conservatives

If you're looking for a legislator who will punch when he discusses the workings of the state legislature, don't talk to Billy McKibben.

The Republican state senator from Lovington is as quick to criticize some of the procedures of himself and his colleagues as he is to take on the labor unions.

But underneath his quips is a rock-solid philosophy of conservatism that helped make him Lea County's first GOP senator. And he's not all criticism.

McKibben, the Republican whip in the Senate, credits the legislature, at least in recent years, with understanding—finally, in his view—the oil and gas industry, which makes up the main business in his district, which includes parts of both Lea and Roosevelt counties.

"The legislature has been extremely responsive to oil and gas the last few years," McKibben said. Two years ago, he said, he was able to get a bill passed that for the first time allowed severance tax money to be invested in New Mexico's oil and gas industry—and not, as McKibben sees it, just in New York and California.

He recalled that when he first arrived at the legislature, during Bruce King's first term as governor, the main problem was what to do with "the unbelievable amount of money" the state government was getting from the energy industry.

Those days are over, McKibben noted, although he said the economy in his area, which had been "horrible," has recovered somewhat.

"When oil goes down, we take a direct hit," he remarked.

Discussing the current session, McKibben made it clear that keeping the reins on some of the Democrats' spending plans will be one of his priorities as a member of the loyal opposition.

He expects the Democrats to propose a multi-million dollar property tax referendum that will be touted as being for education.

But if a tax passes—that raises, say, \$30 million—what McKibben calls "the old shell game we've been playing" for years will be on.

That state's leaders will take \$20 million from the general fund that had been earmarked for education, divert it for capital outlay or other programs, and put the \$30 million from new taxes into the general fund.

But the only real increase for education, McKibben points out, will be \$10 million.

If something like this takes place, he suggests, it will prove his saying: "The New Mexico taxpayer is a political hostage."

McKibben predicted that voters in his district—and in many other districts around the state—would vote against a tax proposal. But voters in what McKibben calls "the Imperial City" of Albuquerque and several other cities could muster enough votes to put a tax referendum over the top.


The workings of the legislature itself look open, McKibben said. But the open meetings law, which requires most public agencies to conduct much of their business in public, doesn't apply to the legislature, he pointed out.

"We can sneak around," he said—adding that the legislature not only can do that but does do that.

Some years ago, he said, the Senate—with himself as a participant—decided on its budget at a meeting in the Hilton Hotel.

The final legislative budget, worked out by conference committees of the two houses of the legislature, is worked out in private, he noted.

"We go through all that charade (of open meetings) and rinky-dink in the Finance Committee," he said—but the real work isn't in the open.



Joe Dunlap: Lifetime experiences add up to art

If lifetime experience is any measure of an artist's creative power, then Joe Dunlap will be ranked by art historians near the top of the ladder.

Since the age of 15, he has worked off and on for the New Mexico Game and Fish Department, he served in various law enforcement positions and as a private investigator, performed in the professional rodeo circuit, participated in the film industry, was involved in state politics, owned a western wear store and an art gallery, restored old buildings and has been married and divorced four times — to the same woman.

And at the age of 57, Dunlap's skin is weathered from years outdoors, but he is as trim and agile as a teenager and he seems nowhere near ready to settle down.

Dunlap recently visited China with San Patricio gallery owner-artist John Meigs, who has associated with some of the great contemporary painters. Meigs calls Dunlap "The best kept Hondo Valley secret," adding that he is one of the finest artists in the Southwest.

Amazingly amid all of the activity, Dunlap has found time to paint. Not surprisingly, he has experimented with a variety of mediums including pastels, watercolor, oil, egg tempera and bronze sculpture.

"I began sketching as a child," he said during an interview at his studio on the Meigs property. "My aunt Opal Lee (now 90 years old) was a teacher and amateur artist. She gave me my first set of pastels. It gave me some insight into something other than pencil and crayons and that I might be able to create something."

"As a young man rodeoing, I spent a great deal of time recuperating (from broken bones) and did cartooning and some serious painting."

He realized he might have a future in art when he was offered a job as an illustrator for an architect who was recovering from a stroke in the same hospital. But with a wife and four children, Dunlap figured he needed a regular job and decided on law enforcement.

In 1972, Dunlap's wife offered him a chance to paint full-time and said she would support the children.

He moved to Belen, but former school chums adopted his studio as a stop-off point between shifts and he accomplished little.

Desperate for privacy, he arranged to live in a cowcamp on a nearby ranch where he produced egg tempera and watercolors depicting

the landscape, wildlife and personalities of New Mexico.

"I painted hard for one year and did a little cowboying for the ranch owner," Dunlap said. "When I had a quantity of material prepared, I interviewed galleries in Taos, Santa Fe and Albuquerque for a one-man show."

But before the June 1973 date of the exhibit at the gallery in the Old Town section of Albuquerque, Dunlap had traded the bulk of his work for the deed to the business. Although he enjoyed building up an art collection as well as a collection of Navajo and Pueblo blankets, rugs, pottery and jewelry, the demands of running the gallery left little time to paint.

He sold the gallery and went back to painting in a studio in Old Town while working as a private investigator, a job that allowed him to visit many of the nation's best art museums and galleries.

He moved to Ruidoso in 1982 to operate a pawn and gift shop for a friend, and to paint.

In 1987, he ran another gallery in Albuquerque for a short time. He then returned to Ruidoso to manage the Smith Ltd. Gallery, where he remained until 1989 when he moved to San Patricio.

"I'm a self-taught artist, although I have met some fine people who have encouraged me over the years," Dunlap said. Besides Meigs, that encouragement came from such respected artists as Henriette Wyeth and Peter Hurd, who saw Dunlap's sketches in 1963 and urged him to continue. In 1969, Dunlap lived, worked and painted with Hurd.

"I have found that a true artist is always there to help another artist," he said. "They are not selfish and they are glad to share their knowledge."

During the 1970s, Meigs was showing his work in Scottsdale and invited Dunlap to hang some of his pieces. They all sold. "Then I really started to paint at every opportunity," Dunlap said.

Viewing works by other artists is a learning experience in itself, but Dunlap is proud that his technique is self-taught.

"As a gallery owner, frequently I was more impressed with self-taught artists because they work on it. They don't rely on a degree from some institution," he said.

Pastels sell the best for Dunlap, but he does not find them as versatile in the field as watercolor, which is the medium represented in a collection at the Meigs gallery in San Patricio. He also has works at the Dallas Art Gallery (successor to Smith Ltd.) in Ruidoso and the Santa Fe operation of Joan Cauley

Galleries.

"I like to paint on location, not from photographs," Dunlap said. He often makes quick sketches to pin down shapes and general lighting, then goes home to finish the color, which he is able to capture from memory.

"Over the years, I have painted the Hondo Valley so many times I could nearly shut my eyes and do it," he said. "I do love New Mexico so much. I have painted from the high mountains to the desert. It's been my bread and butter."

Dunlap is fond of using a dry brush in watercolors instead of the great washes chosen by many watercolorists.

"I also always use the finest materials. I don't use second rate pigment or paper," he said.

However, the secret to any type of painting is the use of light and shadow, Dunlap said. "But if it doesn't appeal to the emotional sense of the viewer, it won't sell."

A watercolor may require one hour or 16 hours to complete, but when asked, Dunlap says all of his paintings took 35 years because they are an accumulative effort.

Most of his oils are painted in his studio, where he also has stored cartons of paintings that still wait to be finished.

"I have many stairs in the studio, because I have to live with my work a while," Dunlap said. "I start several paintings as the mood strikes. I'm a very undisciplined painter. Some will never be finished. They're not the quality I want to show. About once a year, I have a good burning."
