EDC explores new uses for Fort Stanton

It's a "done deal" so let's pursue alternatives for use of Fort Stanton personnel and facilities.

This was the feeling which emerged from a regular meeting of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County Thursday night in offices in the Stroud building.

Fort Stanton Administrator Ervin Aldaz told EDCLC board members that "it's going to occur no matter what," referring to the two-year phase-out of Stanton as a hos-

pital and training center for mentally and physically handicapped individuals.

After Aldaz briefed board members on the dark outlook concerning Fort Stanton, the business and retention committee of EDCLC under Roy Seay was instructed to use every means possible to help find alternative uses of personnel and facilities.

Aldaz suggested several possible alternatives:
-Brain-damage unit. There are some 60 to 70 persons who have suffered severe brain damage in accidents. These people need perpetual care, he indicated.

-A type of nursing home facility for people with behavioral disorders.

-A facility for treating persons

who have addiction problems through substance abuse.

-A southern New Mexico psychiatric facility. Aldaz mentioned the present expertise among Stanton staff members.

"The last thing we want to be is a penitentiary," Aldaz said. He spoke against any type of "warehousing" of people, but, he said, if necessary to keep jobs and payroll in Lincoln County, even a corrections facility would be acceptable.

New board member and vice president of EDCLC Steve Stroud said that if the county is going to lose Fort Stanton as a hospital and training center, people need to know who to write and what to say.

"We need direction," he said. Seay said his committee will develop a plan of action.

"This problem could be the most important faced by the EDCLC since its inception" Ronnie Paulger, EDCLC board president, said.

Aldaz said complete shutdown of Fort Stanton would "be shocking to you if you see the trickling effect" on the economy.

Ruidoso Mayor Victor Alonso, member of the board, reported on efforts in Santa Fe to obtain funding for an airlines feasibility study.

He said Dick Weber had raised \$7,500 over the telephone to match state funds for such a study, but that the effort to obtain state money had not been successful.

Alonso asked EDCLC to get behind a suggestion that area communities contribute money toward a feasibility study concerning demand, scheduling and rates.

Weber and others have developed plans for a locally owned Sun Country airline to serve Ruidoso, Roswell, Artesia, Carlsbad and El Paso.

Stroud suggested that a shuttle from Roswell to Ruidoso and Ruidoso to Roswell might be an answer to get more people into Ruidoso and to accommodate those who presently use air travel.

Other communities will be contacted about contributing to a fund, George Puckett, executive director of EDCLC, said.

During the meeting Cindy Lynch, former board member and secretary, was presented a plaque by Paulger for her "faithful service."

Skeen brings hopeful messages

"There isn't any technological problem we can't solve if we really want to," U.S. Rep. Joe Skeen told Ruidoso High School students Thursday after he addressed the students and then asked for questions.

Skeen was asked about possible tax incentives for developing alternative sources of energy.

Skeen said Americans are "impatient," that they sometimes want instant solutions to prob-

lems. Citing the dependency on Middle East oil for energy, Skeen said the U.S. must pursue other sources.

He cited the breeder reactor, a "perfectly safe" form of energy production which "was scrapped when I first went to Congress, over my objections."

Skeen addressed a room crowded with students from several classes. One student had invited Skeen to speak to the study body; Skeen accepted.

He also addressed a Spanish

class while here, Thursday and after also addressing the weekly meeting at Ruidoso Inn of the Sierra Blanca Lodge No. 26 of the Fraternal Order of Police.

Skeen told police that the Gulf situation "heightens local law enforcement because of possible terrorism."

"Basic law enforcement is local ... the feds are not worth a hoot unless they have good relationships with local enforcement officers," he said.

The congressman said the federal government must heighten the "prosecutorial" end of the war on drugs.

Emphasis should be on the demand side, convincing young people "that getting high is not a good thing to do."

Skeen said that law enforcement should benefit from the law which allows forfeiture of vehicles and other property involved in drug transactions.

Some \$382 million becomes available in a year's time because of sale of confiscated vehicles and other property.

"Those of us in Congress are very cognizant you have to have some help," Skeen said about budget problems.

Of Saddam Hussein, Skeen said he is "capable of any type of behavior," that the dictator is "totally inhuman."

Skeen urged students to participate in government.

"If we continue the low voting turnout, we're going to lose it," Skeen said.


exchange student in Ruidoso, asked Skeen if the United States can come out of the recession "in light of the terrific national debt."

The lawmaker said the long-range plan in Washington allows for reducing the debt by \$500 million.

"We have a very strong economy," he said, citing the eagerness of foreigners to invest in America.

"We invite those investments," Skeen said.

The congressman was scheduled to be in attendance at the New Mexico Legislature, Friday.

"It's an additional way to remember those in the Gulf," Link said.


Madeline Shackelford of Mitchell's in Village Plaza, with the war on her heart and in her mind, placed a sign outside her shop for people to place names.

State could mandate teacher unions

Local school boards and district administrators are pacing up and down their offices, nervously watching the State Legislature, which may deliver a double whammy this year.

Under consideration by the 40th New Mexico Legislature is a bill that would create a mechanism for collective bargaining for public employees. And the legislature also is discussing reinstating tenure for teachers, a system abolished in 1986 that sets up strict regulations on teacher termination.

If a collective bargaining bill passes both the Senate and the House, and is signed into law by Gov. Bruce King, public employees would have the option of organizing under union representation. They would then be able to negotiate wages, hours, benefits, working conditions and other issues mutually agreed upon with the board.

Dr. Scott Childress, superintendent of the Capitan school district and a former negotiator for the Gallup/McKinley schools, warned that the legislation could be disastrous for school districts.

"There is no state money to pay for the negotiators or arbitrators and that can get very expensive," Childress told Capitan school board members last Thursday. "It detracts from the rest of the district's operation and is very time consuming."

But there is a good chance that the legislation will pass in the predominantly Democratic Senate and House, he said. And unlike his predecessor, King is unlikely to veto such legislation.

Ruidoso School Superintendent Mike Gladden delivered letters of opposition to collective bargaining from his school board members to the Senate Finance Committee in Santa Fe last week.

"Discussion still is very much in the initial stages," Gladden said Sunday. "The impression is that teachers are not really lobbying for the legislation and the State Classroom Teachers Association already has come out against it. I understand they believe it may inject too much politics into the system and detract from the educational process."

Capitan employs about 33 certified teachers, Ruidoso lists 114.

Cynthia Eggleston, local representative of the National Education Association (NEA) in Ruidoso, said even if the collective bargaining legislation passes, she's not sure it would be utilized locally.

"Our problem here is that we are so fragmented, that there isn't one group that speaks for the majority even to get to the point of holding an election (to select a labor organization as bargaining agent)," Eggleston said. "Our biggest stumbling block would be agreeing on a group. We don't have any real problem to unite us, but having the option for collective bargaining would be a safeguard."

Both Eggleston and teacher Lindy Lott said they can see why larger districts in the state and those at the lower end of the wage scale may have an immediate need for collective bargaining.

"From what I hear, it would strengthen due process for teachers and I think that would be preferable," Lott said. "Generally speaking, teachers in Ruidoso feel they are treated fairly, but (the abolition of tenure) put uncertainty in many teachers' minds. I'd sure like to have (collective bargaining) in my pocket."

Eggleston said she is much more interested in seeing the restoration of tenure and in making sure the legislature appropriates sufficient money for education.

About 40 Ruidoso teachers are members of the NEA, Eggleston said. And only a handful are associated with the American Federation of Teachers (AFT).

To schedule an election for selection of a bargaining agent, the proposed legislation requires a petition filed by a labor organization showing that it represents at least 35 percent of the teachers within a district. It then requires a majority vote of all members of the bargaining unit for an organization to be designated.

As now written, the Senate bill specifies that if teachers in a district elect to proceed with collective bargaining and negotiators reach an impasse that cannot be resolved through a mediator, the issue would be referred to an arbitrator.

The decision of the arbitrator would be binding on the board and the teachers. Under current regulations, the board has the final decision on issues of employment, salaries and working conditions.

"They want to take away all of the board's powers and handle it themselves," Childress said. An attempt to use collective bargaining in Gallup for two years from 1976-78 caused scars that still have not healed, said Childress, who was a negotiator during that period.

He said he has talked to teachers in the Capitan district and they were not interested in selecting a bargaining agent and engaging in negotiations. Ruby Johnson, president of the Capitan Classroom Teachers Association, could not be reached for comment.

But Childress fears the legislation effectively will mandate that all 88 school districts in the state use collective bargaining. The proposed legislation specifies that once a bargaining agent/labor organization

is selected, it would speak for all teachers in a district, not just those who voted for or are members of the organization. All teachers within that district also would be required to pay toward the expense of that representation.

A three-member Public Employee Labor Relations Board appointed by the governor would hear unfair labor practice complaints.

The legislation would prohibit discrimination against employees because of labor organization membership or participatory activities; interference with or coercion of employees in the exercise of their rights; domination of or interference in the formation, existence or administration of any labor organization; and discrimination in regard to hiring, tenure or any term of employment to discourage or encourage membership in a labor organization.

On other side, the proposed legislation also carries a prohibition against strikes by public employees and provides for appeals to the court for injunctions against such actions.

Both sides are prohibited from refusing to bargain in good faith. The legislation would allow negotiation of multi-year agreements.

Tenure is another knotty issue facing school districts, Childress said. Under existing law, if a school board decides to terminate a teacher, the only limitation is that the firing not be in violation of the board's policy.

"With tenure, the board must show cause for a firing, the burden of proof is with us," Childress said. "Now the burden is on the teacher to show how the board violated its own policy. It will require much more documentation."

problems to a minimum this year according to Ruidoso Police Chief Richard Swenor.

Charlie Armstrong of the road Department said his crew starts before dawn on their routine priority roads.

Armstrong said the village uses salt delivered from the Carlsbad area and is stockpiled in the street yard.

He said while the blades are on the run, the salt trucks are placed at key intersections where there are stop lights or any other major intersections that intersect with Highway 48. He gave White Mountain Drive and Cre Meadows Road as examples.

After Mechem and Sudderth are treated, certain locales like the fire department, police department, hospital, nursing homes and any area where ambulances are likely to go are treated.

"We try to get the main thoroughfares cleared for the eight o'clock traffic, then we go into the secondary area," Armstrong said.

Joe H. "Tuffy" Welch

Services were conducted Sunday for Joe H. "Tuffy" Welch, 84, of Ruidoso Downs, who died Thursday at Lincoln County Medical Center.

The Reverend Gordon S. Bowie of El Paso, Texas, officiated at the services in the First Baptist Church in Ruidoso Downs. Interment was in the Hale Cemetery in Ruidoso Downs.

Welch was born July 6, 1906, in Loving, and moved to the Ruidoso Downs area about 40 years ago from Carlsbad.

A rodeo cowboy, Welch was inducted into the Cowboy Hall of Fame in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, November 27, 1988. Among his most famous performances was his participation in the International Rodeo before the Queen of England in London in the 1930s. He also rode in the 101 Wild West Show and the Billy Ross Centennial show in Fort Worth, Texas.

Welch performed in the Madison Square Garden Rodeo for six years and judged there for four years. He

was one of the original TURTLE's #6, which is now the Professional Rodeo Cowboy's Association. He also is a member of Los Rancheros Visitadores in California.

He built, owned and operated the Silver Spur Supper Club in Carlsbad. He married Louise Metcalf January 4, 1946, in Las Cruces.

Survivors include his wife, Louise, of Ruidoso Downs; two sons, Jim W. Welch of Ketchum, Idaho, and Joe M. Welch of El Paso; four daughters, Janice L. Welch of Mora Bay, California, Merle Ray Rigdon of Denver, Colorado, Karen Cooper of Selah, Washington, and Sharon Mortenson of Roby, Missouri. He is also survived by 16 grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.

The family suggests memorials to the American Cancer Society or the New Mexico Federation of the Blind.



The school leaders delivered the message to their congressional representatives that they will strive for reform but cannot do the job alone, continued the release.







Hobbs attracts varied industries

The impact of the oil bust has been felt nowhere more than Hobbs, New Mexico. Much of the economy was based on oil field service companies, from wire line operators, to drillers, and production companies. Virtually every business in town suffered reverses and many went under.

As a result, it became imperative that some diversification efforts were necessary... not unlike the Lincoln County experience in the middle and late '80s. Hobbs has had an economic development group for years, but as long as oil was king little effort was required to create new jobs, and not until the bottom fell out was it clear that a new thrust was required.

Those efforts have paid off in newly-created jobs that bring in dollars, which are not tied to oil, from the rest of the world to Hobbs.

The Industrial Development Corporation of Lea County has been directed for the last three years by Harold Lampe whose professional career began in Missouri. Harold is an

outstanding professional who also serves as president of the Business Quarter and as a director of the New Mexico Industrial Development Association.

During his tenure as executive director the community has been able to induce several companies to relocate to Hobbs. They have created a solid base of employment. To wit: —USA 800 is a telemarketing firm based in

Kansas City which established a facility in Hobbs in 1989. The company currently hires more than 75 employees, most of whom are involved in telephone sales.

—Electro Support Systems based in Temecula, California, has established an expansion facility in Hobbs. The company employs more than 10 workers and is involved in electronics contracting.

In addition, the community has been successful in securing funding for Rich Meat, a packing company, to expand its red meat business by establishing an export market in Japan.

Other projects are currently under way which, if successful, could result in a significant number of additional jobs.

Again, the Hobbs story illustrates that a community effort, well-funded and staffed by professionals, will pay off handsomely but patience is the key because success does not come quickly ... or easily.

Champ kickboxer puts foot down in Ruidoso

Kiki Germany, 31, sat on the stool in his corner before his European super heavyweight kickboxing title match last November. His eyes were open wide and the adrenaline filled him with a new nervousness.

In the Miami audience were his heroes; Jean Claude Van Damme, movie actor specializing in kickboxing; Chuck Norris, leading man in martial arts movies; and Steve Segall, star of Hard to Kill now playing in the theatres.

"As I looked at my opponent, I thought if I can go the distance, I might be able to win the fight," he said.

His opponent was John Dillon of England, and the fight was televised on ESPN.

Germany said after the opening bell the fight started as a routine "feeling out" round with each throwing a few punches. He said Dillon then connected with a kick to his shoulder. He said the shot didn't hurt, but it did spur his reaction, a round house kick that caught Dillon flush on the side of the face. Dillon fell to the canvas.

"I couldn't believe it," Kiki said.

"I just stood there, waiting for him to get up. He never did."

The total fight lasted 1:28 seconds. Germany was crowned the European champ.

Kiki had been kick boxing for three years and now he was only one fight away from the World's super heavyweight championship. Germany would meet Luis Martinez out of Puerto Rico for the title. He came back to Ruidoso to train for the fight.

Germany had trained for the European title at Ruidoso and he is effusive in his appreciation of the support he received in the valley for that fight.

Horse trainer Clint Wright hired Germany to assist him with his horses. At the same time, Wright let Kiki set his own work schedule that allowed him to train for the fight.

Kiki's regimen included running 10 miles for three days a week and then biking 26 miles a day for three days.

While at Miami, Germany received daily calls from his sister Andree who manages the 3 B's

Restuarant in Ruidoso.

"Andree was always there when you really needed that phone call," he said. "I can't express how great a motivator that was."

His sister calls him a big Teddy Bear and the big and powerful Germany does appear to be shy and polite. He gives the impression that he just wants to be your friend.

Kiki, no doubt, learned a lot about boxing from his father Coyt "Bud" Germany who fought 14 years in amateur boxing. After a few problems with his manager, Kiki enlisted his father to be his manager.

While in service he became the Air Force world boxing champion in both the middle weight and light heavyweight divisions. Kiki also played baseball for the California Angel's organization.

His boxing ability has landed him regular work. Prior to his kick boxing days he was a Miami policeman and he has worked as a

body guard for six years.

His clients included Michael and Leon Spinks, Dean Martin, Tina Turner, Janet Jackson, as well as businessmen such as jewelers.

Recently, Germany's attitude toward kick boxing began to change. At 31, he wondered why he was putting himself through such a tough training program when he felt there was nothing he had to prove. Kiki said he also fell in love.

"What God gave me was a gift," he said. "I used it to the best of my ability. I'm satisfied and that's enough for me." Kiki decided to retire on top.

Germany said he now wants to build a home in Ruidoso and start a business. "A new career with new challenges," he said.

"I've worked hard, but just as important as hard work is the people who stand beside you. That's why I like Ruidoso. The people here are the best I've ever met. That's why I'm going to live here."


Poncho Portillo, 160, placed a respectable third in the tournament by winning two matches and only losing to the eventual champion David Lathen of Tucumcari.





Ruidoso children's home is gone — not forgotten

All that remains of the old children's home in Ruidoso are memories and burned out buildings. One former summer resident is still dealing with those memories.

Years after the orphanage was closed in the 1970s, local Ruidoso children on late night romps or Halloween dares would sneak into its darkened rooms.

Some would later swear they heard the pitiful sobs of the orphaned children who spent their summers inside the old lodge and that they saw the ghostly outline of abandoned clothing and toys.

The deserted main building of the Southwestern Children's Home's summer retreat burned down about three years ago.

But its presence still is very real to Marcia Silver. Forty-three years after being sent there by her father, an emotional wall still blocks her steps whenever she attempts to approach the charred ground or to enter the remaining buildings in the field across from the Ruidoso Police Department.


"I think twice I actually walked up to the house, but I could never go in," Silver said. "It was an overwhelming feeling, one of fear and revulsion."

Now a million dollar salesperson with Pine Mountain Realty, Silver remembers her three summers at the orphanage's retreat as times of isolation and rejection. She remembers them as hard times.

However, for all of Silver's bad memories of the orphanage, a former employee, Aunt Elizabeth Moore, recalls the retreat as a place full of happiness and warmth.

"It was a beautiful home, everyone loved it," Miss Moore, now 83, said.

Silver's parents apparently thought of the orphanage as a safe place to put their seven-year-old daughter and 8 1/2 year-old son while their mother was ill. Silver said her father loved the mountains and referred to the orphanage as summer camp. He had learned about the facility, a seasonal arm of the main orphanage in El Paso, Texas, through the El Paso Optimist Club, which sponsored pic-

nic for the children.

"It was beautiful coming up to the property, but when the gate locked behind you, you felt like prisoners," Silver said.

And to some extent they were, she said. As she recalls, their personal possessions were confiscated until the end of the summer. They were issued clothing by the orphanage and her long braids were cut. They were not allowed to place or receive telephone calls. Their letters and packages were opened before they received them, she said. "So we never knew if we got everything that was sent to us."

Silver's impression is that her brother and she were the only children who were not orphans during the three summers they were there.

"The staff more than the kids picked on us, but the kids couldn't understand why we were there if we had parents," she said.

However, one of the orphanage's employees said many families, especially those where both parents worked, sent their children to the retreat for the summer to get away from the heat in El Paso.

"I suppose it was a clean place, but it was very oppressive," Silver said. "I don't remember anyone on the staff being loving or someone you could go to when you were upset. It was very military, regimented. We had a certain time for naps, for play and to clean up," she said.

"We were required to take naps

outside on the concrete floor and, of course, everyone would get sick. Then came the castor oil. They used castor oil as a cure and as a punishment, along with restriction of privileges and (some types of psychological isolation)."

That first summer, her parents may have visited once or twice, Silver said. She tried to tell them how much she disliked the orphanage, "but they couldn't understand why we didn't love summer camp."

Some of the happiest moments were when one of the local stables brought a string of horses once a week for the children to ride. But as Silver remembers it, to be eligible for that treat and others, such as going to the skating rink, a child

was required to learn verses from the New Testament.

Silver and her brother were Jewish and although she tried to memorize quickly, they didn't often get to go on the outings, she said.

Probably 30 girls shared the dormitory, Silver said. They bathed in two big kitchen sinks.

"I used to get cold, dirty baths because they didn't change the water and I was always the last in line," she said.

Her brother, Joel Kleinfeld, lived in a dorm in another section of the main lodge and spent his time trying to think of ways to escape, Silver said. Babies and toddlers were kept in a separate two story house that still stands today.

The staff was housed in three smaller buildings that over the years have been brutalized by time and vandals.

"I learned to hate oatmeal, but the meals were healthy," Silver said. "You had to eat what you got. If you didn't, you'd get a little less the next time. You learned to fill your pockets with food."

Flour was kept in large drums in a dirt-floor storage area under the toddlers' dorm. Dozens of drums remain there today, but rodents have torn into the stacked burlap bags of cornmeal, rice and beans.

As Silver recalls, the children slept on roll-away type cots with sheets, small Army blankets and no pillows.

Children were told to refer to Mrs. Moore as "My deary" and her assistant as "Aunt Selma," she said.

"It was the true meaning of an orphanage," Silver said. "I hope and pray the ones today are not like that."

But to Elizabeth Moore, the retreat was an orphanage in the very best sense.

The Ike Wingfield family

donated nine acres for the home and people came from El Paso to build the structures, she said.

"It was for the children to get out of the heat. It was so hot (in El Paso). I taught them to sew and we had college students for recreation, two girls every year. There was horseback riding, hikes, picnics and different things. I just loved it up there."

Initially, the retreat was used nearly exclusively for orphans, sometimes as many as 100 children at a time. But when the government started paying for the upkeep of orphans, relatives often took over their care, Miss Moore said.

"Then our children came mostly from broken homes," she said. And many parents who were stuck in the city during the summer sent their children to the orphanage center in Ruidoso to escape the heat.

"They wanted their children to be able to come to the mountains," she said. "Sometimes they stayed three weeks or a month."

Miss Moore had grown up in a Waco, Texas, orphanage and when Southwestern needed some help in 1930, she was recommended by the director for the post.

Mr. and Mrs. Moore were running the home. They were so good to me, Mrs. Moore adopted me even though I was grown. We worked hand in hand," Miss Moore said. "I loved children, but I never married. I worked with the orphanage (in El Paso) until 1979 when it was dissolved."

Another home that had opened in El Paso took over after the Texas child welfare division "put (Mrs. Moore) out because she didn't have the education. She died at 78. She didn't last long after they took away her job," Miss Moore said.

The retreat in Ruidoso had been turned over to another manager to operate, but he apparently let it

run down. Miss Moore was asked by the orphanage board to clean it up.

But Miss Moore said she threw up her hands because it was such a mammoth job and she was being pestered constantly by child welfare because it was so dirty.

"They like to drove me crazy," she said. "I just closed it and came home."

In 1977, the property was purchased by Robinson & Robinson Co., apparently with the idea of building low-income housing, a concept that never materialized. Ten years later, H. Roscoe Robinson of Albuquerque bought the tract from the company.

Meanwhile, Silver moved to Ruidoso in 1978 from California with her husband. Despite her feelings about the orphanage, she enjoyed the climate and scenery in


Ruidoso. They bought a hardware store, but eventually divorced.

Three years ago, Silver heard fire engine sirens and saw flames coming from Grindstone Canyon road. She drove down to check a house she was handling nearby.

As she approached, she realized it was the orphanage retreat that was burning.

"Never in my life had I had a feeling like that, an awesome feeling," she said. "I had been here 10 years and driven passed it nearly everyday. I had always said I wanted to see it burn down. I was jumping up and down, saying burn, burn. I'm surprised someone didn't arrest me."

Silver never talked to her parents about her experiences at the retreat. "It left a scar, but we never talked about it. I have buried so much of the memories, just blocked them out," Silver said. "I probably have a lot of mental stress that will come out someday."





Just when you think you've heard it all...

The Committee for Building a new Visitors Information Center is asking the Lodgers Tax Committee for \$2,000. This is what the request has to say: "This seed money is needed to prepare the proposal, print copies, mail solicitations to possible donors, and provide a means to start the ball rolling for fundraisers."

This Chamber of Commerce Committee wants a new Visitors Information Center because the "current Visitors Information center is inadequate, does not allow the use of advertising, provides very little information to tourists and visitors except allowing them to pick up brochures."

Yep, the visitors end of the Chamber of Commerce is crowded — that's the way it was redesigned when the roomy end was remodeled from a visitors center to a chamber board room. Maybe it needs to be changed back — it probably could be reorganized for less than \$2,000.

Aren't we in the midst of looking for money for a whole string of civic projects? Like sidewalks, a civic/events center, Midtown parking and river walk.

Sometimes it's a good idea to say "no," and we hope the Lodgers Tax Committee will do just that.

How much sunshine is too much?

How much sunshine will the Legislature allow?

That's the question raised by the Public Records Act (H.B. 23), a proposed bill that would greatly improve access to public records in New Mexico.

There's little doubt that this "sunshine bill," which has broad bipartisan support, will pass. The only uncertainty is to what extent special interests will succeed in dimming the bill's light by closing off their own records from public scrutiny.

"Everybody's for openness, except when it comes to their own records," commented Bob Johnson, of the New Mexico Foundation for Open Government (NMFOG), an Albuquerque-based non-profit organization that strongly supports the bill.


Currently, New Mexico has one of the most restrictive - and inconsistent — set of public records law in the country. The first public records law was promulgated in 1947, and only allowed three exceptions: medical treatment records, mental examination records of persons confined to institutions and "as otherwise provided by law."

That loophole has allowed nearly 120 other exceptions to creep into the law over the years. The exceptions are scattered throughout state statutes, court rulings and administrative regulations. The current situation is so chaotic that access to documents that should be public is routinely denied simply because record-keepers are ignorant of what is public and what isn't. "They typically deny access just to be on the safe side," Johnson of NMFOG said.

H.B. 23 seeks to correct this mess by consolidating the number of exceptions into 48 separate exceptions, including life-endangering information or welfare records. The bill also provides for a uniform procedure for gaining access to public records, similar to the federal Freedom of Information Act; a procedure for people to make requests for records; timetables for responses; and financial penalties for violations.

The bill has already cleared one House committee and is scheduled to come before the House Judiciary Committee this week.

So far the bill, which was hammered out over several months last year by a task force,



has remained relatively intact. But there are several important issues that remain to be resolved, and that could seriously weaken the bill depending on how the Legislature handles them.

The questions being wrangled over include these: When should lists of candidates for government jobs, like university presidencies, become public?

The ten members of the task force, who were appointed by former Governor Garrey Carruthers and legislative leaders, deadlocked on this question, and so tacitly gave any public body the right to conduct any job search in private. However, the House Consumer and Public Affairs Committee amended the bill to require public agencies and universities to release the names of persons under consideration for a job at the point when interviews are being scheduled and references checked.

This amendment is certain to be disputed by the University of New Mexico, which conducted a closed presidential search last year and was sued by several news organizations who wanted access to records on the applicants. The court, at UNM's request, has postponed the trial until after the current legislative session.

UNM's position is that a disclosure law would discourage qualified candidates from applying. "We don't want to put higher education in New Mexico at a competitive disadvantage," Nick Estes, an attorney for UNM, said.

Should there be a ban on using public records to solicit business?

The House Consumer and Public Affairs Committee rejected an attempt to strip a pro-

vision from the bill which fines chiropractors, lawyers and auto-body-shop owners \$500 if they use accident reports or other public records to drum up business. But this issue is far from dead. For one thing, it may be unconstitutional. "Ambulance chasers may be irritating," Johnson, of NMFOG, said. "But I don't think you can selectively discriminate against how public records are used."

Under what circumstances may a business withhold commercial, proprietary or financial information?

One of the bill's answers to is when such disclosure "will cause competitive harm." Business lobbyists like Niel Pezzillo of U.S. West are trying to get the language loosened up so that businesses have more leeway. "We feel it's too restrictive right now," Pezzillo said. However, Rep. Gary King (D-Bernalillo, Torrance & Valencia), one of the bill's sponsors, has rejected an attempt to have the language changed to "may cause competitive harm" because he said it would "gut the bill."

There's a good bet that some kind of compromise language will be put in place here. One solution currently under discussion is to replace "will" with "could reasonably be expected to." But NMFOG's Johnson criticized that as too vague. "It'll just increase the likelihood of lawsuits," Johnson said.

Another issue is a concern on the part of law enforcement organizations that the bill in its current form jeopardizes people's privacy by providing too much access to police records. "Tom (Udall, the new attorney general) campaigned on open government and supports the spirit of this bill," Fred Nathan, a spokesman said. "But he does have concerns that the bill in its present form could jeopardize people's privacy. We often investigate people who turn out to be innocent. To have their names revealed publicly could needlessly damage their reputations."

Yet another point of contention is the fiscal impact of the bill. While it does not call for an appropriation, it could require state agencies to spend money hiring record custodians. But, as Johnson put it: "This bill doesn't require any state agency to do anything that they shouldn't already be doing."




