Banks offer low-cost loans for MainStreet

Five financial institutions in Ruidoso are offering low interest loans to MainStreet Ruidoso merchants who wish to enhance their properties.

Mayor Victor Alonso has written the financial institutions asking that some \$750,000 be provided for such loans to "revitalize downtown."

Offering such loans are Pioneer Savings and Trust, United New Mexico Bank, Sun World Federal Savings Bank, First National Bank and Ruidoso State Bank.

The mayor said that low interest loans encourage businesses to "invest now rather than later in projects to beautify, add parking, gain access to businesses' back doors, etc."

Search is on for shooting suspect

A State Police roadblock set up this morning in Lincoln County was part of a state-wide effort to apprehend three suspects in the shooting of State Police officer Steve Sandoval.

Three Mexican males believed to be Mexican Nationals are being sought in this area after Sandoval was shot in the shoulder about midnight at Duran, a tiny community north of Corona between Corona and Vaughn.

The officer, stationed at Vaughn, is in stable condition at University Hospital in Albuquerque according to Martha Julian, State Police dispatcher at the district office in Alamogordo.

Roadblocks were set up at Duran and north of Carrizozo near the White Oaks turnoff during the night and were being manned into this morning, police radio reports indicated.

The three subjects are armed and dangerous, State Police warn. Several vehicles had been checked out by mid-morning, but

the trio had not been apprehended by then.

The subjects were in a 1980 to 1982 black Monte Carlo. They apparently had been stopped in a routine traffic check because the taillights on the car were not working. A temporary New Mexico sticker is on the back window of the Monte Carlo.

Sandoval's two guns, a 9 mm Smith and Wesson and a Remington 870 12-gauge shotgun are missing and are presumed to be in possession of the nationals, Julian said.

After he was wounded, officer Sandoval drove himself to Vaughn and was transported to a hospital in Santa Rosa from where he was airlifted to Albuquerque.

Driver of the car is about 25 years of age, five feet, six inches in height, medium build, shoulder length hair, combed straight back.

He was wearing faded blue jeans and a red t-shirt with a pocket.

No information was available on the other two subjects.

Odds are still out on NM gambling

Bills and resolutions favoring gambling were being jockeyed from all directions during legislative meetings in Santa Fe over the weekend.

The Senate passed legislation that proposed a constitutional amendment that would provide a New Mexico state-wide lottery and video gambling in certain locations.

A separate bill expands access to video gambling for non-profit organizations.

At Sunday's session, State Representative John Underwood's constitutional amendment, House Joint Resolution 11 regarding video gaming, passed a motion to reconsider. That resolution had narrowly failed to pass by a 33-31 vote earlier in the week.

Underwood also has Bill 872 regarding video gaming that passed through House Appropriations and Finance yesterday. That bill was amended to include any local option area in New Mexico, an expansion of the bingo and raffle act, for anybody who has a liquor license and for anyone who has a hotel of 100 or more rooms.

The 100-room requirement was to ensure a substantial investment, Underwood said.

A separate lottery bill proposed by Michael Olguin, house majority leader, passed out of House Appropriations and Finance Committee yesterday and will be on the floor of the House today.

Underwood said he was hopeful the Senate would vote on both bills tomorrow and have them on the governor's desk by Tuesday. The governor would have three days to either act on it, veto the bill or it would become law.

A bill requires the governor's signature.

A resolution would leave final approval of the constitutional amendment up to the voters and the governor's signature would not be required.

Underwood said a constitutional amend-

ment would require two votes.

"First of all, people would have to vote for the constitutional amendment. And then if it is an amendment to allow local option video gaming, those villages mentioned in the constitutional amendment would have the right to pass or deny video gaming," Underwood said.

The constitutional amendment that links a state lottery and video gambling was sponsored by Senate President Pro Tem Manny Aragon, D-Albuquerque.

Underwood said the lottery is very popular statewide, with polls showing a 65-70 percent popularity with the voters. The video gaming as a statewide issue has about a 50-50 popularity. The video gaming, therefore, was tied into the popular lottery question in hopes that it would pull the gaming issue through.

Aragon said his resolution was a "once and for all" type of measure that would let the voters decide on the gambling issue that has reached the governor's desk every year since 1983.

Aragon's constitutional amendment, Senate Joint Resolution 19, restricts video gambling to hotels with at least 150 rooms or more for the resort areas of Ruidoso, Angel Fire, Sunland Park and at horse racetracks within local option districts. Those districts are unincorporated Colfax County, unincorporated Santa Fe County, the Village of Ruidoso Downs, the Village of Sunland Park and unincorporated San Juan County.

The Downs at Albuquerque is on state property at the New Mexico State Fair and does not appear to qualify.

Voters in those qualified areas would be given another chance to approve or reject video gambling after the statewide election.

Aragon's constitutional amendment passed 28-14 in the Senate and is now before the House of Representatives. If the voters ap-

prove the legislation in a statewide election, the Legislature would have to enact a lottery by statute.

The proposed legislation would not allow poker, blackjack and other Las Vegas Casino type of gambling other than electronic machines.

Supporters of the measure claim tourists would stay longer in those resorts where gambling is permitted.

Several objections to legalized gambling included "financing government with a roll of the dice," according to Senator Louis Whitlock, D-Carlsbad.

Senator Victor Marshall, R-Albuquerque, objected to restricting the gambling in certain areas to hotels with at least 150 rooms and called the proposal "one of the worst forms of special interest legislation I've seen in quite a while."

Aragon said established racetracks should be allowed to have video gambling if a lottery is approved so the tracks don't lose bettors.

"It would not be good to permit the lottery to go on without video gaming at the racetrack. It would hurt that industry and that is not my intent," Aragon said.

A bill to expand charitable bingo games by using electronic bingo machines that would be registered and taxed also passed the Senate by a 27-15 vote.

That measure raises the maximum bingo prize to \$2,500 from \$1,500 and allows progressive bingo, with jackpots that expand over several days.

The Senate also approved, 27-15, a proposal allowing non-profit organizations to sponsor video bingo games and "pull tab" games.

Federal program provides funds for small air routes

Senator Pete Domenici, R-N.M., is working to ensure that New Mexico would continue to receive its share of Essential Air Service (EAS) program funds, which are vital to the survival of commercial air service to at least 12 New Mexico cities.

"The Essential Air Service program has assured New Mexico air service to communities which could not otherwise support commercial air service," Domenici said in a news release provided by his office.

In New Mexico, the Farmington-based Mesa Air Shuttle receives in excess of \$500,000 in EAS assistance annually. Mesa provides commuter service to Alamogordo, Albuquerque, Carlsbad, Clovis, Farmington, Gallup, Hobbs, Las Cruces, Roswell, Santa Fe, Silver City, and Taos, in addition to a number of out-of-state cities.

Mesa provided service to Sierra Blanca Regional Airport for several months.

Shuttle Camp registration at the Space Center opened March 1 in Alamogordo for the 1991 summer season.

The Mercury program, designed for first time Shuttle Camp cadets in grades three and four, emphasizes "hands-on" activities in rocketry, astronomy, physics, space history, and living and working in space. Cadets visit historic space research facilities, construct and launch model rockets, eat space food, and experiment with robotics. Mercury cadets get a feel for studying the space program.

How about being a pet's foster family?

People who drop off litters of kittens and pups at the Lincoln County Humane Society without inoculations may be signing their death warrants, shelter manager Randy Basch said.

He's looking for foster homes that could temporarily house the unwanted litters and increase the animals' chances for survival.

Even if the small animals are given distemper and Parvo shots the first hour they arrive at the shelter on Gavilan Canyon, the immunities don't take effect for 10 days. And during that time period, the kittens and pups are vulnerable to the air-borne germs that can kill.

"They lie there in the shelter and are exposed to anything that a stray might bring in," Basch said.

Unfortunately, after he explains those facts to the owners, most still won't keep the small animals an extra 10 days to allow the inoculations administered by Basch to take effect.

It's not as bad during the winter when fewer litters arrive, but in the summer, Basch said he receives as many as seven litters in one day. The shelter becomes overcrowded and there is no place to isolate the pups and kittens.

The trauma to the young animals of being removed from their mothers and transferred into

a pen with concrete floors and barking animals all around adds to their distress and lessens their resistance to disease, Basch said.

"Loving care could really help," he said.

"If I had a list of homes with a secured fenced area or other suitable place for the litters, it could mean the difference between life and death," Basch said. "We do everything we can, but most often we have to put them down if we have no place for the 10 days."


Of course, the best way to avoid the suffering is to spay female animals and neuter male cats and dogs.

"It would eliminate a lot of the pain and needless deaths," Basch said. Statistics from the American Humane Society show that for every human born, 15 dogs and 45 cats come into this world.

"The excuse that a female should have one litter before being spayed is not valid," Basch said. "Most female cats and dogs can avoid a lot of health problems by not having any litters and being spayed."

Most local veterinary clinics offer lower prices if owners bring their animals on certain days and do not leave them overnight.

Bear is begging for a home of his own

A mop of gray hair obscures his eyes unless the wind or a friendly hand brushes it aside.

But Bear's charm shines through the gray shag. The three-year-old malamute/bearded collie cross has been a resident at the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter since July.

It's the second time he's stayed there.

"He came in the first time about two years ago as a stray," said shelter manager Randy Basch. "He was adopted, but the family had to move and brought him back."

Basch described Bear as extremely playful and a great com-

panion for children.

"He's very much a kid's dog. He would make a good watchdog, although he doesn't have a mean bone in his body," Basch said. Bear basically is housebroken, but occasionally has an accident. He is not neutered.

The dog also has been introduced to obedience training, Basch said. The adoption fee is \$27.50. Neutering usually runs about \$35 at weekly clinics conducted by local veterinarians.



Council calls special meeting


The Ruidoso Village Council will hear and possibly take action on a water study report presented by the Ruidoso Water Study Committee

County Farm Bureau wants to help teachers

The Lincoln County Farm and Livestock Bureau met at the El Paisano restaurant Monday evening for their monthly meeting.

James McDaniels reported there were six applicants for the "Ag in the Classroom" program. The local Farm Bureau has offered financial help to classroom teachers who wish to take the summer course at New Mexico State University. The course will be June 17-19 in Las Cruces. The teachers receive a one hour credit.

Andy Norton reported on legislation affecting agriculture. The state

land commissioner does not plan on raising grazing rates at this time.

State Engineer Julian Martinez told the Farm Bureau members in Santa Fe that New Mexico water users have problems in all four corners of the state. The Canadian River in the northeast faces claims by Texas, the San Juan Basin of the northwest area the protection of the squaw fish, Dona Anna County area litigation with El Paso and the Pecos River with agreement with Texas.

The state engineers office hoped to get an appropriation to buy up water rights in the Pecos River Valley but due to the shortage of

money they hope to get \$3-8 million dollars. Otherwise in order to pay Texas its water, Martinez said he would have no other recourse except to shut down the farmers.

Norton explained several other bills that adversely affect the agriculture segment. They include the gross receipts tax, and transfer of appointments of Secretary of Agriculture out of the hands of the New Mexico Board of Regents to the office of the Governor.

On the national level the private property law involving sod-busting and wetlands and increasing the grazing fees on public lands. Members were encouraged to contact

state legislators, congressmen and Farm Bureau lobbyist Andy Nunez.

Bill Hays announced a proposal to be presented to the County Commission Tuesday called Coalition of County Government as equal partners with federal agencies. He encouraged all who could to attend the County Commissioners meeting. The group welcomed two new directors, Duane Frost and wife Sandy, and Ronnie Merritt and wife Beverly and son, Ron of Yeso. There were 19 members and guests present.

The next meeting will be at 7 p.m. April 1, at K-Bob's Restaurant in Ruidoso.

He was 81. Since his retirement, Freeman has divided his time between his 25,000-acre ranch near Lincoln and a home in Wayne, Illinois. As president and then chairman of First National Bank of Chicago from 1960 to 1975, Freeman built the institution into an international giant. First Chicago Corporation has offices in 32 countries in 1975, when Freeman retired.

Freeman was a member of the Harvard Law School Class of 1934, and never attended business school. He was quoted as saying the reason he became a banker was that weeks of prospecting on Depression-era LaSalle Street in Chicago landed him only one job offer — at First National Bank of Chicago's legal department. Over the years, Freeman served on Presidential commissions on matters of housing, health, manpower, international trade, investment policy, productivity and the quality of life. He was a director of many corporations, including Atlantic Richfield, Northwest Industries and Bankers Life and Casualty.

Freeman grew up in Chicago, but friends said he always had a passion for ranching. That's what led him to spend a great deal of his time after retirement in Lincoln County. According to the Chicago Tribune, Freeman listed cattle magazines as one of his favorite reading materials in the 1970s. Friends said he had recently been devoting much of his time to breeding Beefmaster lean cattle, consulting daily with his ranch hands on the project, even when he was in Illinois. No funeral services were conducted for Freeman, who died of complications after vascular surgery.

Apricot blossoms welcome spring

First Apricot Bloom
This is being sent to you on March 7, a little after midday. Yesterday at ten o'clock in the morning on a sunny day with the west wind slowed down to half speed, a solitary apricot fruit bloom appeared on the west side of the little apricot tree all by itself. With its five snow white petals and golden center shining in the bright sun, it was like a tiny face smiling into the western gale singing down the Vale. On the same twig were its companion buds in all stages of opening. The same with the rest of the tree. All the way up to twelve o'clock this advance guard bloom was swinging and swaying on its twig, all by itself with many of the other buds showing crystal white in their crimson bud covers, just on the point of joining the lonely bloom in blossoming out. By mid-afternoon there were four or five new blossoms on the tree. Sending their first fruit blossom fragrance of the year into the sunny breeze. The warm weather and several days of wind had brought out the blooms fairly early. Down farther in the valley the apricot trees were in full bloom with the plums ready to



Marketing plan is important to all tourist and resort towns

Tourism injected \$2 billion into New Mexico's economy and generated 45,000 jobs in 1987, the last year for which figures are available. It also meant the state collected \$93 million in taxes on tourism expenditures that year.

"Tourism is an important part of our state's economy," said Robert O. Coppedge, New Mexico State University Cooperative Extension Service economic development project leader.

"Communities or regions hoping to cash in on tourism should develop a marketing plan to make sure they get their share of tourist dollars," he said.

Coppedge expects to release an Extension Service bulletin on the subject soon. The publication will outline 11 steps to effective tourism marketing. The activities listed are among his marketing secrets.

—Inventory your attractions.
—"Communities must know what they have to sell before they can

make tourism marketing plans," said Coppedge. Attractions may include natural, man-made, historical cultural or ethnic features; and festivals, special events or recreation opportunities.

—Assess current work toward marketing your town. Steps toward effective marketing include defining goals; identifying advertising, promotional and public relations efforts already being used; and determining whether these are successful in meeting your marketing goals. If they are not working, new campaigns can be developed.

—Conduct market research. "Certain information is vital to developing your marketing plan, including knowing your attractions, marketing trends, tourist motivations, profiles and spending habits," Coppedge said. Find out what kind of marketing other areas are doing, but remember their plans are tailored to their attributes. Other aspects of a tourism

marketing program include selecting a target market, developing goals, selecting campaign themes, choosing the most advantageous advertising outlets, using free publicity, finding funding to support the marketing plan and developing an evaluation plan to assess your marketing program.

"A marketing plan without an evaluation mechanism is like a recipe with half the ingredients left out," Coppedge said. "You've made an effort, but the end product is a flop. A good marketing plan should be a recipe for success. Planning should help you minimize problems in the marketing process."

Writing down goals helps planners identify what needs to be accomplished and weigh whether goals are reached, he said.

RHS tracksters run wild in West Texas Relays

The Ruidoso Warriors boys and girls track team had "its strongest showing ever" at the West Texas Relays, according to head track coach Ronny Maskew.

About 35 students made the 616-mile round trip to Odessa, Texas, where they competed on Friday and Saturday. The Warriors opened this year's track season February 16, in an indoor meet in Lubbock, Texas.

"We had more people qualify for the finals than we've ever had before and had some outstanding performances for this early in the sea-

son," Maskew said of the West Texas Relays showing.

There were over 1,600 high school athletes participating.

In the girls' division, Stephanie Haas finished a notable second place in the 3200-meter run. Haas ran a time of 12:09 to set a Ruidoso school record. The time was 55 seconds faster than she has ever run before.

Luisa Tam finished third, only six seconds behind Haas with an excellent time of 12:15.

Haas and Tam also qualified for the finals of the mile run. Tam finished seventh with a 5:50, Haas was ninth with a 5:55.

Missy Gosdin placed sixth in the 100-meter hurdles with a time of 17:34.

Ruidoso's new talent includes freshman Sarah Dix who long jumped 15-4.5 and missed the finals by three inches.

Maskew said the girls' relay teams did quite well with some of the school's best early season performances. He said although they didn't make the finals, he felt they were positioned well at this stage of competition.

Maskew called performances at the field events "promising" from

freshmen and sophomores he said will help the team considerably within the next few weeks.

In the boys' division, the 400-meter relay team of Kief Johnson, Tony Aguilar, Chris Torres and Jose Marquez raced its way to the finals. Although they didn't place, Maskew felt it was quite an accomplishment to make it to the finals while running against some of the larger Texas 4-A teams.

The mile relay team of Tony Aguilar, Chris Torres, Jason Dix and Chris Salas also made it to the finals. They didn't place, but Mas-

kew felt it was a fine effort against so much competition.

Torres placed seventh in the long jump hitting the sand at 19-9.5.

In the boys' 2-mile, Nick Nanz and Gilbert Kayitah winged their way to the finals with a gutsy performance. Nanz placed third with a time of 10:22, his best ever.

Kayitah finished seventh at 10:36, also his best time.

"These are very good times for these runners this early in the year," Maskew said. "This was our first meet of the year, while it was

the fourth meet for most of the Texas schools."

Kayitah and Nanz also ran their way to the finals in the mile run.

Nanz broke the 5-minute barrier with a 4:55. Kayitah finished the course in 5:02.

Maskew said the girls were pitted against all Texas 5-A schools. Ruidoso was the only smaller school at the meet.

The track team, 65-70 students strong, will not compete this weekend. Their next meet will be against New Mexico schools only on Saturday, March 23, at Carlsbad.

Tennis team tested at Alamo

The Ruidoso Warrior tennis team participated against eight other schools in Alamogordo with four players reaching the semi-finals.

Warrior tennis coach Betty O'Dell said she was very pleased with the performance by both girls and boys teams. She acknowledged that several warm weather schools had built more playing time than the Warriors this early in the season. And she was especially impressed with several new players that joined the club last week.

"This match was really encouraging for me," said the first year coach.

Cobre, Deming, Gadsden, Oñate, Las Cruces High, Mayfield, Ruidoso, Silver City and Alamogordo all participated in last Saturday's tournament.

The Warriors have four seniors on the squad; Emily Chavez and Lori Swalander on the girls' team and Mike Widener and Shane Long on the boys' squad.

Warriors top seeded girl, Jean-

nie Garcia was toppled in the first round by June Benton of Alamogordo, 5-8.

American Missionary Fellowship celebrates 200 years of service

Sunday School advocate Francis Scott Key could hardly have known that his poem would be immortalized as this country's national anthem.

He would have been just as surprised to learn that the Sunday School organization over which he presided as vice president would shape and strengthen the moral fabric of the nation he cherished.

Yet, today, Americans still sing the "Star Spangled Banner" and Key's Sunday School group, the American Missionary Fellowship, is still alive and well.

On Sunday, two centuries of the American Sunday School were celebrated as the American Missionary Fellowship, America's oldest North American mission and Sunday School organization, turned 200, according to a news release.

In Lincoln County, the American Missionary Fellowship is directed by Gregg Horst, who has been serving here for the past three years.

Horst and his wife, Staci, represent the non-denomination, independent group that offers support for new churches and serves people wherever they are.

"We try to reach out to people who have been largely ignored by other groups," said Horst of the evangelical mission of the American Missionary Fellowship.

Horst works in Lincoln, Otero, Chaves and Lea counties.

A member of the Lincoln County Ministerial Alliance, Horst rotates as chaplain in the Lincoln County Medical Center and participates in ecumenical services here.

The ministry here in Lincoln County includes the Capitan Youth group at 7 p.m. Wednesdays at the Lincoln County Fairgrounds and a men's Bible study at noon Mondays at the Pizza Hut on Mechem Drive in Ruidoso.

The Horsts lead a couple's study group at 6:30 p.m. Thursdays at the Stewart Motel in Ruidoso.

The American Missionary Fellowship, known to Francis Scott Key as the American Sunday School Union, traces its roots to the First Day Society, a Sunday School organization in 1791.

Bishop William White, minister at Philadelphia's Christ Church,

where George Washington and Benjamin Franklin worshipped, had visited England where he observed the work of Sunday School pioneer Robert Raikes. Already concerned about the number of illiterate, unchurched children in Philadelphia, he Reverend White seized on Raikes' solution and excitedly brought the idea home to America.

There he assembled a group of prominent Philadelphia Christians and challenged them with the prospect of organizing Sunday Schools.

On December 26, 1790, the charter of the First Day Society was drawn up, and on the second Sunday of March, 1791, the first two Sunday schools met in the Philadelphia area, one for boys and one for girls.

As American settlers blazed a trail westward, away from Philadelphia, American Missionary Fellowship missionaries traced a parallel path. They started Sunday schools, distributed Christian books and literature, and established Sunday school libraries. In the Mississippi Valley alone, missionaries began more than 5,000 Sunday schools and recorded more than 50,000 professed conversions to Christianity.

Along with Francis Scott Key, noted personalities such as Chief Justice John Marshall, Declaration of Independence signer Dr. Benjamin Rush, and heir to the George Washington estate, Bushrod Washington, were staunch supporters of the American Sunday School Union's ministry.

From its pioneer roots, the American Missionary Fellowship continues in the vanguard of evangelism in North America.

Today's frontiers have expanded to include the inner city, multi-cultural ministries and rural America. Modern American Missionary Fellowship missionaries still start Sunday schools, but they have broadened their church planting methods to include Bible studies, released time classes and Christian camping.

Many thousands of churches in our nation owe their origin to the American Missionary Fellowship. The mission's army of volunteers number in the millions over the span of 200 years.

"Small wonder indeed that there is cause for celebration of God's faithfulness for this outstanding heritage," concludes the news release provided by the American Missionary Fellowship.

Amateur skiers team up for race

In a repeat performance, young Lloyd Hobbs of Glencoe again skied home with a first place team trophy in the annual Businesspersons-Handicapped Ski Championship race, sponsored by Ski Apache Handicapped Ski Association (SAHSA).

SAHSA student Hobbs and his Ruidoso business teammates Carla Grover and Ronnie Hemphill skied consistent, fast individual runs for a combined time of 53.70 seconds. Hobbs was also on last year's first place team.

Only .15 of a second separated the second- and third-fastest teams. SAHSA student Val Vegara partnered Roswell businesspersons Vic Hamill and Mike Notz for a combined best time of 56.42 seconds, narrowly edging out the 56.57 seconds of SAHSA student Leonell

Parks and Ruidoso businesspersons Stan Cape and Penny Enriquez.

Fourth place trophy went to the team of SAHSA student Eddie Aguilar and Ruidoso businessperson Stuart Thompson for their 58.20 second finish.

Vegara and Aguilar were also from Roswell, while Parks is a student at the NM School for the Visually Handicapped in Alamogordo.

SAHSA skiers represent a variety of disabilities including visual, developmental, and learning, as well as polio, spina bifida and amputations. Visually disabled skiers often raced with an instructor giving oral commands or signals.

Businesspersons raced on one ski with the other leg restrained and used outriggers for balance. Outriggers are forearm crutches with short skis attached.

Each racer ran twice on the East Easy Street course with his or her better time counting for the team total.

At the awards ceremony at the Broken Ski immediately following the races, SAHSA Director Diana Persons presented team trophies as well as participation medals to the 20 SAHSA students. One student, David Barwick of Roswell, claimed the fastest individual time of the day—15.45 seconds.

Other fast individual times included Dan Wimberley's 15.80, Person's 15.81, Ron Anderson's 15.95, Jovian Smith's 15.96, Larry Brock's 17.8 and young Hobbs' 18.32.

Twenty teams competed, each team consisting of one SAHSA student and two randomly selected businesspersons.

"Caliber of racing has improved over the years," observed Person.





Right next to the Editorial, we publish an Editorial Cartoon most issues. Those cartoons present views of the various cartoonists, but don't always reflect the views of this newspaper. We try to choose cartoons that treat serious issues in a humorous way, giving our readers something to think about.

Elsewhere on the Opinion Page, you'll find the opinions of our readers. Readers views on local and regional issues, so long as they are not libelous, are printed regularly in the "Letters to the Editor" column. Letters are reviewed, approved, and, sometimes, shortened by the editor. Write us a letter; that's a great place to share your opinion and get things off your chest.

Columns, some from local columnists and some from elsewhere in the state, present the views, opinions and reflections of the individual columnists. Like the Editorial Cartoons, columns do not always reflect the newspaper view on any issue, but they give our readers yet another perspective on issues and events. Those columns, whether they agree or disagree with this newspaper's official position, are authorized, edited and printed with the editor's and publisher's approval.

In the bottom corner of the Opinion Page is the newspaper's masthead, a place, where the owner, publisher, editor and staff are listed. That's where we attach our names to our convictions.




