Ruidoso wins and loses this session

Ruidoso walked away from this year's legislative session with nearly \$340,000, but will have to once again wait until next year for a chance at video gambling.

Timing, according to State Representative John Underwood D-Lincoln County, probably spelled failure for House Resolution 19 supporting a statewide vote for a lottery and video gambling in certain resort areas.

"Factions that were previously supportive of the gaming amendment backed out of that support when bills (liquor licenses) they backed were defeated," Underwood said.

Pari-mutuel gambling for bicycle races was passed for the Indian reservation north of Albuquerque.

"This is a \$10 million expenditure of a Japanese firm interested in building a velodrome for bicycle racing. This will not only make New Mexico one of the leading training centers for world bicycle competition, but it also involves the betting on bicycle races," Underwood said. He said the approval for bicycle gambling was for that area only.

"I thought the legislators voted on issues, but that's not necessarily true. They seemed to be sending a message that if one faction got their way on one issue, they won't get their way on the next one."

Underwood said a request for \$140,000 passed to start an Eastern New Mexico University branch. He said the village received the OK to transfer the \$130,000 allocated for civic center furniture to construction, along with an additional \$39,000 for the center. Underwood also said road construction was given \$30,000.

Underwood said teacher tenure was killed in the senate, but due process passed.

"The school system now has to show that the teacher is a bad employee, rather than the teacher proving that they aren't," he said.

Underwood said that attending the legislature was the greatest thrill of his lifetime.

He said he would not do anything differently if he had an opportunity to start again.

"I would continue to give it 110 percent effort. You grow as you go, learning more and more. Hopefully, I'll become a little more savvy and know how the system works a little better each time. But there were lots of folks that didn't get any bills passed. I felt good getting three bills passed," he said.

"One of those bills, the Victor Alonso Bill, says that when petitions are filed with the village clerk, it's a done deal, names cannot be withdrawn," he said.

The other two were the uniform money claims act and the uniform money judgment act. The first allows New Mexico to enter into world trade agreements with foreign countries such as Mexico.

"If there's a dispute over a contract, the Mexican businessman would feel better about entering into a contract if they could sue in Mexico, if that is where the contract was signed, and get a judgment that would be honored in New Mexico," Underwood said.

Underwood said in the uniform money bill, if the judgment is in a foreign currency, that judgment can be enforced in that foreign currency.

Underwood said he felt both bills were important because of the large amount of Mexican business with New Mexico.

The legislative council service informally voted Underwood freshman of the year.

Attacker faces 20 years in jail

A former Ruidoso man who attacked his wife and another woman with an ax last October was sentenced to 20 years in prison Thursday.

Erwin Boyd Bartlett, 27, pleaded no contest to two counts of attempted first degree murder stemming from an incident October 4 in Ponderosa Heights when Bartlett chopped through a bedroom door. He then repeatedly struck his wife, Bobbi Bartlett, and her friend Terri McDaniels, with an ax, saying he was going to kill them.

Assistant District Attorney Viola Rhodes said Judge Richard A. Parsons of the Twelfth Judicial District sentenced Bartlett to nine years on each count of attempted murder, plus one year on each count because of Bartlett's status as a habitual offender with a previous felony conviction.

Four years of the sentence were

suspended, she said.

According to Canon Stevens from the Public Defender's office in Albuquerque, Bartlett would be eligible for parole after he has served about half of his sentence.

Bartlett was scheduled to go to trial later this week on the attempted murder charges and next week on a charge of criminal sexual penetration, a second degree felony, connected to a 1987 case.

But Rhodes said she and Bartlett's attorneys, Stevens and Gary Mitchell of Ruidoso, reached a plea and disposition agreement. The sexual penetration case has been dropped.

"I think it's probably a reasonable disposition for the state and I assume his attorneys feel it was reasonable too," Rhodes said.

She said Bartlett was scheduled to be transported to an intake facility at Grants and then sent to a state prison.

Downs village hall moves to Redmens

Ruidoso Downs trustees have authorized village attorney, Gary Mitchell, to pursue lease of the old Redmens Club for use as a village hall.

The present Municipal Building has serious structural and sewer problems because of broken lines under the concrete flooring.

Trustees haven't decided whether to abandon the old building permanently or to correct the

problems there which could cost in excess of \$35,000.

The authority to draw up a lease for the Redmens Club came at a special meeting, Thursday night.

Trustees also awarded a contract to Gentry Construction Co. of Alamogordo for building the Senior Citizens Center in All American Park.

Gentry's bid was \$114,467 plus a gross receipts tax figure of \$6,868.

Speelunkers descend on the last true wilderness

In the soft glow from a spotlight mounted on a miner's helmet, the low-slung ceiling of the cave appeared to be blotched with discolored lumps of calcite.

Moving closer in the chilly refrigeration of the limestone chamber, the brown spots metamorphosed into the hanging forms of hibernating bats, one of the most prized assets of Fort Stanton Cave.

Although the second largest known cave system in New Mexico, Fort Stanton is not a commercial enterprise as is its impressive cousin to the south, Carlsbad Caverns.

The eight mile-long series of narrow passageways and spacious chambers has attained a noble reputation among cave enthusiasts. But many longtime residents of Lincoln County have never set foot on its uneven floor — a floor that sometimes is strewn with boulders and breakdown, and often is slimy with clay still wet from a 1986 spring bath when the Rio Bonito flooded, sending some of its overflow into the crevices below.

Matt Safford hikes the arduous subsurface route at least twice a month, either counting bats or leading groups of visitors along the underground stream into the nearly lifeless environment of mineral deposits. The stream can't support fish because the rocks above filter out nutrients. Algae can't survive because no sunlight reaches beyond the entrance.

On a recent tour, Safford, a cave specialist with the Federal Bureau of Land Management (BLM), cautioned his trailing entourage to step quietly through the initial portion of the cave just beyond a locked gate.

This is the winter roost of about 1,000 Townsend big-eared bats, measuring only a couple inches in length while folded in sleep, and a few small-footed myotis bats. The section, called a cold trap, is as much as 20 degrees cooler than the rest of the cave, which maintains a constant temperature of about 54 degrees.

The cold helps induce the necessary stupor that slows down the bats' metabolism for hibernation.

"If you wake them as you pass through, they will use up some of the energy they have stored in their body fat to survive the winter," Safford explained. "The fat can't be recaptured because there aren't enough insects in the winter and insects are the primary diet of the bats."

Because their physical systems are slowed almost to a stop, the cave is nearly free of guano, bat excrement, and therefore presents no risk for the deadly lung infection that can occur in humans who explore heavily-populated bat caves. The bats hang motionless, their hook-like claws securing them to the ceiling surface.

In spring, the bats begin to leave Fort Stanton Cave and establish summer homes in other warmer caves nearby. A gate erected in the 1970s to keep vandals out was redesigned with large horizontally spaced bars to allow easier access to and from the cave for the flying mammals, which use their eyesight and sonar to avoid obstacles.

Fort Stanton's reputation also is tied to displays of rare velvet formations found in the Upper Breakdown Room, the Lake Room and the rear portions of the eight mile long cave. The origin of the crystalline coating on the cave walls and formations is unknown.

Other formations at Fort Stanton include:

—Selenite needles that grow from cave soils containing gypsum and are the result of sulfate solutions evaporating in air pockets in the cave soils. The deposit left by the evaporation grows in the easiest direction, out of the soil.

—Cave coral commonly called popcorn, the result of water seeping through rock and leaving thin films of calcite.

—Helicite, a twisting, worm-like growth from the cave ceiling, walls and floor, formed by water pressure and impurities in the water.

—Soda straw stalactite, a thin-walled, strawlike formation of calcium carbonate that grows downward from the cave ceiling and is formed by dripping water.

—Columns, the result of a stalactite (which grows downward) and a stalagmite (which grows from the floor upward) touching to create a pillar.

In areas, the cave ceiling seems full of tiny stars, the reflection of droplets of water containing gypsum.

In 1986 when the overflow from the Rio Bonito seeped into the cavern, Safford and his wife could only enter the lower chambers by using a raft.

Where a small stream trickles over rocks and mud today, the water was as deep as eight feet five years ago, Safford said.

Mud along now-exposed sections of the underground creek bed is patterned in permanent swirls, kept damp by the 90 percent plus humidity in the cave. By the end of a two-hour tour, sweat drips from underneath visitors' helmets, testimony to the cave's dampness and to the physical demands of the terrain.

Because of the dry conditions above ground, the cave is considered essentially at a stop in its formation development. But evidence of past growth is visible from the very first "wet" section. Small "curtains" of mineral deposits line the ceiling as do thousands of baby stalactites. Star burst crystal formations are splattered across the ceiling before entering Crystal Crawl, a hands and knees corridor.

The mud and gravel beneath visitors' feet were left thousands of years ago, the gravel from fast moving water and the mud in times of slower streams.


Over half of the formations at the end of Crystal Crawl have been vandalized. But other than human-caused damage, the formations inside the cave remain largely un-

changed for thousands of years because they are not subject to the forces of wind and rain that rule on the surface.

Safford stopped his group at the top of Twenty Steps breakdown to rest and to experience the phenomenon of total darkness, an absence of light so complete, the human eye could never adjust. The only sounds disturbing the blackness were the labored breathing of the non-hikers and the distant dripping of water that had found its way through the earth above to add its minerals to the cave below.


Given the slightest encouragement, Safford will strike a match to a modern-day version of the candle lanterns used by early explorers in the cave. And he will recount tales of ghosts, dressed in turn-of-the-century costume, who stroll the passages and lead lost cavers to safety.

The only other residents of the cave besides the ghosts and the bats are a few insects. The most permanent is the Dipluran, which lives in the back part of the cave and is similar to a silverfish, Safford said. It has adapted to the darkness by developing feelers on both ends of its body and by turning pale white, losing its eyesight fine tuning all of its other senses.

Fort Stanton, the structure above ground, was established in 1855. That was the same year, soldiers first entered the cave, Safford said.

"We know the Indians knew about it long before that," he said. "There is plenty of evidence outside and around the entrance, but none inside the cave itself."

Entered by a sinkhole formed when underground water retreated and the overburden of soil collapsed, Fort Stanton Cave lies at about 6,160 feet above mean sea level.

A confrontation between local Indians and soldiers gave birth to the notion that there may be a second entrance to the cave, but it has never been found, Safford said.

"The soldiers were chasing renegade Indians and followed them up the canyon," he said. "They saw the Indian horses tied up by the cave entrance and camped outside for several days thinking they would starve them out."

"But either the Indians knew a second entrance or they never went into the cave, because the soldiers later saw them heading for their

horses." The cave formed below the water table in a series of cracks, or faults, and its passages intersect at angles. The passages were later enlarged by running water. As the water receded in places, some areas collapsed, called breakdowns. But the cave is considered stable, Safford said. The last breakdown of any consequence probably occurred 1,000 years ago.

But mounds of breakdowns litter the floor, mini mountains that must be climbed to reach subsequent sections of the cave.

Visitors may elect to keep it simple by confining their tour to the front section of the cave, or they can crawl 800 feet to the more spectacular back sections. Experienced cavers in good physical condition may even venture through Hell Hole and into passages beyond.

The first serious exploration of Fort Stanton Cave occurred in 1877 when the Wheeler Expedition discovered Hellhole and the Lower Breakdown Passage, Safford said. The members completed one of the first instrument surveys of a cave in the United States.

The Great Divide Expedition of 1891 did more to popularize the cave. The newspaper-sponsored group painted a vivid chronicle of adventure for its readers.

Tuttle Wingfield from El Paso left his name behind in 1889 and graffiti added by more recent groups mar some of the walls.

In 1956, cavers penetrated Three-Way Hill, discovered the Keyhole, and a series of large, well-decorated passages beyond. But essentially the known cave today is the same as that surveyed by the Wheeler Expedition.

"Now cavers would only find new passages after digging," Safford said. "When you see a pile of breakdown, you figure the passage continues behind it."

Most of the exploration and surveying is being done by private cavers working with the BLM. The agency encourages research by state universities, Safford said. But recreation remains the

major use of the cave.

Safford said more than 400 cavers a year tread Fort Stanton's passages. The BLM considers its job is to provide undeveloped caves for recreation in contrast to areas such as Carlsbad, which is highly developed for use by tourists.

"An undisturbed, undeveloped cave is the only true wilderness left," Safford said. Even the peace of the Alaskan back-country or Amazon forest can be broken by the roar of a jet, he pointed out.

No one has died as a result of an accident in Fort Stanton Cave, Safford said. But visitors should come well-prepared with a hard hat, several sources of light, boots with gripping soles, a light jacket or long-sleeve shirt and knee pads for those who plan to tackle the crawl passages. Water and a high energy food, gloves and a watch are optional. Wear old clothes, or an outfit that can survive several layers of mud.

All trash must be carried out. Trips can range from short tours to explorations of more than 20 hours.


Slippery surfaces, fatigue and poor physical conditioning are the major problems encountered by most visitors, according to a brochure on the cave published by the bureau.

"All breakdown piles are very unstable and cavers who dig or crawl in these areas face greatly increased dangers of entrapment, serious injury or death," the brochure states.

The cave is situated inside a locked and fenced enclosure on Fort Stanton Reservation about 6.5 miles between Lincoln and Capitan on State Highway 380. Restroom facilities are located near the cave.

Permits are required to enter the cave. They must be requested by mail or in person by contacting the BLM at 1717 W. Second, Box 1397, Roswell, NM 88201. Allow at least 10 days for processing.

Safford said trespassers on BLM land and persons who remove objects or vandalize can be fined up to \$10,000.

EDCLC will be in tandem with the Business Quarter.
Attendance at that show is one of the highlights of a preliminary first quarter report prepared by the EDCLC staff for directors and the county commission.

A quarterly report for the final quarter of 1990 also was submitted to the board of directors at Thursday's regular meeting.

The preliminary report shows one new member, Dr. Robert A. Walters, psychologist, was added in January.

Dorothy Smith of Capitan reminded board members of a fund-

raiser scheduled April 15 in the all-purpose room at Capitan High School.

The event is to raise funds to promote the celebration planned for the 50th anniversary of the U.S. Forest Service and Smokey Bear's tie-in with that anniversary.

Entertainment will include a skit about Smokey Bear by high school students, music by the Flying J Wranglers and other events including a barbecue beef plate meal.

Tickets will be available in Ruidoso at the Chamber of Commerce and at the EDCLC offices on the third floor of the Stroud Building.

During the meeting, Ronnie Paulger, president, presented Don Shaw with a plaque and gave for his service to EDCLC since its inception. Shaw is immediate past

president, past prospects committee chairman and past vice president.

Shaw and his wife are moving to Springer where he will be a bank president.

Shaw told directors in a letter of resignation that "this group took an impossible dream and made it happen."

Directors agreed to contact Governor Bruce King to oppose portions of Senate bills 315 and 591 which, they say, would take revenue away from small towns.

"Some businesses in Capitan are barely hanging on. I wonder what we will do?" Smith asked.

George Puckett, executive directors of EDCLC, said Richards Puzzles has moved its manufacturing equipment here and will be operating out of the Warp Speed building on Mechem.

Sample puzzles are on display at

the EDCLC offices.

Puckett reported on several trips he, assistant director Anita Sanders and Mayor Victor Alonso made for EDCLC.

John Krebs, formerly the manager of the Economic Development Department of Southwestern Public Service Co., has been named deputy director of the New Mexico Economic Development and Tourism Department, Puckett reported.

Puckett said lack of air service remains one of the most serious problems facing economic development in Lincoln County.

"We'll do anything we can to help," he said of current efforts to set up air service.

Directors approved a financial report and minutes of the last meeting.

Miniature dog will trade love for home

When the board member of the Lincoln County Humane Society first saw her, the three-year-old dog was dodging cars down the middle of Mechem Drive.

"She's good with kids and other dogs," Basch said. "And she even gets along well with cats."

He hasn't given her a name. That will be up to the person or family who adopts her.

The dog is miniature size. Her

coat had to be cut in back because it was badly knotted.

"She'd obviously been outside a long time," Basch said.

But once she's adopted, that can be remedied quickly.

Alison Walstad and Judy Blakeney of Hondo Valley Kennels have offered to give one free grooming to dogs adopted from the shelter. The new owners must bring the adoption papers with them.

The adoption fee at the shelter is \$27.50 and females should be spayed unless a veterinarian recommends otherwise. Most local veterinary clinics offer lower rates on certain days and if owners are willing not to leave the animals overnight.

Request and justification forms can be picked up at village hall.



Affordable hospital care is LCMC goal



Patients admitted to hospitals today are those who need the most expensive care. As our society ages and the shift to outpatient care continues, patients in hospital beds are

the very sickest, and they need more highly trained workers to care for them.

Costs of the goods and services hospitals buy have outstripped general inflation. Salaries, for example, have risen rapidly as hospitals compete with other employers to recruit and retain nurses and other professionals in short supply. And hospitals are more labor-intensive than most other industries.





Spring will reach us on March 20, and certain messengers are arriving day by day—a little cautious and careful this year, foreshadowing fairly late Spring weather.





History features bring back memories

We just received the February 18, 21 and 25, editions of The News. This is common; we generally do get three or four at a time, then we play catchup.

I was particularly interested in two. The first, February 18, had an article and picture about the Children's Home. I would like to correct the date, you were off about 20 years. The rather dour looking lady in the cloche seated in the center of the second top step is my grandmother, Lula (Mrs. Ike) Wingfield. The small towheaded boy standing directly in front of her is my uncle, Ike Leslie Wingfield. He drowned in Elephant Butte Lake in August 1939 at age 14, so that would date the picture in the summer of '29 or '30. I also have copies of it.

I was puzzled at Ms. Silver's description and memories of the Home until I realized that she was Jewish. She must have been miserable; her situation today would compare to an Arab child in a Jewish summer camp.

Southwestern Children's Home was started by Mr. and Mrs. Victor Moore in their large private home in El Paso as a Christian home for children. This grew over the years until the institutional home was built on Altura Boulevard.

I also spent a summer, 1939, in the Home, but my memories are much different. First, few of us were true orphans, most were like me, with one living parent. This was in the days before Aid to Dependent Families and Social Security benefits to children. Another major reason was POLIO; remember, this was before the Salk vaccine and summer was always a time of much worry for families who lived in the hot country.

I remember the Bible drills, but this was

just like those held in all Sunday schools and what you would expect in a Christian Home. The summer home was much like Boy Scout or Girl Scout camp, summer camps were pretty rustic in the '30s and '40s. So were a lot of homes! But that is where I learned to skip rope and play jacks, the "Big girls" — eight and nine years old — taught us. We built play houses under the pines in the Southwest corner, the boys' area was the Southeast corner. It wasn't perfect, of course, but not bad. The big excitement that summer was the big forest fire in which a CCC boy was killed.

Yes, it was regimented, all boarding schools are. I spent the winter of 1940-41 in a Catholic school, Loretto Academy in Las Cruces, and we were expected to do things at a certain time I was seven then and probably as homesick as Ms. Silver and her brother. But I discovered that it wouldn't kill me to make my bed, dress in a navy blue uniform and long brown cotton lisle stockings (ugh) and go to Mass every morning before breakfast, even though I was a Methodist. I don't know if it did me any good, but I didn't jump for joy when the school was torn down for a shopping center.

The second story, which I enjoyed, was in the February 25 issue in which the teacher

Alice Traylor was my first teacher in 1939. She taught primary (which was kindergarten), first and second grades. I'm not sure that there was a doctor in town then. I remember falling during recess and Dick Traylor took me to Fort Stanton to have my knee stitched up. I also attended third grade in Ruidoso, 1941-'42. It seems there were several different teachers, the only one I can recall was Nell Crain Parks. My brother, Buck Morrison, attended a lot more in Ruidoso. I didn't return until the high school was built in 1947, and then graduated with the second class in 1949.

Herbert Lee Traylor was principal at Nob Hill when our children started school. I have copies of some of the pictures he mentioned. Mother and Aunt Opal both attended the school in the Gateway when Mrs. Tod Browning taught. Did anyone mention that School House Park, where the library and swimming pool are, was named for that school and not the ones built in the '40s and '50s?

Mother, Della Wingfield Hale, also taught a couple of years before she married, about 1930-3. Blair Halladay and Constance Ward were two of her students.

I laughed aloud reading Marie Rooney's stories; I remembered a lot of funny things and I could just hear her mother laughing. Jack and Mack Hull built the bowling alley and had a cafe in what was Bill Britt's drugstore across the street from my grandparents' home, which is now the Blue Goose. They were both town boosters, but Mack was a wonder. She had such an infectious, happy personality.

Thank you for a great article. While I don't agree with all of them, obviously, I do appreciate Diane Stallings' efforts to give us a little of Ruidoso's history.

TO THE EDITOR:

Cree Meadows Resort and Country Club is alive and well. Doing rather nicely, as a matter of fact, after five years of membership operations. The "grand old man" of local golf courses continues to offer challenging golf, along with excellent lounge and restaurant facilities for the enjoyment of visitors, local residents and over 400 members.

The addition of the Links at Sierra Blanca to the local golfing scene, joining Cree Meadows and the Inn of the Mountain Gods, gives Ruidoso a variety of courses available to the public that will attract more visitors to the area. Cree Meadows welcomes the new course and wishes it much success because we believe that it will help us to be more successful also.

A recent letter to The News commented on the green fees at the Links and the cost of golfing in the area. Without going into lengthy

details concerning the costs of maintaining a golf course here in the mountains, expenses such as labor, equipment repair parts, fertilizer, water and other supplies add up to a significant amount of overhead. Add to this the amortization of the large capital investment to construct the course, plus depreciation of the equipment and taxes, and the operating expenses are sizable. Most of the play takes place in a relatively short season (only six months or less for the peak numbers of vacationers) and this requires fees that will assure that the operations generate an acceptable profit. There is no such thing as a "free" lunch.

Equating the green fees for a seasonal mountain course with those of a municipal course in a metropolitan area is not possible. The mountain environment requires that a course with blue grass fairways and bent grass greens be well cared for all year or it won't

last very long as a playable facility. On the other hand, a municipal course near sea level, in a warmer climate, with Bermuda grass fairways and greens can survive with much less care. Many city courses are operated at minimum expense to keep the green fees low and the quality of the course and the equipment shows this clearly. There are exceptions, of course, but take a close look at several municipal courses with \$10 green fees and compare them to the local courses.

If you are looking for low-cost golfing, Cree Meadows has memberships available that make it very affordable for full-time residents. Drop by the clubhouse and talk to General Manager Norman Smith or PGA Professional Jack Warlick about a membership for yourself and your family. We have a lot to offer at a very low cost.


