It's that time: spring cleanup

Spring Clean Up '91, Ruidoso's annual village cleaning before summer tourists flood the town, will run from Saturday, April 13, through Saturday, April 20.

Village manager Ron Wicker on the recommendation of Councilor J.D. James will head this year's clean up campaign, an annual service to the community that offers free waste disposal.

Wicker said he welcomed all interested service organizations that want to commit to cleaning certain areas of the city.

"Boy scouts, girl scouts, any of the sororities or service clubs that would like to get involved should call this year's coordinator Judith Word at 257-4116. Word is also the secretary for the Ruidoso Fire Department."

Wicker said alternative telephone numbers to call are village hall at 258-4014 or 258-4343 or the solid waste department, 257-4090.

Wicker said this year there will be two major collection sites, the chamber of commerce parking lot and the village hall parking lot. Both areas will have a collection area on April 13 and April 20.

Wicker said a city employee or representative will be at those locations with a flat bed truck or flat bed trailer and dumpsters.

Wicker said there will be restrictions about what could be placed in the dumpsters. No heavy items, like refrigerators, would be permitted. Normal type of trash including construction debris, other than commercial construction debris, or yard clean up material can be placed in the dumpsters.

Residents who want a special trash pick up during or before cleanup week, all they have to do is call the solid waste department and the department will schedule a pick up during that week for them.

Glasnost leads to art exchange

Glasnost has found its way to Ruidoso Downs through the Hubbard Art Award for Excellence.

When the second annual award and show weekend opens May 31, works by five Soviet artists will be shown right along with the 52 pieces presented by the American artists nominated for the art award.

Joan Dale and R.D. Hubbard of Ruidoso, already major collectors of American realistic art, established the Hubbard Museum and the Art Award for Excellence in 1989 to honor the genre of American realism. The \$250,000 cash award is the largest in the world, and supports an annual competition the Hubbards set up in the tradition of the Nobel and Pulitzer prizes.

"Last year the Hubbard Art Award for Excellence show and gala celebration were met with even more enthusiasm than expected," said R.D. Hubbard.

"Our roster of 1991 participating artists is, if possible, even more exciting than last year's."

The first Hubbard Art Award for Excellence drew international attention, and was enhanced by a successful sale of contest arts. Before that multi-million dollar contest exhibition was packed for a world tour that included Russia and Germany, plans were in the works for this year's show.

Even with the spirit of Glasnost and the thaw in relations between the US and USSR, working out an agreement was no simple matter. Mr. Hubbard called on officials

in Washington D.C. to help work out complicated details for the unprecedented Russian show and exchange. The months of negotiations ended February 1990 when Hubbard and Tair Salakhov, first secretary of the Union of Artists of the USSR, met in Washington D.C. to sign an agreement for a unique cultural exchange between the United States and Soviet Union.

Hubbard initiated the exchange with a request for a host museum in Russia to display the art award works, and he in turn welcomed the nomination of five Soviet Union artists who work in the genre of realism to exhibit in the 1991 Hubbard Art Award for Excellence.

His efforts were welcomed by Salakhov, whose Union of Artists oversees art in a country that has more than 20,000 artists.

"Peace can only be furthered by this exchange between our two great countries," said Secretary Salakhov, who attended the 1990 Hubbard Art Award for Excellence events.

Senators Pete Domenici and Robert Dole offered their support to the project.

"I am very pleased to once again contribute my support to the remarkable efforts of the Hubbard Museum to foster international goodwill and spread the beauty and enchantment of New Mexico worldwide," said Domenici.

"The Hubbard Museum is one of the nation's finest centers of art.

County auctions land for tax liens

About 60 parcels of land in Lincoln County are scheduled to be sold April 9 for delinquent taxes.

Owners who have allowed their property tax payments to lapse for more than three years have until sale time to pay delinquencies if they want to keep their property, said County Treasurer Janice Silva DuBose.

The New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department will auction delinquent properties at the courthouse at 9 a.m., according to Department Secretary Dick Minzner.

The county will receive the tax, penalty and interest from the proceeds of the sale to be funneled to county and school district operations.

Amounts generated in excess of the tax, penalty and interest will be returned to the former owners, he said.

DuBose cautioned potential bidders to inspect property before bidding on it and to check for liens that might have to be paid.

"The land could be on a cliff somewhere," she said, although

most of the property is situated in Ruidoso, Alto and Ruidoso Downs, and most are vacant lots.

"We started out with 128 parcels advertised," DuBose said. "But after the legal notice appeared in the newspapers, the taxes on all but 61 have been paid up. By the time of the sale, that number will be even lower. Last year, we ended up auctioning 21 parcels and the year before, it was less."

The 61 parcels represent \$67,297.98 in delinquent taxes and penalties, she said.

Once the property is sold, the state will issue a tax deed to the new owner, DuBose said. At that point, it is too late for the previous owners to redeem the property by paying the tax debt.

They can challenge the sale in court for a period of two years, but they would have to prove that either the land should not have been subject to a tax sale or that all taxes had been paid before the sale, she said.

A list of the delinquent properties is available at her office in the courthouse and maps may be obtained in the assessor's office.

USFS is looking for a few good ideas

More national attention and more money may translate to improved recreational opportunities in the Lincoln National Forest.

Fred Roeder of the U.S. Forest Service said this week that over the next few years, the public should see a renewed emphasis on recreation in response to President George Bush's initiative, "America's Great Outdoors."

"I don't know exactly how much money will be available for the national forests, but we're already seeing a difference," Roeder said. "We have more money available for trail maintenance and construction."

That's quite a contrast to the pattern of underfunding that has developed over the past 10-15 years, he said.

"Many recreation facilities, campgrounds and trails have been neglected because of lack of funding," Roeder said.

"Unless Congress shuts off the initiative, we hope to get a lot more money for recreation projects,"

Roeder said. Public attitudes have been changing, he said.

"I think the President and Congress have sensed that change," Roeder said. "There's a feeling that in the past the forest service placed too much emphasis on grazing and timber cutting on public land. The public wants more developed campgrounds. They want improvements so there is access for more than just the rugged outdoorsman. They want access for the handicapped, they want running water and restrooms."

His office in Alamogordo is looking for public input on how and where the anticipated money should be spent.

The federal forest service is proposing that more than a half-billion dollars be expended over the next three years for recreation facilities, special-designation areas, interpretation and environmental education. Roeder wants to be sure the Lincoln National Forest receives its fair share.

He emphasized that the initiative will not just speed up existing plans for the forest around Ruidoso and areas to the south, it will add entire new projects.

"We know as New Mexico grows, so does the need for diverse recreational opportunities," said Forest Supervisor Lee Poague. "The forest must be ready to accommodate recreational needs as they emerge. To accomplish this, we are amending our forest plan."

Some of the exciting prospects for the Lincoln Forest include: construction and reconstruction of campsites, trails and facilities like an amphitheater in Cloudfcroft; enhancement of Sitting Bull Falls on Guadalupe Ranger District and Rio Bonito Recreation Area on Smokey Bear Ranger District; management of the Forest's unique caves, archaeological and historic sites; trail construction in the Sacramento mountains on the Mayhill Ranger District.

Planning for wheelchair-bound and other disabled visitor access to

recreation has special consideration as does expansion of environmental education in communities adjacent to the Lincoln, he said.

"It will take more than the work force of the Lincoln National Forest to get the job done," Poague said. "We invite everyone to be a partner in helping us reach the highest level possible in recreation improvement."

Roeder said the service would like to get involved in cost sharing projects with local government entities. Improving the campground at Rio Bonito and the route along Pennsylvania Trail are two candidates.

The service hopes to beef up its staff to meet the heavier emphasis on recreation and to handle the design of new recreation projects, he said.

Council will take another look at plans

Managing and marketing the new Ruidoso Civic Events Center will be discussed at a special meeting of the village council at 10 a.m. Tuesday, April 2, in the Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center.

The meeting is to be a joint workshop session between the council and the lodgers tax committee.

The council will also discuss the design plans for the center. Councilor Ron Andrews, during the last village council workshop, inquired about the architects' failure to meet three center construction deadlines. The architects have asked the council for more fee money because the cost of the center is approaching \$2-million dollars, substantially higher than when they first took the job.

A special committee was appointed by the council about a month ago to make recommendations about marketing the center. It is expected that the committee's findings will be one topic of discussion.

Several committee members and organizations have expressed a desire to head the marketing of the new facility.

Welfare cases are up in Lincoln County

The number of people on public assistance in Lincoln County and New Mexico has reached an all-time high, mirroring nationwide trends, state officials say.

Caseloads for the Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) in Lincoln County jumped by 30 percent to 153 client families from February 1990 to the same month this year. The number of food stamp households increased by 26 percent to 570.

The state lagged slightly behind the county percentage with a 25 percent hike in AFDC, representing 23,694 families.

The number of food stamp households in New Mexico in February was 64,121, close to a record of 64,646 set during the 1981 recession, said Dick Heim, secretary of the state Human Services Department.

"If present trends continue, we anticipate food stamp cases will soon reach an unprecedented high as well," Heim said.

Mary Crenshaw, former supervisor of the Lincoln-Otero county of-

vice of the state Income Support Division of Human Services, said local caseworkers have seen a steady increase in their load since last fall.

"Our caseloads are right at close to 300 for each worker," Crenshaw said. "We've been told that 180 is what it is supposed to be."

She attributed some of those extra cases to additional Medicaid categories put under the office's jurisdiction.

"The state added Medicaid categories for pregnancy care and medical care for children. That's increased a lot, especially because the children are eligible longer than they used to be," she said. Those categories are tied to an increase in teen-age pregnancy and single mother families.

In 1985, the office in Lincoln County was closed and its cases were handled in Alamogordo. But the office was reopened in September 1987 with two caseworkers. Less than four years later, there are four employees in the office and a caseload of nearly 900, representing the two counties.

"From what they tell us, the

same thing is happening statewide," Crenshaw said. "I think the State Legislature approved 25 new positions and that will help."

Because of its racetrack and tourist industry, the Ruidoso area sees a significant surge of cases in the summer, Crenshaw said. "But there's still plenty of cases after they leave in the fall."

The number of food stamp and AFDC caseloads nationally has shown an upward trend over the last year, with AFDC rolls hitting a record high of 4.2-million families in December 1990. From November 1989 to the same month a year later, nearly two million more households in the United States received food stamps, Heim said.

"No one has been able to pinpoint a single cause," he said. "Overall, most everyone agrees it is probably the sluggish economy."

That sluggishness is reflected in Lincoln County's unemployment rate of 7 percent, up nearly one full percentage point from January 1990 to January 1991, according to Jerry Bradley of the State Department of Labor.

While the number of unemployed has gone up from 375 to 429, the county's total labor force has dwindled from 6,157 in 1990 to 6,128 in 1991.

In New Mexico, Heim said some areas of the state are experiencing layoffs and the unemployment rate has hit 7.2 percent.

"As a result, we are seeing a lot of new applicants," he said.

Ed Baca, public information officer for the state Human Services Department, said some families are on multiple forms of assistance.

"They may come in to sign up for one program like AFDC, but see that they may also be eligible for food stamps and check that box too," Baca said.

The growth has caused a strain on the Human Services staff. The average caseload per worker now is up to 250. In one Albuquerque office, the average is slightly more than 300, Baca said.

The American Public Welfare Association is conducting a national study to determine causes of caseload growth. Results of the survey are expected later this spring.

Last year's Hubbard Art Award for Excellence was a great success, and this year's emphasis will add even more excitement. I am particularly pleased that five Soviet artists will join an international tour to Japan and the Far East," he added.

"The Hubbard Museum's continuing efforts are breathing new life into the artistic community in New Mexico and worldwide."

Dole said the Hubbard Art Award marks an important cultural exchange and presents a unique opportunity to view and appreciate the works of artistic masters from the Soviet Union.

"Dee and Joan Dale Hubbard deserve recognition for their tireless efforts to make this special event a reality," he said.

Governor Bruce King also had words of praise for the Hubbards and their contributions to the arts.

The Union of Artists of the USSR coordinated the selection process that narrowed the slate of nominees to 10. The five finalists were selected by the body of the Secretariat based on their works and their backgrounds.

The five artists will travel to Ruidoso in May and will attend the Second Annual Hubbard Art Award for Excellence May 31, June 1 and June 2.

The Russian art will be for sale along with the works of the 52 American artists. Each artist will be displaying two original pieces during the event.

"The addition to this already extraordinary event, of the five representational artists from the Soviet

Union, reveals our dedication to the genre of realism," said Hubbard.

"Joan Dale and I are exhilarated by this unique cultural exchange among our three magnificent countries — the United States, the Soviet Union and Japan."

The 1991 art award show, along with one piece from each of the five Russian artists, will then go on an international tour to the Far East.

John V. Hall, director of the Hubbard Art Award, is just back from a trip to Japan where he has been setting up the venue for that part of the 1991 show.

"It is our greatest wish to honor realism artists throughout the world and to give them the recognition that we so adamantly feel they deserve for their talents," added Hubbard.

Howard Terping, winner of the first annual Hubbard Art Award for Excellence, will also take part in this year's exhibition, and welcomes the inclusion of international artists.

"Mr. and Mrs. Hubbard are bringing the works of representational artists from around the country together in one show for the second time, and now there will also be five excellent artists from the Soviet Union participating," said Terping.

"We all learn and grow from each other and this exhibition provides us all with the opportunity of a lifetime to do both," he added.

The Union of Artists announced that the five Soviet artists are Guri Zakharov, Alexander Belashov, Oleg Komov, Afanasi Osipov and Tair Salakhov.

Zakharov, a graphic artist, was born in Zimry in 1926. He gradu-

ated from the Moscow Higher Arts College, formerly Stroganov College, and frequently participates in the Republican and All-Union Art Exhibition in Moscow, as well as in exhibitions and one-man shows abroad.

His works can now be seen in the Tretyakov Art Gallery in Moscow, the Russian Museum in Leningrad and many other major museums throughout the world.

Alexander Belashov, a sculptor, was born in Leningrad in 1933. He graduated from the Moscow Higher


Arts College and exhibits in the Soviet Union, Germany, Hungary and the U.S. His works can be seen at the Tretyakov Art Gallery and

many other major museums.

Oleg Komov, also a sculptor, was born in Moscow in 1932, and still lives in that city. In 1957, he graduated from the Surikov Art Institute in Moscow and went on to become a member of the USSR Academy.

Afanasi Osipov, a painter, was born in the mountain region of Yakutsk, Siberia, in 1928. After graduating from the Surikov Art Institute in 1955, Osipov has exhibited in Moscow, Bulgaria, France, Germany, Hungary, India and Sweden.

Salakhov, who will be making his second trip to Ruidoso for the Hubbard Art Award, was born in Baku in 1928, and presently lives and paints in Moscow.

Cats crowd shelter

All the cages in the feline house at the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter are occupied.

Twenty-eight cats are in residence and it isn't even the busy season.

They range from a ginger tabby kitten to mature and more exotic-looking tortoiseshell and Siamese varieties. Some sport luxurious long hair, others much shorter fur.

But they share a common goal. They need safe, loving homes.

HiYo, a smoky gray neutered male, was brought into the shelter three months ago as a stray. He was nicknamed by the staff after the old "Hi Ho Silver" salute by the Lone Ranger to his horse.

Shelter manager Randy Basch estimates that HiYo is about three year old.

"He obviously was an owned cat," Basch said. "I waited an extra week to put him up for adoption because I kept thinking someone would show up looking for him. But no one has and after this much time, it probably means they didn't really want him."

Basch described HiYo as a very people-oriented cat. He's looking for an owner who would keep the litter box-trained HiYo inside.

The difference in life expectancy for an indoor versus an outdoor cat is 16 years compared to three years, he said.

"One of the problems with an adult cat is that they tend to have more difficulty adapting to a new environment, even up to three months after an adoption," Basch said. "It's imperative that the new owners keep an eye on them. If

they get loose, they're very territorial and could head back to their original area."

He also reminded cat owners that the county's leash law applies to cats as well as dogs. It is against the law for them to roam without restraint.

HiYo can be adopted for \$20 since he already is neutered.

The shelter is initiating a new fee system. It no longer will charge an adoption fee, but to insure that new owners follow through on neutering and spaying, those fees will be charged at the time of adoption.

"We've had too many litters brought back here from animals that were adopted," Basch said. "That just defeats the whole purpose of trying to control the cat and dog population to reduce the suffering and deaths."

Each adopted animal will have been inoculated against rabies for a charge of \$7.50 and will be issued a city license at \$5 for dogs and \$2.50 for cats.

New owners will pay the neuter fee and will be given certificates to present to local veterinarians, who will bill the society for the procedure after it is completed.

The charge, under the special arrangement, will be \$45 for a female dog, \$35 for a male dog or female cat and \$18 for a male cat.

The total charges for shots, licenses and neutering will be: \$57.50 for female dogs, \$47.50 for male dogs, \$45 for female cats and \$28 for male cats. If the animal already has been neutered, that fee, which is the major cost, would be deducted.

Doyle Jordan

Former Ruidoso resident Doyle Jordan died at his Lubbock, Texas, home last week after a brief illness. He was 81.

Memorial services were conducted Tuesday at Trinity Church with the Reverend Randal Ross, pastor, officiating. Burial was in City of Lubbock Cemetery.

Jordan had been under hospice care.

Jordan was born in Elgin and moved to Lubbock in 1928 to attend Texas Tech University. He married Ada Ruth May June 28, 1932, in Lubbock.

He was employed by Firestone for 20 years before working for

Fuelwood areas open today

The Smokey Bear Ranger District will open several areas of the Lincoln National Forest today (Monday) for area residents to gather fuelwood for personal use.

A permit, showing the designated area, must be in the possession of those gathering fuelwood. Removal of fuelwood when soil conditions are wet resulting in soil disturbance violates the terms of the permit. The wood could be seized and a violation citation issued.

The Divide North area, that was

a green wood section last year, will be a dead and down area with no permit charge. Tops and limbs primarily are available there.

A second down and dead area will open later this spring, but permits will cost \$10 per cord.

The Jacob Fuelwood section offers standing green trees at no permit charge, but removal is limited to two cords per household. The trees in that area generally are smaller than those in the fee areas.

This is a trial project aimed at

creating openings where grasslands have been invaded heavily by piñon and juniper trees. The goal is to provide more forage for livestock and wildlife, which is the management emphasis for the area under the Lincoln Forest Plan.

Maps of the open areas and fuelwood permits are available at the district office at 901 Mechem in Ruidoso. The office is open from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.



Meanwhile let us give thanks for a joyous Easter and all our other many blessings.





Handicapped must acquire new placards

Handicapped persons will be pleased to know that the Motor Vehicle Division (MVD) of the Taxation and Revenue Department is now issuing new versions of both temporary and permanent Handicap Parking Placards.

The current parking placards will expire July 1, according to Motor Vehicle Division director Frank Mulholland.

The MVD issues Handicap Parking Placards only to individuals who have a medical disability that makes walking difficult. Persons with other medical infirmities or elderly persons who do not have problems walking do not qualify for the Handicap Parking Placard.

Those who do qualify can obtain a placard that is transferable to any vehicle and that will allow them to park in designated handicap parking zones.

The MVD has designed two easy-to-use placards that conform to federal standards and are recognized and accepted in all North America.

In Lincoln County, the placards can be obtained at the MVD office on the lower level in the Stroud Building in Ruidoso. Or, they may be ordered from the Vehicle Services Bureau, P.O. Box 1028, Santa Fe, NM 87504-1028.

Programs for Indians outlined

The administrator of the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) has directed the leaders of the agency's major programs to develop plans to improve services to native Americans living on reservations.

Administrator Susan Engeleiter says she has issued a directive requiring that each program complete its plan by the end of the year.

"The purpose of this directive is to promote the growth of tribally owned businesses around the country and to improve the success rate for businesses owned by individual native Americans," Engeleiter said.

The SBA operates a wide range of programs for small businesses, including technical training, busi-

ness counseling, loan guarantees, surety bond guarantees and help obtaining federal contracts.

Engeleiter said that Indians who live on or near reservations suffer from a 40 percent unemployment rate, with most workers earning less than \$7,000 per year.

Yet, SBA's statistics show that native Americans don't participate in the agency's programs, which could be used to spur economic development on reservations, Engeleiter said. In fiscal year 1988, she said, the SBA issued more than 17,000 loan guarantees for small businesses, but only 98 went to enterprises owned by native Americans.

Employers must report comp facts

During the past week, forms on which New Mexico employers will be required to report the Workers' Compensation Personnel Assessment Fee were mailed.

The New Mexico State Legislature reformed the Workers' Compensation Act last September, and the provisions of the new law became effective January 1, 1991.

The requirements governing payment and application of this act have been changed. Employers will be required to report and remit the Workers' Compensation Assessment Fee on a quarterly basis, and these reports will be due by the last day of the month following the end of the quarter. Questions regarding forms should be directed to the New Mexico Taxation & Revenue Department in Santa Fe, or to your local Taxation & Revenue Department district office.

The total fee is \$4 per worker per quarter. The fee is broken into two parts. The employer is required to deduct a \$2 fee from each employee, and the employer is subject to an additional \$2. The employer is responsible for remitting the entire fee.

The fee is paid by those employers who are covered by the state's Unemployment Compensation law. Basically, those employers required to submit quarterly unemployment insurance wage reports to the Employment Security Division of the New Mexico Department of Labor are required to remit the \$4 assessment.

Only questions concerning Workers' Compensation should be directed to the Workers' Compensation Administration at 1-800-255-7965.






Pay now, pay later

Personnel (pay and benefits) is among the highest cost in any municipal budget, and the Village of Ruidoso must get control of that item if the current mayor and council are to fulfill campaign promises regarding village finances.

Managers and department heads who work for the Village of Ruidoso have been the beneficiaries of what we believe is an unusual practice of overtime and/or compensatory time for hours worked over a normal 40-hour work week.

We believe that's the first place the village should look to cut the municipal budget.

When you hire a managerial, salaried employee to do a job, you are contracting for a job to be done — not for a block of time. Department heads and other administrators should be more concerned with getting the job done than in tallying up hours, even if that job takes more than 40 hours a week.

As Bob Jerkins of the New Mexico Municipal League put it: "The idea of salary, as opposed to wages, is that you are paid for the job that is done, not for the time it takes to do it. Consequently, if you start accounting for every hour, you stand a chance of putting yourself in a wage category instead of in a salaried category. As far as compensatory time for exempt salaried employees is concerned, ordinarily, they don't get it on an hour-for-hour basis." Jerkins went on to say that practice could even jeopardize the professional status of managerial employees.

In Ruidoso department heads do get hour-for-hour compensation for hours worked over their regular work week, and they have for as long as I can remember. This is not a new practice, but the current administration has vowed to "balance the budget without using reserves" and "reduce property taxes without curtailing public services." A good place to start would be by treating department heads and administrators like professionals; paying them a fair salary and expecting them to get the job done for that salary.

The Village of Ruidoso has taken another cost-cutting measure that will end up being very costly. For, when it comes to paying for work that is done, you'll pay now or pay later.

The village's practice of replacing overtime costs with compensatory time for hourly employees is a time bomb that will backfire when it's time for employees to collect on the past pay they have coming. In municipal government, especially when administrators try to maintain services with the smallest staff possible, some overtime work is going to be required. Putting off paying for that work in the hopes that comp time can be substituted can balloon into hundreds of hours of uncompensated time. And then you have to pay. As of February 9, the village had accumulated comp time in the \$22,000 range.

Employees don't like it, and it defeats its original purpose of saving money. It was a good experiment, but it didn't work, so let's go back to paying as we go.


