EID says 'clean it up'

State officials Friday ordered the Ruidoso Street Department to clean up an ongoing, decade's old, oil drain from an 8-inch pipe pointed toward the Rio Ruidoso.

Last Thursday, *The Ruidoso News* printed pictures of the illegal drainage system from the road department maintenance shed off Gavilan Canyon.

Friday morning, village employees were issued orders to cover the oil tracks.

Friday afternoon, Carl Stubbs of the Environmental Improvement Department (EID) visited village manager Ron Wicker. Wicker also talked with Anne Young with the state Surface Water Department in Santa Fe.

Wicker said Young told him the village would need to build a catch basin, similar to a septic tank, where the oil and grime would be contained, vacuumed and hauled away.

"We can't dump it," Wicker said. "A grease trap was not acceptable. We will have to do a thorough cleaning, putting all old materials in drums for disposal."

The problem first surfaced when Bob Arnold of Safety Counselling Inc., out of Albuquerque became curious about three traps on the maintenance barn floor that collected water, oil, sawdust and grime.

The safety survey followed the pipe's path that led from the three traps to an embankment outside the yard's fenced area and on a very steep slope above the Rio Ruidoso.

Village employees said the system had been installed more than 14 years ago when environmental regulations might have been different.

Wicker said he wasn't aware that the oil had been covered up Friday morning.

"If all they did was cover it up, it didn't change any conditions," Wicker said. "It can still be corrected."

He said his first instructions to Charlie Armstrong, road maintenance chief, was to clean up the area and order a grease trap.


"But today, it was determined by the state that a grease trap was not acceptable," Wicker said. "Charlie will have to go back and take the fence down and dig up the soil."

Wicker said Stubbs had visited the site Friday afternoon and indicated the cleanup had to be more extensive.

Wicker said Young had told him the site would have to be excavated, but he did not know how much digging would be necessary.

"I questioned the EID as to what we needed to do specifically," Wicker said. "They were not able to tell me specifics. They couldn't tell me how much to dig out or what we had to do to correct it. They referred me to some environmental standards that we are going to have to comply with. We'll have to study those and do what is necessary."

"I am hopeful the EID will let us simply get it corrected," he said. "I think we need to make sure that we clean it up in compliance with the state of fines and that's what we intend to do."

County gears up to recycle

Recycling in Lincoln County soon may be handled by asking residents to drop aluminum, glass, paper and plastics in a compartmentalized trailer.

The Solid Waste Authority, comprised of representatives from the county and five municipalities, authorized member Kerry Krumsiek Monday to further research the trailer system that's being used in Durango, Colorado.

It also has been successfully tried in Socorro and Silver City,

said Krumsiek, who serves on the authority's recycling committee.

The trailer is a departure from the original recycling plan designed by the committee, which was to be based on drop boxes at prominent locations such as Furr's and Wal-Mart. That plan would have required an attendant to sort materials.

But Krumsiek said the compartmentalized trailer, which can be hauled by a pickup, is a more efficient and flexible system.

"We could take it to different sites on a schedule so that people

will know it will be there," he told board members. "The attendant would be the driver."

Las Cruces started a similar system last summer and the response has been tremendous, he said. "Now they're looking to purchase another trailer to be in more places."

Because of its proximity to Mexico, Las Cruces also was able to arrange for a collector to come from Juarez who pays the city to haul the recyclable materials back across the border.

LTC could be the goose that laid the golden egg for some

Every year, the Ruidoso Lodgers Tax Committee doles out thousands of public dollars to businesses and non-profit groups to help promote the community.

But in making their decisions, committee members often rely on broad brush financial statements and a scratch pad analysis from the people seeking the money. Questions seldom are asked to clear up inconsistencies in the information.

Does not the public have the right to expect its appointed committee, before it hands over public money, to exercise the same caution and demand the same accountability as a bank?

THE GOLDEN ASPEN MOTORCYCLE RALLY INC.

"Everybody thinks I make a fortune out of it, but you can see the bottom line," said Ruidoso Village Councilor Ron Andrews, regarding his Golden Aspen Motorcycle Rally.

His bottom line last year was a small \$1,333.65 profit split among four partners.

Last Tuesday, Andrews asked for \$5,000 from the Lodgers Tax Committee (LTC) to help cover his advertising expense. The committee recommended \$2,500. A request for approval will go before the village council in May. Councilor Andrews will probably abstain from voting.

A conflict of interest arises when a councilor asks for tax money to advertise his for-profit corporation to a committee he helped appoint.

Ethical questions aside, the motorcycle rally is a 21-year-old tradition in Ruidoso which has contributed to a substantial economic impact for motel owners and other merchants who consider the event vital.

For Andrews, who took it over four years ago with three partners, it represents a year-long endeavor with apparent little reward.

No one representing the Golden Aspen Motorcycle Rally was present at the meeting Tuesday to answer questions. The Lodgers Tax Committee had told those requesting funds it wasn't necessary and the application doesn't require many details.

Andrews owns and operates the West Winds Motel. However, he also is a village councilor who helps appoint the tax committee. Because he requested public money from that committee, *The Ruidoso News* asked him for a break down of his financial statement.

Andrews was very cooperative with *The News* and candid about his expenses.

But even after a telephone conversation with Andrews to discuss the financial statement, his figures seemingly fail to explain his income or expenses.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Andrews had submitted an income statement for last year that reports he made about \$39,800 and his expenses were about \$38,500. He cleared about \$1,300. Not much for the work that goes into such a project.

In his application to the LTC, Andrews noted that 1,717 people registered for the event and just over 6,500 attended the associated trade show.

In addition to those two sources of income, Andrews rented 60-70

booths at the trade fair, solicited money from motels and campgrounds, received \$3,000 from LTC for advertising and collected a fair sum of donations from different merchants, both in money and merchandise.

But other than the LTC money, those sources of income are not listed separately in his financial statement.

While the dollar amount from all those sources would appear to comfortably exceed the \$39,800 he reported in his income statement, Andrews contends his attendance figures may be misleading.

Figures he submitted to the LTC indicate 4,700 plus walk-ins. At \$5 per person that would raise \$23,500.

Also, his 1,717 registrations brought fees from as low as \$20 to a high of \$34 each. Andrews said many registrations are given away as door prizes at various rallies and others are handed free to the volunteers.

However, if 217 registrations were given away and the average registration cost is \$25, the registration revenues alone would be \$37,500 with a flat 1,500 paying.

"Uh-huh," said Andrews, "If everybody pays, which everybody doesn't."

Those two combined revenues alone would produce \$61,000. He listed refunds and bad debts totaling about \$1,000.

Andrews said he gets his number count from an organization that specifically counts and works rallies.

The Ruidoso rally sold three-day, four-day and five-day passes.

"If those people come back every day, they get counted twice or three times," Andrews said.

He said absolutely different people would be more like 4,000 or less.

But even using that lower figure, a combination of registrations and walk-ins still would appear to reach \$50,000, if everybody pays. And that's not counting booth rentals.

BOOTH RENTALS

Andrews could not pinpoint the exact number of booths, but said there were 60-70 rental booths, 15-20 outside the building, the rest inside.

He said booth renters that were not charged last year were AMA, Texas Motorcycle Riders and the Christian Motorcycle Association, organizations that just sell memberships. That would leave about 50 spaces for paying vendors inside the building.

Andrews said other vendors pay \$150 for 10x10 spaces. If they have three booth spaces they pay \$450.

"If Rick from Roswell comes over here and wants 600 square feet and he wants to sell motorcycles, he's going to pay me \$150 times six."

Andrews said his booth costs were low by comparison to other rallies. Several vendors contacted by *The News* agreed that Andrews' charges were reasonable, but they said the rally itself didn't meet the standards of other rallies. They felt the \$5 ticket to enter the show significantly cut the gate.

One vendor said he asked for a break in rental space and Andrews told him he couldn't give one. He said Andrews told him everyone had to be treated the same.

Using Andrews' figures, the

booth rents from the 25,000 square-foot building and the parking area outside the building, would appear to generate another \$7-10,000 to his rally receipts.

Other areas also impact his financial bottom line.

THE EXTRAS

Last year, about 20 motels and campgrounds paid \$50 to have their names placed on the rally registration cards. That would appear to add another \$1,000 to the rally receipts. This year the charge is \$100.

"Some of those people pay," Andrews said. "Some donate me lodging. Just depends on what their choices are."

In his advertising on registration cards, Andrews listed "Thousands and thousands of dollars in contingency prizes donated by vendors, local merchants, manufacturers and restaurants."

Several merchants told *The News* they had made substantial cash donations.

However, the only line item listed under revenues other than the Lodgers Tax Fund was Rally Receipts. Cash donations and prizes were missing from the income statement unless they were also lumped into the Rally Receipts.

Under expenses, Andrews included \$6,000 in rents, \$3,500 for the building and the rest in condo rentals for his volunteers.

Pins and patches cost \$4,350; trophies, \$2,277; and prize costs, \$6,058.

However, Andrews did not delineate how much of the costs of the prizes and trophies might have been offset from donations of cash and other items received from vendors, local merchants, manufacturers and restaurants.

The grand sweepstakes prize was a bike sponsored by the Golden Aspen Rally Association. That was a single item listed under prize costs at \$6,058.69.

Andrews said a line item called officer expenses was all out of pocket costs for the owners. No salaries were listed for anyone in the corporation.

Andrews said he purchased partner Flo Maul's share of the business this year.

"One of the reasons we decided to reduce the number of officers to three, is because there isn't enough money to split four ways."

"If anybody thinks this thing is making that much money, I'll sell it to them for four times what last year's income was on that sheet of paper you got," Andrews said. "Four times \$1,300. I do it because I make money from the motorcycle rally at the motel, otherwise I'd be empty."

Andrews said he felt the Lodgers Tax Committee should set some type of limit of three to five years for persons asking for public advertising funds. He said this was the third year the rally had asked for funds since 1981.

"I don't know of very many people that would put \$15-20,000 of their own money out front for an activity for which a town is going to benefit more than the individuals who put the money up, which is the case of this motorcycle rally," Andrews said.

"Someday, I hope this is a hell of an income producing venture. I don't much think it will be."

Highway 48 project is back for a public hearing on Wednesday

The state Highway and Transportation Department will conduct a design public hearing over the Highway 48 project from at 7 p.m. Wednesday, April 24, at in the cafeteria at White Mountain School.

That agency is planning to four-lane New Mexico 48 from Sudderth Drive north to White Mountain Drive.

Staff representatives from the Highway Department and engineering consultants from Boyle Engineering Corporation will be on hand to discuss the project on an individual basis from 6 to 7 p.m.

At 7 p.m. the staff will make a brief technical presentation covering the various aspects of the proposed design.

Plans call for the widening of the two-lane road to four driving lanes with a continuous left turn center lane.

The proposed work also includes concrete curb and gutter, provisions for bicycles, storm sewers, retaining walls, sidewalks and other accessories.

Following the presentation, members of the audience will have the opportunity to ask questions and offer comments. Written com-

ments may be submitted to the coordinator at the Environmental Section, New Mexico State Highway and Transportation Department, PO Box 1149, Santa Fe NM 87504-1149.

Preliminary plans and right of way maps are available for public inspection at the Village of Ruidoso offices and may be seen during regular business hours.

Incentives equal \$818,175

The Lincoln County ASC Committee Chairman Fred W. Pfingsten today announced the county producers were mailed their incentive payments for their marketings of wool and unshorn lambs marketed during the 1990 marketing year which ended on December 31, 1990.

The payment rate is 127.5 percent for wool, 4.08/cwt for unshorn lambs, and 4.08 for mohair.

The approximate amount earned in Lincoln County for all three categories was \$818,175. These payments are financed primarily through import taxes on woolen products.

The support price for wool is 1.892 per pound and 4.532 for mohair. The rates are determined by taking the percentage needed to bring the national average up to the support level.

FmHa solicits nominations

The Farmer's Home Administration is accepting nominations for county committee elections for Lincoln County.

Persons nominated should have an interest in a farm as an owner, tenant or sharecropper with the county or area in which activities of the county or area committee are carried out. White Sands monument begins Full Moon series

White Sands National Monument begins its 1991 Full Moon Program Series at 8:15 p.m. Saturday, April 27. New Mexico poet and teacher Richard Bodnar will present "Rawhide Recollections," a dramatic portrayal based on the life and work of S. Omar Barker, western humorist, storyteller and cowboy poet.

A ranger-guided stargazing nature walk will be offered at 6:30 p.m., and White Sands National Monument will remain open until midnight April 27.

Autos head for Lake Lucero

An auto caravan to White Sands National Monument's Lake Lucero, the source of the white sands, is scheduled for Sunday, April 28.

Reservations are required and may be obtained by calling Monument Headquarters at 479-6124. The caravan is limited to 30 vehicles.

The trip will begin at 10 a.m. at the Small Missile Range Gate intersection with U.S. Highway 70/82, 25 miles west of White Sands National Monument Headquarters, between mileposts 174 and 175. Park Rangers and Military Police will brief the group on regulations that apply during the trip. The caravan will proceed over paved roads, through the White Sands Missile Range, to the trailhead to Lake Lucero. About two hours at the lake area allows time for the 3/4-mile conducted walk to the lake, snack, photograph taking, and then return to the vehicles. The caravan will then be escorted back to the starting point, on U.S. Highway 70/82, arriving there about 1 p.m.

All vehicles should have a spare tire and sufficient gasoline for the 35-mile roundtrip to the Lake Lucero trailhead. Each person should have sufficient drinking water, a snack if desired, sunglasses, stout walking shoes, and suitable dress for the weather. Cameras may not be used while passing through the Missile Range, but are encouraged for use while at the Monument lake area.

All persons will need to be at the Small Missile Range Gate intersection by the departure time of 10 a.m. No vehicles may join the caravan once it leaves for the lake.

Students experience ranching history

For a moment last week, 60 fourth grade students from Ruidoso were transported back in time, back to the days before tractors and before electricity reached the Hondo Valley.

They came face to face with living history.

As part of the Lincoln County Partners in Education Program, volunteers demonstrated historical change by contrasting buildings, vegetation, activities and equipment from the past with the present and speculating on how they may evolve in the future.

Modeled after a program presented for two years in Roswell, the presentation is the brainchild of the Lincoln County Heritage Trust.

The trust initiated the Roswell program in partnership with the Hondo Oil & Gas Company and the Diamond A Cattle Company. Staged at the historic South Springs Ranch, its aim was to supplement New Mexico classroom history by portraying important characters.

The trust decided to start a similar program in Lincoln County for about 285 children from the schools at Ruidoso, Capitan, Hondo, Corona, Carrizozo and at Mescalero in Otero County.

The local program has been modified to pique the interest of children with more rural backgrounds than in Roswell.

Hubert Quintana of the Diamond A Cattle Company, one of the sponsors in Roswell and Lincoln, lined up other financial backers. With the cooperation of ranch manager Tony Dickinson, the Circle Bar Ranch in Tinnie was selected as the staging area along with the Peters Ranch, an isolated homestead in the foothills.

The school buses started arriving about 9 a.m. last Monday and the process was repeated each morning through Thursday.

After a brief lecture on early plows and modern tractors by Trust Director Bob Hart, one of about 15 volunteers, the children were shown an acre of land staked for easy viewing.


"They're always hearing about an acre of land, but probably have no idea what one really looks like," Hart explained.

For the next half-hour, the focus shifted to a pasture where Ruben Aquilar described the outfit, roping and horsemanship of a charro. Demonstrating the skills he described were Patricio Baca and Ricardo Solis.


Aquilar also illustrated how many English cowboy terms were derived from Spanish terms.

Rancher comes from the Spanish ranchero, chaps from chaparreras, lariat from la reata, lasso from lazo and mustang from mesteño, the horse that escaped from the Spanish conquistadores' mestas or breeding stock.

On the 45-minute trip out to the Peters farm, Hart and other volunteers such as Ralph Dunlap discussed ranch history, pointed out irrigation systems, plants and wildlife, and explained the concept

of a watershed.

As the buses passed a windmill, Hart reviewed its uses and then added that windmills didn't exist during the era of Billy the Kid, despite the fact that they appear on the television series, "The Young Riders."

"That's 20 years too early," he said.

At the ranch, Laura Peters painted a verbal picture of life on the spread with no electricity, telephone or plumbing.

In various groups, the students watched sheep shearing and discussed methods used throughout history to pump water.

They listened to Hart and others explain various approaches to

range management and to descriptions of fence types, from barbed wire to wood and electric, water barriers and game fences. Aerial photographs were compared to old pictures showing roads long since abandoned.


Back at the Circle Bar, the students watched a branding demonstration and a show on local history by actor Boyd Barrett before heading back to school.

The buses were barely out the gate when the volunteers started to prepare for the next day and students from Capitan. Before the end of the week, students from Hondo, Mescalero, Carrizozo and Corona also were scheduled to go through the same exercise in touching his-

tory firsthand.

The trailers with compartments cost about \$20,000 each and hold 20 yards of material, Krumsiek said.

The trailer could be hauled to schools or wherever the demand develops as the system grows, he said.

The authority's recycling program is being financed by an \$88,000 grant from the State Energy and Minerals Department. It was awarded to the Village of Ruidoso.

Recycle Committee Chairman Bill Allen and member Jim Ed-

wards from the State Environment Department plan to attend a conference in Socorro next week with the state energy and mineral officials. Krumsiek said it would be a good time to see if the state objected to changing the scope of the grant for the purchase of a trailer. And they could query state officials on changing the name of the grantee to the solid waste authority.

"Assuming that the grant can be changed, we would like to initiate the system as soon as possible," said Authority Chairman Victor

Alonso.

Even after the authority addresses its collection process, it also eventually will need a processing area where the trailer can be dumped and the materials sorted, Krumsiek said.

Authority members discussed several vacant buildings that could be used.

Krumsiek said sorting for recyclables before compaction also would ensure that hazardous waste doesn't get dumped into a sanitary landfill and would reduce the risk of litigation to the authority later.

Although the market for recyclable materials is depressed, if the county generates a sufficient amount, it may be able to arrange for a company to collect and haul it away, he said. However, the sorting and hauling part of system now lacks financing.

In other business, the authority agreed to rent an office in the Ruidoso Downs new municipal building for Solid Waste Manager Gene Green. For rent of \$4,000 a year, the Downs will include secretarial assistance and access to office equipment.

EDCLC adopts budget, hires director

Directors of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County (EDCLC) adopted a plan of operation and budget for the year 1991-92 at a meeting, Thursday night, April 18.

The board of directors also unanimously approved Anita Sanders as acting executive director until a replacement is located for George Puckett who resigned recently.

EDCLC will accept resumes and applications until May 15 and will make a selection by June 15 for the position.

Directors in executive session approved a salary adjustment for Sanders to cover the interim period. Her annual rate will be \$25,200.

EDCLC, through the efforts of Sanders, Chris Allison and Dave McIntosh, has prepared a proposal to be presented to the state for possible matching funds. The deadline is April 29.

A tentative advertising schedule is included in the proposal.

In a report, Sanders says \$22,335 will be sought in matching funds, requiring a total expenditure for advertising of \$56,120.

"This is only a proposal and may

be adjusted with state approval as the year progresses," Sanders wrote.

Also, Sanders has written the county commission requesting funds as per the past year.

Directors elected Jim Bassett of Texas-New Mexico Power Co. to the board replacing Don Shaw who moved away.

Bassett's election is conditional. If he is elected to the Chamber of Commerce board of directors, he says he can't serve EDCLC.

If not, he'll be on the EDCLC board.

County manager Nick Pappas told directors the county is doing an overview of Lincoln County to

determine economic potential.

Information is needed from each community to "put it in good form," he said.

Pappas said it will be an "ever changing plan." He said Lincoln County is the first county in recent years in New Mexico to seek such a plan.

President Ronnie Paulger asked directors to be available to go before the county commission May 1 and 2 when the EDCLC budget will be considered.

A marketing plan will accompany the budget request. Sanders said communities will be contacted to provide support, also.

Greg and Brad Richards of Richards Puzzles reported business progress to directors.

The company, producing puzzles in the Warp Speed building on Mechem, is producing 12,000 puzzles a month and hopes to jump that to 20,000 in the next few weeks.

They reported that Stroud Crop Inc. has purchased 500 puzzles to be engraved and sent to agents in a number of states.

Eggleston resigns


Assistant village manager Leon Eggleston has resigned effective May 3.

Jesse Hofacket serves at LCMC as therapist

Jesse Hofacket, the new physical therapist at Lincoln County Medical Center, has begun expanding services offered by the hospital.

Hofacket joined the hospital staff in November after spending 27 years in West Texas. "I saw an excellent opportunity here at the hospital, and I loved the area," he said. His most recent position in the Lubbock area was as head of the physical therapy department at Crosbyton Clinic Hospital in Crosbyton, Texas.

Since his arrival, Hofacket has worked closely with part-time physical therapist Lisa Vega to guarantee coverage at Lincoln County Medical Center five days a week. Most physical therapy patients come to the hospital on an outpatient basis, often for follow-up care after surgery or injuries.

Hofacket has a strong background in orthopedics and will help patients recuperate from hip and knee replacements performed at Lincoln County Medical Center or any other facility. The department also is equipped to provide follow-up care for neurological patients.

Under the direction of Vega and Hofacket, an employee well-

ness/fitness program was begun. The program, which includes a fitness test and follow-up plan, has been well received by hospital employees.

One of the most exciting projects for Hofacket since his arrival has been development of an aquatics program which began operation April 1.

"Water exercise is applicable in many physical therapy treatments. The buoyancy of the water lessens gravity and means less strain on the joints. The warm temperature reduces muscle and joint tenderness, and working against the resistance of the water aids in the strengthening process," he said.

In addition to the aquatics program, Hofacket is involved in planning other programs including an osteoporosis education program, development of a post-polio syndrome library, screening for athletes and a scoliosis screening clinic at the schools.



Beautiful Days


