Counting down to the Kansas

RUIDOSO DOWNS—The Kansas Futurity time trials, which jolt this summer meeting into gear each year, are less than two weeks away. Jack Brooks' pair of Grade 1 stakes winners — Special Class and Steppin For The Moon — are two of the more prominent names slated to compete in the trials on May 9-10.

Numerous 2-year-olds are as yet untested, and many will debut in the Kansas trials. All seek a berth in the finals of the Grade 1 350-yard test, which will have its 41st renewal on May 26.

The following is a sneak preview

of some of the high-hope horses set to contest the Kansas trials:

COUNT DASH: Brooks is quite high on this son of Dash For Cash. "He's worked big," is all Brooks would say.

PULLASIX: A full-brother to stakes winner Pullastreak, also in the Brooks shedrow. "He's a lot better horse than his brother," Brooks said.

VITAL CLASS: Another in the interminable stream of 2-year-olds from the Brooks barn, a half-brother to Vital Streak who won his first three races here last summer.

EYES OF POWER: This full-

brother to graded stakes winner Power Effort brought \$105,000 at last year's Ruidoso Horse Sales. He was disappointing in his debut at Sunland Park, but Brooks says the colt was "very green in that race and went to bucking about 30 yards down the track." Eyes Of Power still finished third, beaten less than one-length.

SAVE THE EFFORT: From the stable that brought you Signed To Fly — last year's Kansas Futurity hero — Arnold Simmons has liked this daughter of Special Effort since early in the year. She won her debut at Bandera Downs by

daylight.

MOONS FLYING HIGH: Another in the Simmons stable, this gelded brother of 1990 Rainbow Derby winner Moons High has vast potential. He debuts in the trials.

DASHES BANDIT: The connections here are certainly solid. The horse is owned by James Helzer and trained by Dwayne "Sleepy" Gilbreath, who teamed to win last year's All American Futurity with Refrigerator. Dashes Bandit is a colt by the promising young sire First Down Dash, the 1987 World Champion.

Council considers expanding boards

An ordinance revised to permit non-residents of Ruidoso to serve on village boards where permissible is tied in with the creation of an Arts and Film Commission and a Transportation Board.

Under Residence, the new revision will read "Except as otherwise provided in a section applicable to a specific board, a member need not be a resident of the Village of Ruidoso if the mayor, with the advice and consent of the village council, determines that the member

has a substantial relationship with the village. This includes residence, employment, or ownership of real property or a business enterprise, in the Village of Ruidoso.

The council has said that this would increase participation on boards by areas like Alto, Ruidoso Downs and others.

Other changes in the ordinance call for automatic resignation of board members for missing three meetings in any calendar year, no excuses accepted.

The village manager can approve per diem and mileage in advance to compensate board members.

Members of the Lodgers Tax Committee need not be registered voters.

Also on the agenda, Lodger's Tax Fund revenues are on the rise and it's burning a hole in the pockets of the tax committee. They'll ask to increase the budget at Tuesday's village council meeting.

A public study session is sched-

uled at 5:30 p.m. prior to the regular council meeting at 6:30 p.m.

Other agenda items include public hearings on:

—Approval of a new restaurant license for Virginia Smith of the Homestead Cafe.

—Amend an ordinance to permit filing Lodger's Tax returns by the twenty-fifth day of the month.

—Another ordinance will attempt to amend a code to redefine "unit" for purposes of water and sewer charges.

State lawmakers slip in one more tax — pass down indigent health care funding to county governments

New state legislation may require New Mexico counties to cough up more money to pay for medical care of the poor.

The mandate could cost Lincoln County more than \$105,000 in the form of a new 1/16th cent tax or as a slice from its general fund.

Sponsored by State Rep. Ron G. Olguin (D-Bernalillo), the bill is aimed at generating \$11 million from counties to ensure that the state is eligible for a three-to-one match of Medicaid money by the federal government. For its \$11 million, New Mexico would receive \$32 million, according to Donna Smith of the New Mexico Association of Counties.

She said all of the money will go into one pot. It will be used in the Medicaid program to cover pregnant women and children from the ages of 16-18, which represents an extension of the existing coverage.

The bill was passed without amendments by both the House and the Senate. But when it was sent to the Enrolling and Engross-

ing Committee to be reviewed and prepared for the governor's signature, an amendment introduced by State Sen. Gloria Howes (D-McKinley) was mistakenly included, Smith said.

Governor Bruce King signed the flawed bill. And now the State Legislature is trying to figure out what to do about it, she said. As written, the bill does not accomplish its original purpose because Howes' amendment appears to create a loophole that would allow counties to avoid contributing toward the expanded state Medicaid program.

In a letter to county managers across the state, Smith wrote that the legislature intended for every county to contribute the equivalent of 1/16th percent gross receipts tax to the new county Medicaid fund. The counties would have a choice of either pulling the money from general funds or imposing an additional 1/16th percent gross receipts tax by ordinance.

"Gloria Howes, with her amendment, intended to allow counties to use funds remaining in (any exist-

ing) county indigent hospital fund to be used to cover their mandatory contribution to the new county Medicaid fund," Smith wrote. "Her amendment from the beginning was technically flawed and finally even the Senate intended to strike it."

But as finally written and signed into law, the bill included the amendment and "seems to allow the counties a loophole to avoid making its contribution to the fund," Smith wrote. "If a county does not impose... (the tax) and if it manipulates its indigent hospital fund so that there is a balance remaining at the end of the fiscal year, this (amendment) would seem to allow the county to avoid enacting the ordinance to take the Medicaid fund contribution out of its general fund."

On top of that, a section of Howes' amendment also seems to preclude using money out of the county indigent fund for the contribution, she said.

Smith presented four options for counties:

—Impose the 1/16th percent

county health gross receipts tax.

—By ordinance dedicate the equivalent of a 1/16th percent gross receipts tax out of a general fund revenue other than a county indigent hospital fund.

—Do nothing, interpreting the bill as allowing counties to avoid a contribution by keeping a balance in an indigent hospital fund.

—Wait and see whether the Taxation and Revenue Department and the Local Government Divisions of the Department of Finance and Administration offer an alternative.

When Pappas first heard about the legislation, he wasn't too concerned because he thought the county only had to come up with an amount of money equal to 1/16th percent sales tax collected from unincorporated areas of the county. That came to about \$18,000.

"But now I find out that we're not just talking about the unincorporated areas, the municipalities must be included too," Pappas said. "That comes to more than \$105,000. There's no way we can squeeze that out of the

general fund. We'd have to impose a 1/16th percent county health gross receipts sales tax."

That's what he intends to recommend to the Lincoln County Commission.

"(County Attorney) Bob Beauvais and I agree it's going to come in one way or another," Pappas said. "The State Legislature probably will bring it up again during the special session for reappointment."

Lincoln is one of eight counties in New Mexico without an indigent fund, accounting for about \$265,000 of the expected matching money, Smith said. Lincoln clearly would be contributing the major portion of that amount, she said.

Pappas said Lincoln may not have a designated indigent fund, but it does end up paying for some of the care of medically indigent at the Lincoln County Medical Center.

As a result of a referendum several years ago, the county has levied 4.25 mills annually for generation of a new hospital. The millage

produces about \$540,000 per year, according to Pappas.

That construction project still is on hold.

When the Medical Center ran into tight financial times last year, the commission designated a portion of that money for the hospital's operational expenses. This year, \$390,000 was allocated, Pappas said.

Some of that money benefits the medically indigent, he said.

Smith said her staff calculated that because of the Medical Center in Ruidoso, as much as \$866,000 could be pumped into Lincoln County through the expanded Medicaid program.

"That could be based on a higher number of Medicaid recipients in the area or that residents from other counties who are eligible will come to Lincoln to receive their medical care," she said.

But Pappas said it's too early to predict any benefits. "There is no way at this point to make a best guess estimate on how it may impact."

Down in the valley, trash grows and grows

The massive dump site along a small arroyo could be seen from U.S. 70, just as the unidentified caller promised last Monday.

The dump site appeared to be on private property in back of the home and new Memorial Gardens Cemetery owned by Stormy Edwards, former Ruidoso school board president.

County and state officials were called in Ruidoso, Roswell and Santa Fe. They said although there are trash disposal exceptions made for homeowners, proposed areas have to be approved in advance by regulatory agencies to insure compliance.

THE SITE

On Wednesday, sheriff deputies Jim Rethmel and Alan Caraway approached Edwards at his home on the banks of the Rio Ruidoso and adjoining the cemetery. Edwards confirmed that the arroyo, east of Ruidoso Downs, belonged to his father. He said the debris in the landfill was family generated, but not all of it came from his ranch.

Edwards unlocked the gate leading to his landfill and allowed the

deputies to inspect the site.

The arroyo contained a substantial amount of refuse such as paper, mattresses, junked appliances, bottles, discarded furniture and construction materials.

A makeshift road with a drainage culvert skirted the lower end of the 70-100 yards long landfill.

Edwards said one of his employees was picking up his trash and probably other trash as well to fill the arroyo faster.

He showed the deputies to make nearby-gully he had filled to make the property safer for horses he was raising.

He said he had talked to a person named Green from the county and Green said his landfill was "OK."

LINCOLN COUNTY SOLID WASTE AUTHORITY

Contacted Friday, Gene Green, the new manager Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority, confirmed that he had talked with Edwards seven to 10 days earlier after receiving a tip about a possible illegal dump site.

After viewing the landfill from the highway, Green said he talked

to Edwards who was mowing the front of his property at the time. Green said he never visited the actual landfill site.

Green said Edwards told him he was filling the arroyo with family generated trash to make the property safer for horses he was raising.

According to Green, Edwards told him the area did not drain into the Rio Ruidoso below the landfill.

Green told Edwards that if there was a problem, he would get back in touch with him. Green said he did not tell Edwards the dumping was "OK."

"I guarantee you in the future I'll deal with that matter differently," he said.

Green said the more he thought by the landfill, the more he drove it was an Environmental Department (ED) problem to handle. He said he called Carl Stubbs, local ED representative, last Friday, more than a week after he first confronted Edwards.

County and LCSWA Attorney Robert Beauvais said that he had received a complaint from deputy sheriff Jim Rethmel about a landfill on private property owned by either Stormy Edwards or his dad.

Beauvais said there was an exemption for garbage that is generated on personally owned property by farmers, ranchers and other owners. He said it is the same exemption that the Ruidoso Downs Race Track uses to dispose of trash on its property.

In county regulations, there are two sections that apply to landfills. One section deals with health hazards; the other is nuisance.

"I would think there would be concern because of water that runs through the arroyo," Beauvais said. "I think they're going to have to proceed as a nuisance complaint."

Beauvais, questioned about a possible conflict in representing the county in a complaint involving Edwards, said he had acted as Edwards' attorney once for a specific item. He represented Edwards in seeking approval to develop the Memorial Gardens.

"It wasn't in the context of a continuing thing," he said of that representation.

Environmental Department said the violation could possibly be a violation of water quality control commission regulations.

Those regulations state "No person shall dispose of any refuse in a natural watercourse or in a location and manner where there is a reasonable probability that the refuse will be moved into a natural watercourse by leaching or otherwise."

"Refuse" is defined in the regulations to include food, swill, carrion, slops and all substances from the preparation, cooking and consumption of food and from the handling, storage and sale of food products, the carcasses of animals, junked parts of automobiles and other machinery, paper, paper cartons, tree branches, yard trimmings, discarded furniture, cans, oil, ashes, bottles and all unwholesome material.

Another section of the regulations relates to notice of intent to

discharge. It states "Any person intending to make a new water contaminant discharge or to alter the character or location of an existing water contaminant discharge ... shall file a notice with the Water Pollution Control Bureau of the Environmental Improvement Division."

"Notices shall state: the name of the person making the discharge; the address of the person making the discharge; the location of the discharge; an estimate of the concentration of water contaminants in the discharge; and the quantity of the discharge."

The state official said other Environmental Improvement Board regulations may have been violated.

The Environmental Department from Santa Fe and Roswell said they would send a team to inspect the site this week.

Chamber board welcomes 5 new members

Five Ruidoso business or professional people were elected to the board of directors of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce in April and will start service July 1.

Terms of four present members will expire as of June 30. And the terms of four ex-officio members also will expire. Two present ex-officio members, however, have been elected to the board effective July 1.

Board members whose terms expire are Mickey McGuire, Mary Noltensmeyer, Brenda Buckner and Jimmy Goodwin.

The fifth seat became vacant when Craig Rawlings resigned at a board meeting last week. Elected to the board last week were Valerie Miller and Joan Bailey, former ex-officio members; Tom Rigsby, Frank Sayner and Jim Bassett.

Ex-officio members whose terms

expire June 30 are Ron Andrews, Cindy Lynch, Miller and Bailey.

The incoming president of the Chamber, Tony Wilcoxson, will appoint ex-officio members after he takes office July 1.

Andrews has been representing the Village of Ruidoso; Miller, Lincoln County Medical Center; Bailey, Hospitality Association, and Lynch, Board of Realtors. Under Chamber by-laws, ex-officio members have voting rights on the board.

At a regular meeting of the Chamber board April 24, Bailey reported that the celebration of the 50th birthday of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce will open in mid-May.

Bailey is chairman of a committee to plan celebrations in connection with the anniversary.

Her main aim is recognizing volunteer efforts, through a picnic, banquet, or whatever, she advised

the board.

Greg Masters gave a preliminary report on the 1991 Connoisseur Classic. He reported the event "was in the black," although a final accounting is not yet available.

Board members had high praise for Frankie Jarrell, chair person of the Connoisseur Classic.

Since there was no subsidy this year, Masters said the event was \$6,000 ahead this year over last year. Actual net "profit," however, was minimal.

"This was a trial year to see if we could hold our own. Overall the committee did a fine job," Masters said.

One reason for success is that facilities were donated, thus lessening insurance costs.

Tony Wilcoxson, chairman of the Art Festival scheduled in July and incoming chamber president, said the jury work is completed for the

festival and committees are functioning.

The location will again be on the race track property near the Sports Theater.

The board voted to transfer some funds from advertising to "trade shows" to include attendance at two more trade shows this fiscal year. The amount is \$1,600.

A financial report was presented by David Sailor.

During the board meeting, Craig Rawlings resigned from the board and as chairman of the advertising committee. The board also voted by secret ballot to retain Jerry Watts as executive director.

Wilcoxson said a board planning retreat is being planned for June, but the dates and place haven't been pinned down.

Possible choices of location are The Lodge in Cloudcroft or Angel Fire, Wilcoxson said.

Bert and Ernie are looking for homes

Bert and Ernie hope they get a chance at life. Four of their brothers and sisters weren't so lucky.

The shepherd/collie mix young males arrived with six other siblings at the Humane Society shelter February 3. They were brought in by a rancher from Capitan who didn't want any of the dogs. They're about six months old.

Two were adopted, but four were euthanized. Just Bert and Ernie are left.

"They're very outgoing dogs, but they tend to be a little intimidated by new experiences like the first time they were put on a leash," said Randy Basch, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society Shelter.

"They would be well-suited to the outdoors and would make excellent farm or ranch dogs and they love kids," he said. The young brothers are not

neutered. The charge to take either dog home would be \$47.50 to cover the cost of a rabies shot, a city license and neutering.

People interested in helping the adoption effort for animals at the shelter may donate to the society's spay/neuter assistance fund or they can sponsor an animal for adoption by paying its fee for being neutered or spayed.

Basch also is looking for foster parents willing to keep litters of pups for 10-day periods. That's long enough for them to develop immunities after they have been inoculated against the deadly Parvo virus. It gives them a chance to be adopted. Without foster homes, many pups die or must be euthanized.


Mrs. Guydelkon was born September 22, 1901, in Mescalero, and had lived there all her life. She was a homemaker.

Hazel Kennedy And Her Trees

One of the charms of Ruidoso "The City in the Pines" is the great variety of early flowers, ornamental bushes and shrubs, and flowering trees which suddenly appear to delight your eyesight this time of year among the pines and spruce and fir throughout the town.

First is the golden Forsythia bush and the small crimson orange Japanese quince bush, followed by the flowering crabapple tree and the flowering peach, which all in a day bloom forth in a tree full of close-clustered shining pink blooms.

On the April 23, Hazel Kennedy called me up and said she wanted me to come and see her flowering crabapple tree, which was in full glory and with the most beautiful bloom of its life.

Hazel's home is right there on the corner on Meander Drive and Paradise Canyon.

Here was the giant tree at least 30 feet tall full of large pink blossoms growing right out to the very ends of the limbs and twigs. It is a great joy to your eyesight, hungry after a long winter for a look at bright pure color.

Hazel bought the original tree from Sears Roebuck, and gave it to Cap Cowan in memory of his daughter, Marion Jo. This was about 1951. Then four years later Cap gave Hazel one of the saplings which came up from his tree. And this is the giant flowering crabapple the pride and joy of the yard.

Giant Douglass Fir

Lillian Kennedy, Hazel's sister-in-law, built the house where Hazel has lived since 1955. Lillian wanted a weeping willow for her yard, the forest on Meander Drive; so she went up to the home of Ike Wingfield (which still stands), and Ike cut two small branches off his weeping willow tree and told Lillian to put them in the ground in a moist place. One of these trees today is a giant weeping willow. Along about the same time, Lillian took four tiny saplings from the mountains and planted them in the yard. Today these are giant Douglass Fir towering over the neighborhood, singing soft wind songs as the wave their tops in the spring breeze.

A golden rain tree was presented years ago by Travis Hicks Sr.

Hazel says these trees are the oldest planted trees on the north side of the river in the gateway area.

United Methodist Church
Hazel was born August 12, 1900, in Bosque County, Texas, and came to West Texas in a covered wagon in 1902.

In Lubbock, Texas, a small girl in Hazel's Sunday school class, upon hearing that Hazel and her husband, Ike, were moving to Ruidoso, said: "I know that the year after she arrives there, there will be a Methodist Church on the prettiest corner in Ruidoso."

Sure enough, Ike and Hazel moved to Ruidoso in 1945 and on April 28, 1946, Bishop W. Angie Smith dedicated the Ruidoso Community United Methodist Church. It was the first church in the Gateway. The lot was donated by George McCarty and Mrs. Delsey Palmer.

A 44th anniversary service was planned for Sunday, April 28. (This is being sent to you on April 25). Dawn Swearingin will sing "Bless this House."

Hazel Kennedy told me how her father's people came from Scotland and were pioneers around Waco; and that her mother's people were early Texas pioneers. She has much of her family history written down — a priceless family treasure.

Hazel herself is a treasure and a blessing to all of us. It was a memorable visit with her among her beloved trees.

Mobile home market is flat in area

Trouble with financing, strict regulations on subdivision development, a shortage of suitable lots, are a few of the factors that have suppressed the mobile home market in Ruidoso.

Ruidoso has a number of mobile home subdivisions like Ponderosa, Airport 1, 2, 3 and 4 and Del Norte, but no new subdivisions have been developed in recent years.

One major reason, according to Alex Adams of Holiday Home Sales, is the cost of subdivision development.

Utilities must be underground, and paving is required.

Formerly, Adams says, Texas-New Mexico Power Co. would refund over a five-year period most of the cost to the developer of putting electric conduits underground. That cost can run as high as \$2,400 per lot, Adams says.

But, apparently, a law was revised in Santa Fe which eliminates the refund requirement, says Adams. He points out one example where he obtained a 10 percent refund on a \$9,000 investment.

John Winniford of Lela Easter Real Estate says a good mobile lot in Del Norte subdivision may cost \$20,000.

"You might as well buy a house," Winniford says.

"We don't have enough good mobile home lots," he adds.

A number of lots are zoned for mobiles in Ponderosa and Ponderosa Heights subdivisions.

But, many of them are steep and

would take major investments for site development.

Owner financing is about the only possibility on older mobile homes, Marge Woodul, Realtor with Bill Pippin, says.

Pippin himself says that a Realtor can't sell a mobile home in a mobile home park without a special license.

That, coupled with difficulty in obtaining financing, has made him shun that market.

Two other factors have reduced interest in mobile homes. One is the cost of new mobile homes themselves.

As Winniford said, "you might as well buy a house."

The other factor is a natural aversion among many home seekers to modular or mobile homes.

In the county, laws affecting water source development are somewhat of a stumbling block to housing developments.

In Ruidoso "the village won't let us annex any more land," Adams says.

He cited a proposed Tanglewood Subdivision which was platted and presented to the village for annexation.

The project involved more than 100 acres near or adjacent to the Alpine Village subdivision.

He said residents in the area protested, saying, "we don't want any more mobiles."

Adams said the 103 acres involved recently sold for only \$87,000.

Ruidoso also has a regulation

which requires a property owner to request permission to cut trees on any piece of property.

"We do require a permit to cut trees," Cleatus Richards, planning administrator for the Village of Ruidoso, says.

He, too, says, "the cost of development is getting higher."

Subdivision development in the Ruidoso area came to a halt in the early 1980s when oil prices tumbled and when real estate sales plummeted in resort areas.

Holiday Home Sales, which specialized in mobile home sales, has virtually abandoned new mobile sales.

It's still possible to buy a lot, move a single-wide or double-wide on it and become a part-time or full-time resident of Ruidoso.

But, count your bucks and check regulations first.

Otherwise, there may be a quagmire there, at first unobserved.

In the early 1980s, the sight of mobile homes being transported into Ruidoso was a common sight.

In Del Norte one area was reserved for double wide mobile homes. Almost every lot has mobiles on it. It filled up relatively fast.

Extensive dirt work was common in many areas of Ponderosa before mobiles could be put into place.

New subdivision regulations, Adams says, call for no grade over 10 percent. It hasn't always been so.

Many mobiles are perched on hillsides much steeper than that.

Mescalero/Molycorp mining project is on hold

The price of raw yttrium has dropped; believe it or not, that has had an impact in Lincoln County.

The drop in price of the rare earth mineral has caused Molycorp to put on hold plans to develop a mine on the Mescalero Indian Reservation.

That is just one reason, according to David N. Partridge, why the project is on hold. Partridge was project manager for the contemplated mining operation on the

Indian reservation.

Partridge, who now resides in California, said that processing costs constitute another reason the project is on hold.

However, Partridge said, New Mexico Tech has agreed to study more economical ways to process the mineral.

Yttrium is a rare earth metal of the lanthanide series. It is used, for instance, when combined with another element to provide the red color in television picture tubes.

The mining site would be about

215 acres in a "very isolated canyon on Pajarito mountain," Partridge had said previously.

Partridge is serving as superintendent of a chemical plant at a Molycorp, Inc., lanthanide mine in California.

However, he said he is "keeping track of the Pajarito project."

Mining on the reservation would require extensive road work beyond the tiny village of White Tail on the reservation.

Partridge was called off the project here about six months ago

when the local office was closed.

The company had worked out a lease agreement with the Mescalero tribe. That apparently also is on hold.

Molycorp's raw yttrium currently is obtained through an agreement with Canada and Japan.

Partridge also had said zirconium availability was a key factor in original plans to proceed with recovery of yttrium here. He also said it is rare to find deposits of the metals as extensive as are apparent on the reservation.

Yttrium prices apparently swing widely in the marketplace.

The Bureau of Mines has arranged for New Mexico Tech to do process development work to find more economical processing procedures. The college also is doing an environmental study, Partridge said.

If the project here is revived, "it'll be some years away," Partridge told The Ruidoso News from his office in California. Molycorp, Inc., is a wholly owned subsidiary of Unocal Corporation.

Ruidoso's girls won their half of the meet edging Artesia and burying Goddard, Lovington and Portales.

Ruidoso's boys finished third in the meet behind Lovington and Goddard and ahead of Artesia Portales and NMMI.

State qualifiers are: Monica Martinez, shot put; Sarah Dix, long jump; Missy Gosdin, 100M hurdles; Lisa Tam 1600M and 3200M and Gilbert Kayitah, 3200M run.

Junior sensation Tam had two of the most memorable runs any distance runner could have in one meet.

In the 1600M, Tam nudged Welch of Portales at the wire by

less than a second to win with a 5:40.08 time.

Tam then came back to win the 3200M run by such a huge margin that she lapped the second place girl. Her time of 12:13.72 was 1:46 minutes better than number two.

Freshman long jumper Sarah Dix, showing great promise, lost a first place to Owens of Goddard by one inch, 16-2 to 16-1. Both girls qualified for the state.

Senior stalwart Missy Gosdin won her most exciting 100M hurdle race of the year by nipping Lee of Portales and Stewart of Lovington at the wire by less than a second. The times were 16:34, 16:37 and 16:38.

Sophomore Monica Martinez qualified for the state with a hefty 34-foot shove of the shot put, good for third. Martinez happens to be in

Senior Heath Huey finished in the money in the 110M Hurdles and the 300M hurdles. Huey is one

of the few Warriors that has played in three sports throughout the year.

Chris Torres lost a heartbreaking 200M dash by less than three tenths of a second. Torres was bunched in a field where all six runners finished within a second of each other.

Junior Amy Wishard, a three sports star, won the grueling 800M dash over Blanton of Portales with a 2:33 time.

Kami Bailey, Jody Randle and Brandy Pfeffer all crossed the high jump bars at 4-8. Because of number of jumps, Bailey and Randle tied for second. Owens of Goddard won with a 4-10 jump.

Interest shall accrue at the rate of one percent (1%) per month or any portion of a month (Statute 7-38-NMSA 1978).



Past Tense

Laughter is law around old Ruidoso

The following is a story, about the law of Ruidoso.

Heavy Stewart, the organizer of the "Mountain Boomer Orchestra" in the late 1920s and 1930s, moved from East Texas to El Paso for his wife's health in 1927.

But after living in that town for several months, his wife's health had not improved. He decided to try Tucson, Arizona, but friends instead suggested moving to Ruidoso, New Mexico. They assured him the climate was compatible for tuberculosis since the U.S. Marines maintained a hospital for tubercular patients at Fort Stanton, not far from Ruidoso.

The couple moved there and rented a house know as "The Park School House," in the area where the Robert Moore Fire Station is now.

In those days, most people in Ruidoso were only there during the summer months. They left the canyon by Labor Day to get back home in time for their children to enroll in school. Work practically was nonexistent in the village from September until the first of June.

Heavy's wife was an invalid with large doctor bills. No Medicare or welfare programs existed at that time. Heavy decided to trap fur bearing animals. Those years, many people depended on trapping for their livelihood during the winter months.

Heavy traded for some traps and set them out according to the instructions he obtained from a neighbor.

He was told to set the traps close to game trails and scratches where predatory animals left scratched the ground to cover up body waste. He was to check the traps no later than three days after they were set and in two-day

intervals thereafter.

The third day on his rounds, he found a six-point buck in a Number Four "New House" trap. The deer had broken a leg and was standing on three legs.

Heavy's thought was to spring the trap open and let the deer go free. After a couple of failed attempts during which Heavy barely avoided being gored by the animal, he knocked it on the head.

After killing it, he decided to skin the deer and to take the quarters home so as not to waste that much meat.

One morning several days later, the local village constable, Coleman Joyce, and the district game warden pulled up in front of Heavy's house. Before going to the door to let them inside, Heavy closed the door to the kitchen where a deer roast was ready to remove from the oven of his woodburning stove.

The men asked Heavy if he knew who might be trapping in the area. Heavy told them he had put out a few traps and had

caught four skunks. He just couldn't imagine a trap holding a deer. The game warden made it clear the deer had been caught accidentally in a trap before being butchered. He told Heavy, "The trapper should have notified the game department instead of killing the deer. Whoever removed the meat is liable for a game violation."

After 30-40 minutes of sermonizing and lecturing by the game warden, Heavy could smell the meat in the oven and knew it was burning. But the lecture went on, then was followed by stories from the constable about his early law enforcement experience and how he usually brought all law violators to justice.

After the two had talked for an hour and the roast had burned to a crisp, Heavy was ready to confess and be taken away, but the men decided to leave. On their departure, he assured them he would cooperate with them and the law in any way he could.

When they left, Heavy was sure that they had gone to the county seat of Carrizozo to obtain a search warrant for his house. They were just out of sight when Heavy dumped the burned meat in a bag, put the remaining meat in a washtub, drove four miles into the forest and buried it. Years later, when recalling the incident, he laughed and said, "The men knew I was scared out of my wits and I was the culprit. They knew I had no money and was needed at home. They were just having fun at my expense."

Heavy realized he was not going to be arrested when they didn't return with a search warrant. He regretted the total waste of all the good meat the most.

Bar hopping with your son after he gets off school could be a real father and son type of thing to do.

Only five children under 15 were convicted of driving while intoxicated last year in New Mexico. And in the 15-19 age group, only 1,122 were convicted. Of those young drivers just 268 were injured in accidents and only 29 died.

In fact only nine percent of all DWI convictions in New Mexico in 1989 were against children under 21. With scores of children drinking while driving, that represents a fairly low conviction rate.

Our legislature still is not satisfied with those fine stats. In fact they passed a bill to charge all drunken drivers a \$75 fee to establish a community education fund. That's some teeth we can all understand.


