City attorney says AG clears village

The Ruidoso Village Council did not violate the state's Open Meetings Act when it met in closed session last month to discuss bids for a new civic center, according to village attorney David Thomsen.

He said Thursday the village had been notified by Daniel Yohalem, director of the Attorney General's Civic Division, that no violation had occurred.

Thomsen issued a press release to that effect Thursday, however the AG's office told **The Ruidoso**

News the investigation is continuing.

Ronnie Crago of Yohalem's office said she had talked with Yohalem and he had the press release by Thomsen was sent prematurely. She said Yohalem's evaluation has not been written.

Crago said she was not at liberty to discuss the continuing case, but that District Attorney Bert Atkins had been asked to conduct the investigation.

The New Mexico Foundation for

Open Government and **The News** had alleged the council violated the state law when it met in executive session April 2 to discuss bid proposals for the operation and marketing of the civic center.

Bob Johnson, executive director of the Foundation for Open Government (FOG), asked the Attorney General's office to investigate, alleging the council had gone into closed session from a public meeting and conducted public business.

Johnson contended the council

violated the Open Meetings Act by failing to announce a proper reason for closure; when Ruidoso Mayor Victor Alonso polled participants on their opinions of three plans for marketing the civic center, and by adjourning while in executive session and failing to return to public session to announce what it had done and take a public vote on its actions.

Yohalem concluded that provisions within the New Mexico Procurement Code on competitive

proposals took precedence over the Open Meetings law.

Yohalem, in his letter to Thomsen, emphasized that discussion of this kind must be limited to the bids and to negotiation tactics and issues associated with those bids.

The News, one of the complainants, was not contacted by either the AG or the DA's office during the preliminary investigation. Participants in the closed session who were contacted by **The News**

said they were not interviewed by anyone from the attorney general's or district attorney's offices.

DA Atkins said he met with Mayor Alonso, the village clerk and several other people who were present for the meeting.

Atkins said he asked them what had occurred and the contents of the meeting. He said that information was passed on to Yohalem's office.

Council is in session

The Ruidoso Village Council is in special session this morning regarding the marketing and management of the civic-events center.

The special meeting was called last Friday and began this morning at 10 a.m.

Voting district proposals are set for hearing

The public will have a chance to comment Tuesday on proposed new voting districts being created for the expansion of the Lincoln County Commission in 1992.

The commission meeting will begin at 9 a.m. in the County Courtroom in Carrizozo. The public hearing on the district alternatives is scheduled for 10 a.m.

The commission voted last month to increase the number of members on the board from three to five. That decision also will increase the length of terms for elected county officials from two to four years starting in 1992. Commissioners will be nominated and elected within five separate districts instead of being elected at large.

The first public session on proposed alternatives for the five districts was conducted last Thursday evening to ensure that working residents would have an opportunity to attend.

But only about a dozen persons showed up.

At the urging of County Clerk Martha Proctor, the commission probably will not make a final decision on the exact alignment of the districts until after the State Legislature has completed its reappointment and set up new legislative districts. The Legislature is expected to call a special session in September, Proctor said.

Public hearings on the legislative redistricting will be scheduled in June in Alamogordo and Roswell, she said.

County attorney J. Robert

Beauvais said he was pleased the commission left the redistricting studies and proposals to in-house staff.

Counties that have hired outside firms have paid around \$7,500 for the work, he said.

Beauvais said that working with Proctor and county mapper Albert Baca, they have come up with three basic proposals.

Other factors besides numerical parity that must be considered in drawing district lines are ethnic groupings and economic forces, Beauvais said. "For instance, we have tried to keep the Hondo Valley area together because the people there share similar interests," he said.

Special legislation is scheduled to be considered by the Legislature in a special session to facilitate

numerical balance. It would allow counties to adjust precinct lines and split precincts to form districts as long as they don't cross legislative lines. The precincts were set up in 1986 before Proctor was county clerk and are to take effect for the 1992 primary.

"With 12 voting precincts, there's no way we could come up with five equal districts," Beauvais said. "There are about eight counties in the state like Lincoln, with a very large geographical area but a low population."

All of the districts must have populations of between 2,322 to 2,444 people. One more factor complicating the process is a requirement that census blocks must not be broken, Proctor said.

County could cut EDC funds

The financial legs of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County were sliced down to nubs in a preliminary county budget session Thursday.

The Lincoln County Commission tentatively agreed to eliminate the millage given the Economic Development Corporation (EDC) in the past and to set aside, instead, \$30,000 for the county's own economic development effort, said Commissioner Monroy Montes.

"We're not thinking about creating an office or anything like that. The money will just be available," he said. "In the past, I feel there was very little accountability."

The county is faced with a tighter budget this year (1991-92), he said.

Last year, the county budgeted 1/4 of a mill for the EDC and pledged another 1/4 of a mill as matching money for any dollars the agency was able to raise within the community.

The one-fourth mill generated about \$60,000. It was the third year the county had contributed the major portion of the agency's budget.

EDC interim director Anita Sanders said the county contribution for the current fiscal year was \$86,973 out of total anticipated budget of \$169,000. Another \$38,500 came from the villages, \$2,540 was donated by private firms or individuals, \$1,200 from new memberships and \$30,000 from original memberships, for a total of \$157,213.

George Puckett resigned as EDC director about a month ago.

EDC President Ron Paulger told **The Ruidoso News** that he couldn't say what the organization's next move will be until after a scheduled board meeting next Thursday.

"We'll decide what direction, if any, we can go," Paulger said.

"It certainly was a total shock," he said. "(Commissioners) had already predetermined their direction with little area for negotiation before we had the option to opt out. What we said fell on deaf ears."

Trying to continue to operate with a drastically cut budget may not be feasible, Paulger said.

"I've always been of the mind that if you can't do it right, if you can't compete with the others in the market place, it's money down the drain," he said. "We've had lots of success. It's a long range project."

Support for a concentrated effort at economic development has been shown in the community and by voters, Paulger said.

"The real losers are the young

men and women who will go off to school, but will not be able to find jobs here when they return," he said. The EDC was attempting to foster diversification in the local economy and to draw industries that could provide incomes to would allow young people to stay and raise their families here, he said.

Sanders said the EDC has enough money in reserve to "pay everybody who deals with us and the program running through June 30."

She noted that the agency's impact was three-fold: new jobs, new salaries and real estate sales.

"The national trend is to go in this direction (with) local economic development groups and I hope we don't go backwards," Sanders said.

Montes, who was the commission representative on the EDC board, said he initially proposed continuing up to a 1/4 mill as matching support of the EDC if the agency would agree to give the commission complete jurisdiction.

But after discussion, commissioners decided that probably was a situation under which the EDC could not function.

"Up to this point, the county has put \$200,000 into the EDC operation, but how can anyone say they've done a good job or a bad job when they haven't presented figures to prove either way?" Montes asked. "We have the taxpayers to answer to and they don't."

Montes contended the commission is not anti-EDC.

"It's a tough decision, but we're at a point of either pumping more money into it or pulling out," he said.

The EDC could present a plan for use of part or all of the \$30,000 like any other agency "if they can show that it is viable and good for the county," Montes said.

He was disappointed when the EDC failed to carry through on a request from the commission for an economic assessment of the county and for a breakdown on the exact number of new jobs and new wages generated by its efforts, he said.

The money that had been allocated to the EDC may be funneled into a fund that would be used in a few years to renovate the county courthouse or other county-owned facilities.

The commission is scheduled to vote on preliminary approval of the county's 1991-92 budget at its meeting on May 28.

County Manager Nick Pappas said money is going to be tighter in 1991-92 "because the revenues are not going to be as good as last year, but I think the figures now look shorter than they really are."

Governor King proclaims Home School Week

Governor Bruce King has proclaimed May 6 through May 16 as Home School Week in New Mexico.

The State Legislature enacted laws in 1985 setting up a framework for the operation of home schools which now serve 2,000 New Mexico students. That number is expected to reach 3,000 by the 1991-92 school year.

New Mexico law requires parents to hold a bachelor's degree or apply for a waiver, and according to a news release, three-fourths of all home school parents in New Mexico must apply for the waiver. That release goes on to say that home school students have tested 10-30 percentile points above their New Mexico public school counterparts every year. Home school children are required to take the public school's CTBS tests.

In Ruidoso, about 50 children are home schooled, and several Ruidoso families were expected to attend a Home School Seminar in Albuquerque this past weekend.

In his proclamation, Governor King noted that teaching children at home was the primary method of educating children during early America, and home school has produced such successful men and women as Martha Washington, Abigail Adams, John Quincy Adams, Abraham Lincoln, Thomas Edison, Woodrow Wilson, Franklin D. Roosevelt, General Douglas MacArthur and Agatha Christie.

Ruidoso Downs Race Track previews Anne Stradling Museum of the Horse collection

Anne C. Stradling could have had her pick of spots when she looked for a new home for the Museum of the Horse.

But, what better home for a horse museum than Ruidoso Downs, home of the world's richest quarter horse race? She thought so, and her entire museum has been transferred from Patagonia, Arizona, to Ruidoso Downs.

Gary Miller, director of the Anne C. Stradling Museum of the Horse, and his wife, Dee Miller, couldn't be happier.

Stradling had talked to several nationally-known museums before she was contacted by R.D. Hubbard's representatives and settled on the Hubbard Museum as a home for her collection of carriages and

sleighs, saddles, paintings, photographs and other items relating to the horse.

The collection, with its 10,000-plus items, is one-of-a-kind and is expected to draw visitors from all over the world to this mountain resort.

The Millers, Ron Smith and Bill Jones are hard at work preparing a small part of the exhibit to be on display in the Hubbard Museum at the Turf Club on opening day at the races, Thursday, May 9, and through the end of May.

"We really want the community to have a chance to see this collection," said Dee Miller. This small preview will give area residents an idea of what an impressive display will be gathered in the Anne C. Stradling Museum of the Horse when it opens in 1992.

Coordinating the transfer of the museum items, planning and coordinating the refurbishing of displays is a piece of cake for the Millers.

Gary Miller worked for 14 years on the Lincoln project where he created a museum from the ground up for the Lincoln County Heritage Trust. He was at the helm as that historic town was restored as a tourist attraction and a state treasure.

Miller was nominated for a President's Award for his achievements in Lincoln.

He said this project is pretty parallel to the Lincoln work.

"In Lincoln we started with bare bones." The Stradling collection was in better shape since most of it had been on display in Patagonia, but designing and establishing a

brand new museum is still a challenge.

It was a major accomplishment to acquire such a valuable collection for the Ruidoso area, and just as great an accomplishment to keep the entire collection together, said Miller.

That collection includes English carriages, sleighs, a Conestoga wagon and a stage coach — all together more than 20 wagons. Besides family photographs and paintings, the art collection includes Remington paintings and drawings.

The horse artifacts were gathered throughout Stradling's lifetime and include items from the U.S., England, China, Argentina, Mexico, Scandinavia and Japan.

Stradling's love of horses and collecting led her to begin those hobbies as a very small child. She learned to ride in the New Jersey countryside where she grew up and became an accomplished horsewoman. She attended the Formata School in Aiken, South Carolina.

Her riding ranged from polo ponies to riding to the hounds and later western horse riding when she headed west and reached in Arizona.


Along the way, Stradling gathered horse memorabilia and her friends, including Frederic Remington and Theodore Roosevelt, enhanced her collection with gifts.

Miller is working with a firm of facility planners to develop a plan and a specific focus before construction begins on the museum's new home.

But, he and his crew have taken time off from that long-range project to select and prepare an assortment of items for the preview exhibition.

"This is a very, very minute part of the collection," said Miller.

Anne Stradling Museum of the Horse will be open to the public from 8:30-10 a.m. on race days and from 10:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. on non-race days until the end of May.

Since the largest portion of the county's population is centered in Ruidoso, the biggest fear by some non-Ruidoso residents has been that the majority of the commissioners would live in the village and its interests would dominate.

But the three proposals now being considered by the commission would avoid that scenario.

"The way they are designed, two districts would comprise the bulk of Ruidoso and the balance of the population of the county would make up the other three," Beauvais said.

"Someone could run from Ruidoso in some of the other districts, but the majority of the voters within those districts will be from outlying areas," Proctor said. Since each commissioner will be elected only by the voters within his/her respective district, Ruidoso's overall population would have no impact in the individual districts.

Under one of the proposals, District 1 would cover the southwest and north of the county taking in Nogal, Carrizozo, Ancho, Corona, Roman and about half of the Alto precinct.

District 2 would include the portion of Ruidoso west of Mechem and south of Ski Run Road, and the Carrizo Canyon area. District 3 would encompass Gavilan Canyon Road to Mechem in Ruidoso.

District 4 would stretch from Capitan through Fort Stanton, Angus, the county airport property,

east of Gavilan Canyon Road and down into a small section of Ruidoso Downs.

District 5 would cover Ruidoso Downs, Glencoe, San Patricio, Lincoln, Tinnie and the rest of Hondo Valley in the southeast corner of the county.

Other items of interest on the commission agenda for Tuesday include:


—A request from Sarah H. Anderson to vacate the right of way on Griffin Drive and Cedar Road in the Agua Fria east of Ruidoso Downs.

Lulu may be one of the lucky ones. The one-year-old Airedale is up for adoption at the Lincoln County Humane Society and has a sponsor who will pay the \$45 fee for mandatory spaying.

Her benefactor is Nancy Bankston, owner of Light Spirit Resource Center, 123 Sleepy Hollow Road.

"We've had all of our animals neutered, a lot came from shelters, Bankston said. Some of those adopted pets had special problems.

Bankston said the neutering fee is often an issue when Shelter manager Randy Basch has found suitable homes.

"I just think that animal population control is vital to the community and to the animals. That was my motive."

Basch said Lulu was brought in by her owner, who said he could no longer keep her.

"She has a very calm and very sweet disposition," Basch said. "She's housebroken. She's good with children and with other pets. But she's also a good watchdog and very protective of family and kids."

The owner left his name in case a prospective adoptive family wanted more information, Basch said.

Lulu was spayed late last week and has been given her rabies shot. The charge for adoption will be \$27.50 to cover the shot and her city license.

Hondo Valley Kennels will groom Lulu free of charge after her adoption if the new owner will show her shelter papers.


Just today the orange and black Crossbeak, first cousin to the Oriole, has arrived in the vale, sending his chime-like notes into the bird harmony of May Day celebration.

special May baskets in which we gathered wild flowers and roses and lilacs to give our mother a May Day Flower Shower; and to bring a flowery message of good will to the neighbors. In Alaska it was the early violets, shooting stars, columbines, Blue Bells and Forget-Me-Nots that were the flower favorites of May Day. In Oregon it was the Wild Rose, Wild Tiger Lilly, and tall Forget-Me-Not, and the Laurel. The yards at that time were filled with Lilacs and Roses.

The Year of The Leaf

With the late cold snaps holding back the warm weather, it seems that the blossoms and leaves became confused about the time they should venture out.

It seems that the fruit blossoms and lilacs waited ad waited before blooming out; and the leaves became impatient so that leaves and blossoms came out together.

Last year was the year of the blossom. Where in all other past years the Lilacs had one or two clusters, last year they had four and six. The apple trees had a double setting of blossoms so that the trees had a double load of apples. All through the apple areas there was the heaviest crop of apples in memory.

This year the Lilacs are blooming very lightly in the yard, while the leaves are larger and more abundant than usual.

Word comes from down in the main fruit belt off the Ruidoso Valley that there is a very light bloom and lots of leaves on the apple trees. Rufino Herrera says that is because of the unusually heavy crop last year. This year's

crop is medium, and the apples will be extra good, says Rufino.

Tull Stansell's cherry orchard, the largest in the county, last year bore a fine crop, and this year it seemed that the leaves were heavy and the blossoms light.

The leaf parade was slow in moving up the valley, and is now picking up the pace. Here in the neighborhood of the vale, the Oak trees have begun to leaf out rapidly, along with the box elder. The walnut are just beginning to bring out their leaf buds. The Oak brush on high is coming into extra heavy and brightly colored new green leaf.

The Cottonwood, Giant Willow, Glove Willow, and Weeping Willow are a sight to behold in shining new leaves in greater size and numbers than in many a year.

I am wondering if the long and hard spells of wind this year have brought out the great tide of leaves all through the mountain land. Surely this is message of great benefit to Mother Earth.

May Second

Now I am writing you in mid-morning of May second, and the Children of Mother Earth are celebrating the glad month of May. Steppin' Out is a shoe outlet owned by Arthur and Merrijon Newton who bought the business early last year from Anita Smith.


Across the street from the old Legends building, Rio, a gift shop, opened the latter part of April.



Economic Development, By George!

Economic development is everything

One nice thing about writing a column on economic development is that almost everything that happens with regard to government or business can be construed to be related to that subject.

Solid waste disposal, taxes, teachers salaries and, in the case of Ruidoso, even the weather has an impact. I honestly never thought that I would want it to snow, but now I see the white stuff as economic development.

There are both positive and negative occurrences that affect the economics of an area, like the price of oil and the insolvency of banks, on the one hand and a congressional decision to appropriate money to our favorite local military establishment on the other.

The current news story in Ruidoso is the question of the State's plan to widen Mechem Drive to a five-lane thoroughfare. It is difficult to see how such a drastic change in traffic and for that matter the landscape in general would benefit the community. The only fast traffic I have observed on Mechem consists of skiers on the way to Ski Apache and since the proposed five-lane highway reverts to its original two



lanes it is hard to understand why they would get there any quicker.

Meanwhile, a protracted construction period would cause irreparable financial damage to the merchants and businesses along Mechem. And this, coming at a time of some long-awaited measurable improvement in the local cash flow, could deliver a blow to some of those business people from which some might never recover.

From an economic development viewpoint, that kind of plan is regressive. Oh, yeah, the construction activity would add dollars to the local economy, but at what price?

As to the benefits of the proposed thoroughfare ... they are hard to visualize. As a community that relies heavily on tourist trade the speed of the traffic is of vital concern. Anyone familiar with site selection of retail establishments knows that traffic speed is crucial to a good location. The faster the traffic the less likely are motorists to "stop and shop."

Not that I am against progress. It is by some standards a long trek all the way down Sudderth and Mechem to get from one side of town to the other. But there are other ways of dealing with the situation. An improvement in Gavilan Canyon Road or other means of short cutting the high traffic route could be helpful for through-town traffic.

It is typical that the bureaucracy would come forth bearing gifts that are unwanted while real needs, like reduced taxes, are not only ignored but exacerbated by some of our politicians in Santa Fe.

I hope that those voices calling for pause in the consideration of the highway project will be steadfast in their resistance. Keep up the good work team!





Mid-schoolers adopt a trail

For some students, a class field trip is a free day, plenty of time to daydream between stops at the museum, business or government office.

But for 21 members of Bob Palko's 6th grade homeroom at Ruidoso Middle School, the annual Capitan Wilderness field trip means backbreaking work and a generous supply of bruises and scratches.

They don't seem to mind. It's all part of the U.S. Forest Service's Adopt-A-Trail program.

"I do this every year with my class," Palko said. This year, the effort strictly by coincidence occurred during the week of Earth Day.

The task for the day consists of clearing the trail by removing any obstacles including large rocks, broken tree limbs, even fallen trees if they can be sawed into sections and dragged away.

The particular trail adopted by Palko's class is a two-mile stretch of Capitan Peak Trail 64 up to Chimney Rock. The total distance covered by the trail is six miles.

To reach the trailhead on the north side of the Capitans at Pine Lodge takes about one hour, 45 minutes by car, Palko said.

Once on foot, students hiked three-quarters of a mile before entering the Capitan Wilderness, a 35,000 acre tract that was placed in the National Wilderness Preservation System in 1980.

"Since it's a wilderness, we can't use motorized tools, so we took two-man cross cut saws, bow saws and pruners," Palko said.

Trash also was picked up along the way and hauled back out. The all-day effort not only benefits the forestry and wilderness, it's also a great first-hand experience in taking care of the environment.

The Capitan Wilderness contains nearly 50 miles of trails and is 12 miles long from east to west. The elevations range from 5,500 feet above mean sea level to 10,201 feet.

Any family, individual or group may adopt a trail or section of a trail by contacting Sam Tobias at the Smokey Bear Ranger District.

The fact is the mayor is learning from our government.

If the law is inconvenient and you just don't want to follow it to the letter — no problem. Find an attorney general's opinion with ambiguous language and skirt the law. It's easy.

Months and months ago the State Highway Department wrote Wendell Chino about a billboard that was on state land. No one said when it had to be cleaned up.

Last week, Ruidoso Downs was digging more landfill cells across the street from its old village hall. They were burying limbs and trash in a fire burn area. Mayor Bonnie Addy said they'll probably dig it up and burn it once they obtain a burn permit.

She didn't say when all that would take place.

I'm not sure, but I don't think law skirting really has anything to do with what's morally right or wrong. That's probably another trend provincial slob will have to learn.

Not everybody can hire a lawyer, but it's not necessary. Just scale down your law skirting.

The next time you and your wife are driving down the highway and you have a McDonald's cup inside a recycled brown bag, check your rear view window. If you see no one, roll down the window and give it a toss. Then look at your wife and say, "I feel guilty about doing that." Then both of you can laugh.

That's what our government does.

Don't feel badly, the government wouldn't ask you to do something they wouldn't do ... would they?

The weather box that is published in each paper may not always be good news — you know, everybody's talking about it, but nobody's doing anything about it.


I had a hard time figuring out whether or not some stories were positive.

That was a pretty sad story, but I gave it a "plus" because those stories are a public service to the people of this county and the Humane Society.

As an aside, the Humane Society folks are thrilled with those pet stories, and have placed almost every "pet of the week" in a good home.

We had the chamber board welcoming new members and a bunch of briefs on page 2, Dan Storm on 3 and business stories on 4. On the bottom of this business page were official

records, not always the best of news, but just the facts.

On the sports page last Monday, we had tracksters qualifying for state, tennis results and coaches honoring players. On that page, we had the names of 53 RHS athletes and five coaches, as well as a picture of a Mid-school coach. We were a bit late on the coaches honoring players — all good news — but the some of the coaches were kind of slow in getting us all those names. We wanted to name as many kids as possible, so we waited, and finally even decreased the size of a house ad to get the story in on Monday.

The people page is always filled with names and pictures of people — last Monday we had an engaged couple's picture, a Cinderella queen's picture and the names of three college students and one service. We listed 17 community events in the "coming up" column. We can't make any guarantees as to the "positive" nature of that wedding or those events, but they're all published as a service to the community.

On page 7, we printed RHS honor roll with 141 names and an on-the-job day story with the names of 17 organizations that took part. We pictured the seven winners of the Corona Science Fair and the 30 young people confirmed last week at St. Eleanor's Catholic Church. We had a picture of 10 elementary

school students who achieved the 200-minute reading status — we included in that cutline the name of a business and club that are helping those good readers, as well as the school principal's name and the name of a school board member.

Where else could you pick up a newspaper with that many names and faces?

On the Opinion Page, where we give our opinions, your opinions and make you think; we congratulated R.D. Hubbard on his latest achievement (+), listed the names and addresses of some lawmakers (+), printed an editorial cartoon and three letters — one tribute, one warning and one welcome back (+++). The truth is, we print a lot of letters that might sound negative to some readers, but that page is the place to share ideas.

Reporter's Round on the Opinion page included some more things to think about, handled in a humorous way. I gave it a plus, but if thinking makes you uncomfortable, you might disagree.

Yep, we're going to print some news that may not be totally "positive," but it's still news. Like the trash dump that grew on the Chamber of Commerce parking lot — that was unusual, it was news and our readers needed to know. We printed the news that the dumping should stop — that was a service to the village.

Chuck was asked "Why not take a picture of the parking lot now that it's clean?" Well, that's not really news, because it's supposed to be clean all the time, but Chuck went down to take that "positive" picture anyway.

What he found was a line of dumpsters down by the river. Not a real pretty sight, and not very positive. He skipped it.

The next time you're wanting to read something positive, pick up The Ruidoso News. You just may find names and/or pictures of 241 bright kids like you would have last Monday. That's pretty positive.
