## EDC seeks funds

Board members of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County (EDC) this week will try to persuade the Lincoln County Commission to restore funding for the organization.

But, in spite of being on the brink of financial catastrophe, the board couldn't muster a quorum to conduct business. Two months ago the EDC also met without a quorum.


Last week, the Lincoln County Commission agreed to zero out funding for EDC next fiscal year.

The commission tentatively agreed to drop a quarter-mill levy which has been a main source of revenue to keep EDC in business.

The total county contribution to EDC this fiscal year has been \$86,973. EDC's total budget for this fiscal year is \$169,000.

At a monthly board meeting Thursday, EDC lacked one person of having a quorum, but discussion went on for nearly two hours about the funding problem.

## Racing begins with a lucky 7

Seven in one day... Trainer Jack Brooks and jockey Jacky Martin set a world record on opening day at Ruidoso Downs Race Track when they teamed up to go to the winners circle seven times.

The two were as surprised as fairy tale's "brave little tailor" who got "seven with one blow."

An opening day crowd of 3,189, up 30 percent over a year ago, bet \$313,969 on opening day for a hefty handle increase over last year's opener of 43 percent.

Ruidoso Downs Race Track co-owner R.D. Hubbard, joined by track officials and jockeys, opened the 79-day season and then the fun began.

Kansas time trials were first up on the fast mountain track, with Brooks, a five-time All American Futurity winner, qualifying time for the Kansas Futurity.

## AG, DA investigate closed meeting

Officials from the District Attorney's office were in Ruidoso Wednesday and Thursday as part of the investigation into the Ruidoso Village Council's recent closed meeting.

New Mexico Attorney General Tom Udall told **The Ruidoso News** Friday that the investigation will remain open until all of the facts have been received.

District Attorney Bert Atkins of Alamogordo and investigator Leandro Vega met with **The Ruidoso News** last Thursday to discuss the meeting. They also interviewed some of the 18 people who attended.

**The Ruidoso News** and New Mexico Foundation for Open Government (FOG) contended the council had violated the state Open Meetings Act when it moved into executive session without naming one of the seven exceptions of the act.

The state procurement code allows councils some latitude when dealing with closed bids on professional services.

Councils can avoid conflict between the Open Meetings Act and the procurement code by appointing a special screening committee to rank bidders.

Then in a public meeting, the screening committee would announce its first choice and the council would declare that it intends to go into executive session to discuss negotiations with the screening committee and the number one bidder.

If no meeting of the minds can be reached, the second bidder is called and so on down the list.

The Ruidoso Village Council chose to break with tradition and elected to go into closed session to discuss all bids simultaneously.

Mayor Victor Alonso indicated a choice would be made in closed session.

"We're going to make up our minds which one we like best whether we agree with our screening committee or not and then at the next meeting we'll make our decision public," he said.

Councilor Ron Andrews then made a motion to move into closed session without listing one of seven exceptions as provided by the state Open Meetings Act.

David Thomsen, Ruidoso village attorney, cited former deputy attorney general Jon Barela's opinion that the procurement code took precedence over the Open Meetings Act.

Contacted by FOG, Barela said that his opinion had been misinterpreted by Thomsen and that he didn't mean for the procurement code to be pitted against the Open Meetings Act.

Although Barela's opinion was a crucial part of the attorney general's investigation, no one from the district attorney's office or the attorney general's office contacted Barela, now a lawyer in the private sector, to ask him to clarify his opinion.

No one from the attorney general's office or the district attorney's office had contacted **The News**, one of the complainants, prior to Thomsen announcing last week through a new release that the council had been cleared by the state.

Thomsen's release was based in part on an advisory letter from deputy attorney general

Daniel Yohalem that bid information had to be protected, even at the expense of the Open Meetings Act. Yohalem also requested more information.

Thomsen sent a release to the Associated Press based on that advisory letter. However, the attorney general's office told **The News** that the investigation was continuing until all information had been received and reviewed.

Thomsen told **The News** that any remaining questions had been cleared up in a telephone call to Yohalem.

However, Yohalem later said he does not conclude investigations by telephone.

Udall said that village attorney David Thomsen was not speaking for the attorney general's office in his release to the Associated Press. He said that after a client receives a letter, they can do what they want. Although, he said, action normally is not taken from an advisory letter.

He said the attorney general's letter to Thomsen was strictly advisory and requested information.

Udall said that his office had received other complaints of compliance problems and is working on a compliance guideline for counties and cities regarding the handling of similar situations.

Udall said the guidelines to aid compliance would be available by July 12, which would coincide with a continuing education workshop for lawyers. He said the guidelines would offer specific examples that would cover a variety of situations.

## Apache Trails moves on, gets organized

Apache Trails has been formalized to a degree after officers were elected for the first time at a monthly meeting, Wednesday afternoon at the Inn of the Mountain Gods in Mescalero.

Jerry Watts, executive director of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, was elected president. Gary Wood of Cloudcroft is the vice president-treasurer, and Molly Schweers of Eagle Ranch in Otero County, is the secretary.

Apache Trails is an organization first envisioned by Wendell Chino, tribal president of the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe.

The organization, with members from Alamogordo to the Hondo Valley to Carrizozo, is designed to promote attractions in "Apache country."

A brochure with a map of the area and showing tourist attractions has been produced.

Wednesday, a "signage committee" was named by Watts to pursue getting the Apache Trails logo on existing highway signs in the area.

Also, a membership committee was appointed to identify potential members and determine recruiting strategy.

The signage committee will be meeting with New Mexico High Department personnel in Roswell to determine that department's com-

mitment to the signage project.

The signage committee consists of Ellen Mitchem of the International, Space Hall of Fame, Bob Hart of the Lincoln County Heritage Trust of Lincoln, Bob Evans, executive director of the Alamogordo Chamber of Commerce and Watts.

Names of the membership committee were Gloria Wood of Cloudcroft, John James of Alamogordo and James Hobbs of Ruidoso.

On possible matching funds from the state to meet future expenses, Watts reported "the most we will have to match is \$6,000."

He said that amount should be available next fiscal year from reverting funds.

Suzie Pitts of Newman Signs, Alamogordo, said she will try to get permission from customers who have contracted for billboards in the area to include the Apache

Trails logo.

She and Jack Pallick of Las Cruces, of Newman Signs, were present at the meeting.

They were informed that the young organization has no funds for billboards.

"I want to get involved personally," Pitts told the group.

Members were informed that Sun County members will gather at the Swiss Chalet May 17 for lunch and to hear a speaker.

The speaker will be Mike Pitel, travel writer with the New Mexico Department of Tourism.

Members were advised that there should be spillover into Cloudcroft and Ruidoso from a national hang glider gathering May 25-26 in Alamogordo.

Several hundred inquiries about the event have been received.

Next meeting will be a luncheon meeting in Alamogordo, June 12.

## Council will consider liquor, landscaping, animal shelter

Sidewalks, curbs, landscaping and signal lights are all part of the MainStreet project to be discussed at Tuesday's Ruidoso Village Council meeting.

The streetscape design is for Sudderth and Mechem Drive to Carter's Lane. Sealed proposals will be received by Ruidoso's purchasing agent no later than July 8 at 4 p.m.

The council will also conduct a public hearing on a transfer of ownership and location of a dispensers liquor license. Joetyne and C.L. "Bones" Wright applied for the transfer to be used at the Ruidoso Bowling Center.

The council will award a contract to the Humane Society of Lincoln County for providing kennel facilities for humane treatment of animals.

The Humane Society, located in Gavilan South Industrial Subdivision, will receive \$2500 per month for the one year contract.

A discussion concerning request for proposals for advertising will have information and a request to be presented prior to the council meeting.

The council will hear a proposal of a joint powers agreement between Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs for adult detention services in Ruidoso Police Adult Detention Facility.

Ruidoso Police Chief Richard Swenor said the Ruidoso Downs Police Department, as of Sunday, May 5, began booking detaining their arrested persons in the Ruidoso facility. The Village is billing the Downs a cost based fee of \$30 per booking-day for the first court appearance of arrested adults.

The village will also take action on a proposed ordinance regulating fireworks.

## County schedules open house

Lincoln County wants to show off its new Road Department office on State Highway 48 in Capitan near the district school complex turnoff.

Road Manager William Cupit will be host for an open house at 3 p.m. May 15. The public is welcomed to see their tax dollars at work.

## Ruidoso Downs board meets in new Municipal Building

The Ruidoso Downs Board of Trustees will conduct its first official meeting in its new quarters at 7 p.m. today (Monday), May 13. The Municipal Building recently moved into the old Redmen's Club up the hill from the old village hall on U.S. Highway 70.

Meetings of the board are open to the public.

The adult female cat was brought to the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter four months ago with a litter of kittens.

"She came in as a stray," said shelter manager Randy Basch. "She was found under a house with her kittens. She must have been owned at one time because she is so people oriented, but from her condition when she was found, she'd been on her own for a while."

The mother cat suffered from a respiratory virus and her eyes were watery, but Dr. Warren Franklin treated her and donated the necessary medication. She's in good health now and ready to go to a new home, Basch said.

Lacy also gets along well with dogs, he said.

"She usually rolls over as if to play," Basch said.

All animals adopted from the shelter must be spayed or neutered to ensure they do not reproduce more unwanted animals.

According to statistics from the National Humane Society, each year shelters across the nation kill 18-million dogs and cats, primarily because owners do not neuter and spay their animals to prevent unplanned offspring.

With the large number of strays, many pure breeds, available for adoption at shelters, it seems especially cruel to allow pups and kittens to be born only to be killed because they are unwanted, Basch said.

# MainStreet seeks new members

MainStreet Ruidoso will have its annual membership drive in June.

Mary Maul, project director, at a board meeting Thursday suggested a workshop for solicitors to be staged before the drive.

The workshop would bring board members and other solicitors "up to speed" on the status of MainStreet just prior to the drive.

Mike Line, new president of MainStreet, asked Bonnie Maddox to report on a "Spruce Up" campaign.

Maddox said members can order flowers and plants at reduced rates to help upgrade the MainStreet area.

Plants Ruidoso (across from the Ruidoso State Bank) is providing plants and flowers at reduced rates to MainStreet Ruidoso.

Maddox also is taking orders at Great Southwest and will have order for merchants at the MainStreet coffee, May 17, at Great Southwest. The telephone number there is 257-9884. The coffee is from 10 to 11 a.m. May 17.

During the board meeting, Maul said the police patrol in Midtown will start Memorial Day weekend.

Treasurer Alden Deyo reported that MainStreet Ruidoso had \$7,608.49 in the bank after a \$7,500 check was received from the Village of Ruidoso.

Maul reported that MainStreet

and the Village of Ruidoso will be seeking sealed proposals for professional engineering services.

The project involved is to provide engineering design services for improvements to storm drainage, sidewalks, curb and gutter, landscaping, lighting and signaliza-

tion along Sudderth from Mechem Drive to Carter's Lane.

The 1991 Legislature in House Bill 2 allocated \$30,000 for Phase I (Documents) and for co-op funds that will become available July 1.

Phase 1 of the sidewalks revamping, drainage work and such

will involve work from Fern Avenue to Country Club.

Proposals will be received up until July 8. A selection committee will make a recommendation to the Village Council on July 30.

Maul, who started a two-week vacation Friday, urged board members to become involved in budget hearings of the village this week.

In other action, board members: —Approved expenditure of \$128 to New Mexico Literature Exchange for distribution to racks of the MainStreet Shopping and Services Directory.

—Approved an expenditure of \$747 for repair of brackets and for new banners to grace lightpoles in the project area.

The "tulip" banners will be redesigned in a more simplistic pattern, Maul reported. Old banners are worn out, the project director said.

J.D. James, village councilor who is liaison between the village and MainStreet, told board members that "money is tight" and to expect some hard questioning at budget hearings conducted by the village.

Maul said that when she returns from her vacation and a sister's wedding in Chicago, she will give a full report on a National MainStreet Town Meeting event in Biloxi, Mississippi, in April.

## Master Plan ready

A MainStreet Redevelopment Master Plan for the Village of Ruidoso prepared under a contract by Fort Worth, Texas, planners Carter and Burgess, Inc. is complete.

Carter and Burgess was hired to do a study for redevelopment of Midtown Ruidoso.

Representatives of the firm will be in Ruidoso June 13 to make a final report.

The master plan, a 58-page document, is on file at Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center where it is available for inspection.

The plan deals with parking, pedestrian traffic, a river trail system, proposed park areas, traffic control, landscaping, existing land uses, need for public restrooms and many other topics.

Recommendations from

Carter and Burgess take up many pages of the document.

Planners say if traffic volume increases, changes will be needed, and outlined five alternatives, with a one-way pair of Sudderth and Wingfield offered as the best solution.

However, the planners say such a move would require a major capital investment, and additional acquisition of right of way.

The State Legislature allocated \$36,000 for the MainStreet study.

MainStreet project area includes Sudderth Drive and side streets from Pine Tree Square to the Gazebo Shopping Center.

Board members at the meeting talked banners, membership drive, application for co-op funds and other topics.

# Each school board gets to pick how to announce meetings to the public

No one objected. No one asked any questions.

In one swift motion, the Capitan School Board last Thursday approved for another year its policy that spells out how the public will be notified about regular, special and emergency meetings.

Not many people realize that public school boards in New Mexico literally can write their own rules when it comes to notification.

While the sessions must be open to the public — except for seven different reasons an elected board can use to close them — school boards have wide latitude on how they decide to tell the public.

For instance, at its discretion, the Capitan School Board would be in compliance with its policy simply by "posting a notice in the U.S. Post Office at least six hours prior to the beginning of an emergency meeting."

That means by posting a notice at 3 a.m. in the lobby of the U.S. Post Office in Ruidoso Downs — the board could meet legally at 9 a.m. the same day. The policy doesn't specify what post office must be chosen.

Chances are few people would see the notice. Chances are the Capitan board would never handle a notice in that manner.

But that's what the policy would allow.

Neither the Capitan nor Ruidoso school board policies require that community newspapers be notified of regular, special or emergency meetings.

As written, the Capitan school board policy provides three alternatives for notification of regular and special meetings.

The board can elect to publish the time, date and place of a regular meeting in a newspaper of general circulation in the school district not later than the day prior to

the meeting day.

Or it could post a written notice in the office of the school superintendent and at the U.S. Post Office three days prior to a meeting.

Or the board could announce those details at the previous regular meeting.

If any one of those three conditions are met, it's sufficient.

The policy on special meetings also provides for publication, or oral announcement at a prior meeting at least 24 hours before the special meeting, or posting in the superintendent's office and post office one day before the special meeting.

Both Capitan and Ruidoso school boards establish a general schedule of meetings in their policies.

Capitan's policy states that the board will meet on the second Thursday of each month, that the time will be 7:30 p.m. from Nov. 1-May 1 of each year and 7 p.m. otherwise, and that the meeting

place is the school administration building.

The Ruidoso School Board policy specifies that the meetings will be at 7:30 p.m., the second Tuesday of each month in the administration building unless the board votes to change the location and gives the public notice.

A calendar of regular meetings also is approved by the Ruidoso board in December.

The Ruidoso policy does not require that newspapers or radio stations be notified about regular meetings, but District Finance Officer Karen Snow said notices are mailed. Capitan often sends an agenda and explanatory information.

According to Ruidoso's policy, special meetings may be called by the board president at any time. Written notice must be delivered to board members 24 hours before the meeting or mailed 72 hours before the meeting.

## P&Z extends deadline on development plat

A preliminary plat extension for White Mountain Plaza and Ruidoso Performing Arts Center was granted by the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission (P&Z) Thursday.

D.T. "Tim" Collins, agent for White Mountain Development Company, requested an additional six months of the preliminary plat approval beyond the July 9 deadline.

The property known as Tract Z is bordered on Hull Road and reaches to the Links at Sierra Blanca Golf Course.

Patricia Thompson, an assistant secretary with White Mountain, said Bill McCarty, owner of the property, had executed an option on

behalf of his company granting to A.N. and Jackie Spencer an option to purchase nine acres for their performing arts center. The land would be included in White Mountain Plaza.

Thompson wrote that the Spencers have not yet signed the option and speculated that the couple is waiting to determine that the civic center and the hotel to be built on the airport property are satisfactory to them before making a commitment.

Because of the uncertainty of the Spencer purchase and the impediment to development by reason of the "wetland" designation, the zoning extension was approved under the condition that the plan for

drainage of the property be separately submitted for village approval.

P&Z also approved a replat for three lots in the Devon Hills Subdivision for applicant Emmett Hatch. The replat of three lots to two would cut demand on the village water and sewer system by one third.

Plat approval was conditional that the easement be vacated subject to the rights on any existing utilities.

The commission approved a replat for Paul and Betty Crown for the purpose of correcting encroachments and to obtain variances for a setback on two lots.

A replat to correct an encroach-

ment of a mobile home and a propane tank was approved for applicants McDaniels Inc. and Sandra Clark.

A replat was approved to correct an encroachment of a building on Lot 12A of the Palmer Gateway Subdivision onto the W.R. Long Tract and a fence of W.R. Long Tract encroaching on Lot 12A.

Lien holders previously exchanged deeds eliminating the encroachments.

A plat was approved for Wayne Moore and Helen Strong that cleared up a setback violation for two lots in the Pinecliff Subdivision.

Board members agreed that the president, Ronnie Paulger, should send a letter to individual commissioners; that letter was scheduled to be mailed, Friday.

The board also agreed to run half-page ads in two newspapers in the county listing all of the businesses and entities in the county which EDC says have benefited from jobs created through EDC efforts.

Board member Mike Line said he wanted to know if EDC "had done something wrong" to bring about the commission's blanking out funding.

Paulger and acting EDC executive director Anita Sanders attended the commission meeting.

"There was absolutely no feedback as to why there was no funding," Paulger told the directors. He said the only thing mentioned was a "tight budget."

"Every commissioner has a breakdown of what has been accomplished ... without a doubt we have made mistakes, but we haven't got that feedback," Paulger said. He said the county has the money, "It's a question of allocation."

Line said of remarks by Commissioner Monroy Montes, "What is he talking about, is he implying a misuse of funds?"

Montes had said at the commission meeting: "Up to this point, the county has put \$200,000 into the EDCLC operation, but how can anyone say they've done a good job or a bad job when they haven't presented figures to prove either way?"

Paulger said the board must decide by the June meeting whether to "gather up everything, put in storage and hope for better days" or to operate on a drastically reduced budget if funding is not restored.

"We have enough money to last until July 1," Paulger said. He told

the board he believes that either a job should be done right and professionally or not at all.

Some other board members expressed dismay that the operation may crater.

Member James Hobbs asked, "Is there something we don't know about?"

"Something has changed, and if there is something, we need to know about it," Paulger said.

Board members indicated they would query commission members as to reasons for cutting off funding. The next budget workshop for the county is Thursday at 6 p.m. at the courthouse. Board members were urged to be present.

"I think the public is behind us if we can just get them to say so," said Dorothy Smith, member from Capitan.

"We want to be professional and not rant and rave," Paulger said. "We want to try and stimulate

them to reconsider."

"If we go under, how long will it be before anyone has confidence to start again?" Smith asked.

Paulger said the search for a director will have to be put on hold. Jim Bassett, who heads the Texas-New Mexico Power Co. in Ruidoso, spoke as an interested citizen.

He said he is on the board of the Southeastern New Mexico Business quarter and that "Lincoln County enjoys a success rate envied by all. I hate to see it turned around," Bassett said.

"We're winning. If we must 'Mom and pop' I don't think we need to store anything," he declared.

Line asked if the commissioners are going to use the savings to renovate the courthouse.

"If so, I hope they build a tower," he said.

# "Queen of Seasons" bursts forth

**Spring Steps Forward  
Into Full Stride**

This is being sent to you a little after high noon on May 9; and today Mother Earth has dressed up her children in their springtime best and brightest, as the "Queen of Seasons," after holding back during the cold nights and windy days, has now shone forth in full glory.

All morning there were light clouds all in the west and overhead here in the Vale, with a cool breath of moisture in the light western breeze, bringing a faint echo of rain somewhere over the horizon.

Now a little after midday, the clouds have mostly drifted away and the bright sun shines down on the mountain world with a temperature of 88 on the left side of the house.

In this summery weather, the light breeze is fragrant with the incense of the rapidly growing leaves and shoots of evergreens, and the blossoms of wild cherries and berry bushes, and the mid-spring flowers of foothills, mesas and mountain.

Piñon, cedar and pine all flavor and balmy air with and evergreen taste, baked out by the warm sun. And this mingles with the mixed aroma of the leaves now growing at top speed — walnut, cottonwood, willow, oak, wild cherry, box elder, wild grape, mountain ash and Chinese elm.

The New Mexico pink, spring daisy, golden trumpet, and many kinds of small clover lend their fragrance to the sunny air.

**Cliff Cactus**

Over at the old cliff, across the highway from the old corral, today's first warm sun of the year has brought out the blooms of the cliff cactus high on the sheer face of the cliff, all in one day.





## Familiar faces head for the '91 Kansas Futurity

A couple of familiar faces unveiled promising 2-year-olds in Friday's second and final day of Kansas Futurity time trials.

Vital Class, from the barn of the incomparable Jack Brooks, is a half-brother to Vital Streak who won his first three outings here last summer.

The chestnut son of Easily Smashed and out of the Dash For Cash mare Vital Link, clocked a sharp final time of 18.06. Brooks also qualified Dashing Dove in Friday's eleventh race, giving him a total of four in the finals.

Magic Dozen, recent winner of the Grade I Graham Farms Futurity at Manor Downs, recovered from a slight stumble at the start of the ninth race and drew away to a sharp victory in 18.10, the fourth fastest time of Friday's trials.

Despite Magic Dozen's victory, regular jockey Nicky Wilson was concerned.



### MainStreet brightens the Village of Ruidoso


MainStreet Ruidoso is at it again. That busy bunch is making it easy to spruce up the town this year.

### You can't fit a square peg in a round hole

#### TO THE EDITOR:

Following is the text of a letter written by State Representative H. John Underwood and sent to Lou Medrano, secretary of the State Highway and Transportation Department regarding Project RS-1226 (12) CN 1738:

I want to thank you for taking time out of your busy schedule to attend the design public hearing on the Highway 48 project held in Ruidoso on April 24. I felt that your staff conducted the meeting and themselves in a very professional manner.

The environmental impact that the project would create is of particular concern to me, as the increased erosion, the cutting of long-standing trees, and the increased noise that was testified to all seem to indicate that the project, as

designed, would detract from the intrinsic beauty of our mountain community.

I am also very concerned with the impact that the proposed project would have on the businesses along its route, for it appears that the ingress and egress to and from those businesses would be severely impacted by the increased grades created. I fear that rather than promoting increased business, that the project may indeed have a chilling effect on the public's ability to easily access those businesses.

My thought is that the project, as currently designed, is not suited to the special situation existing in Ruidoso, and I would like to work toward a project which maintains our unique mountain atmosphere, and yet creates a safe highway for our locals and our tourists alike. As

you stated to me, it is obvious that something needs to be done with Highway 48, and I would suggest that the project be redesigned so that it consists of fewer than five lanes, provides safe travel, retains our mountain village atmosphere and offers good ingress and egress to and from the businesses on Mechem Drive.

I spoke with Irene Lazcano, the Area Engineer with the Federal Highway Administration, and expressed both my concern over the current design and my desire to have a project that is safe yet suited to the particular situation existing here, and asked for her help in maintaining federal involvement in the project. It is my belief that since she was present at the meeting and heard the concerns of our local citizens, that she is willing

to help us in any way possible, including attempting to make this a "special project" which would still qualify for federal funding.

I just feel that we might be trying to squeeze a square peg into a round hole. I would like to see us all work together in designing a round peg. I feel that this project is one which calls on us to bring design and technology into line with aesthetic and environmental reality, so that we can truly say that we are building a better place to live.

I thank you for your helping hand, your patience and most of all for your dedication to the people of the Great State of New Mexico.

### Doesn't buy "speed right through" editorial

#### TO THE EDITOR:

My! My! Let's back up and take a look at this "speed right through" argument.

Until a couple of years ago, as I recall, the speed limit on Mechem Drive in town was 45 miles per hour (mph). The current, posted speed limit is 45 mph except for the far south end of Mechem from just north of the First Baptist Church. The proposed wider Mechem Drive is to have a design speed of 40 mph.

From 'The News' argument, I assume that visitors cannot "speed

right through town" on Mechem now. If visitors do not speed through town on the existing Mechem Drive at 40 mph, why would they speed through town on the widened Mechem Drive at 40 mph?

Roads like Mechem Drive are to facilitate the movement of motor vehicles from point A to point B. A widened Mechem Drive would have a greater traffic-carrying capacity. Isn't better traffic-carrying capacity on Mechem Drive one of the things

we need?

I am reminded of a situation that occurred many years ago, say 1949 or 1950, relative to Mechem Drive. Mechem Drive was unpaved and, boy, was it rough and dusty. After many years of Ruidoso asking for improvement to Mechem Drive, the highway department agreed to pave the existing two-lane road. At the next Village Council meeting a delegation appeared who lived and had businesses along Mechem Drive. The delegation demanded

that Mechem not be paved; people were just going to make a "race track" out of Mechem Drive. Ike Wingfield, who was on the council, commented that he thought it would be a good idea to get the new paving in and see how fast the traffic moved. After considerable debate, all agreed that this was a good idea. The road was paved and the "race track" idea died a quiet death.

### Writer disagrees with Tully on letter issues

#### TO THE EDITOR:

I feel compelled to respond to Jim Tully's letter in your April 25th paper. A self-styled water protector, he gives himself several other titles, land surveyor and chairman of Water Users Association.

I recall one time Tully ran for Lincoln County Surveyor; the only person who ran for this office. He won! He couldn't serve. He couldn't qualify for the title.

The last meeting of the Ruidoso Water Users Association was held over 30 years ago. President Bert Pfingsten; president, secretary Ken Nosker; board members Ralph Bonnell, Peter Hurd, Tom Babers, Wilbur Coe, and attorney Daniel A. Brenton. This association was formed and incorporated to prevent the Village of Ruidoso from pump-

ing from the river without legal water rights. Judge Bill Scoggins, district judge, agreed with farmers and the village bought the White Mountain Inn property near Ruidoso Downs and transferred water rights to the Upper Canyon at the present point of taking.

Tully was never chairman of any organization I know of; except his self-appointed one; he uses for his own purposes. The Ruidoso Water Users Association has been a defunct corporation for over 20 years.

As of this week, there are no records of Tully having put one dime toward the Water Defense Association's legal battle to save our water rights.

As to the proposed landfill application in the Valley by the Vil-

lage of Ruidoso Downs, it is not in an arroyo as Tully claims; neither is it apt to pollute any underground water.

Tully's airport claims are as insane as his playing at being a chairman of something he isn't. I was chairman of the Sierra Blanca Airport Commission during the pre-planning and construction of the new airport, which was funded by the state and Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) with \$11 million spent in our area for construction of one of the best small city airports in the country. This money was spent during the time our economy really needed the injection of some financial activity. After the oil industry bubble of our state burst, all these funds were spent legally and followed the guidelines set up

by the FAA. The board consisted of representatives from Lincoln County, Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs, Capitan and the State of New Mexico. There may have been places where money could have been saved; however, when you use federal monies you follow their guidelines and directives or kiss the money goodbye.

I'm proud of our airport and challenge anyone to debate going back to the accident-prone OLD ONE.
