Gasoline fire damages home

Very young children "playing with gasoline" caused a structure fire on the Mescalero reservation Wednesday, a fire which destroyed the living room of the home and severely smoke damaged the rest of the home.

Children found chainsaw gasoline on a porch and poured the liquid on a wood stove in the living room of the Florine Smith place, according to Mescalero fire marshal Dale Webb.

The resulting fire brought quick response from the Mescalero Fire Department and forestry personnel, Webb said. Firemen quickly ventilated the house which was extremely hot and because of gasoline fumes. There were no injuries. Adults at the home were outside when the fire occurred, Webb said.

A week ago Wednesday, a one-ton pickup was destroyed by fire at the summit. An Arizona horseman was pulling a horse trailer when he saw smoke pouring from the truck.

He unhooked the horse trailer and pulled it away. The truck burned, Webb said.

Humane Society's first litter of foster pups ready to adopt

Five healthy, affectionate frolicking puppies are up for adoption at the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter.

They are the first puppies to benefit from the new foster home program started two months ago by the shelter.

Shelter manager Randy Basch called on families and individuals within the community to provide temporary love and care for litters that arrive at the shelter without inoculations to protect them from deadly diseases such as Parvo.

When puppies are dropped there without that protection, it's doubtful they will survive even if they are given the shots immediately, he said. It takes 10 days for the immunizations to become effective.

Even though he would explain the situation to persons dropping litters at the shelter, few were willing to keep the animals for 10 more days just to ensure their survival, Basch said. He was forced to destroy many full litters.

But the five female blue heeler/walker hound mix puppies are living proof that the foster concept will work.

Brett and Kelly Foster (the name is purely a coincidence) volunteered their home as a temporary stop for unwanted litters brought to the shelter.

The pups are now two months old and back at the shelter. They've had their first two shots of the shelter by the Ruidoso impounding officer after the owner of the mother dog agreed to have her spayed, Basch said.

Although there is no fee for adoption, new owners must pay the cost of a city license, rabies shot and mandatory spaying. The total for female dogs is \$57.50. Basch said new owners will be given certificates that can be turned into their local veterinarian when the time is appropriate as proof that they already have paid for the spaying and rabies shot.

The shelter has many male and female dogs and cats available for adoption. Some already are neutered or spayed. But Basch needs sponsors for other animals, whose chances for adoption are lower because the cost of the operation often discourages prospective

owners with big hearts but small budgets.

Abandoned mines pose health hazards in County

Great gaping holes mar the Lincoln County landscape as silent testimony to the century-old search for gold in the Sacramento Mountains.

The abandoned mine shafts, many on private land, today represent a safety hazard that the state would like to see eliminated.

And the Abandoned Mine Land Bureau of the State Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department is trying to come up with plans and money to do just that.

The bureau has targeted two areas for hazard abatement work: the Red Cloud mining district west of Corona and the Nogal mining district east of the county seat of Carrizozo.

A meeting to review those plans has been scheduled for 7 p.m. Friday, May 31, at the Carrizozo City Hall.

Geologist Rick Koehler from the bureau's Santa Fe office told The Ruidoso News that money for the projects comes from revenue collected by the federal government from coal mines.

"The money is to be used to take care of abandoned coal mines, but sometimes when there is an emergency situation, it also can be applied to non-coal mines," he said.

The death of a young man as a result of a fall into a mining shaft on Rough Mountain at Red Cloud late last year prompted the bureau to declare an emergency.

The Nogal location emerged as a candidate because, "The U.S. Forestry Service said there was

some possibly contaminated water related to a mine feeding into Bonito Lake," Koehler said.

Forest Ranger Sam Tobias said he discovered a pool of yellow-tinted water near a mine above Bonito Lake earlier this year.

It was fed by an artesian flow out of a nearby well and, in turn, the pond spilled into a stream that emptied into Bonito Lake.

Tobias called for an onsite examination by officials from the State Environment Department, the forest service mining specialist and the City of Alamogordo (which derives part of its water supply from Bonito), as well as Koehler.

"In Colorado, flow like that normally would be acidic," Tobias said. "I wanted to take advantage of their expertise and funding. But after all the testing was in, the water was not in fact acidic. Rather it was iron in the water from a sub-surface iron deposit. We are not talking a problem with water quality, but it was an effort to insure that."

Koehler said when he was on the onsite trip, "We noticed all sorts of shafts on the right side of the highway around Bonito. And there are little kids running in and out of the area."

It was a good location to propose for closing work because of the high recreation use, Tobias said.

"Hopefully, we will be able to affect a safe solution without adversely impacting the historic area," he said.

Koehler said many old claims were staked on federal property.

"They usually consist of a 30-foot deep shaft and are called prospects,

not mines," he said. "But that's plenty deep for someone to get killed."

Mines were gouged out of the mountains around Corona first in a search for gold, then copper, lead and zinc. Later they turned to an element needed in the manufacturing of steel. Modern-day miners are looking again at the metallics, but this time to be used in items such as super conductors, Koehler said.

The shafts that cause the bureau's blood pressure to rise are those with a high degree of accessibility.

Sometimes the claim or land is owned by a company or individual, who is reluctant to close it and shut off future exploration.

"We have police powers in coal," Koehler said. "We can go right in. But we have no power to force closing of non-coal mines. That means we also can't force someone to pay."

"The bureau tries to convince them this is a way for them to eliminate a liability at our expense."

The design for closure has to be certified as safe by a certified engineer, he said. Backfilling is the safest.

"A grate could be removed," he said. But some owners think they prefer a grate. Or if a shaft contains a significant population of bats, the bureau must devise something that will allow the bats to come and go, but not people.

"If we're lucky, we'll be working on both projects before winter," Koehler said. "Obtaining all of the clearances takes time. There are many environmental concerns."

Bronze Galapagos turtle is lost

Two Galapagos Tortoise bronzes were recently stolen from the Mansion Club in Phoenix, Arizona.

These bronzes are the works of Tom Knapp of Ruidoso and are parts of two limited editions of eight. The large tortoise is number two of eight and the smaller female is number seven of eight.

Knapp has bronze tortoises in the Gladys Porter Zoo in Brownsville, Texas, the Children's Museum in Midland, Texas, Benson Sculpture Park in Loveland, Colorado, and in private collections in Monahans, Texas; Chicago, Illinois; Boston, Massachusetts, and San Antonio, Texas.

Taxpayers ask IRS ...

These are typical questions asked by taxpayers and are presented as a public service of this publication and the IRS.

Q: I have heard a lot about money laundering. Just what is it?

A: Money laundering involves converting money from illegal sources through one or more transactions to make the money appear legitimate. This is often done by making large purchases or obtaining services with cash.

Q: I have my own business. Do I need to be aware of money laundering every time someone pays me in cash?

A: No. Only if you receive more than \$10,000 in cash, in one or a series of related payments within one year, do you need to report the payments. In addition, these payments must relate to your trade or business.

Q: What do I do if I receive over \$10,000 in cash, or if someone is making a series of related payments to me that total more than \$10,000, during the course of my business?

A: You should report the payments to the Internal Revenue Service.

Poulos has won some kind of award every year in California for his expertise in the pizza business.


His achievements have been written up in newspapers and magazines in California, his scrapbook shows.



Beautycraft is doing business here utilizing skills of Navajo Indians

Navajos have invaded Apache country. A manufacturing operation in this area where artistic talent is involved is providing employment to about 15 skilled Navajo Indians who were brought to the Huidoso area from Magdalena.

Beautycraft, with a manufacturing operation at 131 Highway 70 East and a new retail outlet at 925 Sudderth, produces mandellas and other Indian crafts, such as medicine sticks, Southwest leathers and other craft work.

Most employees of Beautycraft, about 90 percent, are Navajo.

A 47-year resident of Huidoso, Willene "Billy" Hull, founded Beautycraft and designs the mandellas and other craft products.

"She did it all herself," says her husband, Dick Hull, who worked as a butcher for Warren Tucker in the old Tucker grocery store, located many years ago in the complex just east of Don Victor's Restaurant building.

"Warren Tucker was like a father to me," says Dick Hull, who is disabled.

Two sons and a daughter-in-law also are involved in Beautycraft. One son, Pete, is heading up the new retail operation.

Mike, the second son, and his wife, Mary, are helping out where needed. She keeps the books.

Beautycraft ships from 1,000 to 1,500 mandellas or Indian wall hangings to a jobber in El Paso each week.

Shipments are made to other jobbers and stores across the country, especially to Florida, the Hulls report. Some 35 stores in Montana feature Beautycraft crafts.

And a connection only last week has been made with Disney World and Disneyland, Dick Hull told The Huidoso News.

"It's firm," he said, adding that Disney will handle Beautycraft products in its gift shops. The Disney operation in Tokyo, Japan, also will handle the crafts, Hull said.

The Navajo craft people working at Beautycraft work full work days five days a week. They are started

at minimum wage. Willene Hull moved here with her parents and brothers 47 years ago. She has been involved full time in Beautycraft for the past 10 years.

A son's work in leather got her interested in crafts. She certainly followed up that interest.

Her dad, Zeke Scott, was mayor of Huidoso Downs at one time. He was a carpenter.

Her mother suffered from asthma, and an uncle had recommended New Mexico. The family wound up in Huidoso from Holdenville and McAlester, Oklahoma.

Willene has two brothers, Major and Duke Scott, who lived in Alamogordo.

Before getting into the craft business big time, Willene "Billy" Hull operated two motels, the Holiday House and Spear Head. She opened the Swiss Chalet just after Sam Parker built it, she says.

She also was a waitress here for

many years. Pure white wool used in the all-wool mandellas or wall hangings comes from the Carolinas and Nebraska. Wool produced west of the Mississippi, Willene Hull says she heard from a dealer, has a "yellowish tinge."

She does use some New Mexico wool, which is rated as some of the best in the world.

Dick Hull says Roy Seay of the First National Bank provided some help to Beautycraft. Seay heads up the Business Assistance branch of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County.

Beautycraft helps keep UPS busy with tons of products leaving Huidoso over a period of time.

Payroll at Beautycraft each year approaches \$130,000.

Beautycraft is a small industry which is entrenched. It's a chapter in what economic development for Lincoln County is all about.

To quote Dick Hull: "She did it all herself."



Ruidoso residents should benefit from this best kept secret.

The report does mention stocking the Ruidoso River with 1,250 10 3/4-inch rainbow trout.

Last Saturday a man fishing on the bridge off Country Club Drive caught his limit within an hour. Fishing is a little slow at Bonito

Creek's north fork. The anglers have been using worms for trout. The crews stocked 200 10 3/4-inch trout at North Fork. Below the dam, the crews stocked 510 10 3/4-inch rainbow trout. In the lake, the crews stocked 2,670 10 3/4-inch rainbow trout. That should put some more action in fishing Bonito.

Tularosa River fishing has been fair using salmon eggs for trout. Crews stocked that area with 1,250 10 3/4-inch rainbow trout.

Magic Dozen wins the Kansas

RUIDOSO DOWNS-Nicky Wilson knew better.

The veteran jockey was thoroughly convinced that Magic Dozen uncorked a sub-par effort when he barely snuck into the Kansas Futurity finals with the eighth-fastest qualifying time.

There was nothing, however, sub-par about undefeated Magic Dozen in Sunday's \$392,129 Kansas Futurity.

The stout son of Easy Dozen screamed away from the starting gate on the lead, put about a half-length on the field in mid-stretch, and held on by a diminishing nose against Vital Class.

Magic Dozen, by virtue of his second Grade I victory of the season, powers to the forefront of the 2-year-old crop. In five career outings, he has yet to be beaten to the

wire. "I told you this horse wasn't really himself in the trials. He was really dull," said Wilson, who lives in Bandera, Tex. "Today, he was a different horse from the paddock on. He was on his toes all the way."

Magic Dozen's time for the 350 yards — :17.73 into a fierce headwind — was also decidedly better than his qualifying time of :18.10. The time was the slowest in the Grade I race since 1984 when Flying Arkly won it in :18.01.

"From the paddock on he was a different horse," said owner Jerry Windham of Bryan, Tex. "This was quite a thrill. But we were sweating at the wire. That one horse (Vital Class) was really coming."

Magic Dozen, who increased his earnings to \$278,695, was the 7-to-2 second choice of the holiday

weekend crowd of 8,378. Vital Class, the less highly-regarded part of the Clarence Scharbauer entry behind Pullasix, was the overwhelming 4-to-5 favorite in the field of 10.

Pullasix, the fastest qualifier from the trials, was fourth, a nose behind longshot Georgia Lindy, who was third.

Jockey Jacky Martin, who was riding the favored Pullasix for trainer Jack Brooks, offered only mild excuses for his colt.

"He lugged in real bad early in the race. He couldn't run straight, so I couldn't ride him," Martin said. "Other than that, he just got out-ran."

Another of the Brooks' foursome, Steppin For The Moon who also entered the Kansas Futurity undefeated in four trips to post, acted

up in the gate and finished last. The son of Moon Lark, who has a history of gate problems, wore a flipping rig for the first time.

"He hated the rig," said Brooks. "But the horse had tried to climb three times in a row. I had to try something. Next time, I guess we'll have to run him without it."

Another highly-regarded youngster, Leaving Memories, from the stable of Dwayne Gilbreath, finished seventh with no apparent excuses.

The complete order of finish was Magic Dozen, Vital Class, Georgia Lindy, Pullasix, Royal Quick Dash, Bills Ryon, Leaving Memories, Dashing Dove, World Class Man and Steppin For The Moon.

Charmin Abercrombie shows \$75,000 heart

RUIDOSO DOWNS-Charmin Abercrombie is not getting older. He's getting better.

Displaying the heart of a champion down the stretch, Charmin Abercrombie — a 6-year-old gelding — turned back the stretch-long bid of Forever Best — an 8-year-old — en route to an exciting nose victory Saturday in the \$75,000-added Budweiser Breeders' Cup Handicap.

"He's got a big heart," said Glen Murphy, who gave Charmin Abercrombie a perfect ground-saving trip. "He puts everything he has into it whenever a horse is trying to pass him in the stretch."

Charmin Abercrombie, showing sharp speed from the starting gate, joined pacesetter Happyasahark Tomas down the backstretch. When the latter tired suddenly entering the far turn, Murphy dropped his mount over along the rail and out-finished fast-closing Forever Best.

"I just sat on him for a long time, waiting as long as I could before I asked him," said Murphy. "I wanted to wait until the come-from-behinders came up on him. He did it just like a pro."

Charmin Abercrombie, who is owned by Mary Kimberlin and trained by William Thompson, has now captured 16 of 63 career starts. He covered the flat mile in 1:41.2.

In the co-featured \$10,000-added Fine Loom Handicap, James Capps' Six Shooter Tex defended his crown with an impressive 1 1/4-length victory. Six Shooter Tex, one of the top 870-yard horses in the country, had not raced since last Dec. 15.

The 7-year-old gelding, however, looked better than ever in his return. Six Shooter Tex engaged for the lead soon after the start and held off the late charge of favored A Master At Work down the stretch.

Six Shooter Tex, a career-earner of more than \$100,000, covered the 870 yards in a solid final time of 46.17. Last year, the New Mexico-bred son of Cut Shot won the Fine Loom in 46.30. Six Shooter Tex, who is trained by Arnold Simmons, was ridden by Alex Baldillez.

In the Kansas Futurity Consolation, Jacqueline Spencer's Challenger Six rallied boldly in the final yards to post a nose decision over Oh How You Shine.

Challenger Six, the most experienced member of the consolation field with six races under his belt, covered the 350-yards in a snappy 17.85 despite a stiff headwind.

The New Mexico-bred son of Six Fortunes, who earned \$17,109 for his victory, has now captured three of six career starts. Challenger Six, who is trained by Darla Crenshaw, was ridden by Glen Murphy.

Cagney And Lace posts top times in Norgor Derby trials

RUIDOSO DOWNS-T.J. Hoyt's Cagney And Lace simply toying with his field, drew away to a 2-length victory in the second and final division of the Friday's Norgor Derby trials.

The top 12 finishers from Friday's two trial heats advanced to the June 8 Norgor Derby, a \$12,500-added 6 furlong test.

Cagney And Lace, who has won four of his last five races including the Duke City Handicap at Albuquerque, carved out rapid fractions of 21.4 and 44.3, before coasting under the wire in 1:11.3.

The Texas-bred son of Enemy Number One, who is trained by Brent Davidson, has now captured seven of 12 career starts. He was ridden by Bobby Don Harmon.

In the first trial heat, Richard Parrish's Imsortaspecial broke a fretful streak of five consecutive in-the-money finishes without a victory by powering away to an impressive 1-length triumph.

The New Mexico-bred son of Dawn Of Creation contested the lead throughout, then pulled away from second-place finisher Dawn Street through the stretch. Imsortaspecial covered the 6 furlongs in 1:12.1.

The complete list of Norgor Derby qualifiers includes Imsortaspecial, Dawn Street, Combate, True Express, Country Forest, Lobo Lobo, Cagney And Lace, I Come Ready, Jerrico Miss, Uncle Nasty and Thumper's Ego.

Native Sovereign wins feature

"Fair is Fair," but reader says charging for services that can't be delivered isn't fair

TO THE EDITOR:

For the past couple of weeks and months I have been casually observing the actions of the Lincoln Waste Authority and the proposals that have come from them. I can no longer stand by as a casual observer when I see the improprieties about to be imposed on all Lincoln County Citizens.

As I understand it, all residents

would be charged a fee (\$8-\$12 per month) for garbage pick up which would be tied in to your property taxes. I feel this is grossly unfair and illegal, to be charged for services not rendered. The people in rural, unincorporated areas would, in essence, be paying for those in incorporated villages since not all residents would have access to this service. I see this as a slick way for

the Authority to finance itself at the expense of the taxpayers.

In the May 20 Editorial of *The Ruidoso News* it was stated that it was unfair for village residents to pay double and to pay for those in unincorporated areas. The first part I agree with, but the fallacy is, there is no garbage service in unincorporated areas nor will there ever be in some areas.

It could be argued that as taxpayers we sometimes pay for services such as schools and hospitals that we don't always use. But we are paying for those services to be available if they are needed or we choose to utilize them. However, in the case of garbage services for rural areas, it is not feasible for ranchers and others in remote areas to expect garbage pick up nor

be expected to pay for such services if they are not available. I think the Authority would leave itself open for civil law suits if that is indeed the case.

I understand I will probably be a minority on this issue and will be voted down simply because of numbers and the fact that the Waste Authority is composed mainly of mayors from incorporated villages.

I know the answers to "our" waste problems are not going to be simple. I only ask that all sides be carefully examined and no quick decisions be made for purely political or personal reasons.

To quote *The Ruidoso News* editorial again, "Fair is Fair" but THIS is not fair.

Upon Reflection

Does the name Elbridge Gerry ring a bell?

Part 3 in a series

When legislatures reapportion themselves, Elbridge Gerry's name invariably pops into the headlines.

Gerry's durability as a newsmaker has nothing to do with the fact that he signed the Declaration of Independence or that he was vice president under James Madison. Rather he remains newsworthy because of actions he took as governor of Massachusetts in the early years of the Republic.

After the Revolution, demographers (although they did not call themselves such in those days) began to notice significant shifts in the new nation's population. In Massachusetts, for example, growth in shipbuilding and commerce had transformed tiny former-colonial villages into small cities. It should have been expected, of course.

Even in agrarian America, some amongst us migrated from one place to another in search of jobs and opportunity.


For Gerry, however, it represented a problem. His own political faction's control of Massachusetts state government was already tenuous, and the latest census showed population shifts downright threatening to his political future.

The question was: How to curtail the damage? The answer, Gerry advised cronies in the legislature, was to draw new legislative districts so as to minimize the electoral clout of their political opponents while maximizing their own strength.

And so the lines were drawn. One, in particular, was of such meandering and distorted configuration as to resemble a salamander to the eye of a skeptical Boston political cartoonist who thought he knew a rat when he smelled one.

This was added to our political vocabulary the term "gerrymandering," the practice whereby whatever faction controls reapportionment redesigns district boundaries so as to assure their continued dominance.

It is now nearly a decade since the last round of reapportionment in New Mexico. At that time, 1980 census data revealed a 28 percent increase in state population; and the



legislature

was controlled by a coalition dominated by Republicans allied with breakaway conservative Democrats. It was known as the "conservative coalition," and significant portions of the reapportionment scheme it contrived was struck down by three federal judges who detected racial gerrymandering in the scheme.

Today, armed with 1990 census information, the legislature is preparing once again to reapportion. New Mexico, the data tell us, is more populous by 16.2 percent than it was 10 years ago; its legislature and office of governor firmly under Democratic control.

The question is, to what extent will Democrats use control over reapportionment to insure their future legislative dominance?

State GOP leaders naturally fear the worse. But Democratic state Sen. Tom Rutherford, co-chair of the legislature's Reapportionment Committee, insists there will be no gerrymandering this time around.

"There will be a cry of politics from Republicans," Rutherford admits, "but a lot of that will simply reflect the need to undo injustices perpetrated by the Republican coalition ten years ago."

Partisan pronouncements notwithstanding, 1990 census figures reflect shifts in New Mexico's population distribution which inevitably dictate "winners" and "losers" when reapportionment is over. Perhaps the biggest losers are apt to be "the state's rural areas, especially the east side," says Brian Sanderoff of Research and Polling Associates which has been retained by the legislature as its reapportionment consultants.

And which of the state's sundry political factions is most apt to be harmed? "Conservatives, Democrats and Republicans alike," Sanderoff predicts. "Look at Lea County," he suggests, "where despite nearly stagnant growth in the general population, there has been a dramatic 39.5 percent increase in the Hispanic population" which traditionally had not supported conservative legislative candidates of either party.

Ironically, however, conservative setbacks in rural New Mexico may not signify a new era of dominance by progressive Democrats at the legislature.

Why? Because, Sanderoff explains, "the big winners in the 1990 census are those communities up and down the Rio Grande — from Santa Fe to Las Cruces — especially the Albuquerque area where growth in the (city's) northeast heights and suburbs west of the river has been impressive, and should counterbalance (conservative losses in eastern New Mexico) by helping suburban Republicans."

What we are dealing with here, in other words, is potentially a wash. Progressive Hispanic Democrats may enjoy improved political prospects in portions of eastern New Mexico where they have often fared poorly in the past. On the other hand, conservative Republicans could gain strength in urban places like Albuquerque.

In short, the pie will have to be sliced differently than presently in the case. But it is apt to taste pretty much the same.

Not that Democrats who control reapportionment won't be inclined to heed old Elbridge Gerry's counsel and maximize their advantages. Still there will be limits on their ability to maneuver with impunity.

Under terms of the 1982 federal court order which governs reapportionment in New Mexico this time out, the U.S. Justice Department must approve any reapportionment measure the legislature adopts. And the U.S. Justice Department these days belongs to Republicans under a president by the name of George Bush.

Elbridge Gerry never had to worry about things like that.
