Police arrest local on drug charges

An intense six-month-long drug investigation ended Friday when a prominent Ruidoso businessman was arrested at his home on two counts of cocaine trafficking and a charge of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon.

Merle Miller, 44, was led away in handcuffs from his duplex apartment at 101 Eagle Drive shortly before noon by Ruidoso detectives and narcotics enforcement officials, assisted by the State Police.


Magistrate Judge J.R. "Jim" Wheeler set bail at \$100,000 and Miller was transported to the Lincoln County Jail in Carrizozo.

According to Ruidoso Criminal Investigations Commander Lanny

Maddox and Detective Corporal Lou Wardwell, an Otero County narcotics enforcement unit and the Ruidoso Police Department under the direction of Chief Richard Swenor, have been working jointly on the drug investigation since March.

"Intelligence has been gathered for the past six months," Maddox said. "We have found a list of clientele that have been purchasing cocaine. That list includes persons from Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs and Alamogordo. The names on that list are being checked out at this time. The investigation is continuing. More developments should appear within the next two weeks."

New Yorker wins award

When R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard started out on their "pursuit of excellence," they left nothing to chance.

The results of that well-orchestrated pursuit — a glitzy, sit-down dinner complete with celebrities, the governor and some of the best artists in America — came together Saturday with the Second Hubbard Art Award for Excellence in Ruidoso Downs.

The Hubbards, joined on stage by entertainer Tim Conway, handed New York artist Ronald Sherr a check for a quarter of a million dollars. His work, "Portrait of Elaine" was judged the best of the 102 pieces submitted by the 51 American masters nominated for the show.

That presentation, the largest cash purchase prize offered for one piece in a show, came after Friday's successful \$1.8 million show and sale.

Hubbard Museum director John V. Hall announced Saturday that this year's sale already was \$92,000 ahead of the same time last year, but some art was still available for sale.

"We will stop the band to sell you a piece of art," said Hall.

Governor Bruce King echoed that sentiment. "Go ahead and spend your money," said King, who went on to recognize the Hubbards for their contributions to the art world and to this state.

Sherr, who lives in New York City, has traveled and studied throughout the world. The 39-year-old painter's many awards include an Allied Artists of America Gold Medal for cover art for "Time Magazine."

Finalists for the \$250,000 prize included William Acheff with both of his oil paintings: "War Bonnet & Peace Pipe" and "Purple Maize," priced at \$35,000 each. Both Acheff pieces sold Friday.

Paul Calle, whose work took the People's Choice award last year, was among the finalists for "In the Beginning ... Friends," which sold Friday for \$110,000.

Wilson Hurley's "Line Squall" was among the top six. That painting is priced at \$50,000.

"Five Apricots," a watercolor by John Stuart Ingle, was also in the finals. "Five Apricots" sold Friday for \$42,000.


Judges for the Pursuit of Excellence Hubbard Art Award included John Arthur, a Boston, Massachusetts, art consultant; Jacqueline Pontello, an editor with Southwest Art; Bill Frazier, an attorney and art columnist from Big Timber, Montana; and

John Bowlin, director of the New Orleans Museum in New Orleans, Louisiana. A fifth ballot was cast as the "People's Choice" after voting by guests at Friday's show and sale.

The Hubbards cast the deciding vote for the winning art award. "Portrait of Elaine" will be added to the Hubbard's extensive art collection.

Sherr and last year's winner, Howard Terpning, had words of praise for the Hubbards, thanking and congratulating them for their support and recognition of the realist genre in art.

On display along with the American realist work was work by five Russian artists who were special guests throughout the weekend's events.



Each cocaine crack "rock" in the hand has a street value of \$10. Thousands of dollars in 100-dollar bills were confiscated.


Detectives Lanny Maddox, left, and Lou Wardwell survey the haul with Tom "Skip" Worth and his cocaine sniffing dog.

Ruidoso High School graduates 86

The class of '91 celebrated the completion of 12 long years of hard work Friday night as 86 Ruidoso High School seniors stepped into their shoes of the future.

Principal Mike Kakuska presented the anxiously-awaiting seniors with scholarship certificates and their diplomas during an hour and a half commencement exercise at 8 p.m. Friday, in the gym.

The ceremony included a farewell address by Kakuska in which he also honored assistant principal Doyle Howell who is retiring this year.

Mike Gladden, superintendent, and Dr. F. Lynn Willard of the school board also addressed the students and assisted with the presentation of diplomas, shaking hands with the graduates and wishing them the best of luck.

Former school board member Don Swalander joined Willard in presenting diplomas. Both Willard and Swalander had the chance Friday to hand their own children diplomas.

Among the honor graduates were Swalander's daughter Lori Swalander and Willard's son Cody Willard.

Only a handful of the class of '91 were born in Ruidoso or had been raised here since first grade, however, the gym was full of their supporters who got them through the past 12 years — family, teachers and loved ones.

Valedictorian Chaitanya Pai congratulated his classmates on finally achieving their goal, and also encouraged each of them to continue.

Maddox said Miller is cooperating fully with the authorities.

Maddox said he was able to arrest two search warrants and an arrest warrant obtained that morning when evidence suggested Miller may have attempted to assault a former client and his family with a deadly weapon. The arrest was made shortly after 9:30 a.m.

Among the items seized at Miller's home by the police were: a brown briefcase containing cocaine with an estimated street value of \$5,600, drug paraphernalia, \$3,595 in cash, a small bottle of crack cocaine with an estimated street value of \$1,000, scales, an electronic buzzer for race horses, a 1988 pickup truck, as well as rifles, shot-

guns and handguns worth an estimated \$3,600.

According to police arrest reports, the investigation intensified early one Friday morning last March when a confidential informant working with two narcotics officers purchased several packets of a substance from Miller at his home. The substance tested out as cocaine.

Miller allegedly continued to traffic cocaine from his residence.

Police were convinced the marketing of the drug was becoming common knowledge among some circles when a CrimeStoppers tip in mid-May referred to Miller selling cocaine in the Ruidoso area.

Then last week, a Ruidoso businessman, who employed Miller, was contacted by an anonymous caller who said his son had been

hooked on cocaine by Miller. The caller said that Miller was dealing drugs near his business. The businessman confronted Miller about his alleged drug dealing, fired him and notified the Ruidoso Police.

Maddox was advised that a local resident had purchased cocaine from Miller on several occasions and that Miller came to the conclusion that the young man's family had called the businessman.

On May 29, Miller allegedly asked the young man to come to his residence on the pretense that Miller's daughter needed help with her vehicle.

When the young man arrived, Miller, holding a handgun, allegedly threatened his life and that of his family, saying he would kill whoever had called his employer.

Maddox has been told that Mil-

ler always carried a concealed gun. Last Thursday, the young man told police that Miller called him again to say it was another family that "squealed" on him and that he would take care of them.

In the predawn hours of Friday, the Ruidoso Police Department received a call from that family that their patio doors had been shot with some type of firearm. The father suspected Miller of the shooting because of their son's past involvement with him.

Maddox then obtained an arrest warrant and search warrants from Judge Wheeler. About 9:30 a.m., law enforcement officials, equipped with a specially trained police dog, surrounded the Miller house.

Miller's first court appearance will be before Magistrate Judge Gerald Dean Jr. in Carrizozo.

State details plans to close abandoned mines

He knows all of the horror stories, young children wandering into abandoned mines, teenagers falling down shafts hundreds of feet deep.

But Rick Koehler didn't have to spend much time convincing the 20 people who attended a meeting Friday in Carrizozo about the wisdom of closing hazardous abandoned mines, especially with the state bearing the expense.

Most of the land and mineral rights owners seemed satisfied that Koehler and other staff members of the State Abandoned Mine Land Bureau were not going to rush onto their claims with bulldozers in a back-filling frenzy.

In fact, it may be twelve months before work actually begins to close some of the 80 shafts and adits (horizontal mines) that litter the areas around Bonito Lake north of the Ruidoso and Rough Mountain near Corona.

Meanwhile, staff members also are interested in compiling an inventory of potentially hazardous abandoned mines around White Oaks and Willow Springs. And there are three coal mine projects, slipped to the side more than a decade ago, that may be revisited, said Homer Milford, environmental coordinator for the bureau. The roof of an underground mine has collapsed on the south side of Capitan and seven open coal mines near the Coalora area northwest of Capitan also are scheduled to be reviewed, he said.

Program manager Denise Gallegos acknowledged that the bureau might not have looked into the Lincoln County sites if a person had not fallen into a shaft on Rough Mountain and died last November.

The closure program is financed through the 1977 Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act, which collects 35 cents per ton for coal mined on the surface within New Mexico and 15 cents a ton for coal mined underground.

Originally designated strictly for coal mines, the program was expanded to include hazardous non-coal sites.

"Twenty-four states and tribes are funded through it," Gallegos said. "And we are third from the bottom. Wyoming is at the top with \$39-million. Our budget is \$1.4-million."

With a staff of nine and a limited budget, the bureau primarily is interested in safety hazards, shafts and adits that are accessible to the public and present a danger, Gallegos said.

"We don't mess with shafts that are four to five feet deep if a kid or reasonably healthy adult could climb out," Koehler said. One of the most dangerous situations is presented when people under conditions of poor lighting explore horizontal mines that could hide winzes (vertical shafts) hundreds of feet deep, he said.

Fairly extensive research into ownership of the land and mineral rights of 46 mining features on Rough Mountain has been accomplished, but work has just begun on sites around Bonito Lake, he said.

"Before we start, we have to contact anyone with any interest and ask for their feedback," he said. Koehler would welcome help running down owners.

Besides the owners, other hoops have to be jumped through," Koehler said. The bureau must receive clearance in the areas of archaeology, hydrology, wildlife and vegetation. "We have to be sure we are not entombing a group of animals, like bats, by shutting a shaft. It's not a simple matter of hopping on a bulldozer," he said.

The best method of closure, and one with no maintenance, is to backfill, he said. But if an owner wants to be able to go back into a mine or animals are habitating there, a chain-link type screen can

be erected over an opening or a locked gate installed designed to allow bats to enter and leave, but to keep humans out.

Jim Clark, exploration supervisor for Hecla Mining Co., which owns claims on Rough Mountain, asked who would be responsible for restoration if access roads are created to reach a site.

Koehler said the contractor hired by the bureau to handle the closure would have to restore any disturbed areas. A supervisor from the bureau would be on site for the entire project, he said, "to count bucket fulls of dirt and be sure the contractor stays away from archaeological areas."

Around Bonito, access is no problem.

"There are so many shafts down there, we don't have enough money, people or time to handle them," he said. "We targeted those next to roads with a high degree of public access, where you practically can pull up by car and roll into them."

In response to a question from U.S. Forester Sam Tobias, Gallegos said follow-up at a closed site depends on the bureau's budget and how much maintenance may be involved. It may be left up to the land supervisor such as the forest service, she said.

Koehler said he wants to push for closure to start in the Rough Mountain area no later than September before the hunting season. But besides the necessary approvals by different agencies, bid specifications need to be drawn by design engineer Mike Du Mond and contractors have to be selected.

"Do we get a choice of method," asked Mark Malkoski, a geologist with Hecla.

"Yes, we will consult with the

owners," Koehler said.


"We're not dictators," said Gallegos. "But the Mine Safeguarding Act of 1989 does provide (that if a mine owner doesn't accept the bureau's recommendation) mine or mineral owners could have to demonstrate how they are going to safeguard."

The staff currently is not dealing with potential pollution at sites. But Gallegos said that a provision that will take effect in October could allow the bureau to direct

other action in such cases if it could demonstrate "extreme environmental detriment, impacting on public safety."

However, remediation could cost hundreds of millions of dollars, money the bureau does not have in its annual budget.

"Right now, we're just chasing after holes in the ground," Koehler said. Estimates place the number of mine openings in New Mexico at about 20,000.

Fort Stanton parents are perplexed over hospital's future

Families of clients at Fort Stanton met Saturday morning at an early-dated annual meeting for the dedication of the new greenhouse and to discuss the future of their loved ones.

About 50 relatives showed up to express concern about the removal of developmentally disabled clients and to get advice on how to proceed in the replacement of Fort Stanton.

Ervin Aldaz, administrator of Fort Stanton Hospital and Training Center, warned the families to use caution when answering the difficult question of where their relative should be placed.

"Be hard-nosed on getting what you want," he said of the services that the clients need — especially the medical attention. Many community groups can't take your relative to a hospital every time they wake up with a headache or they fall down, he said.

Fifty to 60 percent of Fort Stanton clients have been in group homes before and have failed.

"It's time for them (group homes) to prove they can do better than Fort Stanton," he said.

The families were urged to continue making contact with state representatives to help in providing other options, or in slowing down the closure of Fort Stanton.

There are no new developments in the lawsuit, but an appeal has been made in the federal court of appeals and everyone is hoping for great satisfaction, Aldaz said.

Since the point when the State Legislature said Fort Stanton will be phased out, Aldaz has only been following orders from Santa Fe. Twenty-four clients must be placed elsewhere, but the rest are just being looked at, he said.

More people are becoming aware of the circumstances, Aldaz said, remarking on the call of a representative of the community providers. Community groups are panicked because they have had no say in Fort Stanton's partial closure.

"They felt they needed to know about our clients," he said. "I'm glad they finally snapped."

During the meeting the families wanted to concentrate on all angles of the situation if this change was going to occur.

Many have doubts that community groups and hospitals are able to accommodate for their relative's needs.

Secundo Quintana is afraid for his son, Delfinio, who has lived at Fort Stanton for four years. "He is happy here," Quintana said.

Delfinio was in an institution in Silver City before coming to Fort Stanton. "Within six months he was a basket case," the father said. "They aren't geared toward his needs," he said. Delfinio is retarded and has cerebral palsy.

The Quintanas have checked on a Santa Fe hospital and are looking into several Albuquerque agencies in their search for a new home for Delfinio.

Although they want the best for their son, it is hard for them to check out every facility. Like many other parents, the Quintanas are getting old and are unable to be very active.

"It's hard because we are handicapped ourselves," said Delfinio's mother.

Right now the couple is praying that it won't come to a move. "We hope that they will keep it open," Mr. Quintana said.

Another factor the families are worried about is having their relatives admitted into a hospital or community group and released later because of problems or overcrowding.

The state doesn't plan on building more group homes, said Aldaz. But, two sets of money have been set aside for these groups and for research on this very concern.

Aldaz no longer wants promises, but action. "I want to do what the clients need — a process where parents have a say so."

He stated that if a client was able to live at home, that's where they would be at this moment.

To assure that their relatives will remain at an institution once they have been admitted, Aldaz warned the families to have a written contract guaranteeing the client

has residence there until he or she doesn't need it anymore, not until the hospital doesn't need the client, he said.

As for worry of staff member's becoming frightened of their job's security, Aldaz said they are dedicated and that many of them are following generations of Fort Stanton staff.

"This is home and the clients are our family," he said.

If a staff member were to begin letting out their frustration on a client, he or she would be fired. "That type of behavior won't be tolerated," Aldaz said.

The staff at Fort Stanton is not only dedicated to the clients, but employees are a big part of maintenance right now in order to keep things going. Several committees have been set up to plan the future, in addition to improvements of the reported deficiencies at the hospital, said Aldaz.

After the seriousness of Fort Stanton's legal problems was discussed, the relatives and staff went to the greenhouse for a dedication

ceremony in honor of one of its clients, Sabrina Rivero, whose family donated a large sum of money toward its completion.

A plaque with her name on it, and her picture, will remain at Fort Stanton.

Chamber board reorganizes

The Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce board of directors will be considering "streamlining" the organization by combining some divisions and reducing the vice president count and the size of the executive committee.

Chamber President Ron Wall at a regular board meeting Wednesday afternoon outlined the plan.

Since a change in the by-laws will be necessary and since 10 days formal notification to Chamber directors is required to change by-laws, no action was taken Wednesday.

Board member Clark Carpenter did move that the Chamber executive committee be reduced in size.

That motion was approved. But by-laws must be changed to accomplish a merger of divisions.

At a special meeting of the board on June 12 following a village council meeting on June 11, the board will vote on whether to change the by-laws.

By-laws called for an election of directors at the May meeting, but since it isn't firm how many vice presidents will be required, that function was postponed until the June 12 meeting.

The executive committee agreed recently to propose changes to reduce the number of divisions and consequently the number of vice presidents who sit on the executive council.

Currently the chamber has five divisions, Organization and Development, Special Events, Community Development, Economic Development and Advertising and Promotion.

The executive committee recom-

mends combining Organization and Development with Special Events and combining Economic Development with Advertising and Promotion.

Currently a vice president heads each division.

The suggested changes also would put the president-elect as vice president of Organization and Development-Special Events.

And, the president-elect would not necessarily head up the annual Art Festival. It was pointed out that heading the Art Festival may

put a president-elect on overload when he or she should be devoting all energies to planning the overall Chamber mission.

The June 12 special meeting of the board was called to consider the by-laws changes after the village council decides on June 11 whether to accept a Chamber proposal for the Chamber to continue providing visitor services but without the "convention" part of the CVB (Convention and Visitors Bureau) which is now under the Chamber's wing until July 1.

The village has voted to do convention center marketing in-house which essentially wipes out the CVB funding which has gone to the Chamber to support visitor services.

The Chamber response to RFP will include a request for funds to advertise Ruidoso's attractions, do mailouts, pay for the "800" number, etc.

"We don't know what the future is ... we can adapt," Wall said.

Paul Crown, new board member, in advocating reduction in the number of vice presidents on the executive council, explained his reasons.

He said he is uncomfortable with the fact that the executive committee in actuality constitutes a quorum of the board if all members are present.

New board member Valerie Miller said she "feels left out" when she just may be required to affirm decisions already made for the board in an executive committee meeting.

In effect, she said, board members not on the executive committee can be told "this is the way it's going to be."

President-elect Tony Wilcoxson wasn't present at the board meeting. Members were reluctant to make any changes on the spot without his input.

Board member Don Dutton moved that the executive director and a committee be authorized to negotiate with the village council on the Chamber's proposal.

The board also authorized the mailing of a letter to all Chamber members urging support for the Chamber's proposal to provide visitor services.

In part, the letter says, "the visitor questions answered by the

Chamber will not decrease because the village has a new department."

Some 70,000 inquiries to the Chamber concerning Ruidoso are expected this calendar year. The increase so far this year over 1990 is 33 percent in the number of inquiries handled by mail or by staff in person.

Executive director Jerry Watts told board members inquiries over Memorial Day weekend in person or by phone totaled 463.

Some 400 of those inquiries were walk-ins, he said.

CofC scholarship unclaimed

Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce directors, concerned about the dearth of qualified applicants who apply for scholarships, agreed on a plan of action at a board meeting.

Directors met in regular session Wednesday afternoon at the Chamber of Commerce-Visitors Center building.

The Chamber scholarship committee will contact the Ruidoso school system and will suggest a "Scholarship Day" for early fall to inform seniors, especially, of scholarship opportunities available.

Neither of two applicants for Chamber scholarship this year were acceptable. They didn't meet criteria as established by the Chamber scholarship committee.

Director Don Dutton said, "I hate to not award scholarships when we have scholarships."

The Chamber sets aside \$2,000 each year for scholarships.

Director Cindy Lynch suggests that maybe former scholarship recipients who are still in college could use additional help if they still meet requirements.

Directors agreed, and the scholarship committee will check to see if that is the situation.

Director Joan Bailey said a "Scholarship Day" would acquaint seniors with "the opportunities available for free bucks." She suggested getting

scholarship information out very early in the school year.

Directors were told by Jack Muhn, financial officer of the Chamber, that the Connoisseur Classic will be "slightly in the black" when all obligations are met and village dollars received.

Bailey, chairperson of the advertising committee, displayed one-sheet "hot pink" maps to be dispersed to tourists and inquirers about Ruidoso.

The cheaper maps will replace slick paper, more expensive maps of the area used in the past.

The new maps have Apache Trails information and an area map on one side and a Ruidoso city map on the other.

Muhn reported that the state is providing \$42,000 in co-op or matching funds with 77 percent earmarked for Chamber use. The balance will go toward promoting the All American Festival just before Labor Day and to advance the Cowboy Symposium in the fall.

The executive director said that the Chamber will be "debt free" in June after a bank note is paid off.

Directors will attend an annual retreat on the weekend of either June 22 or 29 at The Lodge in Cloudcroft.

A program of work is traditionally planned at such retreats.

Tax board is waiting for money

The Ruidoso Downs Lodgers Tax Board met Wednesday and elected officers.

The board has no money to use as yet as the lodgers tax ordinance was just recently passed. Lodgers tax businesses will report in June collections for May, by the July

meeting of the board, there should be money in the till.

Mike Warren of radio station KRUI was elected chairman of the lodgers tax board; Camille Mansell is vice president, Shelly Barnes, secretary, and Karen Stevens, treasurer.

Seven businesses are considered lodgers tax businesses in Ruidoso Downs. They are the American Motel, Champions Run, Downs Motel, Mitchell Motel, Quality Inn at Pine Springs, Timberline Motel and Winston Ranch.

"Please don't leave them there," Basch said. "We don't charge a penny to take animals. We ask for donations, but it is not a requirement. It's heartbreaking to find one or two puppies from a litter down by the road sniffing around the bodies of their dead litter-mates who have been hit by cars."

Sometimes people dump puppies and kittens from litters in different places around town.

"I empathize with what they are thinking, that at least they may have a chance to survive," Basch said. "But in truth, their chances are a lot better at the shelter than being scraped off the road or being shot by a homeowner who is tired of animals being dropped on his land."

The odds are the animals will end up at the shelter anyway, Basch said.

"Like the person who tied a dog named Rosie, a little shepherd mix, to the door of another man's house. The man already had a dog and he brought Rosie here."

Having foster homes for the temporary placement of litters also

has increased the chances of adoption, Basch said.

"We're not having to put nearly as many puppies to sleep," he said. "But even if we have to, the euthanasia techniques used here are far more humane than meeting a two-ton automobile or an irate, gun-toting homeowner or a larger territorial dog."

Perhaps one of the cruelest approaches to getting rid of litters is to put them in dumpsters where, if

they don't first die from lack of water and food, they will be crushed to death, he said.

"Please bring them to the shelter instead of just turning them loose or dopping them near the entrance. Give them a chance," Basch said.

 Flags fly on traditional Memorial Day

Traditional Memorial Day
 This is being sent to you on May 30, the Traditional Memorial Day, and the American flag is floating in a light western breeze singing down the Vale, a song of spring in its green and flowery prime. Mother earth is rejoicing under a sky of very light white clouds.

Refrigerator is remarkable. Every time the big bay gelding touches the track, he turns in a powerhouse performance. Proving beyond a doubt that he is every bit as good as last year when he won the \$2 million All American Futurity, Refrigerator chilled the opposition again Sunday by dominating a stellar field in the \$268,642 Kansas Derby.

The official margin of victory against a field that had won nearly 50 percent of its starts was three-quarters of a length. Anybody that saw the race, however, was awed by the ease in which Refrigerator accomplished his feat. "I never did hit him," said Kip Diderickson, last year's leading quarter horse jockey nationwide. "He always tries hard. He's the best horse I've ever ridden."

Refrigerator covered the 400 yards in a sharp final time of 19.86, the fourth fastest clocking in 17 runnings of the Grade I race. The time was especially impressive considering the race was run into a stiff headwind. Despite his fifth consecutive victory, Refrigerator's fan club experienced some anxious moments in the

starting gate and at the break. The order of finish was very similar to last year's All American Futurity with See Me Gone second and Alifax third. Quick Fun, second in last year's All American Futurity, however, suffered through a horrible trip and ran last in the Kansas Derby. "As long as he's healthy, we'll run him," said Gilbreath.

Piel Canela takes First Lady Handicap

Benefitting from a blistering five-horse speed duel Dallas Dalton's Piel Canela circled the leaders turning for home and out-finished Scout Beauty for a dramatic nose victory in Sunday's First Lady Handicap. Piel Canela, last year's Ruidoso Oaks winner, earned the winner's share of the \$18,800 purse and increased her career earnings to more than \$30,000. Under apprentice jockey Mark Buehrer, who was capturing his

first stakes ever at Ruidoso Downs, Piel Canela was allowed to settle comfortably behind the suicidal front fractions of 21.3 and 44.2. Scout Beauty, who was rating kindly just behind the front-runners under jockey Jimmy Coates, made her move first and swept to the lead straightening away for the drive. Piel Canela and Buehrer picked up the chase shortly thereafter, however, and finished quickly for the narrow victory.

Sculptor and crew enjoy more space

When a bronze is cast in a foundry, that's only the beginning. Many further steps are required before a bronze is passed by master sculptor Dave McGary and before it lands in a gallery or a collection.

The McGary Studios and the 14 employees just plain outgrew facilities north of Ruidoso at Loma Grande, McGary says. Consequently, the finishing work on McGary's award-winning sculptures is now done in a 5,100-square-foot building at 819 Gavilan Canyon Road.

Dozens upon dozens of McGary's limited edition bronzes stood silently Saturday when McGary and wife, Jerre, and his skilled crew staged a "Second Annual Open House and Pigout."

Normally the "crew" is welding, filing, assembling, painting and otherwise preparing McGary bronzes for the market. Some 1,500 invitations were sent out for the event. Last year 400 fine art enthusiasts and friends turned out for the pigout.

More were expected to be present this year because the finishing studio is more accessible.

McGary still has his personal studio at his home at Loma Grande, this side of Nogal off of State Road 48 to the west.

McGary has redone the new location to accommodate the metal room, the paint room, the patina room, conference room, business office and shipping and receiving. McGary built a foundry in 1982

at his Loma Grande home and gallery. He no longer casts bronze because "it just got to be too much," he told *The Ruidoso News*.

He utilizes five foundries in three states to produce the raw bronzes. All finishing work is done at the Gavilan Canyon location.

McGary and his wife also have their own gallery, Expressions in Fine Art, in Santa Fe. She spends a lot of time there during the summer when tourists flock to the City Different.

McGary in his sculpting is becoming a living legend among con-

temporary artists of the American West. He is considered the master of realism depicting Indians of bygone days.

At one time he was adopted by a Montana Sioux tribe where he has participated in ceremonies.

One older Indian one time patted his chest and said, "You are Indian inside."


Two of his bronzes are in the permanent collection of the White House in Washington D.C. A more recent honor came when a monumental version of his "Long Soldier" went on display in front of the

State Capitol Building in Santa Fe. The life-size bronze is commanding.


McGary was chosen as one of the artists competing in the Hubbard Art Award for Excellence the past weekend.

Corporation acquires lodge


Closing papers were scheduled to be signed Friday when C-Net Resorts, Inc., acquired title to Carrizo Lodge from the FDIC.

Inside The Outdoors

You're not the only one praying for rain


It definitely appears that we are in the midst of a dry cycle in New Mexico. Last year, we had little precipitation, there was little winter snowfall and spring rains have been very limited. This makes folks mad because they have to water the yard or crops more and face those high water bills, but for wildlife, the picture looks very bleak indeed.

Just imagine being a wild critter for a minute. You've just managed to make it through winter, the toughest time of year to survive. You're looking forward to springtime, when all the plants green up and food is abundant. But, the rains don't come. Everything remains hot and dry. No green grass, just brown dead stuff. Great, does anyone have a plane ticket to Hawaii or Florida?

Unfortunately, most of our wildlife species can't just pack up and move somewhere else. They have to stay here and suffer the consequences. So, how does a lack of precipitation affect wildlife?

In the first place, good habitat is the key to wildlife survival. It consists of four basic components—food, water, cover and space. Lack of moisture has an effect on all four.

Without rainfall, food plants don't grow and even if they manage to sprout, the nutrient content isn't as high as normal. This means that all types of wildlife suffer. The rabbit doesn't have much to eat, so there are fewer for the fox to catch. There aren't as many in-

sects for birds to eat which means hawks have slim pickings and so on down the line.

Also remember, that most wildlife give birth to young during the springtime. That means that pregnant females are in poor shape because of a tough winter. Add to this a spring drought with little food that is of poor quality and it points to young being born in bad shape or maybe not being born at all. Animals in poor condition are also more susceptible to illness and disease.

Good habitat also means water. Different species of animals have varying needs for water, but all must have it. The kangaroo rat for instance, never has to take a drink of water, it gets all it needs from the plant material it eats. However, little or no rainfall means less seed production and lower water content. Turkeys on the other hand, need to

have water once or twice a day. As watering areas dry up, turkeys have to move or perish, even if abundant food is available.

Another critical part of a good habitat is cover. Growing plants are utilized by wildlife to hide from predators, build nests and escape from the elements. Less rainfall means fewer or dying plants that reduce available cover making it easier for predators to find nests or young. It may even stop some birds from even trying to nest at all.

Lastly, rainfall helps provide space. Many animals are territorial and keep others of the same species out of their proclaimed area. Take bears for example. They keep all other bears out of their territory. In times of good habitat, bears can have a home range of 12 or 20 square miles. With poorer habitat conditions they may need as much as 150 to 200 square miles. This means that smaller or weaker animals will be forced out of better areas and will have to try to survive in worse habitat. There is also competition among different species for food, water, cover and space. Just imagine being a deer and trying to get to a water hole staked out by a black bear or cougar!

That high utility bill may raise your blood pressure in times of drought, but lack of rainfall is much more serious for the wildlife in our arid state. And, sadly, there isn't anything we can do about it but hope it rains.

Tax dollars spent on the Ruidoso Public Library are money well spent. It's an investment in a future where everybody will not only know how to read, but also enjoy reading.

Ruidoso's beautiful little library, under the leadership of librarian Mary Lou Gooch assisted by Ingrid Schmitz, Birdie Garrillo and Jimmie Krieg, serves all ages. The library budget is among the smallest in this village's multi-million dollar package, but those dollars are stretched to serve the public well.

Summer programs are just about to begin, with sign-ups starting today for a summer reading program and a whole line-up of fun and educational classes for youngsters three and up. Visits to the library at a young age will teach children that reading is fun — opening up a whole new world to them.

Besides those special programs, the library offers the latest of the best periodicals — newspapers and magazines — in a comfortable reading area. Read old copies of The Ruidoso News on the microfilm reader in the sunny new addition to the library, or take a break by the cassette player to listen to recorded music that's available for checkout.

The Ruidoso Library also has a complete selection of books on tape, a service that is especially useful to older folks whose vision is not what it used to be or for travelers who spend long boring hours in the car. The library also has a selection of videocassettes available on loan.

Having a meeting? Rent the community meeting room — complete with a kitchen and tables and chairs. There's a nominal utilities fee for night meetings, but the room is offered free for non-profit groups during regular library hours.

Research materials of all kinds are on the shelves to be used in the library. But, if the library doesn't have the research material you need, the librarians will locate it and borrow it on an inter-library loan. Those inter-library loans are also possible for microfilms and any kind of book.

Which brings us to books. The Ruidoso Library has lots and lots of books, including the best-sellers, which show up here almost as soon as they hit the New York Times list.

The Library is open from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Friday and 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday. There's a bookdrop beside the front door to help you get those books and tapes back on time.

So, take the kids to the library, take your mom to the library or take your grandparents to the library — there's something at the Ruidoso Public Library for everybody.



State Of Mind

Lincoln visitors say they've seen a ghost

In the summer of 1989, 22-year-old Billy Cox of Bartow, Florida got a hankering to go west for the first time, looking for adventure.

He got off the Greyhound bus in Roswell and wandered into the local museum. The historian there, Ken Hobbs, took one look at him, gasped, and pronounced him a dead ringer for the most famous outlaw ever to wander through those parts: Billy the Kid.

For Cox, it was the start of something ... well, peculiar.

A few days later Hobbs drove Billy Cox to the town of Lincoln, where the Kid killed several men before he was gunned down at Fort Sumner in 1881 by Sheriff Pat Garrett, at the age of 21.

These events are now memorialized in a state monument, run by Ranger Jack Rigney. "This is Billy the Kid from Florida," Hobbs said to his friend the ranger — and Rigney could not believe his eyes.


Only one authenticated photograph of the Kid is known to exist. In it he wears a crumpled top hat, a low-slung gunbelt and a bandanna, and holds a Winchester rifle by his side. The camera captures his face straight-on. The face is identical to Billy Cox's.

When the ranger caught his breath, he and Cox struck a quick rapport. They stayed in touch after Billy took the bus back home and resumed his work as a busboy in a restaurant. Rigney visited relatives in Florida that winter and stopped by to see Billy, who had rounded up some clothes such as the Kid wore in the old tintype photo, and had been practicing the same pose.

As soon as Rigney saw Billy Cox intentionally impersonating Billy the Kid, he began seeing possibilities. So he suggested that Cox spend the next summer in Lincoln, to see what would happen.

"Jack even said there could be a 'financial supplement' to this," Billy remembers. "But I wasn't so sure what he meant."

Billy returned to Lincoln in July 1990, and stayed in a room in Rigney's house. As he walked through town, packing an unloaded

pistol and a Winchester, tourists pointed at him in astonishment.

Then they wanted him to pose for photographs and paid him five or ten dollars without him having to ask. When there was a crowd, he could pick up \$30 or \$40 at a time.

At daily presentations at the state monument, Rigney would tell the story of Billy the Kid, then ask if anyone believed in ghosts. On cue, Cox would walk in and strike the pose. The tourists would gasp, grab for their cameras — and leave a donation.

In his spare time, Cox tried to do things that the first Billy had done in Lincoln County, more than 100 years ago. He borrowed horses and went riding through open country. He slept out under the stars. He did odd jobs on area ranches. He stopped to chat with everybody in town, and accepted hand-outs at many houses. He went to saloons in the old village of White Oaks, where señoritas would dance with him and call him "Billito."

Yet Cox insists he retained his own identity. He never felt he was mystically bonded with the Kid, much less a reincarnation.

"I was always William H. Cox, not William H. Bonney," he says.

"There were never any spirits in the night."

In this fashion, the summer passed. Capitalizing on New Mexico's unending fascination with its most notorious son, Cox portrayed Billy not only in Lincoln but also at festivals in

Truth or Consequences and Taiban, and at the Eastern State Fair in Roswell. He won look-alike contests, staged shootouts with "Pat Garrett's Gang," was featured on local television and in national magazines, even had a videotape made about him. The pay was always chancy, but enough to keep him in canned pork and beans.

But the tourist season finally ended — and last October Cox realized things were changing. Rigney, in whose house he had lived all summer, started dropping hints about Florida. Then the deputy sheriff in Lincoln drove up one day and asked him outright: "when you going back home, Billy?"

Some cattle on nearby ranches had been shot, it seemed, and people suspected him. "The deputy thought I was getting lost in the character," Cox says. "He said he had seen it before."

Protesting his innocence, he nevertheless left town. Until the end of the year he stayed in the area, taking hospitality from friends in Roswell, Carrizozo and other places. Then he went to Florida for two months. But last March he returned to Lincoln.

This time, however, he could not tell if he was completely welcome. Jack Rigney seemed glad to see him, he says, and talked of reviving the Billy the Kid act in July and August. But there was no open invitation to stay in his house in the meantime. And while the deputy sheriff was friendly at first, he soon returned to inquire about an apparent break-in at a Lincoln hotel, in a room once occupied by Billy the Kid.

Not quite knowing what to make of all this, Cox "fled to Albuquerque" for several weeks, to figure out what to do. He really does want, he says, to go back to Lincoln this summer and portray the Kid one more season before leaving the legendary gunfighter behind and getting on with his own life. Yet, if the atmosphere does not seem right, he does have a backup plan.

"If worse comes to worst," he says, "I'll go to Fort Sumner."




