Senior athletes win gold

Lincoln County's senior athletes found their own pot of gold this weekend in Las Cruces.

Of the 17 county residents who qualified for the New Mexico Senior Olympic Games (NMSOG) June 13 through June 15 on the campus at New Mexico State University, all by two brought home medals.

Bill Britton, Bob Clarke, Dorothy Payne, Josie Tenorio and Ira Kaster all brought home gold medals from the competition.

Britton, who won the men's singles in bowling, not only won the gold medal in his age division, but also had the highest overall score in the entire singles bowling tournament. Britton, who lives in Ruidoso, is 76.

Clarke, of Ruidoso, won four gold medals at the state meet. He took the top spot to win a gold medal in the 5K road race, the 200 meter back stroke, the 1500 meter run and the 100 meter back stroke.

Payne, a Carrizozo veteran of the state games, won another gold for horseshoes.

Josie Tenorio, of Corona, ran the 50 yard dash in 11.12 seconds to win a gold medal.

Ira Kaster entered five events and got five medals. He won the gold in the 1500 meter race walk and the 1500 meter run.

The following Lincoln County athletes won silver medals in their events:


Lucy Savedra, Capitan, ladies singles bowling; Bessie Jones, Capitan, eight-ball pool; and Fabian Valderamma, Carrizozo, 200 meter run and mens doubles bowling. Valderamma's partner in the bowling, Frank Crawford, is from Tularosa.

Also winning silver medals were Roland Bailey and Fred Savedra of Capitan, mens double bowling; Ira Kaster, Ruidoso, 50 meter run, 200 meter run and 100 meter run; and Lester "Rusty" Lanelli of Alto, mens singles table tennis.

Verna Rodman of Carrizozo, won a bronze for her third place in horseshoes.

Fourth place rosettes went to Pat Bailey for women's singles bowling, Josei Tenorio and Bonnie Brotherton for women's doubles bowling, Bill Britton and Ed Kettler for men's doubles bowling, and Barbara Ward and Maggie Miller for women's doubles bowling.

Lucy Savedra and Pat Bailey finished fifth in women's doubles bowling.



Motorcycles judged



Police search for escapees

Two white males escaped from Camp Sierra Blanca and are now wanted on charges of theft, as well as escape.

Police said Shane Deen Cox, 21, of Sherman, Texas, and Robert Don Taylor, 33, of Roswell, walked away from the minimum security camp just west of Fort Stanton at approximately 10 p.m. Saturday night.

The escapees were last seen Sunday when, after eating a large pizza and drinking two pitchers of beer at the Ruidoso Pizza Hut on


Sudderth Drive, they ran toward Two Rivers Park without paying for their meal.

Taylor is 5-foot 9-inches tall and 152 pounds. He has blond hair and green eyes with a tattoo on his left arm of a ribboned heart with the name Jodie printed in it. On his inner arm he has a one-inch burn scar.

Cox is 6-foot 2-inches tall and is about 167 pounds. He has brown hair and hazel eyes. Cox has several tattoos: a star of David on his upper left arm, a panther chain on his forearm, a star on his left hand, an AC/DC KISS symbol on his shoulder, a heart banner with the letters T.C. on it located on his

right upper arm, and a flaming skull with handcuffs on his chest.

Both escapees are habitual offenders, said Lanny Maddox, Criminal Investigations Commander for Ruidoso. Cox was in Camp Sierra Blanca for forgery, and Taylor was in the prison for a stolen vehicle and possession of firearms.

According to police reports, Cox was last seen wearing a white T-shirt with blue jeans and his hair in a ponytail. Taylor had on a blue T-shirt, blue jeans and glasses.

MainStreet plan calls for more parking, lights

MainStreet Ruidoso directors, Ruidoso village councilors and Planning and Zoning board members have been exposed to the MainStreet Redevelopment Master Plan for Ruidoso in its final form.

John H. Mason, senior vice president, and William M. O'Brien Jr, project director, both of Carter and Burgess, Inc., were in Ruidoso to outline the plan to local entities.

Carter and Burgess is the Fort Worth-based planning firm hired to do the study.

Thursday afternoon the plan was presented to MainStreet Ruidoso directors. Friday morning councilors and P&Z members were exposed.

The master plan deals with redevelopment of the Midtown area from Mechem to Ruidoso State Bank on Sudderth, but deals primarily with a six-block high density area of the shopping area in Ruidoso.

Expanded parking, better lighting, traffic controls, landscaping, a river trail setup, park development, pedestrian safety, sidewalk improvement and other facets are covered.

Mayor Victor Alonso asked John Shaw, village consulting engineer, if he thought a river trail system

could be in place by the spring of 1992. Councilor Bill Karn said he sure would like to see that happen. The answer was "yes".

An aerial survey of the river area in the project area has been completed, and property owners who have riverfront property will be contacted to be asked if they'll provide easements. The trail would run from Country Club west to Fern. At least one wooden bridge across the Rio Ruidoso is included.

P&Z is expected to review the master plan and recommend adoption to the village council at a later date. Only four of the councilors were present at the Friday workshop where the plan was presented. Al Junge and Ron Andrews were missing.

Mary Maul, MainStreet project director, said proposals are out for engineering work on sidewalks.

She said contract documents should be ready by January 1, 1992.

One objective of the planners is to slow traffic on Sudderth. Additional traffic controls are suggested, as well as more pedestrian crossings.

Mason pointed out the importance of the "pristine Rio Ruidoso" river. He contrasted it to the muddy and polluted river in the Fort Worth area. He advised pro-

tecting it and capitalizing on it. "Don't lost the vision and the patience," Mason advised.

The plan projected the costs of all improvements suggested at from \$3,131,584 to \$3,990,696.

He said development will have to be a cooperative venture between MainStreet, the village, private citizens and other public bodies.


The planners see nothing but continued growth for the Ruidoso area.

Planners suggest park development on what is known as the "Canning property" at Country Club and Sudderth or on the old Jennings Oil Co. and mini-mart property at Eagle Drive and Sudderth.

Mason suggested that the best plan for off-street parking development would be for several property owners to get together and develop parking.

One suggested area is behind Mountain Arts Gallery off El Paso Street and east of the Bill Carrigan appraisal offices.

O'Brien and Mason emphasized that the purposes of redevelopment are many-fold, that attracting more visitors and local people to the Midtown shopping area is a prime one, along with safety and esthetics.

BLM sets public comment period for its plan to acquire 5,000 acres

A resource management plan and an amendment that specifically deals with the proposed acquisition of private lands along the Rio Bonito in Lincoln County have been compiled by the Federal Bureau of Land Management (BLM).

The documents prepared by the BLM describe and analyze the environmental consequences that would be expected to result from implementing the proposed plan and amendment.

Roswell District Manager Francis Cherry Jr. has determined that an Environmental Impact Statement will not be necessary for the Rio Bonito project since an environmental assessment did not disclose significant impact.

5,000 Acres Involved

Proposed for acquisition by the BLM is as much as 5,000 acres near the settlement of Lincoln covering grasslands, woodlands, wetlands and cultivated areas.

The bureau contends the acquisition would provide an op-

portunity to enhance the protection of historical and cultural values within the Lincoln Historical District and would generally benefit the area.

"The present riparian community along the Rio Bonito is generally in poor condition," BLM officials wrote in the summary. "The lack of tree regeneration, unstable stream banks, poor width/depth ratio, invasion of upland vegetation and exotic species, lack of overhanging and instream vegetation all contribute to the poor condition."

"In addition, high siltation rates associated with offsite activities and watershed conditions, and uneven grazing utilization also have contributed to the poor condition."

The BLM noted that a demand exists for additional camping and recreational facilities in the area from visitors to Lincoln and by those using U.S. 380, a major east-west highway through southcentral New Mexico.

The study points out that under the present system, the county would receive less annual money for cultivated land if it is acquired by the BLM, but more for unused land.

"Tax revenues derived by Lincoln County from private lands are \$1.35 per acre for cultivated land and 4 cents per acre for grazing land. In 1990, the federal government paid 38 cents per acre in lieu of taxes," the BLM team wrote.

Environmental Impact

The bureau proposes to protect sensitive species of plants and to enhance the habitat of sensitive animal species. It would stabilize stream banks, encourage revegetation and reduce the downstream siltation.

The bureau also plans to establish natural areas, parks, native species fisheries, camping and picnicking sites, trails for hiking, horseback riding and off road vehicle use.

The summary noted that Eastern New Mexico University is operating archaeological field schools on public land above and below Fort Stanton. The possibility of establishing an interpretive center for prehistoric rock shelters and caves along the Rio Bonito is being considered. The BLM would be able to initiate inventory surveys to discover more cultural property wor-

thy of interpretation. Protests to the plan to acquire private lands along the Rio Bonito must be filed by July 8 with the Director (760), Bureau of Land Management, Department of the Interior, 18th and C Streets, Washington D.C. 20240.

Interested parties have until August 16 to comment on the proposed Roswell Resource Management plan.

The Roswell resource area includes all of the counties of Quay, Guadalupe, Curry, DeBaca, Roosevelt and Lincoln and most of Chaves — about 14 million surface acres.

Public Workshop Set

A local public workshop has been scheduled by the BLM from 1-4 p.m. and 6-8 p.m. July 24 in Fletcher Hall at the Lincoln County Fairground in Capitan.

Written comments should be sent by August 16 to Pat Kelley, RMP Team Leader, Bureau Land Management, Roswell Resource Area, P.O. Drawer 1857, Roswell, N.M. 88201.

The final draft must be prepared by the BLM by September 30.

Police respond to report of attempted abduction

Wednesday, a call from a frantic father referred the Ruidoso Police Department of a possible child abduction attempt, resulting in an attempt to locate a New Mexico licensed vehicle.

The investigation is continuing, said Criminal Investigator Lou Wardwell. A description of the vehicle has been given to every law enforcement officer in an effort to locate the possible suspects.

The police dispatcher received the call at approximately 7 p.m. Wednesday. The other police officers could not respond at the time, so Wardwell arrived at the scene about an hour later, five minutes after the incident was called to her attention.

Upon arrival Wardwell was informed by concerned parents and family members that two fe-

males driving a newer model 2-door Isuzu Trooper approached a 6-year-old girl west of the intersection of Heath and Kirkman Circle.

According to the minor female, a woman on the passenger side of the vehicle opened her door and offered the little girl some candy.

This action was interpreted as a possible enticement to get the child closer or inside the vehicle, said Wardwell.

The girl, formerly taught not to take candy from a stranger, then screamed and ran home.

The Isuzu Trooper is either white or silver with a black stripe, tinted windows and a New Mexico license plate.

Halls head back to NMSU to embark on yet another career

With several successful careers behind him, John V. Hall is heading back to school with his eyes on a brand new profession.

Hall, who just resigned as director of the Hubbard Museum, is going back to school and hopes to attend law school after graduating from New Mexico State University.

He's well on his way, for in the midst of coordinating this year's huge Hubbard Art Award, Hall completed one semester at NMSU, taking 18 hours, driving to Alamogordo every day and ending the semester with a 4.0 grade point average.

Hall and his wife, Tina, who has worked with him at the Hubbard Museum and in his real estate company, both are within a year of completing their bachelor's degrees at NMSU.

And, when they move to Las Cruces to finish their education on campus, it may be a little like déjà vu for the two who met at New Mexico State in the 1960s.

Both Halls are native Texans — Tina is from Big Lake — but John Hall and his parents, Valton and Marjorie Hall, moved to New Mexico in the '60s. Hall graduated from New Mexico Military Institute in 1965, attended NMSU and then settled in Capitan where he and his father developed several subdivisions.

Tina and John Hall married in 1968, and in 1972 they opened Sierra Development Company, a business the Halls built up during the real estate boom.

"We were the biggest company in town for eight or nine years," said Hall, looking more relaxed these days than he ever did when he was heading up that firm.

Hall, his hair a little longer, his smile a little bigger and his dress a little more casual than in those days when he led his real estate team to the top, admits that those days were pretty intense.

"Ruidoso is very intense," said Hall, who obviously loved that challenge. "To make a good living you've got to be intense."

"I made a lot of money in the boom — my family's made a lot of money — I've lost a lot of money," said Hall.

Hall and Company built 42 homes when the developer-Realtor who later turned museum director was in the construction business. He said his "famous Hall Box" can

be found all over town with its well-remembered style and plan, customized for each customer.

Hall syndicated part of the Dunning Ranch and later syndicated the Ruidoso Financial Center, which is now the Stroud Building, Ruidoso's near-high rise on Mechem Drive.

"I was proud to be able to hold it together until it sold to the Strouds," said Hall of that deal. "We had a strong deal up to the point that The Bank of Ruidoso failed."

"We've done a lot of things, but in Ruidoso, you've got to do a lot of things — that's Ruidoso," he said.

In 1986, Hall affiliated his SDC firm with the national Coldwell Banker firm; in 1989, he sold to a Coldwell Banker firm in Alamogordo, and was all set for a year's sabbatical when he just happened to discuss art with R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard.

That informal conversation, that happened just after the Hubbards' purchase of the \$12 million Doheny art collection, turned into a brand new career for the Halls.

John and Tina Hall were at the center of putting together the Hubbard Art Award for Excellence which hit the art world like a stick of dynamite.

The Hubbards, whose foundation was already active in promoting education, turned their attention to the arts, and hired the Halls to put together the world's biggest

art award at the home of the world's richest quarter horse race.

Hall, with the complete backing of Joan Dale and R.D. Hubbard, coordinated the award that drew 50 of this nation's best realist artists the first year and 52 of those American masters the second year.

He worked closely with museum directors from throughout this nation, and ended both awards with successful sales — close to \$2 million in art was sold each year.

The Hubbards were pleased with the shows and sales, but even the first year they knew they wanted to show to go international.

Hall traveled to Russia and pulled off one of the toughest jobs he'll ever try when he booked the show into a Russian museum. The show went on to Germany, but the Hubbards and Halls weren't through yet — they were able to enter into an agreement allowing five Soviet artists to take part in the 1991 show.

This year's show is slated for another international tour, with plans in the works for a venue in Japan.

"One deal I'm more proud of than any is the negotiations for the Museum of the Horse," said Hall last week as he looked back on the past couple of years before moving on to his next big challenge.

"I was on the point that — playing in the big leagues with some very big people representing some very important museums."

In the end, Hall put together a plan that could result in the biggest attraction this area has ever had. The Anne Stradling Museum of the Horse — with its more than 10,000 unique items all relating to the horse — will be at home in Ruidoso Downs. People from all over the world can be expected to visit that museum when it opens in a new building in 1992.

"I can't say enough about the proving things," said Hall.

"The award was an impossible deal — it was incredible we went out and did it."

But Hall doesn't take credit for those revolutionary successes. He admits he worked as hard as he's ever worked in his life and was at the center, putting together deals and working out the logistics, but he gives the real credit for the success of the art award and the acquisition of the Museum of the Horse to R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard.

"The Hubbards are Ruidoso's unsung heroes," said Hall. "The Hubbards had the money and were willing to use it for Ruidoso — and they had the personalities. The press ate them up. They're wonderful people."

But, as of last week, Hall is putting his work with the Hubbard Museum, not behind him, but on hold, as he opens a new chapter in his life.

He admits to having some mixed feelings.

"I've been in Ruidoso since 1970-71 and it's been home a long, long time," said Hall, adding this is the first time he and Tina have lived away from Lincoln County since they married.

"We feel like we'll come back."

For now though, the Halls are settling in Las Cruces and hitting the books.

"I want to try something else; I want to build a little wider base," said Hall.

"I've worked with a lot of attorneys in my business career and I've always enjoyed the profession," he added.

"It's fascinating — the way we treat each other goes all the way back to the Magna Carta — man's law on how to treat man."

But, even as the Halls look forward to this new and exciting challenge, they're sad to be leaving their long-time home.

"Some of the finest people in the world live here," said Hall.

"The dream is to come back."

MainStreet project plan is complete; copies are available at Village Hall

The 58-page MainStreet Redevelopment Master Plan, which includes many maps and drawings, has many facets.

Copies are available at village hall for public inspection.

The main goals and highlights are as follows:

Goals

—Carefully manage and control municipal growth.

—Develop sound and stable neighborhoods.

—Allow development without destroying the natural features and amenities.

—Improve vehicular circulation.

—Provide a system of public facilities that will serve existing and future development.

Objectives

—Allow urban growth only in a planned, orderly manner to encourage high quality development.

—Actively promote the use of undeveloped land within the village which is served by public facilities and utilities.

—Create stable identifiable neighborhoods which contain a full complement of supportive commercial, institutional and public facilities.

—Preserve steep slopes in their natural state.

—Minimize the destruction of forested areas.

—Maintain established views and view corridors.

—Provide a full complement of recreational facilities.

—Ensure village residents are

protected and provided with high levels of public safety.

Plan highlights

—Widen sidewalks, install additional traffic control devices, lower speed limits, remove parallel parking at specific locations to increased sight distances.

—Improve street lighting, upgrade underground storm drainage system, allow access to the Midtown area for wheelchairs.

—Construct a large, open air pavilion with a design that will highlight the regional mountain architecture, construct public restroom facilities, install landscaping, connect the community park area to the river trail system.

—Expand parking capacity, including use of vacant lot west of the

police station.

—Construct structures to reduce river bank erosion, connect trail system to civic/resort center.

—Provide multi-story parking facility that is centrally located.

—Designate loading and unloading zones on Sudderth, improve signage.

—Make Sudderth and Wingfield a one-way pair of streets.

Several financing plans are offered in the document from grants to bonds.

"The master plan must be implemented phase by phase, year by year. Few, if any, cities, would have the financial resources available to implement a project of this magnitude within a short period of time," the planners conclude.

School Board orders a new activities bus

The Ruidoso Board of Education approved a bid for the new activity bus and discussed a two-year extension bid for maintenance of computers and office machines at a regular meeting Tuesday night.

After an hour and a half long session, board members Ronnie Hemphill, Susan Lutterman, Rod Adamson, Lynn Willard and superintendent Mike Gladden approved an \$86,182.20 bid from Herrera School Busses Inc. of Albuquerque, for a 1992 school bus.

The board had four separate bids from three companies. One company, Adair Bus Sales Inc. out of Clovis, gave a bid for a new and a used bus. However, both bids were over the suggested price from the Herrera company.

The other bid before the board

was for \$63,368. After a 15-minute recess to study the qualifications of each bidder, the board rejected the lowest bid.

"It has a front diesel engine and doesn't meet the specifications at all," said Willard.

The new blue and white activity bus has a capacity of 60 people and ample room for luggage and equipment.

Other items on the specification list include an air conditioner, rails above the seats, and tinted windows.

The bus will be delivered in 180 days, which leaves the school without a bus for the first half of school.

The schools will continue to depend on a contract with S&S until then, said Gladden.

The money to buy the activity bus came from the Senate bill nine-

"We have money to buy the bus but not to maintain it," said Gladden.

He explained that the excess money can't be spent on recurring costs so the purchase of an activity bus would put it to good use. In fact, the school will save 35 to 45 percent by buying an activity bus instead of continuing with a contract with the local S&S company.

"The savings provides enough cash to pay for the bus within four to five years," said Hemphill.

The board also discussed extending the one-year maintenance contract of computers and office machines to two years.

"Let's see if we can save some money this way," said Gladden.

The call for one and two-year bids is now in process. The anticipated costs for the maintenance of computers is

\$6,500, while the maintenance cost

of office machines is expected to run about \$3,500.

In other business the board:

—hired two new teachers, Barbara Avalos and Debbie Pritchett for the White Mountain Intermediate and Elementary schools.

—Started the revision of the school's policy handbook.

—Heard from board members on the Twelfth Annual New Mexico School Boards Association School Law Conference, which 375 administrative personnel throughout the state attended June 7-8 in Albuquerque.

—Added a new policy of having a moment of silence and saying the pledge before each meeting.

The next regular board meeting is at 7 p.m. Tuesday, July 9, in the administration building.

The spayed, one-year-old blue Great Dane is an outdoor dog and weighs 105 pounds.

She comes from a loving home, but one already crowded with other large dogs, said Randy Basch, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter.

"She would be great in a home where there are no other dogs because she is somewhat timid," Basch said. "But someone with patience, time and a lot of tender loving care should be able to help bring her out of that."

The large dog will need a big yard and a sizable dog house. All of her shots are current and the previous owners left her papers.

"If there are children in the house, she would be better with older ones who are more calm," Basch said. The same would hold true if there are other dogs in the home.

Basch asked dog and cat owners to take responsibility for their animals this summer and to have them neutered and spayed before more unwanted litters are pro-

duced.

The shelter already is crowded with the usual influx of young animals. Before the end of summer, many will have to be put down because the rate of reproduction will outdistance the number of available adoption homes by the hundreds.

"Sometimes I think what might make an impression on people who say it's not their problem would be to have them make the decisions on what animals must be put down and to watch the process," Basch said. "Some people just don't think about the consequences of allowing their animals to roam and reproduce."

Meanwhile, Basch and his board continue to try to save as many animals as possible by seeking sponsors who will pay the cost of neutering and spaying for adoptable pets.

He also needs volunteers able to offer their homes for foster care of young litters until their immunizations take effect.

P&Z to consider MainStreet plan

MainStreet, roller rinks and tough subdivision codes are slated for discussion when the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission meets at 2 p.m. Monday, June 17, in Village Hall.

Number one on the agenda is a request to repeal by W.R. and Mary Robertson of Odessa, Texas.

The applicants are requesting that lots 15 and 16 be combined into one lot.

The commission will consider a request to amend the commercial site development at Y-Knot Park.

The requested change involves change of use of a 6,000 square foot area previously approved as a restaurant and lobby area to roller skating rink usage.

The MainStreet Redevelopment Design Plan by consultants Carter and Burgess, Inc. will be reviewed.

Planning administrator Cleatus Richards has approved the new plans and Mary Maul, MainStreet director, will affirm that the plan as now presented was prepared in strict accord with the contract scope of services and is acceptable to the Ruidoso MainStreet board.

In old business, the board will

reconsider its recommendation for council approval of a preliminary and final plat for a one acre tract owned by Donald A. Miner.

The Village Council directed that the commission, in future cases, provide specifics as to reasons for deviating from staff recommendations and code requirements.

Tim Collins, agent for Miner, said that Don Snyder Drive was previously platted and should have been approved by previous developers.

Richards maintains that previous actions of the P&Z Commission and Village Council taken during a period of minimal or no subdivision standards is not an acceptable criteria for considering subdivisions under current regulations.

Richards said subdividing a tract of land is subject to full compliance with the village subdivision code regulations.

"All requests for variance must be submitted to the Village Council.

"Any variance granted must be based on specific findings as listed under the subdivision code.

"Only the Village Council can grant variances.

Lincoln County Commission is considering franchise tax

Lincoln County Commissioners will try again Tuesday to convince area utility officials to sign on the dotted line of new franchise ordinances.

The meeting will begin at 9 a.m. in the county courthouse in Carrizozo.

The franchise ordinances, which will be proposed for all utilities using county rights of way, require the companies to pay two percent of their annual gross receipts generated within the unincorporated areas of the county.

The first three companies to fall

under the new requirements are Zia Natural Gas, Capitan-Carrizozo Natural Gas and Lincoln Cablevision.

The ordinance requires that the companies submit the payments quarterly with written reports on their business activities for the previous three-month period.

Twice before the commission has discussed the ordinances, but both times county attorney J. Robert Beauvais was asked to make some changes.

In another matter, the commission is scheduled to consider a request from Sheriff James McSwane to raise the per day rates for keep-

ing prisoners from other government entities at the county jail. He also wants to create two positions for transportation and extradition officers.

The responsibility of transporting prisoners was handled last year by two contractual employees. But McSwane said he would like to put them on staff at \$6 an hour, on call 24 hours to handle transports. That would ensure that his local manpower is not depleted for those duties, he said.

In checking surrounding counties, McSwane said Lincoln does not charge enough when it cares for prisoners from other

government entities.

Rates in Otero and Chaves counties range from \$35 to \$75 a day, he said.

"Our rates are still outdated" despite an increase in 1989, McSwane wrote the commission. "With the rise in the cost of food, the increase would help to cover the constant rise in care."

"I would like to raise the cost of care for other counties' prisoners from \$35 per day to \$45 per day," he wrote the commission. But he recommended that the cost for municipal and state prisoners remain at \$35 and \$50, respectively.

The new charges would be effective

July 1.

Also on the agenda, the commission is expected to:

—Execute an agreement with the Southeastern New Mexico Economic Development District under guidelines from the State Department of Finance and Administration. The agreement stipulates that the county's annual contribution to the district is \$2,500 based on a population of 4,075 in unincorporated sections of the county.

—Approve a litter control and beautification program under the State Highway and Transportation Department to provide youth employment. The allocation is for

\$6,300 to keep the courthouse, roadsides and ditches clear of trash.


—Take action on a proposed change in the per diem and mileage reimbursements for county officials. The per diem for out of state travel overnight would stay the same at \$70 and \$95, depending on the area. Overnight travel in state would go up from \$48 to \$65, but a higher allowance for special areas would be dropped.

Rates for less than 24 hours would stay the same at \$22.50 for 18 hours or more. They would increase \$2 each for 12-18 hours (\$15) and 6-12 (\$8).







Real Bar Forth wins Zia Handicap Sunday



Rita Danley's Real Bar Forth, exploding away from the starting gate, led every step of the way Sunday for a convincing 1 1/2-length victory in the \$14,675 Zia Handicap.

The Zia Handicap, a race reserved for New Mexico-breds, was the third consecutive stakes victory for the streaking 4-year-old horse. In his previous two outings, Real

Bar Forth posted wins in the El Bosque and Patriot Handicaps at Albuquerque.

Real Bar Forth, installed as the 4-to-5 favorite by the crowd of 4,708, broke like a bullet from his inside post position in the field of nine.

Under only moderate urging from regular rider Bobby Don Harmon, the son of Bar Forth

pulled away to the wire.

Real Bar Forth, who extended his winning streak to four, has now captured nine of 22 career starts. Trained by Fred Danley, Real Bar Forth covered the 400 yards in 20.05, despite facing a stiff headwind.

The \$8,805 winner's share of the purse increased Real Bar Forth's lifetime earnings to \$117,975.



Winner of the \$14,675 Zia Handicap is Real Bar Forth. The four-year-old quarter horse was the three-to-five favorite and ran past his competitors winning the 400-yard race by one and a half lengths in 20.05 seconds. Real Bar Forth is owned by Rita Danley, trained by Fred Danley and was ridden by Bobby Don Harmon.

R.D. Hubbard and Ed Allred's Forever Best draws away for a one-length win in the \$11,325 Mescalero Apache Handicap Saturday. The lightly-raced eight-year-old

Forever Best takes Mescalero

Proving once again that it's never too late, the gritty 8-year-old Forever Best unleashed a whirlwind stretch run Saturday, and drew off to a 1-length victory in the \$10,000-added Mescalero Apache Handicap.

Forever Best, owned by R.D. Hubbard and Ed Allred, has started only 17 times in his career because of a series of injuries sustained in his youth.

He has, however, captured eight races.

Forever Best, who was winning

the initial stakes race of his career, trailed by as many as 10 lengths in the early stages of the 6 furlong dash. Way Cool, the only 3-year-old in the race, cut out blistering fractions of 21.2 and 44.2.

When the front speed began to tire, jockey Joe Martinez angled Forever Best to the outside. By the time the horses entered the stretch, Forever Best was in high gear. He roared by the field, stopping the timer in 1:12 flat.

"We were pretty far back, but I wasn't worried about it," said

Martinez.

"I thought they were going pretty fast up front."

Forever Best, who was nosed out by Charmin Abrecrombe in the May 26 Budweiser Breeders' Cup, turned the tables on that rival in the Mescalero Apache Handicap. Charmin Abrecrombe finished second, a head in front of third-place finisher Oso Prieto.

Forever Best, who is trained superbly by Don Farris, increased his lifetime earnings to \$29,404.

Pullasix rebounds in trials

The top three finishers from each of the 12 heats Friday advance to the June 27 time trials. The 10 fastest qualifiers from the time trials move on to the July 14 Rainbow Futurity.

Pullasix, who ran rather greenly in the Kansas Futurity as the heavy favorite, made no such mistakes in Friday's 10th race. He broke perfectly and eased away from the field under a stranglehold

by jockey Jacky Martin.

The Jack Brooks-trained son of Streakin Six covered the 350 yards in a solid final time of :18.02. Pullasix, a bay colt, has now captured two of three career starts.

One race later, Jacqueline Spencer's Challenger Six, under a strong ride by Glen Murphy, logged the fastest final time of the day. The New Mexico-bred son of Six Fortunes, who had won the Kansas Futurity Consolation in his most recent start, covered the distance in :17.80. Challenger Six is trained by Darla Crenshaw.

One of the most impressive winners of the day was Nancy McCoy's Klassy Juno in the fifth race. The

Kansas-bred son of Junoingood, after a slow start and a seventh-place finish in her debut, was flawless Friday.

Klassy Juno, under veteran jockey Gary Sumpter, broke sharply and simply ran away from the field. The sorrel filly checked in 1 1/2-lengths in front and covered the 350 yards in a quick :17.83. Klassy Juno is trained by Brooks.

In the eighth race, J.V. Whittle's Master Bugs Bad gave notice of his impending ability when he broke alertly and powered away from a field by 1 1/4-lengths. The Texas-bred son of Master Bug covered the distance in :17.87. Master Bugs Bad is trained by Craig B. Smith.

There's Magic on the mountain!

There's magic on the mountain top.

Jerry Windham's Magic Dozen, doing what he does best, outran the competition again in Thursday's first day of Rainbow Futurity elimination trials.

Magic Dozen, who captured the Grade I Kansas Futurity here May 26, extended his unbeaten streak to six Thursday by cruising away from a field by 2-lengths. The son of Easy Dozen was under only moderate pressure from regular rider Nicky Wilson as he covered the 350 yards in 18.00.

Magic Dozen, who is trained by James McArthur, seeks to become the second horse in history to sweep the 2-year-old Triple Crown. By virtue of his victory Thursday,

Magic Dozen advances to the June 27 time trials. The top three finishers from each of Thursday's 12 trial heats advance to the time trials.

The 10 fastest qualifiers from the time trials advance to the Rainbow Futurity, a 350-yard dash with an estimated purse of \$600,000. The third leg of the Triple Crown is the \$2 million All American Futurity here on Labor Day.

Clarence Scharbauer's Vital Class, who lost by a nose to Magic Dozen in the Kansas Futurity, was also an easy winner in Thursday's 10th race. Despite stumbling at the start, Vital Class drew away from his field. Trained by Jack Brooks, Vital Class covered the 350 yards in 18.15.

The fastest heat of the day came in the seventh race when Dash Master Miss and Cowboys Rodeo hooked up and battled the length of the stretch. Scarlett Farm Inc.'s Dash Master Miss posted a nose decision against Cowboys Rodeo, who is owned by R.D. Hubbard and Ed Allred. Dash Master Miss, who is trained by Dwayne Gilbreath, covered the distance in :17.81.

In the fourth race, F.R. McKibbin's Bills Ryon powered away from his field by 2 1/2-lengths in the quick final time of 17.83. The son of Windy Ryon, who is trained by John Buchanan, finished sixth in the finals of the Kansas Futurity after a tardy start. He was ridden by Steve Fuller.

New stones mark old grave sites

It took almost seven years, but the military finally followed through on one of its projects.

The result benefited Fort Stanton Cemetery.

About 100 yards to the left of the 25-foot monument that is just beyond the iron gates to the Fort Stanton Cemetery are four headstones surrounded only by shrubbery and cactus.

The headstones differ from the rows and rows of white crosses, located on the other side of the monument, because of their significance. They mark the resting places of four Germans who were among the first to be buried in the little 10-acre cemetery.

In December 1939, the luxury liner S.S. Columbus sunk during World War II. The crew was rescued by Americans and sent to Fort Stanton. As resolution began, the crew was sent home, all except for four crewmen who didn't survive.

Although the Germans were not forgotten, their headstones, like many others, were left to deteriorate over the years.

In the past two years Victor and Jean Schaefer, residents of Ruidoso, led a campaign to clean up and restore the cemetery. With the help of many people they were able to level the graves that settled through the years and buy the white crosses to replace the original headstones.

Replacing the German headstones was a project that the Schaefer's had on their list, but not

for some time in the future.

Because of interest that started a couple of years ago from the German Air Force Air Defense School (GAFADS) out of Fort Bliss, and Mr. DeMoss, director of the National Military Cemetery at Fort Bliss, the headstones were replaced with new ones.

DeMoss found out through the German office that the unique, original headstones were badly in need of repair.

Since GAFADS is the only German military post in the vicinity of Fort Stanton, they felt obligated to assist the German War Graves Commission in restoring the sites in an appropriate manner, stated the Colonel Karl E. Wallrath in a letter written to the chief of Memorial Affairs in Washington, D.C.

That was a request in 1985. The project got sandwiched between other work orders, said DeMoss. However, last October the director took a trip up to see the headstones himself, and the project got on its way.

After a call from DeMoss, Schaefer and his wife photographed and recorded the information on the old headstones.

It was more than a year later that the restorians received a telephone call from the office of the Chief of National Cemetery Monuments in Washington, D.C. requesting confirmation of the information to be engraved on the stones.

The simple white cement slabs of stone are now in place with each German's name, birthdate and date of death engraved upon them.

The American flag is floating just this side of the blue bird tree, and the meadow is turning green by the day. The bluebirds are flashing their colors in the sun as they fly back and forth from their tree.

From among the piñons on the hillsides comes the clarion call of the piñon jay, echoing down "from Glen to Glen." The robin and the meadowlark send their flute-like notes across the mountain meadows.

All the Vale is melodious with the music of the children of Mother Earth who is dressed in her finest gown of late springtime emerald green.

Year in and year out June is the hottest and the driest month. All through this June the weather has been remarkably cool. What with many light rains and thunder showers; and the west wind bringing a cool breath down from the mountain where drifts of snow still linger in the deep and shady places.

Often times by this time of year the river has used up its snow melt water, and the stream is fed by springs all along the river bank and stream bed. Today the stream is running very strong, singing its song of approaching summer.

Many times in June the temperature reaches 95 and 100 here at Storm's Crossing. Today the temperature is an even 85. And I see clouds forming away to the west, a welcome sight.

Our State Flag

All in a day, our state flower, the yucca, has begun to bloom. By the roadside, high on the hillside and under the small cliffs, out across the reaches of the mesas, foothills, and the reaches of the desert in our state the large



clusters of close-massed pearly white blooms touched with pink—delight your eye and lift your spirit.

In the lower country the yucca has been in bloom for several days, yet only in the last few days here in the mid valley, have they greeted us from the roadside.

Suddenly, like something in a dream, they appear on their stalk four to seven feet tall, clusters two feet tall and a foot in diameter—in the driest part of the land light led up by the sun shining through its many blooms, the emblem and the spirit of the great vitality and staying power of the creatures of Mother Earth in the southwest.

On moonlight nights the pearl and white clusters of the yucca shine as they catch the golden rays of the moon, and are plain to see all through the night all across the desert plains, the mountain meadows, and all up the hillsides, glowing like mother Earth's "luminaries" (lighters of the way).

Indeed, they were called by the early Spaniards, "Las Velas De Dios" (The candles of God).

And so the proud Yucca, our flower emblem, will cheer us on into the beginning of summer, which begins June 21. We are all proud of our state flower; the glorious Yucca.

The Yucca has been used for food and fiber, and the seed stalks for Christmas decorations. And out of the dried stalk you can make a rustic musical instrument called by the Spanish, "Musica de Pastor" (Shepherd's fiddle).



Chautauqua Festival planned

The New Mexico Endowment for the Humanities announces the first Ruidoso Chautauqua Festival.

The Chautauqua Festival, sponsored by the Ruidoso Arts and Film Commission, is scheduled for a site at Country Club and Sudderth on July 11-13.

Valencia Dela Vega, director for the Humanities Resource Center, said the three performances, free to the public, will include Trouble in Lincoln County, Lincoln County Women Another Viewpoint On The Trouble In New Mexico Territory, 1873-1881 and Baby Doe Tabor.

Vega said this program is one of the regional activities of The Humanities Resource Center of the New Mexico Endowment for the

Humanities. The HRC is supported by grants from the National Endowment for the Humanities and from the Historic Preservation Division of the Office of Cultural Affairs of the State of New Mexico. The remaining costs are met by tax-deductible donations of cash, goods and services.

Chautauqua was a system of summer school and correspondence school education founded in Chautauqua Lake, New York, in 1874. The term also refers to traveling groups, called Tent Chautauquas, which had no connection with original educational movements.

Tent Chautauquas were traveling groups that operated in the United States from 1903 to 1930.

They moved from town to town giving a program of lectures, concerts and recitals in a large tent. These traveling groups brought shows of mixed quality to the people of rural areas. Their popularity decreased with the invention of radio and the development of other forms of entertainment.

That kind of traveling entertainment, presented in an informal open-air setting, will be back when the Chautauqua Festival unfolds in Ruidoso.

Trouble in Lincoln County is a one man show by Boyd Barrett of Roswell.

Barrett is well-known in Lincoln County, and performs often in historic Lincoln. He also has presented his one-man shows at the Ruidoso Public Library and at various Ruidoso school events.

Trouble is scheduled for 7 p.m. July 11. It is a multi-character dramatic presentation of the story of the Lincoln County War.

Lincoln County Women will be presented by Deborah Blanche at 3 p.m. July 13. Blanche performed in Ruidoso just this past Friday, sponsored by Ruidoso Friends of the Library.

Her show is the story of four women from Lincoln County who share tales of the Lincoln County War.

Moore, who also has performed in Ruidoso in the past, will tell the rags to riches story of Baby Doe Tabor.

The monologue unfolds as audiences follow her life, beginning as one of the richest people in the United States during the decade of the 1880s when she was married to Silver King Haw Tabor and ending as one of the poorest when she froze to death in her shack at the Matchless Mine in Leadville, Colorado.







There are some things that money can't buy

Ruidoso elected officials don't need an increase in pay — the \$250 a month they now receive is an adequate honorarium for their service to the community.

There are some things that money can't buy, and good representative government is one of those things. That's why the pay that elected officials receive has no relationship with the job they do or don't do. Elected officials SERVE the community, and that SERVICE is from dedication and concern, not for pay. You can't put a price on that kind of service.


Ruidoso has a paid village manager and paid employees to oversee the daily operations, and the elected officials, who ask the voters for the opportunity to SERVE, are responsible for setting policy and maintaining a balanced budget. Some elected officials give that task many hours of their time, and we appreciate that kind of dedication.

But, in a time when money is tight, elected officials should be considering hanging tough with the village's paid staff — the mayor and council might even want to cut their own pay to provide more pay for workers.

A comparison of elected officials' salaries in the state indicates that Ruidoso's mayor and councilor pay is probably about average, with some communities paying more and some less. The communities nearest Ruidoso's size pay more and less, with Los Lunas (population 5,420) paying \$500 to the mayor and \$450 to the council, and Sunland Park (pop. 5,570) paying \$125 to the mayor and \$50 to council members. Alamogordo (pop. 27,930), just next door, pays its mayor and councilors \$50 a meeting while Roswell (pop. 44,110) pays its mayor \$1,107 and council members \$254. Taos, a resort community with a population of 3,670, pays its mayor \$425 and councilor pay was increased a year or so ago from \$325 to \$525.

But, all of that is relative anyway, and SERVICE to community, the kind of service that puts the good of the town above any special interest, is something that is beyond a price. Over the years we've had some elected officials who are worth millions and others who aren't worth two cents. We can expect more of the same.

We would encourage the Ruidoso Village Council to reconsider its request to double the pay for future mayors and councils. Pay should not be a major consideration of candidates for public office.

On Wednesday, June 12, there was an attempt by two women to abduct my granddaughter. Other children, as well as an adult neighbor, witnessed the incident. These witnesses were able to get a detailed description of the car and occupants.

My grandchildren have been taught not to accept anything from strangers and never go near a stranger in a car, so instead of being enticed, my granddaughter started screaming and ran to her house. My son called the police!

I have a police scanner in my home and I heard the dispatcher tell the police officer that she had received a call regarding an attempted abduction and the calling party requested an officer. The officer told the dispatcher to call the

party back and get as much information as possible. Also, to tell them that all two officers were busy and it would be awhile before anyone could respond.

I realize our Police Department is very much understaffed, but I do not believe escorting a house should take precedence to an attempted child abduction.

As any parent or grandparent can understand, we wanted someone after the suspects and felt completely frustrated about the lack of concern on the officer's part.

Since I knew the CID handled those kind of cases, I called an off-duty dispatcher I know and asked for help in locating one of the detectives. She told me she would, and in five minutes time there was a detective on the way to my son's home.

Detective Wardwell talked to each of my grandchildren separately and told my granddaughter how proud of her she was. Detective Wardwell further spoke to the other children and the neighbor and took a statement from each. Needless to say, we all calmed down as she did a complete investigation.

It is really too bad the police officer did not have the foresight to have the dispatcher call CID when he felt he could not respond. All in all, it was an hour between my son's call and when we finally got in touch with someone who was there in five minutes.

Our City Council wants this town to be a Lovely Little Mountain Village with the Artsy Golfing and LA DE DA. All well and good, but it isn't! The race season starts and we have every conceivable crime here

that other towns have. I do believe we need a City Council who also thinks of their town, not just their little innuendoes.

I remember that they want more money for their jobs. How about we take that money and put it to use on our Police Department. More officers, more training about what to do in such situations as the one we had.

I really think it's time to get people here in Ruidoso to wake up to the fact that we need people who work for all the residents and not just the ones with all the money.

WAKE UP, RUIDOSO! before we do have a child taken, more murders and, God forbid, our town being run by Drug Lords.


