Higher taxes, pay on council agenda

The Ruidoso Village Council is shooting for a lodgers tax increase while hoping for a hospitality tax increase to pump up advertising and operational dollars for the civic-events center.

An increase in lodgers tax to four percent is expected to be approved by the council Tuesday, July 9, in Village Hall.

The ordinance that would raise the lodgers tax is the fourth item on the agenda. The council meeting begins at 6:30 p.m.

Village attorney David Thomsen said the lodgers tax increase, if passed, would stay in effect until the state authorizes, and Ruidoso implements, a hospitality tax to be defined by the legislators.

Councilor Ron Andrews, who recommended both taxes, has been careful to point out that an eventual one percent hospitality tax would replace the proposed one percent lodgers tax increase. But he has not said the total lodgers taxes would ever revert to three percent.

In fact, the council said if a hospitality bill was eventually passed, the four percent tax assessed on lodging would stay in effect. It would be split between a three per-

cent lodgers tax and a one percent hospitality tax.

The new lodgers tax, if passed, is expected to raise approximately \$62,000 in annual revenue.

Tuesday's meeting will lead off with a public hearing recommending an increase in pay for future village councils and mayors from \$250 to \$500 per month.

The council also has asked for clarification of eligibility of council members and their families for group health insurance.

Attorney Thomsen and village manager Ron Wicker have recommended that councilors be allowed to participate on the same basis as other employees, except that a councilor be required to pay 100 percent of the premium.

The new pay increase, if passed, would increase the council payroll by \$9,000 per year beginning March 1992, and another \$12,000 per year beginning March 1994.

The village council also will consider a lease of a part of a hangar building and a trailer space to Shiloh Aviation for the purpose of aircraft maintenance and repair.

In other agenda items, the council will:

—Hear a police benefit dance proposal from resident Jane Lewis.

County hears from BLM on land swap

Lincoln County Commissioners will get a chance Tuesday to talk face-to-face to federal officials about the proposed acquisition by the Bureau of Land Management of thousands of acres around the historic settlement of Lincoln.

Fran Cherry, the bureau's Roswell district manager, is on the commission agenda at the beginning of its 9 a.m. meeting in the county courthouse in Carrizozo.

Commission Chairman Stirling Spencer last month said the commission has the right to be included in any federal acquisition decisions that could affect the economics in the county. To date, the commission has been left out of that process, he contended.

After sending announcements to local newspapers, the bureau conducted a public hearing last February in Lincoln on the proposed swap of federal land elsewhere in the state for privately-owned property along the Rio Bonito.

No commissioners attended that meeting. However, the chairman of the commission appears on the bureau's mailing list that was filed as part of the acquisition amendment to the West Roswell Management Framework Plan.

Also on the commission agenda is a public hearing at 11 a.m. to review proposed projects for the county's annual Community Development Block Grant application.

Curtis Shrader of Southeastern New Mexico Economic Development District will review possible programs.

In another matter, County Clerk Martha Proctor is scheduled to review proposed redistricting maps. The maps delineate new voting precincts and possible alignments for five commission districts in anticipation of the board's expansion from three members in 1992.

The commission is expected to take action on a request from the board of directors of the Sun Valley Sanitation District to impose a five mill levy on all property in the district. The amount represents a reduction from 6.15 mills levied last year. One mill is equal to \$1 for each \$1,000 of net taxable property value (about one-third of the assessed value after exemptions).


The commission also will consider a recommendation from the planning and zoning board to approve a replat (change in layout) of Units 8-17 of Deer Park Woods Townhomes to 17 single family lots. They are located in the Alto area.

The zoning board specified that the action will require the disclosure statement to be changed to reflect that the fire protection fee is not actually for fire protection nor for the Bonito Fire Department. The board wrote that the map also should be corrected to show the site of the sheriff's sub office and the Ruidoso Police Department.

Police stay busy; arrest Colorado man

A man wanted in Colorado was picked up in Ruidoso during a random seatbelt check in Ruidoso during a busy holiday weekend for the Police Department.

On Sunday, John Stuart Fuller was arrested and transported to the Ruidoso Police Department where he was jailed, according to police reports.

Police said Fuller was wanted for a violent crime, kidnapping and assault.

An extradition hearing is scheduled this afternoon.

Officer Will Hoggard stopped Fuller for violating the New Mexico seatbelt law, and learned of the warrant after checking his license plate number on the NCIC.

During the holiday weekend, which officially began at noon on July 3 and lasted until midnight last night, the police held 45-minute road blocks at four different locations.

Police arrested four people for DWI, and two others in alcohol-related incidents.

The police log also reported 12 accidents, three with minor injuries, and nine fireworks calls.

No citations for the fireworks were given however because the suspects were from out of town and

did not know of the village ordinance.

Although an exact number was not available, there were also several service calls of disturbing the peace and courtesy rides.

Ruidoso Police Chief Richard Swenor said, overall, it was a good weekend, with few incidents in spite of busy streets.

Traffic was also heavy throughout Lincoln County, with much of the Fourth of July activity outside the Village of Ruidoso.

Ruidoso Downs Race Track reported that 5,362 people attended the races and wagered \$477,001 on track, with a handle of \$643,777 including simulcast locations.

Crowds continued over the weekend with 5,243 fans attending Friday's card and 6,301 at the track Saturday. 4,350 people were counted Sunday at the track.

Activities in Capitan, starting with the big parade Thursday morning and continuing through the weekend with the Smokey Bear Stampede rodeo, dances and other special events, drew big numbers, too.

Crowds lined the streets of Mescalero on Thursday for the annual parade, and many stayed for that professional rodeo and Indian ceremonials that continued through the weekend.

An executive session will deal with personnel and disposal of real property.

School Board meets Tuesday

The Ruidoso Board Of Education has a full schedule of items for its regular meeting at 7 p.m. Tuesday, July 9, at the administration office.

Among items scheduled for discussion is construction at White Mountain School which began last March, and is near completion.

In relation to the renovation update the board will hear a request for a land swap for both White Mountain Elementary and the Ruidoso High School.

On the fiscal agenda, the board will open and award bids for computer and office machines maintenance. At its last meeting, the board voted to look into a two-year contract for those bids, rather than the usual annual bids. The change might save the board money and time.

The board will also make final budget adjustments and approve 1991-92 bus contracts and the Agricultural Education budget.

Regarding the 1991-92 school year, the board will consider changing credit requirements for graduation and a change of time regarding the school day.

The last items on the school board's agenda is the recommendation for employment of five teaching applications and the resignation of two teachers.

Optometrists warn: be careful when viewing solar eclipse

Directly viewing the upcoming solar eclipse could cause severe eye damage and the New Mexico Optometric Association recommends caution when the solar eclipse occurs mid-day on July 11.

The eclipse will be among the most spectacular to be witnessed by this generation and will play to one of the biggest audiences ever. It will be visible to some 500 million people across the United States and, at some locations, will last up to seven minutes. The maximum length of a solar eclipse is about seven minutes and 31 seconds.

Viewers need to take precautions to avoid retinal burning that can occur when you look directly into the sun during a full or partial eclipse. The sun's invisible rays can painlessly burn the eye's retina which contains the sensitive receptor nerve cells needed for seeing. When the retina is burned or scarred, permanent vision loss, even blindness can result. Sunglasses, smoked glass, welder's goggles and similar lenses are not considered safe.

During the 1970 solar eclipse, 140 eye injury cases were reported. Forty percent thought they were using safe viewing methods and 60 percent looked directly at the sun without any protection.

The eclipse can be viewed indirectly with a special device called a sunscope which is simple and inexpensive to construct. Instructions on building a sunscope are available by sending a self-addressed, stamped envelope to the New Mexico Optometric Association, PO Box 11585, Albuquerque, NM 87112.

Bingaman joins Skeen in opposing grazing fee hike

Senator Jeff Bingaman (D-NM) has joined other senators in opposing a grazing fee increase on public lands. It is the second year such an increase has been proposed.

"It is ludicrous to believe New Mexico ranchers can afford a fee increase of this magnitude," Bingaman said. "It could mean economic ruin for hundreds of families."

The House of Representatives has included a provision in its Interior Appropriations. Fourteen Western senators said such a fee hike "would further threaten the economic stability of already depressed rural communities."

The Senate is now crafting its own version of the Interior Appropriations bill. Senators are asking Byrd to reject the House proposal and keep the existing fee formula intact. The Senate will likely take action on the issue in late July.

Prayers answered for 91-year-old

He has no transportation, no family, and no job. But an elderly Ruidoso man has a guardian angel - one who found him a place to live for the summer.

John Hix, 91 years old, has lived in various one bedroom shacks or trailers since 1945.

But now, because of a mysterious message, the help of a local real estate agent, and the generosity of a Texas couple, he is living in a two bedroom, two bath house with a kitchen and living area.

Increases in electric bills prompted property owners to ask Coldwell Banker Realtor Doug Siddens to check on the adobe on Reese Drive that they purchased last October.

"I noticed the yard being fixed up in the past two weeks, but thought nothing of it," Siddens said, thinking the new owners had come up for the summer and began renovating the place.

He discovered Hix living in the house, which used to belong to long-time Ruidoso resident Gladys Knox, who moved into Ruidoso Care Center five years ago. Hix knew Knox and had worked for her, doing lawn work.

Hix, a popular Ruidoso resident, was found after Siddens notified the police of a possible break-in.

The innocent man's voice quivered as he explained his reason for entering the run-down house.

"The Lord told me to move in and take care of it," he said. Hix said God told him the owners wouldn't mind.

Even though the owner of the house was not who he believed it to be, his intuition was right.

After hearing the story, Mr. and Mrs. Leo Hefner allowed the "homeless" man to live in their place until they return at the end of summer.

Because of the couple's concern for Hix, he will also be able to cook and bathe - they have decided to pay the utility bills.

Hix's earlier homes didn't have a kitchen or refrigerator. But the simple man was happy with his

shabby living quarters until he was told by his last landlord not to talk to the teenagers who came around.

Hix said that the owner of his tiny house, next to Tastee Freez, didn't like him talking to the teenagers. It pained the friendly old man not to be able to do what he enjoyed the most.

"I love kids," he said.

That incident, along with his difficulty in walking to the laundromat, added to his unhappiness.

Recently, sitting in an old swivel chair in the living room of his summer home, Hix explained that he never wanted much - he knew The Lord would provide for him as long as he lived by the teachings in the Bible. The miracle of his new temporary abode proved his faith.

For Hix, the couple's generosity means another escape from joining his friends in an old folks' home.

Numbered in years, he gets tears in his eyes when talking about "his place" they took his friends to, because "they never came out."

Hix is not a grandpa, like most men his age, with a house to call their own and family surrounding them with love. In fact, the lonely man is not even a father - the last time he saw his stepson was when he was a little boy.

A new life began in 1947 when, Hix believes, the Lord took him under his care and advised him to leave the last of his three wives.

"God told me to quit my way of living, to give my wife the car and leave," he said.

He hasn't had a drink, or owned a car since. However, Hix doesn't mind all that - he couldn't be happier with the way his life turned out.

Now he is a friend to everyone he knows. His family is made up of long-time residents of Ruidoso.

"Ginger at the bus station," the coach's wife, and his boss Dr. Potts, all take care of him, making sure he has the necessities such as food and clothing.

Hix doesn't receive welfare. He

believes in working for his money. Instead, he lives a meager life on two federal checks and the pittance he receives from doing odds-and-ends jobs.

He has shown his appreciation by working for his rent.

Before Hix broke into the adobe, there were five-foot weeds smothering the front yard.

With his depleting strength, the 91-year-old man hand-chopped the weeds. It took him about 20 hours of work spread over days.

Then, buying supplies out of his social security check, he hand-scrubbed the inside walls of the place, apologizing for not being able to get the stains off.

"When Gladys left they just closed the door and locked it up," explained the real estate agent.

Hix didn't realize the stains were permanent, that the walls were in bad need of new paint.

The new occupant of the house is now working on taking out the rocks so that someday there can be a lawn for a home that he believes might someday be his. Hix does not fully understand that the house is not for sale.

When he was young, Hix helped build houses and roller skated daily at the old roller rink.

"They called me 'Highstepper' because I skated like you would ride a horse," he said as he shakily stood up and lifted a leg while leaning and pushing his hands back as if he were pulling himself forward.

He was so popular with the roller skating crowd of Ruidoso, Alamogordo and Roswell that they all pitched in and bought him, and 14 other people in his roller group, matching shirts.

That was more than 40 years ago and the shirt has maintained its youth better than the owner.


No charges were filed against Hix.

There are 25-year-olds out there who are on welfare and burglarizing, said Police Detective Lanny Maddox, explaining how difficult it would have been to handcuff the elderly, honest man.

For now, John Hix is leading a content life. Who knows what will happen at the end of August?



Firefighters rescue dog trapped on cliff

Instead of a cat up a tree, it was a dog on a cliff that Bonito Volunteer Fire Department (BVFD) successfully rescued Monday afternoon.

Accustomed to climbing tall pines after kitty, BVFD volunteers faced a different sort of rescue for a yellow Labrador retriever stuck on a narrow ledge 15 feet from the top of a 40-foot cliff. The steep drop-off forms the roadcut on the east side on State Road 45 at the top of Angus Hill.

Using climbing ropes, BVFD Chief Howard Puckett fashioned a Swiss seat — a rappelling harness — around himself, tied off to a nearby sturdy tree and lowered himself down the cliff to the narrow ledge. Rescue Lieutenant Lester "Rusty" Lanelli remained above to belay.

"Suspended 25 feet above the roadbed, Puckett tied a rescue harness around the shivering dog's forelegs, back legs and hips, "his own Swiss seat," joked Puckett. Lanelli then pulled the dog to the top.

"He tried to walk up but his legs just gave out so I hauled him up." At the top, rescuers unharnessed




"Heave ho," as Lieutenant Rusty Lanelli hauls up Gordie, the yellow Labrador; Chief Howard Puckett follows.

the grateful canine. "He was all tongue and tail," said Lanelli with a smile. BVFD turned the friendly dog over to Lincoln County Animal Control Officer Angelo Vega, who termed the rescue, "a perfect job."

From his rabies tag, rescuers determined the dog's name to be Gordie and that he belonged to Mark Stambaugh. Gordie's rescue was not complete, however. A call to Chief Puckett's wife Lillian, who maintains a file on all property owners in the BVFD district, gave Vega and Puckett the High Sierra location of the Stambaugh residence. Within minutes Gordie was again romping in his fenced enclosure with his kennel mates.

Upon learning of his dog's cliff-climbing adventure, Mark Stambaugh expressed his gratitude to the BVFD volunteers.

"Not many people would go to that effort to rescue a dog on a cliff."

Spaniel is pet for this week

A Springer Spaniel with a big heart and a good disposition, two-year-old Kelly is ready for adoption at the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter.

"She came in as a stray last January and apparently had been abused judging by her behavior then," said Shelter Manager Randy Basch. "But she seems to have adjusted well and would be a very protective pet, well-suited for a single adult or older couple."

Kelly gets along well with other dogs, Basch said.

In anticipation of her adoption, she already has been spayed under the sponsorship of Dr. Lynn Willard of the Ruidoso Animal Clinic. All she needs to move into a new home is a willing owner, her city license tags and shots.

Basch said Kelly is not completely housebroken, but is a very intelligent dog and eager to please. "I think she would learn quickly with some individual attention that she just can't get with so many dogs at the shelter," he said.

The number of animals being picked up in the village and brought in as strays or owner releases is growing each week, Basch said. Unfortunately, the number of adoptions isn't keeping pace. When the shelter becomes too crowded, it's time for tough decisions.

"The puppies and kittens often are the ones that must be euthanized because people just don't seem as willing to pay the cost of spaying and neutering for them when they know they'll have to wait months for the procedure to be done," Basch said. "And many people think they just don't have the time to train a pup."

The shelter is home to many different types of cats, kittens, dogs and puppies, including Australian shepherd-blue heeler crosses, shepherd mixes, Labrador crosses, several black Labradors, a rottweiler-boxer cross, cocker spaniels and an Airedale.

Game law violators lose licenses for three years

The State Game Commission met June 14, and revoked hunting, fishing and trapping license privileges of 17 convicted game law violators, including two Lincoln County men and three Tularosa juveniles, for the maximum period of three years.

Ronnie A. Gunkel of Noga and Sammy Roper, Carrizozo, were convicted of illegal possession of elk in closed season in February, according to information provided by the state.

Other hunters whose licenses

were revoked for three years include:

Michael J. Cordova of Alcalde and Carpentino Vigil Jr. of Santa Cruz, convicted of illegal killing of four turkeys and trespass onto Vermejo Park property in northern New Mexico, where they killed the turkeys, in 1990;

Timothy C. Owen of Albuquerque, convicted in September of 1990 of illegally killing an antelope during closed season;

Lee Grant Anderson of Chamisal, who pleaded guilty to il-

legal killing and possession of deer in November of 1989;

Gene Davis of Grants, convicted of illegally killing a deer and an elk in September and October of 1990.

Howard L. Graham of Fort Sumner and Ruben Fernandez of Willard. Graham pleaded guilty to illegal killing and possession of deer in March; Fernandez was convicted as an accessory.

Joe Green of Silver City pleaded nolo contendere to charges of spotlighting and illegal possession of elk in November and October of

1990. Johnny Garcia of Tijeras pleaded guilty in March to two counts of illegal killing and possession of a fawn.

Ernest Trujillo of Truchas pleaded guilty to hunting with a license issued to another in October. Lorenzo Valdez of Espanola pleaded guilty to illegal killing and possession of elk in October 1990.

Kenneth Grenko of Murray, Utah, was convicted to three counts of making a false statement to procure a resident license.





The free fishing days are a result legislation passed this year, and those days, by law, must be on two non-consecutive Saturdays.





Refrigerator, in all his muscular glory, had cast a fairly hefty shadow over the talented filly See Me Gone.

In one mighty effort, however, See Me Gone emerged out from behind Refrigerator's shadow, and finally bask in the limelight that was sure to fall her way sooner or later.

In the biggest upset of the Ruidoso Downs season so far, See Me Gone turned in the race of her life Sunday in the Rainbow Derby and left Refrigerator in her wake by three-quarters of a length.

Refrigerator, who had captured six consecutive races including both

the Kansas Derby and All American Futurity, however, was certainly no easy giant to slay.

In order to beat the big gelding, See Me Gone needed a near world record performance. The sleek daughter of Behold A Beduino broke like a gunshot from the starting gate, and whizzed the 440 yards

in an eye-popping final time of 21.12.

See Me Gone's blazing final time not only shattered the stakes record of 21.31 set by World Champion See Me Do It in 1989, but it was also only 1/10th of a second off the world record of 21.02 set here by Truckle Feature.

Anybody for tea?

Lincoln County residents are about to be hit with a double whammy.

The Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority — the new regional authority formed to oversee the collection and disposal of garbage — is buying equipment from its various members. We're going to tax ourselves to sell ourselves equipment we already bought.

The authority was formed by the county and villages in response to the new rules and regulations imposed by state environmentalists that shot the cost of owning and operating a garbage landfill through the roof. It's just too expensive for one little town, so the authority was formed to provide the population base needed to pay mounting landfill costs. Good idea — or at least we thought so. Even though government was growing — the way governments just love to do — it was good to see the county and villages cooperating and working together, and the plan seemed pretty logical. Everybody was happy.

Well, not everybody, because county residents will be paying, for the first time, for garbage pickup; and some prognosticators predict we'll all be paying more and more for garbage collection with another hungry taxing body on the scene.

And it didn't take long, as the authority got down to the nitty gritty of settling on prices and such, debating over how much to pay ourselves, a light bulb went on — we're going to be paying a brand new environmental gross receipts tax on bonds to pay the villages and county for equipment. Village and county leaders get their hands on more money to spend, and nearly everybody's happy.

But, we can't help but ask — didn't we already pay — with tax dollars — for that equipment we're buying from ourselves? Yes, but now we'll use this new tax money to pay for it again.

Capital equipment should be transferred to the authority, without any exchange of money; and the environmental gross receipts tax should go into a savings account to develop a regional landfill.

Taxpayers shouldn't have to pay for the same thing twice. Seems like that's double taxation — a little like taxation without representation. Maybe we need another Boston Tea Party.
