## College arrives

Ten years ago when Dr. Jim Miller worked with the Carrizozo school system, talk started about local college courses in Lincoln County.

"At the time, it was not connected with Eastern New Mexico University (ENMU), but the dream of a college has been there for at least a decade," Miller said.

Back in the county after resigning as superintendent of schools in Farmington, Miller is starting a new phase of his career as director of the fledgling Off Campus Instructional Center in Ruidoso.

"I still have many friends in the county," Miller said. "In my adult career I have lived and worked twice in San Juan County and in Lincoln County. I really like both of those places."

The center was created through the joint effort of Eastern, the State Legislature, the Ruidoso School Board and the voters of Ruidoso, who approved a special tax levy toward the support of the venture.

Registration is scheduled for August 19-23. Classes will begin August 26.

To be financially viable, the center needs 135 students per semester, Miller said.

"The money from the State Legislature is not a grant, it is an account that you draw down based on the number of students you have," he explained.


Unpacking boxes in his new headquarters at the Casa Tesoro center on Sudderth Drive last week, Miller said in terms of marketing the center, "We want to offer high quality, rigorous education, but in a caring and culturally sensitive manner because we know there will be a number of Hispanic and Mescalero students and we want to take into account that we are here to help them succeed in college."

To date, the group of people most interested in courses locally has been adults rather than recent high school graduates, he said. "I think we have a lot to offer those in the 30-50 year old group. There are a lot of single parents needing additional skills."

But letters also are being sent to 1991 graduates of Ruidoso High School.

"We want to be able to offer something to keep our young people

## Buckle up or pay a \$66 fine

If the fact that 282 people wearing no seatbelt restraints died in 1990 doesn't convince motorists to buckle up, than maybe the fact that 40 seatbelt violation tickets were issued during July will change their minds.

The fine isn't getting cheaper either, now that the Ruidoso Village Council voted on a \$16 increase to the \$50 fine.

In June, the Ruidoso Police Department listed only eight tickets issued for the violation of seatbelt restraints — that total jumped 500 percent in July.

Police Chief Richard Swenor said the department is cracking down on all traffic violations because of an increase in accidents with injuries in the past several months.

The Chief, on June 27, told his officers to emphasize traffic citations. "The June reports of injury accidents were just too high," he said, of the 38 percent increase from last year at this time.

Swenor explained that the department is getting tougher with the law because of a national campaign, Operation Buckle Down,

that is backed by President Bush.

In May, Swenor announced that the local police department would be participating in the new national safety belt enforcement campaign.

The campaign is designed to help the nation reach the goal of a 70 percent safety belt use rate by 1992.

According to reports, without seatbelt laws, the U.S. was unable to achieve use rates higher than 15 percent, and with the current law, use rates above 50 percent are seldom reached without emphasizing belt law enforcement and publicity about the need for that enforcement.

Reports of New Mexico vehicle deaths for 1990 recorded 492 lives ending in traffic accidents. Eighty percent of the vehicle occupants wore no safety restraint.

"Many people just don't realize how your chances of serious injury or death are significantly reduced by wearing safety belts," said Chief Swenor.

The Chief said that in compliance with the stricter enforcement, the department has been conducting periodic roadblocks during the holidays.

Swenor said that after seeing the roadblocks, motorists will real-

ize the possibility of getting stopped is greater than usual and will put their restraints on.

The problem however, is about two weeks after the holiday season, he said. People just quit wearing them — and the chance for an accident is higher during that period because motorists aren't as aware as they are with heavy traffic.

Officers stop a vehicle if they do not see the strap going across the driver's chest. Swenor said that motorists who don't have young children strapped in correctly are more at risk of being stopped.

Penalties for violating the Safety Belt Use Act or the Child Restraint Act range from \$25 to \$50. Beginning September 1, the fine will be increased to \$66.

The Ruidoso Village Council passed the increase during its last meeting, Swenor said.

"This will bring the Ruidoso Department up to compliance with the state level."

The law includes all passenger cars, pickup trucks, vans and other multi-purpose vehicles.

As long as the injury accidents don't continue to rise the police department will slack off to an acceptable level of issued citations, Swenor said.

## Hubbard Award takes a year off

The Hubbard Art Award for Excellence, the largest art contest in the country, is taking a leave of absence for a year while searching for a new area home.

Jim Stoddard, executive director of the Hubbard Foundation, said several factors have contributed to this conclusion.

"Primarily, the facility that has hosted the Hubbard Art Award for the past two years will not be available any longer," Stoddard said.

The Hubbards are presently in the developmental stages of a new cultural attraction — the Anne C. Stradling Museum of the Horse.

Stoddard said the equestrian collection, including over 10,000 items, will open to the public in the spring of 1992 in the former Hubbard Event Center.

"It was the original intention, by the Hubbard Museum, that the 1992 Hubbard Art Award would be hosted in the new Sierra Blanca Radisson Resort Hotel complex — also to be developed in Ruidoso," he said.

According to Stoddard, the completion date of the hotel is uncertain. He said the Stradling Building will not be available as well. Once the completion date of the hotel has been set, the Hubbards will announce their plans for

1993, he said.

The Hubbard Art Award for Excellence was created in 1989 by R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard, founders of the Hubbard Museum.

The purpose of the award was to recognize, in an exceptional manner, contemporary American realism.

Stoddard said the Hubbards have committed to continue their support of realism and will add to their cultural commitments by opening the Anne C. Stradling Museum of the Horse early next year. That museum is expected to take three years to complete, according to Stoddard.

The winning pieces of the 1990 and 1991 Hubbard Art Awards for Excellence, will continue to hang in the Hubbard Museum, Stoddard said.

The two winning artists, Tucson, Arizona artist Howard Terping for "Transferring the Medicine Shield" and New York City artist Ron Sherr for "Portrait of Elaine" each won the top prize, \$250,000, for their realistic art.

The Hubbard Art Collection also was exhibited throughout the world with shows in New York, Germany and the Soviet Union during its first two years.

## Hotel development delayed for a year

The proposed 207-room Sierra Blanca Radisson Resort Hotel has been postponed for a year at the request of developer-owner R.D. Hubbard.

Hubbard, in an interview Thursday, said he had advised Ruidoso Mayor Victor Alonso that he was asking the council for an extension.

"I don't want to build the hotel this year," Hubbard said. "The economic condition of the country is not good at this time. I'm not totally convinced that the recession is over. The more economic signs that come down, the more convinced I am that

this thing is not over," he said.

"Anyway, I asked the council for a year's extension," Hubbard said.

Alonso discussed the request during an executive session with the council at the end of Tuesday's regular council meeting.

Hubbard said he picked up a rough draft, unsigned, of a council letter Wednesday morning.

"They're asking for me to appear before the council to request the extension and to post a \$100,000 bond," Hubbard said. He said he would have been required to post the bond in October, anyway, if he didn't act on his agreement.

"I really don't have any problem with what they asked," he said.

He said those were the only two requests from the council.

## Old bridges may buckle and break under heavy loads, warns county road manager

Old wooden bridges add charm to the Lincoln County countryside. But those picturesque planks may not be safe.

"There are several wooden bridges built in the 1950s and 1960s, some even earlier," said county road manager William Cupit.

"They were built during a time when trucks were smaller and lighter. They're designed to carry maybe 20,000 to as high as 80,000 pounds, but some of the rigs hauling drilling equipment can weigh 120,000 pounds.

"Add the degrading of the timbers because of age and they're not as safe as they should be."

Cupit would like to replace many of those bridges with large steel or concrete culverts.

Those culverts could support the heaviest vehicle weight, but require no engineering fee like a bridge.

"The county doesn't have money for its own engineering services," Cupit said.

If Cupit could move tomorrow, the first three bridges he would target would be the Transwestern bridge on the road from Corona to the north of Capitan.

"It's been there forever," he said.

Next would be the White Oaks bridge to the old community school house.

"It's not a county road, but it would be nice if the county could help," Cupit said. "It's in pathetic shape."

Babers Loop in Hondo Valley would be his third choice.

"It's not built to stand when you run 80,000 pounds over it," he said.

Removing an old bridge and installing a culvert type would cost about \$15,000 or one fourth the price of a new bridge, Cupit said. The life expectancy of the culvert crossing would be 20 years or more, he said.

"I can't criticize the old bridges," Cupit said. "They've been here 25 years or longer. Some were built in the 1940s. But times have changed and there are bigger and heavier vehicles on the road."

When he receives a report about a bridge in serious condition, his crew usually patches it, replaces the timbers, planks and decking, and may put steel on top, Cupit said.

If people are concerned about the safety of crossing a bridge, they should contact the road department at 354-2922 in Capitan.

"Don't take any chances," Cupit said. "I'd rather cooperate up front than try to pull someone out of a hole later."

His crews discover deteriorated bridges, cattle guards and culverts while they are out on other calls or in response to specific complaints, Cupit said. "There's no inventory right now, although I would hope

we continue to get a better picture as we review the maps of county roads."

The problem with the cattle guards is due in part to settling, he said. When cattle trucks weighing 84,000 pounds roll on top of them, it accelerates the destruction. Cupit estimated that as many as 100 guards in the county may need replacement or repair.

"The county needs to update the standards for installation of the guards," he said. "We're doing it the same way as in the 1950s. We need to do more stabilization work."

Guards consist of steel grids on top of timbers. The timbers settle when water flows underneath them and that causes a depression, aggravated every time someone drives over the guard when it's wet, he said.

After recent flooding in the Arabela area in west-central Lin-

coln County, Cupit said he was irritated to learn he couldn't use state disaster money to improve the roads there. All he could do is rebuild them to the same standards that caused the problems in the first place. That doesn't make sense, Cupit said.

"It's the same with drainage problems," he said. "When we go in to patch, we don't upgrade and put in the proper culverts."

"If we don't upgrade Arabela roads, we will have to continue to go in there every time it rains. It's the same at the O Bar O ranch and we're losing money with constant repairs."

"If I do something, I like to do it right."

One solution would be to install low water crossings in the area. They are concrete slabs that water and debris can run over instead of culverts that might become plugged by debris, he said.

But they are built to keep water from undercutting the structure.

"The fact is that every board has projects they want to work on, but I'd like to spread it around on more roads," Cupit said. "This commission has not refused anything for the improvement of roads. The commissioners are behind the upgrading of the system."

# Confusion characterizes various advertising boards

With Tammie Maddox, village clerk on vacation, there was an unanswered question at a meeting of the Ruidoso Lodgers Tax Board.

The question last Monday was whether a \$13,500 item earmarked for civic center furniture was included in an \$85,000 balance in the LTB treasury.

LTB members played it safe and recommended \$75,000 to go to the newly created Regional Advertising Committee with \$13,500 held in reserve.

However, before the Ruidoso Village Council meeting on Tuesday, LTB chairman Mark Doth found that the \$13,500 was not included in the \$85,000. Doth recommended to the council that the entire \$85,000 be transferred to the RAB for advertising Lincoln county activities and attractions. The council approved.

RAB members were to meet this morning to finalize some Sun Country and New Mexico Magazine Vacation Guide advertising.

The five members of the Ruidoso Lodgers Tax Committee last Monday voted to recommend the transfer of funds.

After the LTB meeting, the same people put on their Regional Advertising Committee hat where a meeting was conducted.

Eventually, according to a plan originated by the village council, there will be other members of RAB, from the Chamber of Commerce, from the county and perhaps from the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe. So far, only the LTB members are official members of RAB.

RAB is in its formative stages and is somewhat nebulous at this time.

The LTB, with three members appointed recently by the Ruidoso

mayor and approved by the council, elected officers last week. Doth is the new chairman.

The LTB is an advisory board to the village council, so the transfer as approved had to have council approval.

LTB members were advised by member Jay Francis that nine entities have or are expected to get together to co-op advertising costs for a three-page spread in the Vacation Guide, which reportedly has 750,000 circulation. Also, the three-page spread would go into the Sun Country publication.

Formerly individual entities such as Ruidoso Downs Race Track, Ski Apache, Chamber of Commerce and such have advertised with small ads scattered throughout the publications.

Cost to each entity for the co-op effort would be from \$3,000 to \$3,500.

LTB members were advised of

two bids for "production costs" for the spread. Doth asked for a motion for the LTB to pick up \$2,000 of such costs. The action was approved, subject to council approval.

The LTB decided to seek a third bid. The two bids were from the Phil Price Advertising Agency in Lubbock, Texas, and the Entrop Agency in Roswell.

The Entrop Agency's bid was considerably higher than the Price Agency bid.

LTB previously had approved money for advertising a number of activities in Lincoln County this year.

These include the Billy the Kid celebration at Lincoln, Christmas Jubilee, Golden Aspen Rally, Cowboy Symposium, All American Festival, Apache Trails activities, Blue Grass Festival and such.

Also money has been set aside for Sun Country USA dues and

Ruidoso lapel pins.

After approving the \$75,000 transfer from one pocket to another, Francis asked, "What are we going to do next meeting if all the money's gone?"

Mike Warren, chairman of the newly formed Ruidoso Downs Lodgers Tax Committee, attended the meeting for educational purposes.

Apparently the Downs LTC will be asked to contribute monies to the Regional Advertising Board as will the county lodgers tax board.

Warren told the LTB that the Downs expects possibly \$30,000 to \$35,000 in revenue from the lodgers tax this fiscal year, that he had no authority to commit any funds at this time.

Francis said that with the \$85,000 and maybe \$30,000 from the Downs, \$30,000 from the county and perhaps \$10,000 from

the Lincoln County Heritage Trust, "we'll get more bang for the buck" in advertising Lincoln County. He mentioned a \$42,000 match from the state.

LTB members said that the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce will be coordinating and recommending how RAB monies will be spent.

Next regular meeting of the LTB followed by a RAB meeting will be August 20 at 4 p.m.

Other members of RAB, other than LTB members, should be in place by that time.

Two Chamber members were expected to be named last week at a board meeting, but the board meeting was canceled due to death of Jerry Watts' father. A board meeting was to be rescheduled for this week.

Watts is executive director of the Chamber.

# Two injured, two arrested in two separate area stabbing incidents

Two local men were injured in separate stabbings in the Ruidoso Downs area last week.

The incidents also resulted in the arrest of an Alamogordo man and a Ruidoso Downs resident.

Carl Dawson and Leonardo Marquez of Ruidoso Downs, were taken to the Lincoln County Medical Center Tuesday, July 30, after disputes they were involved in got out of hand and ended in stabbings, said Lieutenant Bobby Angermiller of the Ruidoso Downs Police Department.

Dawson was transported to the Gerald Champion Hospital in Alamogordo with an injury to his right eye. He is reported to be in serious condition.

Marquez was stabbed about three times. He was released from the hospital early Friday afternoon.

Arnold Ochoa, 33, of Alamogordo and Manuel Sanchez, 23, were arrested and both have appeared before Magistrate Judge J.R. Wheeler of Magistrate Court and are waiting for their preliminary hearings.

According to court reports, Ochoa was charged with aggravated battery and is out on his

own recognizance.

A \$10,000 appearance bond was set for Sanchez, who was arrested and charged with aggravated battery and use of a deadly weapon.

Dawson and Ochoa were involved in a heated dispute at a residence at 122 Heights Drive when Dawson was struck in the face, according to police records.

Some of Dawson's friends immediately took him to the LCMC, where officer Dana Terlecky and Lieutenant Bobby Angermiller responded to the disturbance call.

Because of the extent of damage occurring to the male's eye, he was

transported to the Alamogordo hospital, Angermiller said.

An arrest warrant was issued and Ochoa was arrested the following day.

The Ruidoso Downs Police Department is keeping identity of the object which struck Dawson's eye unidentified at this time until further investigation can be made.

The other aggravated battery occurred just after midnight at the Ruidoso Downs Race Track.

Angermiller reported that Marquez and Sanchez had been drinking intoxicating liquors when they began to argue.

Marquez was then stabbed three times by a folding blade knife. He was stabbed once in the lower left of his torso, a deep cut to his right forearm and a strike to his left ear, according to court reports.

Because of the seriousness of crime and no permanent address given for the suspect the police were afraid of the possibility of Sanchez leaving the area.

According to court reports, a consultation was immediately scheduled for an arrest warrant. Police were able to locate Sanchez at a residence in the Hollywood Trailer Park.

Both men reside at the Bill Leach Barn at the Ruidoso Downs Race Track.

Lieutenant Angermiller said that the stabbings are a very rare case.

"We very seldom have any stabbings," he said, explaining that it was probably the first one this summer.

The last major incident occurring in Ruidoso Downs was a rape of a young woman at the beginning of June.

at home," Miller said. "When young people move away, the community loses a large investment."

The center location at 1400 Sudderth Drive was chosen because it provided enough room for administration as well as a few classes.

"The community survey last year indicated that classes also should be available during the day, so eventually there will be daytime classes here," Miller said. "But for now, all the classes will be at Ruidoso High School at 6 p.m. and later."

Another plus is that Sandy Gladden and the Region IX offices, which handle a variety of special education programs, are upstairs in the same building. That will allow sharing of information and the possible future development of a program for the learning disabled.

"At this point, there is no two- or four-year institution in the state with an active program marketed for the learning disabled," Miller said. "It's one of the special niches talked about with the local administrative committee. And there is state and federal money available."

A student will be able to earn as many as 15 hours of credit per semester at the center, going to the classes Monday through Thursday evenings, 6 p.m. to 9:30 p.m.

"And it will be at half the cost of tuition" on large state university campuses, Miller said. A student taking 12 hours will be considered full time.

For this first semester, the entrance fee of \$15 is being waived. The charge per credit hour for residents of Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs is \$18. For non-district students, it is \$20 an hour. Students also should anticipate some cost for supplies and textbooks.

"We will have a little bookstore operating at the high school, but it will pretty much be limited to textbooks," Miller said.

Financial aid will be available in the form of PELL grants and the Stafford Loan Program, he said.

"The main campus will handle the processing and we will provide a toll free number to call, as well as forms and some advice," Miller said. "As soon as a student affairs person is hired (within a month), he or she can handle the financial aid applications here."

"One thing I also will be discussing with the local committee is a scholarship program," Miller said. "We would look to local people and businesses to invest in their high school students."

Veterans education benefits can be used at the center.

The course offering was developed by community leaders and Eastern before being approved by the state Higher Education Commission.

"We will have a dozen standard freshman offerings, courses like business law, business communica-

tion, accounting, computer skills, English composition, beginning Spanish and beginning drawing," Miller said.

They run from one to four hours in credit and each course meets just one night a week, so several could be taken during the same semester.

The center also is offering two refresher-type courses in English and mathematics.

"They could be important for adults who never have taken college level classes before or who have been away from school for years," Miller said.

To familiarize members of the community "with what a college is all about," Miller was scheduled to meet informally with residents of Hondo last week. Other community-based meetings may follow.

To pull in more people from across the county and state, Miller plans for the center to host a number of special events such as an art show the first week of October, workshops on aging and conferences on various subjects.

The next step will be to introduce non-credit courses.

"We already have seen a great deal of interest expressed, but we need to get the credit section started because that's where the state money is being allocated," Miller said. When instituted, the fees will be substantially less for non-credit courses, he said. One of the first may be a life drawing class.

In the center's future, Miller sees enough courses to complete a two-year academic degree or technical degree in areas such as the

building trades. Classes will be year-around.

"I think a summer session should be extremely popular and attract a lot of out-of-town people to teach and to take classes," he said. "I can see us offering four different blocks of time."

"The possibilities are limitless here," he said. Once a two-year degree program is in place, the center would be able to establish courses by contract with businesses to train prospective or existing employees.

He also would like to introduce college courses for high school students. Gifted students with high grade point averages would be eligible to take courses toward their college degrees while still attending high school.

"But I don't want to jeopardize the honors courses at the high school so this is something that will take a great deal of coordination," Miller said.

Night high school also is a possibility for students who need to make up credits or are working, and for adults who want to go back and earn a high school diploma.

"The state has money for night high school, but the local school board will have to decide if it is something of interest," Miller said. "It has to be up and running by the 40th day of regular school and then must obtain accreditation."

Miller said he has received many applications for teaching positions from local people and instructors in Roswell, some would commute and others are retiring and would like to move to Ruidoso.

Initially all the faculty would be part-time positions, but as the cen-

ter grows, some could work into full time jobs, he said. Miller plans to start interviewing teachers this week.

"Eastern is very committed to staying here," Miller said. "I know people have been worried that it would come in and then leave. But I think some of the longterm indications are that Eastern is investing additional instruction resources here in terms of money, equipment and technical assistance to a degree I wouldn't expect if they were here for the shortterm."

"I think they also see the economic potential for Ruidoso with the establishment of an education center, in terms of sending kids here for college from out-of-county," Miller said. "They'll need a place to live and to eat. Ruidoso has to be a real attractive place to go to college."

Registration for classes will be conducted in several places because "part of the mission is to be very responsive to the needs of the community," Miller said.

From 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. August 19-23, students will be able to register at Ruidoso High School. # Mescalero leader attends summit

Tribal and state government leaders, including Fred Peso of Mescalero, participated in a summit conference, Friday, in Santa Fe.

Title of the summit was "Tribal Sovereignty: the Government-to-Government Relationship."

A release from the New Mexico Office of Indian Affairs says the conference was to give substance to one of Governor Bruce King's campaign promises. This was to take care of the needs of the state by working as equals with New Mexico's sovereign tribal governments.

Peso, secretary of the Mescalero Apache Tribal Council, was appointed to the Commission on Indian Affairs by Governor King in June.

The conference working sessions were at the Santa Fe Indian School at 1300 Cerrillos Road in Santa Fe. Governor and Mrs. King hosted a reception for tribal leaders and other participants the evening before at the Governor's Mansion.

Peso says the conference would focus on the current issues of concern to Indian people. Jurisdictional problems will be confronted, he says.

He expected redistricting to be discussed.

"This will be a true dialogue between the highest levels of New

Mexico state and tribal governments in a positive, non-adversarial setting," Regis Pecos, director of the New Mexico Office of Indian Affairs, says.

Speakers at the conference said states and Indian tribes should negotiate, not litigate, their differences, according to an Associated Press story on the conference.

John Echowhawk told delegates that for the past 30 years the sovereignty of tribes has been firmly recognized by the courts. Echowhawk is executive director of the Native American Rights fund.

The issue today is implementing that sovereignty, he said.

"Our traditional enemies, the states, have come to recognize tribal sovereignty cannot be defeated, and the best policy to pursue is learning to live together as neighbors," Echowhawk said.

University of Colorado law professor Charles Wilkinson told the Indian leaders they have a "rare moment of opportunity" to negotiate with the states on matters ranging from tourism to child welfare because Gov. Bruce King's public acknowledgement of the tribes as sovereign.

Albuquerque lawyer Kevin Gover, who is an attorney for Indian tribes, said stability must exist in matters such as taxation and

environmental regulation before businesses will be willing to invest on reservations.

The New Mexico Commission on Indian Affairs co-sponsored the event with the New Mexico Indian Bar Association and the New Mexico Bar Association, the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Supreme Court of New Mexico.

Topics included tribal law, taxation of resource extraction companies operating on Indian lands, authority of tribal courts to decide child custody cases, law enforcement and more.

The news release from the Office of Indian Affairs stated:

"The 1984 legislation for Joint Powers Agreements provides a way for the tribal and state governments to join forces as separate sovereigns with a mutual respect. Close to 10 percent of New Mexico's citizens and 10 percent of land is Indian owned.

"It is impossible for New Mexico to succeed without the partnership of the 22 tribes that govern over these lands and citizens. As federal funds become scarce and both state and tribal governments are held responsible for everything from child care to air pollution, New Mexico's 22 tribes and the governor face one another with frankness.

The two were brought in when they were about six-months old with six other siblings. Four of their brothers had to be euthanized and two were adopted.

Ernie resembles a collie and Bert has the expressive contrasting eyebrows of a shepherd. Basch said they would be well-suited to the outdoors and would make excellent ranch dogs. They enjoy children and are very out-going, he said. However, they do tend to be somewhat intimidated by new experiences "like the first time they were put on leashes," he said.

They could be adopted separately, but do enjoy each other's companionship and would make a good team.

People interested in helping the adoption effort for animals at the shelter may donate to the society's spaying/neutering fund or they can sponsor an animal for adoption by paying its fee for neutering or spaying.







Meetings are set to discuss habitat stamp

New Mexico Game and Fish, the U.S. Forest Service (USFS) and the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) have scheduled public meetings in August to solicit comment on Sikes Act habitat improvement projects and the Northeast Region Five-Year Habitat Stamp Plan.

Meetings, 6:30 to 9 p.m., will be on August 19, American Legion Hall, Cuba; August 20, USFS, 1220 St. Frances Drive, Santa Fe; August 21, Coronado Hall, 120 Civic Plaza Drive, Taos; and August 22, Public Service Company of New Mexico Building, 420 Railroad, Las Vegas.

Comment may also be submitted in writing before August 31 to: Janell Ward, c/o New Mexico De-

partment of Game and Fish, 3841 Midway Place, Albuquerque, New Mexico 87109.

The 1974 federal Sikes Act allows each state to enter into cooperative agreements with the BLM and USFS to charge a fee for hunting, fishing and trapping on those federal lands. The law requires that monies collected be used for habitat improvements in the areas on which they were collected.

New Mexico was the first state to implement the Sikes Act, starting with a fee on the Valle Vidal in 1985. This year, a \$5.25 habitat stamp is required to hunt, fish or trap on all federal lands in New Mexico.

Game & Fish sells 712 elk licenses

Licenses not sold by 5 p.m. August 16, will be available at 8 a.m. Monday, August 19.

Elk licenses cost \$38 for residents and \$213 for nonresidents. Deer entry permits are \$3 each; applicants must have a valid deer hunting license before purchasing a deer entry permit. Deer licenses are \$19 for residents, \$146 for nonresidents.

A list of licenses for the secondary ("fire") sale is available at Game and Fish offices.

The secondary sale resulted from some hunts not being requested by applicants for 1991-92 public-land license by the April 27 deadline. Last year 2,032 licenses were available in an August sale.

The number is lower this year because 57,000 people applied for the nearly 24,000 public-land licenses of all types, including elk, bighorn sheep, antelope and exotic big game — compared with 45,000 in 1990 — and because more hunters asked for second-choice hunts in the elk hunt drawings.

The Department of Game and Fish will sell 712 elk licenses — about two-thirds of which are for bow and muzzle-loader — and 32 deer entry permits beginning at 8 a.m. August 16 at its offices in Albuquerque, Santa Fe, Raton, Las Cruces and Roswell.

A total of 149 bow, 331 muzzle-loader and 232 rifle licenses will be available. Under-filled hunts are typically in less popular areas and/or later hunt periods.

Hunters may obtain application forms from Department of Game and Fish offices on or before August 16. A computer network links game department offices, and a centralized clock will put each office on line at 8 a.m.

Only one person may apply on a form, but an applicant may submit up to four individual applications at the counter. Forms not signed by the applicant and submitted by another applicant must be accompanied by a power of attorney form. Personal checks, cash, money orders or bank drafts will be accepted.





# Pony Express riders finish the race with a photo finish

Hills, spills, and thrills were all part of the annual events in White Oaks Saturday, as the Pony Express Race saw a photo finish for the first year ever.

As the crowd of more than 100 people gathered along the sides of the street, talking and waiting for the first horse to come in, the Zia and Hindi teams were battling it out between the steep gullies of the mountains.

The roars of excitement intensified about 9:45 a.m. as the two teams came skidding to the finish line, both riders pulling their tired horses across in an effort to capture the winning title.

Hindi had so much desire to hand over the mailbag that he reached out too far and ended in a face crash to the ground - just over the finish line.

It was the first time the Pony

Express Race has ever seen something so close, said one of the judges, Betty Joiner.

The two determined riders, inches apart, were so close that the winner wasn't announced until the rodeo - after officials got together to discuss various rules concerning the race's finishing strategies.

The problem occurred because of the finish line painted across the street. After the race, the Hindi rider believed he crossed first, but was unable to give an official his bag.

An actual finish line has only been provided a few times during the 23 years the race has been held. Usually the first rider to hand one of the officials their mailbag is declared the winner.

The Zia team was the first to do that, said Joiner.

So, as the cheers of number one filled the air, rider Waashba Tsits,

joined by his family and friends, received the \$1,250 check.

And last year's first place winner, Jamil Hindi - who bought his mailbag as a souvenir hoping for that same good luck this year - accepted the \$750 check for second place.

Third place and a \$500 check went to the Gachupin rider with the time of 1:47.17, just three minutes and 34 seconds behind the winning time.

The rains didn't stop the action from continuing as spectators watched an original White Oaks Rodeo packed with entertainment that announcers claimed could only be seen in this little town about ten mile outside of Carrizozo.

In addition to the events, great homemade barbecue cooked by Paul's Brother of Clint, Texas, was enjoyed by many of the rodeo and racing fans.

## Bargain horse wins the Rio Grande Futurity

Jose Pancho, one of the best bargains to come out of the Southwest in quite some time, scored the biggest victory of his brief career Sunday by romping away to a 6 1/2-length triumph in the \$48,185 Rio Grande Futurity.

Jose Pancho, a steal for \$2,300 at least year's Ruidoso Horse Sales, scored his fourth victory in six

career outings while defeating a full field of 11 other New Mexico-bred juveniles.

"He broke good, but he tried to take himself back a little bit," said regular rider Joe Martinez, who has already captured seven added-money events at this meeting. "Going into the turn, I thought he was getting a little too far back, so I

strapped him a few times, and he just re-broke."

The compact son of Sutcliffe accelerated into contention on the turn, and then simply blew by early leader Power Stretch straightening away for the drive. Jose Pancho covered the 6 furlongs in a fast 1:12.4 on a sloppy track.

Jose Pancho was picked out at

last summer's Ruidoso Horse Sales by trainer Don Farris for the partnership of R.D. Hubbard and Ed Allred.

"I liked his conformation when I saw him," said Farris. "He was correct."

I kind of just took a shot on him."

Leon & P. Jean Anderson's Jean

Allemande, who was second to Jose Pancho in the trials, closed well for second. Apache Summit finished fairly well for third, in front of stablemate Power Stretch who faded to fourth.

Jose Pancho has now captured two stakes races. Earlier this summer, the dark bay gelding was a 1-length winner in the Rio Grande

Kindergarten Futurity. The only setbacks in his career were a runner-up effort in his debut and a strong second-place finish against open company in the Norgor Futurity.

Jose Pancho added the \$24,092 winner's share of the purse to his bankroll, which increased his career earnings to \$71,718.

# County targets low income housing for '91 grant request

A \$400,000 program of housing rehabilitation was chosen Tuesday by the Lincoln County Commission for its Community Development Block Grant application.

The figure was based on spending \$10,000 per home. Houses owned by low and moderate income families would be targeted.

The application will be for a two-year period, because the state is combining allocations for 1991 and 1992 in grants to be awarded in November.

About \$9,056,000 is available this year and \$6.2 million has been set aside for basically rural areas like Lincoln County that include

cities with less than 3,000 residents and counties with less than 15,000.

Lincoln County's population is estimated at slightly more than 12,000.

The block grant program started in the mid-1970s. But in the early 1980s, the program was transferred to the state to handle except for applications from cities with populations of more than 50,000. Those go directly to the federal government.

The county will use the Las Cruces organization called Tierra Del Sol Housing Corp. to prepare the application. If the money is awarded, that corporation also will be one of the bidders for the job to coordinate the housing repair work.

Commissioner Monroy Montes had suggested housing rehabilitation as a project earlier in the year. Public hearings were conducted for input and suggestions for other projects from residents.

The block grant program requires about 5 percent matching money from the applicant, but county manager Nick Pappas said Tierra Del Sol's preparation fee will be used as an in-kind match. The deadline to apply is August 23.

Pappas said last year, with \$8 million available, the county's application for renovation of an old government office complex in Carrizozo was ranked in the middle range and was not funded.

The commission stayed away

from projects that would include the Ruidoso/Alto area because it would push the income level too high for favorable consideration.

Anything that benefits over 51 percent low and moderate income people is a good bet for funding, the commission has been told. The state expects to fund from one-third to one-half of the applications.

County attorney J. Robert Beauvais said it was wise for the county to apply for \$400,000 because the government probably would cut the request.

In other business, the commis-

sion—Approved hiring two part-time transportation officers at minimum wage with full benefits for the


Sheriff's Department.

—Told Maggie Bohks, emergency services and communications coordinator for the county, to come back with a detailed proposal for an increase in the per hour pay for volunteer emergency medical technicians based on length of service with the county. Bohks said the rate of pay when volunteers respond to emergencies has not changed since 1974 when it was set at \$10 an hour. The county has a high turnover of personnel and she especially would like to see those who have stayed in the area receive consideration, she said.

—Heard that Sheriff James McSwane has requested financial participation from the villages of

Carrizozo and Capitan in the purchase of more equipment for dispatch services used by both communities.

—Approved a contract with Carrizozo for the housing of their prisoners in the county jail, with the stipulation that the village be responsible for any medical care needed by those prisoners and for security during transportation. Beauvais said the county may see more prisoners charged for traffic violations under state statutes instead of municipal ordinances because prisoners are then considered the county's responsibility even though they were arrested within city limits.





Lots of talk and no action could be the downfall of the Ruidoso Village Council. Grandiose plans sound good, but in this current administration those big ideas get bogged down quickly as the Mayor and Council debate details and seem fearful of losing complete control.

The Mayor is preaching regionalization — in solid waste, in advertising and in committees. Such broad-based efforts require cooperation and good communication. Regional plans will only work in an atmosphere of openness, and they're only a dream when the various governing bodies place themselves in adversarial roles.


Mayor Victor Alonso ran his campaign on a platform of openness and communication, and yet it never happened, because the Mayor doesn't like it when people — councilors, employees, voters or the press — question him or (even worse) disagree with him.

On the one hand, Alonso heads the regional waste authority, and on the other hand he says, "WE don't want to give the county anything." When the Mayor's regional planning board met for the first time, Ruidoso Downs and Lincoln hadn't been contacted to send representatives.

The Sierra Blanca Resort project, which the Mayor inherited, is his opportunity to shine. It involves the village, All-Hub and Jackie, and A.N. Spencer, and will impact the entire area. And yet, here too, there appears to be a complete lack of communication between the village and the hotel developers.

It's time to reopen village hall and set aside the clandestine attitude that is paralyzing this village. Village employees shouldn't feel threatened for asking questions, councilors shouldn't be punished for raising issues and village citizens should feel welcome in our village headquarters.

Please, can we talk? And then, let's make it count by working together.



Freedom of expression. That's what it's all about. If I want my house painted polka dot, that's my right. This is America, buddy. Land of opportunity. All this zoning to protect the other fellow is a bunch of bunk.

I am the other fellow. Do they think they're protecting me from myself?

Individuality. That's what this country is based upon.

In Florida, I once built an 8-foot tall fence around my house, with the pretty side facing inward so only I could see it.

My neighbor was furious, called it an eyesore and vowed to get even.

"How would you like it if I sold my house to

a minority?" he asked. "That's OK," I told him. "It's a tall fence. I wouldn't be able to see him."

Freedom to individually set community standards. That's what we're really talking about. Those bi-centennial red, white and blue fireplugs made a big social comment. So did the dogs that left occasional unpatriotic messages on them.

And how about that bi-centennial? Did anyone ever get enough of the old red, white and blue during the early '70s? I sure didn't. Good art never wears thin.

The mayor has all kinds of bold new plans. He recently suggested the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County (EDCLC) sue Lincoln County for breach of contract. That's courageous. How many politicians do you know that would suggest the EDCLC, funded by tax payers money, sue the county, also funded with the same taxpayers' money? The suit could eat up thousands of dollars and years in time between a team of lawyers representing the same client.

That leaves a lot of key unanswered questions. If the EDCLC won, how would that impact Corona? If the county won, could the Village of Ruidoso still afford Dick Weber feasibility studies? How about punitive damages? Would the county force the mayor to take a class in art appreciation?

And would any of this be seen on "America's Funniest Home Videos?"

It was the news release given by the U.S. Forest Service concerning a public meeting the next evening about their timber management program. The small article did not contain any background information for concerned

citizens. My wife and I attended this meeting because we were notified earlier by the U.S. Forest Service. The U.S. Forest Service personnel did an outstanding job of presenting their information. It was just a shame that practically no one attended this very informative two hour meeting. Other than the 15-plus forest service personnel that were there to answer questions there were only three other people besides us that attended.

I strongly believe that if The Ruidoso News is truly interested in serving the public that you would show better judgment in get-

ting information to the public. Your lack of concern in publishing an earlier story about the U.S. Forest Service plans kept practically all citizens of Ruidoso without important information. That important information would have given the citizens of Ruidoso the opportunity to give input into the future of the national forest we all hold dear to us.

When it gets to a point where a local newspaper fails to report the news or perhaps refuses to report the news, then maybe it's time for some competition.
