## US Rep Skeen weighs solid waste collections

What works in Hoboken doesn't necessarily track in the rural areas of New Mexico, including Lincoln County.

That was the prevailing opinion when U.S. Rep. Joe Skeen (R-NM) discussed solid waste disposal with municipal and county leaders at an

open forum Wednesday at Ruidoso village hall.

Skeen said the people who make state Environment Department and federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations involving waste management "don't know one strata from another."

"You have no board of appeals," Skeen said.

He said he would like to see the

EPA put together a panel of experts who could come to Lincoln County to see if certain rules and regulations are applicable," he said.

The appeal body should have the power to grant variances when regulations don't apply or fit a local situation, he said.

"We haven't answered your problem ... let's find a solution," Skeen told the group.

"Long term monitoring (of disposal sites) is a problem," said Capitan Mayor Frank Warth.

Ruidoso village councilor Ron Andrews suggested that when a village is fined for non-compliance, fine money be put in escrow.

When the village does its best to comply or does comply, the money should be returned, he said.

He said a \$25,000 fine is "big

money" to Capitan or Ruidoso.

County Manager Nick Pappas outlined another problem.

He said the Ruidoso and 'surrounding developments can't qualify for Community Development Block grants because "this area doesn't have the low to moderate income CDBG requires."

He said Capitan, Carrizozo and the Hondo Valley can qualify, but

not Ruidoso.

He would like to see the congressional delegation work "to give eligibility," Pappas said.

"That's why I am here ... to make an appeal for you as long as you let us know about it," Skeen said. Skeen had harsh words for the New Mexico Legislature. He said

## Council hears Radisson update

Tuesday's Ruidoso Council Meeting will present a light agenda with some heavy items that include a general discussion of the Radisson Hotel by R.D. Hubbard.

The meeting will begin at 6:30 p.m. in village hall on Cree Meadows Drive.

Hubbard is expected to ask for a year's extension before building a Radisson Hotel on the old Airport property.

The council is scheduled to take action on an ordinance that would double the salaries of the governing body.

The increase would be effective only for council members who win in the next two elections in 1992 and 1994. Those now on the board only will benefit if they run again and are elected.

The bid award for the Civic Events Center will be discussed.

Bradley Construction of Albuquerque was the apparent low bidder at \$1,907,000. Bradley was challenged by Cheyenne Building Contractors in Ruidoso questioning the legality of the sub contractor's list.

Village Manager Ron Wicker said the validity of the challenge would be investigated prior to the regular council meeting Tuesday.

If prior to the council meeting we determine the bid is valid,

Councilor (Ron) Andrews and myself will meet with the general contractor and the architect to determine if any of the bid items can be reduced," Wicker said. He said it may not be possible to have all negotiations completed by the council meeting. If not, Wicker said he will ask to postpone the item for a future meeting.

Mark Doth, Chairman of the Lodgers Tax Committee, will request funds for Aspenfest advertisement. Those expenditures include Billy the Kid, \$2,000; Christmas Jubilee, \$1,500; Golden Aspen Rally, \$2,500; Lincoln County Brochures, \$1,500; Cowboy Symposium, \$5,000; Civic-Events Center furnishing, \$13,500; Lapel pins, \$3,700; All American Festival, \$5,000; Apache Trails, \$1,000; Rocky Mountain Music, \$168; and Sun Country USA, \$2,000.

Other agenda items will include: -The swearing in of Gary Jackson as Deputy Village Manager.

-Creation of a cemetery board -Presentation and request from the Golden Age Club.

-Presentation and request from the Arts and Film Commission.

-Schedule public hearing on a Zone Map Amendment for Lot 19, block 1 of Forest Heights Subdivision.

### White Mountain Elementary opening delayed for a week

White Mountain Elementary students will get another week of vacation. Classes for the second and third graders at the Ruidoso school on White Mountain Road will not begin until Tuesday, Sept. 3.

Major interior renovations and additions to the school by Cheyenne Building Contractors have been completed, School Supt. Mike Gladden said. School officials began moving furniture last week into new classrooms.

But heavy rains have hampered the completion of exterior improvements, he said. "The parking lot still is pretty messy," Gladden said. "The kids deserve the best this year. They had to put up with a lot last year (when construction started while classes still were in session.) We appreciate the understanding and cooperation of the parents of the community."

Other schools in the Ruidoso district began classes last week. As enrollment figures climb, the local school board has begun discussion of alternatives for expansion of other schools or construction of a new school.

## Spencer skeptical of BLM land exchange

Officials from the Bureau of Land Management have offered plenty of answers, but Lincoln County Commission Chairman Stirling Spencer said last week that he still isn't sold on the idea of the federal government acquiring private land along the Rio Bonito.

A letter from Larry L. Woodard, state BLM director, published in The Ruidoso News, failed to quiet his concerns nor did a meeting with BLM officials in July.

Lack of trust and a general dissatisfaction with previous BLM actions seem to be the crux of many of the current objections, including those of the commission chairman.

Spencer said Friday that he is especially leery of the proposed swap of land because no written plan exists that can be evaluated by local residents; water rights would be removed from the private sector, possibly forever; statements from BLM officials that no other private lands will be condemned are only

verbal, not in writing; that once the land is acquired, BLM activities there could adversely affect neighboring property owners; and that the true extent of the tax loss if the private land goes public has not been accurately estimated.

Following the points reviewed in Woodard's letter, Spencer noted that BLM officials say they will develop a plan only after the land is acquired and ample public input has been received as part of a districtwide plan. The initial swap would cover about 2,000 acres, but up to 5,000 acres ultimately could be acquired.

In his letter, Woodard said developing a detailed management plan when the land is not owned by the government would not be "a wise use of taxpayer dollars."

Spencer disagrees. "Does private business develop a widget or buy real property prior to putting together an actual plan? I don't think so," Spencer said. "And private business seems to perform at greater efficiency than that

reflected in the national budget, paid for by taxpayer dollars."

The idea of swapping BLM-owned isolated and less environmentally desirable tracts of land

elsewhere in the state for prime riparian (river and related land) along the Rio Bonito around the historic settlement of Lincoln was not a result of a demand from the

public, Spencer said. It was proposed to the BLM by a private land partnership, which had purchased several thousands acres in a bankruptcy action.

"Let's not build a larger bureaucracy unless the public requests it," Spencer said. "This transfer was requested by a real estate group for monetary gain."

Without at least a general plan, area residents and the county as a whole have no guarantees if the leadership or direction of the BLM changes, or the agency is abolished and the land is transferred to another government entity, he said.

"Let's put it in writing so it's fixed," he said.

### CONDEMNATION

A guarantee he would like as part of an official document is Woodard's statement that "No private lands along the Rio Bonito will be condemned by the BLM."

## Hondo teacher canned by obscure rule

Carrying placards declaring their support for Thurman Sanchez, students, parents and some teachers Friday asked the Hondo District School Board to keep Sanchez on the school's teaching staff.

But board members said they have to comply with the law, even if it's after the fact. They voted unanimously to rescind Sanchez' contract.

Hondo school board members and Sanchez, who formerly taught in the Ruidoso school system while serving as a member of the Hondo district board, appear to be victims of a law passed years ago designed to discourage political "cronyism."

That law states that school board members may not be compensated by their districts until their four-year terms have expired "even if the board member resigns from the board before the end of the term."

Board chairman Modesto Chavez assured supporters in the audience that the board would be willing to consider any alternatives that could bring Sanchez back on staff without violating the law.

### CHRONOLOGY

Sanchez was elected to the Hondo School Board last March while employed in the Ruidoso school system.

When Sergio Castañon, also a former Ruidoso teacher, was hired as Hondo school superintendent in July, he recruited Sanchez to form part of his new teaching staff. Sanchez also was to serve as second in command when Castañon was away.

The evening the Hondo school board was to consider his hiring, Sanchez resigned from the board.

The motion to hire him passed with one vote in the affirmative from Chavez and two abstentions from member Alberta Sena and Victoria Sanchez (no relation to Thurman Sanchez). Abstentions are counted as positive votes.

The five-member board consisted of only three members at that spe-

cial meeting because of Sanchez' resignation. Member Ken Pendergrass had resigned at a previous meeting to clear the way for his son to be hired as a teacher.

Victoria Sanchez said Saturday that she abstained instead of voting against the motion because although she had questions about the propriety of the hiring situation, she thought Sanchez was an excellent teacher and the argument for hiring him was persuasive.

Mrs. Sena apparently had similar reservations in addition to her disappointment that Sanchez did not fulfill his four-year commitment to voters to serve on the

The Roswell district resource management plan, which will include the Rio Bonito project, if the land is acquired, will not be finished until 1993, Spencer pointed out.

"That's two years away," he said. "So what guidance will there be for the Rio Bonito prior to that date? Anything they say now, they're not bound by. Until it's in that plan, they can't be held accountable."

"If the management and money are in place as Mr. Woodard indicated, why not have a management plan in place so citizens can get their answers."

Spencer said there are too many previous incidents involving federal agencies where promises of no condemnation were lost under pressure to develop national parks or dams or other projects. It's the tax-

payer who has to reimburse the owners for the land and improvements taken under condemnation, he pointed out.

## WATER RIGHTS

A risk exists that privately-owned water rights could be sold to out-of-county entities, Spencer said.

But he has confidence in the fairness of the state's regulation of rights and ownerships along the Rio Bonito.

"Once (water rights) are in (federal) government hands, we'll never be able to bring them back to the private sector," Spencer said. "If they don't put them to the best use, they're lost."

"And not having a plan in place we fully understand, we don't know if they will be put to the best use."

The BLM may not be after all of the water rights in the state, but the agency would like to control all

of the water rights on land it owns, Spencer said.

"Right now, some water rights are owned privately, even though the BLM has the land," he said.

After a meeting in Carlsbad, he was present when Woodard said the bureau would like to control those rights, Spencer said.

"If they are kept within the private sector, they will not be used at the direction of federal, Eastern U.S. whims," Spencer said.

One plant mentioned by BLM officials in reference to stabilization of stream banks is salt cedar.

"I question the use of that bush as a riparian enhancement tool," Spencer said. "It was brought into this area 30 years ago as an erosion control tool for planting on the sides and bottom of arroyos."

"It does that, but it sucks up all the water and will dry up creeks. Plus, it proliferates like crazy.

They're spending millions to eradicate it along the Pecos River, but it's hard to kill."

## FUTURE IMPACT

"This new direction of the BLM is the result of a push from the federal government and Eastern senators and Congressmen," Spencer said. "Are we letting them tell us what to do?"

If the effort of the BLM to improve the riparian area provides a habitat for an endangered species, even though it is not onsite initially, adjoining private land could be impacted, Spencer contended.

"The federal government could then regulate the use of that adjoining land and that would take away private landowners' rights," Spencer said.

Pointing to the fact that the commission hadn't been specifically consulted about the swap plan until it asked BLM officials to attend a commission meeting last month, Spencer said he's not sure the commission will be included in future steps either.

Although BLM officials have repeatedly stated they will comply with all county laws, zoning or otherwise, Spencer said he isn't convinced. Before a final decision, he wants the BLM to ask for the commission's concurrence and wait 60 days for a response.

Despite BLM assurances that the public and the commission will have plenty of opportunity for input at every step of the process, Spencer said he's not sure the agency will listen to that input.

In lieu of property taxes, the BLM will pay the county at the federal rate per acre (depending on type of use) established by Congress in 1976.

"Remember, this is not an entitlement, but rather at the discretion of Congress annually," Spencer said. "The county, on the other hand, can adjust property tax rates annually to reflect inflation and market. That's not just true about land that includes equipment, livestock. In addition, there is a loss of improvements private landowners and businesses provide, and the loss of gross receipts taxes to the villages and county. There's a negative multiplier effect that could affect villages and even cities in other counties."

He wants to see the economic impact analyzed before any action to remove that land from the county's tax base, Spencer said.

board, Victoria Sanchez said.

"But apparently Mr. Sanchez felt he could better serve the children by teaching in the valley," she said.

She pointed out that Sanchez had taught with the Ruidoso system 21 years and took a pay cut to join the Hondo district.

Sanchez had been teaching four classes for three days in Hondo when newly-appointed board member Curtis McTeigue noticed the law in a packet provided to board members by the state.

McTeigue called Frank Sisneros, another new board member, and he called Castañon. The superintendent said he then contacted Charles D. Noland, an attorney with the State Education Board, who had advised him before the board's special meeting that the hiring was legal.

"This hiring was all directed to the betterment of the school," Castañon said. "It was my job, the board's job and the job of the people in Santa Fe to know the rule. I called and it passed, but now (the state officials) are saying we didn't discuss it."

## FRIDAY MEETING

High school students expressed their support for Sanchez Thursday by walking out of classes and peacefully demonstrating in front of the school.

After a meeting with Castañon, they returned to class prepared to attend the board meeting to ask for cooperation.

Board members Friday said they shared the blame with Sanchez and state officials for overlooking the law. But now that they are aware of the law, they cannot ignore it.

Sanchez' hiring "has been embroiled in conflict since the beginning," Victoria Sanchez said. "And it's been stressful for all of us. All five of us (Chavez, Victoria Sanchez, Sena, Castañon and Sanchez)

are responsible for the mistake and it needs to be fixed. Ignorance does not eliminate that need. If we choose to bend the law now, it would set a precedent to bend it in the future and I don't think that's in the best interest of the kids."

"If we don't enforce this law, how can we enforce others like our own disciplinary policies?"

McTeigue said that he felt compelled to speak out when he read the law in his state-provided packet.

"I was born and raised in Hondo and as I went through life, I saw a

lot done here and other places under the table and around the law," McTeigue said. "Board meetings were nothing more than a puppet show. The superintendent said this and nobody questioned."

"I promised myself that if I was ever elected, I would not go under or around the law. If we don't start setting an example, when will it be set?"

"I'm not against Mr. Sanchez or the students," he said. "What happened is unfortunate, but I can't personally go against the law. (This) makes us look like bad guys. Things should have been checked out more thoroughly before proceeding."

One spectator asked Chavez, who had served a previous term on the board, whether he had ever reviewed the packet of regulations sent by the state.

"This was the first time I read it, I had no reason to before," Chavez said.

Sanchez asked Sena whether she was aware of the law at the time he was hired.

"I said I knew it wasn't right and I'd fight it," she responded. "You ran for the board, not the staff."

New board member Frank Sisneros said he felt "put upon" being thrust into a tumultuous situation not of his making.

He pointed out that every school board member in the state - including Sanchez - received the same manual sent to McTeigue.

"It's their choice to read it or not," he said. "In my opinion, they accepted the responsibility to read the laws governing their work."

## SUPPORTERS SPEAK

Several students told the board that in the brief three days they had attended Sanchez' classes, they had learned more than in previous year-long classes. They credited him with improving their attitudes toward school and preparing for college.

"I'm for Mr. Sanchez staying," said student Danelle Marquez. "I've known him for a long time as a friend and teacher. I feel you would be doing damage to myself and my fellow students having him not be a teacher. I have never had a teacher who cared for and respected me like Mr. Sanchez."

Teachers told the board they have seen a dramatic improvement in student pride and attitudes.

"Last year, I don't believe the students would have demonstrated this amount of enthusiasm and care over a teacher resigning," teacher Gordon Thompson said.

Linda Sanchez, sister-in-law of Sanchez and an instructor, noted that Sanchez had approached "her about starting an honors class program. He also has been working on a \$10,000 grant this year for the school as part of a program that could expand to as much as \$50,000 in future years."

"That's a lot of money for a poor school like Hondo," she said. "Because of his stature around the state, we had a good chance of getting it."

Teacher Cheryl Bowman said, "I

believe Mr. Sanchez helped create an air of excitement. I'm hearing students talk of college goals I never heard discuss it before. His not being here will be a detriment to students and would hurt the school."

She urged the board to examine all possible alternatives.

One possibility mentioned was that Sanchez could be paid by an-

other educational entity and used at Hondo as a contractual service.

But Victoria Sanchez reminded spectators that many other factors may have been involved in the change of atmosphere in the school.

The change started when former Ruidoso High School principal Tom Hansen took over as interim superintendent late in the school term last spring, she said.

"In three days, yes, there has been change, but there are other staff members and the new superintendent and I don't think they are receiving the credit they deserve," she said.

James Baca, who referred to himself as a major stockholder in the school system with four children attending Hondo, said the law was not designed for this particular situation.

"There are two (separate) things - the letter of the law and the spirit of the law," he said. "You're playing political football with the future of our kids and the future of Mr. Sanchez."

He questioned whether someone "went looking for (the law) to hurt Thurman."

## BOARD ACTION

"When I came down, it was with the goal to help the students of the valley," Sanchez said. "I was a graduate from Hondo and I attended Highlands University without any idea of what it was all

about. The fact is, we were not giving the students the necessary training. That's why I came and took a cut in pay. I didn't have to. If I, the school lawyer or (state officials) had known about the law, I definitely wouldn't have resigned."

On the advice of attorney Noland, the board prefaced its motion to rescind Sanchez' contract with the words "assuming for the purpose of this motion that the contract had legal status."

Also on Noland's advice, the board then proposed a motion that would allow Sanchez to resign under an agreement that "the parties should release each other from any claims based on the contract or the board's action."

But Sanchez refused to agree to that motion on the advice of his at-

torney. "I admit I did not know the law, but the liability lies on the employer, not on the employee," he said.

He pressed Chavez to state that he no longer had a job with the district.

"Are you telling me I'm fired," Sanchez asked. "Because your motion says it was a valid contract. I signed a contract and so did Mr. Castañon."

He said the issue may have to be resolved in court.

Chavez finally responded, "I interpret it, Mr. Sanchez, that you don't have a job."

A few tense moments followed when Sisneros questioned why Sanchez seemed to signal to a person videotaping the meeting. He asked whether Sanchez intended to use the film in court.

Castañon said the film was to be used for a government class and was the property of the school. But he pointed out that the meeting and the minutes of the meeting are open to the public.

After the meeting, Sanchez said despite some apparent ill-feeling on the board, he would be willing to come back to Hondo if something can be arranged legally.

"I would come back for the benefit of the students and staff," he said. But he added, "I feel obviously that this is a personal thing. Someone went looking for something and found it."

the Legislature said, in effect, "We aren't going to raise taxes, we're just going to take it (revenue) away from the cities."

"I think that is reprehensible," Skeen declared.

Al Junge, recently retired Ruidoso village councilor, posed a couple of questions to Skeen not having to do with municipal or county affairs.

Junge cited a \$362-billion projected deficit this year and asked what will be done about it. He said that Congress is going to have to muster enough guts to get rid of some of the entitlement programs.

Skeen said giving the president the power of line item vetoes would be one step in that direction. He said public demand for more services is part of the problem.

Asked by Junge what he can tell

his grandchildren, Skeen said:

"Confess that your generation is part of the problem. It's up to the electorate to make Congress perform ... we've got to get more people voting to solve problems," Skeen said.

"You are right, the answer is with the people," Junge said.

Village councilor Bill Karn cited water rights problems with Indian reservations.

"It has to go to the Department of the Interior ... we've got a severe problem," Skeen said, citing damage to water right owners along streams.

The problem of the government-paid attorneys representing the tribes while citizens or municipalities must pay their own way was brought up.

Regarding the free trade movement, Skeen said some sort of import fee may be needed to protect basic resource producers. He men-

tioned oil and agricultural products specifically.

Ruidoso village councilor J.D. James asked about the spiraling costs of medical services.

Skeen acknowledged that congressional action is necessary.

"We have to work to protect the care providers as well as the recipients," he said.

Responding to a question from Junge, Skeen said that restricting the number of terms a congressman can serve would not solve anything.

Skeen said "staff" would be running the government, that there would be no continuity.

With "staff" calling the shots, Skeen said, "you would be deeper in the mud than ever."

Lame ducks won't do anything, he said.

Skeen admonished those present to pay attention to redistricting, not only congressional but legislative.

# Domenici seeks Indian programs

New Mexico Senator Pete Domenici today announced that he is co-sponsoring legislation to create a demonstration program that would integrate the employment training programs of four federal government agencies and allows tribes to consolidate them into one.

"The scarcity of employment opportunities is a fundamental problem on Indian reservations," Domenici said. "The bill before us today would create more efficient use of job training funds allocated to the four employment programs."

The bill co-sponsored by Domenici would establish a demonstration program for at least ten tribes to integrate employment, training and related services programs of the departments of Labor (DOL), Health and Human Services (HHS), Education (DOE), and the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA).

The major programs to be consolidated by tribes participating are the DOL's Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA), the HHS's Job Opportunities and Basic Skills program under the Family Support Act, the DOE's Carl Perkins Vocational Education programs, and the BIA's Tribal Work Experience Program and Employment Assistance Program.

"I believe an effective job training program is an important key that will complement our efforts to increase employment on our Indian reservations," Domenici said. "Besides complementing the program I introduced with New Mexico Governor Bruce King (Joint Economic Development Initiative), which includes a section for Indian employment, it also complements a bill I co-sponsored that provides more incentives to expand employment opportunities on reservations."

In February 1991, Domenici co-

sponsored the Indian Economic Development Act.

"The average unemployment rate on New Mexico pueblos is about 40 percent," Domenici said. "In some areas, as in the Zuni pueblo in northwest New Mexico, the unemployment rate is as high as 75 percent."

Among the Native Americans in New Mexico are the Navajo, Mescalero and Jicarilla Apache tribes, and 19 pueblos.

Domenici, R-N.M., is co-sponsoring Illinois Senator Paul Simon's Bill with Senators Daniel Inouye, D-HI; Daniel Akaka, D-HI; Quentin Birdock, D-ND; Kent Conrad, D-ND; Thomas Daschle, D-SD; Dennis DeConcini, D-AZ; Frank Mikowski, R-AK; and Harry Reid, D-NV.

"This measure may hold great promise for the economic future of Indian people across America," Domenici said.

The laughter and giggles could be heard through the doors to the Ruidoso Middle School gymnasium as Loren Kahn captivated another young audience with her imaginative puppets.

But Hank has a good disposition. "He's a large, strong dog, but he will need someone who understands hounds. They have a mind of their own," Basch said. "He's been an outdoor dog, so he's not housebroken."

Hank is being sponsored for neutering by C.R. Hicks, a repeat and generous contributor to the humane effort in Ruidoso.

Neutering is the major cost connected to adoption. Sponsors provide for less expensive adoptions and enhance the chances of dogs and cats finding new homes. All pets adopted from the shelter must be neutered to ensure that they do not continue the production of unwanted litters that might have to be destroyed in the future.

It's always a good day for Basch when he sees pets paired with new

owners who will love and properly care for them. He saw plenty of loving owners earlier this month when he was asked to judge a pet talent show sponsored by the Ruidoso Public Library.

Children showed up with gerbils, goats and many other unusual pets with dubious talents.

"But the one that made me chuckle the most was the worm," Basch said. "The child who owned it carried it around to show people and when I asked what her talent was, the owner said she catches fish."

The goat was on show for being able to eat anything "and we got a demonstration of that," Basch said.

"One child said she had a bunny. It turned out to be her two-year-old sister in a rabbit costume."

All the entrants took home a prize.

The society always needs pet sponsors and foster homes for litters of young kittens and puppies. The homes provide a healthy environment for the young animals until protective shots take effect and they can be returned safely to the shelter for adoption.

Furr's had acquired the structure when the corporation purchased Safeway stores in several area cities, including Ruidoso.


Jimmy Sportsmen, minister of the Church of Christ, said a facade is being designed for the old building in the 400 block of Sudderth.





Also from the Gospel according to Saint John:


"I go to prepare a place for you ... that where I am there you may be also."

## Editorial

### Home isn't always a safe place to be

Women are more at risk for assault, rape and murder by a male partner than by a stranger, and it's going to take education and enforcement to put a stop to the national problem that reaches into every little town in this nation — even into this peaceful mountain village.

Family members are beating up on each other all over the United States — from two to four million women are physically battered each year. 20 percent of women using emergency rooms are battered. One in five pregnant women is battered. 95 percent of batterers are men, and up to 65 percent of them also abuse the children.

It would be nice to think those awful statistics on domestic violence are recorded somewhere else. But New Mexico's 11 shelters and two safe homes tell a different story — they care for about 1,000 victims each month. It's happening right here in Ruidoso.

Police work hard to keep the peace and keep family fights from escalating, but the problem is far too time consuming for them to do the job alone. It's going to take help beyond law enforcement and the courts — it's going to take educating the public and victims to the pervasive and debilitating nature of domestic abuse.

Family Crisis Center is at work in Lincoln County. Since there's no shelter, this county's statistics are not included in that 1,000 a month, but the Crisis Center is on the job, called in by police to offer counseling, advocacy, a temporary safe haven and, often, a shoulder to cry on.

If you're a victim of domestic violence, remember that you're not alone. Call 257-7365 and ask for a Family Crisis Center volunteer. Call anytime — just for information or for someone to listen to you. Don't wait until it's too late, for statistics show that violence in the home usually escalates over the years.

If you know a victim, call the Crisis Center to find out how you can help. The Center can provide a "Plan Ahead" card to help the victim consider options for dealing with her problem.

If you want to help victims of domestic violence, call the Crisis Center at 257-7365 to find out how to join the dedicated, but small, group of volunteers.

It's a terrible thing to be afraid in your own home, but Family Crisis Center, with your help, will ensure that the terrible cycle doesn't repeat itself into the next generation.

## Business & Economic Development

### Studies don't drive the economy — people do

Last year the Legislative Interim Committee on Economic Development decided to meet in Chama. The mayor and some community members showed up to discuss economic development issues.

People complained that the lumber mill had recently shut down and that times were hard. They needed help.

Don Silva, a representative from Albuquerque, said that maybe they needed an economic development study done for the area and suggested that the legislature could help them find funding.


Everyone at the meeting nodded in agreement. Then one person raised their hand and said that a study on Chama had just been completed at a cost of \$60,000 and was submitted to the city last week. It had been put on the shelf and forgotten before the ink even had a chance to dry.

The study is still on the shelf.

This is a common story.

The Los Alamos Labs received directives that they should work more with area Indian tribes, so the labs did a study. They found that some tribes owned structures that could be converted to manufacturing facilities, and the labs figured out what could be manufactured by the tribes that they could buy. The studies were presented to the tribes, and they still sit on the shelf.

Similar stories could be repeated again and

again. When an economic development entity or a community decides that there's a need to foster economic development, they usually commission a study. Studies do not create economic development, people do.

The necessary main ingredient is always a key individual — an entrepreneur. The time to do a study is after an entrepreneur is found — not before. Even if a study does not necessarily recommend a specific industry or business for an area, if someone wants to do it had enough, they can often make it work.

The other common instant recipe for community economic development is an industrial park. After a study is commissioned, this is often the next step. Never mind that there are over 15,000 industrial parks in the country, and they are all trying to recruit businesses.

The City of Taos recently completed a study for an industrial park. This, however, was

done as an outgrowth of their successful business incubator project. The incubator was begun several years ago with the donation of a Smith's Supermarket building. Two women were hired who had made similar projects work in Colorado, against great odds, to do fund-raising and create an incubator.

The community was skeptical. The incredible drive and dedication of Patty Martinson and Terry Badhand made the dream a reality.

The incubator is now full and has fostered the birth of a number of new businesses. As the businesses grow they will be encouraged to move out of the partially subsidized incubator environment and move into the industrial park, making room for more new start-ups at the incubator.

It's a wonderful theory. If it had been put forth in a study, it would have been thought simplistic, and the study would have sat on the shelf.

In the case of Taos, it was the two women who made the concept possible, and their continued work will make a study for an industrial park fruitful.

Despite what is sometimes thought, business and economic development hinge on individuals. It is finding, inspiring and supporting key people that economic development is really about.
