Shooting mars motorcycle weekend

"They kicked him and shot him, kicked him and shot him, kicked him, and then shot him again."

That was one officer's account when two motorcycle gang members were shot late Saturday at the Winner's Circle in Ruidoso. One member also was stabbed.

The shooting of rival motorcycle gangs at the bar, co-owned by Ruidoso Village Councilor Jess Stinson, was not a part of the Golden Aspen Motorcycle Rally, according to rally promoter Village Councilor Ron Andrews.

Andrews was asked if his large rally might have attracted these cyclists. He said cyclists often follow rallies. He said attracting unsavory cyclists can't be prevented.

Andrews' Golden Aspen Rally advertising listed The Winner's Circle as sponsors of the Battle of the Bands on Thursday and a street dance on Friday.

Early Saturday, hundreds of motorcyclists had congregated in front of the Winner's Circle and the Win, Place and Show, the village's two Midtown bars. Many had participated in the Golden Aspen Rally parade and settled down for what turned out to be a long day of drinking.

The Winner's Circle and other

town bars had enlarged their drinking area by obtaining a permit from the New Mexico State Alcohol and Beverage Commission to serve liquor outside on their parking lots.

Ruidoso's severely understaffed police officers had to look the other way for hundreds of open container drinking violations that could be witnessed along Sudderth and Mechem.

The Winner's Circle lot was filled with bikers at 8:45 p.m. when six shots were fired by two rival motorcycle gang members.

According to a police report by CID Commander Lanny Maddox, when the fight ended, Mark C. Stevens was taken to the Lincoln County Medical Center with a laceration to the left side of his head, a single stab wound to his left upper arm and three gunshot wounds to the upper thigh, lower thigh and interior calf. Stevens was later listed in stable condition.

Michael Allen Craig, a 39-year-old male from Pasadena, Texas, also was shot in the right buttocks and was treated and released at LCMC, according to Maddox's report.

Oddly enough, although two persons were shot on the premises with a .38 caliber and .45 caliber gun, the police report lists no arrests in the shootings by any indi-

vidual nor arrests for reckless endangerment or negligent use of a firearm by the combatants involved.

Maddox's report did say an investigation is continuing. Firearm on the premises of a liquor establishment is a felony offense.


Only one gun, the .38, was recovered and officers at the scene said none of the bikers in the crowded parking lot were talking. Officers were unsure of how many people were involved in the incident. One officer said it was very lucky that no one else was hit by the shots.

Some residents were angry over the general promotion by the council of a large group of motorcyclists coming to Ruidoso. Others thought it was good for business.

Andrews was approved for \$2,500 in tax funds by the Ruidoso Lodgers Tax Advisory Board to help promote his rally, a for-profit venture. He had asked for \$5,000. The \$2,500 also had to be approved by the Ruidoso Village Council on which he is a member.

Some said councilors Stinson and Andrews and Mayor Victor Alonso stood to profit the most from the motorcyclists coming to town. Alonso owns a local restaurant.

Motorcyclists who attended the Golden Aspen Rally, September 18-22, poured out of Ruidoso, Sunday, trade show exhibits were being dismantled and the big trucks hauling them moved out to home bases.

Ms. Harley-Davidson, Krisann Whitley, 23, of Levelland, Texas, and her parents departed the village after what sponsor Ron Andrews said was a very successful rally.

Whitley was crowned Ms. Harley-Davidson in Daytona Beach, Florida, in March.

"The attendance was better than last year, although I haven't tallied the total," Andrews said, Sunday.

Thursday night the King and Queen were crowned by last year's Queen.

Selected queen was Susan Lawson, of Sonora, Arizona. King was Keith Blessingame of Colorado City, Texas. Nita Porter of Midland, Texas, did the crowning.

Receiving recognition for traveling the longest distance to the rally (although not riding his bike which

was hauled along with 12 pairs of skis) was Douglas "Rooster" Campbell, of near Concord, New Hampshire.

A skier of some reputation, he says he's moving to Colorado where he will be a ski instructor at Steamboat Springs.

Campbell said he came to Ruidoso to visit with Ms. Harley-Davidson who he said was a friend and sort of "happened on" the Golden Aspen Rally.

Jill Andrews, co-sponsor of the rally with her husband and with Dan Watkins, said results of judging events during the rally "are in five notebooks scattered around town." They will be compiled and put into publishable form this week, she said.

Weather for the event was more than miserable the first two days but cooperated Saturday and Sunday when bikers fanned out into the hills around Ruidoso for memorable rides.

A number of bikers headed home Saturday since Friday night was the last night of formal rally activities except for a massive parade Saturday morning.



LCMC is in the black two months in a row

Lincoln County Medical Center was in the black in July and August, Valerie Miller, administrator, told board members at a regular meeting, Thursday evening.

The profit figure for July was \$32,518 and for August, \$9,689.

The administrator also reported that during a recent retreat at Ghost Ranch three superintendents at the hospital received awards for outstanding service.

Honored were Betty Testerman, director of social services; Dylinda Roe, director of housekeeping; and Ernie Gonzales, PA, Carrizozo Clinic.

Two specialists have been recruited and will be available in Ruidoso one day a month for patient care, Miller said.

Both are from Albuquerque; one is an oncologist (cancer specialist)

and the other a nephrologist (kidney specialist).

Inez Tanner, hospital auxiliary president, reported to the board that 1,674 hours were donated to the hospital the last two months and that the auxiliary has nine new members.

The auxiliary bank statement shows \$66,178 as a balance; however the auxiliary will be purchasing 50 "lifeline buttons" at \$70 each for hospital use.

Miller announced that board member Ruth McGuire has resigned since she and her husband, Mickey, will be spending the winter in Arizona. The board voted to give McGuire emeritus status. She has been a board member for a decade.

Nell Trout will conduct a workshop on thrift shop operation at the

New Mexico Hospital Association convention in Albuquerque October 31 and November 1.


Also, Julie Duffalo, director of nursing at LCMC, will be conducting a workshop.

Miller called attention to a management training workshop which was being led by Albuquerque personnel at LCMC last week.

Miller also reported a \$10,000 contribution to the hospital from the Reading Foundation, set up by a woman from Midland, Texas.

The hospital staff netted \$181 from a bake sale to replace a camera stolen from the hospital.

Miller said Pat Crumley, director of personnel, was primarily responsible for the \$1,500 raised from the hospital staff for the Political Action Committee of the New Mexico Hospital Association.

Aspen Rally is uneventful on Ruidoso Downs streets

MainStreet board makes plans for Midtown project area

Planner gives update on revitalization

MainStreet board members talked about sidewalks, Halloween and Christmas during a board meeting Thursday.

Brian Burnett of the planning and design firm contract for Midtown's revitalization, outlined the first phase. He told directors that 60 percent of the plans need to be completed by mid-January for presentation to the Legislature for possible funding assistance.

"We should have a dollar estimate of cost by then," said Burnett, who represents Bonannon-Houston of Albuquerque, the civil engineering firm that has the engineering contract for the im-

provement project.

The first phase covers the area on Sudderth from the telephone company office at Fern Avenue to Country Club Drive. Sidewalk improvement, landscaping, a river walk, signage, traffic control and other factors are in the master plan.

The first public hearing on plans for the project will be scheduled November 14 or 15 when public input will be sought.

Engineering should be wrapped

up by the middle of April, said Burnett.

One high priority will be public restrooms. The project area currently has no public restrooms.

Board President Mike Line and directors Dave Saylor and Bill Hirschfeld were named to a task force to plan for possible restrooms just east of Winner's Circle. Village funding apparently will be required.

Also Thursday, Hirschfeld reported that Community Update

'91, co-sponsored by MainStreet and The Ruidoso News, is set for November 1 from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at Cree Meadows Country Club.

Tickets at \$7.50 will go on sale October 17 for the fajita bar meal. Hirschfeld mentioned possible "name" speakers for the event.

Sally Reese reported that Sun World is sponsoring this year's Halloween costume contest set for Ski West Center.

Barbara Westbrook of the

Ruidoso Arts and Film Commission presented her plans for possibly hanging "Christmas palettes" from power poles in Ruidoso.

The presentation was for informational purposes only because current plans do not impact the MainStreet project area.

Westbrook said the plan, if approved by the Village Council, would be to have local artists paint their impressions of Christmas on large plywood palettes.

Her husband, Paul Westbrook, said only a dozen would appear the first year and would be hung primarily around the "Y" at the traffic circle on Main Road and out Mechem.

He said that in the years following many more could be produced to hang from Thanksgiving through New Year's.

"We have plenty of power poles," he told board members and project manager Mary Maul.

Bonnie Mattox, secretary and project chairman for an Aspen weekend float, was given approval to spend up to \$200 for supplies for the float.

One businessman complained that the councilors jeopardized the health and welfare of the community for a few lodgers and their own self-serving profit.

Gene Etter, whose wife manages the Thunderbird next to the Winner's Circle, said he was disgusted with the rally and the council.

"I've talked to many tourists who say to me 'when is this motorcycle rally, we won't be up there that

week.' They avoid it like the plague. In the overall picture, we're probably running away more business than we're taking in."

Etter said he had pleaded with the mayor once before about the conduct of the cyclists and said that if the establishment his wife managed was trashed again a lawsuit might occur.

"He ridiculed the idea and told me I'd have to stand in line," Etter said.

The fight spawned a tense situation. The police were telling citizens to

were trying to contain the situation.

The police scanners noted that village manager Ron Wicker was going to the scene and wanted a police escort. The village manager has an unlisted number by his own request and was unavailable Sunday for comment.

Police Chief Richard Swenor called in reserves. Nearly all of the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department was sent to Ruidoso. Three Roswell State Police and two Alamogordo State Police were sent to Ruidoso. BIA officers were on the scene and private police firms were hired.

Swenor closed the bars to any incoming patrons around 10:30 p.m. Win, Place and Show at that time told customers within their establishment that they were concerned for their safety and asked them to

leave. The Winner's Circle continued to serve their customers until closing.

Stinson said the Winner's Circle did not close because the police did not require him to close.

Stinson said the Winner's Circle used glass bottles Saturday in the picnic area outside instead of paper cups like other drinking establishments, because the Winner's Circle sells bottled beer.

He said cans on his premises or liquor seen in open containers up and down Sudderth would have come from package liquor stores or the grocery store but not his place. He says he doesn't sell cans.

Stinson said the Ruidoso Police should be given great credit for keeping things under control.

It appears that Chief Swenor's fast action in calling in new troops

and the local police officers' prudent responses did prevent what could have been a local disaster.

Dirty, dented dumpsters prompt debate among garbage officials

Ruidoso village garbage dumpsters are not being repaired properly or quickly enough, according to a report compiled by a member of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority.

And some authority members say they want assurances that when it comes time to purchase the dumpsters from the village for more than \$200,000, the units will be in good condition. That purchase would be part of the authority's move to provide countywide garbage collection and disposal.

Authority Vice Chairman Frank Warth, who also serves as mayor of Capitan, said Sunday that if the dumpsters aren't in acceptable condition, the price may have to be renegotiated or other arrangements specified.

"I'm sure this situation will be discussed at our next regular authority meeting," Warth said.

He met last week to discuss the condition of the dumpsters with authority member Al Junge, who assembled the report, and chairman Victor Alonso, mayor of Ruidoso.

Junge, who recently resigned from the Ruidoso Village Council, said he compiled the information after checking on the handling over the past year of a contract for the repair of village dumpsters.

In a summary dated September 6 and sent to village manager Ron Wicker, Junge noted that:

"The city's contract with Luke's Welding contains no written specifications such as the type of paint to be used, the number of coats to be applied or the production schedule.

A longhand notation on a memo says repairs will cost no more than \$150 per unit, he stated.

"This would mean that some units, requiring minor repairs, would cost less than \$150," Junge wrote in his summary. "However, the vendor has billed Ruidoso for \$150 for (each of) the dumpsters repaired to date and has been paid on this basis."

"The agreement with Luke's lacks a specified production schedule. That has resulted in less than 80 dumpsters being repaired between the time the contract was signed and the date of Junge's report, "while the vendor says his capacity is 360 repairs per year."

"The vendor complained to Junge that he has been unsuccessful working with the village solid waste department to keep a supply of units to be repaired on hand. Once repaired, he also has experienced problems getting them picked up, Junge wrote.

Rudolph Luker, owner of the Luke's Welding, was out of town on vacation and could not be reached for comment.

"The vendor complained that 40 percent of his time is required to clean out the interior of the dumpsters before repairs can be effected. Despite complaints to the village, the practice of bringing dumpsters with rubbish and garbage has continued, Junge stated.

"It would appear from the foregoing that the bid process and the installation of the provisions of the bid (such as they are) was mishandled by all concerned," Junge wrote.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Many of the points cited in his report were covered as recommendations before the contract was signed in an April 1990 letter from Junge to then acting village manager Leon Eggleston.

His 1990 recommendations included steam cleaning the units before delivery, maintaining a repair inventory and continuing to use a paint designated for metal and of a shade the same or darker than the existing color.

However, at some point, the color was changed from the original tan to a pinkish tint, Junge said. The water-based paint appears to need more touch-up and seems not to be faring well against rust, he said.

If specifications had been included in the contract with Luke's Welding, some of the problems might have been avoided, Junge said.

For future handling of the dumpsters, Junge recommended in his letter to Wicker that a startup inventory of 10 units be delivered immediately and that it be kept intact as repairs are completed. A regular schedule of delivery of units to the vendor and pickup of repaired dumpsters should be instituted by the village.

"Before delivery ... all dumpsters will be steam cleaned," Junge wrote. "This will result in less make ready time and, perhaps, less cost to the city."

Junge also noted that because the authority has experienced a delay in arranging financing for the purchase of garbage collection equipment from Ruidoso and other coalition members, the village will continue to realize a \$20,000-a-month profit from its collection system. The delay could be as long as five months.

"During the same delay period, the (authority) is enjoying the disadvantage of accumulating miles of wear and tear on the trash rolling stock along with adding to the already heavy inventory of UNREPAIRED DUMPSTERS (Junge's italics)," Junge wrote.

The village is scheduled to sell more than 2,000 dumpsters to the authority, which is a coalition consisting of the county and the five municipalities within its boundaries.

In his letter to Wicker, Junge estimated that as much as 30 percent of the dumpster inventory needs repair.

"The fact that Ruidoso repaired less than 80 dumpsters since the repair bid was signed is regrettable and catching up with the repair work in so short a time will be difficult," he wrote Wicker. He added that he did not hold Wicker responsible for the situation because the village manager has only been on the job a short time.

WICKER'S RESPONSE

Wicker responded to Junge in a letter about a week later.

"I commit to you and the representatives of the (authority) that we will attempt to repair our normal monthly quantities, prior to the official transfer of the sanitation department to the (authority)," he told Junge.

But he disagreed that the village should be responsible for repairing as many as 900 dumpsters prior to the transfer.

"Although I was not involved in the appraisal process, I believe the appraisal was based on the fact that some of the dumpsters would be in good condition and some in need of repair," he wrote. "If all the dumpsters were in perfect condition, I would hope that the appraisal would have exceeded the individual appraised cost."

An appraisal of the dumpsters performed for the authority by West America Business Brokers placed the value of 2,045 dumpsters at \$102.80 each without distinguishing the number in poor, average or fair condition. An appraisal by John Blatnik & Associates broke the number down into 1,500 dumpsters at \$100 each and 700 at \$125 each.

Wicker pointed out that the contract with Luke's Welding has expired and the village is working on a month-to-month basis for repair while attempting to negotiate a welding contract for minor repairs on scheduled routes throughout the

village. In his letter to Junge, Wicker admitted that a more formal contract is needed for the service. He pointed out that Luke's was the only bidder who responded last year.

Any new contract drafted will address the cleaning of dumpsters delivered for repair, Wicker wrote. But he contended Luker had stated to a village sanitation official that the dirty dumpsters weren't a problem.

Alonso said Sunday that he was not aware of the conditions of the village's dumpsters and appreciated Junge's meticulous research on the subject. He was surprised with some of the findings, however.

"I thank him for the positive things he reported, but I don't agree with every aspect of the report," Alonso said.

"I agree with Mr. Wicker that it would be unreasonable to expect the village to overhaul one-third of the stock. And I pointed out to Al (Junge) that as authority members, we should be equally concerned about the condition of all of the (collection equipment) to be purchased by the authority, not just that of Ruidoso. If he's concerned about the authority buying worn out dumpsters, he also should look at those in Ruidoso Downs.

"He tended to agree and we're looking at it."

Ruidoso will be spending money to repair dumpsters and to buy some new units, Alonso said. "I think that it's reasonable to expect the village to keep up the level of service," Alonso said.

Warth said that at the meeting last week, Alonso assured him the dumpsters would be in good shape by the time the authority buys them.

"I don't know if I'm satisfied, but I feel the village is taking steps to get into a program and ensure they are repaired," Warth said.

Stirling Spencer, chairman of the Lincoln County Commission and a member of the authority, told The Ruidoso News he appreciated Junge acting as a watchdog for the coalition.

Spencer said if the village continues to use Luke's, the authority should have some assurance that the company can keep up with the repair volume.

"It surely is a concern that the dumpsters be in good shape," Spencer said. "I would expect the authority would not accept any higher than 10 percent in a repair situation, not 20-30 percent."


"I think we all have been remiss failing to look at the dumpsters firsthand. We're asking Ruidoso to show good faith in the inventory."

Alonso said Ruidoso will do just that. "We'll maintain a good faith effort," he said.

"One of the things I don't want to see is to open up the can again and renegotiate," Alonso said. "I think the entities here have a once in a lifetime opportunity to agree. I didn't foresee the financing problem (that delayed the purchase). I'm not going to say that we fixed 900 dumpsters and now we want more money and I don't want the county saying 12 percent of the stock needing repair is no good. None of that was specified before. I think the deal should stand as agreed upon."

The village may not have a legal contract with the authority about maintenance and repair of the dumpsters, Junge said. "But I think Ruidoso certainly has a moral obligation to do whatever it can to get as many dumpsters ready as possible before the authority takes over."

"The delay (in financing) should give Ruidoso the time (and money) to do that. Members (of the authority who also serve on the council) must realize they are wearing two hats and also are obligated to act in the best interests of the authority."



Sisson named to state board

Gov. Bruce King has appointed Danny Eugene Sisson of Ruidoso to a four-year term on the State Board of Thanatopractice.

The board is responsible for ensuring that all provisions of the Thanatopractice license law are adhered to by funeral practitioners.

Sisson is employed by LaGrone Funeral Chapel. He will join board members David Santillanes Jr. of Rio Rancho, Harold O'Dell of Alamogordo and Charles Sherwood and Walter Smith, both of Albuquerque.

Public speaks out on garbage

Members of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority will field questions from residents about mandatory garbage collection soon to be instituted countywide. The authority, a coalition of the county and its five municipalities, plans to take over responsibility for collection and disposal. Information will be available on the authority's recycling program, compost project and eligibility for variances.

The meetings are scheduled for 7 p.m. They begin tonight in the Capitan school cafeteria and will continue Tuesday in the Hondo school cafeteria, Wednesday in the county commission room of the courthouse in Carrizozo, Thursday in Ruidoso Village Hall and Friday in the recreation room of Corona High School.

BLM accepts Capitan bids

Four bids were accepted last week by the Bureau of Land Management for livestock grazing areas in the Fort Stanton Reservation near Capitan.

Out of nine bids submitted based on an animal unit month over an eight month grazing season, the high bids were: Salado Unit 1, \$13.23 per AUM, West Unit 2, \$13.25 per AUM; High Mesa Unit 3, \$8.26 AUM and East Unit 4, \$9 per AUM. An animal unit month is defined as the amount of forage consumed by one cow and one calf, one horse, or five sheep or goats in one month.

The grazing of the range resource at Fort Stanton will provide the opportunity to research the effects of various grazing strategies on the riparian areas in the area. The effects of the livestock grazing on an endangered species of cactus also is being studied.

The longterm management of grazing at Fort Stanton will be outlined in a Resource Management Plan to be completed in 1993.

Davis murder suspect remains in county jail

Lamar Treas-Wilson, 20, accused of murdering a Mescalero boy, appeared Thursday before U.S. Magistrate Judge Joe H. Galvan at Las Cruces. He remains in the Doña Ana County jail in Las Cruces awaiting his detention hearing.

Treas-Wilson, a Mescalero Apache Indian reservation resident, was arrested by FBI agents just before 8:30 p.m. Wednesday. He was named in an indictment returned by a federal grand jury seated in Las Cruces, according to FBI public information officer Doug Beldon.

The indictment charges Treas-Wilson with the murder of Kelvin Ray Davis an 8-year-old Mescalero boy whose brutally murdered body was found on January 26.

A spokesman for Judge Galvan said Treas-Wilson was read his rights and the charges against him were explained in the initial appearance. She said determination on bond will be made during the detention hearing scheduled at 9 a.m. Tuesday, September 24, in Las Cruces.

The Davis boy's body was found on the morning of January 26, in a wooded area behind his home in the Peña Canyon housing area on the reservation.

Beldon said investigation determined that Davis was murdered with a knife on Friday night or during the early morning hours of Saturday, January 26. The boy reportedly died of one stab wound

to his neck.

The grand jury indictment alleges that Treas-Wilson is the person who murdered young Davis.

Beldon said the indictment and arrest culminate an intensive investigation conducted by the FBI, the BIA, the Mescalero Tribal Police the Ruidoso Police Department and the Otero County Sheriff's Office.

The suspect was arrested driving his vehicle between Las Cruces and Mescalero, according to reports.

Treas-Wilson is employed as a part-time firefighter on the Mescalero reservation and also works seasonally at Ski Apache as a lift operator, said Beldon.

Beldon said if Treas-Wilson is convicted as charged of the offense, he faces a penalty of death or any term of death up to life imprisonment.

The Davis boy reportedly was babysitting two sisters the Friday night and early Saturday morning of the abduction.

When Kevin's parents returned home at 3 a.m. the boy was missing.

Police reports indicated the boy's bedroom window had been broken.

Davis was the son of Zandra Smith and Douglas Davis of Mescalero. He has three brothers and was in the fourth grade at White Mountain Intermediate School.

New lawsuit names Fort Stanton and other state mental health centers

Fort Stanton Hospital and Training School has been named as one of the defendants in a lawsuit alleging maltreatment of patients at state hospitals.

The civil rights lawsuit was filed in U.S. District Court last week by Thomas Popejoy of Albuquerque and co-counsel, which includes more than a dozen lawyers and a public interest law group called Trial Lawyers for Public Justice.

It names as defendants Las Vegas Medical Center, Los Lunas and Fort Stanton hospitals/training centers, Fort Baynard Nursing Home, the state Health Department and 10 state health officials.

"The basic tenet of the suit is that at least four of the plaintiffs had dual diagnoses," Popejoy told *The Ruidoso News* Sunday.

"They suffer from severe psychiatric problems and are developmentally disabled. But New Mexico has no institution or programs

for such clients. They either go to a psychiatric hospital or a facility for those with developmental disabilities like Fort Stanton."

The local facility is named in the suit because of Beth Thomas, 35, a former patient at Fort Stanton, Popejoy said.

She had been diagnosed with chronic schizophrenia, undifferentiated, and with a mental development disability. She stayed at Los Lunas Hospital and at Fort Stanton numerous times between

1975-78, he said.

"At one time, Ms. Thomas was semi-independent, doing her own grocery shopping and laundry under an Association of Retarded Citizens program," Popejoy said. "Our allegation is that because she received no appropriate treatment for her dual diagnoses, she has deteriorated."

Thomas now is confined to the Las Vegas Medical Center, a state hospital, he said.

Fort Stanton Director Ervin

Aldaz said Sunday he's perplexed by the new suit.

"We've been treating dual diagnosed clients for a number of years," he said. "Over 50 percent of our clients have psychoses."

Aldaz said he was gone from the hospital from 1976-81 and did not know the specifics of the Thomas case.

In the Popejoy suit, the plaintiffs are asking for punitive damages, compensation for past damages and money to provide adequate services

for the six defendants in the future.

Popejoy said that winning damages would send a strong message that state hospitals cannot just warehouse their patients. They have a responsibility to provide proper medical and psychological treatment.

A spokesman for the Health Department and Ronni Crago of the State Attorney's office both declined as a matter of policy to comment on the pending litigation.

But it was the Braves defense that cracked like thunder on the gridiron.



Second went to Marilyn Trotter, Bart's wife. She received \$125 and a trophy.



Tepee Lounge serves life skills to RHS students

Industrious cooks earn & learn

Patrons sign a waiting list to eat there. The decor isn't glamorous, no band performs, no dancing is allowed.

But Ruidoso High School's Tepee Lounge is one of the most popular eating spots in town.

TRAINING GROUND

A training ground for aspiring chefs or for young people trying to learn how to survive in "the world after mom," the cooking class has built a solid reputation for consistently good food over the past seven years.

Leading the classroom culinary adventure is Rebecca Durham, who initiated the program and has watched it grow to proportions she never imagined at the outset.

This year, the group has been asked to cater a 400-person banquet for Wal-Mart.

"But the main purpose is to train students for restaurants and to help private enterprise by providing qualified employees, not to compete with private business," Durham said.

"Our emphasis mostly is in-school, not outside catering. But the program has become popular with the community and with the kids.

"We catered an academic awards banquet last year for 200 people, so I started buying equipment to handle bigger groups," Durham said. Some community clubs also enlist their services.

The program is accredited by the State Food Service and there are only 10 such courses in the state, Durham said.

"It's great training for kids who

may work in restaurants or hospital food service for a career or as they go through college," she said. "And it's wonderful background for someone who might like to own their own restaurant someday.

"I thought there would be a demand here."

The curriculum stresses budgeting and planning.

"A lot of kids have told me four years later how much they had learned and how it had helped them," Durham said.

The group consists of 20 students and Durham. That's about four or five short of the usual number in the class. To be eligible for the class, students must first have passed the Foods I course. They prepare all the food for the lounge meals, practicing on the other weekdays or cooking ahead whatever items can be stored without losing flavor.

One of the big bonuses for taking Tepee Lounge is that for all the work and hours students put in, they reap financial rewards by splitting any profit at the end of the year.

LEARN & EARN

The profit has been as low as \$60 for each student in the early years. Last year, each participant earned \$200, Durham said.

About 60 meals are served each Thursday. The seats are filled by regulars who jealously guard their reservations.

The lounge on the second floor of the high school will open October 3. Meals are served from 11:45 a.m. to 12:40 p.m. only on Thursdays.

A tempting sample menu from October includes: Chicken Parmesan, Pasta Fettucine, garden salad, bread sticks, Millionaire Pie, ice tea or coffee. In November, one of the lounge meals will consist of Teriyaki K-bobs, broccoli rice casserole, twice baked potato, spinach salad, bread sticks, cherry delight and drinks.

MAKE RESERVATIONS

All plates are \$4.95 for adults and \$2.50 for children under 12. For reservations, contact Durham at 258-4910, ext. 328. The lounge must be notified two days in advance about cancellations to obtain a refund.

Roundhouse redo revs up AG's office


Who could believe it? The AG came right out with an opinion within a matter of days, maybe even hours, after the State Legislature took action.

The system works for better and worse

In 1968, I remember sitting in San Francisco's Golden Gate State Park and being given Mao Tse Tung's Little Red Book. Usually, I'm not a good subject for proselytizing but, if I remember the moment correctly, I had communed with nature about all I could stand so I read the book.

A couple of dozen pages into it, I thought, "Wow! This is pretty sage stuff," until I happened upon a passage I couldn't quite swallow.


There on page 39 (or whatever it was), good old Chairman Mao, who up 'til now had been promoting education for the lower class and equality among the masses, had written, "True political power comes from the barrel of a gun," and that marked the end of my infatuation with modern Chinese political proverb.

Deep down inside, I loved the United States and I really liked the idea of constitutional rule of law. Pistols in the parking lot just wasn't my idea of good government.

Just recently, I got a chance to experience my favorite constitutional guarantees firsthand. At sunrise on August 30th, a half-dozen white, station wagon cage cars rolled out of prisons across New Mexico.

Convicts chained in each car represented various segments of the plaintiff class in the 14-year-old Duran prisoners' civil rights suit. Each shackled man or woman had been summoned to speak before federal judge Juan Burciaga about the recent settlement agreement reached between the convicts and their captors.

To a person, everyone knew they were about to witness big change and everyone knew that when big change involves humanity, the smaller the chances are of predicting the outcome. Nonetheless, deep in each convict's heart was hope that this was not an invitation to an abandon ship drill.

Once everyone had arrived in the courtroom, it became apparent that the prisoner representative from the Penitentiary Maximum Security Facility was not present. Transportation guards looked sheepishly at their feet and said the missing man was absent by his own choice.

Convicts sitting at the counsel table huddled and came to a different conclusion. Sabotage!

Shortly thereafter, a telephone call from the judge's chambers to the maximum unit confirmed that the convict representative had indeed decided not to come but only after he was told he could not bring legal documents he had collected for his presentation.

New Corrections Secretary Eloy Mondragon took charge and issued an order. The prisoner would be transported to the courtroom immediately with his legal materials.

He arrived within the hour and the hearing proceeded as planned.

From conversations prior to and testimony during the hearing, neither side was thrilled with the agreement. Like all negotiated settlements, both sides had compromised. There was no clear victor. Both sides had found a

place they could tolerate. Nothing more, nothing less.

During the hearing, what makes Judge Juan Burciaga who he is became readily apparent. When testimony turned to mentally ill inmates, Burciaga changed. As he listened, the hard nosed, impatient judge who runs his courtroom like it was on rails tempered to Juan Burciaga, became the man who hates injustice.

Throughout the hearing, Corrections Secretary Mondragon listened intently and took notes. Three years earlier, in the same courtroom, his predecessor, Lane McCotter, appeared bored and occupied himself by fiddling with the water jug and paper cups provided on each attorney table.

Laurence Hurd, the convict representative from the Las Cruces prison, thanked Dwight Duran from the witness stand for his dedication and devotion to duty, a sentiment later echoed by Judge Burciaga.

But, in some ways, the day belonged to Ray Twohig. After more than 10 years as prisoners' counsel, Twohig was leaving the case.

As a compliment and to show his agreement with the attorney's position, Judge Burciaga quoted from Twohig's final written brief during summation.

Deputy Attorney General Rob Booms, who entered the case with the King administration, promised "a new era in the operation of safe and humane prisons in New Mexico."

At the end of the hearing, both sides shook hands and promised mutual cooperation. From all indications, times were changing. The seige mentality of the previous prison administration was being vanquished.


