Aspenfest attracts crowds

Ruidoso's population swelled over the weekend as thousands of visitors took advantage of Aspenfest '91.

"There was an excellent turnout, and no problems at all," said Chief Richard Swenor.

"We were up in the 25 to 30,000 range, I'm sure," said Swenor. "It was a heck of a parade day turnout."

"Everything was peaceful and good," he added, echoing the sentiments heard up and down the street at the parade, street festival, car show and other activities.

Chino tops in primary balloting

With only one third of the eligible votes cast, Mescalero Apache President Wendell Chino seems a solid favorite to win the November 5 general election.

In a three way primary election Friday, Chino and Harlyn Geronimo were the two top vote-getters.

Chino received 297 votes to Geronimo's 123, according to AP reports. Activist Donahn Torres received 23 votes. Ten ballots were voided.

More than 3,000 Mescaleros are registered tribal members and about half are eligible to vote.

Chino has been the only president the Mescalero Apaches have had since the tribal constitution was adopted in 1965.

Geronimo Thursday accused tribal election officials and Chino of improperly conducting ballot-counting behind closed doors.

In 1936, according to Chino, tribal members accepted the provisions of the Indian Reorganization Act, which provided for tribal government.

One provision provided for tribal elections and counting ballots behind closed doors.

Geronimo's brother, Joseph Geronimo, alleged during the last tribal presidential election in 1989 that he was denied a chance to run against Chino.

Election officials at the time said Joseph Geronimo incorrectly filed the candidate applications because he failed to sign the document.

Joseph Geronimo challenged Chino in 1975, 1979 and 1987.

Chino, 66, said he had planned to retire.

"But a majority of Tribal Council pleaded with me to run another term. Many, many tribal members asked me not to abandon the tribe," he was quoted as saying.

State board to promote parks

A highly varied agenda faced the Policy Advisory Committee of the State Parks and Recreation Division of state government in a meeting at Carrizo Lodge here, Friday.

Charlie Griffin of Ruidoso heads the advisory committee which has 10 other members charged with working with State Parks Director Richard Cooper and his staff to establish policy and deal with problems. Cooper and several of his staff were present at the meeting.

Committee members from across the state discussed mercury in lakes, community support for each of the state parks, problems with Caballo Lake below Elephant Butte, simplification of the park fee systems, plus others.

Griffin assigned each of the 10 committee members certain parks to oversee. Members were urged to get committees established in each community near state parks to help promote the parks and to work toward more funding through legislators and the legislature. Committees can help with things like tree plantings and approach road improvement.

Griffin assigned himself Brantley Lake, Bottomless Lakes near Roswell, City of Rocks, Elephant Butte Lake, Harry McAdams State Park, Living Desert at Carlsbad and Smokey Bear.

He and committeeman Gilbert Sanchez will share responsibility for Navajo Lake.

Vice chairman Jimmy Bustamante of Las Vegas named a Las Vegas committee already appointed to help with Storrie Lake. He also has Morphy Lake, Villaneuva and Coyote Creek.

Cooper reported on mercury found in several fishing places in the state including Ute Lake and Santa Rosa Lake. Cooper said the Department of Health has been testing fish. Guidelines on what fish can safely be consumed and

what quantity can be eaten with no ill effects are being shaped up, Cooper said.

"I've been eating fish out of those two lakes for 50 years. If people catch any fish, bring 'em to me. I'll eat them," Griffin declared.

Griffin said his opinion is that the mercury danger has been vastly exaggerated.

But, Cooper said, park attendance has been down at lakes where mercury has been reported in certain kinds of fish.

Thus, he said, guidelines are being prepared.

Donald Isgrig, of Alamogordo, who has Caballo Lake to help look after, said there are only 15,000 acre feet of water in the lake.

He recommended that the lake be closed to boating when it is less than 20,000 acre feet.

He said this would be for boating safety reasons.

Farmers in the area, he said, use water from the lake. They claim dynamos "are out" at Elephant Butte which makes withdrawal from Caballo necessary, Isgrig said.

However, he said, that irrigation ditches are "rain soaked" and that water is being wasted.

Isgrig also asked if he could request road work from Otero County for Oliver Lee State Park near Alamogordo.

Griffin advised that Otero County can be asked to assist with road work on access roads, but that the park system must be involved on any road work within the park.

A new multi-color slick paper brochure was shown committee members. Cooper said the brochure, which lists each state park with location, elevation, facilities, etc., isn't in general distribution.

He said the governor will be asked to launch the publication. Some 250,000 brochures were printed.

Ruidoso's college classes are a big success

Officials of the new off-campus instructional center of Eastern New Mexico University in Ruidoso still are reeling from the overwhelming response of area residents to classes offered during the opening session this fall.

While hustling to meet the needs of students enrolled in classes, they already are planning for a new weekend college.

"Initially, we planned for 12 basic courses, one section each, but by the time registration was over (in August), we had 23 sections," said Dr. James Miller, center administrator.

"The biggest growth was in the computer courses, which have four sections each and we still had to turn people away."

The majority of students are adults from 30 to 50 years old, he said. Very few are in the 18-23 category.

"We have a dozen in their sixties, mostly in computers," Miller

said (See sidebar story).

Spanish was the next most popular course and then art, he said.

The center employs nine instructors and eight of them are local. One commutes from Roswell.

"The Ruidoso school district has been very accommodating, because obviously we needed many more rooms than we originally anticipated," Miller said.

Reaction at the university's main campus in Portales has been enthusiastic.

"The president and others knew there was high interest here and this validates their impressions," Miller said. "But the response was even better than they imagined."

To gauge how well the college is doing after a month of classes and to get input for the future, students were asked to fill out a survey prepared by Miller and his staff.

"All the surveys aren't in yet, but looking at the initial response, it appears most people heard about the college from the newspaper or word of mouth," Miller said.

The first question on the survey was Miller's special choice: If a weekend college option were offered to you starting January, would you be interested in enrolling for such classes and which day would you prefer?

"I had discussed the idea with several people and put it on the survey," Miller said. "The positive response in the initial survey returns was terrific. People said they definitely were interested. My wife is a nurse and she received feedback from medical personnel who said they couldn't go to school during the week because of shift work, but they sure could come on weekends."

Saturday was preferred over Sunday or Friday evening.

"One of the things our new student services director Cheryl LaCounte is doing now is to try to lay out a degree program for weekend students," Miller said. "It would be a two-year course for an associates degree."

Miller said classes would start

early in the morning, break for lunch and run until late afternoon.

A business degree covering areas such as accounting, computer application and general business operation probably would be one of the courses offered and in which there is the most local interest judging by the enrollment to date.

"We are developing courses now to offer starting in January," he said. "We are trying to package the classes to meet people's needs and to get the necessary number of contact hours (for a degree)."

It will be another week or so before the results are in on the rest of the survey questions including those dealing with the need for low-cost child care while attending classes, the demand for no cost tutoring, access to computers outside of class time, the need for financial aid, the major problems areas with the college, the types of courses students would like to see added and why they are attending

Neighbors don't want pit bulls returned home

The possibility that two pit bulls, suspected of killing a local Doberman last month, might be returned to his neighborhood in Alpine Village boils Tom Thompson's blood.

He's already come face-to-face with the violence of a pit bull through an attack on his stepson several years ago.

If the two pit bulls owned by Robert Hamill are returned after Hamill's trial, Thompson said, "I'm arming myself. He better have a way to ensure they can't get out of his property, because if they get into my yard I'm not going to wait to see what they're going to do. I have a two-year-old and a four-year-old."

Hamill's male and female pit bulls, Buddy and McKinsey, are accused of killing a Doberman owned by Jon Raven, who lives nearby.

Hamill recently pleaded guilty to the misdemeanor charge of failing to have his dogs vaccinated. But he pleaded not guilty to allowing his dogs to run loose. A trial is tentatively scheduled for November.

Just how the attack took place may never be known, since there were no witnesses. Hamill was out of town and Raven also was away from home.

The two pit bulls were left on yardruns. The Doberman was confined by a fence, built by Raven after his dog was attacked twice before when it entered the Hamill property.

Ruidoso Impounding Officer Mark Hughes, the first on the scene, has submitted a report offering his opinion. Based on the trail of blood, he suggests that the Doberman, Shodan, broke through a gate at his home. Although the fence built by Raven was quite strong, the gate was a minimal structure, he said.

Hughes said he believes the Doberman then was attacked by the female pit bull, on the Hamill property, was chased back and finished off in Raven's backyard.

Charlie LaBelle, Lincoln County Impounding Officer, said while he doesn't disagree with Hughes, he couldn't offer an opinion on the sequence of events.

"The female was in heat and any male when he smells that is going to try to get to her," LaBelle said. "If the Doberman got out of his yard, I don't know. All I know for

sure is that the pit bulls (at some point) entered the (Raven) yard, regardless of how they got there, and killed the Doberman."

Hughes was the first on the scene and already had Buddy, the male pit bull, in his truck by the time LaBelle and Sheriff's Deputy Angelo Vega arrived, LaBelle said.

He shares the concern of Raven's neighbors and friends.

"My opinion is that the pit bulls can attack again, a dog, a human being, a child, if they felt threatened or provoked," LaBelle said.

Just how the pit bulls got loose from their chains and when they got loose are facts disputed by Raven and Hamill. Raven also disagrees with Hughes' conclusions about the blood trail, contending "there was not a trace of blood outside our yard."

He feels his dog was attacked inside his yard, backed into a corner and killed.

But Raven said he's not calling for the destruction of the pit bulls.

"I just don't want them next door," he said. "The damage is done. I've lost my

dog." Raven said the male pit bull "seemed mellow and there wasn't much blood on him."

Hughes agreed that it probably was McKinsey, the female, who attacked the Doberman. He believes it was a territorial dispute.

"A female pit bull just doesn't attack unless someone has intruded on her territory," he said.

"Any dog is what the owner makes it," Raven said.

Some people might be afraid of Dobermans, Raven acknowledged. But despite Hamill's claims that Shodan chased him when he first came to view the house he later purchased, Raven and several of his neighbors paint a different picture of the Doberman.

They say it was a friendly animal.

"Before Jon built a fence, his Doberman ran free, but I never was afraid of him being around my kids," Thompson said. "I have a shepherd, but he always was friendly."

Raven said his young daughter also played with the Doberman.

Neighbor Anna Demaray said her small 20-pound dog would chase it off by barking. Dr. Earl Leslie, who was the dog's

veterinarian, said the Doberman was a good patient and an excellent pet.

Raven said he's not after a ban on pit bulls, although his mother, Barbara Westbrook, initially asked the Lincoln County Commission to consider an ordinance banning the breed. She later modified that stance in line with an ordinance from Tijeras village near Albuquerque. That ordinance calls for the removal of any dog that has exhibited viciousness and the destruction of any dog that has killed livestock or another dog.

Demaray said she doesn't want the pit bulls back in her neighborhood. Although the pit bulls never tried to harm two Husky puppies that she kept outside.

"I was always afraid to take my small house dog out, because he tends to be aggressive even though he's so small," Demaray said. "I have grandchildren and I just feel this is the third attack and that means there's a problem. They've got the taste of blood and once they have that, it does something to them. I've seen it before."

While Thompson said a Doberman could present the same threat as a pit bull, he noted that Raven built a fence. "I have no problem with these people owning (pit bulls)," he said. "There just should be some backup to ensure they can't get out."

School Board looks to future

The future needs of the Ruidoso School system will top the agenda of the School Board when it meets at 7 p.m. Tuesday in the administration complex next to Ruidoso Middle School. Max Luft of the Cooperative Education Service will present the need assessment report. Later in the meeting, the board also will discuss the objectives of a proposed \$5.5-million bond issue. Board members also will hear the results of a quality of education survey sent to parents of students in the system. Other items on the agenda include the system's asbestos management plan, a first reading of proposed policies for board operation, recommendations for employment and an executive session for personnel in line with annual staff evaluations.

Council is going to the dogs

Good dogs, bad dogs and the cost of dog care covers two agenda items for Tuesday's Ruidoso Village Council Meeting. A contract with Humane Society of Lincoln County regarding insurance is the fourth item on an agenda that starts at 6:30 p.m. After the proposed agreement with the Humane Society was approved by the Village Council, the Society requested the Village to provide the Society's liability insurance coverage. Village Attorney David Thomsen said it would not cost the village additional premiums for the coverage. Thomsen said the provision requiring the Society to carry Workers Compensation insurance, similar to the one in previous years, was left in. He said the Society has asked the Village to pick up this cost of about \$2,000 per year. Consideration of an ordinance banning pit bulls will be discussed during item eight, unless the village chooses to move it around.

other ways to use it, possibly for accounting spread sheets.



They will be available at ports of entry and at state parks and elsewhere for vacationers. Cooper said the fee system for parks is being studied with a view toward making it unnecessary to "track down a park ranger" to get a permit. Fees, he indicated, will be higher for the "better facilities." He said fees will be competitive with those in other states. Lack of funding for state parks the last two years was cited by Cooper. The parks department will be asking the legislature for \$8.3 mil-

lion this year, he said. The need for more RV electrical hookups at several parks was discussed. Cooper said his department is going to be a "big inventory" to see where expanding electrical outlets will be cost effective. "About half the parks need expanded electrical hookups," Griffin said. Next meeting of the committee will be the third Friday of January in Santa Fe during the 30-day legislative session. Committee members were feted at a reception downtown following their meeting. Griffin was appointed chairman of the advisory committee by Governor Bruce King earlier this year.

classes. One of the major complaints has been availability of textbooks, Miller said, because it's difficult getting the right quantity in a timely fashion through a bookstore on the main campus and because the price of textbooks is so high. "The cost of tuition here is inexpensive, but the textbooks cost your right arm," Miller said. To help the school improve, Miller said he has a grant writer on staff working to bring in money and equipment, especially in computer

courses. A second survey was sent to educators through the state Region IX area that stretches from Cloudcroft to Corona and from Tularosa to Hondo. "We are asking educators what kind of service we can offer for them," Smith said. "Probably a lot of what they need would have to be delivered from the main campus, because it would entail graduate work and we can't accommodate that." Those surveys are to be returned by October 10. Meanwhile, Miller and his staff also are busy making up a new

class schedule for the spring session. "We'll be adding sections in Spanish, English and mathematics," Miller said. "We're thinking about Introduction to Psychology, the history of New Mexico, public speaking and sciences such as geology and biology." The second half of the beginning art course will be offered and he hopes to add a course dealing more with ceramics and pottery; beginning accounting may be offered as well as the second half of the construction trades course and possibly a drafting class.

Two music courses, one in appreciation and a second in guitar are scheduled and a new class called introduction to business are anticipated. "Generally, with the weekend college included, we're looking at doubling or more the range of our offerings," Miller said. "That's one of the reasons we're looking for donated space, because arranging all the classes at night at the high school would be a problem." "He's going to want a lot of attention and would be terrific with kids," Basch said. "He'll need some running space and a fence, but he's well-suited for the outdoor life."


While Big Red is shy with new experiences, he also tends to adapt easily with a little encouragement, Basch said. Only five months old, he would respond well to leash and other training.



Residential property sales show healthy trend for past 10 months

If you see larger smiles or frowns in place of frowns on the faces of real estate brokers and associates in Ruidoso, there is a reason.

Residential properties in Ruidoso aren't exactly selling like hotcakes at a Kiwanis pancake breakfast, but things apparently are looking up.

"My feeling is it's on the way up," Preston Isaacs, banker at Ruidoso State Bank who handles repossessed real estate, said.

Al Lane, of Multiple Listing Bureau, says sales in Ruidoso since the beginning of the MLS year, December 1, 1990, are up some \$828,000 over the same period the year before.

Sales for the past 10 months have totaled \$32,929,887 compared to \$32,101,456 the 10 months the previous year.

The optimism was evident at the Ruidoso Board of Realtors installation banquet, Wednesday, October 2, at the Alto Lakes Country Club.

Glen Crane, master of ceremonies, said attendance was the "best in years." There was a jovial atmosphere, contrary to some years past when Realtors were feeling the effects of the oil slump in Oklahoma and Texas and when Mexican citizens were blocked from purchasing property here because of the tremendous drop in the value

of the peso.

Most of the optimism centers on residential sales in homes and cabins in the low to medium price range. There have been a number of sales in the \$100,000 to \$300,000 range, however.

John Winniford, broker, at Lela Easter Real Estate, Ruidoso's oldest real estate firm, says, "We've had the best July and August in years."

Lela Easter had 16 sales in August, the biggest August in history, Winniford says. Ten August closings was the former record. Eleven closings were experienced in September.

Sales in July were 10. Back during the real estate boom years, Lela Easter had 15 sales in July of 1982 and 13 in July of 1983. After that, the market cratered, but indications are it's coming back relatively strong.

Commercial sales? Well, that's a sad story. There is little activity except leasing. Lela Easter had eight sales people including Winniford. The company was founded by Lela Easter in 1952.

Isaacs said that repossessed residential properties in the low to medium range sell within 30 to 60 days after they are put on the market. That certainly hasn't always been the case.

He said the \$100,000 to \$250,000 market is "dead."

Lela Easter has had a few sales in that class, however. It's not completely dead.

One apparent factor in that price range is that people can build a new home for about what an older one, which may be somewhat outdated or in bad repair, costs. This has been a good year in construction of more expensive residences or second homes, building permits reveal.

"Commercial properties are starting to move a little bit," Isaacs says. He said eight to 10 properties between the Post Office and Ruidoso State Bank have moved since January 1.

Roy Seay of the First National Bank said "it's workable. Formerly we didn't have anything."

Tom Rigsby, president of United Bank of Ruidoso, said mortgage loans "really picked up in August and September."

"I am sure the abstract companies and savings and loans will bear that out," he said.

James Paxton, partner in Century 21, happily said his company "is up about 20 percent through September."

That includes both sales and listings. He said the average sale at Century 21 is \$75,000.

"It's still seasonal, however," Paxton said.

He commented that first time visitors to Ruidoso "like what they see." He said "an awful lot of people buy second homes as potential retirement homes in Ruidoso. Prices may seem high to West Texans, but property here seems like a real bargain for anyone coming to Ruidoso from the west, particularly California. "Prices have stabilized," Paxton says. Lot and condominium sales have been off, most Realtors agree. June and July "were bad, but

August saw a rally like Gang Busters," Cindy Lynch of Gary Lynch Realty, said. "September is looking good." She said a few properties over \$100,000 are moving. Bill Pippin of Bill Pippin Real Estates says the "market has been real active since the races were over. I expect it to be good until the last of October. He says there hasn't been much activity in land, and "no commercial. "I feel like there are positive vibes." Sales "are a little bit sluggish right now," Bill Smith of Bill Smith

of Bill Smith Realty says. "Lending institutions are reluctant to loan money on commercial property," Smith said. He says residential property from \$70,000 to \$125,000 is what is moving. So the dark years appear to be showing a degree of brightness. At one time there were 272 real estate sales people in Ruidoso. The number is 117 currently, Realtors were told at their banquet. Real estate sales always have been an important indicator of general economic health or lack of it. Hopefully, it's continued fair weather ahead.



Warriors sack Sartans 17-10 at Homecoming

An air attack led by quarterback Manny Guardiola lifted the Ruidoso Warriors over the St. Pius Sartans for a homecoming victory, 17-10.

"We're really starting to reach our peak," said Warrior head coach Mike Speck. "But we still are unable to hold a high level of intensity for the entire game."

Speck said it was the Warriors' best ball game of the year, and the Sartans were a quality ball team that made the win sweeter.

Speck said there were many outstanding performances. He mentioned Keith Henson for his play on both sides of the ball; Sam Gumbert for his kicking; Manny Guardiola, who completed 54 percent of his passes; Louis Jimenez, he caught several passes and played great defense; Aaron Ford, for defense as well as kicking.

Speck also mentioned Richard Rippy, for one of his most consistent performances; and Robert Murry, who he said played his best defensive game at tackle.

Speck also had high praise for the offensive lineman. He said Jeff Cox blocked well for Guardiola and the running backs; Brook Henderson played in the dual role of blocker and punter, one kick was a 43-yarder with a 5-second hang time; Able Chavez also was commended for his blocking.

"We didn't give up any sacks, which means our offensive line is coming along real well," Speck said.

"We threw the ball 25 times, the most thrown this year."

Speck said the Warriors were spread out offensively, instead of just throwing the ball to Jaime Ordorica like in past games.

"We had five different receivers out there," Speck said.

The coach said during the first

quarter Ruidoso decided to build a little confidence in our passing game and threw the ball seven of the first eight downs. Ruidoso scored on the eighth play.

Walberto Murillo, with 4:12 left on the clock in the first quarter, scored on a seven-yarder around the left end.

Sam Gumbert converted the PAT and it was 7-0.

Gumbert has missed only one point after touchdown and is one for three in field goal attempts this year.

The Warriors traded positions with the Sartans for most of the first and second quarters.

"The defense bent, but never broke," said Speck.

A key play in the second quarter was a tremendous 60-yard pass from Manny Guardiola to Ordorica which moved the ball into field goal range. This was not a pass and run 60, but 60 yards in the air.

With 11 seconds left before halftime, Gumbert split the uprights with a 40-yard field goal and the half ended, 10-0.

In the third quarter, the Warriors grabbed the kickoff and drove it for the second touchdown of the night and a 17-0 lead.

Jose Marquez scored the touchdown on a five yard run off the right tackle.

Gumbert converted. With two minutes and 10 seconds left in the third, the Sartans hit the board with a 26-yard field goal.

In the fourth quarter, the Warriors had several opportunities, threatened but couldn't convert. One miscue was an interception in the end zone and the other a stalled drive that Ruidoso was unable to convert on a fourth down.

St. Pius scored their final touchdown on a 22-yard pass with six

minutes left in the game. The Sartans had one more opportunity, but fumbled the ball in their own territory.

The homecoming victory was the first for the Warriors since 1988.

The game's Golden Helmet Award winner was Jaime Ordorica for key receptions during the course of the game.

Offensive player of the game was Able Chavez, an offensive lineman who helped provide protection and made some key blocks on rushing plays.

Defensive player of the game was Roberto Murillo. Speck said Murillo's performance of playing sideline to sideline was his personal best of the year.

Kicking game player of the week was Aaron Ford. Ford's performance in the kicking game really helped shut down their kicking game, according to Speck. The coach also said Ford made several saving tackles that prevented a touchdown.

Scout team player of the week was Matt Harshey. Scout team players help prepare the varsity by giving a realistic view of the opponent, playing out their plays.

A golf tournament also will be staged Sunday, October 27, at the Inn of the Mountain Gods in conjunction with the Hall of Fame meeting.



WIPP is here to stay

Nobody could claim to have been surprised by Thursday's announcement that Energy Secretary James Watkins has solicited and obtained administrative control of the WIPP land from Secretary Manuel Lujan's Interior Department.

Admiral Watkins has been threatening to do just that for a year. His only demand, with the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant ready to accept test shipments of transuranic nuclear waste, was that Congress move.

Congress didn't move, much to the dismay of virtually everyone including the admiral, members of Congress and local WIPP supporters. They and others closely involved with the project, including state officials, would have preferred Congress pass a law transferring control of the land.

A law would have had funding for New Mexico built into it. Except for a previously-agreed \$63 million, administrative withdrawal offers no such funding.

Legislative action would have had force of law protecting safety. Administrative action leaves us dependent on administrative policy.


Today, we have second best. At least we have something.

Carlsbad took the time to investigate and become informed during the first 10 years of this project. During the last 10 years, we've spent much of our energy trying to educate others.

In the last week, we were pleased to see two editorials in New Mexico's largest newspaper, the Albuquerque Journal, finally acknowledging the unproductive anti-nuclear bias we've been up against for two decades.

We hope congress now will catch up to reality. The WIPP is here. Its purpose is right. Now, will the federal government accept its responsibilities to the host state?
