Council considers animal control

A bid to provide kennel facilities and humane care to animals along with a discussion to ban or regulate vicious animals in the village are two of 15 items to be discussed at the Ruidoso Village Council's Tuesday meeting.

Village manager Ron Wicker received a call from Earline Phillips of the Humane Society regarding their bid to the village for animal control that was submitted in April.

Wicker said the Lincoln County Humane Society Board recently met and members were not agreeable to the action taken by the village council at the last meeting.

The action authorized the approval of an agreement for kennel services on a monthly contract fee of \$2,000 per month. Mrs. Phillips said that the society's board feels that they submitted a bid proposal, requested by the Village.

Their proposal was to provide kennel services as outlined in the specifications for a monthly fee of \$2,500.

Hazel Haynsworth of the Humane Society also wrote the village a letter requesting the council approve or deny the proposal.

Wicker said there is not a current contract in effect with the Humane Society because it has never officially been renewed. He also said that if the council does not approve the proposal as submitted, the village will have to begin keeping the animals collected themselves or possibly contract with someone else.

Discussion regarding vicious animals was postponed from the Oct. 8 meeting on an ordinance to ban vicious animals in the village or regulate more stringently. That item has been scheduled for public input.

Other items to be discussed or acted upon are:

A request for sewer lines and paving in Town and Country North.

An ordinance pertaining to the Uniform Traffic Code and the penalty assessment provision of the Village.

—A ban to regulate vicious animals in the village.

—Enforcement of cross walks.

—Award of bid for the sale of surplus property.

—Bid award for a new or reconditioned used multi-material heavy duty baler.

—Amendment to the recycling grant budget.

—Request of Regional Advertising Funds.

—Approval of amended grant application to the New Mexico Arts Division.



Democrats rally at the Inn Saturday

New Mexico Democrats gathered Saturday and looked back on an election when they took over the governor's mansion and the Roundhouse in the state and looked forward to an election where they plan to place their candidates in top positions in the nation's capitol.

Meeting at the Inn of the Mountain Gods in Mescalero for the State Central Committee and the 2nd Congressional District Hall of Fame Celebration and Salute to Education, party leaders took the podium to rally the party.

During the program Saturday, 29 Democrats were inducted into the 2nd Congressional District's Hall of Fame and 29 educators were honored for contributions to the state.

"The Democratic Party is the party of inclusion -- we want everyone in our party, we reach out we reflect the makeup of this state," said Senator Jeff Bingaman.

The senator praised state party leaders and called on the membership to step forward and run for of-

fice and to support those who do. He said Governor Bruce King is doing a good job, and particularly praised him for the caliber of people he has appointed to serve with him.

"If President Bush were to nominate people for the Supreme Court ... half as qualified as Bruce King has for the New Mexico Supreme Court, we wouldn't have any trouble getting them elected," said Bingaman.

Wendell Chino, president of the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe, welcomed the Democrats to the reservation and spoke of the long-standing close ties between the Apaches and the Democrats.

"After all the uproar ... I thought we might get scratched," said Chino, who has been in the news as the tribe applied for and won a \$100,000 grant to study storing high-level nuclear waste on the reservation.

"We love our land ... we love our freedom," said Chino.

He recalled a time when he was asked to speak at the University of Chicago and had a conversation with the elevator operator.

"You're an American Indian?" asked the elevator operator.

Year-round schools can't provide magic answers to Ruidoso's crowding problems

For the sixth time in a decade, the Ruidoso District School Board is asking voters to approve a bond issue for construction of new facilities and for the purchase of new equipment.

Some parents and educators say there are other ways to solve overcrowding problems and one approach is year-round school.

Opening school 12 months a year and scheduling students on staggered terms currently is being used in many large cities as a means to combat overcrowding, tight budgets and voter rejection of bond issues.

In response to proponents of that plan, the district staff has issued a position paper based on its research of the year-round system.

Board members generally agree with their conclusions.

Bottom line, the staff contends

year-round school would be more costly and only should be used as a last resort.

In the position paper, the staff concluded that advantages of such a system include temporary saving of bond money because construction could be delayed by grouping students in clusters on different schedules.

Vacations would be scattered throughout the year, with one group in school while another is away.

"These different schedules allow the school to accommodate one-third to one-fourth more students," the staff stated. "School districts make the decision to go to staggered schedules and year-round school because of the failure of bond issues, catastrophic destruction of facilities or extreme growth that cannot be accommodated in any other way."

But the staff pointed out several disadvantages to the district and community.

—The cost of operating schools rises dramatically, including personnel, utilities, supplies and maintenance.

—Families in smaller communities such as Ruidoso are often upset because children in the same families are not all on the same schedule.

—Extra-curricular activities suffer. "The whole band, chorus, orchestra, football team and others often cannot be placed on the same schedule at a school," the staff pointed out. "Many students drop out of extra-curricular activities as a result."

—Teachers no longer have a room of their own, because they are placed on rotating schedules with the students. "Much creativity and attractiveness disappears from the

classrooms because teachers know they can only set up for approximately a nine-week block of time. Most make the decision to greatly limit their collection of teaching materials," the staff noted.

—Year-round school, when adopted to save space, does not provide more school time for individual students. The traditional 180 days still is the norm.

Board chairman Lynn Willard and member Mike Morris pointed out another problem peculiar to Ruidoso and other small tourist communities.

"We're a tourist economy," Willard said. "A lot of teachers and students work over the summer. Year-round school would really pose a problem for the workforce, the teachers and the kids. You have to look at the local economic picture."

"Yessir," answered Chino. "I'm the real Indian, I'm from India."
"That's because Columbus was looking for you and he found me," said Chino.

State Representative John Underwood also welcomed the group to his district.

"It makes my heart soar like an eagle to see all of your Democratic faces here," said Underwood.

Governor Bruce King said his party is the party of the people -- big enough for all the people.

Three Lincoln County names were listed among the New Mexicans singled out as distinguished Democrats. They are Cece Griffin, the chairperson of Lincoln County Democrats, Inez Marrs of Capitan, and Lincoln N. McTeigue, who lived in the Hondo Valley until his death in 1989.

Chino, who lives on the Mescalero Reservation in Otero County, was among the area Democrats honored.

Educators honored included Nellie Ruth Jones, retired after teaching more than 30 years at Nob Hill Elementary School in Ruidoso; former state representative Mickey McGuire, a retired Ruidoso teacher; and Roger Sowder, principal of Nob Hill Elementary School.

"Education has been a central party of what the Democratic party has worked for and tried to strengthen for all these years," said Senator Bingaman.

Biographies of the hall of famers and the educators slated for honors during the \$100-a-plate fundraiser.

Cece Griffin, a lifelong Democrat, "has politics in her blood and fire in her heart for Democratic causes," according to information provided in the program.

Griffin leads a county where Re-

publicans outnumber Democrats, but she was instrumental in sending a Democrat to the State Legislature when she worked to get John Underwood elected.

Inez Marrs of Capitan works in the Democratic Party as well as in many other community activities. She is a precinct chair and has served as secretary of the Lincoln County Democrats.

Lincoln McTeigue (1920-1989) was born and raised in Arabela and went to school in Roswell and Houston. His wife, Rose, was on hand to accept his hall of fame plaque.

Wendell Chino has been president of the Mescalero Apache Tribe most of the 39 years since he first became president in 1952.

Chino put his tribe on the road to recovery from the longstanding economic and unemployment problems, and today his tribe has succeeded to build a variety of business enterprises.

The district "can't afford the additional expense of year-round school the way we are funded (by the state) right now," Willard said.

Because space isn't needed at the high school, the district could end up with some schools being on a year-round schedule and some staying on a regular schedule.

Even if all schools were on a year-round schedule, "a family with two kids might end up with one going to one session and the other to another," said board member Ronnie Hemphill. "I don't think that would go over well."

Board member Rod Adamson said he wouldn't favor the system for his own children.

"It may be something we eventually have to do, but I don't think it's right for Ruidoso now with the economic problems it's been through," he said.

Board member Susan Luterman said she'd be interested in getting more information on an ex-

tended school year not as an alternative to a bond issue, but as a possible beneficial new approach to schooling.

"I went to a seminar on the extended school year where the children would get off only six weeks in the summer and would have three weeks off after each nine week session," she said. "I was impressed. I felt the students' levels of retention would be better. It's something I'd like to pursue and get feedback from teachers and taxpayers."

Some districts adopt a modified calendar to shorten summer vacation and to improve the instructional program, the staff noted in its position paper.

The short two or three week vacations scattered throughout the year are used for remediation for students experiencing difficulty, for enrichment, or to provide mini-courses.

"This version of year-round schooling does not save space, so no bond money is saved," the staff wrote. "The school is in use year-round, so the costs of operation also

increase greatly.

Morris said he likes the concept of year-round school when it translates to more student-teacher contact time, but not at this time.

"The Europeans do year-round school and they're far ahead of us," he said. "I think it's coming, but for now we have to look at what's best for the kids and the town."

Cost factors aside, Ruidoso High School Principal Mike Kakuska is an advocate of lengthening the school year for students.

He has emphasized in recent speeches at the state and federal level that more teacher-student contact time is needed.

Shorter and more frequent vacation periods would reduce the need for teachers to go over old material and refresh the memories of students at the beginning of each school year, he has contended.

A longer school year may not save money in operation or facilities, but he has noted it could produce students better prepared for colleges, trades and life's everyday challenges.

Take your pick among friendly dogs and cats

Don't let her intense look fool you, this brindle Catahoola mix is gentle and affectionate.

But she also loves the outdoors and enjoys a romp through the underbrush in pursuit of a special scent or leaping grasshopper.

She was brought to the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter about a month ago with her sister by their owner. She's about eight months old, extremely intelligent and walks well on a leash.

"Catahoolas were brought to America from Europe in the 1730s, but little is known about their origins," said shelter manager Randy Basch, who has been training dogs 16 years and has more than a decade of background working with humane societies.

"They used to call them leopard dogs," he said.

She will need some encouragement on housebreaking, Basch said.

"But it's an intelligent breed, a good working dog on farms and ranches. She'd also make an excellent alert dog, offering someone who lives alone good protection."

She's nearly full grown and probably won't weigh more than about 40 pounds, he said. He de-

scribed her medium size.

Just because it's Adopt-A-Dog Month, the shelter doesn't want to ignore the many cats housed there.

For this issue, Basch selected a tortoise-shell type female about eight months old "with a quick motor."

She's gentle and is good with other cats, he said. She has compelling green eyes and a medium-length coat.

"Cats make great companions for people who work, live alone or have to be gone a day or two at a time," Basch said. "They're loving, but independent. They litter-train with ease and can be totally indoor pets."

To ensure that a cat doesn't get lonely, adopt two at a time (male-female or two females) and spread the happiness around, he suggested. Neutering and spaying, which is required for all pets adopted from the shelter, tends to make them happy to stay at home and less likely to wander if they inadvertently get outside.

Beside a few tortoise shell types, the cattery next to the main shelter building contains gray cats, calico, tiger-striped, black and white and nearly all combinations between.

The shelter also is overflowing with litters of unwanted puppies.

"Their owners bring them here and say they're sure we can find them homes," Basch said. "I wish we could guarantee that, but it's not true."

"Then when we look at the owners and ask if they will get the mother dogs spayed so this won't occur again, they're noncommittal.

We'll probably see them again next year with the products of their lack of concern."

What the public needs to understand is that they are paying for the lack of responsible action by these pet owners, Basch said. They pay through damage done by dogs running loose, by the cost of an animal control officer and, if they are concerned about animals, through their donations to help adopt and care for impounded dogs and cats.

"All of this pain and death could be avoided for these little puppies and kittens if people would just neuter their males and spay their females," Basch said.

The humane society is readying an ordinance, modeled on one passed in San Mateo, California, that would require pet owners to spay and neuter their dogs and cats.

That California county has experienced a drastic reduction in the number of animals that must be killed each year. It approached the ordinance with a mandatory six-month ban on all breeding to get the program off to a good start.

But modifications can be applied in Lincoln County and its municipalities that still would result in lower production rates. Recognizing that breeders are a business, those modification could include total exemptions for licensed breeders or limits on the number of litters those breeders can produce each year.

"The only way we will ever get a handle on this problem is through mandatory neutering and spaying," said humane society president Hazel Haynsworth.

Among the dogs waiting for new homes at the crowded shelter are black border collies of varying sizes, Australian shepherd mixes, shepherd-collie mixes including previously featured Bert and Ernie, a red heeler, a white terrier mix called Happy, a greyhound called Misty that needs a big yard and someone with whom she can run, a sleek bird-dog named Doc, a hug-

gable golden retriever mix called Big Red and a tender heart in the body of a bundle of hair called Bernie.

Americans With Disabilities Act could force renovation of business buildings

Ruidoso News Business Editor Jim Kilough, and Cleatus Richards, planning administrator, are looking for further guidelines from the state and federal government on dealing with the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA).

Both agree that ADA will have a heavy impact on Ruidoso businesses when provisions go into effect, Jan. 22, 1992, for some businesses and Jan. 22, 1993, for others.

Title III of ADA "bans discrimination which denies persons with disabilities the full and equal enjoyment of the goods, services, facilities or privileges of private entities serving the public.

Entities such as hotels and motels, restaurants and bars, stores, service establishments such as banks, laundromats, offices of health care providers, accountants and attorneys, museums, schools, social service centers, as well as places of recreation and public gathering are covered.

There is some provision in the law for exemptions from requirements where costs would be prohibitive (in meeting specifications for restroom renovation, for instance.)

Tax credits possibly would be given to firms complying with regulations.

Richards said tax credits are not sufficient to meet the high costs of building renovation in most cases. He said many businesses are marginal in Ruidoso, that cost of renovation could wipe them out.

ADA implementation dates are as follows:

Jan. 26, 1992: Public accommodations (all business and service providers, for businesses with 25 or fewer employees and revenues of \$1 million or less).



If this were the entrance to a business serving the public after Jan. 22, 1992, it would be a barrier to a handicapped person. And the business owner might have trouble obtaining renewal of a business license. A portion of the Americans With Disabilities Act goes into effect in January.

Alterations to public accommodations and commercial facilities.

Public transportation provided by private entities.

January 26, 1993: Public accommodations (all business and service providers, for businesses with 10 or fewer employees and revenues of \$500,000 or less).

New building construction.

Businesses with 25 or fewer employees and \$1 million or less in gross receipts may not be sued for violations occurring prior to July 26, 1992, and those with 10 or fewer employees and \$500,000 or less in gross receipts may not be sued for violations prior to January 26, 1993.

A MainStreet publication points out that as it is written ADA is vague in specifying how its requirements will be enforced at the local level.

In essence, it is up to the local building inspector to enforce the law.

"This makes us the bad guys," Richards says.

Businesses in Ruidoso must apply annually for business registration permits. An inspection is involved.

Richards says that because ADA if federal law, provisions must be enforced.

Otherwise, he indicated, legal action can result against the village.

Kilough says that requirements for restrooms require a "five-foot turn radius" for wheel chairs. And apparently each business must provide such facilities for each sex to be in compliance.

The building inspector is hoping for the construction industries in the state to stage seminars on how the law will be administered, how enforcement will result and to spell out penalties for non-compliance.

"Fortunately, the guidelines which were issued on July 26, 1991, offer special provisions for historic buildings, carefully balancing the need to maintain a historic building's design integrity and significant architectural characteristics with the need to make the building accessible to persons with disabilities ...

"And with a few exceptions, all existing buildings must be brought into compliance with the new guidelines when the building undergoes substantial renovation or when its use changes," the MainStreet publication says.

Religious organizations and entities controlled by religious organizations are exempt from Title III.

Liability for penalties or denial of a business license are places of lodging, establishments serving food or drink, places of entertainment, places of public gathering, sales or retail establishments, service establishments such as laundromat, dry cleaners, bank, etc.; bus terminal, museum, library or gallery, place of recreation such as a park or amusement park, education facilities such as a nursery, social service center establishment, such as senior citizens center, food bank, gymnasium, bowling alley, golf course, etc.

ADA regulations are extensive.



Businesses miss filing deadline

Dick Minzner, secretary of the Department of Taxation and Revenue, says it appears likely that the New Mexico businesses using nontaxable transaction certificate failed to meet the October 21 deadline. Therefore, he says, they may not receive them by January 1, the date on which they were required.

"Business and non-profits which have not received their nontaxable transaction certificates by January 1 will end up paying tax on transactions which they would be entitled to execute tax free," said Minzner. "Anyone who applied for certificates by October 21 should receive them by January 1. We will do the best we can with applications received after that deadline, but we are making no promises," Minzner said.

Only about 10,000 of 50,000 applications mailed out were returned by October 21.

Facelift barely keeps pace with growing school

WMES still crowded

A sweeping facelift over the summer left White Mountain Elementary looking years younger and Principal Frank Cannella very proud.

But despite the addition of four classrooms and extensive remodeling, crowding still remains a problem at the elementary level.

Voters will be asked Nov. 12 to approve a new \$5.5-million bond issue, the sixth bond issue in 10 years. Instead of going for a massive wallop at one time, the Ruidoso District School Board has opted for an incremental approach that hasn't dumped a dramatic tax increase onto property owners.

The new bond issue would benefit White Mountain in three ways.

Six new classrooms, restrooms and support facilities would be added to the White Mountain site joining together the intermediate and elementary facilities under one roof.

A new \$3-million school would be constructed to house first graders now at Nob Hill Elementary and second graders, now at White Mountain Elementary. The sixth grade would be moved from Ruidoso Middle School to the intermediate facility.

Another \$500,000 in equipment and \$270,000 in minor remodeling projects district-wide are included on the list of improvements.

One of the projects Cannella would like to see at his school is the renovation of the custodial area, now accessible only by a twisting route through a furnace room. He also needs more storage space.

PREVIOUS CONSTRUCTION

The White Mountain elementary school was opened in December 1966 with three, two-classroom pods and a cafeteria.

In 1977, when the Intermediate school was built next door, a second phase consisting of a library and two classrooms was added to the elementary school.

"Talking to people who were here at that time, the one thing they always wanted was to tie the three pods together and that's what we finally were able to do with \$1.4-million from this last (1989) bond issue construction."

Such a good job was done over the summer that Cannella said he challenges parents to delineate the different phases (the original 1966, the 1977 addition and the 1991 addition) on the inside of the building.

Pointing to a seam separating two wall boards, Cannella said proudly, "This is the only evidence that one section was built in 1966 and the other in 1991. The different phases have been linked together so well."

Some of the hallways in the older section are a bit narrower, but few other indications are obvious.

"The outside is a different story," he acknowledge, pointing out the 1966 brick phase where it abuts the 1991 stucco exterior:

"We plan to stucco and insulate those brick sections next year," he said. "It will increase the heat retention efficiency and look the same."

Cannella is the fifth principal to hold the reigns at the elementary school. He took over in 1987.

"We literally worked on this plan for three years," he said. "At one point, we actually toyed with the idea of starting over," but the estimated \$3-million pricetag cooled the administration's ardor for that idea.

"The kids used to have to go outside to get to the administration office, the library, special programs and the computer labs," Cannella said. "Other kids were in portables."

"Now we're all under one roof. We're still doubled up in some places, but I love (the renovated facility) and the teachers love it."

"A classroom built in 1966 doesn't look any different from a classroom built in 1991. They're both equipped the same, the cabinets are the same and there are new vertical 'to floor' windows," he said.

The four new classrooms are slightly larger at 900 square feet. The older classrooms contain about 800 square feet.

"The rooms in the middle section were half the size. We gutted the middle, enlarged it and reallocated space. The teacher workroom is a model of what workrooms should be. Everything used to be in six different places," Cannella said.

Restrooms were remodeled to accommodate handicapped students or staff, partly through a \$50,000 grant.

"The cafeteria was doubled in size and that makes a tremendous difference, not having shifts for lunch, there's more time and it's less crowded," Cannella said. To expand, the cafeteria absorbed the previous administration area and teachers' lounge.

The new administration area is more accessible to the public and very comfortable, he said, indicating the airy atmosphere and banks of windows.

Sod has been planted outside, the parking lot finally is paved. "The parking lot is wonderful," he said. "It's bigger and deeper for the buses and there is a circle for parents to pick up the kids without interfering with buses. Before we had parents and buses mixing and it was a potential dangerous situation."

"Clicking more pluses off his mental list, Cannella said sprinklers are stationed throughout the school for fire safety, old pipes were dug up and replaced, new kitchen equipment purchased and new lighting fixtures added, along with the occasional skylight.

One of the less obvious bits of construction, but a very important one for the longevity of the school was the addition of underpinnings to stabilize the older buildings, Cannella said.

Special filtering and lighting systems to eliminate static and glare were added in the computer

lab. "All computers are tied to a main computer," Cannella said. "The kids can program them to levels directly tailored to individual needs."

Down in the library, parents are being trained to work with a computer encyclopedia. They pull students out of regular classes to help them with special projects or work assignments.

Students, teachers and other staff had to put up with a lot of mud and other inconveniences during construction, Cannella said.

"I hope if the next bond issue passes, we wouldn't have to move into a new school until it is finished," he said.

"But this school is going to serve the needs of the community for another 25 years. For six months of

inconvenience. It was well worth it."

FUTURE NEEDS

If the proposed bond issue passes and a six-classroom addition is built between the two schools, rooms should be available to accommodate "bulges" in enrollment at different grade levels, Cannella said. Last year, 400 students attended the elementary school. About 350 are enrolled now.

"Those rooms also are intended to be used for ancillary classes such as speech and occupational therapy.


"Right now, we're using the

hallways and the bookroom," he said. The Chapter One reading class also is overcrowded.

Two teachers currently sharing one classroom, "are working it out through creative scheduling because they are second and third grade level, special needs kids," he said. The bond issue would eliminate that doubling up.

The proposed addition would tie the two schools together in back near the gymnasium.

"With that, the intermediate students will be able to reach the cafeteria through an enclosed hallway in inclement weather," Cannella said. "That might cut down on colds and illness."
