Speakers update Ruidoso community

Indulging his quick wit, interspersed with the state's tourist marketing plan, Secretary J. Michael Cerletti of the Department of Tourism, captured the business crowd Friday.

Cerletti, the first Secretary of Tourism ever appointed in New Mexico, told the audience at the Second Annual Ruidoso Community Update that he entered the department with six strategic plans and 10-12 goals to achieve those goals.

Cerletti said one of the goals is to spread tourism around the state.

"My view has been, that an awful lot of tourism has been concentrated, possibly up in the north Santa Fe-Taos-Albuquerque area. It seems to me we need to spread it

around a little bit," Cerletti said.

He said the national advertising campaign this year will feature five areas of the state. Ads of Acoma, old Mesilla and next spring, the Ruidoso Downs Racetrack and Ruidoso area will be featured.

Cerletti said there is an image problem in New Mexico — the image that the state is a vast desert and little else.

But the truth is that New Mexico offers six of the seven "life zones," he said.

"Because of that we have the mountains, streams, skiing, lakes, small areas of desert, everything that you could possibly want in this state except nobody knows it," he said.

Several programs have been implemented dealing with interstate travel to broaden the knowledge of New Mexicans about their own state, he said.

"While our primary responsibility is to bring people in from the outside, a secondary responsibility is to get people within the state to travel within the state, because those too, are discretionary dollars, tourist dollars," Cerletti said.

He cited a recent contest-oriented program, placed on the radio, that covered 75 different areas of New Mexico.



Downs, Mescalero voters go to the polls

Voters will go to the polls in Ruidoso Downs and in Mescalero Tuesday, Nov. 12.

Downs voters, in an election prompted by a petition, will vote "yes" or "no" on decreasing the size of the board from seven members to four members.

Mescalero voters will be electing a president and three tribal council members.

Wendell Chino, Mescalero's president for the past 36 years, will be challenged by Harlyn Geronimo. Chino and Geronimo were the top vote-getters in the primary where a third candidate, Donalyn Torres, also ran.

Challengers Samuel Cooper Sr., Michael S. Belin and Leland Lester Sr. are running for the Mescalero Tribal Council in hopes of replacing the incumbents who are running on a slate with Chino.

Ruidoso Downs

Ruidoso Downs residents who are registered voters will ballot Tuesday on whether to reduce the size of the village board of trustees or keep the count at seven, plus a mayor.

The proposal is to reduce the size to four trustees, plus the mayor.

Ruidoso Downs village clerk Maurice Gudgel will swear in presiding judge Erma Capps early

Tuesday, Nov. 5, the day of the election. She, in turn, will install members of the Precinct Board.

Residents will cast their ballots from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. at the new Older American Center in Ruidoso Downs.

Gudgel said she and Magistrate Judge Gerald Dean of Carrizozo will canvass the votes immediately after the polls close, Tuesday night.

The election came about when enough signature were obtained on a petition calling for such an election to mandate that an election be conducted. Cost is expected to run about \$3,000.

Mescalero

Harlyn Via Geronimo, a candidate for president of the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe, will file today for an injunction and restraining order to have the right to witness and observe the transportation, storage and tabulation of the ballots in Tuesday's tribal election.

Geronimo, who has spoken out against Chino's 36-year administration, notified President Wendell Chino and members of the election board that he intends to have an observer oversee the counting of ballots this year.

In a letter dated Oct. 30, Geronimo, notified President Wendell Chino, his opponent in the election, that he will appoint a

member of the clergy to observe the counting.

"You have appointed your election board members and I am appointing an observer," said Geronimo.

"Whatever you do or not do, will either re-establish confidence in the democratic process or corrode it even further," wrote Geronimo. "Controversy is the heart of democracy, but where the counting of the ballots is suspect, the tribe will suffer irreparable damage and disunity. It is your choice," he continued.

Geronimo, in a separate letter, told the Election Board of his plans.

"The entire nation is watching and we must prove that our democratic process works," he said.

In an interview over the weekend, Geronimo said the President and Tribal Council have grown unresponsive to the real human needs and aspirations of his people.

Geronimo accused them of using repressive measures and intimidation to smother new ideas and new leadership that could cope more effectively with rapidly changing social, political, economic and environmental realities in today's world.

Geronimo said the only way to remove the old order is by getting elected, and the only way to get elected is by having fair elections.

"No person, other than the

Tribal Council, has ever seen the actual ballots or the vote-by-vote tally," said Geronimo.

"This may change things," said Geronimo, describing his plan to file for an injunction and restraining order.

He also said the Election Board denied his request for observers, and believes that denial violated his rights under the Indian Civil Rights Act.

Tribal Council

Mescalero President Wendell Chino no longer speaks for most of the people, according to Samuel Cooper Sr., candidate for Tribal Council of Mescalero.

Cooper is calling for the tribe to support Harlan Geronimo for Tribal president in Tuesday's elections.

Geronimo is more in touch with the people of Mescalero, said Cooper. "President Chino has been in power for so long that he no longer speaks for most of the people. A change is now in order."

Cooper said the goal of Mescalero should be to select a president who will be impartial in management of the reservation in matters such as selection and placement of employees, and who will support the legal system instead of considering himself to be the law.

Cooper said Michael S. Belin, Leland Lester Sr., and himself are

attempting to become new members of the Tribal Council. He said if the people would support them, it would mark the beginning of the changes needed in Mescalero.

Cooper also was critical of Chino concerning the study for storing high level nuclear waste on the reservation.

"It is important for the people of areas near the reservation to know that the people of Mescalero do not support this plan," said Cooper.

"This type of program would undo much of what we of the reservation have tried to build up over many years, preserving our lands uncontaminated by the activities of industry. This plan does not reflect the feelings of the Mescalero people."

Cooper said the people of Mescalero and other concerned citizens should express their opposition to this nuclear waste plan by writing the Mescalero Apache Tribe, PO Box 176, Mescalero, New Mexico 88340 to the attention of Wendell Chino, President.

President Chino

Mescalero President Wendell Chino, the only president the tribe has ever had, has led his tribe through multi-million dollar enterprise developments including the Inn of the Mountain Gods and Ski Apache.

Flu shots given free

The Lincoln County Health Department will offer free immunizations against influenza starting November 12.

The staff will be at the Carrizozo Senior Citizens Center from 8:30 a.m. to 11 a.m. Tuesday, Nov. 12.

In San Patricio, they will be giving shots from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 13 at the senior citizens center.

Friday, Nov. 15 will be split between Corona and Capitan. From 9 a.m. to 11 a.m., shots will be offered at the Corona school and from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. at the Capitan Senior Citizens Center.

Morning and afternoon sessions are planned in Ruidoso.

From 9 a.m. to noon and 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. Monday, Nov. 18, health officials will be at the Ruidoso Senior Citizens Center.

Inoculations also are available through private physicians.

The health department will be closed Nov. 11 for Veteran's Day and will not be giving other types of immunizations Nov. 18, because of the flu shot schedule.

Registered voters in the Ruidoso Municipal School District will be asked on Nov. 12 to approved a \$5.5-million bond issue to construct a new elementary school, add six classrooms to the White Mountain Intermediate-Elementary site, provide equipment and repairs at several schools, to construct a new maintenance yard and to enlarge the administration area.

Members of the Blue Ribbon Committee, chaired by Pinky Jones, are speaking before various clubs and civic organizations to explain the bond election.

Balloting will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 12, at Ruidoso Middle School.

Chamber deals with dues, special events and more

Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce board members dealt with dues, Oktoberfest, transportation, Christmas Jubilee and other issues at a regular meeting, Wednesday evening.

Directors also agreed that the annual meeting of the Chamber will be in late November. No date has been set.

Craig Rawlings gave directors a report on the recent Oktoberfest staged at The Barn. Sponsor this year was the Ruidoso Oktoberfest Corporation.

Some 1,572 people attended the two days of the event.

The primary draw was from Ruidoso, Roswell, El Paso, Texas, and Alamogordo.

Some 730 New Mexicans attended (excluding Ruidoso), 618 Texans, 249 from the Ruidoso area and 78 from other states, the report shows.

Rawlings said 218 of the spectators visited Ruidoso for the first time.

Gross receipts totaled \$16,000. Some \$4,000 was earmarked as seed money for next year's event. Net income was \$2,000 which was added to \$2,000 in seed money that the corporation provided.

The Chamber board will decide at its next meeting whether to "farm out" the project again. It was granted to the non-profit Ruidoso Oktoberfest Corporation for the first time this year.

A committee will study the Chamber's dues structure and will make recommendations.

Some board members favor a concentrated campaign for new members rather than a dues increase. The President's Club which recruits new members is opposed to an increase, directors were told.

Judy Wicker, chairperson, reported on the success of Aspenfest Weekend and said some changes in format may be recommended for next year.

Dick Weber said equipment has been lined up for a possible airline to feed visitors from nearby airports into Ruidoso. He said the transportation committee will be going to the state to seek bonding authority. He indicated the airline as proposed would serve New Mexico only.

Dean Haynes said the Christmas Jubilee is on track. Advertising has been sent to Las Cruces, Lovington, Hobbs and other communities. An 80,000 circulation Spanish newspaper which circulates from Silver City into Chihuahua, Mexico, also is being utilized.



Senate OKs \$100,000 for Mescalero law enforcement

The Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe received \$100,000 in native American impacts money included in the 1992 Interior Appropriations Bill.

Senator Pete V. Domenici, a member of the Senate Interior and Related Agencies Appropriations Subcommittee, said the bill is headed to conference committee and then on to the White House for the President's signature.

"I am confident that the President will sign this bill into law," Domenici said in a news release.

The Mescalero grant is to augment the Indian Law Enforcement programs.

The bill includes \$1.2 million for the operation of the Gallup Alcohol Crisis Center, as well as monies for the UNM Indian Summer Law Program and other specific allocations.

Snowfalls enhance snow making at state's ski areas

It's not quite time to ski yet, but New Mexico's ski areas have been blessed by early season storms which have produced some decent base cover to allow snow making to begin in earnest.

According to Ski New Mexico, Ski Apache received 14 inches from the storm. Snow making began Wednesday, with five and six foot piles of snow built up by Thursday morning.

Elsewhere in the state, Santa Fe got 17 inches of natural snow last week, with Angel Fire and Pajarito recording 12 inches each. Taos had nine to 11 inches on the ground by Thursday with more on the way.

Governor King honors R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard for Excellence in Arts

R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard are among the five recipients of the 1991 Governor's Awards for Excellence and Achievement in the Arts.

The awards are presented each year to New Mexicans who have made significant contributions to the advancement and preservation of the arts in New Mexico.

Governor Bruce King will recognize the Hubbards for Preservation and Support of the Arts during a presentation and reception at 7 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 14, at La Fonda on the Plaza in Santa Fe.

Capitan music director Ricardo Lucero "Dick" Valenzuela, who lives in Ruidoso, will be among those honored. Valenzuela will be honored in the category of music education.

Among this year's winner are John Farrer of Roswell for Music, Alex Seowtewa of Zuni for Painting and the First National Bank of Belen for Corporate Support of the Arts.

R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard have earned worldwide recognition for their outstanding contributions to the arts.

The Hubbard Museum, located in the Turf Club at Ruidoso Downs, was established in 1989 to further interest in the genre of American representational art and to sponsor the Hubbard Art Award for Excellence on an annual basis.

The \$250,000 cash award is the largest ever given for art in the world and was established in the tradition of the Nobel and Pulitzer.

Their generosity exceeds supporting only the arts. They have established the R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard Foundation to support America's youth and their quest for higher education.

Both the Hubbards began their careers in the field of education, which has carried over to their ongoing commitment to excellence in all areas.

"Art is a way of understanding ourselves and coming to terms with ourselves, both as individuals and as a society," says Joan Dale Hubbard.

The Hubbard Museum is in the midst of developing the Museum of the Horse at Ruidoso Downs, and a small part of that major collection was featured recently at the Museum of Natural History in Albuquerque.

The Hubbards, whose home is in Fort Worth, Texas, are co-owners of Ruidoso Downs Race Track; and

Hubbard recently acquired control of Hollywood Park Race Track in California.

Among their foundation's endowments is the Hubbard Education Building at the Space Center in Alamogordo, and sizable annual scholarships for graduates of Ruidoso High School.

Valenzuela, a native of Mesilla, is well-known and respected in music circles around the state.

After teaching in the Deming school system for 17 years, he joined Capitan High School as director of bands in 1984.

According to a news release provided by the Office of the Governor, Valenzuela turned what was considered to be a less than mediocre

band program into one that is highly respected in New Mexico today.

His commitment to the arts is evident in the ongoing dedication he exemplifies to his students.

Valenzuela is a woodwinds specialist in clarinet, flute, saxophone, oboe, bassoon, and has performed on string bass. He initiated what became known as the Pops Dessert Concert, which utilizes area musicians performing with his concert band to raise funds for local causes.

Valenzuela attended North Texas State University and graduated from New Mexico State University in 1966, with a bachelor's degree in music education.

Farrer is a 19-year veteran of

the Roswell Symphony Orchestra, and is the music director.

Seowtewa is best known for his works as a muralist, and continues to work at the historic Old Zuni Mission Church under a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts.

First National Bank of Belen, under the direction of bank president and chief executive officer James Foley, has led its community in supporting the arts.

The awards were established by the New Mexico Arts Commission, the advisory board of the New Mexico Arts Division in the Office of Cultural Affairs in 1974, during governor King's first term as governor.

He said it was very successful, but was criticized because one station had been critical of certain members of the State Legislature.

"But if I stopped using any portion of the media that did not either criticize the legislature, governor or me, we would have to resort to direct mail," he said.

He said eight percent of his department's budget is devoted to in-state advertising and tourism awareness program.

The awareness program talks about tourism as an industry. Many people don't realize that tourism is the number one industry in 39 of the 50 states, he said.

New Mexico's \$1.6 million advertising budget is very low compared to Texas, which has an \$8-million dollar budget or Arizona with a \$4.5 million budget, he said.

"We're happy to have \$1.6 million, but you can see the effort we

have to do to make New Mexican's aware that tourism is everybody's business," he said.

Cerletti also noted the importance of the Mexico market, as well as the international market.

His entire strategy plan with outlined goals is available on request.

Crowded shelter is life-and-death problem for animals

Help! The Lincoln County Humane Society shelter is bursting at the seams with new litters of pups and adults dogs that have been dumped as their owners left town for warmer climates.

Sometimes, the uncaring former owners turn them out or bring them to the shelter because they just don't want to face going outside to feed a dog during the winter (imagine how the dog likes being outside all the time?).

The young pups are the victims of former owners who didn't care enough about their animals or the town to neuter or spay their males and females to prevent litters they didn't want in the first place.

And next year, they'll probably be back with another litter for the society to foster or, if the number of available homes can't keep pace, to euthanize.

Right now, shelter manager Randy Basch is trying to give four new litters brought to the society a chance at life. They're healthy and affectionate puppies (and a kitten litter too). But the odds are against them as adoptions slow to a trickle in the winter.

Society officers Hazel Haynsworth and Earline Phillips have prepared copies of a San Mateo, California, ordinance that requires the neutering and spaying of dogs and cats as a means of gaining control over the population explosion of those animals and to reduce the needless suffering and deaths.

The ordinances will be carried to the offices of the Lincoln County Commission, the Ruidoso Village Council and the Ruidoso Downs Board of Trustees this week for their review.

"We understand that some tailoring or modifications may be necessary to fit our community," Phillips said. "But they have seen drastic reductions in the number of dogs that have to be put down in San Mateo and we'd like our county to be a leader in this humane movement in New Mexico."

The ordinance contains considerations for dog breeders to continue their businesses. But it would specify fines for violation that would be stiff enough to make neutering and spaying an economic option for animal owners.

Enforcement can be handled through several different approaches to keep the cost down. But the collected fines could offset any additional costs.

Meanwhile, back at the shelter, plenty of good-looking dogs and cats are waiting for new homes.

October was Adopt-A-Dog Month and *The Ruidoso News* ran a pet feature each edition.

But the adoption rate was low for these fine animals. Their photographs are shown. No matter what your preferences in temperament or coloring, there's probably an animal at the shelter to satisfy them.

Bernie is a Bernese mountain dog mix with a tan muzzle and eyebrows and lots of hair. He's shy at first, but warms up quickly.

One of the three golden retriever-Labrador pups pictured waiting at the shelter fence has not been adopted.

The tortoise-shell cat with the haunting green eyes waits in her cage.

Doc, the picture perfect bird-dog with spectacular markings, an inquisitive nose and a great personality, also is looking for a new

owner. (He'd look perfect lying on the fireplace hearth).

Squirt, a pint size black spaniel with a gallon-full of love, is housebroken, bright and a good lap size dog.

Brindle, the intense-looking Catahoola female, is raring to go. She's alert and would make an excellent watchdog. With a little bit of encouragement, she could be housebroken, because she catches on quickly to new experiences.

Big Red, about the best-looking

golden retriever mix to come to the shelter, walks well on a leash, is bright and affectionate.

Buster Brown is a Brittany Spaniel, who apparently is a little picky about his new owners. He gets along well with the volunteers who walk him several times a week, obeying their commands and never showing aggression. But on occasion, he's not as gracious to newcomers.

But if you're looking for this breed, a little time and patience

would pay off. Stop by to walk him and feed him a few milk bones and he'll be yours for life.

The shelter also is temporary home to two tremendously affectionate black border collies (one male, one female), a white terrier named Happy who's looking for a high-energy home, a brown and black coon dog, an exotic maroon Hungarian Vizsla, a greyhound named Misty and a blue heeler mix female who melts at a kind touch.

Among the puppies available are blue-heeler mixes, black Labradors, golden retriever mixes, a shepherd mix, a four-month-old husky mix and a small white and tan spaniel mix, about five months old.







State will track down delinquent taxpayers

The New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department has begun aggressively pursuing taxpayers who are delinquent in paying either their corporate or personal income taxes, Dick Minzner, department secretary, announces.

This effort is another phase of the Revenue Enhancement and Administration Program (REAP) which was approved by the 1991 Legislature for the expansion of compliance, collection and audit functions of the department.

The REAP program is expected to raise more than \$5 million for the state; the goal is \$10 million by June 30, 1992. Already the program has generated \$3.8 million of revenues in delinquent taxes, principally gross receipts tax.

"We hope the new corporate and personal income tax efforts will produce an additional \$4 million this year," said Minzner.

The new personal income tax effort is based on a Tape Match program which identifies delinquent personal income taxpayers by comparing New Mexico tax rolls and tax returns with information pro-

vided by the IRS or other agencies.

This information from the tape match program allows the department to identify several types of returns likely to contain unreported or under reported New Mexico income. Taxpayers will be contacted by letter which will request further information.

If the department receives no response, then an assessment will be issued based on the information provided by the IRS. To avoid reassessment, persons receiving a letter should respond even if they feel they do not owe any New Mexico income tax.

The corporate income tax effort also commences with billings to delinquent corporate income and franchise taxpayers. These billings include interest and penalty from the original due date of the liability to the date indicated on the billing. Before the REAP program, no additional billings were sent to delinquent taxpayers if the original assessment was not paid when due.

If taxpayers desire further information, they are encouraged to call (505) 827-0988 or (505) 827-0847.

Remember the earliest you can begin collecting Social Security is 62.



On the agenda, Ray Eidson is asking for commercial site development for a miniature golf course by his go cart area.

Law will protect landowners

Federal legislation to protect landowners who are subject to mineral exploration and development on their property is under consideration by the U.S. Congress.

Introduced by U.S. Sen. Jeff Bingaman (D-NM), the bill last week passed the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee and was on its way to the full Senate.

The bill would amend the 73-year-old Stock Raising Homestead Act that encouraged the purchase of property for livestock grazing with the understanding that the federal government retained the mineral rights.

New Mexico has the second largest amount of land falling under that 1916 provision, with an estimated 15-million acres. According to a news release from Bingaman, from 6,500-7,000 mining claims are located on these lands.

While the policy objectives of the act were laudable - encouraging the livestock industry while retaining federal title to important minerals, Bingaman said, "Unfortunately, conflicts arise when the same land is used for both grazing and mineral exploration."

Some of those conflicts, especially those arising over the development and production activities associated with mineral exploration, are not covered adequately by existing law, he said.

Bingaman's bill would amend the Act to provide for additional procedures for gaining access to, and undertaking mining activities on lands covered by the Act. Among the proposed provisions are:

-That any person seeking to enter these lands to prospect or locate a mining claim must give notice to the land's owner and the Department of Interior prior to entry.

-That after receiving permission, the miner has a 60-day exclusive right to prospect or locate a claim.

-That any undertaking to conduct mineral exploration, development or production must first be approved by the landowner, or, absent of such consent, the miner must submit a plan of operation to the Secretary of the Interior

Hobbs beat Roswell 14-6 leaving the 4-A in that area a tough bet except for Clovis.


Oñate clinched a state berth with their win over Silver, 33-15.

State hunting regions differ

The annual big game hunting seasons are about to begin, and this year there are six different stratifications.

According to a news release, in southeast New Mexico, the hunting seasons will differ between regions as follows: Region H, November 2-3, (D-one), November 6-10, (D-two), and November 13-19, (D-three); Region K and N hunts, November 5-7, (D-six), November 9-11 (D-seven), and November 13-17, (D-eight).

Hunting opportunities in this state are among the best in the nation in terms of variety and amount of public lands open to the sport.

While Federal lands are open to the public throughout the year, hunting is permitted only at times designated by the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish (NMDG&F).

"The privilege of hunting carries a number of responsibilities," said Roswell Associate District Manager Tony Ferguson. "For the hunter, first and foremost should be respect for private property, knowledge of the rules and sensitivity to the ethics of hunting," he added. The following are guidelines for the good sportsman:

1. Know the law. Study a New Mexico hunting proclamation.
2. Know where you are. Take a map so you will know whether you are on private, state, or federal land.
3. Always obtain permission before hunting on private lands. Travel is permitted on official County roads crossing private lands. It is a good idea, and common courtesy, to notify ranchers when you are hunting within their grazing allotments.
4. Abide by all signs and posted areas. Questions involving access to public lands or unlawful enclosures of public lands should be directed to the BLM District Staff Ranger, Roswell District. Off-road travel is illegal except to retrieve big game.
5. Leave all gates as you find them, and park your vehicle where it will not block roads.
6. Don't camp closer than 300 yards from livestock and wildlife water resources.
7. Keep a clean camp, leave a clean camp. Utilize previously used

campsites if available. Practice fire safety rules.


8. Follow all hunting and gun safety regulations.

9. Do not disturb livestock.

It is a good practice to notify ranchers if anything looks wrong, such as damaged ranch equipment or livestock in need of assistance. Available again this year is a series of maps which help the public land

users determine their location.

These maps, which sell for \$4, show land status and access roads. Also available are topographic maps which sell for \$2.50. Maps may be obtained at the BLM offices in Roswell at 1717 W. 2nd and at the Federal Building at 5th and Richardson; and the BLM Carlsbad office, 101 E. Mermod.

Get fueled up for warm, cozy winter

FIREWOOD SEASON

It is the middle of autumn and even the least observant is aware that the mornings are cooler and the days shorter.

Some mornings a skiff of ice may even be found on windshields.

Many who have fireplaces, or wood stoves, are also painfully aware of a tendency toward procrastination.

In the warm days and cool nights of late October, mountain residents are faced with the decision of how to lay in the winter's supply of wood.

Whether the motivation is to create an atmosphere for a reflective glass of wine in front of a cozy fire on cold winter nights or to reduce the propane bills, a couple of decisions are involved on the way to creating that woodpile.

TYPE OF WOOD

First — what kind of wood?

In the Ruidoso area there are two basic kinds. First there are pine and piñon, softer woods that burn easily but rather fast. They also burn with more soot and creosote.

If these firewoods are used exclusively the creosote may accumulate in the chimney and create a fire hazard.

Juniper, oak and cedar make up the second group.

These are the more desirable woods, and more expensive.

Many people mix the two types, using pine to start the fire and then adding the harder varieties.

A CORD

The unit of measurement for wood is the cord — defined in Webster's New World Dictionary, as a measure of wood cut for fuel (128 cubic feet).

This is by convention considered to be a stack of wood measuring 4 feet deep, by 4 feet high, by 8 feet long. In practical terms it is a standard size pickup load, carefully stacked, and heaped as high as possible.

Knowing the different types of wood and having some idea of the quantity wanted, it's time to decide between the methods of procure-

ment.

There are basically two choices. Either purchase wood from a dealer or go the masochist route and locate a source, cut the felled trees into appropriate lengths, split the lengths into a burnable size, and then transport and stack the finished product.

PURCHASING

Firewood may be purchased with delivery and stacking included in the price, or purchased with the buyer taking responsibility for transportation and handling.

A survey of the advertisements under "Firewood for Sale" in the classified section of The News reveals that the prices for pine delivered and stacked, range from \$100 to \$110 a cord, with the harder varieties of wood going for \$120 to \$130.

Half cords are available at half these prices plus from \$5 to \$10.

Keep in mind however, that when merchants contract to deliver and stack the wood, they assume that they'll find a reasonably accessible place to stack it. Asking a vendor to deliver and stack a cord of wood on the back side of a lot, which is accessible only by wheelbarrow, could breed a touch of discontent.

Buyers loading, transporting and stacking the wood can expect savings of anywhere from \$5 to \$60 per cord, depending on the dealer.

This seems like a wide range of prices but some people put a greater value on their labor than others.

Now let's examine what price we put on our own labor.


CUTTING

To cut our own wood we must first find a place to cut the wood, either on private land or, with the proper permits, on public land.

Cutters should have a chain saw, an axe and splitting maul. Reliable transportation, like a pickup truck or car and trailer is obviously necessary.

This hardware is expensive, but may pay for itself in one season.

An alternative worth exploring is teaming up with someone. Each person contributes some of the tools.



Getting that winter's supply of wood can be a lot of work, but some folks like taking the trek to locate a supply of wood, cut it and take it home. If you purchase your wood, the woodcutter will stack it into neat cords.



This has the additional advantage of sharing the work. Tasks which are often cumbersome for one person are easier with two. When cutting standing green trees, at least six months drying time must be allowed before the wood will burn easily.

PRIVATE LANDS

Many land owners will allow individuals to come on their land and cut wood for a fee or for a portion of the wood cut.

Terms can be negotiated with each owner.

In addition, many unsold residential lots and undeveloped areas have dead wood that the owners would like to have cleared away. They will be reluctant to allow cutting of live trees, but the dead wood needs to be removed and it makes excellent kindling.

NATIONAL FOREST

The Forest Service allows cutting of wood in selected areas from April through November.

This year there are four areas that have been cleared for cutting firewood.

The Forest Service uses firewood cutting by private parties as part of their forest management program according to Steve Makowski, who is in charge of the program.

The Forest Service has two designations as applied to their cutting areas. One is called "dead and down," meaning that the wood to be harvested in this area is dead and

ready for burning immediately.

The other is called "Green Fuelwood" where standing green trees, that have been marked by the rangers, are to be harvested.

This year there is one free area in each designation, meaning cutters can harvest up to two cords per household with no charge.

There is also one "charge" area in each designation where for \$10 per cord in the "dead and down" area and \$14 in the "green fuelwood" area where an individual may cut up to 10 cords for each household.

A permit from the Forest Service is required for cutting in any of the designated areas. They are available at the Smokey Bear Headquarters of the Forest Service on Mechem drive.

Also available are maps to the different area and rules to follow.

MESCALARO RESERVATION

Wood may be cut on the reservation. Permits are available at the forestry office, located on the road that turns south, one mile east of Apache Summit.

Here also you will receive maps and rules. The office is open every day from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The cost of each permit, good for a cord of wood, is \$15.

Whether the choice is the easy route or the "sense of accomplishment" route, there is plenty of firewood available for the cold nights that are coming.

That proposed new construction should tie the two schools together under one roof and create a third elementary school, completing the complex.

The bond issue would allow the existing school at Nob Hill to serve pre-school and kindergarten only by moving the first grade to the new elementary school. Those first graders would be joined by second graders from White Mountain Elementary.

At the same time, the sixth grade would be shifted from Ruidoso Middle School to White Mountain Intermediate, giving the middle school some breathing space for its seventh and eighth grade students.

The Intermediate at White Mountain then would handle fifth and sixth graders and the existing Elementary would house second and third grades.

BACKGROUND

Principal of White Mountain Intermediate School since the 1987-88 school year, Weems said it originally was built in 1978 to serve sixth through eighth.

When Ruidoso High School on Warrior Drive was completed in 1983, the Intermediate was changed to fourth and fifth grades.

"We decided that instead of piece-mealing, adding rooms here and there, we'd build a new high school," Weems said.

That's the same approach the school board is taking on the new elementary school.

The Intermediate facility received no additions until last summer when three new classrooms were constructed as part of a 1989 bond issue. Four rooms had been scheduled, but the money wouldn't stretch.

"We had been working out of two portables," Weems said. "One was

moved to Nob Hill last year and we still use one for music here."

The computer lab was enlarged for 30 separate stations, but more computers are needed, he said.

"We're using the 'Windows on Science' computerized learning system," Weems said. "I think in the future, these systems will take the place of many textbooks."

"It's really fortunate to be in a district that has an interest in keeping up with technology. We have a good system now and we will continue to upgrade it."

The enrollment at the Intermediate school breaks down into 188 fourth graders, 147 fifth graders and 21 children in special programs. That translates to eight classrooms for fourth graders and six for fifth as well as rooms for support programs like Chapter One reading, the bilingual teacher, the gifted teacher, and resource rooms for exceptional children.

After the summer construction was finished, two classes that were in portables were moved to new rooms and Weems hired a new fourth grade teacher.

"So we took up all the new classrooms," he said.

PLANS

But the proposed new bond issue would add a corridor of six new classrooms, restrooms and storage between the Intermediate and elementary buildings, finally tying the two together.

No longer would the intermediate students have to brave the cold weather or rain to reach the cafeteria.

Four of the new classrooms would be used by the intermediate school and two would be assigned as needed by either school.

It's likely rooms would be used by support personnel that are shared by the two schools, such as physical, occupational and speech therapy and counseling.

"We hope to be able to add a teacher workroom and an area for testing and diagnostic work," Weems said.

"I would love to have an empty classroom for once. I'd like to have a separate music room."

For the new elementary school, "We're looking at the area down toward the tract by the road, closer to Hull Drive," he said. "It's flat and the school district owns the property. It would be in line with rest of two elementary schools and there is plenty of playground area for all three schools."

Weems said the construction would not interfere with areas already reserved for public uses such as soccer, football and softball.

"We have a building committee involved in all the planning, we sit down and discuss what we see as the needs," Weems said. "What we build, the teachers and kids have to live in."

CENTRAL OFFICE

While most voters seem to support any improvements to help the community's children, some have questioned why the district proposes to spend \$350,000 on renovating the central administrative office.

Finance officer Karen Snow outlined a few of the imperatives.

"The state requires that we store certain records in a fireproof vault," she said. "We are not currently meeting that requirement. We only have a few fireproof file cabinets and they're full."

"The information for the state agencies must be kept five years and up to seven years for the federal government."

Unlike the district's attitude toward avoiding piecemeal construction at its schools, the central office has been added to in small spurts to accommodate new demands.

But the spurts haven't kept pace with administrative growth. Snow said the office has no waiting space for the public and not enough rooms for the staff or for new specialties that need space, such as special services (now housed in a portable at Nob Hill).

The heating system is antiquated and not centralized.

"We can't save money on utility costs," Snow said. "There are holes here from additions being built onto existing structures."

Storage space is desperately needed, she added.

But perhaps the biggest need is for the district to create a central

receiving area.

"Every year, we have dialogue with the auditor about this," Snow said. "A central area can receive supplies and equipment, store them, check them against invoices and make sure they are in working order."

"You avoid the situation that now exists where things are not checked in properly. The principal doesn't always know what his teachers have ordered."

As each new school year begins, equipment and supplies often are stored in the school board room until a custodian from each school can pick up the items, Snow said.

The board room itself already is a tight fit and frequently, the audience overflows the space, she noted.

Parking also needs to be expanded for the public.

"The \$350,000 is just an estimate. The bids could come in lower," Snow said. "This would be a no frills situation and we would do it in the most economical way with no major equipment purchases. We just need the basics."

MAINTENANCE YARD

The district plans to use up to \$180,000 to build a new maintenance yard.

The existing yard has no restroom or office facilities for the maintenance director or his employees, who work year-around, Snow said.

"We have persons qualified to maintain our vehicles and they have to lie on the ground. It's such a savings, but they need a place to perform their work. They need a garage," she said.

The floors have collapsed in places and there is no central heating system, she said.


"It's a shambles and needs a complete renovation," Snow said. "Their records are just sitting there, there is no storage place."

"And we need some place to put our new activities bus."



Don Weems, principal of White Mountain Intermediate, takes a look-see at a fifth grade painting project.



closeness. The proposed bond issue would complete that picture by tying the two schools with a corridor at back.





Mayor & council are serving the citizenry

The Ruidoso Village Council, meeting Tuesday, made us proud to be Ruidoso citizens.

It's not always easy to take another or a different look at something, but the Council did a complete about face on the Humane Society's contract. After making demands and refusing to sign the Society's contract, it must have been hard to put that aside and put the welfare of the entire village first. That's what the council did, adopting a fair and equitable agreement without any unreasonable demands. The dogs and cats will continue to have safe and humane care, and the village as a whole will benefit.

Ruidoso's mayor and council also admitted that special events can no longer just run amuck, and took action by appointing a special events committee to work to avoid problems like the violence and lawlessness experienced here during the motorcycle rally.

By the same token, we were proud of our mayor for speaking out during the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority meeting. In discussions over taking garbage pickup and disposal services private, Mayor Alonso spoke eloquently that some services remain the responsibility of the municipal government and shouldn't be turned over to private enterprise.

The Council also acted prudently in agreeing to consider controls on shake shingle roofs. The Forest Service suggested several years ago that those roofs are a fire hazard, and limiting their use in the forest area would be a good move.

By continuing to maintain a remarkably efficient animal control system, by facing a problem and taking action, by looking to the future to avoid exorbitant prices and monopolies in trash services, and by acting to safeguard the village from a possible fire hazard, the mayor and council are serving the people well.



Grand Canyon is definitely worth saving

TO THE EDITOR:

This is in response to an article in The Ruidoso News concerning the County Commissioners' opposition to the proposed federal government's change in operations of the hydro-electric facility at Glen Canyon Dam.

While it is true that ours and other rural co-operatives receive power from this dam, it is untrue that a new dam flow policy would cause electric rates to "soar" as indicated in the article.

Here's what is at stake. The dam impounds water into the reservoir known as Lake Powell. Water through the dam fluctuates wildly in order to generate electricity during peak use, usually during the day.

There is nothing unusual about that. Many of this country's hydro-electric facilities operate in this manner. What is unusual is that in the 27 years since the dam was built, the fluctuating flows have wreaked havoc on one of the most astounding natural features on the planet, the Grand Canyon.

The Colorado River, which flows through

Glen Canyon Dam, dissects Grand Canyon National Park for about 300 miles. For the past 10 years or so researchers from various government agencies (not environmentalists) have been studying the effects off the dam on Grand Canyon National Park.

By almost anyone's estimate, destruction of the riverine corridor is well over half way complete. Continued operation of the dam for peak power use will finish the job in roughly 10-15 years.

Several important species of plants, animals, and fish unique to the Park are now extinct. Many more would follow.

Basically, the federal government proposes to replace fluctuating flows with steady flows. This would extend the life of the Grand Canyon river corridor to maybe 40 years instead of losing it in 15.

This means that our rural co-operative will have to purchase peak power from another, probably more expensive source, thus raising our electric rate. The question is how much.

There are a lot of numbers out there and

commissioners or Plains Electric might have you believe the amount will be great. I've looked at most of the important projections and estimate that the average household will be burdened with an additional \$20-\$60 per year in electricity cost.

I operate a business and would expect to pay about double that figure.

I will pay the extra money. The Grand Canyon is definitely worth saving. I am no better equipped to deal with inflation than you are, but it would be a national embarrassment to let such a unique and important place go down.

I don't wish to change any minds here. I would merely point out that our past indiscretions with natural resources are coming due and the cost is often high. In this instance the victim is the Grand Canyon.

There doesn't seem to be an equitable solution for the operation of Glen Canyon dam. Maybe you have one.

Funny how that happened, because back then I didn't have enough money to contribute to anything, hadn't ordered anything through the mail, and had no credit cards. Bet I can guess how they all got my name.

Can we stop this?

Someone is always trying to rewrite history

TO THE EDITOR:

A friend sent me a copy of your article "Billy Buffs are embarrassed by mixup about the Kid's birth," and found the article very amusing and Mr. Weisner's knowledge and research on William Henry McCarty, William Henry Antrim, W.H. Antrim, Henry McCarty, William Bonney, W.H. Bonney, Billy the Kid, The Kid, Kid, and other names, sadly lacking in proof on the subject of Billy the Kid.

It is apparent from the start that Mr. Weisner is unaware that Billy the Kid appears not once but twice in the census for the year 1880.

The first time on the 1880 census he is shown with the Ed Moulton family and his property, in Georgetown, Grant County, New Mexico, along with a man named John Wilson who had escaped with the Kid two weeks before from the Albuquerque, New Mexico, jail. The Kid gave his real name, lied about his age, and gave Illinois as his place of birth, which is wrong, for all historians and serious Kid researchers know that he was born in New York City.

The second time he appears in the 1880

census is two weeks after the census in Georgetown. He was at Fort Sumner and this time he said his name was William Bonney, again he lied about his age, and this time said that he was born in Missouri as were his parents. Mr. Antrim, the Kids stepfather was born in Indiana in 1842.

As for the Kid giving this information to the enumerator, anyone where he was staying at the time could have given this information. I'm sure that Mr. Weisner has not taken this into consideration.

Since there were 4-6 people living on the Ed Moulton property at Georgetown, and at Fort Sumner five or more people were living in the same house, how can Mr. Weisner be so absolutely positive as to just who gave the information?

There is no indication on the census or documents to tell us just who did give the information. One must also take into account that just two weeks before the first census for 1880 at Georgetown the Kid had escaped from the jail at Albuquerque, so he was a hunted criminal.

Given his escape from jail combined with the fact that all criminals lie to protect themselves, leaves you with no absolute or concrete evidence, only an opinion on what amounts to very flimsy facts.

You know, I was told years ago that "words are so easily spoken or written, but without actual proof, that is all they are, words."

I know several very serious historians and researchers and have done research on the Kid (who, I might add, has held a fascination for me since my early youth) myself and have found nothing connecting him to the Bonney family of New Mexico. I would like to also see how Mr. Weisner ties the Kid to the Salazar family.

It seems that ever so often items like this turn up, but never from an experienced historian who knows and has studied the subject for many years and really knows how to research.

But that's the way it goes — someone is always wanting and trying to change history.



10-18—Cynthia Campbell of Ruidoso reported a burglary at her home. Entry was gained through a window. A small plastic heart was reported missing.




