## Auditor praises council

Accountant Ronnie Hemphill, presenting his audit report, praised village leaders Wednesday for reducing expenditures.  
Hemphill said this is the first year that expenditures have been reduced since he began auditing the Village of Ruidoso.  
He presented his financial audit to the Village Council during a special meeting Wednesday morning.  
He commended the mayor and council for reducing expenditures.

"There are some problem areas," he said. "I need to point out that in the past three years the utility fund has decreased from \$3 million to \$400,000." He strongly suggested that this trend be reversed.

Councilor Ron Andrews suggested that one way to improve the fund was to have its portion of administration overhead paid by the general fund.

Mayor Victor Alonso, in reviewing the figures in the utility fund, said it is his opinion that the solid waste facilities should be sold, referring to the proposed formation of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority, wherein the authority will lease-purchase the village's equipment.

Other areas of concern are:  
-Expenditures in excess of approved budget. This is at a minimum, Hemphill said, but has to be noted and is certainly no problem now.

-Inability of present computer software to track customers' deposits in the utility account. Village manager Ron Wicker said he is addressing this problem and will have recommendations to the council later on improving the computer system in both hardware and software.

-Bad utility accounts being carried as accounts receivable. There is approximately \$80,000 in uncollectable accounts being carried in accounts receivable, according to Hemphill, and these should be written off.

Village clerk Tammie Maddox said the accounts had been turned over to a collection agency with negative results.

-Financial statement preparation. Hemphill said his job should be to audit the village's financial statement that is prepared by someone else. Instead he prepares and audits the statement. The only solution to this is for the village to hire a full-time accountant, and that would not be cost-effective. It is not a major problem, he said, but has to be noted.

The council passed a two-part

## Snow! Plenty of it!

A weekend storm moved into the Southern Rockies, forcing many weekend visitors to leave early in anticipation of treacherous roads on the way home.

The Ruidoso Police switchboard was inundated. The department received more than 700 telephone calls from people wanting information about road and weather conditions.

Twenty-one accidents were reported in the village, mostly minor collisions and vehicles off the road.

Ruidoso Police Chief Richard Swenor considered it a routine weekend, given the adverse weather conditions and the number of people in town.

State Police Officer Steve Standridge reported no serious ac-

cidents during the storm, only a few vehicles off the road.

State Police investigated a fatal accident on Friday near Hondo. The driver of a vehicle dodged to avoid hitting a deer and was killed, according to reports.

The village Street Department had snowplows and salt trucks clearing streets on Sunday.

Unrelated to the storm and Thanksgiving weekend, Ruidoso Police surprised a man in the act of burglary at Circle J Bar-B-Que, 1825 Sudderth. They were responding to a tip from a citizen.

Ski Apache reported a total of 5,500 skiers were on the slopes during the four day weekend. The mountain received eight inches of snow during the period and ski conditions are reported good.

"We have about 20 people on the payroll here. What Ruidoso needs is more year-round solid employers to give a better income base," Steve said.


He said the people at the office are proud to have a job with a good company that offers a career opportunity. They also have a good experience background to bring to the job too, he said.

## Megabucks and Hot Rods: Part 2

Imagine the children in your neighborhood playing a game called "My Baby has Cancer" complete with doctor appointments, doll surgery for the removal of arms and legs, doll death and finally doll funeral. Kids in McFarland, California, play that game since real-life cancer clusters have afflicted their community.

Fathom half of the pregnancies in your community ending in deformities, spontaneous abortions, and mole pregnancies - an extremely rare spontaneous abortion of a globular mass, genetically unidentifiable and unrelated to known living organisms. Women of the California-Intermountain Karok Tribe experienced these afflictions for several years after the Forest Service sprayed a nearby area.

Or, fancy being forced from your home into dismal housing projects where increased rates of suicide, alcoholism and family violence take a terrible toll. That's what happened to more than 1,000 Crees in Quebec when Hydro Quebec destroyed their homeland in James Bay area to expand a huge dam project, flooding an area larger than Germany. The project also caused mercury poisoning to fish.

Native Americans across the continent are

protesting proposals to dump nuclear and other toxic waste on their land.

"Indian people," said Robert T. Coulter of the Indian Law Resource Center in Helena, Montana, "are getting fed up... with having their lands used as dumping ground for the wastes that everyone else fears."

Last summer representatives of 40 Native American tribes convened in Bear Butte, South Dakota, to discuss waste disposal assaults on their tribal lands. An Oklahoma representative concluded, "As Indian people, we must gather together and fight the toxic threat just like Indians fought the cavalry. We have too much Indian blood in our land to give it over to the waste companies."

In recent tribal council primary elections, members of the Ogalala Tribe voted out supporters of the proposed Rosebud Oil and Gas landfill, replacing them with opponents of the dump.

Tribal police of the Shoshone-Bannock Nation in Idaho intercepted a truck laden with irradiated fuel rods from a decommissioned plant in Colorado and refused to allow the truck to cross their Fort Hall reservation. A U.S. District Judge issued an order allowing that one truck through, but blocking further shipments of the waste until the DOE obtains a state air quality

permit, a process that the Idaho governor says may take a year. Judge Edmund Lodge made clear in his statement that the DOE is not above the law and ordered that federal agencies must obey state environmental laws. He also ordered DOE to reopen its environmental assessment to allow the Shoshone-Bannock tribes an opportunity for input to determine whether a full Environmental Impact Statement must be done.

It's not just Native Americans who are getting exasperated.

"Don't dump toxic trash on America's poor" was the message sounded by First National People of Color Leadership Summit on the Environment in late October. Leaders from African-American, Native American, Hispanic and Asian-American communities condemned "environmental racism," which the Reverend Benjamin F. Chavis, United Church of Christ Racial Justice Commission director defined in part as "the deliberate targeting of people of color communities for toxic-waste facilities."

As a result of the summit, an indigenous and grassroots movement was born. It will lobby Congress to respond legislatively to "the genocidal character of environmental racism" and will ask the NRC to "ban permanently the

## Separate fires destroy two structures over the weekend

Firefighters, too, were busy over the weekend with two structures razed by two separate fires.

Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs firefighters responded Saturday to a blaze that destroyed a trailer with an add-on in the Hollywood Trailer Park behind Shaver Tire and Auto.

Units contained the blaze that was within a hundred feet of oil drums and old tires stored behind the auto shop, but the structure was completely destroyed.

Ruidoso Downs Fire Chief Humberto Maldonado said today that the unoccupied trailer is owned by Jim Wimberly. Maldonado said he turned the investigation over to the State Fire Marshal's office, with the suspected cause listed as vandalism.

A wood stove was listed as the cause of a Sunday fire that destroyed the home of Ola Rue of Ruidoso.

All Ruidoso units and firefighters were called twice, first at 4:30 p.m. and again at about 10 p.m., to 519 Wingfield Drive where the fire was extinguished and then rekindled.

Judith Word, spokesperson for the Ruidoso Fire Department, said no one was at home when the fire broke out.

Word said Ruidoso firemen were on Main Road, at a chimney fire in the home of Leon Eggleston, when the Wingfield call came in.

That fire was contained within the chimney, she said.

motion.

storage or disposal of nuclear waste in Native American lands and communities." In their Call to Action they stated in no uncertain terms:

"We refuse to accept the deliberate targeting of communities of color and the lands of indigenous peoples as dumping grounds for hazardous wastes and radioactive materials, and the production of pollutants."

The entire "Call to Action" is reprinted in the November issue of the Water Information Network Review (P.O. Box 4524, Albuquerque, NM 87106.)

A regional grassroots group is also working on issues related to environmental racism. The Native American Coordinating Committee of the New Mexico Alliance has prepared a petition to send to the President, half a dozen federal agencies, and all 50 states.

It reads in part: "Whereas, Native American livestock, which are our peoples' economic, social, and cultural sustenance, have drunk from contaminated arroyos, river ... and; whereas, native peoples' religious and traditional rights have and continue to be violated by the destruction and encroachment of our sacred sites, such as Mount Taylor, Dziłth/Na/Odilthe; and Sandia Mountains; ... and whereas, we indigenous people no longer want radioactive materials mined, produced, or deposited on our lands, brought into or through our communities, in any form ..."

Native Americans have already had a few successes.

A proposal to haul incinerator ash to Pine Ridge or the Rosebud reservation has been defeated after a long and arduous fight.

In Oklahoma, at the old Kerr-McGee plant — where Karen Silkwood worked — uranium contaminated soil and water have been showing up for a long time. Finally the NRC shut the plant down and barred from further activities the Environmental Manager and several health physics staff members. They were caught "supplying regulators with false information about levels of contamination ... " contamination running higher than four times the NRC Maximum Permissible Concentration, according to *Atoms and Waste* (2311 15th St. NW #101, Washington, D.C. 20009).

Native Americans have fought for years to bring this lethal place to justice.

The Menominee Nation in Wisconsin pledged noncooperation with the efforts of

Nuclear Waste Negotiator David Leroy to establish an MRS-type dry cask storage project at the Point Beach nuclear plant.

The State of Wisconsin through its Radioactive Waste Review Board took the same position at last spring's meeting.

But success comes slowly. "Despite theoretical plans to remove and store nuclear power waste at some federal deep throat earth bunker," says Susu Jeffrey, a Minnesota poet caught up in the Prairie Island Indian community nuclear waste struggle, "the waste is being stored on-site ... at Prairie Island (at) a nuclear sculpture garden of 90 giant beer can-like casks ..."

The theme of Eurocentrism in the context of the Columbus Quincentennial and the campaign to block storage of radioactive waste on the banks of the Mississippi River was highlighted at an intertribal elders' gathering last summer in Minnesota. The site of their concern is adjacent to the Prairie Island Indian Reservation. Noting that land occupied by native peoples and people of color was often chosen for hazardous waste dumps, waste storage and reactor sites, the conference affirmed self-determination.

And affirm self-determination they did. Within a fortnight they drafted a 16 page "Prairie Island Indian Community Nuclear Radiation Control Ordinance." It officially recognized that "government agencies and corporations have historically and continue to treat Indians lives and happiness as an expendable quantity, valued far lower than most U.S. citizens, sacrificed for public good and private profit, with no distinction made between the two." The ordinance covered, among other topics, "regulated zones" including land, air, surface water, or groundwater. It permitted exposure levels to radiation no higher than that already permitted by federal regulations for non-occupational exposure. And, it required environmental and health impact statements and radiation exposure analyses showing the impact on tribal members, wildlife, habitat degradation, historical and prehistorical sites, future land development and energy demand, and any other quality of life impacts.

The North American Water Office (NAWO) in Minnesota is also opposing the Prairie Island nuclear storage installation. In a fact sheet NAWO states that siting this facility at Prairie Island is a "continuation of the genocide European settlers have historically inflicted upon the Indigenous population," referring to the Mdewankton Sioux community which is "very actively

# County Commission will vote on land swap

As promised last month, the Lincoln County Commission is scheduled Tuesday to hand down its decision on the proposed acquisition of nearly 2,000 acres along the Rio Bonito by the Bureau of Land Management.

It's unclear whether the bureau would back off if the commission opposes the swap of isolated federal tracts in other areas of the state for the privately-owned acreage near the historic settlement of Lincoln.

The commission meeting will begin at 9 a.m. in the County Courthouse in Carrizozo.

Federal officials have said the land and its connected water rights would be a valuable asset to include under the umbrella of government protection, but they also have indicated many other swaps have been proposed across the state if support is not shown locally.

The primary objections to the swap are tied to concerns by ranchers and others that more private land will be removed from the county's tax base, that livestock grazing rights will be curtailed or eliminated and that the bureau will not commit enough personnel to manage the land properly.

Several months ago, the commission called for a moratorium on the proposed swap until the bureau answered some of its questions and provided some assurances.

Meanwhile, the commission appointed an agricultural and rural affairs committee to examine the proposal and to operate as a watchdog on other agriculturally-related issues.

Several members of that committee already had presented a suggested interim land use policy and associated ordinance based on a model from Catron County. They contend the documents would give the commission a vehicle for ensuring some county participation in federal acquisition and management of lands within its boundaries.

Action on those items is expected during the meeting. But at least one former commissioner warns that the county would be tying itself to longterm financial obligations if the policy and ordinance are passed.

Former commissioner Ken Nosker told *The Ruidoso News* that the interim land use policy would not supersede any existing federal authority and would obligate the commission to perform many planning functions, which it currently is not equipped to do.

Nosker said that, although there was an indication during earlier discussions that grant money would be available from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to help implement the policy, the service does not have a grant program for that use, according to the service's regional

director.

"Any citizens of Lincoln County ought to see that the potential problems and costs far outweigh any benefits," Nosker said. "The present commission may handle it well, but in four years someone may decide to go to court to force the county to go through expensive mapping and planning procedures."

"Besides it's an action in futility. They can't usurp state and federal power. You cannot make laws to force the state and federal governments to do anything. Their powers supersede. It (the cost potential) scares me to death."

Nosker said he has faith in the system now used by the State Engineer in allocating and guarding water rights.

"The people haven't been alerted as to how serious it would be (if the items were approved)," Nosker said. "I don't think the commissioners in favor have thought about the longterm effect on taxpayers."

The interim land use policy would impose obligations on the county while spelling out certain requirements for state and federal agencies. The ordinance reinforces those requirements, stating that all federal and state agencies must comply with the county's land use plan in the planning and management of state and federal lands located within the county.

Each agency would be required

to inform the commission of all pending actions affecting local communities and citizens and to coordinate with the commission in planning and implementing pending actions.

Any proposed acquisition, change of use or disposal of public lands would have to conform to the county's land plan in effect at the time.

The ordinance also states that federal and state agencies proposing action that would impact the county's land use policy must prepare in writing, and in a timely manner, a report for the commission on the purposes, objective and estimated impact of the action.

Also on the agenda, Agua Fria resident Gerald Ames and other representatives of the subdivision near Ruidoso Downs are scheduled to discuss a possible cooperative agreement for fire service.

The residents recently told Downs trustees that they are not interested in being annexed to that village because they would not receive improved services, but would have to pay higher taxes.

Other agenda items include an update on the Lincoln Transportation Development District and appointments to the Lincoln Historic Preservation Board, the County Planning and Zoning Commission, the Transportation Development District and the Road Review Committee.

years ago. I have dedicated my life to building this company, and it is with a great deal of satisfaction that I can look back and see that we have gained a degree of recognition such as this," Steve said.

But, as in everything else, a business has its cycles. He said there have been times when it would have been easy to sell out the business.

"When difficult times come, we have to remember this too shall pass. When good times come, we try to put reserves in place, knowing bad times are just around the corner," Steve said.

In running a company there is

no such thing as the status quo because the rules change daily, he said.

Having the farming economy in a recession since the late 1970s has affected the number of farmers the company deals with and the way those farmers do business. Steve said farmers have had to realize farming is a business, and good, solid business decisions have to be made.

The one most important decision they make is to manage risk which is where the insurance company comes into the overall picture. Steve has set some goals for crop insurance sales including \$100 million in premiums by the 1996 crop. He said they have also started a farm and ranch property insurance

division with a goal of \$1 million in premiums for 1992.

Steve and Joan enjoy their separate, but equally important, roles in the company. Steve, the president of the company, works on the day-to-day and long term goals, while Joan is the vice president, secretary-treasurer and personnel director of the company.

Joan said sometimes a whole day will go by when they don't see or converse with each other, but on other days they work on projects or problems all day.

"We have worked together for 20 years and I am still in awe of his ability as a thinker to come up with ideas to advance our business," she said.

He is the "idea" man for the company, while Joan said she works more with people and hears about any problems or situations that come up.

"I enjoy working in the business with him, but I think the reason the business and our marriage have been so successful is because he doesn't let me talk about business at home," she said.

Both said they are honored to be recognized by the State of New Mexico. Steve said the recognition of the company is good public relations throughout the entire operation because they gain more credibility.

"It is always nice to be recognized by your peers," he said.

Yucca Mountain — where the Big struggle is taking place over permanently dumping high-level nuclear waste from all the nation's nuclear power plants — is the center of a fierce legal battle being waged by Nevadans including the Western Shoshone Indian Tribe which claims the area.

The State of Nevada has been reviewing its policies that allow the dumping as it fights off the DOE. The Shoshones have been uncompromising in their fight against DOE plans to store reactor waste on land taken from the tribe by the federal government.

Shoshone Bill Rosse says "The main thing is to not accept it; there is no big money."

Ironically, because of Nevada's success thus far, New Mexico has now moved to center stage. Driven by the demands of the nuclear industry, DOE and the Office of the Nuclear Waste Negotiator have been pushing the interim storage concept of the MRS contacting states and tribal nations to host a "temporary" site until the waste can be buried in a permanent repository.

Storage sites next to nuclear reactors across the country are rapidly filling up with used fuel rod assemblies. Rather than adopt nation-wide programs of conservation and renewable energy options, which would cut out the need for any nuclear power plants, utility kingpins advocate expanding waste storage.

Except for the Mescalero Apache foray and a brief raid into the tribal lands of the Paiute and Shoshone, MRS efforts have met with Native American resistance.

The Fort McDermitt Indian Reservation that the Paiutes and Shoshones call home straddles the Nevada and Oregon state line.

The Nuclear Waste Negotiator's chief of staff, Chuck Lempeis, wanted "to put resources in their hands to hire their own experts." He told a Las Vegas, Nevada, reporter in September that there was a simple three-phase process that could lead to construction of the MRS on McDermitt Reservation land.

The first phase involves obtaining the health and safety grant; the second phase requires testing of soils on the reservation to determine if it is suitable for an MRS site; and the third phase is construction of the facility."

David Leroy, the negotiator himself, said that "in the event tribal lands in Oregon or Nevada were used for a temporary waste storage site, he would consult with governors of both states and

any adjacent states." Such a statement differs considerably from Leroy's promise to New Mexico officials that no MRS would be built in New Mexico unless the state also wanted it.

Governor Bruce King, both U.S. Senators, and numerous other officials have firmly opposed the siting of an MRS within the state of New Mexico.

Since Chino's announcement that the Mescaleros would study hosting an MRS facility, folks in these parts have been trying to figure Chino out.

"The Indians have always loved the land — how could they do this?" asked a widow who vacations near Mayhill just south of the reservation.

"It makes no sense at all — it's the biggest foolishness I've ever heard in my life and I'm 75 years old," said an independent oil man who resides in Artesia and fishes in the Penasco near the Reservation.

"We need to start a Boycott Inn of the Mountain Gods campaign right now," said a Texas woman who owns property in Ruidoso. "We need a pro-democracy movement on the Mescalero Reservation" and "Stop Chino's dictatorship" were comments voiced at a strategy meeting in early November by a coalition of Native Americans and others concerned about an MRS in New Mexico.

According to published reports, consultants from Pacific Nuclear Systems, Inc. (which is conducting the feasibility study) and Science Applications International Corporation have been "working with" Mescalero Apache Tribal President Wendell Chino for almost two years. Pacific Nuclear is the parent company of Nuclear Packaging Inc. and Nu-Pac service which will be building the Tru-pac containers that will carry nuclear waste to the WIPP site.

"There's something unprincipled about Pacific Nuclear being able to manipulate Chino," said one New Mexico resident. "You almost get the idea there is a linkage between WIPP and the MRS. And that Pacific Nuclear is out to make megabucks on both."

"Shady," "scheming" and "unethical" are words used by other reservation neighbors to describe the relationship between Chino and Pacific Nuclear. Whispers of under-the-table bribes and rumors of payola haunt the ranchers whose land is close to the reservation. "At one point they were ready to lynch Chino," said one rancher's wife of the rank-and-file working on reservation.

A Cludcroft teacher expressed her dismay about the whole situation in this way:

"Chino's always been a bully and gotten his way — he'll probably get it this time as well, especially since he has those fox-like consultants guarding the henhouse."

"It's the money," was the reason most people gave when asked why Chino would even consider the MRS project. An owner of alpine property just south of the reservation, expressed consternation: "I simply don't understand it. The Mescaleros have always cared so deeply about their land — it just cannot happen there!"

But it does seem to be happening here and people don't understand it well. While the nuclear waste proposal was an issue in the Mescalero elections recently, the Water Information Network Review explained the lack of resistance this way: "Allegations of ongoing election fraud and intimidation of tribal citizens have been raised by Mescalero Apache residents opposed to the nuclear waste storage proposal. Nuclear waste industry consultants quickly met with tribal members in attempts to allay fears. Tribal members were promised high paying jobs and educational benefits in return for accepting the radioactive waste."

Joseph Geronimo, a former member of the tribal council, clarified the intimidation charge in this manner: "People here are really fearful. Chino owns their jobs. If they go against his wishes they'll lose their economic livelihood ..."

As for the meetings with the consultants, "they totally avoided discussing any dangers of radiation. In fact, they trivialized the issue."

Several people — Native Americans and others — have voiced their concern that New Mexico, especially the southeastern quadrant, is part of a planned "zone of national sacrifice."

Others anticipate a sort of "up-dated Indian war." Life may never be the same here.

The lines, though still subtle, are beginning to be drawn.

A New Mexico couple who were not speeding or breaking the law in any manner were stopped near the outskirts of Roswell this year by a policeman who didn't like their "No nukes" bumper sticker.

"What are you doing here?" he asked them. "Just visiting some friends," they answered. "Where are you from?" he interrogated them. They answered him politely.

He told them "to get out of town and never come back." The couple had been to Roswell to participate in a WIPP protest. In their ancestry, they were part Native American.

# How about a spaniel for Christmas?

She's about months old and was brought to the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter a month ago by her owner.

Shelter manager Randy Basch said Fugi is a little shy around strangers and would be better in a home without children, although she gets along well with other dogs.

"She'd really give all her affection to someone who made her feel safe, in a settled home," Basch said. "She's well-suited for an elderly couple or someone living alone, who wants to give and receive unqualified affection."

Fugi would be a good alarm dog. She's about mid-size and weighs 15-20 pounds.

"She's anxious for affection, but anyone coming to see her should let Fugi come to them on her own," Basch said. "They need to gain her trust."

Once she accepts you, Fugi will pour out her heart.

She is sponsored for spaying, which is the major expense connected to adoption of animals from the shelter.

All adopted animals must be spayed or neutered to ensure they do not reproduce more unwanted litters that may be abandoned or have to be destroyed. Without population control of dogs and cats, the nation's shelters and pounds will be forced to continue to destroy animals at the rate of 18-million a year.

With cold weather settling in for the winter, the shelter needs

volunteers willing to spend time with the animals, especially on days when it is too chilly to take them on walks.

Bring a box full of treats and visit in their cages to keep them from becoming "shelter shy," a condition that makes it difficult for them to be adopted.

Walking the dogs on good days is a great way to get exercise for volunteers and for the animals. It also keeps them socialized and comfortable with strangers.

If you can't visit the shelter and want to help in ways, sponsor an animal for spaying or neutering to enhance their chances for adoption.


Or offer your home as a two-week foster placement for puppies while their protective shots take ef-

fect. It gives them a much better chance at life. A winter foster home must have an indoor area where the puppies can be kept.

The shelter is extremely crowded as more and more dogs and cats are dropped there and adoption slow because of the busy holidays.

## Friday fire destroys Capitan home

By the time a passing motorist alerted the dispatcher Friday, the home on State Road 48 near Capitan already was engulfed by flames.

The home belonged to the Chuck Whipple family. They were out of town when the fire broke out, according to Bonito Volunteer Fire Department chief Howard Puckett.

He said the cause is under investigation by Deputy Connie Hopper

of the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department and by Jim Trehern for the State Fire Marshal's office.

"We received the call at 5:50 a.m., but it was totally gone by the time we got there," Puckett said. "The only thing we could do was save the big shop-garage that had a bunch of chemicals and bottled gas stored. We kept that from going up, but a camping trailer and a car were destroyed."

He described the home as containing about 2,000-square feet of living space.

"We were on the scene until about 9:45 a.m. and then some of our people monitored the scene until the state fire marshal was finished," Puckett said.

Bonito sent four pieces of equipment and 13 volunteers to the fire. The department was aided by the Nogal Fire Department, which Puckett said dispatched two pieces of equipment and seven people, and the Capitan department with three pieces of equipment and seven volunteers.

# Apply now for new tax certificate

Applications for non-taxable transaction certificates continue to lag, according to Dick Minzner, New Mexico Secretary of Taxation and Revenue.

Only about 15,000 of the expected 40,000 applications have been received to date, said Minzner. Secretary Minzner released a county by county list of applications received.

The best response has been from Harding County, whose application rate was at 56 percent of the expected final number of applications.

The worst responses were from Roosevelt, Torrance and Union counties. In each of those counties only 24 percent of those expected to apply have done so.

Among the larger counties the response rates have been Bernalillo 40 percent, Dona Ana 34 percent and Santa Fe 39 percent.

"Either the businesses using these certificates have not heard that their outstanding certificates will expire on December 31, 1991, or they erroneously believe that they have until December 31, 1991,

to act," said Minzner.

Minzner stated that businesses, non-profits and governmental agencies who use these certificates must apply immediately if they hope to obtain new certificates by the end of December.

"We are making no more guarantees," said Minzner, "but we believe that anyone mailing an application by November 18, or immediately thereafter, will receive the necessary certificates by December 31."

SHINGLES (Herpes Zoster) is an interesting disease. The rash which frequently comes on in the 6th, 7th or 8th decade of life is caused by the same virus that produced chickenpox in the patient's youth. It only occurs in those people who had chickenpox earlier in life. The virus lies dormant for as long as 80 years only to break out in a rash usually around the trunk. It can break out along the distribution of any superficial nerve and can cause blindness if it affects the nerve to the surface of the eye. Fortunately one does not have to put up with the discomfort as the pain can be helped, sometimes dramatically, with injections of cortisone in a local anesthetic delivered directly to the rash.

# Downs woman vows she'll appeal 'vicious dog' ruling

Judy Miller will appeal a ruling by Ruidoso Downs Municipal Court Judge Harrold Mansell that her dog is vicious.

At a municipal trial Tuesday night, Mansell heard the case of Tony Craig against Miller concerning an incident that occurred on Oct. 4 when Miller's dog, a Staffordshire terrier, bit Craig when he was delivering gas.

Miller signed a counter suit against Craig for trespassing and cruelty to animals the day before the trial. Mansell heard both cases at the same time and dismissed both charges against Craig.

Craig, a delivery man for Cortez Gas, testified that in the first two years that he delivered gas to the property the two dogs had been chained up. Several months ago the butane tank was moved and a four-foot fence put up. The first time he came after the fence was put up, Craig said he petted both dogs, but when he turned to get the gas hose the brown dog bit him in the back of the leg.

Both Craig and Miller said they did not know why the dog bit him, but when Miller asked Craig if he had been playing with the dog, he said it may have bit him because he quit playing with her. Miller said at that time she put the dog in the house and warned Craig never to come on the property again unless she made an appointment for him to come.

Craig said he does not remember hearing her say this. He said he did mention the incident to his supervisor at Cortez Gas, but they didn't feel any action was necessary because Miller was there when it happened. Craig said Miller also told him it would never happen again.

Miller said on the day the next incident happened she went to Cortez Gas, paid her bill and set up an appointment to have her furnace checked and the gas delivered. She said she set this up for Oct. 7, when she would be at the property.

But, on Oct. 4, as she drove by the property to get her daughter from school, she saw that Craig was there delivering gas.

"I was shocked to see him there because I had made the appointment for the seventh," she said.

Craig said when he got there the white dog was on a chain, but the brown dog was out of the yard and on the front porch. He said when Miller came she asked if the dogs had bothered him, and he said they hadn't. At that time he turned to get the gas hose, and the dog bit him on the calf of his leg, he said.

Craig said the bite brought him to his knees, but Miller said she did not see him go down. Miller said she grabbed the dog and put it in the house because Craig yelled a threat and was running after it.

Craig said she picked up a stick and chased the dog at that time, but Miller said she would never use a stick or hit her dogs.

She said she looked at the bite and asked Craig if he would like to see the doctor, but he declined. Craig said he didn't go to a doctor because he knew it would cost a lot. Miller said she saw him later in the day and asked again if he wanted to see a doctor.

Craig said he did not file a complaint until several days later because Miller called his wife to ask about him, but then said she would keep the dogs chained for 10 days, as required by law, and then would let them loose.

Miller said she would never say this because she wants to protect her dogs and keep them away from people.

After the telephone conversation, Craig said he felt that she wouldn't care who the dog bit or how serious it was. He said he then filed the complaint at the police department with officer Dana Terlecky.

Miller asked Craig if he had been talked into making the complaint, but he said he hadn't been.

Miller said she has never let her dogs run loose. She said they have never been picked up by the animal control officers, and she has had the dog for seven years. This is also the first time the dog has bit anyone, Miller said.

Miller said she feels the dog must have been provoked into the

action. She said Craig had played with her dogs before, but these dogs play to win. The dog was not off of its property and was protecting itself and her business, Miller said. Craig agreed the dog was not off of its property.

She said no other delivery or service people that have come to her house have been threatened. Miller had several witnesses who testified that they had never been threatened by the dogs or seen them running loose. They also said the dogs were well-trained and obeyed voice commands.

Two employees of Cortez Gas testified that Miller had come in to make an appointment that day, but they thought she wanted it to be for checking the furnace, not for the delivery of the gas, so Craig was not told about it.

Miller said she didn't want the gas until the furnace was checked. She said she made the appointment because of the first incident.

In the summary, Craig said he has more than 700 customers, most with dogs, but this dog is the only one that has bit him. He said he never had trouble with the dogs when they were chained, and he never provoked them.

Miller said her dog was not off its property and not at large and should have legal protection as her property. She said she felt accused before the trial began because the case was made so public. She also said Cortez Gas should have kept its appointment.

Before making his verdict, Mansell said he felt both parties were correct in their testimony. He said the thing that concerned him the most was the earlier incident. He said both parties should have done something at that time.

Mansell said it was a tough decision, but since the dog did bite it brings up the word vicious. He told Miller she should make arrangements between her and the gas company for future deliveries.


Mansell said Miller has the right to appeal the ruling within 15 days at Carrizozo. Immediately following the decision, Miller said she will appeal.


Thanksgiving Service At Holy Mount Church

The soccer teams play every spring and fall in Otero County.


The under 14 years of age team, coached by Dean Hood, finished its





While planning for this year's Winter Visitors Guide, we met with ski shop operators, Pat Morrison of Ski Apache and Joan Bailey of the Chamber of Commerce Promotion and Visitors Committee. They all have a big stake and interest in the success of this winter season.

They're all in the business of promoting the entire area, as well as their separate enterprises, and they all agreed that we in the Ruidoso area are sometimes our own worst enemies. For, even as we spend hundreds of thousands of dollars to get people to come to this area, we sometimes don't make their visits as pleasant as possible once they arrive.


"What we need is a class on how to treat our visitors," commented one of the people in that informal meeting. Here's a crash course using the things that we learned from winter business people:

1. Be friendly and welcome the visitors into town — treat them like you're glad they came. Be helpful even if they don't use your services or buy anything in your shop. We all benefit, in the long run, from every happy tourist.
  2. Be helpful in providing information and directions.

### AG Udall explains state's lawsuit

On behalf of the State of New Mexico, I filed suit against the Department of Energy (DOE) and the Department of Interior (DOI) last month in Federal Court in Washington, D.C. in order to halt the illegal shipment of radioactive waste into New Mexico.

Although there are wide differences of opinion about the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant (WIPP), the State's Congressional delegation, Governor King and I are unified in support for this lawsuit. Now, three Congressmen and the State of Texas, among others, have intervened in the suit on the same side as New Mexico.

The DOE and the DOI are attempting to open the WIPP site to the introduction of nuclear waste through an administrative procedure in which the DOI withdraws the WIPP site for the DOE's use as a nuclear waste depository. The U.S. Constitution, however, gives Congress the exclusive authority to permanently dispose of the public lands.

In fact, bills are pending in both chambers of Congress which would permit legislative withdrawal of WIPP. The Senate bill, sponsored by New Mexico senators Bingaman and Domenici, was approved by the Senate on November 5.


The bills pending in Congress are more beneficial to the State than the administrative withdrawal, because they include numerous protections.

First, the bills safeguard the health of New Mexico's citizens in the event of an accident involving nuclear waste by providing further emergency medical training.

Second, the bills give greater protection to the State's environment. For example, they require oversight of the WIPP by the Environmental Protection Agency.

Third, the bills contain hundreds of millions of dollars of assistance to New Mexico to improve the roads upon which the WIPP truck shipments will travel, to compensate us for lost mineral royalties, and to pay for medical emergency preparedness.

The administrative withdrawal contains none of these protections. Administrative withdrawal is a bad deal for New Mexico.

New Mexico won the first round of its lawsuit when the Federal government's lawyers promised the Court that the DOE would not ship waste for a month so that the lawyers could review and respond to our legal papers and the Court could hold a hearing.

I asked the Federal District Court Judge to grant a preliminary injunction to prevent shipment of waste to the WIPP without Congressional action. Injunctions, however, are drastic remedies that judges rarely grant.

Because of the potential for severe harm to New Mexico's citizens, and because the State is likely to prevail on the merits of the case — that the DOE and the DOI violated numerous provisions of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act, the National Environmental Policy Act and the Administrative Procedure Act — I am hopeful that New Mexico will be successful in obtaining an injunction.

Here's what the evidence in the case states: DOE's own expert scientist, Thomas Bahr, warns of "overzealousness in trying to move waste into WIPP" and that this is an "obsession" for the DOE.

The tests, which are the stated purpose for importing the first shipments of radioactive waste, will provide no meaningful scientific data.

A representative of the New Mexico Medical Society, comprised of practicing physicians throughout New Mexico, recently stated, "At present, the physicians of the State of New Mexico do not feel that they are prepared to take care of someone who is injured in an acci-

dent involving nuclear waste."

There is effectively no plan to retrieve the waste from the WIPP at the end of the tests.

There are serious scientific misgivings about the geological integrity of the rooms in the WIPP where the tests with the first shipments are scheduled to take place.

Why are the DOE and the DOI rushing ahead and also breaking long-standing commitments to New Mexico not to introduce waste to WIPP without congressional approval?

Some suggest that it is DOE's impatience with Congress. Others suggest that it is the intense pressure on DOE to open WIPP. A recent congressional report stated that the DOE lacked the "credibility and capability" needed to clean up waste and contamination at the nation's atomic weapons complex. A stampede of criticism followed. Likewise, Governor Cecil Andrus of Idaho and several governors, have been critical of DOE's failure to remove radioactive waste from their states.

DOE Secretary Watkins has threatened to withdraw millions of dollars previously pledged to New Mexico for safety measures if the State contests his illegal shipment of waste to New Mexico.

Apparently, Secretary Watkins, having betrayed his commitment to New Mexico, now seeks to bully and blackmail New Mexico into prematurely opening WIPP. Even WIPP's strongest backers would agree that legal principle, scientific reason and common sense, not transparent threats or political posturing, should determine when and under what conditions nuclear waste should be shipped to the Land of Enchantment.

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** U.S. District Judge John Garrett Penn late Tuesday blocked the federal government from opening WIPP, granting New Mexico's request for a preliminary injunction in its lawsuit over the permanent nuclear waste repository. The decision blocks the DOE from sending radioactive waste to WIPP before Congress passes a bill allowing waste to be transported and stored in the nation's first such facility.
