Four people are dead after two-vehicle crash

After colliding head-on with a pickup truck and killing three people late Saturday, the distraught driver of a semi-truck wrote a suicide note and fatally shot himself in the head.

According to New Mexico State Trooper Salvatore Beltran, Weslie John Wilkes, 25, of Crossville, Tennessee, was driving a semi-truck west bound on his way to Alamogordo when he attempted to pass another semi-truck in a no passing zone at mile post 276 near

Glencoe.

Beltran said the semi driver being passed radioed Wilkes that a car was coming, but it was too late.

Wilkes collided head-on with a 1992 Dodge pickup driven by Patsy Daniels, 50. Her passengers Doyle Ray Capps, 51, and Goldie Harring-

ton Higby, 74, died instantly. Daniels died later at the Lincoln County Medical Center.

All three persons in the pickup were from Wolfforth, Texas.

Beltran said skid marks showed that Wilkes had braked briefly before the collision, probably when he

heard the radio call. He said the pickup truck had not braked or shown any evasive action. He said he did not believe the occupants of the pickup were aware of what hit them.

Beltran said it was his impression that Wilkes did not have any

visible injuries after the accident, but may have sustained internal injuries. He said Wilkes walked over to the pickup, viewed the tragedy and then returned to the sleeper section of his cab.

MainStreet refigures its budget; Village Council cuts, adds funds

MainStreet Ruidoso will be looking at ways to make funding from the village last for the coming fiscal year after getting about \$10,000 less than the group had submitted for a budget.

MainStreet project director Mary Maul told the board about the village's decision at a meeting Thursday morning. During a budget session the village council decided to give the group \$37,500, the same amount as last year, after Maul had submitted a proposed expense total of \$50,700. President Aiden Deyo then went to a recent council meeting to answer questions on these expenses, and the council decided to increase the total by \$3,500 to \$41,000.

Deyo said MainStreet is now in an uncertain situation and will have to consider the amount of money it will take to make it through the year. Maul said the executive committee will probably have to rearrange the budget to see if they can make this amount work. One thing that they will have to consider is the fact that the group has decided to hire an assistant director.

The executive board had discussed having Maul remain as the executive director to continue contacts with the legislature, state agencies and the village. An as-

sistant would then be hired with secretarial and bookkeeping skills to be trained as a program manager. They decided to bring it to the regular board meeting to see how the directors feel about the idea.

Maul said the change would require redefining her job description, but she will also spend a lot of time training the new person. The position won't be advertised because they have already been contacted by several highly qualified people. Maul said as she trains the person more responsibilities will be given to them as program manager.

Deyo said Maul's husband has taken a job in Santa Fe and she would like to be with him, but by the same token MainStreet Ruidoso needs her knowledge and expertise to carry on the projects they have started. He said it would be impossible for her to administer completely from Santa Fe, but it will be handy to have her there in many respects.

Deyo said the assistant would also help carry on with new projects in three of the MainStreet point areas: design, promotion and economic restructuring to further the preservation, renovation and revitalization of the downtown. They will especially want to work in these areas as the plan to improve the sidewalks in the

downtown area is completed in the next one to two years.

As they go on to these new areas, Deyo said they will probably go out in the community to see what people think MainStreet should work on next. The executive committee will be working on how to approach this as well as the budget and the new assistant.

Another project the whole group will be working on is a membership drive. No date has been set yet, but they will hit the streets some time late in June. Deyo said they hope the drive will help them with funding this year.

MainStreet Ruidoso is also excited to be co-sponsor of a marketing seminar here from 9 a.m. to noon on Thursday at the village hall at 313 Cree Meadows Drive. The seminar is free and open to the public with donuts and coffee at 8:30 a.m.

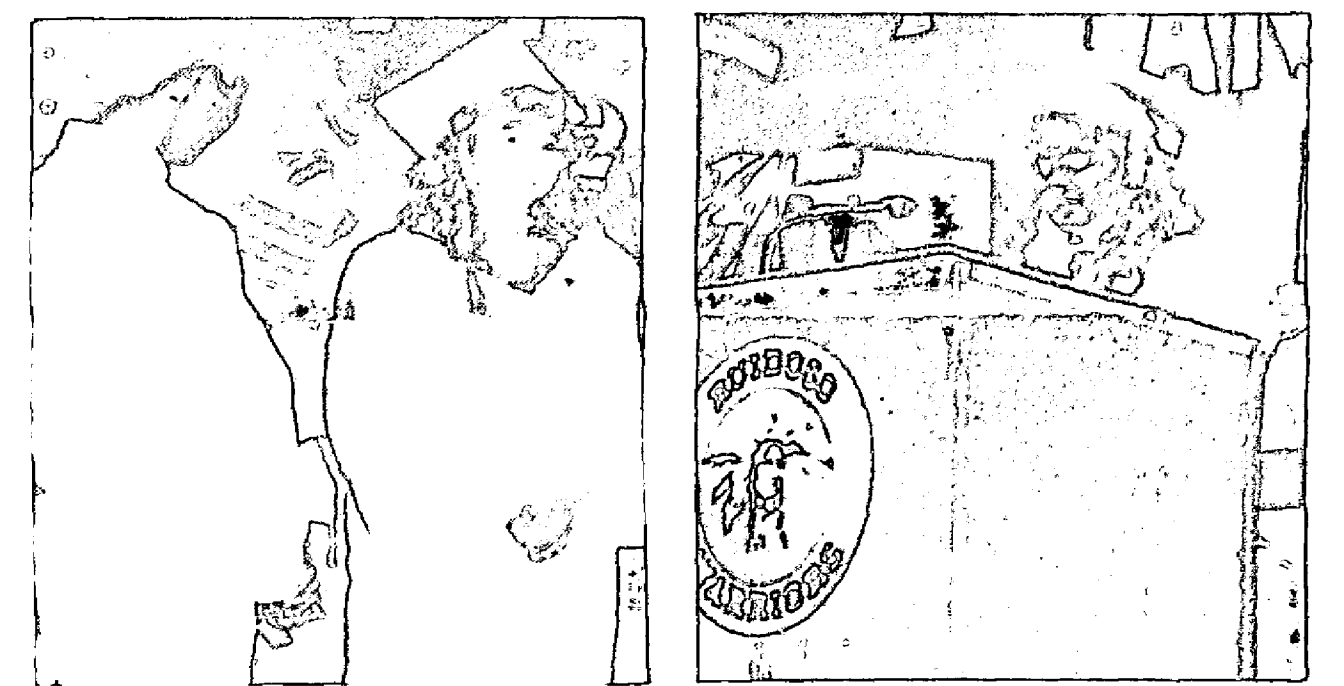
The seminar will be presented by Amy Horowitz Ware who has worked as a consultant for the National MainStreet Center since 1985. She has taught sessions on tourism, marketing, advertising and graphic design in 27 states. She has made presentations at Ruidoso previously.

Maul said they will be working on Saturday.

Resort Air promoter explains finances

Resort Air promoter Dick Weber took exception to an article published May 14 in The Ruidoso News and headlined "Council cuts out air" and "Council cuts out air."

After an in-house meeting with publisher Sammy Lopez, Weber sent Lopez a letter outlining, in part, his objections to the article.

Weber took specific exception to a paragraph that read: "A portion of the funds, about \$4,000 from the original \$8,000, has been spent for various reasons including trips by Duff and Weber to Santa Fe for transportation business."

The Duff mentioned, Councilman Bart Duff, is a member of the Resort Air committee and the village transportation committee.

Weber wrote that neither he nor Duff has spent any contributed funds for supplies, postage, copies, telephone charges, fax fees, mileage, meals or lodging.

The expenses that have been paid for by individual board members and their respective companies, he wrote.

Weber wrote that details of his meeting with Lopez were confidential.

It appears that Mr. Lopez continues to be personally supportive of the effort to acquire air service to Ruidoso and other cities, Weber wrote. He (Lopez) stated that he did not intentionally imply that we were involved in any improperity as

We continue to support any privately funded airline service, said Lopez in an interview this morning. This newspaper will continue to take a very conservative approach to the use of taxpayers' funds for subsidies for transportation.

In today's airline business environment, I am doubtful a new startup can achieve success.

After the poor consumer response to Mesa Airlines, one of the most successful small carriers in the United States, it became apparent that Ruidoso is a "drive" resort area, added Lopez.

I would like to see a different approach to give Ruidoso air service a try.

On May 18, village clerk Tammy Duff responded to a request from Duff to outline expenditures of the Village Study Fund, which includes Resort Air donations.

Two travel reimbursements totaling \$1,779.11 were listed for Kerry Greer and William Cleveland.

According to Weber, Greer and Cleveland are the prospective chief executive officer and chief pilot for Resort Air.

A third travel reimbursement check for \$225.72 was to Dick

Weber. Weber said that the money was for a trip to the Ruidoso State Jail to discuss the Resort Air project.

Resort Air is a privately owned and operated business, Weber said. The article implied that the village should be involved in the project, which is not the case.

As a private corporation, Weber said, he could spend the money as he sees fit. But Shaw contended if the account was for a private business, the Department of Economic Development (DED) would be involved.

Mrs. Shaw stated that she never intended to imply that Dick Weber was involved in any improperity of fund handling. Her comments were directed as possible criticism of the council's former approach to all village studies.

The New Mexico Department of Economic Development (DED) is a state agency that oversees all state-owned and operated businesses. It is also responsible for the development of the state's economy.

Here, it is worth noting that the DED is a state agency and not a village agency. The village is a separate entity and should not be involved in the DED's business.

Monsoon dampens Ruidoso with record breaking season

After a winter with 66.6 inches or 136 percent of normal snowfall, spring-like weather finally arrived by mid-April, following the late snowfall of 5.5 inches on April 1 and 2.

Temperatures reached a record-tying maximum of 80 degrees on April 28, promising an early mild spring; however, May brought a different story with a record number of showers and precipitation amounts.

Since May 1, Ruidoso has measured rainfall on 18 days (the average for the entire month is five) for a record total of 3.77 inches through May 24. The average May total is 0.97 inches. The previous May rainfall record of 2.87 inches

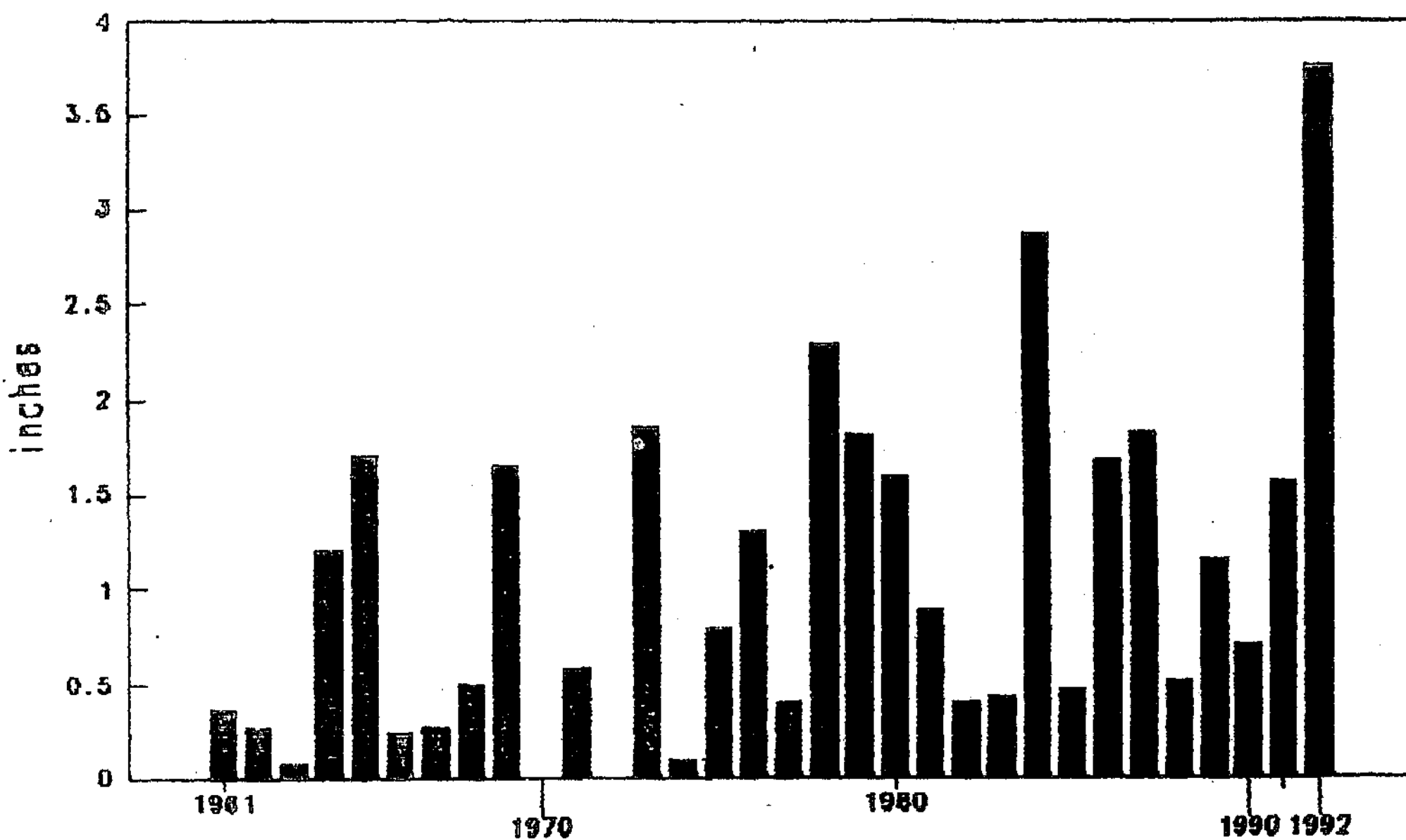
occurred in 1984.

El Nino's unusually warm waters of the Southeastern Pacific Ocean are the most likely cause of our winter and spring precipitation excess. They resulted in a semi-permanent low pressure area off of the West Coast of Old Mexico, which in turn, produced frequent periods of moist southerly winds from the Gulf of California and Gulf of Mexico into New Mexico. When this low pressure area drifted eastward over Northern Old Mexico, Arizona and into New Mexico, major outbreaks of winter snows and spring storms developed.

The Ruidoso precipitation total of 8.92 inches since January 1, makes 1992 the third wettest January-May period on record. It is

exceeded only by 1958 with 10.38 inches and 1975 with 10.79 inches for the period. 1958 was another year of a maturing El Nino, and followed a winter snowfall total of 74.7 inches.

Our annual July and August monsoon of these years averaged 65 percent and 80 percent of the 8.38 inch normal, while summer rainfall for years following very wet Mays resulted in 120 percent of normal. Based on Ruidoso climatology and the outlook of the National Weather Service the frequent shower periods are expected to continue into June followed by a trend toward more normal rainfall in July and August when the monthly totals average 3.94 and 4.44 inches respectively.

Chamber board latches onto Weber's transportation wagon

The Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce wants to share in Dick Weber's dreams.

A small transportation committee formed by the Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce several years ago was the first step in the current burst of transportation projects, according to Chamber President Paul Crown.

Committee chairperson Dick Weber reported to the chamber board of directors at its meeting Wednesday on Resort Air, the Iron Horse Railroad and a mass transportation system for Ruidoso. Weber said in this project he has been wearing many different "hats" on the several transportation committees within the county.

He said Resort Air, which has been designed as a rural economic development tool, has gotten a logo created by Phil Price Advertising Agency, and they hope to have

planes to stick them to soon.

He said he has looked at several air companies that are going out of business and Resort Air may be able to purchase one of their licenses. He said it is exactly what they need.

"We are trying to establish a Mom and Pop style of airline. We want a very unique company that people will want to fly with," Weber said.

Resort Air is working with two major national carriers to provide service, but Weber said he can't discuss any information about this. If they can get the money together, he said they may be in the air as quick as July. The estimate to establish it and run it for the first year is \$9.5 million, according to Weber.

Weber said he has 236 applications for employment for pilots for when they get the planes off the ground. They are applying because they like Resort Air's philosophy

and goals, he said. These pilots already have jobs and love flying the Convair 580, which is the type of plane the company wants to use.

He said many people have given contributions to help pay for the postage, fax work and travel, but the committee members have paid for expenses out of their own pockets. The project is coming right along, and the chamber should be proud, Weber said.

The Iron Horse Railroad project has really blossomed as well, he said. The project has been adopted by the state department of tourism and now the push is on to look for developers. Weber said this is part of a new trend called eco-tourism that will be what Club Med was for the 1980s in saving local economies.

An effort to create transportation within the community is also picking up steam.

Weber said the village has set aside \$70,000 in the new fiscal year

budget to help develop a new type of dial-a-ride. One bus would operate on Sudderth Drive with another one on Mechem Drive. A third bus would operate in other areas, all with a nominal fee, he said.

If the village's grant application is successful, the state would pay for 80 percent of the system's hardware, while the local government would provide the 20 percent. Operating expenses would be split 50-50, Weber said.

Those involved in the project, based out of the village's transportation committee, are doing a transportation study to see if it can be done at a reasonable price, he said. The study would be due into the state transportation office by early fall before it can go on to the federal level. Weber said he expects the federal transportation department to award grants in December.

He said the buses he's looking at will be fully handicap accessible,

and they will probably run on gasoline with a standard engine. The vehicles have about a 24-person capacity, and the whole system is similar to those that are running in Belen and Clovis, Weber said.

Chamber president Paul Crown said the projects are all very exciting. He said since Weber is on a chamber committee, the chamber can take part of the credit for these.

In another committee report, Gloria Fogerson, a member of the Ruidoso Valley Greeters, told the directors about an ambassadors' conference she attended at Canyon City, Colorado. Representatives from seven states attended the conference for workshops, discussions and fun too.

Fogerson said all the chamber directors are invited to become members of this ambassadors group and attend these conferences. She said the greeters would like to see one of these conferences here in

Ruidoso in the future, so the more people they have to tell about this village the more likely it would be. The next convention is scheduled for Sierra Vista, Arizona.

The greeters are trying to help the village, too, Fogerson said. She said they want to help other groups have conventions when the new convention center is complete. Conventions can be big money for a community, she said.

Fogerson said if chamber members are interested in joining the ambassadors group, they should contact her or chamber executive director Joan Bailey.

The chamber is also trying to get more involved with the activities that the greeters have. Crown said the chamber staff will call the directors when the greeters have a ribbon cutting so some of them can attend and see what the greeters do for new members of the business community.

P&Z considers requests

Road improvement, a replat, amended commission Ruidoso planning and a variance fills the 2 p.m. agenda of today's Ruidoso planning and zoning commission meeting.

R. Greg Leyendecker is requesting a replat for Deer Park Woods Townhouses, Units 5 and 7. The subject property is in the county area within the three mile extraterritorial planning and platting jurisdiction of the village and in an unzoned area of the county.

Paul Westbrook requests an amended commercial site development for his lots in Riverside Addition.

The existing property contains 1,339 square feet of commercial gallery and 1,434 square feet for residence. The proposed addition would bring the residential square footage to 2,658 square feet.

Staff recommended the commission consider the following conditions:

1. That the proposed addition be sited as originally planned.
2. That spaces 9-13 not be permitted as shown on the plan.
3. That spaces 7 and 8 on applicant's plan be deleted.
4. That applicant provide fully improved parking areas concurrent with construction.

Trigger Phillips is asking for a variance on a portion of Tract A in Singing Pines Subdivision.

Phillips' property has frontage on a private easement extending from Bradley Drive. Lot adjoins the Ruidoso River and is partially within the flood plain.

Planning staff said the proposed addition is not a substantial expansion and is in an area of minimum flood impact. Site conditions warrant variance consideration.

Frank Fisk, owner of lots in Mountain Trail, requests assistance in improve Mountain Trail road.

Staff maintains that Fisk should work with adjoining property owners to remove encroachment problems and to secure adequate right-of-way. Any street improvement to be done by special assessment with property owners paying the full cost.

Lincoln County road repairs raise questions over costs and propriety

Criticism continues to circulate about improvements to a road leading to the cattle pens and home of Lincoln County Commission Chairman Stirling Spencer.

The accusations of favoritism get louder as the primary approaches. Spencer is seeking re-election to a second term to the District 1 seat. A Republican, he will face Democrat Harold Garcia in the November general election.

The chairman confronted the rumors in April during a regular commission meeting. At that time, he noted the road was listed as a school bus route and was eligible for county maintenance, although it had not been maintained for years. The work was suggested by county road manager Bill Cupit. Spencer said he donated the crusher fine material that was applied to the surface of the road.

After that meeting, Cupit gave a

rough estimate of \$6,000 as the cost for the work. He said the mile-long, 16-foot wide road was long overdue for maintenance. The county attempts to maintain all school bus routes and roads that serve commercial ranching.

At the request of The Ruidoso News, Cupit later supplied an itemized breakdown of the road job, listing the total cost to the county as \$8,042.68. That cost included equipment, labor and culverts only, since Spencer supplied 3,340 yards of surface material, which also was used on several other roads. Cupit put the value of the material at \$16,700.

The cost of equipment used was listed as \$3,758 and the labor as \$3,886.

The figures were based on actual cost to the county, not on what the department would charge when doing cooperative projects with the State Highway Department or what it would cost a private contractor,

who needs to make a profit, Cupit emphasized.

But some critics of the roadwork contend the cost actually was much higher, more than \$19,000.

However, in an estimate provided to The News, they base that figure on a per hour charge that includes the cost of the operator and the hourly rate that would be assessed to the state on a cooperative project.

The News contacted road managers in two other counties that do similar maintenance work. Officials there estimated the cost of the project from \$7,038 to \$10,000, in the general area of Cupit's figures.

The breakdowns from Cupit and commission critics differ in many respects than just the hourly charge for use of machinery and manpower.

Cupit listed 80 feet of culverts at \$4.98 per foot for \$398.40. According to county road department mechanic Ed Lundquist the cost was

\$597 for 120 feet of culvert.

Each segment of the work was listed by Lundquist as requiring several more hours than detailed by Cupit.

For instance, Lundquist estimates that a steel wheel roller worked 30 hours at \$32.86 an hour (machinery and labor), for a total of \$985.80. Cupit accounts for 20 hours of roller use at a cost of \$10.88 per hour for the equipment and \$7.28 for the worker, making the total \$363.20.

A blade was listed by Lundquist as working 130 hours at \$28.73 an hour for a total of \$3,734. Cupit placed the cost at \$2,466, for 113 hours at \$21.82 per hour.

Lundquist's job is being cut from the department in the 1992-93 fiscal year based on a recommendation from Cupit that a full time mechanic is not needed.

Lundquist has been outspoken in his criticism of the commission and of Cupit.

checked on Wilkes shortly thereafter, he found him dead of a gunshot wound to the head. Wilkes had left a short suicide note.

"I couldn't live after killing that man, Jesus loves me," the note read.

Beltran said it was the worst and most bizarre accident he had ever seen.

"Officers on the scene that have

been around for 15-20 years said they had never seen anything like that," Beltran said.

Beltran said the Dodge was no longer recognizable as a truck and remained in the center of the road. He said the semi had sustained

substantial damage to the right front and was pushed to the side of the road, still on its wheels.

Beltran said the accident closed U.S. Highway 70 for two to three hours.

The attorneys were paid \$2,039.29 out of the airline study fund.

Market Data-Small Business Assistance was listed as a \$1,500 expenditure to Gene Simmons of Cen-

tral Eastern New Mexico University.

Included in the back up material submitted for each expense, was a letter dated March 6 and sent to Nancy Radziewicz, owner of the New Mexico Connection. The letter was from Patrick Vanderpool of Advocates of Rural New Mexico (ARNM) regarding rural economic development.

The back up material also noted

that on March 31, Councilor Huff and Patricia Espinosa on behalf of the village transportation board, requested \$100 from the airline study fund for a membership in ARNM.

A small \$37 charge was listed for an Air Transportation Operation Guide.

The total expenses paid out according to the memo were \$6,243. According to Lavonne Cornett,

director of the budget review bureau of local government, division of the DFA, the co-mingling of funds between private and village money for public good, such as an airline, would be a gray area, a legal question.

Cornett said all money in various bank accounts are balanced and reconciled by a monthly report to DFA.

Smidgen is little bundle of love

He weighs only three or four pounds, but carries a ton of love in his shaggy little body.

Smidgen, a 10-month-old terrier-poodle mix, was brought into the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter three weeks ago.

"He's very sweet," said shelter manager Randy Basch. "He's a little timid when first picked up, but it's all love and kisses from then on."

Smidgen is white with a light tan blotch on his back.

"He's good with other animals, and with children," Basch said. "He's housebroken."

"Two other advantages with dogs like Smidgen is that they shed very little and they aren't big eaters."

Smidgen will have to be neutered as a condition of adoption. The society welcomes donations for

its spay and neuter fund from people who love animals and want to improve the chance of adoption for abandoned cats and dogs.

Contributions may be earmarked for a specific animal.

Other ways to improve the adoption chances for animals at the shelter is to visit them. By talking or playing with them, giving them treats or taking them for a walk, the animals become more socialable and are more likely to attract new owners.

Several previously featured dogs and cats still are waiting for new homes. They include Maggie, an extremely intelligent, black and grey marked catahoula leopard dog; Misty, the elegant and gentle greyhound; the wire-hair terrier mix named Mutton; and the unusually-marked Chesapeake bay-retriever, wire hair terrier mix called Mit-tens, with his grey mustache and paws.

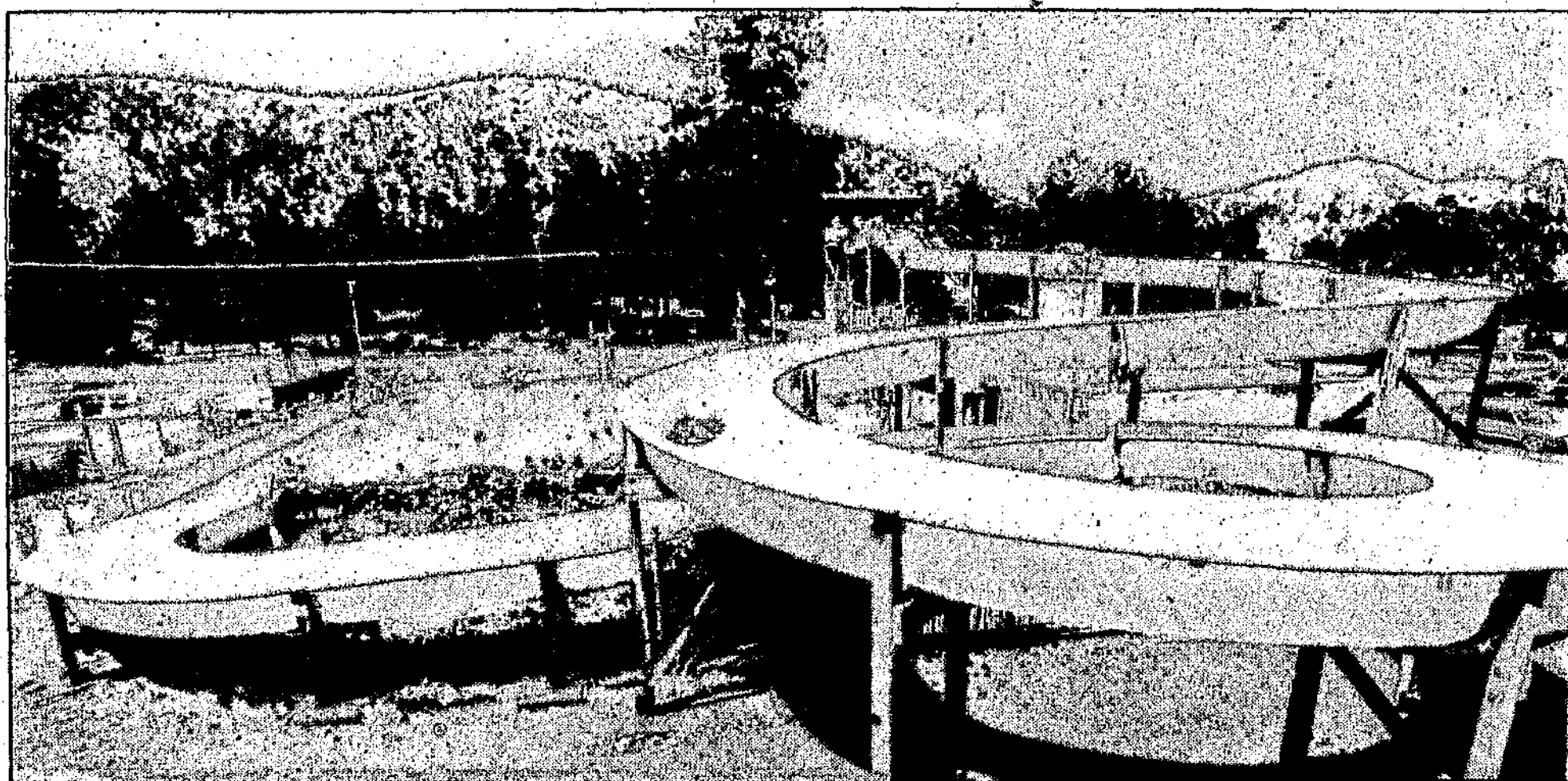
Pool opens

The sunny, summer weather is just around the corner and so is the opening of the Ruidoso swimming pool.

Beginning Tuesday pool workers will also be taking registration for swimming classes from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday until the classes are filled. Adult beginner classes will be from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday and Thursday for three weeks beginning June 16. The cost for the adult class is \$15.

Beginners classes will be offered for children seven-year-olds and older from 9 to 9:45 a.m. the weeks of June 8-June 19 or June 29-July 10. Children ages four and a half to six will have beginners class from

10 to 10:45 a.m. on these weeks. The cost for these classes will be \$30 each.

Advanced beginners classes will be open for all ages that have completed the beginner class. The class will meet from 9:30 a.m. to 11 a.m. June 22-June 26, at a cost of \$30. Parent and tot classes will be available for children ages six months to

four years old, but the parent must accompany the child. This class will be from 10 a.m. to 10:35 a.m. July 13-17 and will cost \$15. Intermediate classes are offered to children who have completed beginners and advanced beginners classes. They will meet from 10 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. July 20-July 31. The cost will be \$30.

Lessons will follow American Red Cross standards and lessons will be taught by certified instructors.

Season passes can also be purchased for individuals or families. Groups can contact the pool to make arrangements for special group swimming or night time parties.

LCMC joins MEDNET, Texas Tech University

Lincoln County Medical Center has become the latest hospital to subscribe to Texas Tech MEDNET, announced officials with the hospital and with Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center.

Texas Tech MEDNET provides a variety of telecommunication services, including satellite broadcasts of continuing education programs, which help local health care providers better serve their patients. At present 46 hospitals in Texas and New Mexico subscribe to MEDNET.

Joint announcement of the affiliation was made by MEDNET Director J. Ted Hartman, M.D., and hospital-administrator Valerie Miller.

Through MEDNET broadcasts, health practitioners at participating sites are able to view live programs which keep them current on developments in medicine and health care. Through a two-way audio hookup, participants at each participating site are also able to ask questions of presenters.

MEDNET currently provides

three hours a week of programs designed for physicians, nurses, allied health practitioners and even hospital board members. All programs are accredited and count toward the continuing education requirements set by licensing boards of the various health professions.

Participating hospitals purchase equipment, then pay a monthly fee for the programming.

"Texas Tech MEDNET helps rural hospital overcome their isolation by giving all their staff direct interaction with medical specialists," Hartman said. "Because the staff receive programs in the hospital, MEDNET ultimately reduces travel and other expenses necessary for staff to meet continuing education requirements."

In addition to the continuing education component, Texas Tech MEDNET provides two-way interactive medical consultations between Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center physicians and rural practitioners at two sites—Alpine and Fort Stockton.

A tribute to the Arizona Kid, Bob Lambert

Happy Birthday To The Arizona Kid

What with all the heavy record-breaking rains, and driving home and back through small lakes and deep mud holes, and thunder and lightning—somehow it slipped my mind that the seventeenth is the birthday of Bob Lambert, alias "The Arizona Kid."

Bob was born May 17, 1909, in Ballard County, Kentucky. When he was nine years old, he and his mother set out for Arizona for his mother's health. While on the train traveling west Bob's mother had a conversation with a man who later turned out to be Zane Grey, world famous writer of western stories. In Arizona Bob began a life which would remind you of one of the great Zane Grey's stories.

Bob's mother began working as a cook for a ranch near Fowler, Arizona, and in helping his mother, Bob learned much of the art of cooking which later on served him well.

At the age of 12 Bob began his life as a cowboy. From this he gets his name "The Arizona Kid;" soon he became a top hand and worked on ranches in the area of Prescott, Seligman, and Kingman.

One time Bob joined a cow outfit near Globe, Arizona. Many of the horses were crippled from running in the Lecheguilla; it was snowing and raining at the same time, and worst of all, it turned out there was no cook.

Bob remembers that the boss pointed his finger at him and asked:

"Can you cook?"

Bob answered, "Sure, I can cook when there is nothing to cook with." This brought a laugh from the other riders, who soon changed their laughing to words of praise and thanks.

"What did I cook?" Good old beef steaks, taters, beans, biscuits, and rice with raisins.

The Turning Point

In 1945 Bob had saved up one thousand dollars, and with this he made a payment on a ranch near Skull Valley. He had a pickup, a bed role, a saddle, and one horse.

And then Bob's star of good fortune came

shining down. On July 28, 1945, in Skull Valley, he was married to the former Betty Vyne. They lived the happy life of ranches, owning several ranches in northern Arizona—for 20 or so years.

While ranching in Arizona, Bob and Betty, became acquainted with two natives of the Ruidoso Valley: Bill Dick and Bud Browning, who referred to their native land as "God's Country."

In 1969 they moved to their present home two miles below Fox Cave, and founded the Canyon Trading Post. Here they have become a landmark to folks traveling coast to coast. And they retain a bit of their ranching back ground. You may see cows, sheep, and goats at the trading post.

"Spare Ribs," The Pet Sparrow

If the pathways of life had turned a little differently for Bob and Betty Lambert, they both might have turned out to be great doctors.

They are both good friends of the birds who are quick to recognize this friendship:

"One time a sparrow had broken its leg, and was helpless in the yard. Bob made a splint out of a pop sickle stick and nursed the sparrow along until the leg healed. They named him Spare Ribs. He would spend the night in his cage and in the day would fly down and perch on Bob's shoulder. He would go into his shirt pocket and all around Bob's shoulders, and then perch on the point of his shoulder while he was reading True West or some other magazines. Every time I remember

this I remember the old favorite song: "Rocked in the Cradle of the Deep."

"Rocked in the cradle of the deep, I lay me down in peace to sleep. Secure I rest upon the wave For thou, O Lord, hast power to save. I know that thou wilt heed my call For thou dost mark the sparrow's fall."

Another time a baby bird fell out of the nest, and Betty taught it to open its mouth by imitating the voice of a mother bird. Then she fed the infant bird with pablum, the baby food. In time little Spare Ribs Number Two became a great favorite of the household, living in a cage. And when he grew up he joined the other birds outside.

Bob and Betty say that the Browning boys spoke the truth when they called the Ruidoso valley God's Country. They endeavor themselves more and more to us each year as good friends and neighbors.

And we wish Bob Lambert many happy returns of the day and all God's blessings.

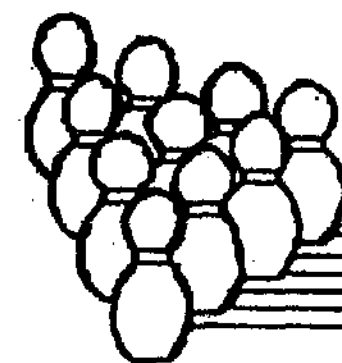

Sent off at odds of 7-1, Dash Master Miss and jockey Luke Myles raced the 400 yards in 20.04 seconds against a head wind over a

muddy track.

"She (Dash Master Miss) usually has trouble getting away from the gate clean," said Myles. "She stood in there today and was all business and left running."

Dash Master Miss recorded a 90 speed index while winning by 1-3/4 lengths over runnerup Six A Pass and jockey Joe Martinez. Owned by

Scarlett Hill Farm Inc, Gus Barakis et al, of Weatherford, Texas, Dash Master Miss paid \$17.40 to win, \$7.20 to place and \$5.20 to show. Six A Pass paid \$12.80 and \$7.40. Disco Sheza paid \$8.20 to show. The 1-2 quinella paid \$95.80, and the 1,2,10 trifecta paid \$3,359.

Even-money favorite Special Task and second-favorite Vital

Class lost their races before ever leaving the starting gate. Vital Class became anxious and broke through the front of the starting gate before the field was fully loaded. When Vital Class broke, Special Task tried to follow. Special Task finished seventh and Vital Class finished fourth.

"He was standing ready, but

Owned by William Clifton Jr. of Waco, Texas, Golden Wave Band returned her supporters \$11.60 to win, \$5 to place and \$5 to show. Longshot Kiss Em' Again finished second and paid \$10.40 and \$6.40. Maggie's Lass finished third and paid \$4.20. Favorite Hatchetta offered a lackluster race and finished sixth.

Design Express held off stablemate Easily Twelve to win Saturday's \$38,600 Kansas Derby

Consolation by a comfortable margin.

Although Design Express drifted toward the outside rail in mid-stretch, the filly and jockey Kenny Hart still managed to win the 400-yard race by three-quarters of a length.

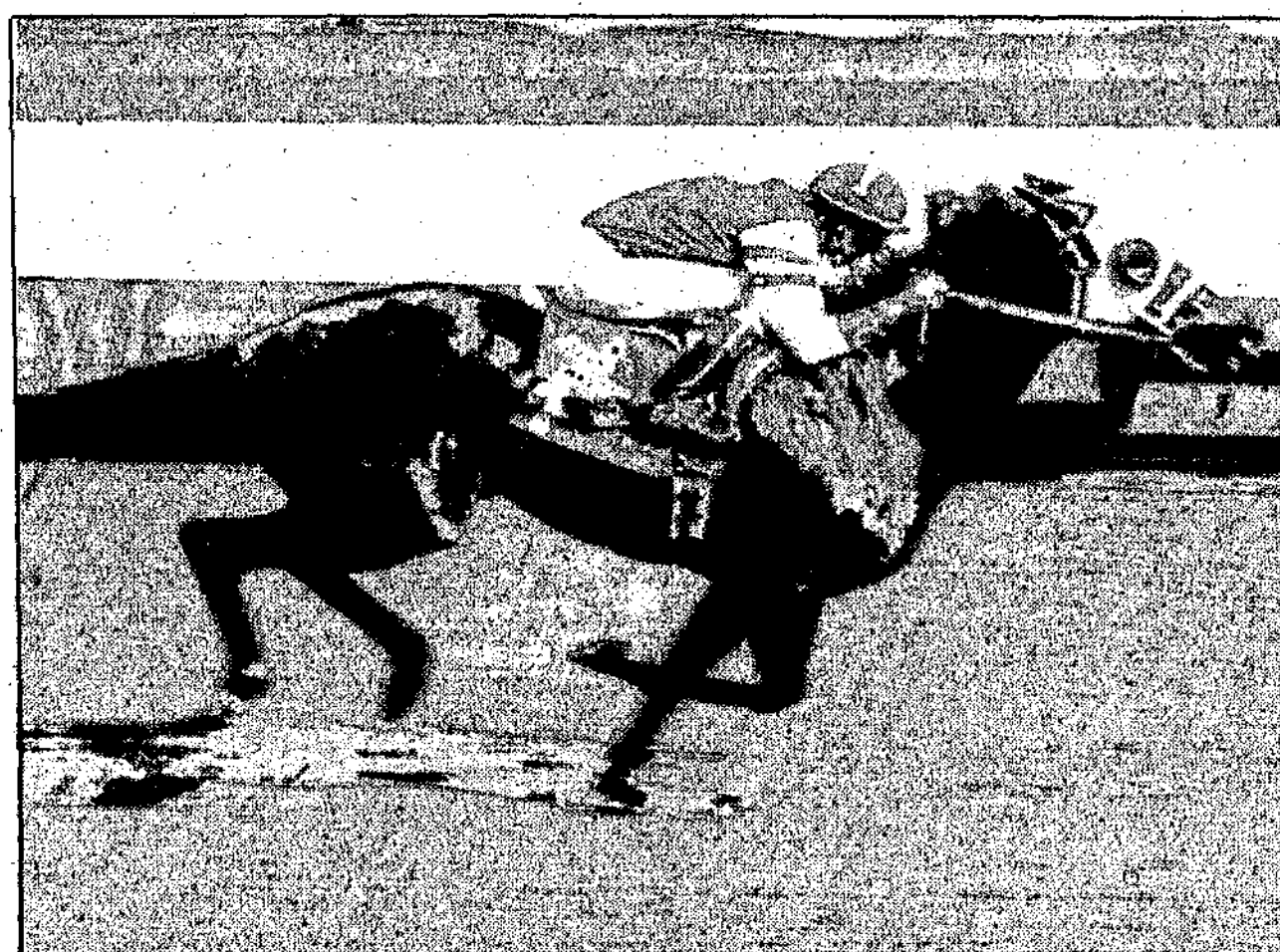

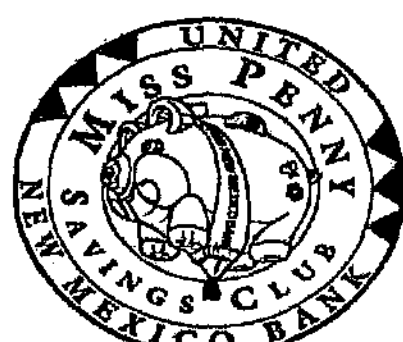

ABOUT THE LINCOLN COUNTY COMMISSION:
NOW HERE'S THE REST OF THE STORY.

As concerned citizens of Lincoln County, we must disagree with The Ruidoso News opinion that the incumbent commission and their appointees have done a "Good Job". They have not. And the general opinion around the country of "Throw the _____ out" is especially warranted in regard to the existing commission.

Let's give credit where credit is due. Almost all of the major accomplishments cited by the Lincoln County Commission including upgrading of Road Department equipment, organization of the solid waste authority, ending the "Lincoln County Courthouse Wars" were in reality initiated and implemented by the past commission and the previous appointed department heads who were subsequently fired by the now existing commissioners. This commission came in on the coattails of these accomplishments and then took full credit.

As if this wasn't bad enough, we have heard that the present commission has used county resources paid for by tax dollars on private concerns. Cases in point are a catholic church cemetery . . .

A county road which accesses only a commissioner's ranch was quoted in this paper by the Lincoln County road manager as costing the county \$6000. We have facts and figures indicating that the true cost to the county was nearly \$20,000.

A major failure of the existing commission is employee morale for which they are directly responsible. Morale of hourly employees is critical because these are the people who in reality provide the services the constituency expects. Public announcements by commissioners of pay raises that are not forthcoming, appointed department heads who have extremely limited personnel management experience, the use of threats and bullying by these same managers have virtually destroyed county employee morale.

In the same vein the elimination of the shop mechanic foreman position in the road department was stated by the road manager as a measure that would save the county money. There are many within the county who believe the decision was personally and politically motivated. By having a mechanic in the road department not only is efficiency increased but the liability to legal recourse by any damage done as a result of unsafe and poorly maintained county equipment is greatly reduced.

We have cited only facts that can be entirely documented. There are many other examples to illustrate the incompetency of the present commission. As voters let's exercise the general national opinion and Vote The _____ Out.

Vote this Tuesday

Tuesday is a big day in Lincoln County. It's the first time that voters of this county will be selecting candidates to serve on the brand-new five-member commission. Lincoln County voters will, for the first time, vote within their five commission districts.

When New Mexico voters go to the polls on Tuesday, June 2, they'll be making selections for Democrat and Republican nominees for president, as well as many state offices. This area will be selecting candidates for Congress and for the State Senate, for county commission and other county offices.
