## Schools face state budget cuts

The belt keeps tightening. State legislators continue to put the squeeze on school districts, shrinking the major source of financial support of education for New Mexico schools.

Because of the uncertainty of the final state student reimbursement "floating" figure, the Ruidoso school district's proposed 1992-93 operating budget grew by only \$344,247. The school board tentatively approved the budget Tuesday.

The state provides 90.25 percent of the Ruidoso district's revenue. Local sources, including property taxes, only account for 1.87 percent and federal sources, 7.89 percent.

Including debt service, capital projects, federal programs, the cafeteria and special revenues, the total proposed budget took a greater leap, up nearly \$1-million from \$11,536,639 in 1991-92 to \$12,481,723.

About \$500,000 of that increase is part of construction projects covered by the sale of bonds.

The budget contains no overall

percentage salary increase for teachers. But by moving up one year in experience on the district's salary matrix, teachers will see an average increase of 1.8 percent, said District Supt. Mike Gladden.

That's close to the 2 percent average increase encouraged by the state, he said. Last year, teachers also received no overall raise, with the board relying on an average 1.7 percent matrix increase. The approach favors teachers at the lower end of the experience scale. Those with more than 15 years of experience and a master's degree plus 45 hours top out at \$36,687.

Beginning teachers with only a bachelor's degree earn \$18,344.

Instructional salaries account for nearly \$4 million of the proposed budget, up \$70,733 from 1991-92, reflecting the addition of one full-time equivalent teacher plus slight increases in items relating to substitute teachers and instructional assistants.

Fixed charges such as employee benefits (which includes workman's compensation, unemployment insurance, retirement and social

security) jumped by about \$120,000 to \$1.26-million.

"We moved from fifth in the state (in salaries) in 1990-91 to seventh in 1992-92," said Supt. Mike Gladden. "I'm waiting for information this year. I hope we don't slip any further."

The section for administration dropped slightly by \$6,490 to \$184,916. Gladden's salary went up from \$52,260 to \$54,873, a five percent increase.

Plant operation costs, which include utilities, jumped by nearly \$70,000.

"We're looking closely at this one because we saw a significant increase this year," Gladden said. "This also is where we place extra money to fall back on."

Athletic salaries remained the same as current levels. Money from the sale of bonds approved by voters last year will cover \$1.94-million in capital improvements.

School Board member Rod Adamson questioned whether setting aside 1.5 percent of the budget for emergencies is adequate.

It sure is a small amount for an

emergency fund," he said, but noted that the state doesn't encourage anything larger.

"Estimating the number of students that will be enrolled in the district from year to year is difficult, because of the high mobility," Gladden told the board. That estimate is what the staff uses to build its budget, because the major contribution from the state is based on a per student unit reimbursement.

Gladden has asked the state to allow him to increase his estimated growth from 3 percent to 5.5 percent.

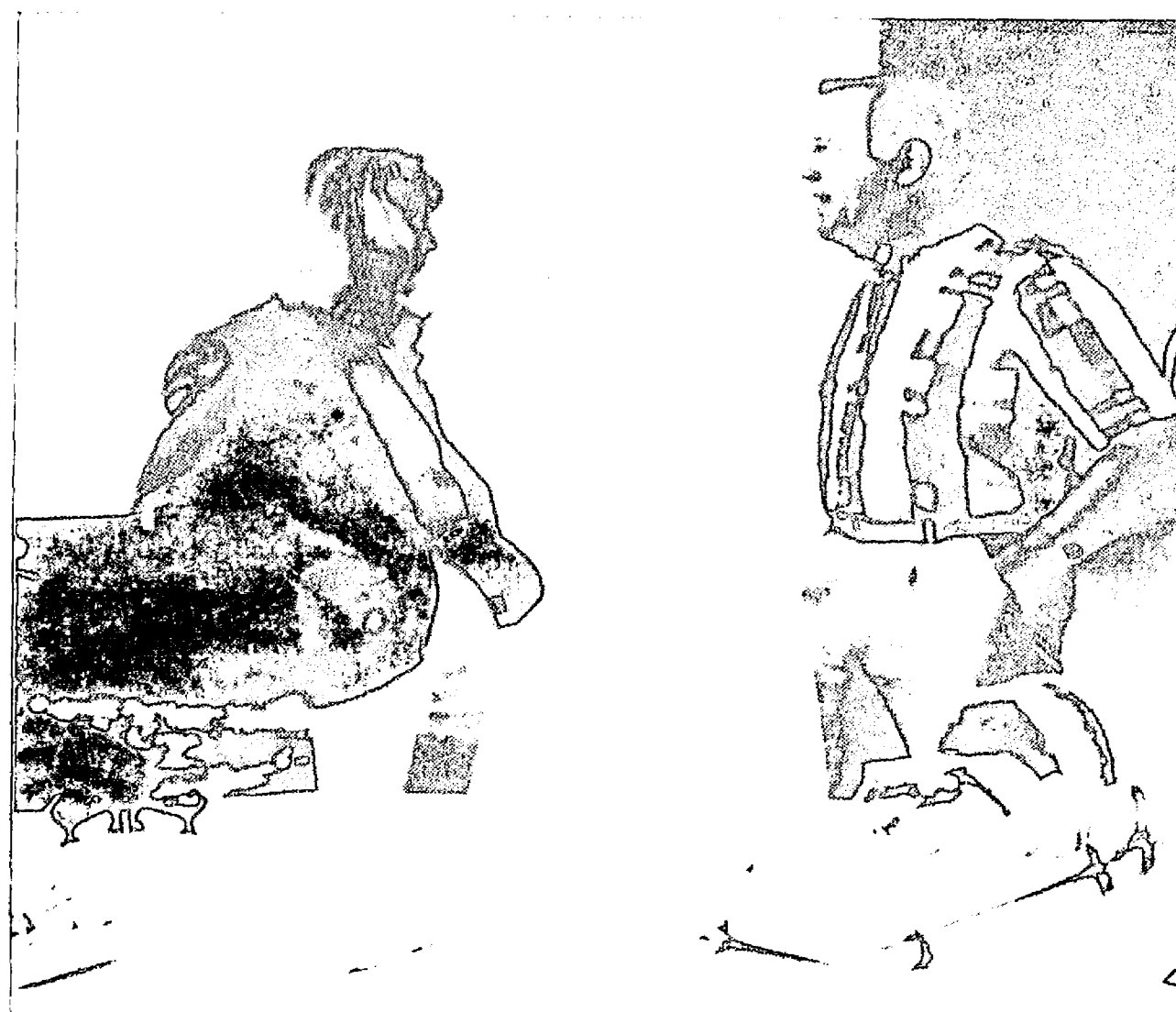
"The (Multiple Listing Service) reported sales \$2.5-million above last year," Adamson said.

As fast as some families move out, others are waiting to move in, Gladden said.

To justify the increase, Gladden noted that:

The district experienced a loss of 3.9 percent in students from the fortieth day count to the 160th day. The usual percentage is between 6-8 percent.

## \$50,000 study derails Ironhorse Railroad plans

The "little engine that could" crawled up the mountain chugging. "I think I can, I think I can," and it'll only cost between \$100-150-million.

The Ironhorse Railroad has really blossomed, according to owner Dick Weber as he spoke before the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce recently. He also said his project was adopted by the state department of tourism.

Various state representatives of the tourism department weren't sure what Weber meant by "adopt."

"I don't think we have enough information to make a stand on it," said Marsha Adams, deputy secretary. "I can't think of anything that we have adopted. We support things I have heard about the Ironhorse Railroad, but we certainly don't have any plans to do anything with it at this point."

Adams said Weber had been up in Santa Fe to see tourism director Michael Cerletti and drop off a package, but that no commitments were made.

Most residents agree a steam-powered locomotive chugging through the mountains would be a

major tourist draw, although there has been no historical precedent in the Ruidoso area.

However, an economic study, using the best of four alternatives to attract private funds for the Ironhorse Railroad, produced a bleak picture, one that caused the blossom to wilt.

Under no scenario was the project standing alone able to service debt financing, wrote Robert Grossberger, Jr., co-author of an Economic and Engineering Feasibility Assessment of the Proposed Ironhorse Railroad for Lincoln County.

The two-part feasibility study, costing more than \$100,000, was completed last December. It was prepared by the Lincoln County Transportation Board (LCTB) and the New Mexico Department of Transportation. The study found that the project would not be economically viable.

But Weber is pushing forward with his dream, and he wants

others to invest in that dream.

The study draws several conclusions, softly stated, but with realistic bottom lines.

From the economic study:

"Finally, although the project seems to have merit from an economic development standpoint, the realities of government financial assistance are slight. The an-

certainty associated with a project of this nature and the low unemployment rate in Lincoln County combined with the limited budgets of government may make public

sector financing difficult to secure."

That overview, government financing slight, public financing difficult, seems a polite way of saying, the chances of obtaining enough money are slim and almost none.

The economic report pointed to a low population base as critical.

"Urban versus rural" was perhaps the most important parameter to consider, the report reads. "A railroad with several million people within a two-hour drive will have less challenge drawing riders than one in the middle of a rural area."

According to the report, most railroad workers and managers agreed that ridership would be from 150,000 to 200,000.

## State funds prompt local contributions

A generous State of New Mexico coughed up \$40,000 to see if it was practical to build a tourist-type train route through the Ruidoso mountain area.

Ruidoso sweetened the pot with \$4,900 and the Lincoln County Economic Development Corporation loaned the project another \$8,000.

Final results of the study leaned heavily against the plan, but the project moves on anyway.

Super-salesman Dick Weber had sold Ruidoso Mayor Victor Alonso on the concept of his private non-profit Ironhorse Railroad, Inc.

Alonso was quoted in a past El Paso Times as saying, "probably one of the best ideas I've heard." Alonso said it would help diversify Ruidoso's seasonal economy.

From dream to reality was a matter of an expensive feasibility study and a raise a couple hundred million dollars to build the project.

Locally, a Lincoln County Transportation Board (LCTB) was created.

"The real motivation for forming the county transportation board came from the New Mexico Transportation Authority dangling a potential

\$40,000 feasibility study," said former Lincoln County manager Nick Pappas.

"The commission and I, as its manager, were concerned at that time that the principals of the Ironhorse (venture) were thinking a little too big in terms of cost," he said. "The commission didn't want to say no. They felt the study would give the answers."

"One of the reasons the commission balked initially was that as part of the powers of the (transportation) board is a mill levy that can be imposed."

"In the minutes, the commissioners (in 1990) made it clear that under no circumstances, never, could the transportation board impose it (a tax) to raise revenue for a railroad."

As sponsor of the transportation board, which went after the grant, the commission should have received a copy of the study when completed, Pappas said.

"I never saw the study," he said. "The commission never received one while I was there."

Pappas was dismissed as manager in January 1992.

## One man dies in mountain accident

In a freak accident last Friday, a 30-foot dead pine tree gave way causing a tree to fall on Oscar Lee Jolsanny, 25, of Mesquite, fatally killing the youth.

Rex Parker, general manager for Ski Apache, said about 16 men were working on clearing a trail for a new ski run when the accident occurred.

"The tree fell from above," Parker said. "They weren't working near it. It just came out by the roots. There weren't many roots there and it just decided at that moment to fall over," Parker said. "It didn't roll on him, it just fell down and hit him on top of the head."

Jolsanny never regained consciousness and died at the site according to Parker.

He said Jolsanny and two other men were clearing the path about 20 feet below the tree. The tree also hit another man, Auden Cariz,

breaking his leg.

Jolsanny lived in Mesquite and of his life and attended high school in Tularosa where he graduated in 1984. He was survived by his wife Bernadette, and two stepsons, Alex Egler and Michael Wahamsee.

## VANDALISM

In an unrelated incident last Friday morning, two Ruidoso teenage girls were arrested for vandalizing middle school property.

Ruidoso detective Larry Maddox said police responded to a call that the girls were spraying the outside walls of the school with a fire extinguisher.

Officers Bill Heineken, B.J. Barnes and Rocky Reynolds found the two girls, age 16 and 14, intoxicated. One is a high school student, the other is a mid school student.

Further investigation showed the mid school had been

vandalized with a large amount of graffiti.

The girls were arrested, M.D.X. and H.B. at the scene. They were charged with breaking glass. Plants were trampled and lots of whitewash used to write words that came from some city sailors' mouth, Maddox said.

It's unbelievable what they did in there, Maddox said. "The place was a real mess."

According to Maddox, principal Paula Pappas estimated the damage to be in excess of \$1200 at this point.

Damage included steel doors that had to be replaced from rock dents, electronic equipment, plants, furnishings.

Maddox said the girls were taken to the station where they confessed to the vandalism and were released in custody of their parents.

He said the case was turned over to juvenile probation officer Jane Parnell and will be referred to dis-

certainly draw visitors who might then ride the train," the report concludes.

The Ruidoso attractions listed in the report were the racetrack, motorcycle retreat, Connoisseur Classic Wine Festival, Aspenfest and two golf courses.

Other visitor attractions for Lincoln County listed in the report included Ski Apache, Smokey Bear State Park and Museum, Valley of Fires State Park, Town of Lincoln, Mescalero Apache Indian Reservations and five golf courses.

Railway lines should be built in four phases according to an engineering analysis.

The summary concludes optimistically that all routes can be built technically with enough money.

Phase 1, an estimated length of 23 miles would cost about \$32-million. It would leave the Fort Stanton Terminal and reach the Ruidoso Downs Terminal.

This route proceeds west across Fort Stanton Mesa, climbs to the top of Alto Mesa, eventually cuts south down Gavilan Canyon and on to Ruidoso Downs.

The report states: "The major problem with this route is that much of it goes through private land and also crosses several subdivisions."

A recommended alternative to phase 1 was a 17-mile route at the same cost of \$30-million that requires a 2,873-foot tunnel, but crosses less private property.

Phase two begins at Ruidoso Downs, crosses U.S. 70 by way of a trestle, cuts through Pinecliff and ends at the Inn of the Mountain

Gods.

The report said there would be significant right of way costs for Pinecliff. In all likelihood, the costs through Indian Reservation to the Inn of the Mountain Gods also would be substantial.

Cost of this 8.84 mile stretch is estimated at about \$40-million.

Phase 3 and 3-A begins at the top of Gavilan Ridge and eventually ends at Ski Apache. This would be a cog railway, vehicles are equipped with pinions that are devised to engage a rack bar mounted permanently between rails. The two phases are estimated to cost about \$20-million.

Phase 4 is a 10-mile expansion independent of the other phases. The route begins at the edge of historic Lincoln and proceeds west along the Rio Bonito to Capitán.

The report mentions favorable terrain "causing it to be the most inexpensive route to build from a construction standpoint." A \$7-million estimated cost was projected for this phase.

The study discusses length of time between destinations.

"Length of time is related to length of railroad and average train speed. A 60-mile ride may take 3 1/2 hours. In other cases a 25-mile ride may take six hours."

"Many of the consultants interviewed during the course of this study are opposed to long, excursion trains. Longer excursions requiring higher prices tend to reduce participation by families and middle income people."

The study says moving local people and tourists around town as a transportation system is unrealistic given the size of the local population and the distance that

the railroad would travel.

"Arrival and departure schedules in short time intervals for effective local transportation would be impossible."

To travel to Fort Stanton in order to take the train to Ruidoso Downs or Ski Apache for the purpose of betting on horses or skiing does not appear to be within reason.

Robert Foster, Carol Fischer and James Wichter of Southwest Technology Development Institute, New Mexico State University, were optimistic as far as engineering for the railway.

They concluded, "The Ironhorse Railroad can be built if there is sufficient financial and political backing to see the project through on a phase by phase basis."

"The project can become a reality with a significant commitment by all parties involved and the local community."

However, from an engineering viewpoint, they also concluded that the railroad was faced with a number of difficult challenges in order to become a reality.

"First, many parts of the line must traverse deep areas since typically the most desirable areas are privately-owned and are significantly improved with houses."

"Second, the railroad bed may encounter geological problems that will require additional money not foreseen in this study."

"Third, an in-depth environmental study will be required to determine the effects on wildlife and watersheds."

"Finally, the line must prove acceptable politically in some sections where it traverses in close proximity to inhabited areas."

Transportation board chairman Nancy Radziewicz had the authority to sign off on the grant without commission action when it was completed, he said.

Radziewicz said the grant never went through the Lincoln County Commission. She said the LCTB has never handled money.

"It went from the state transportation authority to the university," Radziewicz said. She said serving with her on the authority is Harold Mansell, Ginger Mangum, Jeremy Jordan, Dave Cummins, Al Junge and Chuck Rominger.

In order to set the grant in motion Weber made two stops.

On June 6, 1991, the EDCLC minutes reflect: "The Ironhorse Railroad has been awarded \$38,000 for a feasibility study. They need \$8,000 to acquire that study. The route will cover airport, to track, to Inn, to town, to Ski Apache and back to airport. They have asked EDCLC to make a \$8,000 donation. The \$8,000 is to be reimbursed to EDCLC in whole or in part by another mechanism that has the funds available. We should receive the fund within 60 days."

"President (Ron) Paulger reported that the Village of Ruidoso would fund us immediately and we will have the funds to operate though we could use some of the reserves until the refund is received."

According to new EDCLC executive director Karen Kopp, the \$8,000 loan has never been repaid.

Scott Shafer noted that it would be the first time such an action would be taken by EDCLC. Paulger noted the impressiveness of the state commitment.

Steve Stroud made the motion to approve the disbursement of \$8,000 to the Ironhorse Railroad. Pat Huey seconded the motion. Paulger called for the vote and Shafer voted against the loan because he said it was precedent setting.

In August, Weber told the Ruidoso Village Council that the total cost of the studies would be about \$60,000, for what he thought was a \$60-million to \$90-million venture.

Weber said he needed \$15,000 initial seed money. He said he needed \$4,900 immediately and the balance would be contingent upon approval of the study by the governing body.

Weber, last week, said that at the time he was applying for state funds, the state demanded a great deal of data in preparation for the request of the grant.

A village check for \$4,900 sent to New Mexico State University was in turn given to Robert E. Grassberger for freeing his time to prepare for the grant application.

According to Dr. Robert Coppedge, the University received no money from this transaction.

During that August council meeting, Councilor Al Junge declared a financial interest in the Ironhorse Railroad, Inc., and stated that he would abstain from voting. However, the rest of the councilors allowed him to vote and Weber was funded.

Coppedge, extension economist at NMSU, is Grassberger's boss.

Asked about the \$4,900 from the village, Coppedge said he believed that was part of the \$8,000.

"It's not \$12,000 or so," he said.

Coppedge said the total project was \$48,000.

"About \$40,000 came from the state. About \$8,000 came from various sources, from the Village of Ruidoso, if not all of it. But I know the Economic Development was in there at some point and there was some mixup on what was the proper way to funnel the money. But the total project was \$48,000," Coppedge said.

He said the money was then split, about 50-50 in money between the economic unit and the engineering unit.

Coppedge was asked if the university got a certain percentage of that money.

He said under certain types of contracts, there was an overhead charge.

"In this particular case, as I recall it, zero," he said.

Grassberger received about \$24,000 and engineers Robert E. Foster, Carol Fischer and James Wichter received \$24,000. According to a check stub from the Village of Ruidoso, Grassberger also received another \$4,900.

## RR fundraisers go full steam ahead

The spirit of a man in love with railroads is legend.

Therefore, a less than optimistic feasibility study for his Ironhorse Railroad in Lincoln County has not slowed the energy of local enterpriser Dick Weber.

He told the local chamber recently that Ironhorse plans were "blossoming" and although the total ticket may be high, approaching \$200-million, he set one mechanism for fund raising in place last year, donations.

"We have printed a 'funding' brochure to solicit tax exempt donations and have designed a memorial plaque system to encourage dona-

tions," Weber wrote.

"There appears to be an increasing number of organizations and churches who are refusing to allow a plaque or donated items in memory of a loved one. The Ironhorse Railroad Foundation believes that contributions deserve to be acknowledged."

"On large gifts, such as the purchase of a locomotive, the donor will be provided with a certificate and photo of the gift, a valet stand and trainmaster's uniform with actual badge, to be displayed in the giver's home or office."

Weber lists the cost of a gift locomotive at \$575,000. Smaller donations will be accepted according to Weber.

"Gifts as small as \$60 will carry a donor's

name and the person remembered so that even a child can contribute to the project in memory of a favorite relative," he writes.

Weber's donation gift list includes: engines, \$575,000 each; passenger cars, \$115,000 each; dining cars, \$212,000 each; cabooses, \$97,500 each; club cars, \$143,000 each; main terminal, \$250,000 and ticket station/waiting rooms, \$75,000 each.

The total pricetag of the proposed gift list at last year's rates was about \$10-million. Costs may have gone up.

Weber wrote that individual contributions will be gratefully accepted and can be made payable to Ironhorse Railroad Foundation, Inc., P. O. Box 900, Ruidoso NM 88345.

—Special education students on the October projection already have increased to the numbers being requested and live within the district.

—The fifth grade increased enrollment between the two counting periods.

—The kindergarten registration drew 120 students without the Mescalero Reservation. Trends indicate the enrollment will be 170 plus.

—Since September 1991, the district has added one-half of a kinder-

garten teacher, one first grade teacher, one middle school teacher, a kindergarten aide, a special education aide and a secretarial position at the middle school.

—The district passed a \$5.5-million bond issue last November for additions and a new elementary school.

—Assessed valuation for our district has increased an estimated \$28-million.

—Mescalero district officials want to enter a joint powers agreement with Ruidoso to serve three and four-year-old developmentally disabled students, children not reflected in the previous estimate.

### Little Hill Top Darling

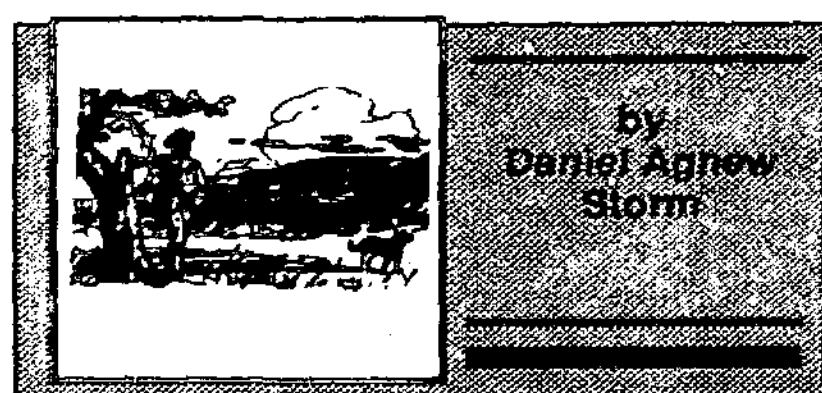

We call her "Hill Top Darling" because she was born up on the top of the hill, and is the darling of the herd, the first heifer calf of the year.

Right now during the warmest time of the day, the cows lying out on Blue Bird meadow — some in the sun and some with shade. You look for Hill Top Darling and there she is her white face just barely showing above the tall grass. Now she stretches out on her side soaking in the sun. And then after a while going over and lying in the shade of a cedar tree—enjoying to the full this story-book day of June, in sunshine and shadow.

# Taffeta is one of many homeless animals

Do it now!  
The Lincoln County Humane Society is crowded to its rafters with dogs. If you've been thinking about adopting a pet, drive down to the shelter on Gavilan Canyon Road and choose from among the more than 70 animals looking for new homes.

One of the friendly temporary residents of the shelter is Taffeta, a white wire-hair terrier mix with taffy-color accents on the tips of her ears and down her back.

She's been waiting for the past two months for someone to walk down the aisle, stop at the cage she shares and pick her as their new companion.

"Taffeta is about one year old and is really good with other dogs and with kids," said shelter manager Randy Basch. "She appears to be housebroken, is very out-going and loving."

Someone interested in Taffeta's future will pay for her spaying, the

greatest expense connected to adoption. All animals adopted from the shelter must be spayed or neutered to ensure they do not produce more litters of unwanted puppies or kittens, which then may have to be killed.

The death of nearly every dog or cat that is destroyed at the shelter is linked to an uncaring or negligent owner. Pet owners who fail to spay or neuter their animals often dump the product of that failure, innocent kittens and puppies, on the shelter. Sometimes, they blame the female and discard her at the shelter too.

Others just walk away from their animals or allow them to run loose, playing hit or miss with cars and trying to avoid angry homeowners who consider strays fair game for target practice.

The majority of owners who leave litters at the shelter are not willing to keep them 10 days more to let immunizations against distemper and parvo take effect, Basch said.

Although he gives the shots as soon as the young animals arrive, if they stay in the shelter during that unprotected period, they often die from one of the merciless diseases.

Foster homes are one way to give puppies a better chance at life, Basch said. The homes provide 10 days to two weeks of care for litters. The animals then are returned to the shelter to be put up for adoption. Basch is looking for more foster homes, because the number of litters increase dramatically in the summer.

The more crowded the shelter, the greater chance of infection. With more than 70 animals housed in 24 inside kennels, three quarantine cages and several outside runs, Basch is at the point where he soon will be forced to destroy some of the affectionate and attractive animals.

In the cattery next to the dog shelter are litters of six week old tabby kittens and Siamese crosses with blue eyes and the traditional markings.

Several dramatic-looking adult cats also are waiting for new homes including a dark mottled gray, orange tabbys, tiger striped and four pure black ranging from long hair to moon-faced toms and a slender young female.

Besides donating to the spay and neuter fund, sponsoring a particular animal for alteration or acting as a foster home, people who care about abandoned dogs and cats can help by visiting the shelter and keeping them socialized (and more fit for adoption) through walks and play.

George M. Payne and his son, who own a lawn and tree trimming service in Hondo, volunteered their time and equipment to trim all of the weeds around the shelter and make it look more inviting.

## California man heads the San Andres refuge

Steve Berendzen has been named refuge manager for the San Andres National Refuge by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services.

The refuge lies within the boundaries of the White Sands Missile Range and is closed to public access.

Southwest Regional Director Michael J. Spear said Berendzen previously served as assistant manager for the six satellite refuges of the San Francisco Bay National Wildlife Refuge. At White Sands, he is replacing Patty Hoban, who was transferred to the service's office in Albuquerque.

As manager of the 57,215-acre refuge, Berendzen will be responsible for the protection and management of habitat for a remnant desert bighorn sheep population that inhabits the area. He also

will ensure that the 50-year-old refuge is managed to provide important desert habitat for mule deer, quail, cougar and many other species of wildlife.

Berendzen received a bachelor of science degree in wildlife biology from the University of Missouri and a master degree from the University of Massachusetts before being hired by the service in Hawaii, where he was stationed for three years. He conducted studies on endangered waterbird species on wetland refuges there.

"I've always had an interest in experiencing the desert Southwest," Berendzen said. "I'm looking forward to the challenging opportunities of the San Andres refuge."

He will be joined by his wife, Tanda, and daughter, Kyla.

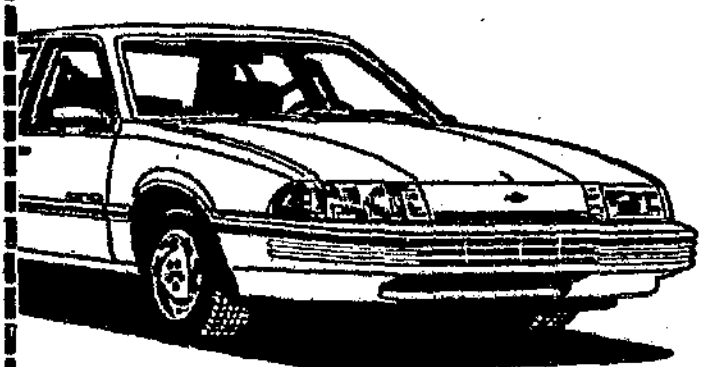

Emma Lou Evertson has also joined the board as an advisory

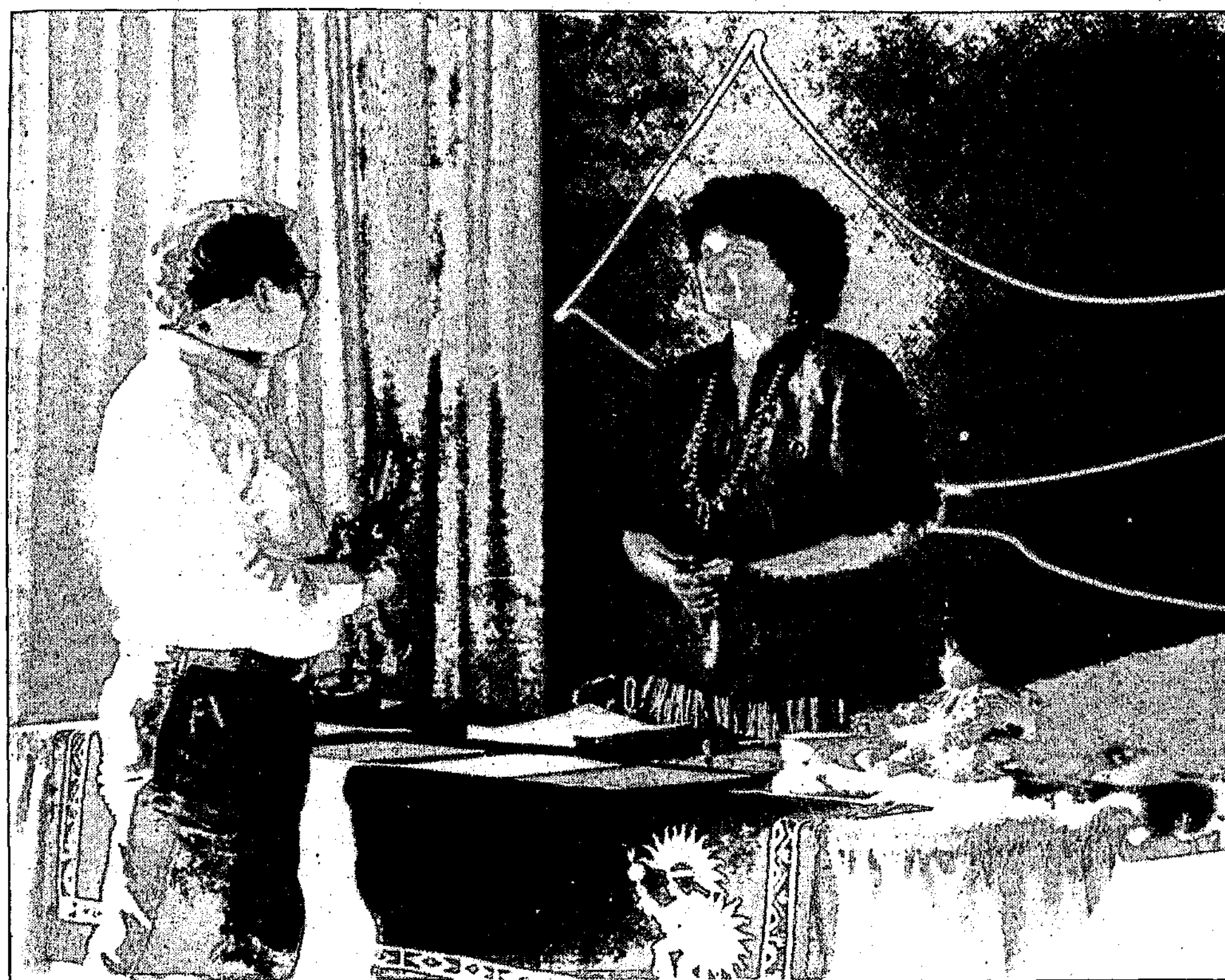

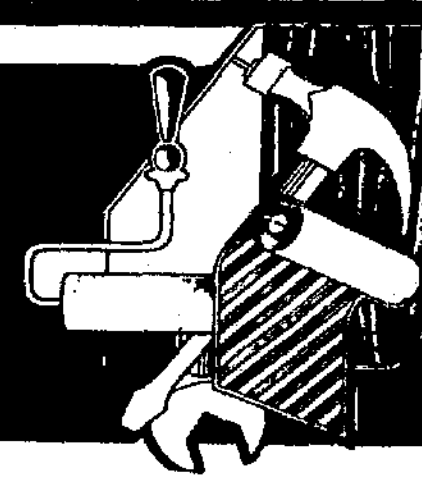

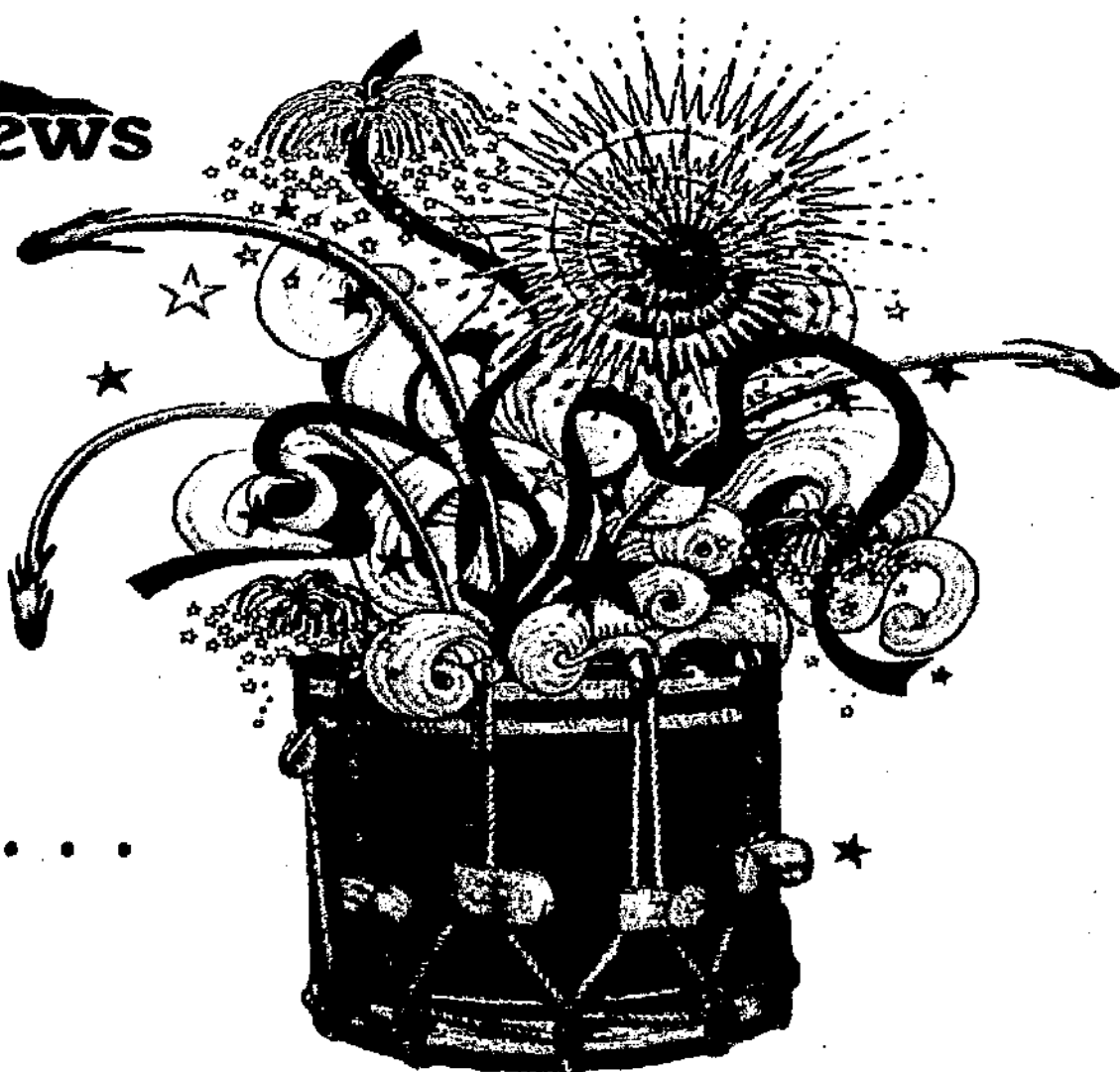

## Hondo looks at soccer for fall

The Hondo High School may also be hitting the soccer field this fall, but as a substitute for football, not as an alternative.

Cheryl Bowman, athletic director for Hondo, said the school board has been considering changing to soccer, instead of football, but has not made a final decision on the issue. The Hondo Eagles are still on schedule to play six-man football, but Bowman said the board seems to be in favor of switching to soccer and should make a decision within a month.

The main reason for switching to soccer is that in a small school the eighth and ninth graders play on the varsity and have to go up against juniors and seniors. She said it is frustrating for these young kids to go up against these older players. In soccer the differences in abilities is not as drastic as in football.

Many kids in Hondo compete in the local and regional soccer leagues and are very competitive. They start at a young age in soccer, but for many the eighth grade is their first opportunity to play football, Bowman said. One Hondo player, Isaac Sanchez, has even qualified to play in the Portsmouth Cup in England in late July.

The school shouldn't have any problem finding teams to play, but they will need to purchase some equipment for soccer, Bowman said.

## Soccer boosters make plans for complex

Although getting approval from the Ruidoso School Board was a big hurdle for the county soccer league, there is much more work to do for the group to accomplish its long term goals.

This fall Ruidoso High School will be represented by a boys and girls co-ed soccer club, which will be financially supported by a booster club but administered through the school system. The approval by the school board Tuesday night came about after a soccer work group was formed at a public information meeting in April. The work group stayed in contact with Superintendent Mike Gladden on its plans and began raising funds for the club.

Dean Hood was named president of the work group with Roy Seay as vice president and Scott Schrader as secretary. With the approval Seay said this group is in the process of changing to a booster club that will provide whatever the team needs. The immediate goal of the club will be to get everything ready to play soccer on Horton field this fall, such as deciding what type of goals they want to use.

The group was pleased and surprised that the school board approved the program so quickly, he said. It was made clear before the approval, though, that the high

school soccer club is now a school program, and all they can do is support it, Seay said.

The biggest difference this fall when the kids take to the soccer field as a high school team, instead of a team on a county league, is that they will have opponents their same age and size to play. Until this year the Ruidoso players had to play men's teams or all-star teams because high school teams had a regular schedule. It's hard to play teams of that calibre and do well, Seay said. He said the team that will play this fall should have eight seniors on it who were members of an undefeated under 15-years-old team, so they should be fairly competitive, although they won't be eligible for district or state titles.

About 40 high schools in the state have varsity and junior varsity soccer. Seay said many teams in the eastern part of the state will be glad to see Ruidoso start playing high school soccer because there aren't many 3 AAA schools in this area.

Hood will work with athletic director Ronny Maskew to schedule games for this season, but the school will probably have sole responsibility for it next year. They

will be sure games won't conflict with other activities that may be scheduled for the field. The decision on who will be the coach is up to the school board, Seay said.

Although the financial backing for the first three years will come from the booster club, the money will be put in an activities account at the school to pay for the coach and other expenses. The group recently raised more than \$1,000 through a benefit bingo night, and they plan to do another one in July.

The group still has its eyes on accomplishing some long term goals as well such as developing a White Mountain Sports Complex for soccer, softball and baseball teams to play on. The soccer teams are already practicing on the fields at White Mountain Schools, but Seay said they would like to get a field in for baseball with a temporary outfield fence that can be moved to have the soccer field.

A work group for baseball was also formed at the public meeting but Seay and the others on the soccer committee are also very interested in helping a baseball team get started too. Since there are more boys sports than girls the next step would be to try to start a girls softball team as soon as possible. The

final phase of additions would be a boys baseball team, he said.

Seay said they have been working with principals Frank Cannella and Don Weems on plans for the White Mountain Sports Complex. To complete the project they need such items as fences, concrete, cinder blocks, lighting poles and sprinkler heads. Some equipment

and work has been donated, but they still need more supplies and people willing to do the work, he said. The school will continue to clean and mow the area of the complex.

They already have restrooms in the area, but a field house is also needed to keep equipment in. Seay pointed out this area at White Mountain is the only place big enough for a regulation New Mexico Activities Association baseball field.

The area has a T-ball and little league baseball program for children up to the age of 15, but they don't have any teams available after that. Soccer players also had to go out of Ruidoso to continue to play after little leagues. This year the county league had four traveling teams with one, the under-12, qualifying for the first time to play in the state cup tournament.

## Everything you wanted to know about rattlesnakes but were afraid to ask

It's that time of year again. Warm weather is bringing out some critters that most people just don't want to meet. Probably the highest on the list are snakes, especially the dangerous kind like rattlesnakes.

Over the years, because little was known about rattlers, there have been numerous legends that people tend to accept as facts about rattlesnakes. To learn more about rattlesnakes, let's first take a little test.

True or False?

You can tell the age of a rattlesnake by counting its rattles.

Rattlesnakes always rattle before they strike.

Rattlesnakes can't swim.

Rattlesnakes have acute hearing.

A rattlesnake can strike the full length of its body.

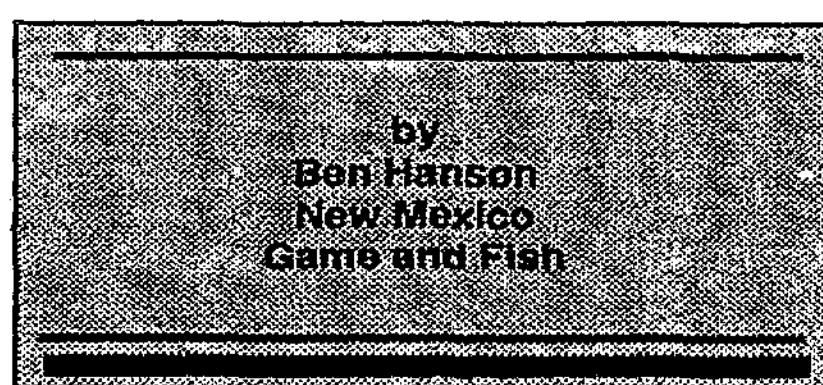
A rope surrounding a campsite will keep rattlesnakes away.

Anyone bitten by a rattlesnake will die.

Newborn rattlesnakes are harmless.

Even though most of the above statements are commonly believed about rattlesnakes, they are all false. Let's look at some of the facts about rattlers and maybe relieve some of the fear shrouding these reptiles.

At birth, baby rattlesnakes have one button or rattle that it not exposed until it sheds its skin the first time about ten days after birth. Then, each time it sheds its skin it adds another rattle. In some areas of the country this occurs once or twice each year, but in southern areas it may be as high as four or five times a year. In addition, few rattlesnakes are able to keep their string of rattles intact. They often lose segments due to normal wear and tear, so a snake with over 10 rattles is very rare even though it may be over 20 years old.

A coiled rattlesnake may or may not "buzz" before it strikes. Why a snake rattles is not fully understood, but they don't always rattle. The best guess is that buzzing is a defense mechanism that they developed to keep from being stepped on by larger animals, such as the 100 million bison that once roamed the plains.

Rattlesnakes, like all other snakes have dry scales, they are not slippery or slimy. Scales combined with muscular action push against the ground to move the snake, and contrary to popular belief they can swim and crawl easily over ropes around camps. One way to tell if a swimming snake is a rattler is to look for the rattle, it holds them above the water when it swims.

Rattlers are pit vipers and have infrared-heat-sensing pits located between the nostrils and eyes. New studies suggest that these organs are used to detect predators and help supply information on whether the predator is small enough to be scared away, or big enough that the snake would be better off retreating (like in most cases with people). In the past it was believed that heat sensing was used basically to locate prey, but the new study suggest this is secondary to defense. In reality snakes trail their prey down using smell. The forked

tongue goes out, touches the ground, then retreats into little sensory holes in the roof of the snake's mouth so it "smells". These are the snake's primary tools, because its vision is poorly developed and hearing is almost nonexistent.

Before striking, a rattlesnake normally coils into an S shape with its head and neck pointed at the target. They can only strike a distance of 1/3 to 1/2 of their length. They open their mouth before striking and the hypodermic like fangs swing out to inject the venom.

The venom injected is actually modified saliva that contains many digestive enzymes. Even newborn rattlers are able to inject a small amount of venom. Venom quickly kills its prey by breaking down blood cells and body tissues. It kills through internal bleeding by stopping blood clotting, by shock, and kidney or respiratory failure. This may happen quickly in small animals, but takes time in humans. That's the reason that even though about 8,000 people are bitten by poisonous snakes each year in the U.S. only 10 to 15 die. The major threat of snakebite to people is shock. The "I've been bitten by a rattler so I'm going to die." syndrome.

Remember you have a better chance of drowning in a bathtub than dying from snakebite. The best thing to do is to keep calm and get to a doctor. Even if it may take a long time to get to the doctor, you are not likely to die.

Fear of rattlesnakes has really created myths and legends. Rattlers aren't super-human and are not an animal to be highly feared. It is also not necessary to kill them on sight, they have their place, just give them some space.

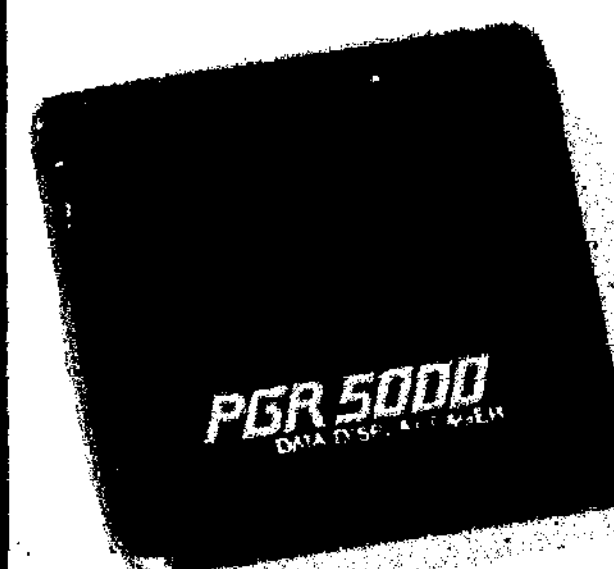

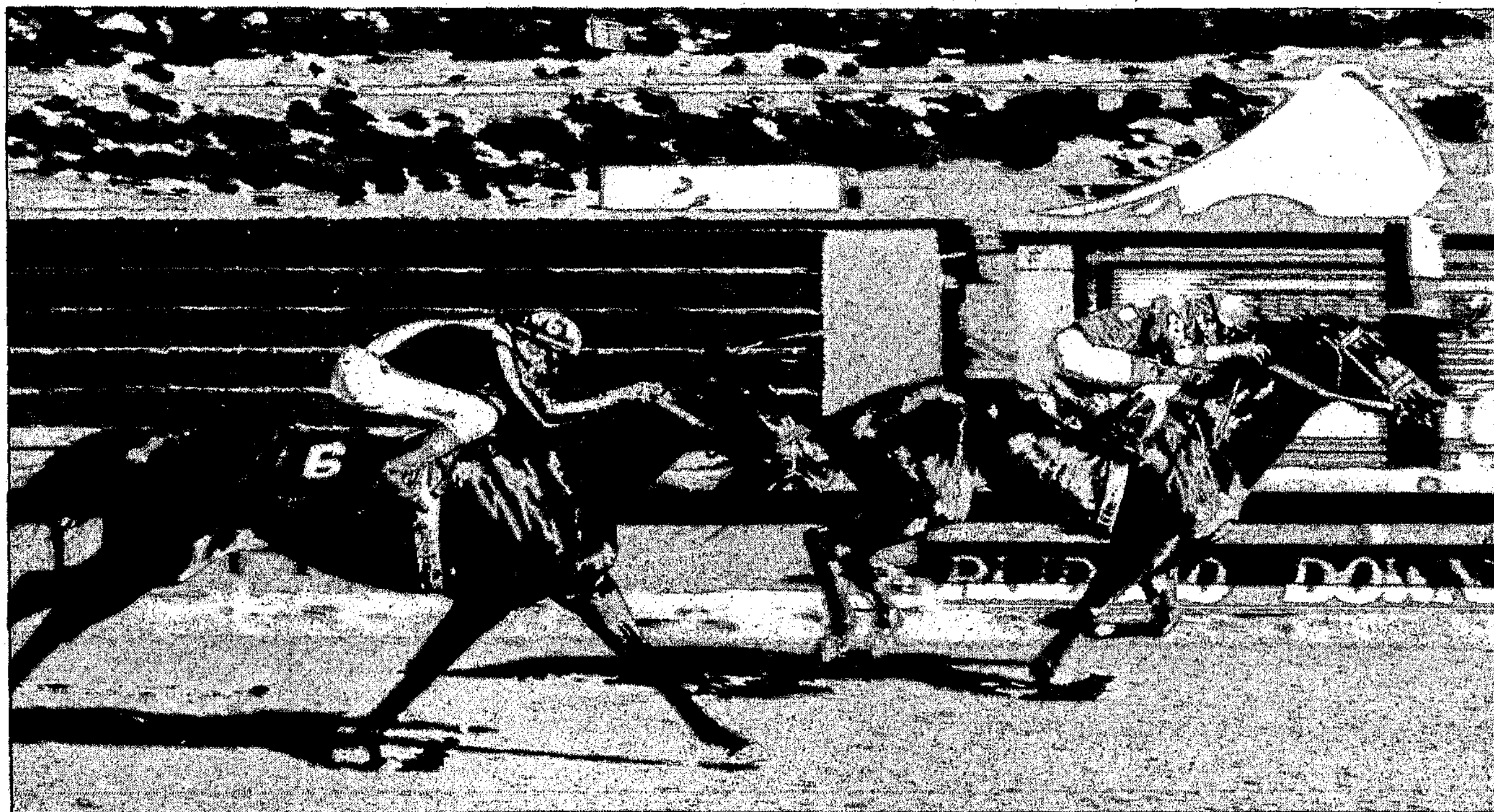

\$15,000-added Apache Mescalero Handicap at Ruidoso Downs Race Track.

### Last Don B. steals victory in Mescalero Apache Handicap

Like many other desert dwellers, Last Don B. thrives in the cool mountains of Ruidoso and he proved it by winning Saturday's \$10,000 Mescalero Apache Handicap at Ruidoso Downs.

Last Don B. and jockey Manny Ortiz won the six-furlong race by running off the pace then stealing the lead in the final furlongs. Favorite Justa Stepahead also made a late move in the final furlongs, but could not match the late charge initiated by Last Don B.

The time for the six-furlongs matched the six-furlong clocking set in the eighth race, 1:09.4, and was the fastest six-furlong posted at Ruidoso Downs in three years.

Owned by Leonard Monti Jr. of Phoenix, Arizona, Last Don B. paid \$10.20 to show, \$5.40 to place and \$3.80 to show.

Justa Stepahead paid \$4.20 and \$3.80. Talent Connection finished third and paid \$3.40. Second-favorite Christian Don set the early pace, but faded down the stretch to

finish sixth.

Trainer Lynda Tanner had said earlier that she had considered giving the 6-year-old gelding a rest over the summer, but will probably keep the horse in training as long as he runs well. She added that Last Don B. raced all winter and spring at Turf Paradise in Phoenix and had been tailing off before moving to the mountains.

"We thought he was done toward the end of Phoenix," said Tanner. "But he just seems to get a new lease on life when he gets up here in the cooler air. We may change his racing program around in the future where we race him here in the summer and rest him in the winter."

Last Don B. is two for two at Ruidoso Downs this summer, having also won the Governor's Handicap in May.

Ontrack attendance was 3,670 with total attendance at 4,358.

Ontrack handle was \$319,664, with total handle at \$457,002.

### Top jockey Glen Murphy is glad to be back in the saddle again

Glen Murphy had a stellar racing season in 1991. The 24-year-old Texan was the number one jockey at New Mexico's Sunland Park and Ruidoso Downs racetracks.

Rather than return to Sunland Park this past spring, Murphy opted to play his trade at Trinity Meadows race track in Weatherford, Texas. He had no trouble adjusting to Trinity Meadows. His early momentum indicated that he would have another successful year in 1992. That is, until his carefree spring came to a frightful halt one March afternoon.

Murphy was the second-leading jockey at Trinity Meadows racetrack when his horse tripped and fell in a race March 24. By that evening, the doctors at Harris Memorial Hospital in Fort Worth, Texas, diagnosed Murphy's back as broken at the T6 and T7 vertebrae.

Luckily, there was no spinal cord damage. He also suffered a collapsed lung.

"I guess if I was going to break my back, I broke it in the right place," Murphy reminisced one morning last week while galloping horses in preparation for his comeback at Ruidoso Downs. "Had I broke something in my lower back, my recovery may have been prolonged. Race riding puts more stress on the lower than upper back."

Murphy's accident occurred when a horse on his inside moved outward and another horse on his outside came inward making for a tight situation for Murphy and his mount.

"We clipped heels and we went down," he recalled. "Everything happened so fast I didn't have time to be scared. Later the reality hit

me that it (the fall) could have ended my life or left me paralyzed."

Murphy's youth, his mother's love and attention, and determination has accelerated the jockey's recovery and Murphy expects to be back race riding this week.

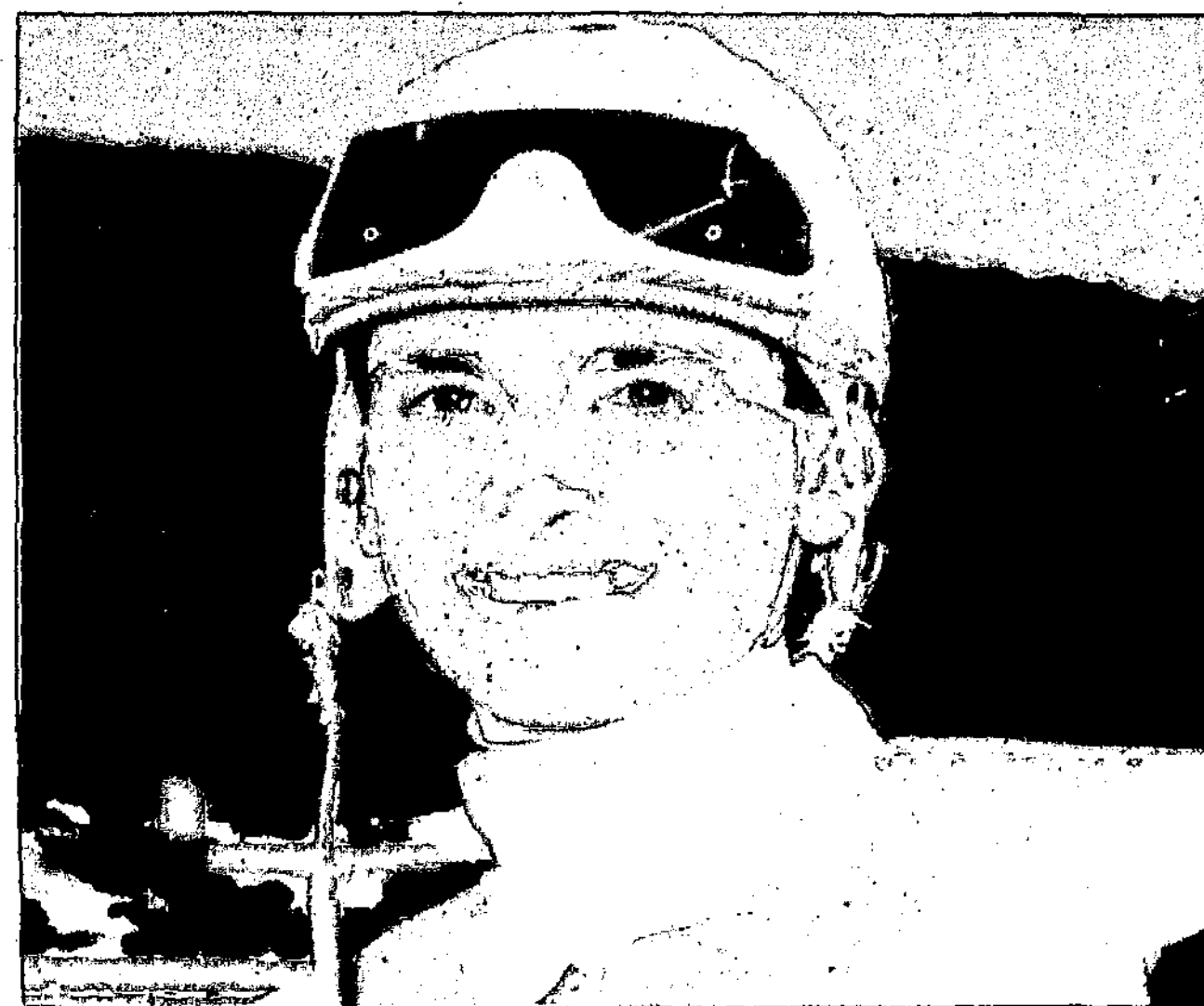
"Some people might not want to go back to riding after a wreck like mine, but I love to race," said Murphy, who started riding racing when he was 16. "I have been galloping in the mornings and look forward to riding races again."

Murphy claims that Ruidoso Downs is his favorite racetrack. He ended the 1991 season with 103 wins, which tied the all-time Ruidoso Downs record set by Joe Martinez in 1990. He annexed 64 wins in the first 40 days of the 1991 season, an all-time record for number of wins at the halfway point in a Ruidoso Downs' season. At sea-

son's end, Murphy ranked first on Thoroughbreds with 71 wins and second on Quarter Horses with 32, behind leader Jacky Martin's 41 wins.

"I'm not looking to win the riding title again, not yet anyway," he said. "It's going to take some rides to get my timing back and I'll have to prove myself again so I can get the mounts. It's never easy, no matter who you are, to come into the middle of a meet and pick up mounts. It's a struggle because trainers have already committed to other riders."

But Murphy won a lot of races for a lot of trainers in the past and he is confident some of those trainers will give him a mount or two. It should be just a matter of time before Murphy will be back on track in the Ruidoso Downs' jockey standings.

### Ruidoso Downs racing fans get their money's worth during action-packed weekend on track

#### Thursday

Longshot Well Naturally's win in the eighth race at Ruidoso Downs Thursday resulted in a Trifecta payoff of more than \$10,000 for a \$1 bet.

The 45-1 shot won the 5 1/2-furlong race by a neck over 4-5 shot I'm Your Gal. Trained by Johnnie Burke and ridden by Flavio Martinez, Naturally Well paid \$92.40 to win on a \$2 bet, 29.60 to place and \$12.80 to show. I'm Your Gal returned \$4.30 and \$3. Resistable Impulse was third and paid \$10.60. The 10-8 quinella paid \$101.40, the 10-8-7 trifecta paid \$21,064.00, but there was only one \$1 ticket sold on the combination worth, \$10,553.20.

As her odds indicated, Well Naturally caught a lot of race fans by surprise. The 7-year-old mare hadn't run closer than third, but once, in her last nine races. Trainer Johnnie Burke said the mare's reversal of form might be at-

tributed to her overcoming an injury.

"This mare was a decent runner when she was younger," Burke said following the race. "But last year she got seriously hurt on a hot walking machine. One of the poles (iron) broke loose and fell on her severely jamming her withers. It was so bad we almost put her to sleep."

Burke said the injury bothers the mare some days and not on others.

"We never know for sure how she's going to race," Burke said.

Well Naturally was one of four horses Flavio Martinez rode to victory Thursday. Martinez, currently Ruidoso Downs' leading jockey, also won the third race on More Than Promises, the fourth race on Bell's Blues, and the ninth race on Angenante.

Martinez, who also won four races last Friday, won six races in a day at Phoenix's Turf Paradise two years ago.

#### Friday

Despite a torrid early pace, Lord Everett raced wire to wire to win Friday's feature race at Ruidoso Downs.

Lord Everett and jockey John Cushing set fractions of .23 seconds for the first quarter mile, 40.4 seconds for the half mile, 1:12.1 for the three quarters and 1:32.4 for the 7 1/2 furlongs.

"I thought we were going slower than we were because my horse was well within himself," said Lord Everett's jockey John Cushing. "When we turned for home I asked my horse for more, but he didn't have it. I thought we were dead, but I guess the others were more dead."

Trained by Joel Marr and owned by Marr and Bill Voss of Tularosa, Lord Everett paid \$8.80 to win, \$5.60 to \$5.40 to show. Cupid's Catcher ran second and paid \$5.60 and \$4.80 and K.K.'s Choke paid \$7.80 for third.

The favorite, Cajun Lass, tried to go with Lord Everett from the start, but couldn't hold on and faded to sixth.

"Those fractions were just to fast for my horse," said Flavio Martinez who rode Cajun Lass. "She's a temperamental horse who likes to run on the front and when she couldn't get the lead she quit."

On track attendance was at 2,148 with total attendance at 2,691.

On track handle was \$163,144, for a total handle of \$270,636.

#### Sunday

Six To Five ran like his name indicated to win Sunday's \$20,000-

added Zia Handicap for New Mexico-bred quarter horses at Ruidoso Downs.

Sent off by the betting public as the even-money favorite, Six To Five ran down leader Sitting On Native in the final strides to win

the 400-yard race by half-a-length. Ridden by Larry Chavez, Six To Five covered the 400 yards in 20 seconds. Sitting On Native broke from the gate a length ahead of the rest of the field, but was unable to withstand Six To Five's challenge and finished second.

Real Bar Forth finished third a half length back.

Although the betting public lent its support to the big gray colt, Six To Five's trainer Jimmy Jones had his doubts in the final moments before the featured 11th race.

"I thought the horse had a chance to win, but then he warmed up pretty flat (dull)," said Jones. "He's usually more on the muscle in the post parade. Had he been sharp, he would have won by more."

Jones thought perhaps the trip down from Albuquerque, where the horse was stabled, may have tired his trainee.

Six To Five's victory boosts the colt's record to 10 wins in 21 races for earnings of more than \$150,000.

Owned by Steve Duran and Jesse Gonzales of Santa Fe, Six To Five returned \$4.20 to win, \$3 to place and \$2.40 to show. Sitting On Native paid \$3.80 and \$2.80 and Real Bar Forth paid \$3.

For the seventh-consecutive racing day the twin trifecta remained elusive allowing for a \$31,383 carryover for Thursday's race card. With Thursday's twin trifecta pool added, the final pool could surpass \$40,000.

### Holyfield match to be televised at Sports Theater

Ruidoso Downs' Sports Theater will televise the World Heavyweight Championship fight between Evander Holyfield and Larry Holmes.

Undisputed World Heavyweight Champion Evander Holyfield will risk boxing's most coveted crown on Friday, June 19, when he takes on former Heavyweight Champion Larry Holmes.

The fight will be hosted by Caesars Palace in Las Vegas.

Southwest boxing fans will be able to view the 12-round fight live on the Sports Theater's large-screen televisions. Three other fights will also be televised including the NABF Welterweight

Championship Bout between Roger Turner Lansing and Luis Ramon "Yori Boy" Campas.

Sport Theater doors open at 6:30 p.m. with the first fight beginning at 7 p.m. The Holyfield-Hollander championship bout is scheduled to begin about 9:30 p.m. Tickets are \$10 and may be purchased in advance at the Ruidoso Downs' Race Track.

The Sports Theater is located one-half mile east of the track.

Holyfield, the 29-year-old unbeaten heavyweight king, will be making his third title defense since flattening James "Buster Douglas" in 1990. Holyfield won a unanimous decision over former Heavyweight

Champion George Foreman in Atlantic City last April and stopped Bert Cooper with a seventh-round knockout last November.

Holmes, 42, won the World Heavy Championship in 1978 at Caesars Palace with a 15-round split-decision over Ken Norton. Successful in 20 title fights, Holmes ended his career September 1985, after reigning supreme for almost eight years. It was Michael Spinks who toppled Holmes from his reign.

Holmes retired from boxing in 1988, only to return in 1991. Since returning to the ring, Holmes has won six consecutive comeback fights.

### The voice of horse racing, Harry Henson, dies at his El Paso, Texas, home

Veteran horse race announcer Harry Henson died early Thursday at his home in El Paso, Texas. He was 78.

Henson called the horse races at Sunland Park in El Paso and Hollywood Park in Los Angeles from the early 1960s through 1982. He called his first race at Puyallup Fair in Renton, Wash. in 1938. He also called races at Washington's Longacres and Portland Meadows racetracks, and at Illinois' Arlington, Washington and Balmoral racetracks. He retired from announcing

when he left Hollywood Park in 1982.

Henson, known as the "Voice of Racing" for more than 20 years, was famous for his clear and articulate calls as well as his accuracy. His call was a benchmark by which other announcers patterned themselves.

Henson called the famous match race between Swaps and Nashua at Washington Park in 1955 on CBS Radio.

Hollywood Park, one of the nation's top racetracks, recognized Henson's accomplishments

in 1991 when management renamed the Debonair Stakes to the Harry Henson Stakes.

Prior to calling races, Henson rode as a professional jockey.

Henson is survived by his sons Gary and Rick. Gary has been the race caller at Longacres for more than 20 years and Rick is the general manger of The Woodlands racetrack in Kansas City.

A graveside service will be on Saturday, May 13, at 1 p.m. at Memory Gardens of the Valley Cemetery in Santa Teresa.

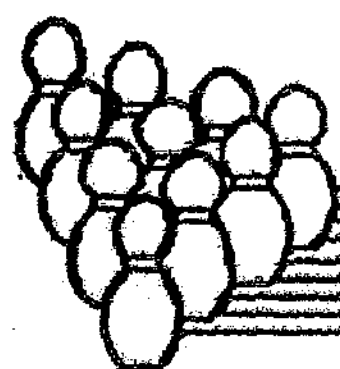
The June 21 concert will feature musicians from the El Paso area specializing in Latin and jazz selection.

He said he is also interested in forming an historical society in Ruidoso to help keep the history of the area alive. He said there should be enough old-timers in the area that they could do an oral history.

Rakocy was born in the steel town of Youngstown, Ohio, April 14, 1924, and in 1930, six-year-old Rakocy hand carried a note from school to his mother suggesting that she send him to advanced art

classes at the Butler Art Institute in Youngstown.

This marked the beginning of his long and involved love affair with art.

During a Sunday lecture Rakocy met American master John Stewart Curry, and this event helped solidify Rakocy's determination to devote himself to the pursuit of art.

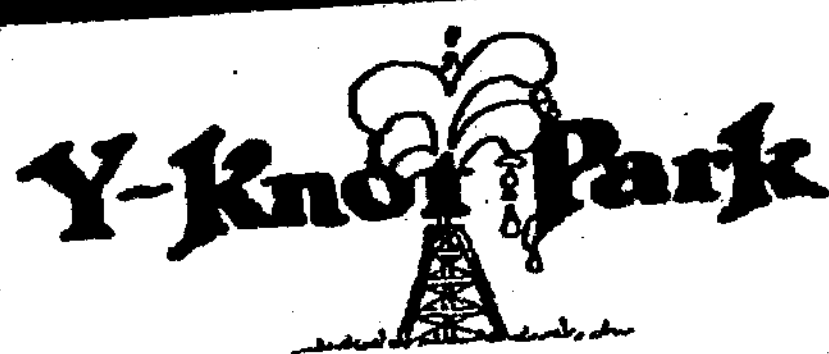
He has done this on various levels, from art director, advertising manager, studio operator, to restorer of ghost towns. Rakocy served three years in the Navy, 1943-1946, landing in the Philippines with the 54th CBs and later Marcus Island in the Central Pacific. He pursued his talents sketching G.I. buddies, often doing dozens of drawings in an evening. In 1950-51

he received a bachelor of fine arts and a masters of fine arts from Kansas City Art Institute. While in school, he married an artist, Gloria Canterbury, now his chief critic and helpmate.

He won a travel grant to study art in Italy in 1953. Upon his return, he put on a one-man-show with more than 80 large water-colors and drawings.

The artist is a consistent exhibitor in national shows where he has received many top awards. He has had one-man-showings in Kansas City, Kansas; Cleveland, Ohio; Butler Institute, and El Paso Museum of Art in El Paso, Texas. He is listed in "Who's Who in American Art."



### Businesses should pay their own way

Welfare isn't just for the poor. Government dollars are pouring into the hands and pocket books of private enterprise at an alarming rate.

It's becoming commonplace for every level of government to contract for feasibility studies over everything imaginable.

Millions of dollars are going into some deep dark hole somewhere and coming out as loose leaf books and binders filled with bits and pieces of public information that any resourceful reporter could gather in a matter of a few days.

We've said it before, but research undertaken here last week led us back down a circular primrose path of government giving money to private groups to be used for studies. And then, if the Ironhorse Railroad study is any example, the results of those expensive studies are basically ignored, while fundraising efforts go forward.

Using the Ironhorse Railroad study as an example, the state paid \$40,000, the village contributed \$4,900 and Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County "loaned" \$8,000 to spend more than \$50,000 to learn if the \$200 million railroad would be feasible. The well-paid researchers waited around that question every way they could to tell those nice folks that paid them that, sure, it could be done — BUT, it wouldn't service any debt, public funds aren't available, right of way acquisition would be impossible, engineering would be a nightmare and environmental and geological studies would be required at an additional high cost. Does that sound feasible to you? In spite of being very well-paid, the studiers just couldn't make it sound feasible.

What's next for the Ironhorse group? Apparently more fundraising, more studies and, perhaps, more public money. As long as the promoters stay out of the taxpayers' pocketbooks, we say more power to them. But, no more public funds should be used.

Meanwhile, an even more expensive study is under way to determine the feasibility of siting a high level nuclear waste storage facility in this area. How do you think a researcher will say "no way" to a group that is handing out money in the hundreds of thousands and even millions?

On the other hand, some smaller enterprises are being undertaken here this summer by entrepreneurs using their own funds and NO TAX MONEY! Three cheers for the developers of Miner's Castle Mountain Music, Rakocy's Museum and Art Gallery, the Brass Horse Barn and other enterprising business owners who put their own money to work using good old Yankee ingenuity.

### Court TV sheds light on Rodney King trial

#### TO THE EDITOR:

The Political Commentary by Al Junge in Thursday's paper contains certain errors of fact that of which your readers should be aware.

"The decision to move the trial from L.A. was made by King's lawyers."

King was not a party to the trial. King had no standing in the trial. King had no standing in the case to ask that the trial be moved.

The request for change of venue was made by the attorneys for the four officers.

That request was opposed by the prosecution which also appealed the decision to move the trial and lost the appeal. The prosecution also opposed the location the trial was moved to losing that objection on the grounds of cost (which the judge apparently considered more important than justice.)

"The process of jury selection is well defined and this matter (racial makeup) is taken into the jury selection phase of the trial."

Because of the almost lily white population of Ventura County the 400-plus member panel from which the jury was drawn contained less than two and a half percent blacks. If all the blacks on the panel had been reached — which they were not — all could have been eliminated by the peremptory challenges available to the attorney for the four defendants.

"Very little news was reported with respect to the two other blacks who were companions of Rodney King and who obeyed police demands while King did not do so."

One of the other blacks filed a personal brutality complaint with the L.A. Police Commission shortly after the event and is now suing the City of L.A. for damages.

The jury did not take notice of this fact because it was inadmissible as evidence as were these other facts: two of the officers previously had been disciplined for use of excessive force by the LAPD; the City of L.A. paid out over

\$12,000,000 in police brutality settlements in 1991 and is paying police brutality settlements at a high rate this year.

"The King verdict should have been accepted by all concerned as evidence that our judicial system is alive and well."

The only perfect Man was crucified nearly 2,000 years ago. Our juries are not composed of perfect people. Our trials do not provide perfect justice. Under our system there can be no legal challenge to an acquittal verdict. We accept that in exchange for the other merits of trial by jury. But we do not have to believe the jury was right — appeals courts do not have to believe nor accept jury verdicts of guilt and frequently they overrule them.

Thanks to gavel to gavel coverage of the trial by Court TV, like the jury I saw and heard a California Highway Patrol Officer who was first on the scene when King was stopped testify that King was

following her orders when the LAPD officers arrived, took over from her, and began the use of force for reasons she did not understand.

Like the jury, I saw and heard defendant Officer Briseno testify that the three other officers appeared to him to be out of control and that he tried to hold King on the ground in the hope that they would stop the beating.

Unlike the jury and unlike the commentator Al Junge, I understand that punishment is not a police function — even if the suspect were Jeffrey Dahmer not Rodney King.

Finally here's a quote from another source: "To see them beat a man with their batons 56 times, to see a sergeant on the scene who did nothing to seize control, was something I never dreamed I would witness." That quotation is from "Chief: My Life in the LAPD" by Daryle F. Gates.

### Junge column missed the mark; racism is not running rampant

#### TO THE EDITOR:

Al Junge's speculative apologia tour through "but-if-only" land (Ruidoso News, 5/28) re: acquittal of LAPD officers in the Rodney King beating, and its destructive aftermath, missed the salient point of widely expressed outrage at the trial outcome. No amount of rationalization about "before and after" changes the fact that those four officers, armed with pistols, electric shock devices (fazers), and batons could not possibly have needed to sue that amount of force to subdue one unarmed individual — especially with nearly 20 fellow officers standing around,

similarly armed, watching the whole thing.

If those poor wimps so "feared for their lives" from King's behavior, they could have drawn firearms to defend themselves, rather than move in close enough to use batons and fazers. Or they could have called on bystander officers for help to bring King down. The beating was unwarranted, brutal and criminal.

Acceptance of the Simi Valley jury verdict as "evidence that our judicial system is alive and well" just doesn't wash. Perhaps Junge didn't listen to interviews with one

of the jurors, who provided quite opposite evidence.

Mr. Junge's presumably illustrative example to show all people are racist is absurd. Rather than speculative tours through "but-if-only" land, Junge might become more informed about racism by a serious study tour through a dictionary and some history and sociology texts. Racism fails to fully explain either the beatings or the ensuing riots; nonetheless, it is a factor that can't be so casually dismissed.
