## School starts

Pencils were sharpened and new clothes pulled from the closets today for the first day of school in Capitan and Hondo.

Ruidoso students will have a few extra afternoons to enjoy the sun and freedom before they head back to the classrooms on Wednesday, August 19.

While the junior high and elementary students will start thumbing through their books Wednesday, those in high school will register Wednesday and Thursday, then start classes Friday, August 21.

### NOB HILL

Kindergarten students also are on a different schedule. A one-hour orientation for afternoon kindergarten students at Nob Hill will be at 12:30 p.m. Thursday and at 9 a.m. Friday for morning kindergarten children. The first full day of kindergarten classes will be 8:05 to 10:50 a.m. Monday, August 24, for the morning session and from 11:35 p.m. to 2:20 p.m. for the afternoon group.

Orientation for first grade students with names starting A-M will be at 9 a.m. Wednesday, August 19, and for those with names beginning with N-Z at 1 p.m. The first full day of school will be Thursday, August 20. School hours for first grade students are from 8:05 a.m. to 2:20 p.m.

Roger Sowder is principal. Deborah Thompson is secretary and will staff the school office. School staff includes five kindergarten teachers, nine first grade teachers and six special education instructors.

### WHITE MOUNTAIN

Second and third graders and their parents should plan to attend an orientation session the first day of school Wednesday, August 19, at White Mountain Elementary.

Students whose last names begin with A-M should show up with their parents at 9 a.m. and those with names beginning with N-Z at 1 p.m. The first full day of school will be Thursday, August 20. Hours are 8:15 a.m. to 2:35 p.m.

Frank Cannella is principal and Cheryl Elder is school secretary. The staff includes nine second grade teachers and seven third grade teachers.

Helene Kobeinyk is the new principal of the intermediate school at White Mountain. Linda Autrey is school secretary.

## Detective pulls the plug on gardener

The sweet smell of the forest surrounded Detective Lanny Maddox as he strolled in the woods in search of New Mexico's booming cottage industry, marijuana.

From his vantage point on the ridge in the Pinecliff subdivision, the woods seemed to teem with a variety of plants in all shades of green.

But to Maddox it was a very special garden, carefully tended, and he could see the shade of green that spelled money.

"There's one," he said. "There's four more over there."

From 10 yards away, it looked like he was pointing to a dead tree at one spot and three beer cans in the other.

On closer inspection, the wonderful world of selective gardening began to unfold.

An area of 18 inches surrounding each plant was carefully cleaned of any loose debris that may prevent water from soaking the earth around the plant. From 10 yards away you could begin to

spot the bare circles under each plant.

"There's one," this reporter shouted.

"I think you've got it," Maddox said.

Suddenly, the field was alive with the sound of greenbacks.

Maddox grasped a succulent stem from a 4-footer and it's roots easily gave way. He deposited in the bottom of his black plastic bag.

It was Easter again, and you were in a hunt against the kid.

## Cleanup concentrates county garbage authority group

Concern over aging equipment purchased from the Village of Ruidoso and an apparent drop in the level of garbage collection service will send a familiar civic watchdog to the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority meeting Monday.

Al Junge, a former village councilor and authority member, will be back in the saddle again to fire off a few rounds of criticism and to offer some suggestions for improvement.

The authority will meet at 9 a.m. in the recycling center at 222 Second Street in Ruidoso Downs.

Authority director Gene Green hopes to get a tighter grip on things with the hiring of an operations supervisor recently approved by the governing board. The board is comprised of representatives from the

county and its five municipalities. The supervisor should be named this week.

Green said he would like to enlist the help of residents to keep dumpster sites from becoming messy and to police litter throughout the village.

Some of his drivers make notes on situations that need attention as they drive their rounds, but no reliable system has been established yet, he said.

"I'd like to divide the village up into sections with different civic groups responsible for keeping that portion clear of litter. Sort of like the adopt-a-highway program," Green said. "I'd love to have a clean up campaign and we need volunteers. I just don't have the staff to pick it up myself."

He would welcome calls from groups or individuals interested in

becoming involved in a clean up effort. Call 378-4697.

Green said he also relies heavily upon the watchful eye of the public to pinpoint dumpsters that need repair or special clean up attention.

"Those that are the most visible are likely to receive priority because they are on main streets and this is a tourist-based economy," he said.

Collection is supposed to be scheduled as often as three times a week for commercial spots and once a week for commercial.

But some businesses still have garbage spilling out of the containers before the compaction trucks stop by.

During Monday's meeting, the authority will review the manager's report, hear a recycling report and discuss the goal of a joint Otero County-Lincoln County effort.

## Security division looks at Carrizo Lodge marketing

Carrizo Lodge owners say they are on the cutting edge of a major marketing plan, but others are seriously questioning the new direction.

The new condo market approach may have been pressed into action prematurely and has drawn the scrutiny of the New Mexico Real Estate Commission and the New Mexico Securities Division (NMSD).

Carrizo is attempting to sell interests in a general partnership which involves sale of condominium units. The sales are not being called time shares.

"Time share", simply defined, is an approach that allows multiple purchasers to buy interest in real estate property, usually in a resort condominium or hotel, and to use the facility for a fixed or variable time period.

Real estate laws governing time sharing state it shall be unlawful for a time share developer to sell or offer to sell time shares located in this state without first obtaining a certificate of registration. An action costing thousands of dollars, extremely time consuming and highly regulated.

Ruidoso entrepreneur James Porter said he is waiting for an opinion from both agencies to put his new plan in full action. He said it is not a time share or a limited

partnership, but a partnership.

Porter said a partnership is not illegal where it is not a time share.

Terri Orton of NMSD, said that a time share plan is not necessarily synonymous to a limited partnership. And a general partnership does not necessarily mean that a security is not present.

Orton said in a time share plan, when someone offers to sell condos and that offer is coupled with an agreement for rental or other services for the purchaser, it very possibly becomes a security.

"I want to clarify that a time share plan is not necessarily equivalent to a limited partnership," she said.

"A limited partnership is merely a legal entity with a general partner responsible for the management of that partnership, the decision makers."

"Persons placing capital and having no decision as to the transactions of that partnership are limited partners. The lack of managerial say, is what makes a limited partnership interest a security."

Orton said Carrizo has proposed to form a series of general partnerships.

"Merely because an entity is a general partner does not remove an investment in that partnership from the definition of security. It depends on the degree of participa-

tion of the partners."

She said the securities counsel has asked to see a partnership agreement.

But before state agencies had a chance to review any partnership agreement or make an opinion, ads appeared in Mexico that the state securities division said contained an offering that more than likely should have been registered with the state.

A real estate "offer" is any inducement solicitation or attempt to encourage a person to buy property or acquire an interest in property.

Furthermore, Orton said it appears that Carrizo Lodge has offered to sell condos and they are offering also to rent the condos when not in use by the persons that purchased them.

To the securities division, an offer of a real estate unit which includes the economic inducement of rental revenue may be the offer of a security. But there may be other determinants.

Porter said he wanted to test his plan in Mexico. His lawyer called it a "survey." Others have called it "selling." The agencies have not given their official opinion yet.

## Complaints lodged against local lounge

Stern measures are recommended by the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Department for lounge owner Jack Tallman's property behind Handi Hanks.

The planning commission meets today, Monday, at 2 p.m. to discuss what action to take.

It appears the village planning department is miffed at what director Cleatus Richards has called "numerous complaints regarding lounge operation and inadequate parking."

In a staff review submitted to the planning commission, director Cleatus Richards said Tallman was notified that parking plans had not been submitted as required under the January 6, commission approval.

Richards said Tallman expanded the lounge area to add a game room without approval by the commission. He said Tallman has also been notified of other violations regarding use of storage areas for com-

mercial purposes not approved by the commission and developed without building permit or inspection.

Richards recommends that the commission formally act to declare previous approvals under PSD92-002 void and withhold any further approvals until Tallman submits development plans in full accord with code regulations.

Richards said the commission action to nullify previous approval will have the effect of making the lounge operation an illegal activity on the premises. If necessary, Richards said the staff will institute appropriate legal procedures in this regard.

Other requests include: —Kurt Schussler, Jr., is requesting to amend a commercial site development to allow a sandwich shop at 2717 Sudderth.

Planning staff recommends approval subject to arrangement for additional parking on adjoining lot

or within 3000 feet of the site.

—Cattle Baron Restaurant agent D.T. Collins is requesting approval of a 16 feet by 116-foot addition to the existing restaurant for additional seating and kitchen remodeling.

Planning staff recommends approval of development plans. However, the parking plans are not considered acceptable as submitted and should be revised to incorporate the following.

—Robert Kakuska is requesting a variance for his front and side

yard in Country Club Estates to construct a garage to within 11 feet of the front property line and on the side property line.

Richards said the lot topography in the area proposed is not adverse and apparently not considered a hardship by the planning department.

Adjoining property owner has strongly objected to the variance as requested.

Richards said the staff recommends denial of the variance as requested.

## AG will visit Ruidoso today

New Mexico Attorney General Tom Udall will meet today, August 17, with the Ruidoso Village Council to discuss the nuclear dump study conducted by the Mesquero Apache Tribe.

Although the 2 p.m. meeting in village hall was not to discuss the storage dump that will house spent nuclear fuel rods, Udall and the board will field any other business that may come before the governing body.

Lodge in an effort to bring the resort back to more prosperous days.

From Lubbock, Texas, Porter has an excellent reputation as a businessman dealing in cotton. For many years he has owned a home on the Rio Ruidoso in the Upper Canyon.

According to Porter, a couple of months ago he decided to buy into a corporation called C-Net Resorts Inc.

C-Net's officers are listed as Tom Coy, agent; Mike Hill, president; Jason Theodore, vice president; Leland Nelson, secretary; and directors are Tom Coy, Mike Hill, Leland Nelson and Barbara Theodore.

Porter said he hasn't finished buying stock.

"We're just in the process of getting it bought, and we're only buying a percentage of C-Net corporation," he said.

State Representative John Underwood (D-Ruidoso) is C-Net's lawyer, he said. And it was on the advice of Underwood that he hired a second attorney, real estate specialist Richard Hawthorne.

### THE AD

Sometime in mid-July, ads began to appear for Carrizo Lodge in Mexico.

A full page color ad appeared on July 15 in the El Heraldo de Chihuahua.

Hawthorne said his understanding of the advertisement was to see how much interest there was in the property and if Porter should go forward with his plan.

"It's not an offer to sell, it's more of a survey to see whether they will buy," Hawthorne said.

He said he had no knowledge of financial arrangements detailed on the ad and other material.

"I do know that James is very adamant about this thing being done properly. He's not about to violate the laws of New Mexico and get the AG (attorney general) after him," Hawthorne said.

The controversial ad was an invitation for persons who were interested in buying condominiums formed as a partnership to contact Carrizo Lodge. It read in Spanish that:

—for a single cost, you and your family could be members for life at Carrizo Lodge.

—the public was invited to accompany a representative of Carrizo Lodge in the Villa de Sol, Monday and Tuesday, July 13-14, and July 20-21 from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. To be in Chihuahua July 15-16 in the Hotel Palacio Del Sol from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. The ad said information would be available.

—a payment plan for one, two, three, four and five weeks to purchase was available. It stated accommodations selected by July 22 would be allowed a 10 percent discount effective with 35 percent down and payments of \$100 until the balance is paid.

—there was a limited number of condos and you had to be one of the first 100 partners for the offer to be effective. It urged not to delay, the first partners will be able to pick the weeks they choose.

—the offer terminated on July 22. The buyer would receive one additional week, totally guaranteed in

1992 and 1993 if the buyer would bring a person who would become a partner and the seller received a commission.

—all deposits were to be turned in at either of the two locations mentioned above. Credit cards were accepted.

### SECURITIES

Contacted on August 5, Orton said the offer as shown in the advertisement has the characteristics of an investment contract which is defined as the investment of money in anticipation of profits through the efforts of others in a common business enterprise.

"When an offer is coupled with a rental arrangement it could be deemed as an offer of a security," she said.

Orton pointed out differences between registration and exemption.

"A security can be sold in the state without being registered, but it must be subject to one of several exemptions available," she said.

Orton said state statutes provide that no security may be sold to or from this state unless the securities have been registered or have benefit of exemption.

"In this case, they have not applied for an exemption, and we don't know enough about what they intend to do to determine which exemption is applicable, if indeed the proposed transaction has the specifications of a security," Orton said.

Orton said her agency would be looking at the law for determining factors in the rental portion of this transaction.

She said Hawthorne would be asked to send the partnership agreement.

Contacted on Monday, August 3, Hawthorne said he hadn't drafted any partnership agreement at that time, but said it will very clearly set out C-Net's rights and duties.

Orton said the first time she talked to Hawthorne about the plan, she received a follow up letter dated July 27. Five days after the deadline to respond to the ad placed in Mexico.

### ADVERTISING

Orton said the advertising itself is another issue.

"Under securities regulation, advertising is not permitted unless the securities are registered or unless authorized by the applicable exemption," Orton said.

"In any event, advertising is not permitted until a determination is made of the existence of a security and until that security has complied with the registration or exemption provisions of our state law."

Orton said her agency is going to contact the North American Securities Administrative Association (NASAA), an organization that is made up of all the securities directors for every state and also includes Canada and Mexico.

Orton said NASAA's committee. The International Enforcement Committee will contact Comision de Valores with the information to determine what their policy is regarding advertising.

The commission is Mexico's counterpart of the securities exchange commission.

"They can take it from there," Orton said.

### ON SITE

A Spanish speaking resident of Otero County, on July 30, visited Tony Rascun at Carrizo Lodge.

After a brief tour of the property, the resident said the plan generally followed the ad in El Heraldo, without the July 22 deadline.

He said the procedure was to simply fill out a contract and pay on a payment plan. He said buyers had to pick a week that was listed. He said some weeks were taken.

The resident said he was told that he had to sign in whenever he used his time at the condominium.

"You must come to the office for the key to your room," he said. "Even if you sign up, unless they get 100 people to participate in their program, they will have to refund your money."

"If I bring friends that buy, they will give me \$100 back," he said. "And if I couldn't make my week, Carrizo will rent my unit and then give me half of what they make during that one week," he said.

Among the information the resident received was a Carrizo Lodge Partnership contract, a map, a calendar to mark the specific week or weeks selected (similar to a time share calendar) and a homeowner's partnership agreement that provided for a rental pool.

The agreement stated, "There will also be a rental pool provided and managed by Carrizo Lodge for those assigned weeks which an individual is unable to use. The rent received will be divided 50-50 between Carrizo Lodge and the individual for that week."

Rascun showed the resident a map of Carrizo Lodge and the condos in buildings six and seven of the complex. All condos offered, registered by the county, are owned by PPM (Pioneer Property Management).

### PPM

According to the state corporations commission, PPM Inc. is located out of Roswell.

PPM Inc. is wholly owned by Pioneer Savings and Trust of Roswell. Pioneer Savings president is George Mitchell. Ruidoso also has a branch office of Pioneer Savings on Mechem Drive.

PPM's corporate officers are: George Mitchell, agent and president; Jon Hitchcock, vice president; Barbara McCampbell, secretary; and Jon Hitchcock, treasurer.

Mitchell said Pioneer had owned those units for years and had optioned them to James Porter who is "doing his own thing."

If Porter's plan is ruled a time share or a security, Porter's "thing" also may be Mitchell's "thing." C-Net only has an option to purchase the condos where the partnerships are being offered. The condos are owned exclusively by PPM.

As used in the New Mexico Time Share Act, a "developer" means any persons creating or engaged in the business of selling 10 or more of its own time shares and includes any person who controls, is controlled by or is in common control with the developer and who is engaged in creating or selling time shares for the developer.

By that definition, the state agencies' rulings on whether or not Porter is selling time shares would have a bearing on Pioneer Savings and trust which owns the optioned condos.

Orton said a person selling condos for a realty, who may be acting

as agent for someone else, may also come under the securities act if the condo units are deemed to be securities.

"They may be deemed to be brokers and dealers," she said.

Mitchell said Porter was the primary player in C-Net.

"He's the owner of C-Net, one of the major owners," he said.

Mitchell said he had no knowledge of what Porter's plans were with the units. He said because of certain "vicious" rumors "I think it's important that you go directly to him about exactly what his plans are."

And yet, two of Mitchell's officers at Pioneer Savings and Trust are Robert Vie and Larry Fresquez. They also are two members of the three-member committee of the Carrizo Lodge Homeowners Association. That committee, with Vie as chairman, has controlled the homeowners association since 1990.

According to a recent Multiple Listing Service, the 43 condos Mitchell is optioning have a cash value of \$1,053,500.

PPM, with Mitchell at the helm, and C-Net have had a business relationship for about a year for the rental management of PPM's units, according to Porter.

The persistent "vicious" rumor Mitchell speaks of appears to be the claim that Porter's unique plan is really a time share program.

### THE PLAN

Porter seemed irritated that anyone would call his plan a time share.

"Number one, it's not a time share any," he said. "We put an ad in the Juarez paper, full page, which we hoped was a good ad, to see if there was any response."

"We're trying to sell the ski season, because people from Juarez and Chihuahua think Ruidoso is a good ski area," he said.

Porter said October through April was a very slow season.

"We felt that would be a good deal for us and a good deal for them to put each one on an individual partner basis," Porter said. "It is not a time share. We have not done it as yet, and I can assure you we have not sold any."

Porter said he was trying to sell a partnership on each condo.

"That would be from five, to six, to seven, to eight partners in each condo, of which we would remain probably the largest partner," Porter said. "We're going to retain at least 25 to 50 percent interest in every condo. This is our proposal if we do any of it."

"A deed will show each condo separately. It will be deeded to this particular partnership. The deed will be free and clear of any liens or debts for that particular condo. So there will be ... no chance of getting any type of bankruptcy. It is completely different from a time share, different than anything you probably ever heard of."

Partnerships and time share limited partnerships do have significant degrees of difference in liability claims, according to real estate experts.

In a time share limited partnership, the limited partners are only liable up to the amount of their contribution. If you invest \$2,500, you can only lose \$2,500.

In a general partnership, each partner is jointly and severally li-

able for the entire partnership debt. If you invested \$2,500 and other partners couldn't pay, you could be liable for 100 percent of all the debt owed.

Porter said more than one week could be purchased.

"You might own six percent, which would entitle you to three weeks usage per year," Porter said.

"Carrizo would be the managing partner," Porter said. "Supplying maid service, rental pool, everything else that's needed."

Orton said under state law, a general partnership would be defined as one where all the partners have a say in the management and operation of the business.

"However, there may be situations in which the partners have some limited degree of participation in the operation of the business and they may call themselves a general partnership," she said. "But a securities situation may be present because of the very limited degree of participation."

The breakdown of annual operation expenses for each condo is figured at \$4,800 per year, \$400 per month, or \$32 per unit per month.

The ad in Mexico showed payments as low as \$10 per month for services. A person buying a condo week at \$2,500 for life, would have to pay \$120 per year for services.

"We are not doing that yet," Porter said. If you had wanted to buy one, we would have taken a deposit and told you we would be back in touch with you in two weeks or three weeks or whenever we know for sure."

During a subsequent meeting with Porter and Jason and Barbara Theodore, Porter said Carrizo Lodge didn't need a brokers license and Tony Rascun didn't need a real estate license.

The state requires that "Under the various licensing laws, one who offers to sell, buy, or rent real estate or any options on real estate, for others, for a consideration, is required to have a real estate license."

A anyone selling time shares must be a Licensed Realtor, according to the New Mexico Time Share Act.

### HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION

Porter said that Carrizo Lodge has a homeowners association. In researching the declaration bylaws of that association, there was no allowance for a time share form of ownership.

"There's 27 privately owned condos out here. PPM owns 43 condos, we own 20 of them," Porter said.

He didn't think it made any difference if the homeowners were aware of the new marketing plan, Porter said.

A local insurance agent individual owners of Carrizo Lodge could be negatively impacted by a timeshare operation causing higher insurance premiums or difficulty in obtaining insurance.

"It would be a better deal for the homeowners if someone stayed in them for a week," Porter said. "Or if they were owners for a week, two, three or four weeks a year, as compared to the way they're being rented out every night, the homeowners and theirs, the homeowners

two nights a week or three nights a week to two or three different people."

On Friday, July 31, Porter said he was waiting for the real estate commission to give an opinion.

"He (the attorney) called the real estate commission, probably two or three weeks ago," Porter said. "They (the commission) said they saw nothing wrong with it, but as far as them giving an official opinion, they didn't want to do it without having it in writing."

"If it is a time share, we are not going to do it."

Porter said he bought the restaurant at Carrizo, the art school, 20 condos, the plaza building and store.

"Bought it last year, C-Net still owns it. We are in the process of transferring stock from Thomas Coy, Mike Hill and Rex Nelson. We've not got any transferred yet, but we're in the process," he said.

Porter said most of Carrizo Lodge has been in the hands of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) for the past three or four years.

"It doesn't take that long to really tear something down. It takes a while to get it built back up. We're committed to building it back up like it used to be," Porter said.

He didn't know anything more to do than to get the best attorneys to advise him, he said.

Hawthorne said what Porter is doing is being done all the time.

"Four or five guys go in and buy a house that's up in Alto and split it so they'd have a place to vacation. That's the same idea here," Hawthorne said.

"There's no scheme here for anybody to make money. It's simply sharing the cost of owning."

However, the calendar handed out to prospective buyers showed 35 weeks were available to purchase. Fifteen weeks were marked off as Carrizo Art School, including the prime time months of July and August. Two weeks were scheduled for cleaning, painting and repair. The remaining 35 weeks are offered at a price, \$2,500 per week, that could result in an \$87,500 sale for condos listed on a recent Multiple Listing Service for \$24,500.

Hawthorne said he had no knowledge of the financing arrangements, but he did know that Porter was adamant about everything being done properly.

Contacted on July 27, Lynne Schmolke of the New Mexico Real Estate Commission said she had never heard of C-Net and had not reviewed any proposal.

"All I can say is that I've not seen anything like this before," Schmolke said, inspecting documents for the first time on July 30.

She said people who want to start projects call the commission and write letters or send information. After the information is processed, if it isn't enough to make a determination they ask for more.

"We just keep grinding until we get enough to make a determination," she said. "At that point, especially for things like time shares and camp ground resorts, counsel is involved because it's a matter of interpretation of the statutes."

"That's what we're talking about. Is this a time share project or not? Does this plan fall under the definition of time share in New Mexico? Lawyers are the ones who answer questions like that."

We whistled while we worked. "This guy is really going to be honked off when he comes back to find his plants gone," I said.

"Or woman," Maddox said, care-

ful not to insult the feminine gender.

Although it was a mild and pleasant day in Ruidoso, all the walking up and down the ridge was tiring. You couldn't help but appreciate how much work, the tender love and care of that gardener toward his crop.

Could it be that marijuana is no more addictive than cigarettes or beer? What if we just legalized it.

Would that curb the desire or cost? To Maddox, that wasn't much of an issue.

"No," he said, plucking a particularly healthy 4-footer from the earth. "They tried in California and it was a mess."

Frollicking in the woods in search of "weed" can be a high of its own. We literally danced from plant to plant.

After collecting 50 to 60 stalks,

Maddox brought out a test kit and plunked a few leaves into the acid mixture.

"Look at that deep purple," he said. "This is a particularly good and virile strain." He seemed pleased.

Singing "when deep purple falls, over sleepy garden walls," we left the area and promised to meet another day.

Wiggins was born May 13, 1924, in Roswell. He was a pioneer in photo-journalism and assignments carried him more than one million miles into 18 different countries for major magazines such as Look, Sports Illustrated, True, Argosy and others. His honors were many, including recognition in the American Society of Magazine Photographers' now classic book, *The World's Greatest Photographers*. He was past vice-president of Ruidoso Downs Race Track, President of the American Horse Publications and Executive Secretary of the Quarter Racing Owners of America. His memberships included Overseas Press Club, American Society of Press Photographers and Adventurers Club of New York. He was a recipient of the Detroit Art Director's Award in 1955.

He married Royne Fitzgerald in 1963.

In 1969 he founded *The Speedhorse*, an award-winning magazine

acknowledged as one of the top equine journals in America. The veteran journalist-publisher was also the delegation leader for People-to-People International's delegation of American Horsemen sent to New Zealand, Australia and Hong Kong in 1978.

Wiggins has authored nine books, five of which are in the field of fine art. He is listed in the *Who's Who in American Art*, *Who's Who in the World*, *Who's Who in the West*, *Who's Who in Finance and Industry*.

# Valley drinks in rainy spring, summer

Sunny August Day

This is being sent to you just before midday on August 13, a bright sunny day with a blue sky above a green world decorated with flowers of all colors.

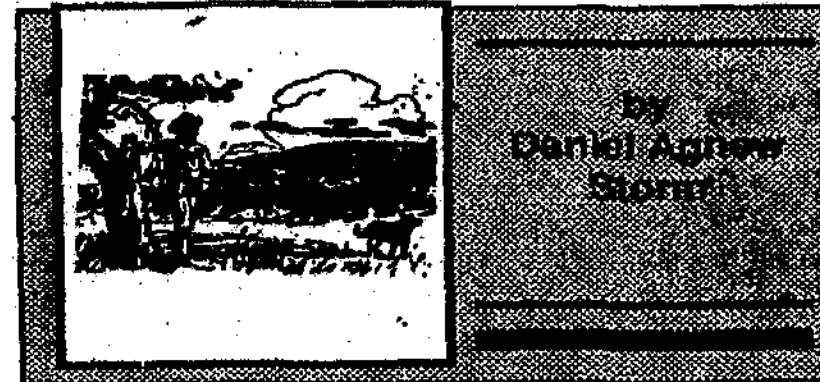
There is a light breeze out of the northeast blowing through the vale carrying a very light mist — rippling the American flag and carrying the flavor of the peaches, pears and apples ripening down the way, mingled with the fragrance of the midsummer flowers, and the incense of the evergreens baked out into the air by the warm sun.

For the rainy month of August it has been quite fair and sunny here at Stormont (Land of Storm Mountain).

Many is the time during the month that I have looked up the valley and seen the storm clouds all gray and purple along the hill horizon, and heard the distant thunder and seen the lightning flash, silver gold and light crimson.

Then here would come the rain water, coloring the stream and making the river sing as it flows faster and deeper under the tunnels of the oak, walnut and wild cherry trees.

In other words, it has been fairly rainy on the mountain and in some of the other high country. All in all however, it has been a spring and summer of abundant moisture, turning the land of the piñon and pine into a mountain wonderland, and bringing a smile to the face of Mother Earth and a song of joy into



our hearts.

### The Ripening Rays

This time of year, when the sun sometimes feels hotter than it does in June and July, the hot months; and this is because the sun is traveling lower down toward the horizon on its daily journey through the sky. Therefore the rays of the sun strike you slantwise instead of straight down. In the same way, the fruits catch the sun on their sides instead of the tops, turning their cheeks red, and establishing the flavor and healthy qualities of apples, pears, peaches, plums and cherries.

This way the ripening rays work their magic; and these days they are busy ripening the fruit all the way from Riverside up to the Upper Bonito; and from near Tularosa up through Bent and on to Mesquero.

It has been many a day since we have had such a golden year in all kinds of fruit — all through the valleys and in the yards of the homes.

Delbert Posey tells me that he and his wife, Judy, have had a wonderland of fruit in their yard — cherries, apricots, peaches — with the apples and pears now ripening.

### The Fruit Picture

Here in the mountain land the ripening of the fruit begins down at Riverside in the Hondo Valley, and moves up the valley through the summer and ends up in the Upper Bonito. This way there is a month or so difference in the ripening.

At this writing, August 13, apples are beginning to ripen in the orchards lower down. The old saying goes that August is the peach month, September the pear month and October the apple month. This pretty much holds true in the main orchards in the central sections of the valleys.

Della Bonnell tells me the pears at the Bonnell Ranch will be ripe about the first of September. The year we have had the rare treat of apricots and cherries, which have mostly already ripened and been harvested — except in the higher reaches around Ruidoso and higher.

So you see we have a long harvest season here in our fruit region, although the main ripening takes place in the middle regions of the valleys — such as Hondo, San Patricio and Glencoe. Soon it will be time to make a visit to your orchard growing and neighbors.

## Fast computers speed up collecting

The combination of experience and technology at World Wide Systems is helping to change the image people have of collection agencies and helping others understand what role these agencies have in the economy.

Partners Mike DiNapoli and "Tex" Cashner use high-speed computers and an efficient staff to collect on "hot" checks, non-sufficient funds checks or past due accounts. They collect for the entire Allsup's chain, New Mexico Pizza Huts and Bell Oil Company, but are happy to have a growing list of area business to work for, too.

Cashner has had 30 years of experience in the business and had begun World Wide last July before DiNapoli joined him in September. Cashner got Discount Feed as the first local account by collecting on several old bad checks.

DiNapoli said when they explain the collection procedure to a potential new client, they are educating that business person on how writing these debts off hurts a business' profits. The more the business has to write off, the harder it has to work to make a profit.

"Businesses don't realize how much they are losing. We show them what they are up against," he

said.

DiNapoli pointed out several statistics concerning the impact of bad debts on the economy. The bad debt written-off each year amounts to \$250 for every man, woman and child in America, which equals \$1,000 extra that a family of four must pay for goods and services each year. He said accounts totaling more than \$60 billion are referred to third-party collection agencies annually, and more than one million checks bounce daily. Debt collectors offer consumers an opportunity to work out their difficulties and meet their financial obligations, which benefits everyone, he said.

The World Wide process of collecting on a check or account is to have a collector call first and then follow up on the account with a letter. This cycle is repeated three times, with a final call right before World Wide turns it back over to the business if it can't be collected on, ready to be filed on in court. Every step World Wide takes in the process is always done legally, Cashner said.

"For most people it is just a misunderstanding and we open the channels of communication. For their

choice," DiNapoli said.

When people do pay, World Wide Systems sends a "thank you" letter from the business, which no other collection agency does, he said. When trying to contact people, the collectors call until about 9 p.m., or 8 p.m. for Texas residents, to avoid calling too late in the night.

World Wide can set up a credit verification system that is flexible for an individual business because all of the computer programming is done here, he said. Also unique in this business is the fact that information is called up from a CD-ROM disk that is updated every three months. DiNapoli said World Wide is the only agency in the state that currently has this.

With the computer, workers can call people up for names, phone numbers and current and past addresses to help locate a person with a debt to the client. Each disk has information from certain areas of the United States. The information can come from one of two vendors, U.S. West or a competitor that buys it from the phone company, DiNapoli said.

In the past World Wide had to rely on phone directories that could be up to 12 months old before they were received. Most agencies still

debt collection agency. World Wide hosted the Chamber of Commerce business-after-hours party on July 30 and also had a ribbon cutting to celebrate a first anniversary.

have collectors with files full of papers for accounts, instead of having all of it stored on a computer.

This agency also has a verification computer to assess checks and credit card charges. Businesses have a small computer to input the data and when it comes into the agency it only takes about five to ten seconds for the verifying computer to approve or deny that charge. This way customers don't have to wait long to get a reply, DiNapoli said. By having the larger corporations subscribe to this service, they can provide a low rate to the local businesses who want this service, he said.

World Wide currently has eight

full-time employees, but because of increasing business it could grow up to 12 people per shift within a year, he said. DiNapoli said they have a good building, the former KBUY radio station studios, because it allows the collectors to be in enclosed glass rooms.

DiNapoli said this area has its own unique problems in debt collections, but these are not as bad as Las Cruces, Portales or Roswell. He said the majority of bad checks are out of Texas, but they are geared for that because of the big accounts they have, such as Allsup's. Because of the fluctuating economy in Ruidoso, there is also more of a tendency for a bad check to happen to the local population and this

problem also goes higher into the middle income brackets than it would normally.

By collecting on these accounts and getting the money back into the economy, World Wide is actually the "good guy," DiNapoli said. The characterization that collectors are professional thugs is totally wrong, he said.

"I believe our collectors are financial specialists who are trained to treat consumers with respect and to solve problems so that the bill or check will ultimately be paid. Our collectors are efficient because they are good communicators. They listen," DiNapoli said.

Then there's a poodle, several long-haired chihuahua crosses and a pekingese mix. The colors mostly are dark, but one is a brandy shade and another is a copper-tan.

Two former past pets, Sugar and Carmella, still haven't found just

the right new pal with whom to share their lives. Sugar is a terrier mix with loads of energy. Carmella, with one blue and one green eye, is housebroken and calm in nature. She walks superbly on a leash and probably is an Australian shepherd mix. She'd be a good companion for a woman and Sugar would be great with kids.

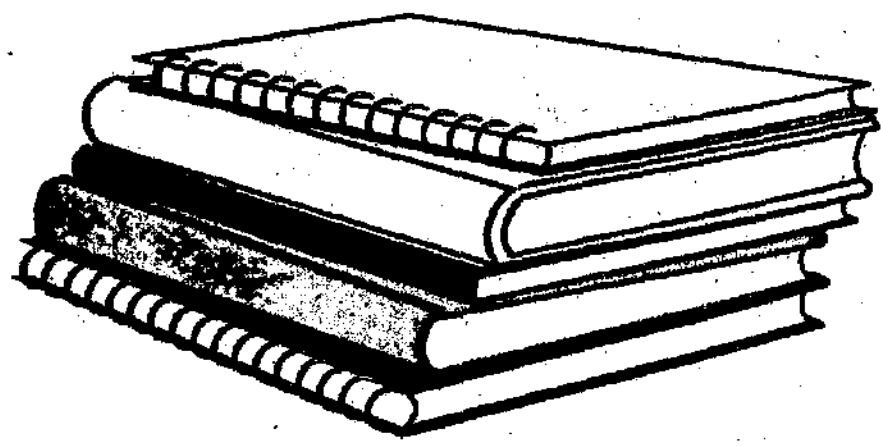

If cats are more your style, the cattery next to the shelter also is full of choices from kittens to adults.

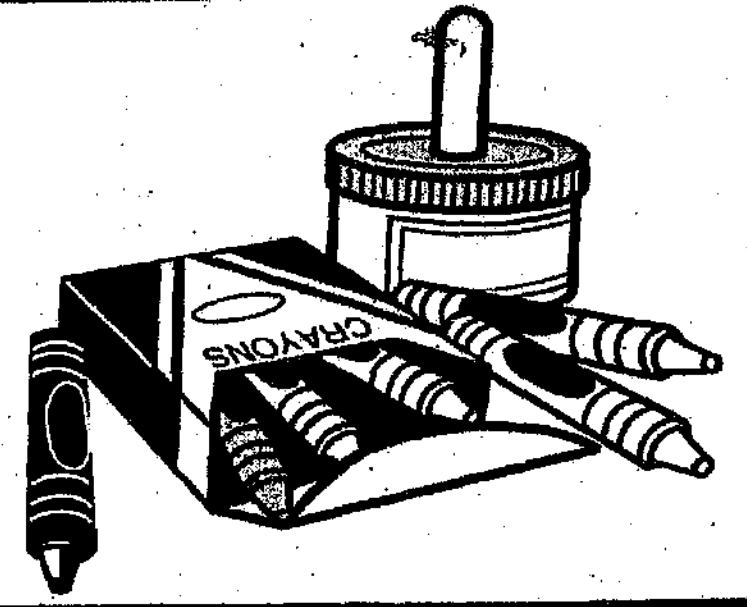

Get those entry forms for the parade into the chamber by September 30.

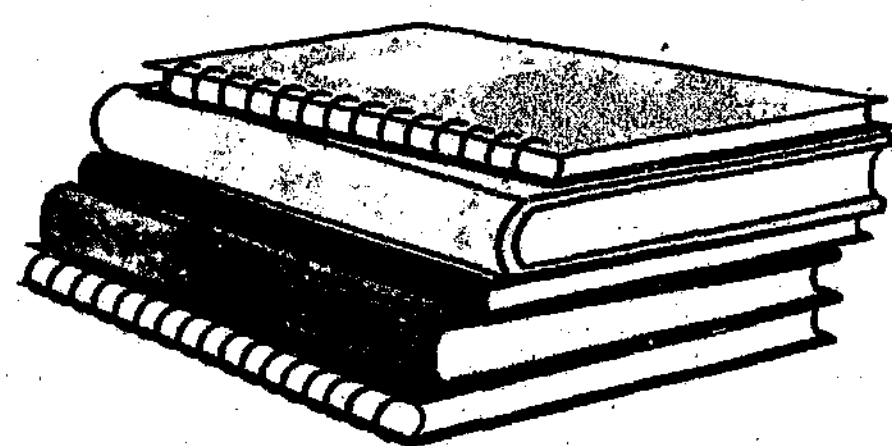

# Mr Eye Opener remains #1

Mr Eye Opener reaffirmed his favored status to win the upcoming \$2 million All American Futurity by winning his 440-yard elimination trial Friday while under strong restraint.

One-hundred and eighty-six 2-year-olds horses participated in Thursday's and Friday's elimination trials. The top-three finishers in each race advance to the Aug. 27 time trials. The 10-fastest horses in the time trials then advance to the rich and prestigious futurity Sept. 7. The Grade I All American Futurity is the richest Quarter Horse race in the world.

Mr Eye Opener's time of 21.87 seconds was not the fastest 440-yards posted for the day, but then jockey Jack Martin never asked the colt for his all. In fact, Martin began restraining Mr Eye Opener after the first 100 yards.

"We wanted to win the race, but at the same time, we didn't want to burn him up any more than we had to," said trainer Jack Brooks who also qualified Choculo, Ronas Goddess and Runaway Cash, Friday.

Prior to the trials, Mr Eye

Opener was ranked No. 1 on the American Quarter Horse Association's All American Futurity Poll. Owned by Dale and Billie Smith of Tulsa, Okla., Mr Eye Opener has now chalked up five wins in seven starts.

The fastest time of the day was posted by Perfect Victory, 21.30 seconds, after she caught a tail win in her race.

Mr Eye Opener's nose victory came as no surprise, but Loose Lips' and Imfastermaster's defeats were. Imfastermaster and Loose Lips were favored to run first and second in the seventh race, but Loose Lips finished fourth and Imfastermaster finished fifth. Neither qualified for the time trials.

"She was bumped pretty hard at the gate and it knocked all the air out of her," Trainer James McArthur said disappointingly. "It also knocked her hind legs out from under her and she never recovered."

Loose Lips placed second behind Deceptively in the Grade I Kansas Futurity in May and third behind Imfastermaster Grade I Heritage

Place Futurity at Remington Park last month in Oklahoma City.

Imfastermaster's connections were also notably disappointed, particularly after paying the \$50,000 supplemental fee to start the colt in the trials.

"He was at a disadvantage going into the race," said Arnold Simmons who, along with his wife Nene, trains Imfastermaster.

"He got sick right after he got here from Remington Park and we really weren't able to get the works in him he needed. He was well for the race, he just came up short."

## Violators will lose game license

Santa Fe—A points system being considered for game law violations could lead to automatic revocation of hunting and fishing license privileges for several hundred wildlife law violators a year, according to the Department of Game and Fish.

The proposed system was discussed at the state game commission meeting in Farmington Wednesday and is slated for final adoption at the commission's August 19 meeting in Albuquerque. A person who accumulates a total of 20 or more points within three years would be subject to automatic revocation. Points range from five for minor violations up to 20 for il-

legally killing big game, hunting with artificial lights, or committing criminal trespass.

The commission also agreed to a request from Glorieta-area residents to scale back a proposed elk hunt in the area this fall. Currently 93 hunters would be issued either-sex licenses for the hunt. Area residents have expressed feelings that too many elk could be taken and asked that the bag limit be changed to mature bull or that hunters be offered an option to hunt elsewhere.

The commission is considering changes in the hunt structure, and will act on the amendments, if any, at its August meeting.

# Don't get hooked by fishing report

The peak of fishing interest is here. Most common questions from anglers include, "Where? How? What bait? or I tried last weekend and got skunked."

Quite a few folks rely on the weekly fishing report for guidance. But, this report reflects what anglers did the previous weekend and many times their success or lack of it would not be considered an absolute.

I've had some of my best fishing in waters listed as "poor" or "fair." Many times anglers not accustomed to changing condition will continue to use the same bait, lures or techniques that worked back in "ought six" or whenever.

Fish, water, weather all have direct impact on fishing and these variables change constantly. The more successful anglers are usually the most adaptable and flexible.

For example, if garlic cheese worked for stocker rainbows two weeks ago in high, discolored water, most experienced anglers would be skeptical of success with the same bait and technique when the water turned gin clear and only brown trout remained between stockings.

I'd guarantee that under the changed conditions the garlic cheese dunker would get skunked. Conversely, the experienced dryfly or stealthy spinner fisher would do very well

in the clear water on the more selective browns.

One of the largest rainbows I ever hooked resulted from using unconventional techniques. The battle lasted only a few seconds with the fish easily breaking my line. At age fourteen my experience level was low but I probably would never have tried the different lure or technique if I had been locked in by years of fishing only one way. By the way, that fish was hooked in a high mountain lake in Colorado using a red and white flatfish on light, four pound monofilament. Ahead of the lure I had attached quite a few split shot for depth and casting distance. The fish was in the ten to fifteen pound category, took the lure near shore, instantly stripped all the line from the reel and broke the line without missing a fin beat.

A few years ago while fishing the famous

San Juan River of Northwest New Mexico a similar, unconventional technique paid off. I was float fishing the river well below the quality water section. I knew that worms, various flies and spinners were working in that section but on the off chance of enticing an out-sized brown trout I tried something different. Some bass lures were sitting in the tackle box just begging to be used for the larger trout. So on went a thin minnow, deep diving bass plug in rainbow trout coloration.

Bingo! The first fish on was a very large Snake River cutthroat. A few years before that, while fishing the lower Red River near the Rio Grande, a very similar situation presented itself. I had been catching and releasing small rainbows and brown trout all day when it occurred to me that since it was fall some large browns may be in the river. I tied on a small, shallow running balsa minnow, cast out into the deep, foam covered pool and bang! Using plugs in small streams was not supposed to work.

In any case using some imagination can pay off. Don't always believe the fishing reports. Remember that the anglers fishing last week on whichever water may all have been using the same bait, the same technique and the same excuses for no fishing luck. Have fun and experiment!

### Watch for kids!

Back to school time is a good time to remind drivers to be especially careful on our windy, mountain roads.

Kids come out in force when the school busses roll, so watch out for them waiting alongside the streets, boarding the busses and getting off after school.

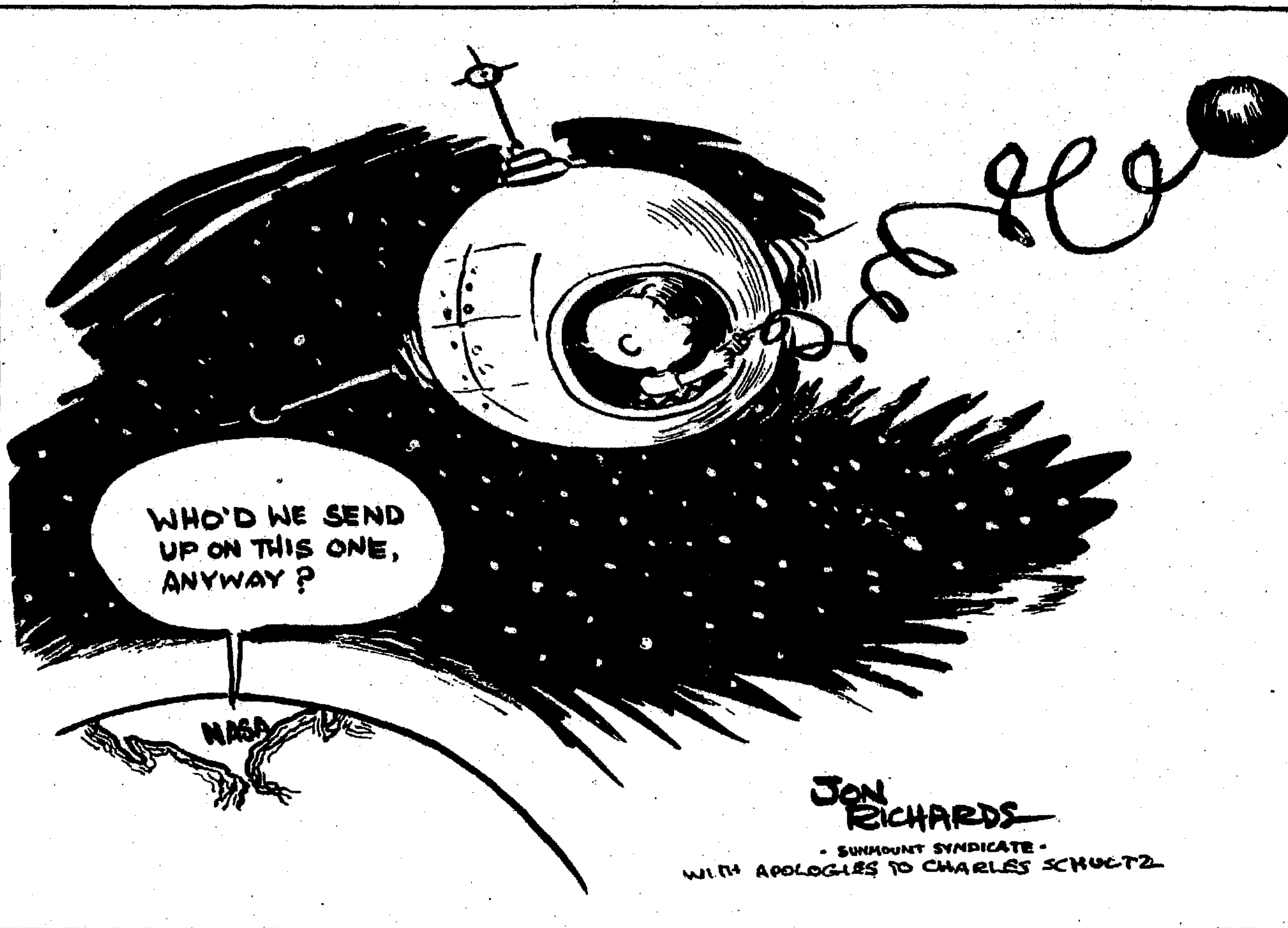
State laws require that drivers stop when approaching or overtaking from either direction a school bus which has stopped on the street with its lights flashing. Stop 10 feet before reaching the school bus.

If the bus is on a divided road, the cars facing the bus don't have to stop, but the ones behind the bus still must stop. Watch for the STOP signs that bus drivers extend from the side of the bus.

In areas where the bus driver pulls off the roadway into special bus stops (like the Ponderosa Heights bus shelter on Mechem Drive), then traffic can proceed on the street, but even then — be sure to slow down.

Watch for pedestrian crosswalks and abide by the slower speed limits in and around school zones. Ruidoso Police are vigilant in enforcing those speeding regulations around schools, so lighten up on the accelerator and you'll save yourself a ticket, besides ensuring the safety of students.

Drive carefully and do your part to guarantee another safe year on the roads for area school children.

And then there's Dick Nixon, a guy who just couldn't take criticism.

Nixon said we wouldn't have him to kick around anymore and then he proceeded to make a comeback and be elected president. His bent for secrecy led this nation into a sad chapter of history — the Watergate scandal.

Al Junge wondered the other day what we would write about if we didn't have Councilor Ron Andrews.

So, Al, what's your point?

How many village councilors ask for and get tax money to promote their own enter-



prise? We can think of just one.

How many councilors helped draft a "special events policy" designed for their own rowdy event? We can think of only one.

How many councilors don't bother to declare a conflict when issues involving their business come up for debate and vote — issues like auditing lodgers? We know of one who just happens to be a lodger, and instead of declaring a conflict, participated in the debate and voted against audits, saying he wouldn't vote to have himself audited.
