Speck resigns

Ruidoso High School head football coach Mike Speck resigned.

Principal Mike Kakuska announced Friday that Speck, who has been head football coach for the last two years, had turned in his resignation as coach and physical education teacher.

Speck, who has led the Warriors to a 6-16 record over the last two years, also coached the Warriors for five years as an assistant under Cooper Henderson from 1984 to 1988.

Kakuska said he and athletic director Ronny Maskew met with Speck on Thursday to discuss the football program when he gave his resignation which will also go before the school board at its meeting Tuesday night.

Speck said he had been considering the move quite awhile because of unresolvable differences in the athletic program. Something had to give, he said.

"My impression when I came back was that the administration was going to resume a commitment

they had made (in 1984-1988), not just to football but to all athletics," Speck said.

"My personal philosophy of football does demand a year-round commitment of sorts. That is not the philosophy of this district and that is fine. We just couldn't mesh," he said.

"It runs deeper than me and the football program. I just sound off because it affects me the most. The win-loss record doesn't have anything to do with it. If we want to compete, the athletic program has to be structured differently," Speck said.

He said he has been in touch with some different people, but has not made a decision on his future plans. He is in no rush and he and his wife, Ann, won't be leaving Ruidoso until he has found a definite position. As of now his last day will be the last day of school.

The school will accept applications for a secondary teacher and head football coach starting today until February 7, when a selection committee will begin to choose finalists. Maskew said they would like to have the interviews and select a person by February 28.

Applications may be obtained from the Ruidoso Municipal Schools Administration Office or from Maskew.

The position is open to any certified teacher either within this school system or outside of it, Kakuska said.

"We don't have anyone in mind. We just want the very best person as a teacher or a coach. We are leaving that door open at this point," he said.

"I would like to thank Coach Speck for his dedication and hard work the past two years. I have never seen a man who has worked so hard at a task as Mike did with this team. We wish him the best in whatever he decides to do," said Kakuska.

Tribe to hear N-waste report

A first-stage document on a proposed nuclear waste repository should be ready within the next two weeks, according to a consultant to the Mescalero Apache tribe.


Last week Miller Hudson, field representative for Pacific Nuclear Systems, said a Phase I study on the proposal looks at three possible

locations for a storage site. According to published reports, he denied allegations by members of a Ruidoso group called Save the Sacramentos who said the project had gone into Phase 2 already.

A Phase 2 study would depend on a contract agreement between the council and the

company, he said.

A Phase 2 document would narrow the search for an acceptable site, include environmental assessments of proposed locations, economic impact statements and negotiate for approval with surrounding governments, he said.

Snow turns the village white

Ruidoso, facing a winter of near record snows, received 12 more inches of wet sticky snow over the weekend.

Unlike the last snow storm this one produced no power outages and the cable TV stayed operative to the delight of football fans.

However, the storm closed U.S. Highway 70 between Roswell and Tularosa Sunday night and created dangerous driving conditions over a wide area in Southern New Mexico.

Also schools in Ruidoso, Mescalero and Capitan were closed today due to the treacherous driving conditions. Schools were closed and delayed throughout the state as snow swept through.

There were no injury accidents reported in Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs or in Lincoln County, although there were numerous fender-benders and lots of vehicles "in the ditch."

There were a couple of accidents on Ski Run Road that had the potential for disaster.

In one, a Jeep with five occupants hung precariously over the edge of the road, dangerously close to tumbling down the mountain, however the occupants and vehicle were rescued, avoiding a calamity.

State Police, Ruidoso Police and Sheriff's deputies all were on the roads reminding drivers that chains were required for Ski Run

Road, and at times, chains were a must to get anywhere in town, with cars slipping and sliding along the stretch of Sudderth near the Pizza Hut.

At times, all area wreckers were in use, pulling cars and trucks out of ditches. Village road crews were out Sunday, grading, salting and keeping village roads open as tourists here for the weekend were hitting the streets to head home.

This morning the storm was moving out of the area and leaving a beautiful postcard scene in the Playground of the Southwest.

Ski Apache is the beneficiary of the weather.

While the storm has caused minor problems for schools, police departments and village snow removal crews, Ski Apache General Manager Roy Parker has nothing but smiles. He has run out of adjectives to describe the ski conditions on the slopes.

Heavy snows this fall and winter and improved grooming methods have created excellent-plus conditions on the mountain.

Over Saturday and Sunday there was a reported 23 inches of new snow at the ski area and settled snow depth at midway was 74 inches.

The sun is expected to make a visit today, making for perfect skiing.

Underwood looks forward to session

State Representative John Underwood (D-Ruidoso) is preparing for the legislative session that begins on January 21.

This, Underwood's second regular session, is the 30-day or "short session" in which only budgetary items, items on the Governor's call, or Constitutional amendments may be addressed.

Looking back on the past year Underwood is proud of having opened up communication with the people that he represents by holding town meetings in several municipalities. He is gratified that the house redistricting, based on the 1980 census, has consolidated all of Lincoln County and Ruidoso into one district. He feels that this will enable him to be physically closer to those he represents and he will be more in tune with the issues they are concerned with.

Some of the budget issues that he wants to concentrate on in this session are:

-Continued funding of Eastern New Mexico State University-Ruidoso Instructional Center. The enrollment in this facility is double what was projected. ENMU anticipates spending \$125,000 to \$150,000 in salaries at the Ruidoso facility.

-He wants continued funding for the completion of the Convention/Civic Center. According to Underwood, this project is unique in New Mexico. It represents a marriage of private and public funds that combine to create a facility that is the first of its type in New Mexico. Santa Fe has a converted school as a convention center and Taos has no facility. He says that Ruidoso is recognized by state leaders as being very aggressive in having visualized and realized the golf course, civic center and proposed hotel concept.

-The Village Council call to the legislature will be addressed by Underwood next week when he meets with village manager Ron Wicker

and deputy manager Gary Jackson.

The MainStreet project is facing the need for additional funding in this session. Underwood feels that funding will be forthcoming since historically once the legislature has initiated a project like MainStreet, they will continue to financially support it. Underwood sees this as a very important project in the future of Ruidoso.

-Regarding to schools, Underwood wants to ensure the integrity of the rural school systems. He feels that in order to do this the recent density factor method of funding must be rescinded and the state revert to the original concept of funding. Additionally on the governor's call this session is a bill enacting collective bargaining for teachers in the state. On this issue Underwood feels, as do many other rural legislators, that if collective bargaining, desired by labor leaders in metro areas, is inevitable then it should be on a local option basis.

The funding issue and the collective bargaining issue must be addressed with a united front from the rural areas, he says.

-Underwood is in favor of a constitutional amendment favoring local option on video gambling and possibly a state lottery. He believes that with Colorado recently allowing video gambling and low stakes table games, New Mexico must follow suit in order to compete for tourists. Video gambling, and low stake table gambling, has a potential of paying \$30 million directly to the state and another \$250 million to the various areas. He thinks this is a completely new industry for the state that we cannot afford to overlook.

-In regards to the Monitored Retrievable Storage facility (MRS) being studied for the Mescalero Apache Indian Reservation, he is opposed to it largely on the psychological impact that it would have on this area's pristine environment and the devastation on the real estate and tourist market. Governor Bruce King has recently

appointed a task force to look into ways to help the Indian nations to pursue economic development.

"I think that the governor is so opposed to any more nuclear waste being deposited in the state that he will really try to help the Indians with their economic development," Underwood says. "Also we must remember that Mescalero Tribal President Wendell Chino has said all along that the MRS will not be on tribal land. I hope that he can trade for land and operate the facility far from our area."

"I want to work to repeal the taxes that are levied on horse feed and on training fees for race horses," Underwood says. "I feel that the way to build an economic base is from the ground up, let new businesses be established and let them prosper. That is better than taxing out of existence, industries that are established and perhaps prospering."

"Racing is a \$750 million business in the state and we need to protect that. Our racing industry is facing new competition from Texas and possibly Colorado. We cannot

afford to overtax it and run off a business that has helped us through the hard times."

Underwood is hoping to support a proposed constitutional amendment sponsored by Senator Ramon Maes. This amendment will make it easier to allow private capital to be combined with public money to fund development of various projects.

"Such an amendment would have made our Convention/Civic Center much easier to accomplish," he says.

-He wants to support a bill that will allow local jurisdictions to increase the gross receipts in their particular area in order to finance local infrastructure.

In summation he states that he has a problem with the increase of taxes, period, whether it is imposition of a new type of tax or an increase in existing taxes such as the gross receipts tax.

Underwood shows such delight in his job that it radiates throughout the interview, and it makes one wonder why everyone cannot have a job that they enjoy as much.

Briefs

Trash talks scheduled today

Members of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority are scheduled to meet with Otero County Commissioners at 1:30 p.m. today (January 13) in the Otero County Courthouse.

They will listen to updates on the status of the Otero County landfill expansion application at Dog Canyon and on the financing and operation of waste management in Lincoln County. Jim French, representing the Lundell System of Waste Management, will give a presentation on an innovative recycling program that is touted as being able to handle more than 90 percent of garbage generated in a community.

ENMU enrollment jumps

Enrollment in January jumped by nearly 30 percent over the fall semester at the Ruidoso Instructional Center of Eastern New Mexico University, illustrating the community's continuing support for locally available higher education.

Office manager Sally Moore said enrollment reached 364 students and is expected to go even higher before late registration for the spring session ends January 21. About 250 students enrolled for the center's first semester last fall.

The crush of new students prompted the college to double its teaching staff to 26 instructors. The most popular subjects continue to be computers, Spanish and history. A new addition, a music course in guitar, also proved to be a favorite, Moore said.

The new weekend college also saw a solid response with classes in physical education, psychology, computers and English.

Palette painters to be honored

The public is invited Saturday, January 25 to a "thank you" recognition party honoring artists who painted the Christmas palettes that decorated downtown Ruidoso.

The palettes will be on display from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on the deck at Le Claire's Mountain Village. Refreshments will be served courtesy of Le Claire's and Paul and Barbara Westbrook. The palette program is scheduled to be started again next August in preparation for the 1992 holiday season.

Texas-New Mexico Power and the Village of Ruidoso also will be honorees at the party. Members of the Arts and Film Commission will be there to explain the program and future projects.

Casting begins for filming in Ruidoso and Las Cruces

Casting for the motion picture, "The Nature of the Beast," began Tuesday in the Drama Department at New Mexico State University, and will continue until all people who are interested in reading for the parts have had the opportunity to do so, according to a news release.

Filming is scheduled to get under way around January 13, and should be completed in two or three weeks, according to Ellen Lively Steele, co-producer.

Most of the exterior scenes will be filmed in Las Cruces and Ruidoso, according to the release. Interior scenes are scheduled for filming at the Garson Studios on the campus of the College of Santa Fe in Santa Fe.

In the race for municipal judge Margie Morales will be in the first position, followed by incumbent Judge Harold Mansell. Former mayor Jake Harris will be third on the list. Former municipal judge Fred Bernard will be fourth on the ballot for judge.

Municipal animal control falls prey to Village of Ruidoso budget cuts

The caller was frightened and angry. A pack of hungry dogs was roaming around her home and she was afraid to go outside.

But by the time Ruidoso police officers arrived on the scene, the dogs were gone.

Since last November, the officers have incorporated the duties of animal impounding into their regular job description.

It's a matter of saving money in a tight budget, said police chief Richard Swenor.

The village has been operating without an impounding officer since Mark Hughes, the man who picked up stray, injured and dead animals for the past four years, resigned.

Village Manager Ron Wicker said a new impounding officer should be hired by June when the town is flooded with seasonal residents and tourists.

"We will fill the position, but not right away," Wicker said. Meanwhile, he is exploring other options than the previous arrangement un-

der which Hughes was employed through the police department.

"We're going to talk to Ruidoso Downs since it's a duplicate type effort and we're looking at avenues such as using a private firm or group to handle the job, like a janitorial service or solid waste company."

Wicker said he has been assured by Swenor that village officers can handle the job in the interim.

"They have the equipment and personnel to take care of the bites and dogs at large," he said.

But Wicker acknowledged that since the officers only respond to complaint calls, often the offending animals are gone by the time the officers reach the scene. That situation is in contrast to an impounding officer who can stake out an area and is familiar with trouble spots and problem animals.

Swenor told The Ruidoso News

that he considered the job part of his officer's duty, not an addition.

To help the officers, "we got more capture poles and equipment," he said. That includes gauntlets for his officers' hands and arms.

"Three officers have been bitten within one month," he said.

It's true that his officers may not always be able to capture the animals reported, Swenor said.

"That depends on the availability of manpower and the (impounding) truck. But they try to identify the dogs and talk to the owner."

"For the first offense (of allowing a dog to run at large), they will leave a warning tag on the door knob if they can't talk to the owner in person."

"They will issue a citation on the second incident and we can take the owner to court."

Any officer in the department may be called upon to help.

"If they catch the call, they're the ones that do it although some would prefer a root canal," he said.

Randy Basch, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter that houses animals impounded from Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs, said he hasn't noticed a discernible change in the number of animals being brought to the facility.

"The officers have brought me several dogs and a few times have called me to help them in situations they were not used to handling," Basch said.

"When calls come in here, I refer them to the police department. Apparently they're doing a pretty good job. In fact, just the other day the chief drove up in a truck and brought me a pup. I congratulated him on his promotion."

High speed chase ends in arrests

A high speed chase by car and on foot early Monday morning ended in the arrest of two illegal aliens south of Carrizozo.

At 4:01 a.m., Lincoln County Sheriff's Deputy Ken Jones was patrolling about five miles south of Corona when he spotted a 1980 Ford pickup truck that matched the description of a vehicle he was attempting to locate.

However, a license check coughed up a stolen vehicle report of a truck taken early Saturday morning in Pratt, Kansas, according to Sheriff James McSwane.

Jones continued to follow the truck without turning on his lights to alert the occupants. He called for

backup.

Several more deputies responded and with the help of the Carrizozo Police Department a road-block was set up at the edge of town on U.S. 54.

The driver of the truck managed to get around the roadblock and bolted through the main intersection. He tried to lose the patrol cars on the back streets of the town, but knocked down a stop sign and crashed into a building behind a closed Western Auto store.


Two men jumped out of the car and took off on foot. Deputies found a 22 caliber rifle in the truck and suspected at least one of the men

was armed with a handgun, McSwane said.

"We gave chase on foot and tracked them for about eight to 10 miles to the O Bar O Ranch property," he said. They stopped when the officers got within six to seven feet, but then took off again. They didn't go far. It was stupid running off in fresh snow where we could track them so easily."

A four-wheel drive vehicle was used to help the three deputies and sheriff, but fences interfered, he said.

The men were arrested at 8:40 a.m., but had not been identified by press time.

Commission to consider land trade

Land management and the protection of private property rights will be the focus of the Lincoln County Commission meeting Tuesday.

The meeting will begin at 9 a.m. in the commission room of the County Courthouse in Carrizozo.

Commissioners will hear an update on the status of a proposed swap of privately owned land along the Rio Bonito for isolated tracts of federally owned lands, including property near Las Cruces.

If the deal is approved by the agency's state director, nearly 2,000 acres of privately-owned land

around the historic town of Lincoln would be acquired by the Bureau of Land Management. Two commissioners have voiced their opposition to the trade, although the Lincoln Historic Preservation Board has endorsed it, saying it would protect the cultural and historic integrity of the Lincoln area.

In connection to the proposed land deal, the commission will consider a recommendation from its agriculture and rural affairs committee on the adoption of an interim land use policy. The policy aims at establishing the county's right for input in such deals, to ensure it

is included in the consideration process, to require federal agencies to assess economic and other impacts and to require them to follow all county zoning and other ordinances.

Commissioners also are scheduled to review the proposed interim land use ordinance, but they cannot take action until it is advertised for public hearing.

Jean Bailey of the Regional Advertising Board has requested a spot on the agenda. Appointments to the historic preservation board also are to be considered.

School Board deals with personnel

The staff of White Mountain Intermediate will describe the school's special education inclusion program Tuesday during the meeting of the Ruidoso School Board.

The session will begin at 7 p.m. in the board room of the adminis-

tration office.

The program recently was selected for a Quality in Education award and is a new approach to integrating special education students into the regular classroom.

Also on the agenda, School Supt.

Mike Gladden will give an update on the White Mountain construction project and other upcoming building projects. He will report on final enrollment figures and the resulting level of state funding and on a drug testing program.

Weather story is clarified

A weather article that appeared in The Ruidoso News January 9 should have read as follows:

"Temperatures for the year averaged below normal for eight of the twelve months, December being the coldest with an average daily maximum of only 45.2 degrees. The coldest day was December 2 with a record low minimum for the date of only 1 degree above zero."

The story, written by meteorologist Bill Hostetter, also should have read:

"The warmest of the year was the 91 degrees of June 25 and June 26. June also produced the warmest average daily maximum temperature of 80 degrees, but that was a degree below the 30 year normal for the month. The average daily maximum temperature of only 75 degrees in July was five degrees cooler than normal."

School board issues \$2.5 million bonds

The Ruidoso School Board is expected to take action on two items of particular importance to area residents Tuesday.

The board is expected to take action on a concurrent enrollment proposal that would allow students to earn college credit at Eastern New Mexico University while attending high school.

Under fiscal items, the board is scheduled to award the sale of \$2.5-million in bonds, the first part of a \$5-million bond program of construction, renovation and equipment purchases approved by voters last year.

Aqua Fria organizes fire dept.

About 25 residents of Agua Fria and Palo Verde Slopes subdivisions met with Palo Verde-Glencoe fire chief Angel Chavez and his staff Wednesday to discuss the feasibility of establishing a new fire district substation.

The substation has been proposed by the state fire marshal's office as the best solution to shortening the response time to the subdivisions. Although they are situated within a few miles of the Ruidoso Downs fire station, that village has indicated it is not interested in providing coverage.

The subdivisions lie outside the village boundaries. The Downs department's first responsibility is to serve its own residents, village officials have said.

The Palo Verde fire station is about 12 miles away.

For the next two weeks, residents will attempt to build a sufficient list of volunteers to be on call and to man a substation in the immediate area, said resident Cathy Ames.

The group will meet again at 7 p.m. January 22 at the Circle B Campground Barn to determine whether the response has been sufficient to move ahead with the plan.

Ten people signed up at the meeting, "but we need more."

"There's a job for everybody," she said. "If you can't hold a hose, you can help with traffic control or something else."

Corky the Welsh Corgi will capture your heart

A low-to-the-ground bundle of loving loyalty, Corky the Welsh corgi captures attention wherever he goes.

The tan and black-colored stray was brought to the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter two weeks ago.

"He's about a year and a half old and very affectionate with everybody," said Randy Basch, shelter manager.

"He probably would do well with cats. In fact, I don't think there's anybody he couldn't get along with, he's so good-natured."

Corky definitely should be an indoor dog, Basch said.

"He should be a companion dog, one that a person can snuggle with. He appears to be housebroken."

Typical corgi size, Corky is about eight inches high at the shoulder and weighs about twenty pounds. He is sponsored by a society contributor for neutering, the major cost of adoption.

All animals adopted from the shelter must be spayed and neutered to ensure they will not contribute to the stream of unwanted litters that are abandoned each year and often destroyed.

Basch reminded Ruidoso Downs residents that if their dogs have been loose and are missing, they may have been picked up and brought to the shelter.

Under a new arrangement with the Downs board of trustees, impounded animals will be housed in the society facility on Gavilan Canyon Road.

"Within the last two days, I have received 19 new animals, mostly

dogs from the Ruidoso Downs area," Basch said, noting the shelter already was crowded.

"The new impounding officer really is hitting the area. I figured the Downs would add maybe nine new dogs a month, but also took into account it might be more in these first few months. I didn't expect this many."

"I want to be sure that people know this is where they should check if they care for their animals and want them back."

PAST PETS

Basch is very anxious to find homes for eight dogs featured as pets of the week in the past, but not adopted.

"This is the time of year when adoptions slow down, but the flow of dogs into the shelter doesn't stop," Basch said. He soon will have to make life-and-death decisions as he did right after Christmas when the shelter became too crowded.

Misty, the lovely, lonely greyhound, and Doc, the normally lively and affectionate bird dog, are beginning to lose hope that they will find new homes.


Van Tussenbroek also announced that pay telephones in this area are being converted to "prepay" to conform to pay phones in other areas.

New federal rule will make life easier for the disabled, but it may complicate life for small business operators

Imagine trying to enjoy all the shops and businesses in Ruidoso if you are in a wheelchair or sight impaired. Can you make it through doorways or to restrooms? Will you be able to go through the aisles of a store?

In three weeks many businesses that provide public accommodations will have to deal with these problems because of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) which was passed in 1990. ADA bans discrimination which denies persons with disabilities the full and equal enjoyment of the goods, services, facilities or privileges of private entities serving the public.

Real estate agencies are also in this category as a service provider and will be required to meet these specifications. To better understand these changes the Board of Realtors invited Dave Thomsen, village at-

torney, to speak to them at a meeting Wednesday.

Thomsen said it is a complicated issue that is hard to get enthusiastic about, but the justice department, plaintiffs and their lawyers will be interested as complaints are heard on the issue. He said a problem with the act is that it uses "soft" words, and their definitions may change each year.

The act includes five sections such as discrimination in private-sector employment, public accommodations, public services, transportation and telecommunications. Public services and accommodations cover hotels, restaurants, bars, stores, service establishments such as banks, laundromats, offices of health care providers, accountants, museums, schools, service center and other public gathering places.

By January 26 these businesses with 25 or fewer employees and revenues of \$1 million or less will need to begin making the changes necessary to accommodate people with disabilities. Businesses with 10 or fewer employees and revenues of \$500,000 or less will have to comply by January 26, 1993.

All aspects of a service building will have very specific requirements, in some cases the dimensions are even down to the millimeter, Thomsen said. He said he does have the addresses of departments that can give the specific measurements for businesses.

Business will have to consider any architectural barriers such as counters or steps, but the reconstruction necessary to meet these standards will be costly, Thomsen said.

Thomsen said the United States Department of Justice will be the one to follow up on the complaints, and that may be one of the few ways to find out about a business that doesn't meet the new requirements. Private legal suits will not be allowed until after July 1992 if a business has 25 or fewer employees, while suits will not be allowed on businesses with fewer than 10 employees until after July 1993.

"The main incentive for the business to meet the requirements is the threat of a suit," Thomsen said.

The justice department will probably look to see if the business has made a plan on the changes when it considers the complaint, Thomsen said. He said he hopes the department will use a little common sense when they begin enforcing the rules taking into consideration the terrain the buildings and

streets are on.

The city building inspector has no authority to enforce the act, he said.

"That is both a blessing and a problem because it gets us out of the loop of doing the job of the U.S. Justice Department. It will also be harder for our citizens to tell if a building is in compliance," Thomsen said.

Thomsen said the department could become more stringent with the requirements after the January 26 deadline. Any new construction after 1993 will have to be readily accessible to the disabled, he said.

From his reading of the act, Thomsen said if making the structural changes would be too costly for the business, it may be exempt until other construction work is done. An example would be if a door is too narrow but would re-

quire an excessive cost in tearing down a bearing wall, the business would be exempt until it had to do other structural work that involves the area.

Mary Maul, project director of MainStreet Ruidoso, said the ADA was taken into consideration when they made plans for renovations on Sudderth Drive. She said the act was passed in 1990 when the engineers made the master plans.

One specific item that the act requires is that the sidewalks be four feet wide. Sidewalks will also have handicap accessibility with ramps built to the proper specifications, she said.

Maul said they have tried to comply with the act. According to a national MainStreet publication, the Architectural and Barriers Compliance Board is responsible for developing these guidelines.

Many taxpayers ignore required state certificate

Fewer than half of the anticipated applications for the new series of non-taxable transaction certificates were received on time, according to Dick Minzner, secretary of the New Mexico taxation and revenue department.

"The curtain has gone up, but most of the actors refuse to get on the stage," said Minzner.

About 18,000 taxpayers have applied for the new certificates, which are required for transactions after January 1. The Taxation and Revenue department believes there are about 40,000 taxpayers currently using these certificates.

The worst responses have been from Lincoln, Torrance and Union counties, all at 28 percent of the expected applications received.

Lincoln County was expected to have 807 applications, but the department has only received 225.

Statewide, about 45 percent of the expected applications have been received.

The 18,000 taxpayers who have already applied received their new certificates before January 1. Addi-

tional taxpayers who mailed their applications before the end of November should have received their certificates by January 10, said Minzner.

Taxpayers who applied in December may not received theirs until February.

Businesses issue non-taxable transaction certificates to their suppliers when they purchase goods or services for resale, such as restaurants buying food or auto mechanics buying parts. Also non-profit organizations, including churches, issue these certificates whenever they buy items for their own use.

Minzner said that some businesses and non-profits might not be greatly inconvenienced by receiving their certificates in mid-January, depending entirely on when they make their purchases.

Taxpayers may obtain applications for the new certificates by calling any local district Taxation and Revenue or by calling the Santa Fe office at 827-0909.

Withholding rates remain same

In answer to the numerous calls coming into the Taxation and Revenue Department, Secretary Dick Minzner announced that there is no change in the withholding tax rates for 1992 and therefore the department will not be sending out new withholding tax packets for 1992. The exemption adjustment will also remain the same for 1992.

The withholding tax packet sent out in January, 1991 will remain in effect and should be used for 1992. Anyone who needs a 1991 withholding tax packet should contact the local Taxation and Revenue Department district office.


The day is warming up rapidly, the way the days will be doing as each day is a little longer, and the sun a little higher in its pathway through the sky.

A heavy snow back through the years has often brought below zero weather, usually in January. Although the next to the coldest day I have seen here in the vale came February 16, 1963, with 14 below. The coldest was that same year on January 17 at 17 below.

That was the day that my little Spirit Dog Shady Logan, came to the house through the deep snow, a little half Coyote half collie two months old—crossing the frozen ice over the river.

Thunder in January

Just after dark on January 6, New Mexico's eightieth birthday, the clouds moved in rapid-



ly over the western hills, and then I could not believe my ears. Was that thunder, or a jet plane? Sure enough, the lightning flashed amid the clouds. It is always a welcome sound — the first thunder of the year, usually in March or April. But in January surely Jack Frost and the weather spirits have made a mistake.

Whenever I hear the first thunder, the words of the old Spiritual song come to mind:

"My Lord calls me
He calls me by the thunder
The trumpet sounds
Within-a my soul."

With a rush down the valley here came the rain, large drops beating a tattoo on the roof, and making a rushing, splashing sound against the windows and the outside walls — always music to your ears — and yet a surprise here in the deep of winter.

Maybe the weather spirits were putting on a special lightning and thunder celebration for the State of New Mexico on the evening of its eightieth birthday.

The Warriors traveled to Carlsbad on Friday and Saturday to compete with 17 other teams in the Carlsbad Tournament, and although they didn't place high several wrestlers are progressing well.

At 160 pounds, Poncho Portillo finished in third place at the tournament with five wins and only one loss. Scott Stricklin wrestled at 135 pounds and had three wins and two losses at the meet.

Shane Eidson only competed in three matches, but had two victories before being injured in a loss to a Las Lunas wrestler. Jerry Romero and Matt Bates both ended the day with one victory and two losses in their weight classes.

Other wrestlers competing and finishing the day with a 0-2 record are Gunner Johnson, Jose Pierto,

Victor Cocchiola, Sam Gumbert, Chris Carusona, Joe Zinn and Mario Sanchez.

The mid-school team competed on Thursday against Gadsden Junior High school but was not able to pull off a victory. The final score was 32-43.

On January 7, the Warriors had a dual at Oñate in Las Cruces. The Warriors lost 20-53, but Coach Gerald Ames said the defeat sounded a lot worse than it actually was. He said they made silly errors and lost matches that they were winning.

"I wasn't really disappointed because they are an extremely tough team and always start out strong," said Ames.

In the light weights, Gunner Johnson got a forfeit at 103 pounds, while Jose Pierto, at 112 pounds, was ahead in the first two periods, but was pinned in the last period. At 119 pounds Jerry Romero also had a forfeit.

Sam Gumbert kept his match close in the first two periods, but his opponent took control in the third period to beat him 2-12. Louis

Jimenez was up 6-5 in the second period, but was then quickly pinned. At 135 pounds Scott Stricklin fought hard but was beaten by a technical fall.

Chris Carusona was ahead 6-3 but then got pinned. Joe Zinn wrestled at 145 pounds, but didn't have the experience to stop his competitor from pinning him. At 152 pounds Matt Bates was also no match for his more experienced opponent and was pinned.

Heavy snow makes great skiing

New Mexico has been left in the white aftermath of a second major winter storm in a week and, once again, is reporting some of the best ski area base depths and conditions in the country.

Ski Apache is at its best right now too. Pat Morrison, public relations director, said the base snow is 52 inches which has resulted in the best skiing ever at the resort. The resort received 10 inches on Monday and Tuesday.

"Skiing doesn't get any better than this," Morrison said.

With all the heavy snow over the last few weeks, the Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce has sent out press releases to about 150 newspapers in eight states including New Mexico. Chamber director Jerry Watts said the snow fall makes for great news.

The Phil Price Advertising Agency of Lubbock, Texas, is also

helping get the information out by calling Ruidoso each week and then telling the radio stations in the area.

Santa Fe ski area, which has been one of the snowiest ski areas anywhere this season according to all the major national snow reporting agencies, has one of the two best base reports in the United States today. According to Ski New Mexico, Santa Fe is reporting an 80 inch base after picking up seven inches of new snow overnight and 18 inches in the last week.

And Santa Fe isn't the only area with great conditions as the latest storm hasn't played any favorites. Angel Fire has 40 inches for a base, with 12 inches in the last week. Enchanted Forest XC has a base of 33 inches with 14 inches in the last week.

Pajarito has also had 14 inches in the past week to make a base of

70 inches. Red River received 15 inches for a base of 56 inches. Sandia Peak has a 50 inch base with seven inches in the last week. Sipapu had nine inches in the last week for a base of 31 inches. Taos Ski Valley received 20 inches of snow and now has a base of 68 inches.

The better news is after record holiday crowds were seen at many of New Mexico's ski areas most everyone has gone home and those freshly snow covered slopes are wide open. Joe Turiciano, operations manager at Santa Fe, said a winter like this year's with heavy early season snow and consistent storms almost weekly comes along only once every seven years or so.

For skiers that means unusually good conditions at a time when it's uncrowded and that makes for an exciting chance to Ski New Mexico.

White Mountain Intermediate wins Quality in Education title

A caravan of special education instructors, regular classroom teachers and administrators from White Mountain Intermediate headed to Albuquerque last weekend.

The school was one of six chosen by the New Mexico Research and Study Council of the University of New Mexico to receive a Quality in Education award.

They were selected for their unique approach for integrating special education students into the regular classroom.

"They award in the categories of science, humanities, social studies, community relations and other," said special education teacher Richard Erhard. "We won in the other category because, although initially we confined the program to science and social studies, we broaden it to touch all of the others, including written language and occupational therapy."

Over the last few years, the need to include special education chil-

dren in the regular classroom environment in a more appropriate way has been documented, Erhard said.

"Under the old mainstreaming approach, the special education children were sent to the regular classroom and told to perform," he said. "You might be talking about a child with a grade equivalent reading level of 2.5 being sent into a fifth grade class."

Instead of sending the children to the classroom by themselves, The Intermediate school staff sends a special education representative with them to give whatever support is needed to succeed, Erhard said.

As a side bonus, the teacher-pupil ratio goes down since the special education instructor will work with other children in class too, kids at risk or just in need of temporary help.

"It's a collaboration between special education and regular education teachers," Erhard said.

"The regular classroom teacher doesn't have the time or expertise to deal with some of the remedial

problems," he said.

The project was started last school year in January as a pilot program for the entire district.

"At this point, inclusion happens in some form district-wide," Erhard said. "The pilot flew and it flew well."

The program was nominated after the university study council called for proposals last October.

"We formalized what we had been doing and it was judged in first place," he said.

The awards banquet was Friday. Traveling to the ninth annual award ceremony were the regular and special education teachers: Kathy Crane, Donna Hamilton, Libby Sears, Cindy Paxton, Cindy Morgan, Denise Hawthorne, Jeamsie Price, Nam Wierwille, Rebecca Johnston, Jane Tully and Erhard. They were joined by Principal Don Weems, School Supt. Mike Gladden and Special Education Services director Karen Tillman.

Dr. Linda Wilson, the director of special education for the state, sat at the table with them.



Leave nuclear waste where it's generated!

As this country heads into a new year, columnists all over are writing about what's hot and what's not.

New Mexico, the Sunshine State, has been hot for several years — the chills, the howling coyotes and such. The state's not that trendy now, but New Mexico may give new meaning to what's hot in the years to come if it becomes host to the nation's nuclear waste. We'll be the hottest property in the world.

But that heat won't extend to the tourist economy. With the whole world to choose from, vacationers aren't going to head out to the nuclear capital of the world to ski the green snow or watch the fastest horses in the world speed around a radioactive track.

All those jokes about glowing people aren't that funny in the context of the devastation that accompanies even the tiniest nuclear accident. And, history has shown that, accidents do happen. Does anybody remember Chernobyl?

Nuclear power companies on the east coast wouldn't be bragging about their low utility rates if they had to factor in the disposal costs for nuclear waste. But, their customers have benefitted from the low prices, and then taxpayers are left holding the bag on disposal costs. New Mexico will be left with the whole thing — we're asked to take the trash and help pay the bill.

When all the costs and risks are weighed, the only logical solution for nuclear waste is to store it at the site where it is generated until some permanent facility is designed and built. Why endanger the entire country with a deadly cargo traveling by highway or rail?



Cashing a check at chain stores can be costly

TO THE EDITOR:

My wife and I have been living in Ruidoso for 15 years. We now have a little shop of our own and now our own home and land.

I work and my wife runs the shop. Anyway, I get paid every two weeks. I didn't cash my paycheck at the bank like I usually do, and on Sunday I decided to try cashing my check at the friendly Wal-Mart we frequent very often and where a large part of my paycheck usually goes anyhow, ever since the closing of Gibson's and Ben Franklins, thanks to Wal-Mart moving into town and cornering that market.

Anyway, I went through the checkout with a couple of items I needed. I asked to cash the check. I had to get it OK'd by the manager or assistant manager. She said they'd cash it if I bought \$39 worth of stuff from their store. She asked how much my purchase totaled, which was \$1.70. She laughed and shook her head.

I left and later returned and asked her why I had to buy \$39 worth of their stuff when just a week and half ago I spent right around \$400 on Christmas presents, not to mention what the

rest of my family spent there. (By the way, at that point in time, when I went through the checkout, I saw no one laughing or shaking their heads at the amount of money I was spending then.)

That didn't count because of store policy, she said. I said, yes, but I'm sure there are exceptions to the policy and that those exceptions were up to her discretion. I'm sure and that I had and showed her other money. I wanted to cash the check only because: 1. it would be convenient; 2. My wife and I had planned to buy something somewhere else, but it could wait; and that it's just the idea and the point of the matter. I also told her that I felt it was an insult, especially after supporting that outfit since day one. She just walked away.

Well, I was pretty mad about it, so when I left I shook my fist and displayed my displeasure and as I was leaving the parking lot drove by and displayed my displeasure again. Ten minutes later a policeman pulls into our shop parking lot and tells me that a lady at Wal-Mart called up and was afraid I had threatened her. I told him

what happened and that I didn't think I had broken any laws. He advised me that all she needed was to feel like she was being threatened in order for him to act on it.

I, by the way, went to Furr's also to cash my paycheck and they told me the same thing — that I had to spend \$39. Just two days earlier me and my wife just spent \$74 there. I can remember when Gibson's would cash my paycheck every time because they knew me and had seen me go in there all the time.

I can't help but notice how everybody in town, myself included, work, get paid and go straight to Wal-Mart and Furr's and spend most, if not all, of our paychecks at either store. I don't feel that asking them to cash a paycheck (without having to buy 10 percent or some set amount of unwanted items, especially after spending boo coo money already just a few days previous) is asking too much, do you?

Regarding this particular 10 percent policy, I just wonder how many hard earned dollars are spent every year on unwanted items bought only because someone (be it rich or

poor) was so in need of money right now that they would allow a portion of their check to be used for quick and unwanted spending.

I am sure this store policy has mainly the welfare of the store in mind; however, in this case I feel the manager used the policy to show lack of feeling and abundance of greed, especially after I explained my situation and they all having seen me go through their store many, many, many times spending, spending, spending.

Evidently we are all just cattle or low life peons to such big corporations like Wal-Mart and Furr's. I can remember when the customer was treated like the boss since they were the ones actually spending the money.

So, whatever you do, don't go to Wal-Mart and disagree with them and their policies and get fed up or mad enough to express your opinion, shake your fist and point your finger at them because they'll most likely sic the police on you, even though this is America and we are all allowed to express our opinions freely, right?

Section 1. Property Leased. The real and personal property

leased is described in Exhibit A to the lease, which exhibit is also attached to and made a part of this ordinance.

Section 2. Lease Term. The lease begins April 7, 1992 and continues until the purchase option is exercised or the agreement is sooner terminated.

Section 3. Lease Payments. Lessee agrees to make payments as specified in Exhibit B to the lease agreement, which exhibit is also attached to and made a part of this ordinance.

Section 4. Purchase Option. The Lessee may purchase the leased property on any anniversary date of the agreement or upon expiration of the term of the agreement according to a schedule of option prices.

Section 5. Special Obligations. The agreement is a limited obligation of the Lessee, not payable from general funds of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority.

Section 13. Title to Property. Title to the property leased is in the Lessor until Lessee exercises the purchase option.




