## Drug bust nets lucky 13

Before dawn on Friday, police officers from nine area police departments and two federal agencies fanned out across the Ruidoso area and arrested 13 suspected drug dealers.

Arrested were, Lorin Csesznegi, Angela Tognazi, Fred Gurule, Kurt Richardson, Jerry Chavez, Marsha Chavez, Thomas Mark Brunett, Jay L. Goodman, Leoncio Rodriguez, Todd Dentler, Martin Baca, Evott Nelson, and David Moran.

Not picked up Friday, but arrested later were two more suspects accused of distributing marijuana. They are Kerry E. Avery and Shawn Childress.

More than 60 officers participated in what was the Ruidoso's largest drug raid in more than six years.

On Thursday a special grand jury met in Carrizozo and returned

19 indictments covering 49 felony counts. Friday's action was the result.

Teams of four or five officers were dispatched from the Ruidoso Police Station at around 6 a.m. Friday. They fanned out over the Ruidoso area and arrested 13 of the alleged drug dealers.

Also targeted by the grand jury were eight vehicles that had reportedly been used in drug transactions. Arrest teams managed to confiscate seven of them in the raid.

The White Mountain Task Force (WMTF) is headed by Gonzalo Cordova with the assistance of Paul Wersich, Lincoln County Sheriff's Deputy. With the cooperation of area law enforcement agencies these two officers gathered the evidence necessary for the indictments. The task force is under the supervision of Lincoln County Sheriff James McSwane.

Deputy District Attorney Scot

Key, Cordova and Wersich coordinated the attack on Friday.

Before 9 a.m. all teams had reported back to the station after having completed the 13 arrests.

Several of the targeted suspects were out of town and several were not located at their homes.

The felony counts range from distribution of marijuana to trafficking cocaine by distribution. Most of those persons indicted had several felony counts lodged against them.

A U.S. Customs Service helicopter and drug-sniffing dog were also used in the operation.

Many of the arrests were the result of Cordova and Wersich having conducted undercover operations in buying drugs from suspected dealers.

Attention was drawn to some of the suspects by complaints from neighbors and people who knew them. One neighbor complained

about the number of visitors to a suspect's residence and the traffic on their street.

Cordova said that the task force was responding to the needs of the community.

There were no wholesale dealers caught in the net, but most law officers said that street traffic of drugs would be noticeably diminished by the raid.

Before the raid five arrests had been made and there was one arrest warrant outstanding.

After two arrests on the weekend there are now five arrest warrants outstanding.

WMTF was formed in July with a grant of \$100,000 from the Bureau of Justice. Matching funds were provided by Lincoln County.

Operations began in October and Friday's arrests were a result of

## Pickers protest MRS

Students from Save the Earth hosted protest signs onto their shoulders and paraded up and down the main street of Ruidoso Saturday and Sunday.

Between chants of "no nuclear waste," they asked residents and visitors to pen messages to Mescalero Tribal President Wendell Chino, urging him to abandon his interest in storing spent nuclear fuel rods on tribal-owned land.

The tribe already has received a \$100,000 grant from the Department of Energy and may receive another \$3-million to look at specific sites.

The energy department has turned to tribes to negotiate because they are viewed as sovereign nations. Past dealings with states have ended in failure with massive protests against temporary nuclear waste storage facilities.

Dave Dale, organizer of Save the Earth, worked with the students and adult advisers, Joe Avalos and Scott Perez. On Sunday, Harlyn Geronimo, who ran against Chino for president in the last tribal election, also joined the protest.

"We had 2,000 of the message petitions printed and hope to get 1,000 filled out by Monday," Dale said late last week. More than 25

people volunteered to carry the signs.

He said the demonstration would proceed rain or shine. What they received was mostly shine as the weather warmed on Sunday. Besides the action downtown, volunteers were scheduled to be protesting at The Covered Wagon, Wal-Mart and Furr's.

"Between now and the end of January we intend to hit Chino hard," Dale said. He added that Chino may not see the demonstrations firsthand because reports place the president in California at one of his other homes.

## LCMC tightens the budget

With the close of the fiscal year approaching at the end of March the Lincoln County Medical Center Board of Trustees approved a proposed budget for the next year at its meeting on Thursday.

Administrator Valerie Miller said the center is projecting an operating income of \$372,000 for 1992-1993 which reflects no rate increase. She said the assumptions in the budget are very conservative and take several issues into consideration.

One issue is that as of January 1 Medicare will no longer reimburse the center for the interpretation of an EKG. Miller said this would result in a loss of \$40,000 in revenue and yet the center will still have to pay to get it done, which means absorbing the cost of \$35,000.

The center has also recruited a second obstetrician/gynecologist and a second orthopedic surgeon, but the budget doesn't include the increased activity from these people.

The most important factor in the

budget is the money the center receives from the county mill levy which provides a majority of the operating revenue. Miller said people in the county will be voting on the issue in the general election, and it is important for them to know what it means to the center.

The current mill levy will expire on June 30, 1993, so voters will have the chance to continue the levy for the next eight years. This is a renewal of an existing tax that people are already paying, Miller

## MainStreet asks state for \$1 million

As the plans for the MainStreet improvements on Sudderth Drive get closer to completion, the financial picture also gets clearer. MainStreet will be requesting more than \$1 million from the legislature to make the plans a reality.

Mary Maul, MainStreet project director, and project engineers from Bohannon-Huston Inc., George Radnovich and James White, met with city and state highway officials on Friday to discuss the project and the estimated cost. Radnovich and White had several construction drawings from the master plans for Phase I which covers Sudderth from Fern Road to Country Club Road.

Radnovich said the construction plans are at 60 percent complete, but they had covered the areas of greatest need. The engineers reviewed in detail the project with Tim Basler, district traffic engineer; Tony Lara, district technical service engineer; and Ed Navarrette, senior highway technician.

Radnovich covered a detailed cost estimate sheet with the officials to get their comments on. He said he had compared prices from a local paving company, the highway department and the city of Albuquerque to arrive at the

estimate. John Shaw, consulting engineer for the village, said the cost for labor may have to be re-estimated to provide for a higher wage than was anticipated.

The demolition and removal phase of the project could cost \$72,600. This would include the removal of sidewalks, driveways, retaining walls and curbs and gutters. Signs, poles, hydrants and meters along the street will also have to be taken out while construction is being done.

For roadway improvements the cost is estimated at \$290,710, which may be low. This would be the construction of the sidewalks, driveways, curbs and gutters as well as the crosswalks which will be made of interlocking pavement blocks with concrete headers. Traffic control during the time of construction was also considered in this estimate.

The estimate for street lighting, signals and signs will be about \$211,500 with the majority of the cost coming from the lighting and electrical controls. This estimate does not include the purchase of extra lighting poles or any signalization at Fern Street which will be completed in a later phase.

The cost for drainage improvements is estimated at \$89,700 and will include sidewalk culverts. Maul said the problems with drainage in Phase I are not as bad as they will be in later

phases that cover the distance from Country Club Road to Carter's Lane. She said the group did not do a drainage analysis of the current phase, but will probably need to do one for the next phase.

Utility improvements are expected to cost \$35,000 and will include new fire hydrants and relocation and general work on the water service. Manholes and valves will also have to be adjusted.

To add the finishing touches to the project street furniture and landscape improvements will also be done. The cost will be about \$113,920 and will include wooden benches, trash receptacles and bollards (special pole lighting) and a landscape and irrigation system.

Radnovich estimates the total cost of Phase I to be approximately \$1,165,585 which includes contingency funds, contractor bond and fee permits, surveys, tests, construction management and local tax. Maul said she will also be requesting \$107,000 for the design of Country Club to Carter Lane and Fern to Mechem. She has designed a packet about the project for the legislative session which begins on Tuesday.

The improvement project is designed to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act as

# Ruidoso's "regional" board goes looking for money, members

The Regional Advertising Board, created by the Ruidoso Village Council to stretch promotional dollars, is trying to recruit new members.

Joan Bailey, chairman of the Visitors Promotion Services Committee of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce and a member of the regional board invited the Lincoln County Commissioners to join last Tuesday.

It was the second time they had been asked. The first time participation hinged on the county kicking in some money.

"It was presumptuous of us to ask for money as well as your participation," Bailey said. "I'm asking today simply for your participation. Then as you see what can be done, you may want to contribute."

"The competition is stiff and money is shrinking. We hope to piggyback some (advertising)."

Bailey said the regional board now only has representatives from the Ruidoso Lodgers Tax Board and the chamber. It was formed to coordinate with Mescalero enterprises and the entire county, she said.

"But to date, we've had no other participation but Ruidoso and it's showing."

She said the board "would consider it a privilege and necessity to have a county representative."

"This is a dynamic area and just on the threshold (of major development)."

Commission Chairman Stirling Spencer said commissioners would review the information left by Bailey and consider action on the request at the next meeting.

In other action, the commission:

—Appointed to the Lincoln Historic Preservation Board Roy Harmon of Carrizozo, a member of the White Oaks Historical Society. Harmon will serve as an at-large member, replacing Agatha Long. Jack Rigney was reappointed, representing the State Monuments Division and Glen Dennis was named the designee of Lincoln County Heritage Trust director Bob Hart. The commission postponed until its next meeting appointing a property owner member to replace Beverly Hammond.

County Clerk Martha Proctor said one of the existing board members is not a registered voter in Lincoln County. Commission policy requires members of county appointed boards to be registered, but the new policy is not retroactive to members already on the board.

—Reviewed a list of equipment road manager Bill Cupit would like to acquire, but postponed action until his budget can be reviewed.

—Accepted a report on the status of subdivisions, their roads and assessments from Patsy Sanchez.

Commissioners went into closed session to discuss the information because of threatened litigation by property owners who want roads to their lots.

those four months work.

"The coordination and cooperation between law enforcement agencies was outstanding, both in the investigation and arrest phases," said Deputy DA Key.

"The task force should be congratulated for an operation well done," he added.

"I am really pleased that the task force has gotten started," said District Attorney Bert Atkins. "This is a great start for them. We are also pleased with the results of the grand jury. I appreciate the cooperation of all of the law enforcement agencies involved in this matter."

Sheriff McSwane expressed pride in the way that the operation was conducted and stated that he appreciated all the assistance received from the various agencies, including those from Otero County

and other agencies comprising the task force. He believes that the arrests made during this operation will lead to additional information on drug trafficking within Lincoln County and he anticipates further arrests.

## MainStreet needs money for Midtown projects

A Ruidoso MainStreet meeting quickly turned into a discussion group when there were not enough members to make a quorum on Thursday afternoon.

The issue of biggest concern for the group is funding for the Midtown improvement plans, and Mary Maul, project director, showed members a packet she had put together for the legislature which may fund the project. The legislature convenes on January 21.

Maul said the packet was complete except for a cost estimate from the engineers, Bohannan-Huston, but she will have received it by Friday. Engineers, George Radnovich and James White, visited Ruidoso on Friday to meet with the state highway department

and city officials on the project.

Maul said he had been using cost estimates from Albuquerque and would see how close these compare to costs in this area. They will also seek input and approval on the project from the highway department.

MainStreet hopes to get funding for the designing of Phases II and III also in this legislative session, Maul said.

In other non-business action, treasurer Alden Deyo said MainStreet had received two notices from the Internal Revenue Service to notify them of a late assessment. One late assessment began on March 30, 1990, and now has a total of \$2,824.55.

Another late charge assessment began on March 30, 1991, and will cost more than \$1,800. Deyo said MainStreet had filed for tax exempt status before the second late charge began.

Maul said the IRS wanted the money in seven days, but they contacted Ronnie Hemphill, accountant, to ask him to write the IRS to notify them of the exempt status. Deyo said they will probably not hear back from the IRS for quite some time.

J.D. James was appointed to the nominating committee to replace Sally Reese, who has recently moved out of town. Mike Line, Don Dutton and Deyo will also be on a committee to review the by-laws of

the organization. Maul said any changes to these will need to be done before the annual membership meeting in March.

She also reminded the members present of an intermediate training course on January 27 through January 29 in Santa Fe. The training is presented in five units including transition, organization, economic restructuring, design and promotion which will help improve staff and volunteer understanding and skills.

The National MainStreet organization will also have a three-day seminar. On January 28, Ruidoso MainStreet will receive an award at the state awards banquet, Maul said.

much as possible. Radnovich said the sidewalks will be six feet wide at most spots and three and a half feet at the minimum. The cross walks are 10 feet and include handicap access from the street to the sidewalk. It was impossible at some points to make the access meet these standards.

If handicap ramps have more than a six inch rise, hand rails will have to be placed on each side. Crosswalks will also be lighted by bollards to improve visibility for pedestrians and vehicles, he said.

The sidewalks will be pigmented to provide a visual path throughout the downtown area, but the group is still trying to decide if they will do the same for curbs and gutters. Radnovich said it wouldn't be that much of an increase in cost to pigment those areas. The drivepads into businesses will not be pigmented so drivers can spot the entrances.

Village manager Ron Wicker said one concern he had with the colored pavement was that if the city had to do maintenance work on it they would have to match the color. He said if some thing is going to be so attractive, it should be maintained attractively, not in patchwork.

Radnovich said after the color is selected the city could be given the specific mix, or they could purchase extra bags of it from the construction company that does the work. He said the group may also want to purchase extra light poles for future replacements.

The driveways will be improved or taken out, depending on the situation. Some of them just don't make sense, Radnovich said. No new ones will be added in this phase of the project, he said.

The inside driving lane will be 11 feet wide, while the outside one will be 12 feet. The project has put in several loading zones to reduce the number of vehicles that have to stop in the driving lanes to unload.

Parking spaces have also been reduced to add to pedestrian safety and to reduce the clutter. Overhead wires will also be placed underground to clear up the streets.

Several trouble spots were discussed at the session to get advice from the state department. One spot is at a package liquor store that has a drive-up window. Radnovich said having two entrances is not pedestrian safe, and the area should at least be made into a one direction drive. Basler said he agreed that there really wasn't enough room to have a drive-up window there unless the business remodels it.

Basler said he was also concerned that the driveway into Le Claire's Boutique is too close to the light signal on Sudderth and Eagle Street. He said driveways should be about 100 feet from it to reduce traffic problems.

Another problem area is at Butler Street where a cross walk is proposed, but is not safe because of traffic. The street leads to rental cabins and allows two-way traffic, but is not wide enough for it or allow a complete view of oncoming traffic.

Planning and zoning administrator Cleatus Richards said making the street into a one-way street would be a good idea, but they will have to study which entrance has the best line of sight for vehicles to exit at. The MainStreet project could then just put up signs to instruct drivers.

Maul and Radnovich will meet with the property owners that are involved in these problem areas to discuss the plans made.

The state highway department is scheduled to do a maintenance overlay on Sudderth Drive in March. The group discussed whether temporary striping of lanes could be done because when the improvement project begins the markings will get covered up. Basler said he may be able to use tape for the street.

"It looks like a good project if you can get the funding for it," he said.

said. She said if another source of funding were mandated, the hospital could go before the county and say the tax is no longer needed.

Each year the county and hospital can assess the need to collect the tax for the next year, Miller said. People who are voting may ask themselves why they should vote for the levy when the federal government is looking into health care, she said.

No proposal from the federal government has gained any consensus and could take a long time to implement. LCMC may not last long enough to benefit from federal aid in this case, Miller said. By voting for the levy, people can be assured that it will be around for eight more years.

"If we lost the mill levy we would be operating at a loss of approximately \$300,000. You can't do that year after year," she said.

The proposed budget will now be reviewed and approved by the Presbyterian Health Care Service Board

No permit from the Village of Ruidoso was necessary as long as the demonstrators stayed on the public sidewalks and didn't block traffic, Dale said.

The petitions include six lines at the bottom for personal messages.

The preprinted plea urging Chino to drop the monitored retrievable storage (MRS) project is signed by Steve Wright, Dave Dale, G.L. Sylling and William Riggles.

"Your good name, your reputation is at stake!" the petition warns Chino. "Each day the MRS study continues, your concerned neighbors and your own people turn stronger against you. Each day you become more alone, more isolated in your Inn, perhaps more

alienated from the Mountain Gods."

The petition continues: "Mr. Chino ACT. You have been duped by the promise of money....We ask that you and your tribal council vote today to stop this MRS study....No longer will you be seen as the Judas who betrays all your countrymen for billions of pieces of silver."

The specter of a possible temporary nuclear storage facility already has damaged the village, the petition contends.

"If you proceed to phase II, you will launch a two-to-10 year battle with all of us, which will decimate your income from the Inn, the ski area, and the turned-off tourists. You will devastate our local economy. In the end, as in Louisiana and Tennessee, you will lose."

She's alert and intelligent, a quick learner.

But Maggie and her friend, Sara the black Labrador, were discarded by their owner. They were left at the Lincoln County Humane Society about two months ago.

A catahoola-blue heeler cross, Maggie inherited the intelligence and solid instincts that are recognized in both breeds. Her markings are black and white.

She's housebroken, gets along well with other dogs and is gentle with children.

"She hasn't been exposed to cats here, but she's so bright that I'm sure she would adapt to anything an owner wanted," said Randy Basch, shelter manager. She already has adapted to walking on a leash.

Maggie weighs 55 pounds and is full grown, probably about two years old.

She's sponsored for spaying by a contributor to the shelter. Spaying or neutering are the major costs connected to adoption of animals from the shelter.

All dogs and cats adopted must be spayed or neutered to prevent the production of more unwanted litters.

The number of litters brought to the shelter this past few months is staggering, Basch said.

"Fifteen dogs were brought into the shelter in one day, a dozen on another and most were puppies," he said. "The sad part is that most will die. They're either already sick or will have to be put down because of possible exposure to distemper."

"I've told people who have brought in litters that they are signing the pups' death warrants if they leave them now, but they don't care," he said.

Basch inoculates puppies

against Parvo and distemper when they arrive, but it takes 10 days before the vaccine takes effect.

"I tell people that I'll give the pups the shots and if they will keep the pups for ten days to two weeks

more, they'll have a chance at life. But they don't want to be bothered," he said.

During the summer, Basch has several families that act as foster homes for puppies, holding them until they are protected by shots and returned to the shelter. But in the winter, he has no foster homes with facilities to keep the puppies inside.

Foster homes would help give healthy litters a chance, he said.

In the cattery next to the canine building, Hazy, a laid-back smoky-tiger stripe male is looking for a new home.

He's solid muscle and shows the wonderful full-face pads that mark a mature tomcat.


But he has the disposition of a contented feline, which would be further enhanced with neutering.

Hazy, who was brought to the shelter as a stray, is sponsored for the procedure. He'd be a great companion on cold winter nights.



# RC&D meets in Weed's new community center

The South Central Mountain RC&D Council, Inc. met Tuesday, November 12, 1991, at the community center in Weed.

Otero County is interested in a study of the economic analysis of impacts of public land grazing in Otero County, and it was approved as project measure PM-292.

## Weight Loss Surprises Researchers

WASHINGTON --A nutrition organization was hopeful that a nutritionally complete "hi-tech" food tablet would help erase world hunger problems, until a study revealed that one of the ingredients could cause significant weight loss.

Although other studies and scientists may not agree, researchers in Europe found that the ingredient, a natural plant colloid, actually caused people to lose weight, even though specifically instructed not to alter normal eating patterns, according to one study published in the prestigious *British Journal of Nutrition*. Researchers in an earlier study had speculated that the weight loss was due to a decrease in the intestinal absorption of calories.

While the project of National Dietary Research, aptly named Food Source One, would not be used to successfully fulfill its original goal, the formula which has since been improved with other natural colloids has been a windfall for some overweight people. A Daytona Beach, Florida woman fighting a weight battle for 12 years used the product on the recommendation of her physician and lost 30 pounds. She stated, "Not only have I lost 30 pounds but my cholesterol has dropped from 232 to 143. I have two closets full of clothes which have not fit me in two years that I can now wear." In a separate report, a telephone interview revealed that a Wilmington, North Carolina pharmacist lost 14 pounds in 3 weeks on the product and was never hungry.

Walterine Hughes also has served on the Village of Ruidoso Parks and Recreation Advisory Board.

When the Hughes family gets together to celebrate this Golden Anniversary, five generations will be on hand. Walterine Hughes' 90-year-old mother will be there, along with the Hughes' three daughters, nine grandchildren and one great-granddaughter, Courtney Ward of Tulia.

J.C. and Walterine Hughes say their life together has been grand, and hope their friends will join them for Saturday's celebration.

# Warriors wow home fans by beating 4A Cavemen

One shot in the final few seconds of the game gave the Ruidoso Warrior boys basketball team the three points they needed to conquer the Carlsbad Cavemen Saturday 62-61.

Fortunately for the health of the fans and coach Norm Wright, the game wasn't that close all the way. In fact, the Warriors scored eight unanswered points before Carlsbad hit a three-pointer at the beginning of the game. Although they only led by one at the end of the first quarter, the Warriors came back to take a good lead at half time, 33 to 27.

It was the third and fourth quarter that saw the lead go back and forth between the two teams until the last few seconds of play. The Cavemen lead at the end of the third quarter by one, 43-44, but the Warriors weren't going to let this victory slip through their fingers.

With one minute to go the Warriors were still behind by one. Wally Murillo made a big steal and threw it down court to a teammate for several catch up points. Suddenly the Warriors were down 56-60 and called a time-out.

Wright said that in the huddle they said exactly what they wanted to do. If they scored they would immediately foul a Caveman to stop the clock and then drive the ball down the court to one of the three-point-shooters.

Robert Sayner made the foul, but it was his fifth, so in came

Murillo. As the team planned Murillo drove the ball down the court and got it to Evans. Evans set up and, with what seemed to be the greatest of ease, shot the ball in from three-point range to give the Warriors the go-ahead points with less than 10 seconds left.

Carlsbad tried to make a shot in the last second of the game, but the Warriors kept them out of range until the final buzzer. The Warriors had beaten a 4A team.

"It doesn't usually work the way you say it will, but this time it did. It's the biggest win I've ever had here," said Wright.

"This is going to give us the confidence we need to as we start district play. Now they think they have a chance to win some district games," he said.

Evans was 100 percent in shooting for the whole game, with four out of four in field goals and two for two on free throws. He also had eight rebounds, three assists and three blocked shots. Wright said he also drew a charge near the end of the game which got the ball into Warrior hands. It was one of Evans' best games, he said.

Another outstanding player in the game was Robert Sayner who was five for nine on field goals and six for seven on free throws. Four of those were near the end of the game when the Warriors needed the points, so it was a real pressure situation, Wright said. Sayner was the high scorer with 16 points and also had five assists.

Jaime Ordorica made three of nine three point shots, one with only about 30 seconds left in the game. He had a total of 12 points.

Jeff Cox shot well, too, and made five out of eight field goals and three free throws. He was the second highest scorer in the game.

As a team the Warriors made 53 percent of their field goal shots which Wright said is really good. The team was 62 percent on free throws, which he said isn't great but was good enough to win the game.

The one statistic Wright doesn't like is that the team had 28 turnovers. He said that is lower than in past games, but it is still too many. Carlsbad had 27.

Wright said the ironic thing about the victory is that Carlsbad had beat Lovington by one point earlier in the season. Lovington beat the Warriors by 80 points on Tuesday.

"With high school kids you can never tell what will happen," Wright said.

The junior varsity was up to the challenge of facing Carlsbad too. At the end of the first quarter the Warriors were up 20 to 10 and at half 31 to 20. In the third and fourth quarter Carlsbad was able to shrink the Warriors lead. It was also in the last few seconds of the game that the Warriors scored the final points to win 47-46.

The Warriors had 10 players score in this victory. The high scorer for the J.V. was Jeff Chapman who had 13 points. Ray Rodriguez had seven, while Jeff Cox had five. Jimmy Varnadore, Jim Paul Whipple and Darin Davis all had four points each.

Wright said the junior varsity seems to be on a roll and has won three of their last four games.

All the Warriors are going to need as much steam as they can get to play Socorro on Friday, January 24. Socorro is the 3 AAA defending champion, and they have competed in the state tournament four years in a row, Wright said.

They have one of the best players in the district in Lawrence Baca, a 5'7" senior. He has been a starter for Socorro for the past three years and was quarterback for the football team. He is a tremendously talented athlete, Wright said, because he is quick and a great shooter.

"He is going to be hard to stop. They have a lot of good players that are aggressive. It is a tough gym to play in too," he said.

Wright said he hopes the Ruidoso gym will be tough because of a home crowd on Saturday night when the Warriors host the Onate Knights. Tip-off is at 5:15 p.m.

Both games are important to the Warriors as they kick off district competition.

# Hunting and fishing isn't all fun and games to Ron Moore

When Ron Moore talks about game violators he becomes very serious.

The smiling, quiet, soft spoken Moore is the conservation officer assigned to the Ruidoso area by the New Mexico Game and Fish Department.

He has been with the department for nine years and in his present assignment for three.

"Before I worked with the department I had no idea how many license violators and poachers there were," he says. "State-wide we feel that there are as many deer and elk killed illegally as legally."

The majority of the citations written in the Ruidoso area are for fishing violations in the summer. These are principally issued for fishing without a license and for taking more than the legal limit of fish.

Like any other job, Moore says that proficiency for conservation officers increases with experience. When a person is fishing without a license, an officer is soon able to pick up furtive movements as the angler glances over his shoulder at every sound or vehicle.

Much of Moore's summer is spent with binoculars around lakes and streams.

Hunting violations are more difficult to detect because of the wide area that hunters operate in. Many times conservation officers are aided by winter snows which help them track both vehicles and individuals.

Ravens and crows also aid the officers in detecting a location where illegal kills have taken place. The birds congregate to feast on the remains of the kill.

Officer Moore covers an area that is roughly bounded on the west by Nogal, the south by the Mesalero Reservation, the north by Capitan and the East by Tinnie.

A conversation with him reveals a dedicated officer.

He has a bachelor of science degree, as do all new hires in the department, with a major in wildlife management.

Moore feels strongly about issuing citations to every person he catches in a violation.

"I have a responsibility to the people that are buying licenses and obeying the game laws. For that reason I issue a citation on every violation where I can make a case. Besides that we take an oath," he says unsmilingly.

"If we find 'em we write 'em," he adds.

"I write between 140 and 180 tickets a year," says Moore. "About 60 percent of these are fishing violations and the balance are for hunting illegally. Hunters are harder to observe because they are spread out and not concentrated around a specific geographical point as the fishermen are."

The Game and Fish Department has a couple of new tools to help them in their work.

The first one is the vehicle confiscation law where the state is entitled to confiscate the vehicle and guns of anyone involved with taking game with artificial light. If any vehicle, including boats, is used in headlighting game, then that vehicle will be confiscated and, upon conviction of the perpetrator, sold at auction.

The same goes for guns used in the commission of the violation.

Since the program was begun in October there have been more than

30 vehicles confiscated in the state. In the southeast area alone there have been 14 vehicles taken.

To aid in this program, the department has another weapon.

They have a dozen mounted deer that are spread among the various areas. These decoys are put alongside the road at night and staked out with an officer team observing.

Violators can be caught red handed while attempting to take game by using the headlight of

their vehicle or by using spotlights.

Moore recites a recent incident in which a bow hunter was observed shooting at one of these dummies. His vehicle and weapons were confiscated.

Another bow hunter drove by and observed the incident and later remarked about it to a conservation officer.

The next night the second hunter was caught shooting at the same decoy that was set up in a different part of the canyon.

The other new law that assists the department is Operation Game Thief (OGT). This is to the Game and Fish Department what the Crimestoppers program is to police departments.

Callers may call an 800 number in Santa Fe and report violations. If here is a conviction on that violation the caller is paid a reward of a specific amount depending on the game taken.

For instance, a conviction for a deer hunting violation pays a reward of \$500 and one for an elk pays \$750. Reports may also be made to local offices of the Game and Fish Department and also individual Conservation Officers.

The Operation Game Thief (OGT) number is 1-800-432-GAME, and the number of the regional office of the Game and Fish Department is (505) 624-6135.

The OGT program was instituted when the Game and Fish Department put an undercover agent on the road with road-killed game and let himself be seen with the game by a number of people. He was not turned in by anyone.

It was then decided to institute a program where persons giving information on poachers and game violators would be rewarded.

New Mexico was the first state to create such a program and received national recognition from other state and federal game and fish departments.

According to Moore, these programs have done a lot toward decreasing the number of violations.

This past hunting season the deer harvest was less than in previous years. Some in the Game and Fish Department believe that this

is due to the reluctance of hunters to spotlight and take their deer illegally and then put a legal tag on it.

The Department is seeing fewer and fewer headlight violations, even though they are putting forth the same effort in enforcement.

Most poaching is done at night and the tougher law obviously has had an impact on violators.

Moore thinks that in his present assignment, he gets more cooperation from the judiciary in prosecuting the violations than when he was posted in the northern part of the state.

All game and fish violations are handled by magistrate judges.

All of the fine money collected on game and fish violations goes to the department, but goes into the state school fund.

Moore says there is a feeling that stricter enforcement leads to the sale of more licenses and those proceeds do go to the Game and Fish Department.

In addition to enforcing the game laws of the state, conservation officers devote a great deal of time to hunter education and training, public relations work and game management.

An additional responsibility is to monitor the streams and lakes for industrial and private pollution. While they are not charged with enforcement of the environmental laws they work closely with state and federal environment enforcement agencies, and the Forest Service.

A fine that is imposed on private and corporate polluters is made available to the Game and Fish Department for restoration and restocking of streams and lakes.

## Who really gives a hoot about the spotted owl? Hearings set to see

Six public hearings will be conducted by the U.S. Department of Interior's Fish and Wildlife Service on its proposal to list the Mexican spotted owl as a threatened species.

The hearings will allow interested persons to submit oral or written comments on the proposed rule.

Three of the hearings will be set in New Mexico, one in Arizona and one in Utah.

The owl inhabits forested mountains and canyons from the southern Rocky Mountains in Colorado and the Colorado Plateau in southern Utah, southward through Arizona, New Mexico, western Texas and into Mexico. Its habitat primarily is uneven-aged, multi-storied forests with closed canopies. They also can be found in younger forests where remnant larger trees exist.

Major threats to the Mexican

spotted owl include loss of its forested habitat due to logging and fires, as well as increased predation and competition from other birds of prey due to fragmentation of their forest habitat. The agency estimates that more than 60 percent of the owl's habitat occurs on lands managed for timber production. About 90 percent of the known Mexican spotted owl population inhabits national forests and another nine percent are found on other public lands.

The service estimates there are more than 2,100 Mexican spotted owls and about 5.6-million acres of owl habitat.

Under the Endangered Species Act, an endangered species is one in danger of extinction throughout all or a significant portion of its range. A threatened species is one likely to become endangered within the foreseeable future.

## Giving away free animals could spell death sentences

When an owner gives away puppies or kittens free to people they don't know, they could be sending the animals to an agonizing death, said Randy Basch, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society.

Each year, millions of animals are used in tests that result in violent deaths from activities such as safety testing for automobiles or in lingering pain and slow deaths from laboratory experimentation, he said.

"There are people who make a handy living going around collecting these free animals and then selling them for experimentation," Basch said. "I even have been approached about selling shelter animals."

"Alternatives now are available through the use of cultures and computers," Basch said. "The use of live animals is not necessary. And so many of the taxpayer-supported activities are costly, inhumane and make no sense. It's irritating to think that my tax money is paying for these useless and inhumane experiments."

Examples cited in a recent edition of the magazine published by People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals include a government grant to spend \$600,000 to prove waterfowl will die from being doused with oil, another project doomed animals to

be tied to the rear of a jet engine to see what would happen if the jet caught on fire.

"I think I could tell then that the animals would incinerate and they wouldn't have to pay me a dime," Basch said.

General Motors was singled out in the magazine for using live animals, such as pigs, in crash experiments despite statements from experts that the resulting data is meaningless for human injuries and deaths, he said. Most of the other car manufacturers use dummies in their crash tests and General Motors' safety record is no better and in some cases, worse than those companies, Basch said.

Another experiment that riled Basch was a research grant for the University of Illinois in which cow's stomachs were cut open and a bag of newspapers inserted to see if the animals could survive on a diet of 40 percent newspaper. In another, rats were fed incredibly large doses of Louisiana hot sauce to see the human equivalent of one-half cup to each 10 pounds of weight would kill them.

"This will continue as long as research money is available for this type of inhumane nonsense," Basch said.

### Let's don't let our village go to the dogs

Ruidoso is going to the dogs, and it's not the first time.

About 10 years ago, packs of dogs roamed the streets, and several people, including Mayor George White's wife, fell victim to the rampaging canines. It was a bad time for the Village, a time when we had no tried and true plan for controlling the animal population that so quickly gets out of hand.

Over the years, those problems were faced, reviewed and brought into some semblance of order. The village hired a full-time animal control officer to be a member of the Police Department. It worked well to have one well-trained and qualified person having major responsibility for animal control within the village. He answered calls on the lost and abandoned domestic animals, wild animals and road kills.

The contract with the Humane Society to provide shelter for animals brought the whole process together, and the village was in control.

But now, we're without an animal control officer, and, according to the village manager, we may not have one until June. If common sense didn't tell us that this village has come too far to let wild animals get out of control again, then the police calls we're hearing on the scanner should.

We're hearing more animal calls, we're seeing more loose dogs and packs roaming the streets and we're seeing more carcasses beside the road. Police officers are doing their very best, but the chief himself admitted that officers already have suffered three dog bites while working the animal beat. The problem will only worsen without vigilance.

We understand that the village is trying to save money, and of course that means cutting back on services. We're putting up with cutbacks in garbage collection and snow removal, but we believe it's shortsighted and a mistake to cut back in the area of animal control. It's an issue that affects the environment, as well as the health, welfare and safety of village citizens and visitors.




