State Legislature opposes MRS plans

New Mexico lawmakers don't want their state to become the nation's dump site for high level nuclear waste.

In a 50-9 vote, the House of Representatives passed a memorial Saturday opposing the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe's study of hosting spent fuel rods.

State Representative H. John

Underwood (D-Ruidoso) successfully lobbied for the passage in spite of an impassioned speech on American Indian Day by Mescalero President Wendell Chino.

"I talked to every representative on the floor," said Underwood. "With the help of Hubert Quintana (executive director of the Water Defense Association) I provided all of the representatives with a packet of information."

Governor Bruce King, who has stated his adamant opposition to the Mescaleros plan, supported the memorial.

The lawmakers, whose action is non-binding, indicated that New Mexico, the home of the Waste Isolation Pilot Project near Carlsbad, has done its share to solve the nation's nuclear waste problems.

While opposing the study and

any further study of bringing high level nuclear waste into New Mexico, the representatives affirmed their belief in the Mescaleros right as a sovereign nation to do such a study.

"I feel strongly about the direction the state needs to take in regard to its economic and environmental future," said Underwood in a telephone interview early today.

The sentiments of the representatives will be sent to President George Bush, the Department of Energy and nuclear negotiator David LeRoy.

Underwood said the ethics committee he served on that was reviewing charges against Representative Ron Olguin has come back with a recommendation that he be censured.

That will be debated today on the House floor.


Underwood also said the house will be dealing with collective bargaining today or tomorrow. He's been contacted by many educators, and said if the issue of collective bargaining for teacher is presented for the entire state, he'll oppose it. He favors leaving the decision to a local option vote.

Council votes to study N-waste site proposal

The Ruidoso Village Council will form a committee to find out more information about the monitored retrievable storage site proposed by the Mescalero Apache tribe.

The council voted at a special meeting Friday to ask for volunteers that would be willing to serve on this committee. When members are appointed they will then investigate questions that the council and other citizens have about the issue.

Mayor Victor Alonso said the committee should be able to use the expertise of the state mineral and resources department which Governor King offered after he turned down a request by the village for a \$100,000 grant to fight the MRS placement in this area.

Councilor Bill Karn had brought up the idea of forming the committee at a previous meeting and he said it is likely that tribal president Wendell Chino will ask for a grant to continue into phase two. He said just because area senators and representatives and the governor are against it doesn't mean it can be stopped because they are dealing with a sovereign nation.

After a comment from former council member Al Junge questioning the recent protests in the Midtown area and the negative impact that could have on visitors, Alonso said he is on record as saying if the legal procedure currently in progress fails, he may be out there protesting as well. He said he has had many interviews on the issue with television stations and newspapers, but he was always careful to say that the area has great skiing this year.

Councilors will also be considering appointments to other village committees including one to the lodgers tax committee from which Mark Doth recently resigned as chairperson. Jeff Maul has also resigned from the planning and zoning commission. Alonso requested the councilors consider possible candidates for these positions.

The ad hoc airport advisory committee will also be reinstated to investigate a request by Jim Franklin to use airspace at the airport for flying aerobatics. Most of the practices would be during the winter so would not impede heavy summer traffic.

The councilors also awarded several bids and discussed the progress of the civic events center. Planning administrator Cleatus Richards submitted a pay request for Bradley Construction Incorporated for work done on the center, but said the company was 50 calendar days behind schedule as of the first of the month. He said he requested the company submit a revised schedule for the completion of the center so he could see how or if they could pick up some of this lost time.

Some of the missed days have been because of the weather, but several of the councilors and the mayor agreed there were days when the company could have been out working on the project, but didn't. Village manager Ron Wicker said it is to the company's advantage to get the project done on time because they lose \$500 each day it is not done past the completion date.

The council approved the request for payment of \$76,632.57, but also approved that the mayor write to the company to tell them the village is very concerned about the lack of progress and is serious about getting the project done. The group also voted to make cost cuts of \$16,925 on the center that will not affect the quality of the building, according to Wicker. The one dissenting vote was by J.D. James.

In other action on Friday the council: —awarded a bid to Graham Excavating for welding services for the repair of dumpsters. The company will do a minimum of 15 minor repairs weekly and a minimum of 10 major repairs weekly at a cost of \$24 an hour for minor

repairs and \$19 an hour for major repairs. The village will provide the supplies and the work will be inspected before the company is paid.

—awarded a bid to Aetna, a local cleaning service owned by James Hodson, for janitorial services for village facilities. The village has the vacuum cleaner and its bags and paper items, but Aetna will provide the cleaning supplies. The monthly cost will be \$1,250.

—approved a bid from 20/20 Recycling for recycling containers for the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority at \$1,200 for three containers per set. The village will purchase six sets of containers. No locations have been determined at this time for placement.

—approved a bid from Northern Gravel for \$8,011 for a multi filter media for the water treatment plant one in Upper Canyon. Wicker said the village has been working on getting this plant back into shape. The filter will contain gravel, garnet, sand and coal to help control the turbidity or clearness of the water.

—approved a contract form for people to use in renting space in the parks and recreation building at Y-Knot Park. The department has had several requests for the use and will use the money to help offset the cost of rent and utilities. The costs will be \$30 for a half day, \$50 for a full day and \$5 for physical activity insurance. The weekly rate will be \$75 with \$10 for physical activity insurance. The monthly rate will be \$150 with a \$25 physical activity insurance charge. A \$75 refundable key/clean-up deposit will also be charged. Carrie Morris, recreation coordinator, will be in charge of the requests.

—approved continued negotiations with the state highway department on the purchase of cold mill at \$1.50 a cubic yard. The department will be doing a cold mill levy on Highway 48 which is Sudlerth Drive in April or May

—approved the removal of two buildings that have been burned.

Couple charged with cocaine possession

Harry Wilcox, former assistant district attorney serving Lincoln County, and his wife, Carolyn Leitzman Wilcox, were arrested for possession of cocaine as they were leaving an Alto condominium Friday night.

The U.S. Marshal's Office, accompanied by New Mexico State Police officer Sal Beltran, had the Alto condo under surveillance in an attempt to serve a federal warrant on Mrs. Wilcox.

The Wilcoxes and an unidentified woman were leaving the condo in a rented vehicle when they were stopped.

Beltran said a vial of a substance suspected to be cocaine was found in Mrs. Wilcox's pocket, prompting officers to call in the canine unit. Beltran said the dogs found five vials, some empty with just residue and others still filled with what field tests determined to be cocaine.

The contraband was found in the luggage, but police didn't say to whom the luggage belonged.

"They had a lot of luggage, and they had their passports," said Beltran.

The couple, who had conducted an auction February 8 to liquidate their home near Tularosa, were planning on moving to Australia in the near future. Beltran said they didn't have any tickets with them when they were arrested Friday.

Wilcox was taken to Ruidoso Police and Courts Complex where he was charged with possession of a controlled substance. He was freed after posting \$4,000, 10 percent of his \$40,000 bond. Wilcox was also required to relinquish his passport as a term of his release.

His wife is being held in Bernalillo County Jail in lieu of a \$4 million bond. She's charged with tax evasion, apparently over a more than \$1 million tax bill she's been disputing with the IRS.

Mrs. Wilcox was the wife of international business operator Robert Leitzman who was killed in a helicopter crash on their Lincoln County Ranch, the O-Bar-O,

several years ago.

The IRS has been attempting to collect millions in taxes they say that Leitzman owed when he died. Mrs. Wilcox has disputed their claims in court.

As soon as U.S. Marshal's took Mrs. Wilcox into custody, she was taken to Albuquerque where she remains in Bernalillo County Jail.

Magistrate Judge Gerald Dean said he'll schedule a first appearance this week for Wilcox.

Judge Dean said the possession of what he believes is about two grams of cocaine is a felony charge.

According to published reports, State Police are investigating another case involving a stolen gun found in the Wilcox home south of Tularosa.

An alarm system reportedly went off Thursday, and officers who responded found a gun that was reported stolen in 1988.

Wilcox couldn't be reached for comment since his Tularosa telephone number is unpublished, but his attorney, Gary Mitchell said the

Wilcox family has vacated the Tularosa home since their auction and rented the Alto condominium.

Mitchell said Mrs. Wilcox was picked up on a writ issued by U.S. Judge Juan Berciaga forbidding her to exit the country. She has been prohibited from leaving until they can have a hearing on an issue of taxes and the ability to pay those taxes, said Mitchell.

"It's a common law writ that the King of England used against colonists whenever he wanted to collect more taxes and didn't want his subjects fleeing to America," said Mitchell. "We fought a Revolution over it."

"U.S. Marshals and the IRS were looking for Carolyn to serve that writ. When she didn't have that amount of money on her person they served that writ," he continued.

The amount of taxes in dispute is in the millions.

"The federal judge wasn't ad-

Ruidoso councilors reflect on the "state of the village"

Councilor Barbara Duff is serving her first term on the Village of Ruidoso Council. She was elected in March 1990 for a four-year term. She also serves as Mayor Pro-Tem on the council.

Duff is proud of having made the public aware of what is going on, and is concerned about public apathy.

"Some people never come to council meetings except when they want something personally and that doesn't show the kind of interest needed in this community."

"I was disappointed that, more people have not run for the council this year," she said, referring to only five candidates filing for the March 3 election to fill three vacant slots on the council. (three incumbents, Jess Stinson, Patricia Espinosa and J.D. James have filed as will as Frank Cummings and Jerry Shaw.)

She did make a point of applauding the approximately 55 people that serve on various village committees.

Professionalism in the village staff is one of the things that she is proudest of, pointing out that this is the first time the village has had "in house" legal council, referring to Village Attorney Dave Thomsen.

"We've made improvements in equipment and programs for our streets and utilities with the addition of a chipping machine for paving streets and a camera for locating leaks in the sewer system."

blame him for his recent antagonistic stand." In referring to the comments of Miller Hudson (nuclear industrial spokesman and consultant to the Mescalero Tribe) she said that his comments are completely self-serving and made at the expense of the Apaches and the people of the area.

In looking at the coming year, Duff feels that there are many problems and challenges facing the village. She would like to see a crosswind runway completed at the airport, composting established and the problems of the motorcycle rally solved.

She feels that the courts and police building must be rebuilt and problems of the village hall addressed.

According to Duff, the village hall is cracking as a result of inadequate soil testing before it was constructed.

"We need to establish air service into the village," she says, "Also we need to continue to encourage citizens to actively participate in village government with volunteer work on committees that establish policy for the future."

In reference to the proposed raise for the councilors she says, "I still feel raising the salary of the councilors may encourage more people to run but will not necessarily mean that the quality of candidate will increase."

Duff plans to back the incumbents in the March 3 election.

Patricia Espinosa, the junior member of the Ruidoso Village Council, both in age and service on the governing body, is noticeably enjoying her term as a councilor.

She was appointed to the body in September by Mayor Victor Alonso to fill the vacancy left by the resignation of J.A. "Al" Junge.

She is running for reelection in March in hopes of being elected in her own right for a four-year term.

After a period of quiet observation, Espinosa is learning more and more about the business of the village and its infrastructure.

She recently was part of an inspection team that inspected the sagging structure of the public service building, a chore disdained by at least one other council member as being too dangerous.

"Some of the construction and structure terms I didn't understand, but Bill (Karn) helped me with them," she said.

In addition to being on the council, she is a member of the transportation board, is working on securing an airline (Resort Air) for the area and serves as the Mayor's proxy on the board of the Economic Development Corporation.

She is outspoken when asked to comment on her past four months on the council.

"I am impressed with the openness of the meetings. I can say whatever I want with no qualms about speaking out."

She also expresses her appreciation for the staff of the village, indicating that village manager Ron Wicker and his deputy Gary Jackson, in addition to village attorney Dave Thomsen, have given her strong support as a new member on

the council.

She says that the mountain of information necessary to digest before each meeting is a major problem and requires a lot of research time prior to each commission, board or council meeting. She feels that the study sessions before the council meetings have helped in this regard.

Resort Air is getting off of the ground she says.

"We're on step two of the application for Part 121 (the operating regulations for airlines.) We need to get more organized, that's my job."

When asked her opinion of problems that face the village she says that she would like to see the village maintain the existing paved streets better before planning to pave new ones.

"We're working on the water system with new telemetry to track the water level. (in the storage tanks.)"

"I would also like Street Superintendent Charlie Armstrong to come in twice each winter and answer any questions that we may have regarding the streets and snow removal."

When asked to comment on the controversial Monitored Retrievable Storage (MRS) she said, "I can't see any situation where we (the council) wouldn't oppose the MRS."

She said that Miller Hudson's recent disclosure about the federal government guaranteeing property values is news to her.

In any event she said that Payment Equal To Taxes (PETT) is available for the village to apply for in the event that the Mescaleros take the MRS study into phase II.

"We are going to oppose the project but at the same time we do not want to alienate the tribe," she continued.

In reference to the recent discussion of increasing the councilors salary from \$250 to \$500 (present members of the council are ineligible for such an increase) she feels that in order to attract capable people the increase is necessary. She feels that many people cannot take off from their businesses and jobs without being adequately compensated.

Espinosa, who recently changed her political party affiliation from Independent to Republican, says that she would like to hear from citizens concerning any questions or problems that they may have.

"I want to represent the people."

Jess Stinson

Councilor Jess Stinson is nearing the end of his first full term as a Village of Ruidoso councilor. He was appointed in November 1987 to replace Ray Dean Carpenter who resigned, and ran for office in March of 1989 and won a four-year term.

He has announced his candidacy for the coming council elections when three council members will be elected.

In looking back at 1991, Stinson is proudest of having lowered taxes in the village a total of two mills. At the same time budgets were lowered.

"I was concerned with having to lower services, but they've remained about the same."

"We have hired a financial adviser and he is looking at refinancing our existing bond indebtedness. With this we may be able to lower the tax rate another four or five mills."

In reference to the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority (LCSWA), he said "I have mixed emotions about selling our equipment (to the LCSWA) but maybe for the overall good the sale was necessary. We were promised that garbage collection rates would not go up."

Stinson said that another accomplishment of the present administration was the settlement of a lawsuit over a leak in Grindstone Dam. Boyle Engineering company settled

with the village.

Terms of the settlement agreement were not revealed as a condition of the agreement.

He is looking forward to the completion of the MainStreet program.

"We're going to get new sidewalks to enhance downtown traffic."

Stinson is the co-owner of Winner's Circle, a Midtown nightspot.

He is proud of the Civic Events Center having made the progress that it has, although it is behind schedule because of the weather.

The hotel is scheduled to start construction in April, according to rumors that Stinson has heard.

When asked about the

Monitored Retrievable System (MRS) facility he said, "The Council has gone on record as opposing it. I am like the rest of the people, I don't see why we have to take it (nuclear waste) into our state. It may never leak radiation, but there is that possibility. The people don't know that much about it and are scared."

In looking forward to the coming year, he says that he wants to keep the budget balanced.

"We're behind on those but the state will help us out on some of those funds."

In reference to the debate on the raising of councilor wages from \$250 per month to \$500 he says, "I think that to get anyone interested in serving on the council we have to increase the salary. We'll find out the 25th." (The Village Council will hold a public hearing and vote on the increase on February 25.)

When asked his opinion of the utilities departments of the village he says, "We're doing all that we can with the money we have. We didn't get any help from the state on paving last year, but hope to get some this year."

With the heavy snows we've had some trouble with snow removal but business has been good and we can anticipate gross receipts taxes to compensate.

Regarding endorsing candidates for this year's municipal election he said, "I will vote for two others."

J.D. James



J.D. JAMES

Councilor J.D. James has served continuously on the Ruidoso Village Council since May 1987.

In his time, he is proudest of having been a leader on the building of the Civic Events Center.

"I've been working on this since 1988. The original concept was to enlarge and put on an addition to the tin hangar at the old airport. Now we're on the brink of completing a 2-million dollar facility."

He also is proud of having adopted an ordinance that prohibits fireworks in the village.

He says that his relationship with the other members of the council has been very good but says that attendance to the meetings could be better.

"When people elect you they expect you to attend all meetings of the council. (James posted a 97 percent attendance record over the past 13 months.)"

"Also, when a person is elected he is a representative of the people and he should walk and act as such."

James says that his relationship with the village staff has improved greatly the past year and attributes this to "hiring a professional staff to run the village."

Candidates speak out on their plans, hopes and dreams

Frank Cummins, after a full career in education, has found that he now has time to jump into village government.

Cummins has filed to be a candidate for the March 3 election of three council members for the Ruidoso Village Council.

He's one of five candidates for three vacancies on the council.

Cummins and his wife, Fran, have lived in Ruidoso for 10 years, moving here when he retired as an elementary school principal in Phoenix, Arizona.

He is employed by Ruidoso Downs Race Track where he is in charge of purchasing and bagging wood shavings that are used for horse bedding.

This is his first time to run for public office, and he has not served on any of the village committees or done service work.

"In the past, because my job necessitated trips to El Paso, I was unable to serve. Now my employer has OK'd whatever time is necessary for village business."

His wife, Fran, works for a local savings and loan company.

Addressing the Monitored Retrievable Storage (MRS) facility he says that it is one of the things that he really doesn't want to see here.

"They (Apaches) have a right to make the study, but as far as putting it here I am opposed."

"The money part of it should enter into it, but it will do more harm than good."

When asked about his decision to run for the council he said, "My main interest if I want to get involved. I want to make sure we have open discussion and the citizens can see why decisions are made."

"I think that we are all concerned with taxes and we must look at all options and not make a hardship on taxpayers."

"I am not running for anything specific. I just think that it is important that our village staff is qualified."

I am impressed with Mr. Wicker

(Village Manager Ron Wicker.)

"Policies that are made (should) benefit as many people as possible."

On the proposed increase of salary for the council members and mayor, Cummins says, "I didn't know what the salary was when I filed for the election, so it is not a consideration for me. I can't state an opinion and justify it either way. I haven't done enough research into it."

On the MainStreet program, he says, "From what I've seen I am impressed with what they've done, getting grants and all. I think that's good. We need to keep up our main street."

In reference to the motorcycle rally he says, "If it is anything like the last one, I am dead set against it. It was not handled properly and studies need to be made to see if it is beneficial for the village, just being good for business is not enough. It put our police department in a position they couldn't control."

"Overall, I think the village is going pretty good, but there is always room for improvement. We need to answer to the people on their problems. I think that council members do not need to run departments, but need to let the village staff do that."

"I hate to not be specific but I want to get the facts before commenting or making decisions."

Jerry Shaw

Jerry Shaw, the first female ever to be elected to the Ruidoso Village Council, is back in the race for another term.

Shaw has lived in Ruidoso for 20 years. During 10 of those, she published a monthly magazine called "Best Bet" that was a visitors guide to Ruidoso and the area.

A councilor on the village board from 1984 to 1988, Shaw is proud of the accomplishments logged during that time. She's ready to put her time, talents and energies back to work for the village she loves.

"During the time that I served, Grindstone was built, the airport (Sierra Blanca Regional Airport) was built and we had the Eagle Creek water find after water was a big issue in 1984."

"All that we did during that time was positive and beneficial for the village."

"I was on the airport planning board that wanted to do what was done."

Asked what she would hope to accomplish as a councilor she said, "I think that for one thing I would work toward not cutting services."

"Animal control is an example. We should have an animal control officer now to replace the one that quit. The police department cannot do this adequately."

"I think that the police should be funded to continue the fight against drug pushers on the street."

"Also I'd like to have a business panel set up to go to the state meeting of the Business Advisory Council and to the Border Authority meetings."

On the controversial proposed Monitored Retrievable Storage (MRS) facility she says, "I wouldn't touch that with a 10-foot pole. That will be settled at the federal level."

Shaw thinks that the motorcycle rally should be held after investigation into bringing more police in from other areas and after a referendum is held and the voters decide.

On the proposed salary increase that will be open to a public hearing and voted on February 25 she had no comment.

"I'm not on the council now and have no vote."

The study sessions that are held before each regularly scheduled council meeting would be discontinued if Shaw has her way.

"They preclude a lot of discussion on the floor and they tend to make up the councilors' minds before public discussion."

"The present council seems to have the issues cut and dried when they are presented at the meetings."

Shaw was a last-minute candidate for the March 3 election. She filed at 4:55 p.m. right before a 5 p.m. deadline.

"I am running because there were not enough choices, and I care."

"Many people tell me they have no voice in village government. I will be that voice."

Fred & Wilma team up for pets of week

With a face as sad as the story behind it, Fred the Basset hound would like new owners who will give him a permanent and loving home.

He and his close companion, Wilma, were brought to the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter about one month ago.

Fred and Wilma were discarded by their owners after an unfortunate incident involving a third dog the family owned. "They didn't want them because Fred and Wilma reminded the owners of the unpleasant incident, although these two dogs were not involved and have never shown aggression," said shelter manager Randy Basch.

Fred is about three years old. He needs a good secure yard "and

tends to go deaf (in attitude) when he's let loose," Basch said. Fred likes a lot of attention and enjoys playing.

"He's not shy about letting you know when he's bored," Basch said. "He'll start barking, doing the typical Basset hound type of thing. He gets along well with other dogs, but he's willing to be competitive for food."

Wilma, on the other hand, is very laid back and content to find a warm spot in the sun or sit by her master and get her ears scratched, Basch said.

"She's very responsive when spoken to and could probably adapt to any type of home.

"She's not demanding for attention and doesn't need a whole lot of exercise. There's not an aggressive bone in her body," he said.

Wilma, who's about five years

old, has been spayed. She's a flat-coated black retriever and weighs about eighty-five pounds.

Fred will need to be neutered, but is sponsored by a shelter supporter. He's overweight and would benefit by a good diet and an exercise regime.

"I wouldn't recommend a home with young children and toddlers, not because Fred is mean, but he doesn't respond well to surprises like little children falling on top of him," Basch said.

FOLLOW UP

The shelter needs volunteers to help follow up on adoptions, to ensure that the match is working and that the new owners have fulfilled their legal obligation to spay or neuter their new pets.

"The contract that each new owner signs specifically points out

it is a legal document that requires the animal to be spayed or neutered," Basch said.

"Unfortunately, some people are not honoring the agreement. We had one bring back a female he had adopted from the shelter, but this time she arrived with pups," Basch said.

"What's difficult to understand is why they don't follow through when they have either paid for the neutering in the adoption fee or have received a certificate they can give to a veterinarian verifying a sponsor has paid for procedure."

The volunteers would be asked to dedicate about three hours a week on the telephone, calling to check adoptions that took place at least 30 days earlier.

"It's a perfect way for someone who must stay at home to help the shelter and the animals, and to make a contribution to the effort to save as many animals as we can," Basch said.

Volunteers, who are physically able and have the time, may help in many other ways such as walking the dogs, taking the cats out of their cages to play and even cleaning the cattery. The animals all love to be given treats on rainy and snowy days when they can't be outside.



Weight Loss Surprises Researchers

WASHINGTON — A nutrition organization was hopeful that a nutritionally complete "hi-tech" food tablet would help erase world hunger problems, until a study revealed that one of the ingredients could cause significant weight loss.

Although other studies and scientists may not agree, researchers in Europe found that the ingredient, a natural plant colloid, actually caused people to lose weight, even though specifically instructed not to alter normal eating patterns, according to one study published in the prestigious *British Journal of Nutrition*. Researchers in an earlier study had speculated that the weight loss was due to a decrease in the intestinal absorption of calories.

While the project of National Dietary Research, aptly named Food Source One, would not be used to successfully fulfill its original goal, the formula which has since been improved with other natural colloids has been a windfall for some overweight people. A Daytona Beach, Florida woman fighting a weight battle for 12 years used the product on the recommendation of her physician and lost 30 pounds. She stated, "Not only have I lost 30 pounds but my cholesterol has dropped from 232 to 143. I have two closets full of clothes which have not fit me in two years that I can now wear." In a separate report, a telephone interview revealed that a Wilmington, North Carolina pharmacist lost 14 pounds in 3 weeks on the product and was never hungry.


points, Joree Muniz - two points, and Nancy Palmer - one point.

vised of all the facts and we're going to have a hearing on Tuesday regarding that," said Mitchell, who is representing Harry Wilcox.

Carolyn Wilcox is represented by two Albuquerque law firms, said Mitchell.

"Carolyn and Harry and a friend of Carolyn's were on their way to pick up their baby at a babysitter's when agents pulled them over," he said.

"Carolyn was patted down, they claimed to have found that vial. Certainly Harry had no knowledge of it; he didn't have any knowledge of any cocaine there. He didn't even pack the bags, he just loaded them," said Mitchell.

He disagreed with State Police reports.

"They searched the vehicle, they found no cocaine. They didn't have a warrant. They then, after some

45 minutes, asked Harry to drive the vehicle and Carolyn's friend, who is from New York, to the police station. Harry complied. He drove it down. They then emptied all the luggage out on the parking lot, they had a dog go through the luggage, showed up in the process," said Mitchell.

"We don't know yet whose luggage it was," he added. "They did not keep the luggage."

"They did not detain the lady from New York; they were taking her to Albuquerque to catch a plane."

Mitchell said police didn't fingerprint the vials.

"The major problem is that Harry is innocent," he added, noting that there are other witnesses.

Mitchell said it will all get straightened out in court.

"The tragedy is the brutality of the IRS," said Mitchell.

"I came to Ruidoso Downs in 1955 for three months and I am still here, and I am going to stay here," said Shirlene. "I live among the finest people in the world."


The birthday party was held on the twelfth because on this day Shirlene was leaving for Washington D.C. to attend a leadership conference.

She is national editor for "Postmaster Gazette," the official magazine of the National Association of Postmasters in the United States.



I cannot allow the implication in Ron Hardeman's letter (2-6-92) regarding Pacific Nuclear to stand unchallenged. Our storage technologies are not currently used in former Soviet bloc countries. However, as the American company whose technology is currently storing more spent nuclear fuel at U.S. reactor sites than any other, we were pleased to be invited by the new Russian government to evaluate the nuclear waste problems it has inherited from the previous Soviet regime.

Similarly, we are working in Hungary, Czechoslovakia and other Eastern European nations to solve some of the serious environmental problems they must now address.

Without the advent of democratic governments these nations would probably have postponed any remedial clean-up. Until very recently American nuclear services companies were not welcome in these Iron Curtain countries.

It is gratifying that Pacific Nuclear's storage technologies have been identified as safe and reliable. We only regret that these markets

were closed to us for so long, but we find it encouraging that the emerging democratic leadership in the region is now willing to put environmental restoration and the protection of public health on the front burner ahead of their many other pressing economic problems. It is equally gratifying to see our own Congress doing the same thing with its authorization of the negotiated MRS siting process.
