County considers top five contenders for manager's job

Lincoln County Commissioners are scheduled to decide Tuesday who will be hired as their next county manager.

Charles D. Wall, a planner with the city of Albuquerque withdrew from consideration and did not show up for an interview Friday when commissioners met separately with the other five candidates.

The five are former Alamogordo city councilor and Otero county clerk Andrew C. Wynham, James Rae Taylor with 16 years of agriculture-business background, former Marine administrator Gary Cozzens, former Bell Gas division manager Neil Selman and San Jon clerk/treasurer Bobbye Lynn Rose.

The commission meeting will begin at 9 a.m. Tuesday in the county courthouse in Carrizozo.

Donna Smith, executive director of the New Mexico Association of Counties, will be on hand to discuss legislative issues and financing for the indigent fund set up by House Bill 441.

Dwight Andrews is on the agenda to discuss subdivision roads and road manager Bill Cupit will give a report on a traffic study at the intersection of Fort Stanton Road and High Mesa in Alto.

Commissioners also will consider a request from the Carrizozo school system to use the water from a county well that joins school property and county property.

C of C selects six finalists

The selection committee pared down the applicants for the chamber director rather quickly and are now down to six from the beginning field of 70.

Paul Crown, chamber president and a member of the committee, said the group met last week to narrow these down. He said they had a lot of people with expertise in business, but not chamber, and vice versa. Some of the applicants had great qualifications, he said.

The committee members are now in the process of calling references for the six applicants. Crown said the members not only want to speak to the people that were put down as references, but also other people in that community who may know them.

Later this week the committee will meet again to discuss the references and decide who they should call in for personal interviews. Crown said they may interview all six or just a few, depending on how the references check out. Of these six, some are from out-of-state, while others are from New Mexico, including one from Ruidoso.

Crown said it still looks like they will be able to have someone named by the end of the month as was planned at the deadline of the applications. He said letters have been sent out to the other applicants to let them know they were not selected for the position.

Horatio Alger scholarship to be awarded at RHS Thursday

A graduating senior will be awarded a \$5,000 scholarship from the Horatio Alger Association on Thursday at 10:10 a.m.

High school counselor Jean Forister said 10 applications were submitted to the association, and the winner will be named at the assembly on Thursday. Also planned for the ceremony are presentations from Mike Padilla, a former scholarship winner and Francine Neff from Albuquerque who was the 35th U.S. treasurer.

A student is selected from one school in each state. New Mexico's winner last year was from Portales. The association is looking for a student who has overcome great odds in life to succeed, Forister said. They must also show self-reliance, individual initiative, integrity and leadership.

State official visits Lincoln County Solid Waste group

Judith Espinosa, Secretary of the New Mexico Environment Department, will speak to members of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority during their meeting at 1 p.m. today (Monday), March 16.

The board meets in the recycling center on Second Street in Ruidoso Downs.

Espinosa will speak to the members about regional landfill planning and the state application process.

Authority chairman Victor Alonso and director Gene Green will give a review on a meeting March 11 with representatives of Otero County, several of its municipalities, Holloman Air Force Base and White Sands Missile Range.

Another meeting with the various groups will be scheduled in April.

Kerry Krumsiek will report on the county's recycling program and Dr. Bernie Reimann will give an update on compost equipment.

Green also will discuss the county's variance policy for land owners with enough suitable acreage to dispose of their own garbage.

That variance needs to be in place before the authority assumes responsibility for garbage collection in unincorporated portions of the county.

RHS business students win state awards

Winning first place at the state conference is only the beginning for participants in two DECA projects.

DECA (Distributive Education Clubs of America) members went to the 40th annual state conference in Albuquerque on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Two groups and several individuals participated in tests and interviews at the state meet.

One group won first place in the Pepsi Earn and Learn Program. Members Lisa Farris, Bethany Jarrell and Hemanth Pai did the project on importing Mexican Baja shirts which they then sold at Christmas time.

They also had to document their project in a 40-page report. At the contest the members were interviewed and asked questions by judges to determine how well they knew their project.

Lisa Barnes, Sarah Echols and Keith Henson won first with the chapter's public relations project.

They established the campaign for the Ruidoso campus of Eastern New Mexico University with the slogan, "ENMU-R is more than you ever imagined." This group also had to document its work and complete interviews with judges at the state contest.


Bryan Streety also qualified for the national competition with his vehicle and petroleum marketing project. Aaron Ford and Valerie Rankin will also be going to nationals as merit award winners.

The students said they were fortunate to be able to go to the 40th anniversary conference because it had many special activities. The keynote speaker, Mark Scharenbroich, was motivational and entertaining, they said.


DECA students brainstormed on ideas at a chapter meeting and chose these two winning concepts as the best projects, according to Echols.

Sponsor Eddie Parker said Ruidoso was the only school to win two big awards at state. He said they have two excellent projects so the groups have a good chance of winning at the national level. The national competition will be in Anaheim, California from April 29 to May 2.

If the group in the Pepsi competition wins they could also earn

\$2,000 in stock. Parker said the Ruidoso chapter won the right, through a drawing, to send several more students to the leadership academy at the national competition. Those students will be selected later this month.

Henson said to prepare for the national meet they have to edit and rewrite their reports and be prepared to answer any questions on the project. Echols said they have to improve their projects by 100 percent to compete and win against the other schools.

The Ruidoso chapter hasn't had a national winner since 1981 and hasn't placed since 1986 when a team finished in sixth place. At the national competition the group will be competing against students from the United States, Guam, Canada, Puerto Rico and several other countries.

About 38 students are involved in the DECA program at Ruidoso, Parker said.

tant thing for the community long-range. The important thing is that the Spencers are doing it and proceeding. I think it's great wherever it is.

"From the beauty standpoint, out at Alto probably gives a lot more of a field to bring in the beauty of the area. I can definitely see advantages to it."

The Links at Sierra Blanca is the one part of the resort complex that is built, open and operating.

"We've already booked more outings and tournaments for 1992 than we had all last year," said Hubbard. "So we're looking for a very big year for the golf course."

Jim Colbert is still operating both of Hubbard's golf courses, The Links in Ruidoso and a golf course in Portland, Oregon.

"They were building it when I bought the race track. Jeff Miller, the Links manager, is overseeing it, and Dode Forrester is the general manager up there," said Hubbard.

Colbert recently sold some of his golf courses, but continues to own some golf courses in Las Vegas, and operates the Hubbard courses.

"The success of Ruidoso Downs depends on what happens in the rest of the community," said Hubbard. "In other words, if we don't have any growth here over the next 10 years, it's not just the racetrack that's going to be hurting, but it's a lot of other businesses that are going to be hurt as well."

"That's one of the reasons we've done some of the things we've done to try and bring more people to Ruidoso."

"We hope they'll like it and they'll come back and they'll go to the races and they'll go skiing and other things, so they'll end up buying a second home here and then some of them will retire here and move here."

"It's related to the arts show, it's related to the museum."

Hubbard is developing the Museum of the Horse in Ruidoso Downs, with perhaps the world's largest collection of horse artifacts and materials. Already that museum, made up of the collection of Anne B. Stradling, is expected

to bring in as many as 100,000 people a year when it first opens.

"I think the museum is going to really, truly be outstanding," said Hubbard. He said when it opens this year it will really be less than a third completed. The museum will be open for the summer and then close up be finished for next year.

"But it will be a state of the art museum that will be able to compete with any of the big museums around the country," added Hubbard.

"I think visitors are going to be very excited about a lot of the horsedrawn vehicles; I think the Indian artifacts are outstanding, but it's just so much stuff that it's hard to imagine — all pertaining to the horse."

Hubbard said people from all over the world were collecting things for Stradling, who died just this past January.

"We met several times and showed her the drawings and the plans. I'm just sorry that she did not make it long enough to see the opening, because I think she would have been extremely pleased."

Stradling's collection formerly was on display in Patagonia, Arizona. Hubbard said the Museum of the Horse, in the old Chaparral Convention Center in Ruidoso Downs, will include a family room with pictures and the history of Stradling's family.

"It will give people a feel about this woman," he said.

Besides the Museum of the Horse, the Hubbards have brought the Hubbard Art Award and the Cowboy Symposium to the Ruidoso area. Both events bring thousands of people to help boost the economy.

Although the Hubbard Art Award for Excellence is on hold for now, Hubbard said some plans are in the works for a special exhibit in conjunction with the Museum of the Horse opening. Plans also are under way for the 1993 show.

"We are starting to talk to the major artists now about a 1993 show, and that will all depend on how many we can get committed," said Hubbard.

"If we cannot get the top artists for the show then it makes no sense to have it. They

have started conversations, and so far it looks pretty promising."

Hubbard is especially proud of the Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium which he and his staff helped originate.

"We were looking for something to bring people here in the fall when things were quiet," said Hubbard.

"After two years the Symposium has been extremely successful and I think this year it will actually be recognized as the number one cowboy symposium in the country."

The Third Annual Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium is scheduled for October 8-11, at the Ruidoso Super Select Sales Pavilion in Glencoe.

Hubbard owns and manages a series of racing operations in addition to Ruidoso Downs Race Track, which he owns in partnership with Allred of California.

The Woodlands in Kansas City, is the horse and greyhound track that Hubbard built from scratch.

In 1989, he purchased the greyhound track in Portland, Oregon, which has been in operation since 1933. It's one of the oldest greyhound tracks in the United States.

Hubbard had a fight on his hands when he set out to gain control of Hollywood Park racetrack. Merv Griffin was just one of the people who tried to shut him out there.

Hubbard is now the majority stock owner and chairman of the board at Hollywood Park.

Hubbard is one of three or four applicants for a license to operate a racetrack in the greater Dallas/Fort Worth area in Texas. That decision won't be made until August, probably, but he's the subject of intense scrutiny as investigators delve into his life and background to obtain that license.

"The investigators are out there, they've got the facts," said Hubbard, unphased by the competition and looking forward to taking on the Texas project.

"They (investigators) just spent a week in California and they told me yesterday, they have not been able to turn up anything bad about me," said Hubbard. "Even in Lubbock, Texas, Ruidoso, Santa Fe and then all over California."

not start grass roots," he said, and Ebert agreed.

"We have never asked anyone to make application," said Nelson. He said the Office of the Negotiator was created by Congress in 1987, and the negotiator was appointed in 1990.

The office, which Nelson proudly proclaimed may be the smallest federal agency, employees 10 people in Boise and three in Washington D.C. It operates on a

budget of around \$2.8 million.

Nelson confirmed that his office has had direct contact with Mescalero President Wendell Chino and with Peso, but reaffirmed that the tribe was not solicited as a nuclear waste host.

Chino said previously that he applied for the first grant because he was asked to by the federal government.

Since the negotiator began his work, a study has been widely distributed that was completed by the State of Tennessee. That study determined that an MRS is not needed, and that the high level spent fuel

rods should stay on-site until a permanent home is found.

Nelson said he's familiar with the fact that there is such a study, but hasn't read it and won't comment on it.

Neither Nelson nor Ebert could comment directly on how much opposition to an MRS by neighbors would impact its siting. Questions on that subject were deflected by answers that the process is all volunteer.

In this case, the DOE and negotiator may have found the volunteer, but the opposition is from the surrounding area.

The Mescalero Apache Indian tribe is

one of five Indian nations studying the placement of an MRS.

Meanwhile, the House Interior Committee recommended just last month that Congress order DOE to end its efforts to build an MRS for high-level nuclear waste.

According to a report in "Inside Energy," the recommendation was contained in the panels' 1993 budget views.

MRS "no longer represents a useful or necessary interim step in the high-level waste program," reads the report. DOE has requested \$40.7 million for the program in fiscal year 1993.

It's unclear exactly how that money will be spent, with record keeping and reporting on the various feasibility studies being undertaken by seven different prospective hosts not necessarily open to public scrutiny.

Nelson said the multi-million dollar benefit package that will go to the eventual MRS host can include everything from infrastructure to educational facilities to environmental cleanup.

Take this friendly teddy bear home and you'll have a companion for life

A compact little body with a teddy bear face, this five-month-old chow has captured everybody's heart at the Lincoln County Humane Society's animal shelter.

Nicknamed Teddy for obvious reasons, he came to the shelter as a stray.

"He has an outstanding disposition," said shelter manager Randy Basch. "Whoever owned him is really missing out on a tremendous pet. It's hard to believe they turned him loose or let him walk away and then never tried to find him."

Teddy has been at the shelter for three weeks and no one has called, Basch said.

He has a dark face area and lighter reddish blonde body.

"He'll need house training and will have to be neutered," Basch said. "I think he'll be on the small side as an adult."

Two other chows also are up for adoption at the shelter, a two-year-old black female called Tundra and a one-year-old blonde female named Bessie.

Tundra came in as a stray about three weeks ago, Basch said.

"She's very sweet and affectionate and seems quite obedient," he said. "She'd be well-suited to the outdoors because she has thick hair and the typical chow undercoat."

She weighs close to 80 pounds, Basch estimated. "A lot of that is hair, but there's a big dog underneath."

Tundra may be housebroken.

"I've been keeping her in an outdoor pen and she tends to wait until she's let out in the afternoon," Basch said.

Tundra is looking for a sponsor to pay for her spaying, which is the major cost associated with adop-

tion. Bessie's chances for adoption also would be increased with a sponsor.

Her owners moved out of town and could not take her with them, Basch said. She has been raised with teenagers and relates well to them, but may not be as good with small children.

She is not housebroken, but has had some obedience training. She weighs about 45 pounds and is full grown.

SPONSORS NEEDED

The increase in animals being brought to the shelter has put a strain on the facility, the staff and the sponsorship fund.

Without a sponsorship for animals that have not been spayed or neutered, adoptions can run as high as \$57.50 for a female dog. The cost includes the price of the altering procedure.

For many individuals, who would provide a good home for a pet, that can make a big difference and discourage them from adopting. On the other hand, society officials feel it is proper and a safety measure to charge an adoption fee to cover the animal's rabies shot, city license and some maintenance costs.

A new owner should be willing to make some type of financial commitment to a pet, Basch said. Booster shots may be needed and annual rabies and distemper shots as well as other veterinary care, he pointed out.

If the shelter gave away pets, a new owner might not place much value on an animal's life and be tempted to abandon it if the dog or cat became an inconvenience. It's also possible that without a fee

people would adopt and then sell the animals to medical research centers, Basch said.

Adoptions have increased significantly this past year, but the sponsorship fund for spaying and neutering has been exhausted.

New sponsors and repeat supporters are urgently needed to replenish the reserve.

All animals adopted from the shelter must be neutered or spayed to ensure they are not responsible for producing more unwanted litters. Despite the society's efforts to educate the public on the need to reduce the pet population humanely through birth control instead of being forced to destroy animals, more and more litters arrive at its doors each year.

For example, last year for the two months of January and February, 66 animals were impounded at

the shelter. In February alone this year, 194 cats and dogs were impounded.

An even sadder statistic relates to the number of animals that had to be destroyed because of irresponsible owners. The monthly average in 1991 was 50. In just two months of 1992, the average has hit a staggering 108 animals a month as the shelter is caught between rising numbers of pets impounded and a limited amount of space at the facility.

"Looking at these statistics, I'm really scared about summer," Basch said. "This usually is our slow season. These figures are disgusting with all of the options open to pet owners to avoid the needless deaths."

FAMILIAR FACES

Although there are many success stories among the dogs and cats brought to the shelter and then adopted, some of the animals previously featured in The Ruidoso News still are looking for homes.

Due to a recent intern training program at the Ruidoso Animal Clinic, many of the dogs and cats have been spayed and neutered without charge compliments of Dr. Lynn Willard.

Misty, a gray-black greyhound has been spayed and would like to find a loving new owner with a large fenced yard or acreage where she can stretch those long legs.

Doc is a neutered male hunting dog with a great disposition and attractive markings who would enjoy a romp in the woods with a new owner.

Misty and Doc have been at the shelter the longest and sometimes they seem to give up hope for a home of their own. But still, they show affection and appreciation for anyone willing to spend a few minutes talking or to take them on a walk.

Fugi is a delicate white-tan medium-size spaniel who is timid and even a little defensive with strangers. But for someone willing to take the time to visit her and get to know her, a loyal and loving pet will be the reward.

Flecks is a medium-size blue heeler mix who survived a confrontation with a car and has been neutered. He has a sweet disposition and, while fearful when he first arrived, has opened up and is eager for attention.

Specks is a German short-hair retriever with the eager good-nature of a pal. He also has been neutered.

Aimigo is a flat-coated black

retriever who has been neutered and would rather sit down for some petting than go for a walk. While he shows the excitability common for most shelter animals when visitors come, he settles down quickly once he is on his own with his new friend.

Another black flat-coated retriever is Wilma, a large female with a laid-back personality that demands little more than a few kind words and some food. She's about five years old and recently was separated from her longtime family.

Maggie is an extremely intelligent black-gray catahoola with the characteristic intense gaze, but affable personality. She has been spayed, walks easily on a leash, but also would be a good working dog.

In the cattery next door are Hazy, Hardy and Sylvie.

Hazy is an attractive gray striped male with full cheek pads that give him a moon face and set off his large eyes. He is easy-going, friendly and neat.

Hardy was brought to the shelter with her sister, Laurel, as a stray. She was extremely protective of her sibling and has been lonely since Laurel was adopted.

A young tiger stripe, Hardy was shy, but is beginning to respond well to attention from visitors to the cattery. She needs a loving home and would make a great companion for a single person in an apartment.

Sylvie also is a good candidate. The black and white female has been spayed and has an adaptable and friendly personality.



Street gangs infect towns and cities throughout the U.S.

Street gangs are not a threat in Los Angeles, Albuquerque or Alamogordo, they are a reality.

In smaller communities they are still in the threat stage but if unchecked the problem will certainly engulf a small community like Ruidoso.

This was the message delivered by Carl Bengtson, U.S. Treasury Agent, who works with the departments Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms.

Agent Bengtson spoke to the monthly meeting of the 12th Judicial District Law Enforcement Association on Friday in Alamogordo. His specialty in the department is gangs of all varieties and their firearms violations.

He was introduced by Ruidoso Detective Sergeant Lanny Maddox, president of the association which includes law enforcement agencies in Lincoln and Otero Counties in Southeastern New Mexico.

"What was once California's problem has now become our problem," said Maddox in introducing Bengtson and the subject.

Bengtson initiated his talk by giving his background in dealing with gangs of all descriptions.

He began police work in Daytona Beach where he had his introduction to motorcycle gangs like the Hell's Angels and Banditos. He later worked in the federal penal system and there learned about prison gangs whose influence extends beyond the penal walls.

His education continued with the U.S. Marshal's office in Dallas where he was in charge of monitoring groups that had the potential of disrupting the judicial system. Nationalistic groups like the Irish Re-

public Army; white supreme groups like The Aryan Nations and Skin Heads; and extreme right-wing organizations like The Posse Comitatus.

In 1987, he began working as a treasury agent specializing in firearms violations as related to organized gang activities. He now conducts seminars with police departments and has helped the Albuquerque Police Department to organize a new anti-gang unit.

Albuquerque had its first drive-by gang shooting on June 16 last year.

Bengtson now conducts state wide training programs with different police departments, teaching how to combat gangs.

What is a gang? Bengtson posed the question. It has four elements he said.

—three or more persons linked together.

—a common symbol like L.A. Raiders jackets, colored bandanas, etc.

—engaged in criminal acts.

—commit crimes frequently.

Are there gangs in Alamogordo? He said that he noticed graffiti on the exterior wall of a convenience store on 10th street in Alamogordo. The initials VDL were spray painted on the wall. He said that is cryptic and marks the area of a gang. If later he saw it X'd out he would know that a rival gang was disputing the territory and was showing disrespect to the initial gang.

Learning to read graffiti has become an important part of his job. Some of the graffiti will even give direction to crack houses, and the color of the paint can denote a particular gang.

In addition to their "colors" the

gangs have hand signals to both identify themselves and show disrespect for other gangs.

The street gang movement, as we know it, can be traced back to two high schools of California where the Crips and Bloods were started and has spread about the country by judges ordering youthful defenders to leave town, and by parents who move their adolescents to new environments, he said.

Where the gangs might be intense rivals in other areas, when they move to smaller markets like Albuquerque, Alamogordo or perhaps Ruidoso they have been known to work together, and even racially oriented gangs, made up of blacks or Hispanics, interact and become homogeneous, according to the agent.

Taxpayer patients may be advised to seek a specialist, CPA or tax preparer, for complex tax problems.

Payment is totally painless and no insurance is necessary as the whole income tax operation is free, because this all performed by volunteers sponsored jointly by the Internal Revenue Service and the American Association of Retired Persons, continues the news release.

More volunteers are needed to provide this service to more people. violation say by a crack dealer, penalties are mandated by law. Also federal sentences have few parole provisions, requiring a convicted felon to serve all of his time.

He mentioned that the Governor of the Pueblo Nation has sought help in gang control, a problem that compares to an investigation Ruidoso authorities are conducting concerning a gang on the Mesalero reservation. That gang is currently assembling a stockpile of firearms, according to Detective Maddox.

The solving of the gang problem, whether in Los Angeles, Albuquerque, Alamogordo or Ruidoso, must fall to the community as a whole, Bengtson said.

Law enforcement agencies can investigate the crimes and take the lead in combating the gangs but organizations like schools, churches, service clubs and elected local officials must solve the problem that is casting a shadow on all of the nation's cities, towns and villages alike.

Coalition considers mutual concerns

The spotted owl and its impact on public lands will be one of the main topics during the general meeting of the Coalition of Arizona/New Mexico Counties for Stable Economic Growth March 28.

The meeting will begin at 8 a.m. at the Carrizozo Country Club.

At its last meeting, the coalition board unanimously approved sending the organization's comments regarding forest policies and the owl to the regional office of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in Albuquerque.

The 17 pages of comment detail the "creative speculation, admitted survey bias and juxtaposition of Northern and California spotted owl data used by the service to reach unscientific conclusions" in the opinion of the coalition, according to Howard Hutchinson, media liaison for the coalition.

The group represents five counties in Arizona and seven in

New Mexico, including Lincoln County, along with individuals, organizations and industries throughout the two states. The comment document represents just one of the many issues the coalition has taken up in its two-year history, Hutchinson wrote in a recent news release.

The drawing together of counties with diverse economic and political structures was prompted by the realization that rural county problems are being ignored, he wrote.

"The spotted owl issue is another example of a federal agency's failure to actively involve local governments in the decision-making process," Hutchinson said. "This omission effectively evades the democratic process established by constitutional and statutory law."

According to the coalition, the best scientific information on the Mexican spotted owl would indicate it is not threatened, Hutchinson

said. However, the member counties are taking steps to design and be prepared to implement recovery plans for threatened or endangered species. Recent meetings with the service in Washington D.C. addressed the prospects for this type of local government participation, he said.

Coalition members are concerned about the maintenance of environmental and economic stability, Hutchinson said. Much of the economic activity in rural areas center around agriculture and natural resources. The mixture of economic activities demands considerations of environmental impacts, not just as theoretical ideals, he said.

Land and resource use decisions made today yield tomorrow's profits, he said. Profits are measured both monetarily and environmentally. Most people chose to live in rural communities for the clean air

and water and the close proximity to nature, Hutchinson pointed out.

The main environmental concern expressed in the spotted owl comments by coalition members is the apparent failure of the service to recognize the danger to Southwestern forests.

Hutchinson quoted Professor Wallace Covington of Northern Arizona University School of Forestry, as saying that only 15-30 years may remain for research and development of environmentally sound methods for reducing both tree densities and fuel loadings.

This must be done to protect and conserve not only the remaining ancient trees, but also the other ecological components and processes in the southwestern Ponderosa pine type.

WASHINGTON—A nutrition organization was hopeful that a nutritionally complete "hi-tech" food tablet would help erase world hunger problems, until a study revealed that one of the ingredients could cause significant weight loss.

Although other studies and scientists may not agree, researchers in Europe found that the ingredient, a natural plant colloid, actually caused people to lose weight, even though specifically instructed not to alter normal eating patterns, according to one study published in the prestigious *British Journal of Nutrition*. Researchers in an earlier study had speculated that the weight loss was due to a decrease in the intestinal absorption of calories.

While the project of National Dietary Research, aptly named Food Source One, would not be used to successfully fulfill its original goal, the formula which has since been improved with other natural colloids has been a windfall for some overweight people. A Daytona Beach, Florida woman fighting a weight battle for 12 years used the product on the recommendation of her physician and lost 30 pounds. She stated, "Not only have I lost 30 pounds but my cholesterol has dropped from 232 to 143. I have two closets full of clothes which have not fit me in two years that I can now wear." In a separate report, a telephone interview revealed that a Wilmington, North Carolina pharmacist lost 14 pounds in 3 weeks on the product and was never hungry.

Team warms up on relay meet

The Ruidoso Warrior track team ran up against some stiff competition at the first outdoor meet of the season at the West Texas Relays in Odessa on Friday and Saturday, but it didn't stop some of the competitors from doing their personal best.

Coach Ronny Maskew said the meet is one of the largest ones in Texas with more than 1,600 athletes competing. The Warriors have been going to the meet for seven years, but this was the 48th year for the event.

Maskew said he was really pleased with the performance of the athletes and they did well for their first outdoor meet of the year. He said some of the other schools had already been to three to five meets this year compared to Ruidoso's one indoor meet in February.

"For the first meet of the year the kids did real well. We have a good start if we take this and improve on it each week," Maskew

said. In an outstanding performance for the Warriors Lhisa Tam won first place in both the 1600 and 3200 meter runs. In the 3200 she cut 36 seconds off her regular time for a time of 11 minutes 28.4 seconds, which gave her a new school record. Her mile time of 5 minutes and 28.94 seconds was also eight seconds better than her previous times. Maskew said Tam even beat several girls who had been unbeaten in the races.

In other girls' results, Monica Martinez threw the discus 106 feet, three inches for third place. Sarah Dix long jumped 15 feet, 11 and one quarter inches to place seventh in the finals.

In the boys competition Nick Nanz and Shane Eidson were double winners in their events. Nanz placed fifth in the 1600 meter with a time of 4 minutes, 44.64 seconds and third in the 3200 meter with a time of 10 minutes, 10.3 seconds.

Maskew said Nanz's time in the two mile was his best ever. Also in the two mile Josh Norbury placed eighth with a time of 11 minutes, 42.90 seconds.

Eidson also had one of his better throws in the shot put where he placed fourth with a distance of 48 feet, three and three-quarters inches. He also earned a sixth place finish in the discus with a throw of 126 feet, 11 inches.

Louis Jiminez received sixth place in the long jump for a mark of 19 feet, 10 and one-quarter inches. Keith Henson made it into the finals and placed eighth in the 110 meter hurdles with a time of 16.78 seconds.

The boys also did well in the relay competition. In the mile relay, Jiminez, Henson, Jason Dix and Anthony Torres placed sixth with a time of three minutes, 45.02 seconds. In the 400 meter relay the team placed seventh with a time of 46.89 seconds.


Favorite Hymns


Just when we think we've heard it all...

The row of puppies is the same picture we saw in *The News* that sent me to the Humane Society shelter, where we acquired Lukenbach, a sheep dog mix whose pictures could be Xerox copies of the one you ran of Shad.

Our Saint Bernard had died and we wanted another large, shaggy dog as a companion for our four-year-old daughter, Holley. We had struck a bargain with a breeder for a standard poodle, but received a telephone call that complications had squandered the deal. That same day we saw the article and I went to the shelter to find one female pup left from the litter. She became an instant family member, and when the breeder called two days later to say the poodle deal was on

again I said, "Sorry, but we have our dog." We never regretted the choice.

Like Shad, Lukey was a working dog, holding down a full time job as chief greeter in my camera shop until we moved from Ruidoso in 1980. She changed careers to nanny duty when we moved to Socorro and continued, through a move to Austin in 1984, until her retirement when Holley turned 16 and got a driver's license.

Lukey's sight and hearing failed in later years, but not her appetite, and she remained a faithful family companion until her death February 3 of cancer.

She never met anyone who wasn't her friend, except maybe the two cats who moved in with us two years ago. She never learned that at 60 pounds she wasn't designed as a lap dog. She wasn't much for barking; she seemed to consider it ruffian behavior and used it only when over-excited in a game of

catch-the-towel. Some harrowing experiences as a pup caught outside in violent lightning-and-thunder storms at our home in Ruidoso just beneath the KRRR transmitter tower (a terrific lightening attractor) gave her a lifetime fear of thunder and booming noises. Those were the times she was most likely to seek a lap. You could always tell a storm was coming long before the first flashes or splashes, because Lukey would start trembling and looking for someone to hold her.

The Fourth of July was always a trial, and the four years I worked in the weapons research laboratory at New Mexico Tech in Socorro were a constant, mysterious thunderstorm as far as she was concerned because the town reverberated daily from tests of anti-aircraft warheads in the mountains close behind the campus. She would run around with her nose in the air looking for the thunderclouds and never find them.

I suppose anyone who adopts a pet into full-fledged family membership can speak the way we do of Lukey and the Wards do of Shad, but I wanted to let you know how much we enjoyed your celebration of Shad's life (and, by proxy, of Lukey's) and how much we agree with the Wards' appreciation of the Humane Society shelter. Although we kept telling Lukey that the two cats were kindred souls, being shelter babies themselves, she appeared disinclined to admit the shared distinction. But we all have roots, and we know that deep in her heart Lukey appreciated hers as well. Thank you for reminding us of them.

We had a thunderstorm last night, and I think Lukey and Shad were up there, somewhere in the clouds, looking down at their people and smiling at the memory of how fine it was to have an excuse to share a lap.

Shelter dogs share love wherever they live

Here's how demand metering really works

TO THE EDITOR:

After reading the three eloquent February 27 rebuttals to Fred Hansen's February 20 letter regarding the alleged "fairness" of Otero County Electric Cooperative's residential demand metering system, it suddenly occurred to me that the majority of your subscribers who are not served by this utility probably haven't a clue what demand metering is.

What happens is this: Our electric meters have an extra "demand"

gauge circling the rim of the meter. Every time you turn on anything electric, a needle advances. This particular gauge reaches a "peak" number and if it goes beyond a certain point, the whole month's electric bill is computed on the highest 15 minutes of the peak this gauge reaches, often resulting in electric bills with fully a third of the cost incurred by the demand factor.

Years ago electric co-ops were established so that rural residents

could have electricity, sometimes requiring many miles of line to reach a single customer. These were a godsend for thousands of rural residents. They were never intended for urban service.

Fred Hansen's idea seems to be that it is only fair for the larger number of rural customers to pay less than those few customers in more-populated areas who "have lots of electric conveniences" because these people are probably more "affluent and can afford it."

Contrary to Fred Hansen's premise, a populated area—like Alto Village with 600 meters to 17 miles of line—should not have to pay extra to subsidize, for instance, 17 miles of rural line going to only one meter, nor should the residents of towns like Carrizozo and Capitan.

I think he's got it backwards! Hence all the protests.
