RHS senior wins Horatio Alger grant

Linda Hankins was named the winner of the Horatio Alger Association \$5,000 scholarship at an assembly Thursday at Ruidoso High School.

Hankins and Jennifer Stevens were the two finalists the association chose from. High school counselor Jean Forister said the selection committee here had about 10 applicants, and they narrowed it down to these two for the association to choose from.

"It was very difficult because we had 10 good applicants. We are glad we didn't have to pick between these two," she said.

Hankins was excited and overwhelmed by receiving the award. She said people can never be prepared for things that happen in life so they have to take it as it comes. Winning this award is the silver lining in her life, Hankins said.

"I just keep going and keep my chin up. I like to stay involved. I help out at the elementary and other places and that helps me. When something gets me down I get more involved and look for ways to help others so they don't have to go through it too," Hankins said.

She plans to attend college at New Mexico State University at Las Cruces to major in communications and psychology. She said she wants to be a news broadcaster and motivational speaker so she can reach a wide audience of people.

"I would have done whatever it took to go to NMSU, but this will make things a lot easier," Hankins said.

Stevens, the runner-up, is planning to attend Baylor University for a medical career in helping children with cancer.

The award is given out to a person who has the characteristics emphasized in Horatio Alger's writings. The characters in the books use their determination to overcome incredible odds to be successful.

Francine Neff, 35th United States treasurer, was the guest speaker at the event. She is a native of New Mexico and past winner of the Alger's scholarship. She grew

then got her bachelor's degree at the University of New Mexico.

Neff got married on her graduation day and thought she would teach school, but she couldn't get in. They had two children, and she said she volunteered for every good cause in Albuquerque, including things for the Republican party. When she got a call asking her to come to Washington D.C., Neff said she couldn't believe it and thought it was for her husband, who is a C.P.A.

She said her experiences in finding volunteers, teaching them and organizing them were all valuable to her in the treasury department during the terms of President Richard Nixon and Gerald Ford. Neff was the spokesperson for the department and traveled to almost every state to explain the policies and procedures of the program. She was also in charge of the bicentennial program and the national directory of savings bonds.

Her staff and 60,000 volunteers nationwide sold more bonds than any other year since World War II.

Neff got out of the treasury department as President Carter came into office and now sits on the board of directors for several Fortune 500 businesses, including the Hersheys chocolate company.

"People ask me if I miss Washington, and I don't because I never learned to like it. The fresh air and mountains of New Mexico are home," Neff said.

"You don't know what life will deal you. You don't know what skills you are gaining in life. Opportunity still knocks in America," she said.

Principal Mike Kakuska, who introduced Neff and the winner of the scholarship, said it doesn't matter if a student comes from a school of 500 or 5,000 if he or she wants to be successful.

"You have a choice of how far you go. It is up to you whether you want to do something with your life," he said.

LCMC, county mull options for indigent medical care fund

The way Lincoln County currently handles medically indigent patients is better suited for the area than setting up a special indigent fund and hiring an administrator, County Commissioners said Friday.

But unless modifications result from a task force study over the next year, the county will be forced to establish an indigent fund by July 1, 1993 in an amount equal to what would be generated by a sales tax of 1/16th of one percent.

To finance the fund, the commission probably would impose the additional 1/16th tax. That should generate \$106,000 annually in Lincoln County.

Ruidoso already has one of the highest sales tax rates in the state.

It's all part of the State Legislature's attempt to drum up more dollars as a match for federal Medicaid money. But instead of imposing a tax statewide, the legislature is

leaving it up to counties to decide whether to impose the tax or dip into their general funds.

Commissioners met with officials from the Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC) Friday to discuss the impacts of the legislation and possible options.

The extra money is needed to provide expanded Medicaid coverage for pregnant women and for children ages nine through 18,

according to a report from the New Mexico Association of Counties.

Lincoln County is an unusual case in that the LCMC in Ruidoso and the Carrizozo Health Clinic are supported by an annual property tax levy of 4.25 mills. (One mill equals \$1 for each \$1,000 of taxable property value.)

That portion of the millage designated for the hospital (3.25 mills) would generate about \$528,500 this year for capital expenditure and \$390,000 for the operation of the hospital.

An allowance for indigent patients is figured into the operating expense. Hospital officials are concerned that the county might dip into its budget for money if a separate indigent fund must be established.

"It is recognized by the Association of Counties (and other groups that will be represented on the study task force) that hospitals

C of C appoints executive director

The Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce selected a local person, Joan Bailey, for the position of executive director at the chamber.

Chamber president Paul Crown announced Bailey as the new director after taking a telephone roll call vote for which she received a majority of votes. She will officially take office the first of April.

One reason the selection committee made such a quick decision was because there are a lot of pressing projects that need immediate decisions on, including the arts and crafts festival which is a major money maker for the organization, Crown said. He said he realizes they will probably be criticized for naming someone so quickly, they thought it was important to get someone on these things.

The selection committee received 70 applications for the position which became vacant with the resignation of Jerry Watts in February. They had narrowed the applicants down to six and called references for each one, but did not do extensive interviews with them.

Crown said the main reason for hiring Bailey is that she has more than eight years experience in the Ruidoso Chamber, and she knows what position the chamber is in. She knows the businesses and the community, he said.

He also voted for her because it will be an easier transition for the chamber to have someone who knows so much about the operations.

Committee member Valerie Miller said they looked at a variety of good applicants but the key was to find someone with a knowledge of Ruidoso and its political environment. She said it was far more important to her personally than whether the person had been successful at a chamber in another arena.

She said she did not think they made the selection too quickly because they had looked

at applications for about a month and they didn't want a void when Watts left. She said some were very qualified, but they really couldn't have afforded them.

"We could have searched forever, but I think Joan still would have been the best," Miller said.

"She has a knowledge of the job. She has a can-do attitude. I have been impressed with what she has done with the advertising committee at the chamber," she said.

Miller said she thinks Bailey will go a great job, and people will see progress at the chamber soon.

The whole community is invited to meet Bailey at the chamber's business after hours from 5:30 p.m. to 7 p.m. Thursday at the chamber office.

Bailey said she is excited about taking the new position. She said she thought she had lo-

cal support in the chamber and the business community, but she never took it for granted that she would get the position.

"I have been a resident here for the last 15 years and I know what it is like to make a personal and financial investment in a community. I hope I can be the catalyst to bring this community back to where it should be," Bailey said.

The chamber has a responsibility both in economic development and in community development. She said this is a community of families who came here for the same reason, the quality of life.

Bailey said she thinks it is also a plus to have served on four different chamber boards in her time here.

"I have had the opportunity to see both sides of the situation. I know what members expect and those things haven't been getting done," she said.

With the present board and membership she said she hopes to turn this around.

"It is really an exciting and advantageous time to be a part of Ruidoso,"

Bailey said she is looking forward to working with the village and with Main Street Ruidoso. She said she thinks the chamber should be more supportive and involved in the Main Street program.

Although Bailey owns and operates Story Book Cabins now, she will have her staff run it while she is chamber director.

"The chamber is my first priority," she said. Her business will remain a member of the chamber, but she has instructed the chamber staff to not refer it to people unless they specifically ask about it.

She will not start in her official capacity until April 1, but Bailey said she plans to be at chamber this week to begin work on things.

"I don't want to be doing housekeeping when I start. I want to be on good footing," Bailey said.

February was a slow month at the hospital

February was a slow month for Lincoln County Medical Center and would have been even worse without a county mill levy, but so far March is looking much better.

Valerie Miller, hospital administrator, reported to the LCMC board Thursday night that on some days in February they only had three or four patients in a day. In financial figures the net revenues were down \$90,192 from last year and about that from January 1992 for a positive bottom line of \$13,443. Miller said without the mill levy they would have lost more than \$60,000 in February.

The hospital has given about \$966,000 in free care, but this must be done, Miller said. She said the hospital can't refuse people service, nor should they. These people aren't asking for hand-outs but are productive members of this society who are working two or three jobs just to hang on, she said.

It isn't the hospital's philosophy

to go after a person's source of income to pay a bill, Miller said. If the person has a car, she said they don't want to take it away because the person couldn't get to work then. She said they do go after the people who just ignore the billing and do have the resources to pay.

Board member Gary Mitchell also pointed out that many of these people have been struggling for years to pay insurance premiums, but the insurance companies usually only pay 80 percent of a bill. The people then don't have the money to pay the 20 percent, he said.

President Dub Williams said there are a lot of people on the ropes these days trying to get by financially. He said 37 million people are going without insurance, but many people out there can't sleep at night knowing they need to pay a bill.

Miller said she heard an economist from Princeton speak on the topic of health care and he said the blame should no longer be on the providers. He said if the insur-

ance companies, Medicaid and Medicare all went to the same billing form \$56 billion would be saved. That would take care of all the free care hospitals have to provide, Miller said.

In other business, Miller said letters have been sent out to about 20 people to invite them to be members of a mill levy committee to inform the community of its importance. So far they have received two positive responses and will be planning a meeting with the members in mid May.

Miller told the group that she and Williams would be speaking to the county commission Friday on the budget requests for the coming fiscal year and projections up to the 1994 fiscal year. She said it is difficult to predict the costs in budgeting for health care, but if LCMC doesn't need all the funds the commission can cut back the mill levy.

She said they will request two new computers to increase automation. She said with increased automation and networking the same

staff should be able to handle an increased load of patients.

In a report from the auxiliary, Inez Tanner said several of the auxiliary members attended a New Mexico Hospital Association meeting in Roswell and heard several good speakers, including a woman from Gallup who spoke on the alcohol problems in that area. Tanner also reported that the members are working hard in the Pink Shop, the thrift shop and at the desk of the hospital. The group is known throughout the state for its excellent thrift shop, Williams said.

Dr. Arlene Brown, chief of staff, reported that the joint meeting earlier this month between the staff and the board to discuss the county mill levy issue was very productive for them.

She also said the staff gave administrator Miller a vote of confidence in her work at LCMC. Miller is starting her third year with the hospital and was also praised by the board members.

Ruidoso receives tree grant

Ruidoso was recently awarded a \$100 tree grant made possible by Keep New Mexico Beautiful, Inc.

The state Arbor Day ceremony was March 13 at Ernie Taylor Park in Albuquerque, honoring the memory of one of Albuquerque's volunteers. Mr. Taylor was a Forest Service employee for over 30 years and then shared countless volunteer hours with the City of Albuquerque during his retirement years.

Sponsored by Keep New Mexico Beautiful, Inc., the program and tree planting were in the park with a reception following across the street at the Bear Canyon Senior Citizen's Center.

Ruidoso Downs board will consider two requests

The Ruidoso Downs Board of Trustees will consider two financial recommendations from the Lodgers Tax Committee at the board meeting tonight.

The committee approved two requests at its meeting a week ago for a total of \$7,500. The Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium requested \$5,000 plus some funds to help pay bills from last year, and the committee approved \$6,000. They will be recommending \$1,500 for the Ruidoso Downs Ladies Auxiliary for advertising the art festival.

The board will also be looking at bids for soil sample tests on the grounds of the old city hall. The offices were moved out of the old city hall because of contamination from a broken sewer line.

They will also hear a request for a zoning variance for a piece of property on Valley View Lane that is currently residential. Membership fees for the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County will also be discussed.

So far, LCMC Board has no applicants for scholarship

The Lincoln County Medical Center has received no applications for its annual scholarship, but students have until April 15 to apply.

Valerie Miller, hospital administrator, said the scholarship is awarded to someone going into a health related field at a two or four year institution. The scholarship is for \$500 per semester and can be renewed up to four years if the student's grade point average of at least 2.8 on a 4.0 scale is maintained.

Information on the scholarship is available from the high school counselor, Jean Forister, or from Miller. Applications can then be sent to Miller at LCMC, Drawer 3C/D, HS.

Tootsie Roll drive aids others

The Seventeenth Annual New Mexico Tootsie Roll Drive will be on Saturday, April 4.

Knights of Columbus local members will be at various local merchants giving out Tootsie Rolls for donations.

around the state in rural areas should not be in jeopardy by having to fund (\$106,000) out of their budgets," hospital administrator Valerie Miller told commissioners.

"The task force has 18 months to come up with specific recommendations," she said. "And they are supposed to look at the situation county by county."

Miller said she also is concerned that under strict Medicaid eligibility guidelines, many of the people who are struggling to stay afloat would not qualify for help with their medical bills.

She now decides on a case-to-case basis who will be classified under that category. Most often it is a person who falls between the cracks of other programs such as Medicaid, but who needs the help, nonetheless, she said.

"In reality, a lot of people have just enough not to qualify for Medicaid, but still fall into the free care category," Miller said. "Some people say why not go after their car or home (for payment of medical bills), but I think that isn't productive for society. If you take their car, they can't work."

"Most of these people are not looking for a handout. Many are working two and three jobs to keep food on the table."

She said many people have insurance and pay their premiums, "but there's no money left to pay the 20 percent left on a bill. They're not deadbeats either."

Medicaid reimbursements to the hospital do not cover the true cost of the care, Miller said.

"Their reimbursement level continues to fall," she said. "And they take a long time to pay."

"The expansion of Medicaid for LCMC is not the deal it's made out to be."

Miller said she has been unable to get a definitive answer on who would be covered by the expanded Medicaid blanket.

And that makes it difficult to assess what type of impact it would have on the hospital.

Last year under a different house bill, she was led to believe it would be young children. She concluded that would have about a \$10,000 a year positive impact on the hospital since there are no pediatric specialists on staff. Young patients would end up at other facilities, she said.

"It's harder to estimate the impact of (House Bill 441) in terms of who will be qualified for the federal match," she said. "How much would offset the free care we are now giving is hard to estimate."

"I think we will see less than \$30,000 increase in reimbursement of Medicaid. The federal match doesn't come back whole to the hospital. Obviously, other providers are out there."

The expanded coverage should increase accessibility of medical

treatment, but it will never cover the gap because the income guidelines are so stringent, Miller said. "The intent of 441 is laudable, but it just doesn't provide that much of a relief to the hospital."

Commission Chairman Stirling Spencer told Miller to monitor the number of Medicaid patients, the cost of their care and the amount of reimbursement for the next few years to give the county an accurate reading.

"We could establish a baseline this fiscal year and then can monitor on year to year basis," Miller said. "It won't be difficult."

Spencer said he is not in favor of setting up a separate indigent department. But he said the public has a legitimate right to know how its property taxes are being spent.

Instead of Miller acting alone, he suggested a committee be established to review cases. The committee could be comprised on Miller, a county commissioner and a hospital board member.

"With the county in the condition it is today, it might help the perception by having a three-person board," Spencer said.

"This may be the English in me coming out, but I believe these cases should be handled discreetly," Miller said. "It's such a personal thing. It's a small town and everyone seems to know everyone else's business."

"I have sent some back because they were not willing to disclose their financial status or I didn't feel they had worked it right."

She consults with the hospital business office on all accounts, she said.

"Unless the voters are unhappy with my handling, this is the least expensive way," Miller said. "It avoids the cost of setting up an indigent fund, a board and an administrator."

County attorney J. Robert Beauvais said if the county eventually establishes an indigent fund with the sales tax, commissioners may want to reduce the amount of property tax levied for the hospital since free care would no longer be part of its budget.

"Right now, property owners are supporting the free care you're giving," he said.

It would spread the tax burden by using a gross receipts tax for indigents.

The commission doesn't have to impose a sales tax before next year, because the law only says it must be in place by July 1, 1993.

Beauvais said. If the county imposes it earlier, the state might take that as an election to participate in the voluntary program and would consume that money too.

"Check that," Spencer said. "I'm sorry to be so mistrusting. But I'm not for taking the money from county coffers. Everything is lean and I don't want to penalize any department if the state says they want the money up front."

On the other hand, there's no reason to penalize taxpayers one year up front as long as they'll take a trickle effect."

"As I understand, regardless of the mechanism the commission uses to finance indigent care, the hospital still needs the 4.25 mills because the positive impact on LCMC will be negligible," Beauvais said, refocusing the meeting on the upcoming referendum.

TIMING

Miller said hospital board members are concerned that the hospital millage issue may be lost on the crowded November ballot.

Since there are four general obligation bond issues and two proposed constitutional amendments also on the ballot, some voters might just vote negatively on everything, she said.

The board would like the commission to consider a special election with the hospital paying the cost.

"The continuation of the millage support is crucial to us to provide this level of service," Miller said.

"We might get it by if we do a real good job educating the voters," said hospital board chairman Dub Williams. "But if we fail, we can't go back and redo it. The hospital wouldn't close tomorrow, but we would have to diminish service."

Beauvais said a special election usually brings out supporters and would be a wise move for the hospital.

Commissioners postponed action on the special election request until their meeting April 7. Meanwhile, County Clerk Martha Proctor will determine the cost.

The proposed wording on the millage referendum tracks state statutes and the previously ballot wording, except it clarifies that the money may be used for operation as well as capital outlay.

Williams said there has been confusion over that issue in the past.

Commissioner Monroy Montes

said he also would like to see wording that lets voters know the commission could reduce the levy. The 4.25 mill figure is the maximum, but is not guaranteed for each of the eight years, he pointed out.

"It could be reduced if the millage generates more money," Montes said.

Beauvais said the commission has two mechanisms by which it can control the situation.

"The commission has to authorize the 4.25 mill levy on a year to year basis and it also has an annual review of the hospital budget," he said.

Spencer said the administration of hospital has been superb and the board of directors is doing a marvelous job.

On a motion by Commissioner Bill Elliott, the board approved the request for millage budget.

Under capital expenditures for replacement, the hospital requested \$210,500 for cardiac monitors and related items, \$25,000 for a blood gas system for the laboratory and \$100,000 for an air-conditioning chiller unit.

New items included a file saver and computer management system for radiology and other items totaling \$193,000.

From the millage levy, \$390,000 will go for operation, for a total millage request of \$918,000.

In her report to the commission, Miller wrote that also the rate of improvement has been slower than she would have liked. "As of January 31, 1992, with mill levy funds of \$319,285 included, the hospital showed a positive bottom line of \$230,845 year to date. This is a \$241,331 improvement over this time last year and includes no increase in charges to patients."

With the millage support deducted, the hospital would show a loss of \$243,212.

"I expect to decrease the loss by year end March 31, 1992, but feel that we will be, at best, within the budget submitted to you earlier in the year, and possibly a little behind," she wrote.

Some of the factors contributing to the slow improvement are the imposition of more federal regulations without reimbursement and the economic condition of the county, Miller said. Small businesses are unable to provide health care for employees, she said. Free care at the hospital has climbed by six percent and she expects it to climb dramatically as long as the recession continues.


It was a blessing to have Saint Patrick's Day begun by a message from a great friend and true son of the Emerald Isle.

A pink nose surrounded by a soft white coat and kind brown eyes, Cotton Candy embodies just about every desirable trait a pet could offer.

The one-year-old shepherd-labrador cross is spayed. She doesn't bark and easily learns and adapts to a set schedule, said Randy Basch, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter.

Candy arrived at the shelter about four months ago as a stray and is eligible for adoption.

"She has a very sweet nature," Basch said. "She's good with kids, with dogs and cats."

She also likes to run and recently enjoyed an impromptu excursion

into a creek near the shelter.

"So we know she likes water too," Basch said. "She'd make any family a great pet."

Her spaying procedure was done as a part of an intern program at the Ruidoso Animal Clinic compliments of Dr. Lynn Willard.

But many other dogs and cats at the shelter haven't been that lucky. They also wait for new owners but will have to be spayed or neutered as part of the adoption process.

The shelter is looking for sponsors who would like to pay that cost for a particular dog or cat, or as a contribution to the spay and neuter fund. The chances for adoption are greatly enhanced for sponsored animals, because the procedure is the major cost.

All pets from the shelter must be

spayed and neutered as part of the society's commitment to controlling the dog and cat populations and to reducing the tragic destruction of millions of such animals each year.

Although adoptions have increased at the shelter, several of the pets featured in the past still are waiting for new owners. Some of their faces are shown on this page.

Fugi is a delicate, white-tan medium-size spaniel who is timid and need a gentle, loving owner willing to take the time to get to know her.

Specks is a good-natured, neutered German short-hair retriever and a great pal.

Amigo is a neutered flat-coated black retriever who is excitable at first but melts with some stroking.

Hazy is an attractive gray striped male cat with a moon face that sets off his large eyes.

Hardy is shy tiger-stripe who needs a loving home and would be a good companion for a single person.

Sylvie is a good-natured black and white female who has been spayed and declawed.

Animals adopted from the shelter receive a free grooming from Hondo Valley Kennels and a free first examination from local veterinarians. Part of the adoption fee also covers a city license and a rabies shot.





School Crime Stoppers programs receive national attention, praise

The Lincoln County/Ruidoso Crime Stoppers had its monthly meeting on Thursday at K-Bob's Restaurant in Ruidoso.

Det. Sgt. Lanny Maddox, Ruidoso Police Department, police coordinator for the Crime Stoppers program, reported on his recent trip to a Crime Stoppers State Training Program in Clovis. He said that the Ruidoso school programs, innovatively installed in the middle and high schools by the local organization, are receiving a lot of positive attention.

He also pointed to an article in "The Caller," the publication of Crime Stoppers International, in which the local school programs were featured.

In addressing the problems of gangs in the Ruidoso schools, he said two organized gangs have been discovered and the school Crime Stoppers programs contributed to their discovery, and the arrest and incarceration of two gang leaders.

Paula Papponi, middle school principal, in commenting on gang apparel which is a trademark of each gang, said that in the fall school handbook there will be a dress code that eliminates gang associated clothing.

Maddox said that he has information that there is a gang forming in the area that is collecting firearms and plan some "hits" in the summer. He said the term in gang parlance is "Cap that person," an obvious reference to the drive-by-shootings prevalent in large cities.

Maddox said that this is not just a police problem but a community problem.

"We're going to have a gang problem regardless of what we do," he said, "We just have to quash them as soon as they start."

In other matters Maddox read a letter he had directed to David Lock, superintendent of schools at Capitan, in which he proposed installing the Crime Stoppers program into that school system.

Village hires a dogcatcher

The Village of Ruidoso has hired an animal control officer.

Johnny Parker, 39, has lived in the Ruidoso area for 3 years, having come here from Portales. He was raised on a farm near Clovis and comes from a tradition of handling animals. His father was a veterinary assistant for 13 years.

Parker is married and has one son, 18.

He is enthusiastic about his new position. He has pursued the job since last December.

His previous employment was with the Ruidoso Downs Race Track as an Emergency Medical Technician.

Parker reported for work on Thursday morning and began to address the problem of stray animals in the village.

Congratulations to the new C of C director



The supervisor suggested that he did not blame us for complaining — that we might as well have a telephone booth in our houses.

TO THE EDITOR:

The results of economic development were displayed at its best this past weekend in Roswell.

Two volunteer groups, The Roswell United Soccer Club and The Roswell Youth Soccer Association, carried out their Third Annual Soccer Tournament. In just three years it has grown to perhaps the largest and most widely attended soccer tournament in New Mexico and West Texas.

Teams came from as far west as Farmington and Four Corners, New Mexico, and many teams from towns in Texas such as Amarillo, Lubbock, Midland and El Paso.

Roswell Mayor Brainerd welcomed all participants to the major sports event in Roswell. John Harrison, tournament director and Mike Determan, deputy director, said that the success of the tournament was due to a large part to the outstanding work the City of Roswell does in providing parks and recreation facilities.

Sixteen fine soccer fields were

required to accommodate all the teams participating in the tournament. Two fields had to be built on park property a few days before the tournament. There has been outstanding help from the Roswell City Council and Parks and Recreation Department over the years to build and maintain soccer and other facilities.

Thirty-five to forty volunteers took reservations from teams wanting to participate, arranged hotel and motel rooms, printed a program, scheduled all the games for boys and girls from under eight years of age up, through under 19 years of age, arranged for referees and many more tasks.

The end result of this community effort was that 73 soccer teams and their families and fans descended upon Roswell last Friday and filled the town until Sunday evening.

Determan said that every motel room in Roswell was sold out and that they had to arrange for two motels in Artesia which were also

sold out. This was for the whole weekend.

They had to refuse to register more teams because of lack of room. Restaurants and fast food establishments all along Main Street were crowded with soccer players and fans from early morning to late evening every day.

Mike estimated that it would cost \$18,000 to run the tournament and they would take in around \$22,000 in various fees and sales for a three or four thousand dollar profit which would go back into the soccer program of Roswell.

Mike said the estimate was that the tournament would bring in to Roswell up to \$500,000. He did not know what this would mean in lodgers and gross receipts taxes.

The tournament directors presented the added attractions of having two professional soccer teams play in the Wool Bowl: The Dallas Rockets and The New Mexico Chiles brought top level professional soccer to town.

Womens soccer was also on dis-

play in the Wool Bowl when the New Mexico Olympic Development Teams from the south and north played.

Here in Ruidoso we have several hundred girls and boys in the various soccer programs, but do not have soccer fields which are adequate. We cannot get visiting teams to come to Ruidoso because of our poor fields. Our youth have to play on Roswell and Alamogordo teams or travel to compete.

Wouldn't it be nice if we had a few soccer and other sport facilities which would make it possible for us to bring a few hundred players and family members to town?
