Flyer is off to Japan

Aerobatic pilot Jim Franklin is a household name on the U.S. air show circuit.

The Lincoln County flier is now taking his show international. Franklin and his wing walker, Lee Oman, will perform April 12, in Japan.


This will be a first for Franklin and a first for the Japanese city of Atsugi. It's the first time a U.S. air show flier has performed there.

Also on the NAF Atsugi program is the U.S. Navy Leap Frogs, a parachute demonstration team. Japanese aviators will also demonstrate their skills.

On Monday, Franklin and his crew, along with his crated aerobatic airplane, will board a Boeing 747 and depart for the Asian nation.

Franklin makes his home in the Ruidoso area and spends the

Council considers animal population

At its regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday evening the Ruidoso Village council will conduct a public hearing on a new ordinance to require neutering and spaying of dogs and cats.

Ordinance 92-9 begins, "The Governing Body of the Village of Ruidoso finds and determines that an unacceptable number of healthy but abandoned dogs and cats are put to death by the Humane Society of Lincoln County."

The ordinance goes on to state that a large number of animals in the village poses a threat to the health and safety of the public, but the governing body finds euthanasia an unacceptable solution to the problem.

If passed, the ordinance will require all cats and dogs older than six months to be neutered or spayed unless their owners buy a special license or the owner is a registered breeder.

Also owners desiring to keep more than five dogs and/or cats will be required to purchase a fanciers permit.

Public comment on the proposed

ordinance is solicited at the meeting that begins at 6:30 p.m.

In addition to the pet ordinance the council will consider:

—a zone map amendment, Navajo Subdivision.

—a zone map amendment, Camelot Mountain Tracts.

—the Ruidoso Youth Activity Association request for funds.

—the consideration of proposals for water leak detection services.

—a general discussion on employment predetermination hearings.

—a consideration of lease agreement addendum with Franklin Aviation that will permit aerobatic practice at the airport.

—a consideration of sale of transfer trailer to the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority.

—a general discussion of a utility dispute resolution procedure.

—an extension of concession agreement with Avis.

—appointments to various boards and/or commissions.

—a pay request for Bradley Construction Company (contractor for the Civic Events Center.)

Council meetings are open to the public.

Proposed airline is soliciting for money again

Dick Weber is enthusiastic in his quest to establish air service for Ruidoso.

He's just \$9,491,705 short of the \$9.5 million he needs to start Resort Air, and he's written to the 113 donors who contributed \$8,295 last March and asked for more money.

According to Weber, Resort Air, a not-for-profit airline, would fly a route from El Paso to Ruidoso, Albuquerque, Santa Fe, Taos, Raton and Denver. It would then return over the same route. Three round-trip flights a day are proposed.

The \$9.5 million he hopes to raise is up \$1.5 million from the \$8 million Weber was looking for when he was interviewed in December. Weber and the Lincoln County Transportation Development District intend to go to the state transportation authority and ask their help in issuing bonds.

Weber is not sure how the money raising process will work, but says that \$9.5 million seems like a reasonable amount for financial institutions to raise.

"I'm not sure, but I think organizations like United New Mexico Bank are set up to do this," said Weber.

United New Mexico Bank Ruidoso branch manager Tom Rigsby is on the Village of Ruidoso Transportation Advisory Board that is working on the project, but Weber stressed he has not discussed raising funds with Rigsby.

Other members of the board are Weber, former village councilor Patricia Espinosa, Mayor Victor Alonso and accountant Roy

Crocker.

This is not the first group to attempt to bring air service to Ruidoso. Mesa Airlines has served Ruidoso, and Air Ruidoso was able to acquire all the needed certifications and licenses to provide scheduled air service for a few months.

Helene McCoy, owner and operator of Air Ruidoso, was successful in putting together an organization with planes and employees, but she wasn't able to attract enough passengers to continue in business.

McCoy said recently she hadn't been contacted by anyone on the Transportation Board or from Resort Air wanting information on her extensive experience with providing air service to Ruidoso.

Mesa Airlines, a very successful independent airline carrier headquartered in Farmington, has twice tried to provide air service to Ruidoso. Both attempts have failed, even though Mesa is successful in its other markets.

Gary Risley an official of Mesa says his company's market studies show that Ruidoso is a "Driver's Market," and Mesa was unable to sustain a passenger level and make it profitable.

Mesa was flying smaller and more economical, nine and ten passenger planes while Resort Air is proposing the older 50 passenger Convair.

Mesa's last attempt at serving Ruidoso was subsidized by the village and was discontinued when the village dropped the subsidy. It is Risley's opinion that the only way air service can be provided to Ruidoso, Taos or Raton is through a subsidy.

Mesa currently has a successful service

to Santa Fe but has no plans to enter the Ruidoso market.

The airline did provide service during both attempts.

"We can't generate enough revenue to make it profitable," Risley says.

Weber thinks Resort Air is different.

Weber is proud of the fact that without advertising he has received more than 100 resumes for flight crew positions.

Even though his proposed airline will only require 10 flight crew members he continues to respond to and process these resumes, sending them by express mail to his proposed Chief Executive Officer Kerry Greer in Florida. Bill Cleveland is the projected Flight Operations Officer and Chief Pilot.

Weber has become something of a lay expert on Convair 580 airplanes, calling all over the nation to locate refurbished and overhauled aircraft and parts, only to be disappointed when the aircraft that are on the market are sold before he is able to "tie up" the planes.

According to Weber, Gene Simmons of The Small Business Assistance Center in Roswell is working on a business plan and will have it completed in a month.

A new marketing study is also being proposed. Weber is going before the State Transportation Authority on April 23, and asking for \$15,000, to be used to contract the services of New Mexico State University or Eastern New Mexico University to study the market of villages and cities on the proposed route and see what market potential the airline will have.

In the meantime, Resort Air is In-

corporated in the State of New Mexico as a not-for-profit corporation. Weber paid the \$10 fee for incorporation from his own pocket. He is quick to show the entry in his check register.

Weber is president of the corporation, Mayor Alonso is vice president, Espinosa is secretary and Crocker is treasurer.

In order for the airline to obtain approval of the Federal Aviation Agency, it must publish an operations manual under part 121 of the Federal Aviation Regulations. Kerry Greer is handling this phase of the procedure.

Mayor Alonso said in a January interview that he backs Resort Air because he believes the village needs air service and "it is the only game in town. If we don't pursue Resort Air what are the options?"

He also indicated that he is against further subsidies for an airline.

Last March, Weber raised \$8,295 by asking for donation from organizations and individuals, 113 donors responded. Of this initial fund, \$3,534 has been spent, primarily for travel expenses for Greer and Campbell, supplies, and attorney fees. Weber has been paying the postage, office supplies and telephone bills out of his own pocket.

The largest donor to the fund was the Village of Ruidoso with a contribution of \$1,000.

The Lincoln County Commission refused to donate even \$75 to the fund.

Commission Chairman Stirling Spencer said the lack of an airline doesn't affect the community that much.

Spencer pointed out that air service

could even harm small businesses along the highways of Lincoln County. Those businesses depend on drivers' patronage.

Weber has written the original 113 donors, and other prospective contributors, in an attempt to raise an additional \$12,000. His letter suggests that they donate an addition \$100 to "our" airline. The money is necessary to write the part 121 operating manual for the airline, according to Weber.

While Weber is looking for airplanes, having the operating manual written, processing pilot applications, and negotiating fuel contracts, a marketing and feasibility study hasn't been made and a business plan is weeks, from completion.

How will the \$9.5 million be raised? Weber admits that he has no idea what the process of issuing the necessary bonds is. He says that the village has a bond agent and he has met him before but doesn't know how to proceed from here.

In spite of a galloping calendar, Weber is adamant in sticking with his previously proposed July 4 completion date for all of the fund raising, manual writing, and the completion of the business plan and market study.

He does concede the Convair 580s may not be flying by Independence Day.

The optimistic Weber feels like with proper marketing, advertising, and re-educating of the drivers who come to Ruidoso, the "break even" 10 passengers per flight, will materialize.

Build an airline and they will come, seems to be his philosophy.

MainStreet meets for annual dinner

The final details have been set, and everyone is ready for the annual membership meeting of MainStreet Ruidoso tonight.

The group will meet at 6 p.m. at La Lorraine for a social hour, followed by the meeting at 7 p.m. and a dinner at 7:30 p.m. Special guests for the event will be state Representative John Underwood, Senator Pete Campos, secretary of transportation and highways Lou Medrano, deputy secretary of transportation Ron Forte, district engineer Tom Dick and MainStreet New Mexico director Julie Johncox.

Current board directors will update the members on several projects and changes that will be coming up in the next year that were discussed at a regular meeting on Thursday. One that the group is excited about is a cold mill overlay of Sudderth Drive, Highway 48.

At the meeting on Thursday, MainStreet project director Mary Maul said the city is on the state highway schedule to have a cold mill overlay on the highway, which has to be completed by May 15. To help people understand what is going on and what the time schedule is, MainStreet will be putting bulletins on business windows and boards during the project, Maul said.

The village is also having a contractor tap in to water lines and repair sewer lines on Sudderth, which must be done in 30 days.

"We hope the village can get its contract done in a timely manner and keep on schedule. They have told us they are working to get it done," she said.

Armstrong Construction of Roswell is scheduled to begin the overlay the week of April 6, according to Pat Magill representative of the construction company. He said they have been doing some work adjusting the manholes and will have to pull up steel lane markers before beginning the overlay work.

Also to be announced at the annual meeting was a decision made Thursday to make all memberships due on an annual basis instead of as a pledge for up to three years. Treasurer Alden Deyo first asked that the board consider action to authorize the treasurer to drop people from the membership rolls when they move out of town, close their business, specifically resign or the pledge is completed. Doing this would make it easier for the treasurer to keep track of the members, he said.

Several members suggested they change to an annual membership basis to make it even easier for the treasurer. They would still honor pledges that have not run out, but then begin

the membership on the new basis when it does run out.

On Tuesday at 1 p.m. Johncox, state director, will speak to the MainStreet board members about MainStreet's position in economic development and how to network and take advantage of the many resources available from the state and national MainStreet offices. She will also be looking for input on how best to spend funds from legislative allocations to the state organization this year. Johncox will report on the state advisory board that is just getting started.

Maul reported at the board meeting that the construction documents for phase I of improvements on Sudderth are about 90 percent complete. A public hearing on the project will be at 9 a.m. April 7 at village hall. Engineer George Radnovich will be on hand to answer questions people have.

Maul said the funding on the project has changed a little in that about \$75,000 fell through for a total of \$300,000 from the legislative arterial project (MAP) funds. Maul said this was the first time they had applied and now an engineer will come to Ruidoso to review the area. The state highway department then

Wilton Howell running for county commission

A strong voice on the Lincoln County Commission is what Wilton Howell promises to provide for voters in District 3.

Howell, a Republican, announced his candidacy today for the District 3 seat currently occupied by Bill Elliott.

Howell moved to Ruidoso 35 years ago with his family at the age of six.

He graduated from Ruidoso High School and attended South Plains College and Texas Tech University, earning a degree in business administration.

In the automotive business all of his adult life, Howell has owned and operated One Stop Auto Center in Ruidoso for the past six years.

"This is a unique election and Ruidoso has a good shot at placing some strong voices on the commission," Howell said. "We have the heaviest population concentration in the county and should have equitable representation on the board."

As a commissioner, he would fight the Mescalero-proposed nuclear storage facility, Howell said. He favors storage at the generation source.

He would like to see access to local government improved.

"I assure you I will be readily available," Howell said. "Right now, it appears to me that it's tough for working people to attend commission meetings. If the law permits, I would like to make government more accessible by moving the meetings around the county and scheduling some evening meetings."

Howell and his wife, Demaris, have one daughter, Cecily, who attends Nob Hill Elementary.

District 3 encompasses the development of North Heights Park, Fawn Ridge, White Mountain Meadows, Cree Meadows and Innsbrook; the high school, the middle school and the White Mountain school complex. It is bounded by Mechem Drive to the west and Gavilan Canyon to the east, with portions of Sudderth Drive defining the southern boundary and the Lincoln National Forest and Eagle Creek, the northern boundary.

County is looking for ways to close zoning loopholes

A loophole in Lincoln County's subdivision regulations needs to be closed to stop subdividers who now can avoid compliance, county zoning officials say.

Members of the county planning and zoning commission attacked that technicality Thursday while reviewing suggested changes in the regulations.

"The replating provision is a pet peeve with me," said board chairman Ben Hall.

"A person can sell up to four pieces of land off of a tract within three years without having to comply with subdivision regulations or file a replat."

What some people have done is to deed over those four parcels to associates, who then each sell off another four parcels, he said.

"Suddenly, they have a 30-lot subdivision where no provisions for roads have been made, with septic tanks running here and there and wells all over," Hall said. "And there's nothing to stop it. It's within the law."

Under county regulations, developers who sell five lots within three years fall under the subdivision rules. They must issue disclosure statements detailing improvements, must provide for roads and meet other requirements.

"This (situation) is not fair to the legitimate developer who does it right and this other guy did it for nothing," Hall said. "It's just not right to require John Doe to put up \$50,000 collateral for a subdivision

of 25 lots and another guy gets out of it."

"We need a mechanism to allow a replat of 10 acres, but to give us a way for the county to keep its hands on it."

Andy Wynham, newly hired county manager, said he will work on some regulation language with county attorney J. Robert Beauvais.

The county also needs to ensure that if a subdivision is approved for 25 lots, it stays at that number, Hall said.

Any change in boundaries (replat) or improvements should come back before the zoning board for approval, he said.

The subdivision regulations already specify that plat (layout) alterations are not allowed by the subdivider," said member Patsy Sanchez, who put together the list of suggested changes. But the rules don't address a person to whom he

may assign or sell property.

Even when someone does come back before the board, too often applicants think that a variance will allow them to totally change what they previously said they were going to do, Hall said. "A variance is only a minor easing of regulations," he stressed.

A Type Five subdivision, consisting of lots with at least 10 acres each, doesn't even need zoning board approval. It could be given the nod by the county manager in consultation with the chairman of the zoning board.

"That's because it would be a very rural subdivision and not as intense a development," Beauvais said.

"It still would have to conform with all regulations, there just wouldn't be all the meetings," Hall said.

"To me some land in this county is not meant to be subdivided and we have an obligation not to allow somebody to cut a scar down a mountain a mile long just to let somebody build a couple of houses up there," Hall said. "Everybody else has to look at it."

"We have a certain right or certain obligation to say to people who may come here later, the top of this mountain is not developable. You can sell the bottom half. We have a right to protect the integrity of the county."

"This is one of the prettiest places in the state," Hall said. "We can't bar access, but we can tell them how they're going to get there."

Sanchez said she likes the way Cedar Creek was developed.

"You can't cut any trees within 50 feet of the road," she said.

Another problem area pinpointed by the zoners was the practice of selling property on contracts for sale and then not recording any legal notice.

County regulations require that all contracts for sale on subdivision lots be recorded.

"Are they really doing that?" asked Hall.

If no deed has changed hands, it's unlikely the seller is going to record the contract for sale, Beauvais said.

"County clerks will tell you that's not being done," said Wynham, who has been Otero County Clerk and Bernalillo deputy clerk.

And until the contract for sale is paid off there is no way to tract

such arrangements, Hall said. "The contracts could be lying in a drawer somewhere as long as the buyer is paying on time."

The arrangement can be risky for the buyer. If there is a middle man collecting the money and he does not turn around and pay the property owner, the owner could take back the land and the buyer would not have a deed. He would be out whatever money he had paid, board members pointed out.

However, a contract for sale is an easy way to sell land and probably will never be eliminated, Hall said. "There's nothing wrong with it as long as something is recorded," he said. "It ought to be state law that you have to record real estate contracts."

Requiring that a notice of sale is recorded in one way to ensure someone doesn't sell the same piece of property multiple times, Beauvais said.

"Could we make it part of the subdivision disclosure statement that a notice of sale must be recorded?" asked member Audean Franklin. That way the buyer would be aware and could check to make sure it had been accomplished, she said.

Since the county ordinance provides a \$1,000 fine for violation, the way to encourage compliance may be to prosecute a few violators, Wynham said. The county clerk's office could help by flagging some possible cases.

"There needs to be some protection for the consumer," Hall said. "Realtors ought to have

enough integrity to come and file it."

Sanchez pointed out that it's also a way of monitoring who is selling property in the county since there are no county business licenses or registration for real estate agents.

Three hours into the meeting, board members decided to call a halt and pick up on the review at next month's meeting.

Other recommendations the board agree Thursday to forward to the commission include:

—That notification of any zoning change be sent by certified mail to all adjacent property owners.

—That developers pay their plat review fees at the time of application instead at the time of approval.

—That way if it fizzles and we have gone through all the trouble and hearings, the county will be paid," Sanchez said.

"They should bring their check with their preliminary plat," Hall said. The fee is \$1,000 plus \$20 for every lot.

"Put their money where their mouth is," Franklin said.

—That a zoning board delegation should look at the physical layout and topography of a proposed subdivision before it is considered by the board.

Board members then would have a better grasp of special road construction and drainage considerations.

—That proposed road names be approved by the county's rural addressing division to eliminate duplication.

The humane society recently released the following statistics on the number of new dogs that could be generated by one female over a seven year period.

Amazing as it may seem, one female over that time frame could be responsible by herself and through her other female offspring for producing a grand total of 4,372 dogs.

Spaying and neutering is a necessity for responsible pet ownership and to stop the tragic deaths of millions of dogs and cats each year.

One of those tragic statistics could have been a two-month-old beagle mix puppy who was dumped in a remote spot around Ruidoso.

"Some people brought him in Thursday," Basch said. "They said

he was found wandering in this very remote area so it was likely someone just took off and left him there."

The bouncy little pup appears to be healthy and is up for adoption.

Becoming a sponsor is one way to directly help animals find homes since the spaying or neutering procedures is the major expense associated with adoption.

Another way people can help who enjoy direct contact with the animals is to visit the shelter and walk the dogs or play with the cats.

Most of the walkers who have helped in the past are busy elsewhere or have lost interest.

"What I'd like to see is a volunteer group with a coordinator to organize things," Basch said. "Without some recognition or incentive, group efforts aren't very suc-

cessful. But maybe members could take on this project and could earn credits or badges."

The faces of some past pets of the week who still have not been adopted are featured on this page.

Misty the elegant greyhound and Doc the bird dog have been at the shelter the longest and sometimes they seem to give up hope that they will be adopted.

But they remain affectionate and easy-going. Both have been altered.

Flecks is a small blue-heeler who was hit by a car, but recovered. He has been neutered. Timid at first, he has opened up to people and is eager for a new owner.

A large black, flat-coated retriever female named Wilma is one of the sweetest of the bunch. Separated from her family of five years, she demands little attention and would be a great companion.

Maggie is one of the most intelligent animals at the shelter, true to her catahoola breed. She has been spayed and would be a good working dog.



Mark your calendar for hunting season

It's only the beginning of spring, but some folks really have to plan ahead. Some organizations require their employees to put in for vacation time real early in the year, and for sportsmen this is sometimes difficult.

It is hard to find out exactly when the deer seasons are this early because Big Game Proclamations have yet to be printed. This information may help these sportsmen.

This year there are nine different hunt periods for the rifle hunter. It may be a bit confusing trying to figure out exactly which hunt dates are available for the area you wish to hunt. Take a look at the following chart. It may simplify things.

 A—October 31-November 1, November 4-8, November 11-17.
 B—November 6-8, November 11-15.
 B(sub-unit 5A)—October 10-14.
 C—October 1-2, October 6-8;
 D—October 31-November 1, November 4-8, November 11-17.

- F—October 31-November 1, November 4-8, November 11-15.

Remember when fishin' was simple?

Inside the Outdoors

Spring must be here. I know this because of the number of fishing equipment catalogues that are arriving each day in my mailbox.

In the old days, fishing used to be fairly simple. Head for the tackle store, pick out a cane pole, a bobber and a few hooks. Of course, if you had the money, you could get one of those fancy fiberglass rods and a casting or spinning reel. A little time spent digging in the woods for worms or netting minnows and you were ready to go.


Cast off the 14-foot aluminum boat, crank up the five horsepower outboard and you're in business. But today fishing is a little different.

Just look at any fishing equipment catalogue that arrives this spring, the changes are amazing. The sport of fishing has turned into a multi-billion dollar, high-tech industry.

Start with your basic rod and reel. Basic, did I say? Just figuring out which rod to buy can give you a headache.

Should it be fiberglass, graphite, boron or a combination of these materials? Should it be a casting rod, spinning rod, flippin' stick, downrigger rod, or a straight-handled casting rod and should it have the rod blank extending through the handle? Should the action be ultralight, light, medium-light, medium, medium-heavy or heavy? Should it be 5'3", 5'6", 6' or 7' and should it have aluminum oxide, ceramic or superloy diamond polished guides?

Whatever happened to the old cane pole? The new reels are no different. A casting reel can be made of steel, aluminum, or graphite with a straight spool or a special "V"



spool to prevent backlash. They have magnets in the side that can be adjusted for casting control and some even have digital readouts to show how much line is in the water.

But the ultimate is the new electric reel that automatically retrieves the lure at varying speeds for one hand operation. Spinning reels are not quite as advanced, but still range from ultra light to heavy duty saltwater reels with a wide range of gear ratios.

Once you have decided on a rod and reel, then you have to decide what kind of line you want. There are monofilament, conifilament and triopolymer lines available. They also come in different colors; fluorescent clear blue, clear, fluorescent golden and green. The strength of the line can vary anywhere from one pound test all the way up to 40 pound test.

For the end of the line the choices are truly staggering. Lures come in every shape and size. Of course, lures were around in the old days, but nothing like today. There are even fish attractants to spray onto the lures to entice the lunkers to bite and lures that make

sound.

Now that you've picked out this equipment it's time to head for the water right? Not yet, you better check out the high-tech devices that help you find the fish once you are on the water. These range from a simple flasher that gives a depth reading to a seven color, six inch television screen that shows everything that's under your boat up to a depth of 960 feet. Some have alarms that tell you there is a fish on the screen and zoom in for a closer look.

When you find the fish then it's time to dig out the pH gauge and the temperature meter that shows the temperature at different depths. After this, you better use the color selector which shows which color lure to use for the water clarity, pH and temperature of water.

Finally, it's time to use the device which tells you if you need a sound making lure and what kind to use.

Of course, all this equipment is loaded into a \$25,000 fiberglass boat with a 200 horsepower engine that tops out at about 70 miles per hour to get you to the fishing quickly. It has an electric trolling motor to sneak up on the fish once you arrive at your destination and aerated livewells to keep the fish alive after they are caught. It has padded rod holders to keep the required four rods per angler safe and sound. Now it's time to catch a fish.

With all this high-tech equipment, it makes fishing interesting even if you don't catch a fish. By the way, I'm astounded that anyone ever caught a fish in the old days without all these amazing gadgets.

Brooks won his third West Texas Futurity with Mr Eye Opener in track record time, 16.45. It Aint No Bull and Mighty B Doll were close behind in second and third. In the Consolation, Choculo, First Down and Ten and Cheval Volant ran 1-2-3 for the training sensation. Brooks

has surged into seventh place among the trainer standings. He has won 20 races from only 91 starts.

Down under workers shear Lincoln County sheep

Sheep shearers from New Zealand and Australia have been busy shearing sheep in the Picacho area, working at the Diamond A and the Circle B ranches.

The crew, under contractor Gordon Scott, Missouri, consists of five shearers, two wool handlers and one packer. They are Gordon Scott,

Missouri, Wayne Ingram, Roger Lawton and James Higgins; New Zealand; Wayne Green, Australia; Ieva Tomson, and Peter Johnson, Australia, wool handlers; and Jason Choate, wool packer, Missouri.

They came to work in the U.S. through word of mouth. Some were on their second tour, others first-time.

The day begins with the ranch

hands bringing the sheep from the pasture into corrals adjacent to the barn. They then guide the sheep into the runway or they call it the bull pen the width of the sheep. The shearer then pulls a sheep out through a sliding gate that slides up and down. As the sheep is shorn it is turned loose into a nearby pen, where they are later treated for keds before being turned back into

the pasture. (Keds are better known as ticks).

As the sheep are being shorn the wool handlers are busy picking up the offwool — belly wool, legs etc. — which is then put into a separate bag. Then the fleece is rolled into a ball that is thrown into another bag where the wool stomper packs it down. When the bag is filled it is then tied with a large darning needle and heavy duty thread.

The wool is no longer tied with twine as in the past. If the wool is tied, the woolgrower is charged five cents a tie to untie it. The wool they were shearing will grade fine (64's - 70's).

When it is taken to Roswell to the wool warehouses it will then be baled, with so many held out for sale purposes. It will also undergo core testing to check for grade.

The "bull pen" shearing platform and set up for the shears and other

equipment is on a twenty-eight foot long and 10-12 foot wide truck bed.

During the shearing process one side of the truck is opened. The shearing platform will accommodate five shearers and their equipment, which is run by electric motors.

The shearers are able to shear between 200-300 head of sheep during an eight hour shift. They average one head of sheep in two minutes or less.

While shearing, they wear special made wool felt shoes. They were pleased with the fine quality of wool they were shearing Monday.

The shearers said that South Island, New Zealand (Otigo, New Zealand) and Australia are very similar to New Mexico sheep country.

Wool growers who raise up to 10,000 head of sheep have what is called farms — those of 20,000 or

more head are stations. Shearing season lasts almost all year long. In Australia it is February through April and July through October. In New Zealand it is all year long with October being the busiest month in both countries.

They also enter various shearing contests. Gordon Scott has placed high in contests in Texas. Wayne Ingram, New Zealand, came in third in a 1991 major shearing contest.

There are a few women with the crews, like Ieva Tomson of Australia. They work mostly as wool handlers. Ieva Tomson demonstrated how she could take a rolled up fleece and throw it up in the air and it will land flat on the floor.

The crew will shear in the western states until the end of April and then will return home.


Congratulations to MainStreet Ruidoso for another successful year.

We want to join the community in congratulating MainStreet for keeping the village's Midtown alive and well through some tough times.



Political Commentary

Politicians: shall we throw the rascals out?



"In the toilet - down the drain." This unsavory comment is being heard more and more as we discuss politics and the elections of 1992.

It is true in our local elections and on to Washington D.C. The feeling is everywhere. Why? - that is the question.

You can't fault the news - visual or in print - they only point out what they see and hear. The foul odor comes from the politicians themselves.

Through a continual bombardment of political going ons by the media the current sorry state of politics and politicians is being shown in its ugliest form to us - the voters. It is noteworthy that mismanagement of the nation's affairs in Washington, as being currently reported, is not new and, in many instances, has been the case for many years. When brought to the attention of the public by the news, more often than not, is the most popular answer - "not me - someone else is responsible, however, the problem has been corrected."

The House of Representatives has been operating a so-called "Bank" for the convenience of their members. No one has said when this "Bank" was created - perhaps as long as 100 years ago. No apparent provisions were set up to control this operation. Now, years later, we find that the "Bank" is out of control. It has handled over 20,000 hot checks for the House members totalling over 11 million dollars. No charges for hot checks to the House members - no expense at all. In charge was the appointed Sargent at Arms who wrote a large number of hot checks himself and who resigned his position in the House meeting of March 12-13.

Statements have been made that the "Bank" operation cost the taxpayers nothing. It later developed that the "Bank" operation actually cost the taxpayers nearly \$800,000 for salaries and other costs. In fact, there were several cases where funds to cover hot checks were paid by the federal government - which is us.

All of this is simple fraud on the American taxpayer. Do our elected officials consider the rest of us as stupid? 355 House Members wrote these hot checks or about 75 percent of the total House body. Many Members have said on camera that their knowledge of writing hot checks was limited "because the 'Bank' did not tell them they had written hot checks." Baloney - how long can one write hot checks with a regular bank and not know that checks written are insufficient? Did all of the members fail to balance their House Bank account each month? Was this the custom going on for many years? Unbelievable - some of the hot checks were in amounts to exceed \$100,000 per check. This practice was an excellent way to borrow money interest free.

A question which cries out for an answer is this: The "House Bank" discontinued doing business over six months ago. With all those hot checks floating around is the Bank solvent? Is there money there to pay the depositors after collecting the many hot checks which surely have not been covered? Several of the Congressmen claim that they broke no rules and were simply following an accepted practice enjoyed during the past. As a matter of fact, former Speaker of the House issued an order in 1978 which decreed that all insufficient checks handled by the "Bank" would be

held only a few days and then would be turned over to the Federal Reserve Bank for action.

A recent audit of the governmental restaurant disclosed unpaid bills in the amount of over \$300,000 representing meals served and unpaid by the Congressmen. Unpaid bills for food were not collected at the time a Congressman retired.

Was the practice of signing food tabs stopped? What balances are still uncollected? Does the food operation operate at a no-cost to the taxpayer? These questions need an answer.

The voters are faced with continuing news of financial, personal, and moral problems affecting the officials we elect.

Most recently we are told that drugs are being sold out of the Congressional Post Office. Funds being handled by the Post Office are being audited to offset an allegation of missing Post Office funds.

So - it goes on and on. Senator Cranston (California) is not running for re-election due to ill health. In spite of his lame duck status he has spent \$500,000 on postage to his hometown folks. This is a perk that needs some sort of control - there is none at the present time. There is insufficient space here to deal with the financial, personal, and problems dealing with the various misdoings by our highly respected officials in Washington, D.C. There is evidence of misdemeanors, theft, fraud, sexual conduct - you name it - and some elected official, at some time, is guilty.

Answering a question recently regarding a plan to limit Congressional terms a New Mexico Congressman answered this question by saying "If I am no longer in Congress, you will have to deal with the assistants in my office." This points out the fact that the number of "assistants" to the Congressmen have grown from a few hundred to many thousands of assistants.

Matters are no better in Santa Fe.

Resignations of 12 senators blamed principally on redistricting but not overlooking the frustration of voters with increased taxes, less services, and a reduced sharing of the tax pie with the cities led to the question: Why continue with a thankless job beset with insolvable problems?

Santa Fe's rejection of a bill to allow gambling in several resort cities because it would assist only those cities with race tracks only validates the personal, selfish thinking of those in Santa Fe. Any tourist who visits any city in New Mexico to spend time and money helps all of us, not just the city being visited.

We should have one basic objective in New Mexico and that is to bring more tourists into

our State. Nixing the gambling was WRONG. We need some changes in Santa Fe.

Qualified persons should be able to run for public office and win approval. The office won should not be for a lifetime. Ideas applicable today find themselves worn out over time and new faces and new ideas should be available to take their place. Too much emphasis is placed on political affiliation and not in ability. Party loyalty is often a root cause of the problem.

Time limits for elected officials is gaining ground and has become the law in many states. Limits should be established for all elected officials be the case local or national.

As long as we continue a no-care apathy towards politics we can expect little change and matters will continue on course with no hope for improvement. Voter turnouts of less than 50 percent of those eligible to vote and often dipping under 30 percent is a sign to the elected officials that "no one cares." Many of the complainers are the very ones who do not vote - just complain.

Perhaps the answer lies in the increasing clamor now being heard "throw the rascals out" - start over from scratch. Such action might cure the current illness but have little effect on the basic disease.

Apathy was apparent in our recent municipal election. A candidate with the least visibility, was elected with the largest plurality. Two of the incumbents were soundly defeated which leads to the conclusion that if all seven members of the present Council had run for re-election they would have been defeated, depending, of course had a sufficient number of citizens offered to run as opponents.

The two defeated incumbents had performed well on the Council and deserved more consideration given by the voters. Only five individuals vied for the three open positions which led the Mayor to remark that the small number of candidates supported the idea that the present Council was performing well. The election proved otherwise. When only 40 percent of the eligible voters go to the polls the results are often misleading and, while the democratic way is accomplished, the 60 percent of the voters who do not elect to vote denigrate the entire voting way of life.

Wake up Ruidoso! Smaller towns give more attention to politics and the right to vote than does Ruidoso. Too few of our responsible and capable citizens are willing to run for public office. Taking the criticism and hassle that goes with the Council job is too much. In the past certain groups of citizens have banded together to encourage some to run for public office. This effort was lacking in the most recent election when only five candidates entered the race for the Council. This number of potential candidates is far less than the number running for office in the past. The key to our Democratic system lies in being properly represented. Apathy, inaction, or indifference to the importance of maintaining a strong political posture in our society can only lead to disaster.
