## Detour: state starts work on Sudderth

Starting tomorrow work crews will be out on Sudderth Drive beginning the first step of a cold mill overlay for Highway 48.

Armstrong Construction, who has been contracted by the State Highway and Transportation Department to do the work, will start at about the stop light at the "Y" in front of McDonalds and work up to the stop light at Mechem Drive.

First the crews will have to scrape off about three inches, which should take about seven working days. During this time they will begin work at about 7 a.m. and will stop at 5 p.m.

The actual cold mill will begin about April 20, if the weather remains good, and should take about three to four weeks. The contractor is required to have the major part of the project done by May 15. Bill Armstrong Jr. said the crews will do half the width of the road, two lanes, for half of a mile each day. In that half mile, the two other lanes will be used for two-way traffic, but no parking will be allowed on that section of the street, he said.

Armstrong said they are required to keep businesses open and provide access into areas, but there will be times during the day when it will be hard to get out of the business to cross the street. He said if there is a special situation or need of a business, they will cooperate however they can.

While doing the overlay, the crews will begin blocking off the area at about 7 a.m. but they won't be pouring the hot mix until about 10 a.m. when the temperature warms up.

"From a safety and efficiency stand point, doing it this way (half the width, half a day) has a lot of merit to it. People will have to realize, though, the traffic will be cramped with the barrels and cones," Armstrong said.

When they get into the heart of the downtown, he said if it is possible they will try to shorten up the work area as the day progresses so people can park. Armstrong said they will try to put out press releases to the area media on their progress a couple

times a week to keep people informed. Although they will not have an on-site office, he encouraged people to call the main office in Roswell, and they will radio up to Jerry Chavez, project superintendent.

People may also flag down a state road department vehicle, which are orange, if they have any questions Armstrong can't answer.

Armstrong and several representatives of the New Mexico State Highway and Transportation Department had a public meeting on Thursday to let people know what their plan of work will be on this project.

In the last week, Armstrong's crews have been adjusting manholes to prepare for the project, while the village has a contractor who has been tapping water lines. Village workers have also been repairing sewer lines. Armstrong said they have been coordinating with the village on these things, so it shouldn't cause his workers any delay.

Village manager Ron Wicker said he thinks both the water taps and sewer repairs are going to be done without inter-

fering with the overlay work. He said the sewer repairs are being done so they will all be in good shape for the future.

After the major work is done in mid-May, Armstrong said they will have to pour cement rings around the manholes, and they will have to block these off from traffic for a couple days.

Wicker said it has probably been about 10 years since this road was overlaid. He said he doesn't think the state has a set schedule for doing overlays on Sudderth but goes on a needs basis. Usually when they get into a situation where it is no longer economically feasible to patch it, the state does the overlay, he said.

Several factors come into play on keeping the road in good condition after an overlay, Wicker said. The weather, especially the rain and snow, will effect how well the road stands up, but the most important thing is to have good construction practices.

"Putting it down well is the best insurance for the work to last as long as possible," Wicker said.

## Election hopefuls could be shut out

A state election law that apparently was overlooked by candidates and not flagged by local voter registration officials may prevent three announced candidates from running for the Lincoln County Commission.

Two of the candidates are crying foul, blaming it on partisan politics and incumbent protectionism.

County Clerk Martha Proctor said she attempted to reach those candidates over the weekend with the news.

"I didn't want them paying the \$50 qualifying fee and then finding out by registered letter in a week that their candidacy was not valid," Proctor said Monday. "I wanted to contact them as a courtesy in advance."

The New Mexico election law states that a person may not be a candidate unless his voter registration shows his political party affiliation and his residency by the time of the governor's election proclamation the last Monday in January.

The prospective candidate then is locked into that affiliation and address. Any change in address or affiliation after that date would not be in effect for the primary election.

Normally, the law wouldn't affect many people, but this year, precinct lines have been changed and two new commission districts formed as the board prepares to expand to five members.

The law appears to block the candidacies of Republican Wilton Howell, who's running for county commission District 3; L. Ray Nunley, a Democrat running for commission District 2; and Patricia Espinosa, who changed from an Independent to a Republican to run in the primary for commission District 2.

The two men filed their address changes after January, as Espinosa did her party affiliation. The new addresses fall within the correct districts, but their old addresses do not.

"I feel the county commission and clerk have an obligation when a new process is involved to inform the people," Howell said. "I called them two months ago and asked about the requirements. I was told you have to live in the correct district and have stated your party affiliation on the voter's registration."

He was not told a change in address must occur before the January proclamation to be effective for the primary, Howell said. On March 3, he revised the address on his voter's registration to show the home he has lived in for the past two years. While the new home is within District 3 where he wants to run, that change is not effective for the primary election.

Howell contends the county clerk should have published a legal ad containing a map showing new precinct lines and district alignments.

"The real crime is that the people of Lincoln County won't have a choice now," Howell said. District 3 currently is represented by Republican Bill Elliott.

He plans to file his declaration of candidacy Tuesday anyway, as does Nunley.

"I think the situation is a violation of the spirit of the law and I plan to qualify tomorrow," Nunley said. District 2 is one of the new commission districts.

"I moved here in 1966 and I hadn't changed my registration information since 1969, but I'm living in a different home," he said. "I was in error by not changing sooner, but I think the county clerk was in error for not publishing the changes sooner."

"I think partisanism is hurting our country."

## State overrides zoning

Proud Lincoln County homeowners in select housing areas protected by zoning laws are shocked to learn those zoning covenants may be worthless against new state and federal guidelines.

Single family residential areas such as Sierra Blanca, Lake Sides Estates, White Mountain Estates Unit Five and Two, Deer Park Woods and Alto Lakes Golf and Country Club areas have all been mentioned as candidates for group home locations.

Recent court decisions specify that group homes, state-licensed or state-operated community residences for the mentally ill or developmentally disabled, may be considered a residential use of property for purposes of zoning, according to state and federal statutes.

Furthermore, local zoning officials and village management have been advised by village attorney David Thomsen that the federal and state laws supersede any existing zoning covenants of a subdivision and may be put in place without public notice.

Ruidoso's pricey Country Club Estates has been targeted for the first group home in this area. That single-family residential dwelling at 205 Torreon Loop Road can service up to 10 mentally ill or developmentally disabled patients.

The home, purchased from owner-real estate agent Doug Sidens, currently is being altered to meet state and federal requirements before licensing.

## Lincoln links up with Otero for landfill

Otero and Lincoln counties took giant strides Thursday toward a regional agreement for the disposal of solid waste.

A swath of land along U.S. 64 from Alamogordo to north of Carrizozo was pinpointed as the most likely area for a regional landfill.

Victor Alonso, mayor of Ruidoso and chairman of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority, handed out a rough draft of a joint powers agreement for Otero officials to review.

The agreement is modeled after the one signed by representatives of the Lincoln County Commission and the five municipalities within the county when they created the solid waste authority two years ago.

Authority vice chairman Frank Warth, mayor of Capitan, said the Otero commission and the governing bodies of its cities must form their own coalition before Lincoln and Otero can authorize site testing.

"This rough draft will give you something to debate in earnest," Alonso said.

Authority attorney J. Robert Beauvais reviewed the different approaches Otero and its cities could use in forming a community service district and in financing the initial operation.

He said more information on financing options will be available after the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers finishes a study now under way.

Meanwhile, the authority also is keeping its options open by participating in a landfill siting study with the Southeastern New Mexico Economic Development District. That entity is looking at a combination of possibilities including a regional landfill on the west (toward Ruidoso) and east side (toward Roswell) of the mountains.

One of the biggest obstacles to a regional landfill for the southeast district is the problem of coordinating 27 political entities from Chaves, Eddy, Lea, Lincoln, Otero, Roosevelt and Curry counties, Beauvais said.

"It's a moving target," he said. "We felt it

was a monumental effort to get six entities together (in the authority)."

"Roswell and Artesia are reaching the point where they are saying to the other entities that they're not getting anywhere and they will build their own regional landfill," Alonso said. "They're saying to the others, you can play if you want."

The distance to a regional landfill shouldn't be a consideration since the hauling cost is one of the smallest financial impacts, Warth said.

"Ruidoso has been hauling to Roswell for two years and it hasn't affected the monthly rates," he said.

Distance would impact Holloman because of the hours it would cost in travel, taking base contractors away from other work they could be doing, said Staff Sergeant James Rachwal from Holloman Air Force Base.

If Otero and Lincoln agree to share a landfill, it will be in one of those two counties and that will set the maximum travel parameters, Beauvais said.

Dave Warren, project engineer for New Mexico Engineering Institute of the University of New Mexico, identified three areas of Otero that may be favorable for a landfill, but one is on the Mescalero Reservation. Another between Tularosa and Alamogordo may have water problems.

The area he favored is north of Tularosa to Three Rivers and west of the highway. It is a checkerboard of private, state and federal land and contains about 10-15 sections, several thousands of acres.

"If there's such a thing as gorgeous land for a landfill, this is it," Warren said. It's flat, contains few drainage channels and has mostly saline water with little recharge capacity.

It extends to about 17 miles north of Tularosa and would be accessible for both counties.

State Senator Maurice Hobson (R-Tularosa) said Warren should run the group's proposals by State Environment Secretary Judith Espinosa for feedback before it spends much money. Warren is working with the state on landfill issues.

"It's important whatever we do, we have

holy water sprinkled on it by Judith Espinosa," Alonso agreed.

"I think our next step is to focus on these sites and to pick our best in Lincoln County."

"I think we're ready to talk to owners of land and start punching holes with little more geological information," Warren said. "It will take at least \$10,000 to get a consultant on board and studies."

Alonso said he'd guarantee \$5,000 from Lincoln if someone from Otero would come up with the other half.

But Warren said that amount would only be the start and won't pay for test wells.

By the next two-county meeting on April 13, Alonso said he hopes Otero County and municipal officials will have worked out an agreement among themselves and be ready to move ahead.

Alamogordo city attorney John Paul Weber said, "I think we can go ahead with a joint powers agreement for punching holes (test wells and soil cores) even while we're resolving the government organization."

Beauvais said five potential sites also have been identified in Lincoln County. Another 35,000 acres of federally owned land has been designated for disposal by the Bureau of Land Management and may include some possible sites that could be inexpensively purchased.

Otero Commission Chairman Richard Zierlein said "You get a lot of people who don't want to commit until they know where the site is and yet we can't select a site until we have a commitment."

"Alamogordo has no choice but to join on a landfill," said Alamogordo city commissioner Jim Griggs. "I think it's the consensus of everybody that we need to narrow the site area."

By the time several studies are finished, the group may have as many as ten good landfill sites from which to choose, Beauvais said.

If the two counties join in a regional landfill, many details will have to be worked out.

"If volumes drop in the future from recycling, we will have to review and raise the tip-

ping fees (fees charged to dump at the landfill)," Alonso said.

"But reducing the volume also will extend the life of the landfill," Zierlein said. "And the cost of operation isn't as great as the cost of closure."

"I think we should offer incentives for recycling," said Hobson. "They won't be using up the landfill or burning fossil fuel to haul the garbage."

In Albuquerque, the government has decided to impose a \$1.11 surcharge on monthly sanitation bills to help finance recycling, Warren said. The city also separates the portion of the bill that is a flat charge to cover landfill closing costs and the volume rates that reward recycling, he said.

Reporting on a meeting last month with the brigadier general in command of Holloman Air Force Base, Alonso said the military has a much more accelerated mandate than counties for cutting down the stream of garbage.

"By 1997, they are to reduce the flow by 50 percent, while we (under new state environmental regulations) have until 1995 to reduce it by 25 percent and until the year 2000 to match the 50 percent," Alonso said.

During the meeting Alonso attended at Holloman, officials from CRINC Inc., one of the largest recycling companies in the world, talked about their highly mechanized system.

"They offer both front line separation and guaranteed markets," Rachwal said. "They combine smaller amounts with their large network to come up with a price. But we just don't have the quantities to meet the break even point."

That point is about 110,000 people, he said.

"About the only thing that makes sense for us is a hopper with a conveyor belt and a place where people sit, hand sort and drop items into bins below," Alonso said. "It's

very primitive and labor intensive.

"If we joined with Eddy and Chaves counties, we'd get into that break-even range," Warth said. "We get bogged down just thinking Otero-Lincoln."

Alonso said the counties shouldn't be pressured into a high-

tech recycling system.

"I feel we've got a little bit of time to decide on whether to recycle manually or some other way," he said. "But we have no time on the landfill because of the two years lead time (needed to get a state permit)."

# EDC narrows director field

Economic development may be back on track soon if the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County can get a director named this week.

The group has gone without a director since Anita Sanders resigned in November but has kept the corporation operating with a secretary, Johanna Gallagher, doing daily work. At a meeting on Thursday, the board of directors went into executive session to discuss candidates for the position and decided to offer the job to one of those if that person accepts it.

Board president Ronnie Paulger said the group has been in a period of non-activity, but it has not been any fault of the other board members. He said he hopes with a new director they will be able to increase their activity. Board member Lee Griffin said he agrees that things will be back at full speed with a director.

If the candidate accepts the position the group will announce it on Monday afternoon.

Even without a director, EDCLC has not been without representation at trade shows. Paulger said Business Quarter of New Mexico has been giving information out on the group at trade shows, including the National Electronic Packaging and Production Conference and Trade Show in Anaheim, California, in February. This show was directed to companies involved in production, packaging, inspection and testing printed circuit boards and electronic assemblies.

From interest shown at that conference, EDC has sent out brochures to 39 companies located in 13 states with the largest number from California. Paulger said they have not gotten any response from these mailings yet but that is not unusual. The Business Quarter is planning to attend two more trade shows this year, the Borderland Trade Show in El Paso and the International Food Exposition

in New Orleans. They may also attend the Canadian Investment Seminar in Toronto, Canada.

EDC recently renewed its membership to the Business Quarter, which was \$2,000.

In other financial matters, Paulger gave the treasurers report for January and February and although money is tight the corporation is current all of its obligations. He said income is down \$13,000 from what was budgeted, but expenses are down about \$6,000 as well in part because they had no director. In good news, the group did receive \$12,000 from the county after the county did an audit and found they had not given EDC the revenue from June for a tax levy.

The directors did give final approval to the corporation's audit, which had been reviewed at the January meeting. Dick Mound, certified public accountant, had done the audit, but had not been able to give a complete statement on it because the county had not given them the \$12,000 yet. Mound, who is also a new EDC board member, said except for that omission, the audit is clean. He abstained from voting on the issue.

In other business, Paulger suggested the board wait 30 to 60 days before electing new officers to see if anyone was interested in a particular position after becoming more familiar with the group. Four new board members, Glen Crane, Rick Evans, Mound and Tom Rigby, were voted in at the annual meeting in February.

The group heard a report from Dick Weber of the village transportation committee on the proposed Resort Airlines Limited, a not-for-profit corporation that will be used for rural economic development. The organization had originally planned to have planes off the ground by July 4, but now hopes to have their paperwork done by then and have flights by Labor Day in September.

They have raised about \$9,000

for the venture but would need \$9.5 million to operate through the first year. The money goes for legal fees, filing fees and creation plans as well as the work that needs to be done to gain a 121 license, which costs about \$160 a day. Both Patricia Espinosa and Barbara Duff, proponents of the airline and members of EDC, said having someone do this at that price is a real deal because to buy a license would cost a lot more. Airline licenses are transferable if they are in good standing and can cost up to \$400,000, Weber said.

The preliminary route will be from El Paso to Ruidoso and on to Albuquerque, Taos, Raton and Denver, he said. The group is also trying to acquire data on an west to east route from Tucson to Dallas, and a route that goes south to Mexican cities. Weber said he spoke to the mayor of Midland, Texas, who wished them luck and commented that his area was a drive market to Ruidoso but not by choice.

He said they plan to affiliate with a major airline so people can fly from Ruidoso to major destinations as they can from Albuquerque or El Paso. The planes Weber said his group plans on using are Conair 580s, which are no longer manufactured but do have extra parts available. Weber said the age of the plane is not significant because inspections and certifications are required.

Espinosa said people who have questions about the project need to ask them for the facts. Duff also reminded them that all the funds are in care of the Village of Ruidoso, so no individual stands to profit from it.

Weber, who is a Ruidoso lodge owner, said things still look promising and although it is an awesome task, the group is not daunted. They planned to meet with secretary of tourism Mike Cerletti and Governor Bruce King on Friday in Santa Fe concerning the proposed project.

Mrs. Espinosa said she accepts that "the law is the law" and is glad she was notified in advance.

"Even though I'm disappointed, there are other good people running," she said.

Hoyt Clifton, director of the state Bureau of Elections, said Monday that it is up to the county commission how the public is to be notified of state election laws and changes in boundaries.

"I wouldn't say this (mixup) is a problem statewide, but we are hearing about problems," Clifton said. "I think we're going to have more candidates running for office in the same situation after the qualifying period (Tuesday)."

The state law about voter registration information has been in effect for many years, he said. But any complaint can be ad-

ressed by filing a court challenge.

"I don't want to sound harsh, but the fact they didn't have knowledge of the law is not a strong argument in court," he said. "We're not given the authority by law to make exceptions. We want people to be as knowledgeable about the election law as possible, but it's up to the candidates to check and the commission to set the notification policy."

Clifton said it's also too late for the men to file as write-in candidates, because those running as write-in candidates must have declared the same information before the January proclamation.

"I feel badly this has happened and if there's something a judge can do, that's fine with me," Proctor said. "But bottom line, neither man could have run from the addresses previously on their registrations because they no longer lived there."

# Texas Monthly ad pays off for Ruidoso

Not all of the results are in yet, but it looks like Ruidoso was the big winner by advertising in the March vacation guide issue of Texas Monthly magazine.

Chamber of Commerce director Joan Bailey said David Dunham, advertising executive for the magazine, called her on Thursday with the initial results of the ad. In the first two weeks after it ran 1,145 inquiries were made, and they expect to continue to get responses for the next four to five months. People write in to the magazine, which

then sends the names on to the community to respond to. The same day Ruidoso gets the names, the chamber staff sends out information to them.

Bailey said this was the highest response for the New Mexico communities or groups that advertised in the edition. She said Dunham was really excited about the response because it has been a long time since this has happened. Dunham computed that from the inquiries about 30 to 58 percent of the people would actually come to

Ruidoso, which could be about 700 people.

The ad, created by the Phil Price Advertising Agency, was paid for from Ruidoso Lodgers Tax and Regional Advertising Board funds at a cost of about \$4,500, according to Bailey. Another Ruidoso ad is scheduled to run in June. They used the logo "Seasoned Just Right," which emphasizes the activities during the changing seasons of the year.

"I have always been a big proponent of the magazine, and it

is real nice to know they (the magazine) are excited. I think it was dollars well spent," Bailey said.

Texas Monthly is probably considered one of the better publications out on the stands and is not just read by Texans, she said. Its distribution is about 300,000, and the readership is the same type of people they want to attract to this area, Bailey said.

"All we need to do is get the word out on us for people to come. It is nice to be able to say we did something right here," she said.

# County cracks down on lodgers tax scoffers

Members of the Lincoln County Lodgers Tax Committee want the County Commission to help them crack down on businesses that are not paying any lodgers tax.

Walter Henn, chairman of the committee, is scheduled Tuesday to ask the commission how to investigate and force the offending recreational campgrounds to pay.

The commission meeting will begin at 9 a.m. in the county courthouse in Carrizozo.

Dick Weber, representing Resort Air Lines Ltd., and Larry Goodman from the Ironhorse Railroad Foundation Ltd., are on the agenda to request \$5,000 economic development allotments.

The money for the railroad would be used by the New Mexico State Transportation Authority to produce an environmental impact study of four routes and an alternate from Carrizozo to Capitan through Fort Stanton to the Sierra

Blanca Regional Airport.

Resort Air would use the money to prepare a Federal Aviation Administration 121 Licensing procedure.

Commissioners also will consider approving a referendum on the re-authorization of a special millage levy for the Lincoln County Medical Center and the Carrizozo Health Care Center.

The board also will decide

whether to schedule a special election for the millage request or to put it on the general election ballot in November.

Public hearings are scheduled at 11 a.m. on a series of proposed ordinances requested by the County Committee on Agriculture and Rural Affairs.

Dwight Andrews will be at the meeting to discuss the completion of roads in Deer Park Meadows subdivision.

# P&Z meets today to review tall tower proposal

A review of the 150-foot tall microwave tower to establish a cellular telephone network in Lincoln and Otero counties leads the 2 p.m. agenda for Monday's Planning and Zoning meeting at Village Hall.

Contel Cellular, Inc. is in the process of establishing a cellular telephone network in Lincoln and Otero counties. A conditional use and commercial site development of the venture will be discussed.

This tower is part of a network of "base stations" and is based on standards established by Cellular Telephone Industry Association (CTIA).

FCC rules and regulations are in place to ensure there is no interference with other broadcast sys-

tems. The proposed location of the tower adjoins a village reservoir site and is accessed from Merlyn Drive in the Camelot Mt. Tract.

Also on the agenda is a request by Ray Eidson for approval to develop an 18-hole miniature golf course, a restaurant addition of 1,700 square feet and a revised parking plan.

Eidson currently owns a go cart establishment located off Carrizo Creek Drive where it intersects with Sudderth.

Other agenda items include: A request to replat Lots 2 and 3 of Block 5 in the Woodland Hills Subdivision by George Gates.

The driveway on Lot 3 encroached onto Lot 2. The replat would correct the encroachment and move the boundary to a point midway between two drives.

L.H. "Alex" Adams, owner of a commercial site in the Forest Height Subdivision, Holiday Acres, is requesting a variance.

His applications states the reason for request as to "utilize the value of the investment in the land office building sales lot for manufactured homes."

A review of the Sketch Plan submitted by Warren M. Atkinson of Atkinson Land Co. Inc regarding Camelot Crown Estates, Unit 1,2 and 3.

Atkinson has submitted plans in preparation to development of a Preliminary Plat for a 72-acre tract.

The purpose of the pre-application procedure is to determine any problems with the proposed development before expenses are incurred in the preparation of a preliminary plat.

No official action is required by the commission other than to offer appropriate comments on the suitability for proceeding based on the proposal as submitted.

A staff report will also hear two zone map amendments, one in the Navajo Subdivision (Lot 1-K, Block A) and the other on the Camelot Mountain Tracts (Lot 29B, Block 3).

# Skeen says it's too soon to judge Lujan's grazing fee proposal

It's premature to pass judgment on a new approach to a grazing fee for federally-owned land proposed by U.S. Interior Secretary Manuel Lujan Jr.

That's the assessment of U.S. Rep. Joe Skeen, who announced in a recent press release that he plans to question Lujan later this month

on the details of the proposal for Bureau of Land Management (BLM) public land.

The grazing fee directly affects 3,700 ranchers in New Mexico and more than 200 in Lincoln County, who graze their livestock on BLM or U.S. Forest Service land.

For the past five years, several

mid-West and Eastern congressional representatives have pushed to discard the current adjustable formula and to boost the fees by 500 percent to a level consistent with private land leases. In their view, the Western rancher is being subsidized by the taxpayer while destroying public rangeland.

Lujan proposes to increase the federal fees on BLM-managed rangelands to private land levels. But unlike past grazing fee proposals along those lines, he also would provide financial compensation for ranchers who make improvements on those lands, Skeen said.

# Heidi, the border collie, will warm your heart

One of the most strikingly attractive residents of the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter, Heidi will melt your heart.

Her compelling eyes and gentle manner make this border collie/Burmese mountain dog cross breed a real winner on the pet parade.

The eight-month-old female was brought to the shelter one month ago as a stray, said shelter manager Randy Basch.

"She walks well on a leash and is neat in her pen, but may need reinforcement for house training," he said.

"She gets along well with other dogs. She's passive when faced with other dogs that are aggressive."

Heidi will need to be spayed,

which is the major cost associated with adoption from the shelter. All animals acquired from the society must be spayed or neutered to ensure they are not responsible for the production of any litters that may later be abandoned or destroyed.

Last year, 14-million abandoned dogs and cats were killed in shelters and impounding facilities across the nation. The society and its many chapters seeks to lower the dog and cat population through a reduction in the number of animals born instead of the crueler option of destroying them after they are abandoned.

## HELP NEEDED

Basch said the society needs sponsors willing to pay the cost of

spaying or neutering to enhance the chances of adoption for shelter animals.

"It's a way for people who want to directly benefit the animals to help find homes for them," Basch said.

The sponsorship fund was exhausted over the last few months and contributions are needed urgently. The shelter population, heavier than expected this past winter, will swell even more during the summer.

Basch said helping one animal find a new home not only means it will not be destroyed, it also creates room for another animal, extending the time the dog or cat can be kept at the shelter and viewed by prospective owners.

Basch also is looking for foster homes, willing to care for litters of pups this summer long enough for their protective shots to take effect. If pups are left in the shelter during that 10 day to two week period, they could contract distemper or parvo, he said.

"If they still are interested, I'd like to hear from people whose homes I previously used to foster litters," Basch said.

## SLATER

In the cattery next to the main shelter, Slater, a lushly-coated gray cat with a moon face, waits for his special someone.

"He's about a year old and has been here five weeks," Basch said. "He has an easy-going temperament and was brought in as a stray. But he's healthy and looks well-cared for."

Slater also must be neutered as a condition of adoption.

Although adoptions continue at a steady pace at the shelter, several



## Long and short of tax forms

New Mexico taxpayers with income from any state or municipal bonds (including New Mexico and its municipalities) must use the PIT-1 Long Form, according to Dick Minzner, Secretary of the New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department.

Taxpayers with such income may obtain the long form from any district office of the Taxation and Revenue Department or they can request one from the Santa Fe office by calling 827-2206.

Many taxpayers who now need the long form because of their state or municipal bond interest received a short form in the mail, if they filed a short form last year, Minzner said.

Legislation passed in the 1991 Legislature removed the tax exemption previously granted to non-New Mexico state and municipal bonds. This new provision is effective for the 1991 tax year.

Interest on New Mexico bonds and the bonds of New Mexico municipalities remains exempt from New Mexico income tax, but it still must be reported on the long form. Interest on the bonds of all states and their municipalities remains exempt from federal income tax, according to Minzner.

## USFS opens firewood areas

The Smokey Bear Ranger District announced that several areas for personal use fuelwood gathering are open as of April 1.

They are:  
Jacob - free use standing greenwood area - this is a free use area and a permit is required. The trees available in this area are generally smaller diameter than those within a charge area. There is a 2 cord limit per household. The area is 6 miles north of Capitan on the east side of highway 246.

Coyote - dead and down area - this is a charge area and the cost is \$10 per cord. It is located approximately 7 miles north of White Oaks.

Benado - dead and down area - this is a charge area and the cost is \$10 per cord. It is located approximately 8 miles north of the junction of highway 37 and highway 380.

Fuelwood must be removed with a permit in possession and from the designated area shown on the permit.

Removal of fuelwood when soil conditions are wet and ruts are created is a violation of the terms of the permit. This can result in seizure of fuelwood and the issuance of a violation notice.

Maps of the open areas and permits will be available at the district office at 901 Mechem, Ruidoso.

In the early stages of cancer, an individual may have no obvious symptoms. However, one of the early warning signs is often occult (hidden) bleeding in the stool.

About 96,000 Americans will develop colorectal cancer this year, ac-

ording to a news release provided by LCMC.

The colorectal screening is most recommended for men and women over age 40, as 90 percent of colorectal cancers occur past age 50.

Anyone interested in receiving a kit can stop by Lincoln County Medical Center, the Carrizozo Health Center, or on Tuesday mornings at the Corona Clinic to pick up the test kit.

# Warriors and Braves track teams improve at meets

The Warrior track teams were left in suspense after their performance on Saturday at the Las Cruces Invitational track meet, when the organizer didn't have the final results at the end of the tournament.

Coach Ronny Maskew said the girls and boys teams scored 40 to 45 points in the meet and had some good individual performances. He said he was notified that the organizers were having trouble figuring the results, but they would try to have them by today, Monday. This year was the first time the Warriors had gone to the meet, so Maskew wasn't sure if this was unusual or if it was always disorganized.

The Warriors decided to go to the meet because most of the teams from their district were competing, Maskew said. About 10 to 15 teams participated in the event.

Individually on the boys team, Eric Evans was a double winner on the day. He placed first in the 110 meter high hurdles with a time of 15.35 seconds and first in the 300 meter hurdles with a time of 41.38 seconds. Shane Eidson also earned a first in the shot put with a throw of 48 feet, four inches.

Jackie Lynn placed second in the 800 meter with a time of two minutes 4.2 seconds. Nick Nanz won second place in the 1600 meter with a time of four minutes 39 seconds. Nanz was fourth in the 3200

meter in 10 minutes 29 seconds.

Keith Henson placed fourth in the 110 meter hurdles but was only one second behind Evans who got first place. Louis Jimenez earned fourth place in the long jump with a distance of 19 feet nine inches.

Luisa Tam captured first place in the 3200 meter with a time of 11 minutes 57.9 seconds and second in the 1600 meter in five minutes 30.46 seconds. Monica Martinez broke a school record in the discus when she threw 111 feet one inch to place fourth at the meet. She also earned fourth in the shot put with a distance of 33 feet 10 inches.

In the high jump Cami Bailey placed third with a height of four

feet eight inches. Sarah Dix got third place in the long jump with a distance of 16 feet one and a half inches. Stephani Haas placed fifth in the 3200 meter with a time of 13 minutes and five tenths of a second.

In the girls relay competition the 400 meter team of Dix, Catrina Gabaldon, Rachelle Holstein and Natasha Mulqueen had a time of 52.7 seconds for fifth place. Kristie Ryan came in for Dix in the 800 meter and 1600 meter relays to help them place third and fourth, respectively.

Maskew said the teams had some improvements in areas, but there are still some things they need to work on. He said having the

The middle school track team had a good day in Capitan on Saturday when the boys placed second and the girls fifth. Coach Borde Williams said even though there aren't many members out, they all try hard in their events.

In the boys events, Kyle Humphreys was first in the 110 meter hurdles and in the long jump. He was also on the 1600 meter medley relay team with Matt Bell, Danny Schrader and Joey Bewley that placed second.

Chris Ortega was also a first place winner in the shot put, while

Schrader placed second in the long jump and 400 meter run and fourth in the 200 meter dash. Bell placed third in the 110 meter hurdles, followed by Bewley at fourth. Bell and Bewley placed fourth and fifth in the 300 meter hurdles.

## It's time to go fishing in New Mexico

Now that the weather outside is starting to get spring like, it only makes sense that people are starting to think about fishing. This is good, but don't just think about going fishing, do it!


If you have a 1991-92 fishing license you still have until Tuesday, March 31, before it expires. So take advantage of these few days, before you have to buy a new license.

April 1 begins the new license year in New Mexico. Indeed it is April Fool's Day, and you sure would feel foolish if you produced an expired license when checked. Therefore, make sure to purchase a 1992-93 fishing license if you plan on fishing after April 1, 1992.

There are many things to do before you wet a line, and buying your new license is only one of them. Again this year you will need a habitat improvement stamp if you plan to fish on any U.S. Forest Service or Bureau of Land Management lands anywhere in the state. The money from this stamp goes to improve wildlife and fish habitat on federal lands.

In addition, you need to find out where the fish are biting. Check through your fishing tackle and purchase new items, if necessary.

Be sure to inspect your boat and get it registered if the old registration has expired. And



most importantly, schedule time off from work.

To assist you in finding out where the fish are biting, the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish compiles, between April and September, a weekly fishing report for many of the states' waters. The information from the weekly fishing report is made available to the public through each of the area offices, as well as the main office in Santa Fe.

However, any fishing report can only contain information on past conditions and cannot predict future conditions.

When something has been stored for a while it needs to be checked over before using, and fishing tackle is no exception. Most

anglers put their tackle up in the fall and don't use it again until spring. Therefore, it is important to check it over to make sure everything is in good shape and still functioning properly. Make sure all of the eyelets are still secure and intact on rods. Reels need to be greased, the drag set and old brittle line should be replaced. Weights, lures, hooks, floats and bait round out the tackle needing to be checked or replaced.

If you have a boat, you already know that fishing instantly becomes more complicated. Check over your boat and motor before heading to the lake. You don't want it to konk out on you while you are in the middle of the lake. It is extremely important to make certain that there is at least one personal flotation device for every passenger on the boat. Finally, make sure that your registration is current. If not, contact the New Mexico Motor Vehicle Department to get it registered.

The rest is up to you. It doesn't do any good to have the best equipment if you can't get time off to go fishing. There are a variety of reasons to take off from work and go fishing, but my favorite is: "Because I deserve it." Have fun and good fishing.



## DOE extends deadline for MRS grants

Finding few takers, the U.S. Department of Energy is extending the deadline to apply for study grants leading to the placement of high-level nuclear waste disposal sites.

In its search for a home for a Monitored Retrievable Storage (MRS) facility, above-ground storage for commercial spent fuel rods, the DOE is offering \$100,000 initial grants for feasibility studies.

Phase I applications are now being accepted through June 30, and the Phase II applications through September 30, according to information in DOE News.

The Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe already has received and completed such a grant and is the only group that has continued on into the second phase with an additional \$200,000 grant. Eventually, the siting of an MRS carries a promise of millions, perhaps billions, of federal dollars to the

volunteer host.

And still, the DOE is facing opposition from neighbors, like the people in Ruidoso and state and federal leaders, who don't want high-level nuclear waste transported through their communities, much less, stored near their homes.

Mescalero is going full-steam ahead, under the guidance of Miller Hudson of Pacific Nuclear.

Some of the original groups applying for grants have dropped out. Grant County, North Dakota, applied for and receive a grant in November of last year, but terminated the project in March.

The Chickasaw Indian Nation, with headquarters in Oklahoma, applied on December 31, for a grant that was awarded on February 14. The Chickasaw Nation did not accept the award.

The Hae and Fox Nation, located in Oklahoma, applied for and later declined an award.

Fremont County, Wyoming, and Prairie Island Indian Community, Minnesota, both applied for grants on January 1, and the Wyoming group's request was approved January 23. The Minnesota Indians were awarded a grant on March 17.

The Yakima Nation, in Washington state, applied January 1, and was granted an award January 23.

As some drop out, the lure of federal dollars reels in new applicants.

In March nine more applications were submitted to the DOE. Applicants are Apache County, Arizona; Skull Valley Band of Goshute Tribe, Utah; Alabama-Quassarte of Oklahoma; Eastern Shawnee Tribe of Oklahoma; Tetsin Village of Alaska; Lower Brule Souls of South Dakota; Alinok-Gaguyaka Tribe, Alaska; Apache Development Authority Oklahoma; and the Absentee Shawnee Tribe, Oklahoma. States, Indian tribes and other

units of local governments are eligible for the DOE grants, but the bulk of applicants have been Indian nations with sovereign nation status. The apparent advantage to the DOE of negotiating with Indian tribes, is just that status, which places negotiations outside the control of states.

"The MRS facility will be an above-ground storage facility using proven technology the the maximum extent practicable," says the DOE in a release. The facility will receive, temporarily store and stage spent fuel for shipment to a permanent geologic repository.

The spent fuel rods have been generated by commercial nuclear energy facilities and are now in place at those sites. Some opponents of the MRS insist that the high-level nuclear waste should stay put until a permanent facility is identified and developed.



## Editorial

### Keep the doors open

Government belongs in the sunshine, with the public entitled to know what elected officials are saying about the issues. That's why we believe the Ruidoso Village Council should stop meeting for a "study" session before regular council meetings.

If you didn't attend the study session before the last council meeting, you may not know that the mayor and council already had agreed to amend a proposed animal ordinance before convening for their regular meeting. Discussions over that ordinance were conducted during the pre-meeting session, and so people who were at the official meeting didn't hear what their elected officials had to say.

If you didn't attend the study session before another recent council meeting you may not know that the mayor asked new councilors to donate their raises back to the village. He was asking for a consensus on the council putting off its raise until the next budgeting period since the council had adopted the increased pay without regard to the budget.

Often, in that informal setting, inappropriate remarks are made and subjects not on the agenda are brought up and discussed. Staff members are questioned about projects and agreement is reached on issues that should be discussed in an official public forum.


You probably weren't at those work sessions, because just one or two people ever attend besides a reporter, elected officials and village staff. Study sessions are open to the public, but since no official business can (or should) be conducted, then most members of the public who attend, wait until the meeting at 6:30 p.m.

The mayor and council know better than to VOTE in a study session, because that would be in direct violation of the Open Meetings Act. Polling the council on an issue, or making an agreement over who will make and second a motion also is in violation of that state law. The council seems to think that "reaching a consensus" is different. We disagree.

Proponents of study sessions say that councilors need to be briefed on the agenda before the meeting. That's not a valid reason to conduct the informal sessions, because the mayor and council have access to staff members on an individual basis at any time. It's up to the elected officials to pick up their agenda packets, read and study the information inside and call the village manager, mayor or other councilors if they need further information.

All discussions should be conducted in the public meeting. It protects the elected officials from themselves and the tightrope they're walking in regard to the Open Meetings Act. It also assures the public of hearing why the council is doing what it does by keeping debate and discussion in the official arena where it belongs.

Government belongs in the sunshine, not in a smoke-filled kitchen at village hall.

### Wondering about timing on "Skiing"

After reading a recent The Ruidoso News article featuring "Skiing" magazine coverage of the glories of Ski Apache, I couldn't help but wonder what the ulterior motive was for this particular Ski Apache public relations and marketing effort.

Don't Waste U.S. is the national coalition of grass roots activists opposed to radioactive waste pollution, and "Atoms & Waste" is its clearinghouse newsletter....

Don't Waste U.S. works very closely with activists at Mescalero and Ruidoso and in Texas, all opposed to the MRS high-level radioactive waste dump targeted for the New Mexico reservation. We work also with Native Americans on five other reservations across

the country, from the Prairie Island Red Wing Sioux in Minnesota to the Yakims in Washington state, with California and Oklahoma tribes in between, all being lured one more time into the government's money-lined trap.

Only this time, they are not being offered warmth-giving blankets (infected with smallpox), but rather the deadliest and longest-lived byproduct of the white man's civilization — high-level radioactive waste from the nation's commercial atomic power reactors.

We at Don't Waste U.S. believe that "Skiing" is being used to help clean up tribal president Wendell Chino's rapidly diminishing reputation — tarnished because of his continuing and complete disregard for the wishes of his tribe, and neighboring citizens, and his

heavy-handed, punishing tactics when dealing with those opposed to his grab for glory, and megabucks.

To be sure there is something quite extraordinary about the development of a ski area on tribal land with its concomitant revenue and much needed jobs for poverty stricken Indians, and no doubt there is much that's marvelous about Ski Apache which will have great appeal to "Skiing" magazine readers, but we strongly suggest that there is another side to Ski Apache which needs media exposure, and that ("Skiing" magazine) check further into this very grave environmental matter and its profound implications for many future generations before becoming part of the industry/government whitewash.

I guess the question "Skiing" editors need to ask themselves is, were writer/photographers told of the MRS Project, its significance, the dangers, the opposition to it etc, and if the answer is, no they weren't, then the next question to ask is, why weren't they? It too is significant a part of Ski Apache as the snowfall, the accommodations, ambience and the incredible color and light.
