Perot tops News poll; Bush trails in survey

While President George Bush is leading the national polls in the race toward the November election, he's trailing Ross Perot, Bill Clinton and Jerry Brown in an unscientific survey conducted by **The Ruidoso News**.

In the survey, which drew 57 responses, Bush tallied just five votes to Ross Perot's 31 votes, Bill Clinton's even dozen and Jerry Brown's six.

Andre Marrou, the Libertarian candidate, garnered two votes in the poll that was published in a recent editorial.

Readers were asked to mark which candidate for president they would choose if the election was right now. They were asked to indicate if they are registered to vote and to check their political party.

Registered voters who responded numbered 54, with two not registered and one survey not marked. That survey wasn't counted because three candidates were selected. That one person selected Patrick Buchanan, David Duke and Ross Perot.

Even though the incumbent president trailed three opponents on this survey, most of those polled said they are Republicans, with 27 Republicans, 21 Democrats, three Independents and three Libertarians counted.

Many of these surveyed said they are looking for changes at all levels of government.

"I will not vote for anyone now in office," said one independent. "We need a government that works for the people, not themselves."

"Revamp the current system, which has obviously failed," suggested a Democrat. "Three the rascals out, out, out!"

"George Bush has proven to be an ineffective leader," said a Republican who is supporting Perot. "This country needs strong leadership. Bush has done nothing to reduce the 4 trillion national debt."

An independent who supports Perot added to the call for change saying voters must get incumbent federal politicians out of office and limit terms of office.

"Perot is the only one in the race

who makes any sense," said one Republican.

"Just hoping fervently that Perot gets on the ballot," said another Republican.

Another Republican for Perot noted that Perot has all the money he needs. "There's no personal gain. Also, he has the brains and seems like a fair man."

Libertarians say don't count their candidate out.

"Andre Marrou is still in the race," said one of the three Libertarians who responded to the poll. "He is the Libertarian candidate and he should have been on the list."

Except for the one survey that listed three choices, Patrick Buchanan and David Duke didn't receive any votes in **The News** poll.

Not all of the voters who returned the survey are from Lincoln County, with some Texas readers taking part in the poll.

The primary elections will take place in New Mexico on Tuesday, June 2.

LCMC tries again for a special mill levy election

The Lincoln County Medical Center Board of Trustees is worried some taxpayers will take the "just say no," campaign a little too far and not renew the mill levy that supports the hospital and Carrizozo clinic.

The board decided Thursday night to ask the county commissioners to allow a special election for the renewal of the mill levy that has supported LCMC for the last eight years.

The issue is already scheduled for the general election but hospital administrator Valerie Miller said there are four other state tax initiatives on the ballot before the mill levy question.

Miller said when she went before the commissioners at their meeting April 7 they were concerned that it would cost an extra \$7,000 for a special election when it was likely that the renewal would pass on a general election. She said she thinks the commissioners would look more favorable on a special election if the costs were not paid for by taxpayer dollars.

The board voted to request the money to pay for the election from an unrestricted fund from the Presbyterian Hospital group in Albuquerque which owns and leases out LCMC.

Board president Dub Williams said he is afraid people will get carried away with "no's" on the ballot and not think about the real issue involved.

"People have a negative feeling about taxes right now. People are now voting against something instead of for it. If people ask why we want a special election tell them our feelings on this," Williams told the board members.

Miller said if the renewal of the mill levy doesn't pass, all the strides they have made in the last two years would be lost. She said although it wouldn't happen right away, people could expect health care to diminish over time without the support of a mill levy.

"Even with the mill levy we are not at break even. Without the mill levy, at some point we would have to say we can't do it anymore, but no one knows how long that will take," she said.

Her consultants in the Presbyterian group have told Miller that a special election is the only way to do it because of the anti-tax, anti-government feelings and the number of things people have to vote on in this election. Miller said

if the hospital goes back to the commission and explains how crucial it is, they may change their minds.

Dr. Arlene Brown said she is concerned that the community will ask why they are spending extra funds for a special election when they could be using it to operate with. She said she wouldn't want to do anything that would backfire on the work they have done to keep the hospital going.

Williams and Jule Duffalo, director of nursing, will attend the commissioners' board meeting on April 28 to ask for the special election. Miller will be out of town and won't be able to attend the meeting. Williams said if anyone else on the board can attend it would be good to have the extra support. If the request is approved the election would be September 15. They will need a majority of the three commissioners to get an approval.

Inez Tanner, LCMC auxiliary president, said the auxiliary members would do anything needed to support the mill levy renewal.

Miller also reported that a community mill levy committee has been established. The group probably won't meet until May but could start working earlier if they do get the issue on a special election ballot.

The hospital may get a new computerized billing system by fall with the capabilities to look up a variety of information and to interface with physicians. Miller said about three years ago a decision was made that the regional hospitals under Presbyterian Healthcare would get new systems and recently a new committee, headed by Miller, reaffirmed the need.

The current system has no look-up capabilities and is about 20 years old, she said. It is also unmodifiable and doesn't meet the needs of LCMC, Miller said. She said when the first decision was made to change to a computerized system, they were going to go with one that was established at the Albuquerque care site, but it had a large main frame and was hard to learn.

Now they will be getting a micro-based system that could help automate the labs and other parts of the hospital as well, Miller said. With a system based on a personal computer they would be able to look up a patient's insurance plans and requirements, billing dates and payment dates among other information. It may also be able to connect with information from the patient's doctor.

Miller will chair a committee that will decide in the next 60 days which particular system to use for this. When they get the system will depend on which of the regionals gets priority but LCMC and the Tucumcari hospital have both spent a lot of time on the issue as well.

The installation of a system should be simple and would have a three to five day training period. Miller said it is a nightmare to change systems no matter how well plans are made, but the change will make the patients a lot happier.

In the budget for the new year, funds had been set aside for a lab and radiology management system but they will wait on making a decision on this until they find out what the billing system will be, Miller said. Finding one that interfaces will make things a lot easier, she said.

All of the regional hospitals will have the same system, while Albuquerque will keep the large system it has.

In mid-August the hospital will also have a permanent radiologist, Don Wolfel. Miller said he is an outstanding radiologist and will be a great addition here.

LCMC has received five applications for the annual scholarship to a high school student planning to go into the medical field. The board decided to let the scholarship committee select and announce the winner because Captain's graduation is before the next board meeting and one of the applicants is from that school. The scholarship is for \$500 a year and is renewable up to four years if the person maintains a good grade point average.

Tanner also announced the auxiliary has eight applicants for their annual scholarships. She said many are highly qualified, and it will be hard to make a decision on the awarding of the scholarship.

In other auxiliary business, Tanner reported that the nominating committee has named officers for the 1992-1993 year. President will be Nellie Ruth Jones; vice president, Pat Lackey; secretary, Greta Cabot and treasurer, Ida Barbee. The board also approved these candidates for the positions.

No financial statements were given at the meeting because they will be included in the end-of-the-year report for the board to review at the meeting May 21. Miller said she is not sure on the exact figures but they should be in good shape because expenses were well controlled.

Fall fatal for hiker

A woman was killed Saturday morning in a hiking accident in the hills above Meander Drive.

Lieutenant Mike Lovelace, assistant police chief, said the woman, from Eunice, New Mexico, was out hiking with her husband in the area above Meander Drive when the accident happened at 10:10 a.m. The Ruidoso Emergency Medical personnel responded, but the woman died at the scene. Her name has not been released, pending notification of relatives.

Lovelace said the area north of Meander is fairly steep and rocky. No other accidents have been reported in that area in the last few years, but he said they have had to rescue people who were stuck in the area and couldn't get down.

Museum of the Horse opens in May

Travel the world of the horse without leaving Lincoln County when the Museum of the Horse opens May 23.

Horse brasses from England; delicately carved figures of the horse from China; wagon and horse decorations in brass and silver from Germany; saddles from Mexico and China and a Pony Express saddle all will be exhibited in the brand new building right down the road from Ruidoso Downs Race Track.

The Hubbard Museum's Anne C. Stradling Museum of the Horse will be the home of a multi-million dollar collection of more than 10,000 pieces related to the horse.

The collection, which illustrates the interactions between the horse and people through time, will be exhibited in a newly renovated 40,000 square foot building.

Anne Stradling, a lifelong collector of the horse, began gathering her collections when she was six years old. She continued to collect throughout

her life. Her home, the Schley family estate in Far Hills, New Jersey, became the showcase for much of her collection.

According to a news release, Stradling loved everything about the horse and became an accomplished horsewoman. She learned to ride in the New Jersey countryside, where she grew up, and at the Formata School in Aiken, South Carolina.

Formata was considered the "Polo Capital of the World," and young Anne chose this school because of its girls polo team. She developed outstanding skills with the horse and was a fearless rider who loved a challenge.

Anne Stradling discovered such a challenge in the call of the West, and she eventually left the stylish life of the Essex Fox Hounds to settle on a ranch in Arizona. She continued to add to her remarkable collection by acquiring pieces unique to her new surroundings.

The Museum of the Horse consists of thousands of artifacts from all over the world.

The Museum also includes an extensive collection of Indian artifacts, pots and Kachina Dolls.

A great number of horse drawn vehicles are in the collection, including fine carriages, wagons, sleighs, a fire engine and a 400-year-old Mexican ox cart.

Anne Stradling carried with her many family heirlooms including gifts from the duPonts, Frederic Remington and Theodore Roosevelt, family friends and hunting companions of her maternal grandfather, Colonel Archibald Rogers of Hyde Park, New York.

"We are excited about the tremendous opportunity that the Ruidoso area has in the Museum of the Horse" said Joan Dale Hubbard whose Foundation provides financial support to the new museum.

"It represents a tremendous asset to the community and a marvelous educational and cultural opportunity to visitors to New Mexico."

The grand opening gala, when the Museum of the Horse will unveil its collection of more than 10,000 items, will be open to the public.

Visitors to the \$3 million project will actually see "a museum in progress."

"Because of the magnitude of this project, not all of the exhibits will be permanently in place by opening day," said marketing director Laura Doth.

"We'd like to treat this as an advantage. Visitors will be motivated to come back and see all of the new additions to the Museum as time goes on."

Eleven different breeds of horses, from a miniature to a draft horse, will parade for guests at the opening gala, according to Doth.

The Museum of the Horse will be open from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. daily, beginning May 24.

Lincoln County voters league gets some national attention

Lincoln County's League of Women voters, completing its second year as a provisional chapter, has so impressed the national organization, that the board was invited to send a representative to the national meeting to tell other chapters how it got so far so fast.

The League, in the midst of publishing a comprehensive "Know Your County" study, while continuing its advocacy of voter registration and voter education, is staying home this time, but members of the board were pleased that the national board noticed all their hard work.

Tonight, the League will meet at 6 p.m. for a dinner meeting at La Junta Guest Ranch. A silent auction will be conducted as a fundraiser. The five mayors from Lincoln County villages all have been invited.

The League of Women Voters Education Fund has recently released the findings of its nationwide investigation on recycling in a report that underscores the nation's growing solid waste crisis.

The study cites that the country's solid waste output, which stood at 180 million tons in 1988 is expected to grow to 216 million tons by the year 2000.

The study revealed that lack of markets for recycled materials; mandatory content standards; lack of basic information; and no uniform national definition of recycling terms exists.

Recycling of newspapers was found to be due to a historic lack of demand by U.S. newspaper publishers for recycled newsprint. Pressures to develop new markets have brought a response.

It could happen here

Gang problems aren't confined to big cities and towns

A task force of local, state and federal law enforcement officers addressed the gang problem of Ruidoso recently.

Speaking to a group of more than 40 concerned teachers and parents, at the high school was District Attorney Bert Atkins, Ruidoso Police Chief Richard Swenor, CID Commander Lanny Maddox and U.S. Treasury Agent Carl Bengtson.

Maddox opened the meeting with a review of the gang activities that he has worked on in the past school year.

According to Maddox, the police department with the help of school administrators have squelched three fledgling gangs in the school system this year.

"Ten years ago Albuquerque looked at California and said that California had a problem with gangs. Today Albuquerque has a problem with 32 different Crips and Blood gangs in the city," Maddox said.

"Now we are looking at Albuquerque and saying they have a problem."

"At first I said 'let's don't use the word gang,' now I admit we have a gang problem."

Maddox said he considers the community lucky in the sense that three gangs were squelched, but it is a matter of time before a knowledgeable kid from a gang infested area comes to town with the charisma to start another group.

He said this is not as much a law enforcement problem as a community problem.

Chief Swenor said that in his

past experience in Ruidoso there have been some substance abuse problems in the form of paint and glue sniffing but now the problem has shifted to alcohol related abuses by underage persons.

In two weekends the police broke up two parties involving 43 arrests. Those arrested ranged from 12 to 25 years of age.

"And we don't go looking for parties, we don't have the manpower for that. These are parties we stumbled on."

"We are charging those persons over 21 with a 4th degree felony."

"What we may be doing is driving the juvenile drinking parties further from town and thus compounding a DUI problem."

"Alcohol in all age groups is an increasing problem. Alcohol abuse has been a factor in 75 percent of the arrests made since March 1," the Chief said.

12th Judicial District Attorney Bert Atkins said that three years ago the Organized Crime Commission came to Alamogordo and met with local officials. Their primary concern was dangers to police officers that might stop Crips or Blood gang members traveling through the areas with quantities of drugs.

Those officers might not be prepared for the encounter and be injured or killed.

He had minimal concern at the time since Alamogordo was not on an interstate highway, but was soon awakened with a start when the city had its first drive by shooting. In the past 18 months in last 12 months.

In one remarkable incident, the victim refused to testify because

when the case went to court the victim was himself an accused in another drive-by shooting.

Atkins says that the problem really came to a head in January 1991 when a gang member fired a 25 caliber automatic recklessly in a gang confrontation and seriously wounded a teenage girl, causing her loss of sight.

"That really woke us up," the DA said. "We then were forced to acknowledge the 'G' word. It forced the community to respond."

Addressing the teachers in the group Atkins said, "You spend more time with the children in the community than the parents do in many cases. We have to do something with these kids that will prevent them from seeking out the gangs."

Citing a recent incident in Alamogordo, where a student was discovered to have a loaded 9mm pistol in class, Atkins said, "I hope that is not coming to Ruidoso, but I can't promise it."

"I am available to help fight the problem," he said. He indicated that there are several groups of concerned citizens working in Alamogordo and he and his assistants will work as liaison to share information between those groups and any group formed in Ruidoso. "I will speak to any size group or provide any assistance I can."

"Every community is unique with its own unique problems and we must exchange information."

U.S. Treasury Agent Carl Bengtson, who works in the Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms department, is an acknowledged expert on the formation of gangs,

their symbols, and graffiti.

He said teachers are the front line troops in the battle of eliminating or controlling the gangs.

"Some say that the parents are the front line troops," he said. "However, too many times the parents cannot look at the juveniles as objectively as the teachers. Parents many times won't accept that their child is involved in gang activity."

"I think that if we can get the kid's to stop the alcohol abuse problem we can win this war," he said.

He gave the commonly recognized definition of a gang as three or more people banded together with a common name or symbol pursuing criminal activity on a continuing basis.

Most of the gangs evolve into financing their operation with deal-

ing drugs.

"They are very ingenious in their operation," the agent said. "They will rent three motel rooms under three separate names. They will sleep in one room, deal small amounts of dope in another and use the third for a warehouse for large amounts of drugs. That way they are not exposed to being arrested with a quantity of illegal substances."

Bengtson used Albuquerque as an example of the problems facing municipalities in the war against the gangs.

"When Albuquerque first became aware of the potential gang problem, they formed a special unit in the Police Department, assigned some excellent officers to the unit and did everything by the numbers,

and they still have the problems you see today."

The federal agent briefed the crowd on gang graffiti, apparel and recognition signs used by the gang.

He said that many times a gang member will flash a sign to a rival gang member and the rival member will "mad dog" (stare down) the first member. This often results in a fist fight "they are terrible fighters," then a possible knife or gun fight. "They are also terrible shots, but sometimes they get unlucky," says Bengtson.

He responded to a question from the audience about what he thought about the potential was for gangs in Ruidoso.

"I don't want to come back here (on a gang problem) but I think it is inevitable."

Looking (dress), felling (attitudes), being (alert, interested), sharp for the job interview.

Knowing in advance the answers to the most common questions asked by interviewers.

New law calls for planning ahead


Patients being admitted to hospitals or joining HMO's or other medical care agencies will notice something new, and perhaps frightening.

They will, or should be, asked if they have made any kind of advance directive to control what happens if they should become seriously ill. An advance directive is a document such as a living will, directive to physicians, or durable power of attorney that will control what sort of life-prolonging technology the patient wishes to be used if he or she is not able to voice a decision on the matter. This is all the result of a new law.

On December 1, 1991, all United States hospitals were required to comply with a new Congressional law. The law is known as the "Patient Self-Determination Act (PSDA) of 1990," and it was included in the "Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (OBRA) of 1990." The PSDA requires institutions accepting Medicare or Medicaid, such as hospitals, hospices, home health agencies, HMO's (Health Maintenance Organizations), and certain nursing homes, to do three things.

First, they must ask all patients upon admission to, or enrollment in, the institution whether they have any kind of advance directive such as a living will or durable power of attorney. If so, the institution must include a copy of that directive on the patient's chart.

Second, institutions are required to counsel patients as to their rights under applicable state law concerning advance directives, the information to be provided to the institution

by the state. The institution must also explain to the patient its policy regarding the implementation of the advance directive, should the time come to sue it.

Third, institutions must provide community education concerning advance directives. The community education provision actually came into effect several months ago. Failure to comply with the PSDA may mean financial, as well as potential criminal, penalties for the offending institution.

This law acknowledges in legislation what has been a continuing trend to United States legal philosophy—the recognition of a patient's right to determine his or her fate. This concept is known as patient autonomy or patient self-determination.

This trend began in the 1970s with the case of Karen Ann Quinlan when New Jersey recognized a patient's right to refuse even life-saving treatment, and was supported just last year after the United States Supreme Court,

in the Nancy Cruzan case, determined that the right to refuse unwanted medical treatment was based on an individual's privacy rights found in the United States Constitution.

There is now a well-recognized right for individuals to refuse any medical treatment, including life-saving treatments, and hospitals, as well as other health care institutions, are required to make this known to their clients.

You may also contact a local attorney to have a living will or durable power of attorney prepared or if you have further questions regarding this issue.

While the issues and emotions raised in dealing with these sorts of questions of life and death are difficult, it is undoubtedly easier to make your wishes known ahead of time to friends, family and physicians rather than having them burdened with making hard decisions in a time of crisis. It is your right to determine what happens to you—exercise your right to make an advance directive.

Weight Loss Surprises Researchers

WASHINGTON --A nutrition organization was hopeful that a nutritionally complete "hi-tech" food tablet would help erase world hunger problems, until a study revealed that one of the ingredients could cause significant weight loss.

Although other studies and scientists may not agree, researchers in Europe found that the ingredient, a natural plant colloid, actually caused people to lose weight, even though specifically instructed not to alter normal eating patterns, according to one study published in the prestigious *British Journal of Nutrition*. Researchers in an earlier study had speculated that the weight loss was due to a decrease in the intestinal absorption of calories.

While the project of National Dietary Research, aptly named Food-Source One, would not be used to successfully fulfill its original goal, the formula which has since been improved with other natural colloids has been a windfall for some overweight people. A Daytona Beach, Florida woman fighting a weight battle for 12 years used the product on the recommendation of her physician and lost 30 pounds. She stated, "Not only have I lost 30 pounds but my cholesterol has dropped from 232 to 143. I have two closets full of clothes which have not fit me in two years that I can now wear." In a separate report, a telephone interview revealed that a Wilmington, North Carolina pharmacist lost 14 pounds in 3 weeks on the product and was never hungry.

"You go not knowing what to expect and come back feeling reaffirmed," Hankins said. "It helped reinforce my beliefs about staying involved, not getting down, knowing you can do something, that you can make a difference."

The proof of her words is Hankins' own record.

She's president of the National Honor Society chapter, president of the senior class, president of the Lifeguard peer counseling group, secretary-treasurer of student council and is a member of the drama class.

After graduation, Hankins is heading to New Mexico State University where she plans to study psychology and communications.

"You can only go one year or I'd be applying for the camp again," Hankins said. "But I am encouraging others to try it."

Girls team wins at home

The Ruidoso Warrior track teams made a strong stand on their own turf to gain the title for the girls and a runner-up position for the boys in the home invitational meet Friday.

Also at the meet were Lovington, Artesia and Socorro. Two teams from west Texas were unable to compete in the meet. The girls team raked in 120 points, followed by Lovington with 109 and Artesia with 93. Socorro had 16. Lovington ran away with lead in the boys division with 158 points, with Ruidoso as its closest competitor at 94 points. Socorro had 87 and Artesia finished with 67 points.

Luisa Tam continued her string of first place finishes in both the 1600 meter and 3200 meter. Her time in the 1600 was five minutes 42 seconds, while she crossed the finish line in 12 minutes 23.72 seconds in the 3200 meter. Catrina Gabaldon also earned a first place in the 200 meter dash in a time of 27.31 seconds.

Close on her heels was Sarah Dix in third place with a time of 29.09 seconds and Kristie Ryan in fourth in 29.88 seconds. The 800 meter relay team of Ryan, Gabaldon, Natasha Mulqueen and Rachelle Holstein cruised into first place with a time of one minute 50.91 seconds. The girls also earned first place in the 1600 meter relay with a time of four minutes 13.62 seconds.

Kami Bailey finished second in the 800 meter dash, just a step behind the winner at one minute 9.13 seconds. Dix also placed sixth in the 300 meter hurdles in a time of 56.90 seconds and fourth in the 100 meter hurdles in 19 seconds, but earned first place in the long jump with a leap of 17 feet, one inch. Ryan came in third with a distance of 14 feet, two inches.

Dix was also in on the winning 400 meter relay team that dashed

to first place in a time of 51.93 seconds. Also on the team were Gabaldon, Mulqueen and Hollstein. Mulqueen captured fifth place in the 100 meter dash with a time of 13.78 seconds.

Another double winner for the Warriors was Monica Martinez in the shot and discus. She threw 32 feet, eight and seven-eighths inches in shot and 108 feet, nine inches in the discus. In the shot she was followed by Jolene McGee at third place with a throw of 29 feet, seven and one-eighth inches. McGee finished fifth in the discus with a distance of 77 feet, 11 inches, while Monique Ramos was third at 82 feet, eight inches.

Jody Randle cleared five feet for the top spot in the high jump, followed by Bailey in second place at four feet, 10 inches. Sarah Echols finished third in the 3200 meter run in a sliver more than 16 minutes.

The boys team gained most of their points in the field events and the longer runs for their second place finish. Three Warriors placed in the 3200 meter run, with Nick Nanz coming out on top. He finished the distance in 10 minutes 36.28 seconds for first. Faustino Miranda was third in a time of 11 minutes 46.46 seconds, while Matt Norbury was fourth at 11 minutes 50.33 seconds. Nanz also came in second in the 1600 meter run with a time of four minutes 42.67 seconds.

Jackie Lynn earned first place in the 800 meter run in a time of two minutes 6.84 seconds. Saul Mendez finished fifth in the 800 with a time of two minutes 22.69 seconds.

Eric Evans won first place in the 110 meter high hurdles in a time of 15.15 seconds, while Keith Henson finished third at 16.21 seconds. Jason Dix was sixth in a time of 17.22 seconds. Evans also came in

second in the 300 meter hurdles in 41.26 seconds, followed by Henson at fifth with a time of 46.28 seconds. Tony Aguilar was sixth in the 100 meter dash in a time of 12.41 seconds.

The 1600 meter relay team earned first place in three minutes 33.4 seconds. The 800 meter relay team finished one second behind the winning Lovington team at one minute 35.83 seconds. Also placing second was the 400 meter relay team with a time of 45.59 seconds.



California man moves back "east" to Ruidoso to lead Ruidoso Care Center

Some people would have a hard time adjusting to moving from San Diego to Ruidoso, but Patrick Taylor says he loves it because it is absolutely rejuvenating.

Taylor is the new administrator at the Ruidoso Care Center who will replace Joe Treviso. Taylor was serving as an assistant administrator at a 190-bed facility with 36 rehabilitation beds in San Diego before coming here. Although, he enjoyed the activities San Diego had to offer, there was one thing he missed.

"Ruidoso is more community oriented. You never get a sense of community there (San Diego). If I thirsted for anything it was that," Taylor said.

It won't be hard for Taylor to adjust to Ruidoso, though, because he is originally from a small town in Iowa. He went to a Catholic University that was a branch of the University of Iowa. He later did graduate work at the University and majored in social work and psychology.

He is single and has a 19-year-old son, who is attending San Diego State University to major in physical therapy. Taylor said it was tough to leave his son, but hopes he will visit often. He arrived in Ruidoso April 5 and began working at the care center April 6.

"I'm looking forward to the cen-

ter having close ties with the local physicians because they are an integral part of our whole program. I hope the physicians take an active role. If they want to stop by and check on their patients daily or weekly they are welcome to," he said.

"They are in the business for the same reason we are, quality patient care. That's what it is all about," Taylor said.

One exciting change going on here is the recent licensing of eight certified skilled nursing beds, he said. With this they can ac-

comodate and treat acute medical situations, such as stroke victims, amputees, hip fractures and replacements. They have a full range of specialists and therapists to rehabilitate the person back to their homes in the community. Taylor said the care center and the Lincoln County Medical Center are both excited about it.

Before this improvement the area was losing patients to other skilled units out of the city, he said. Now people have a continuity of care, or a full circle of service. Taylor said the care center has the beds ready and have some patients in them now.

Taylor said he has been to a lot of health care facilities, with a lot of luxuries, but they still provided poor care. While he was in California, where Horizons Health Care has no facilities, he heard about their excellent reputation.

"This facility, with the Horizon philosophy, gives some of the highest quality staff and best nursing care that I have seen since I've been in long term care," Taylor said.

He said it has been an enlightening experience to work with elderly people. He has worked with people of various ages, including juveniles, gang members, divorce counseling, veterans and more recently with

older people.

"After three or four months of working with the elderly I knew that was my calling. I learned so much by just being in the element of geriatrics. I jumped at the chance when I had the opportunity to work with a company so devoted to the philosophy of quality care and dignified living," Taylor said.

While in San Diego, Taylor was on the juvenile affairs board, and he would like to have a close relationship with the police department here.

"I like to work with the kids to help them avoid jail and going into the system," he said.

Taylor also enjoys restoring old cars and has restored one from the decades of the 1940s, '50s and '60s. He also an artist who does drawings and works with plexiglass and clay.

"I like being here and I want to be involved in the community," he said.

The care center is a very important part of the community too, as it serves as one of the largest year-round employers in the village.

"We welcome anyone to come and visit or volunteer or play a musical instrument for these people who need nurturing and music. We welcome the community to be a part of us as we are a part of you," Taylor said.

Visiting the home folks

Congressman Joe Skeen was in Lincoln County last week to visit the people of his district, speaking before a luncheon meeting, at the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce and before a Capitan town hall meeting. Skeen clarified a misunderstanding about one guest at the lunch, Miller Hudson of Pacific Nuclear. Hudson commented that "Joe invited me to answer questions on the MRS." Congressman Skeen, noting that all his meetings are open to the public, said that Hudson was invited by Jo Kazhe of the Inn of the Mountain Gods, not by the Congressman, who hadn't met him before that meeting. Skeen disagreed with reports that he got a cool reception at the Capitan meeting, stating that the 69 people at the meeting applauded him.

Students get help to study environment

A major element in protection of the environment is public education. And it's starting early in Ruidoso.

Carl Stubbs of the New Mexico Environment Department's Ruidoso Field Office, will take on the added duties of teaching during April.

Stubbs will make presentations to kindergartners, first, second and third graders at two Ruidoso elementary schools. The curriculum for the younger students will include discussions of the water cycle — from evaporation to rainfall to lakes and rivers. But he will also focus on how that water is affected by man during the cycle.

"The students know about these things — they know parts of the water cycle, but they're not quite

sure how it all ties together," said Stubbs. "For instance, they're not always aware that some treated sewage is discharged back into the river, or that septic tanks must be regulated to prevent the leachfield from impacting ground water."

For the third-grade students, Stubbs expands his presentation to include a discussion of mercury contamination of the Pecos River and the analysis of Ruidoso's public drinking water supplies. He also discusses food-borne illnesses with the older students, including tips on how to avoid getting sick.

"This started when I was asked to give a presentation to my son's class. They then asked me if I would talk to other classes as well," said Stubbs.

Riders take to the Bonito area trails

Horse Tales explained the evolution of the horse, its abrupt disappearance from North America about 10,000 years ago, and its reintroduction just 500 years ago by Spanish explorers. It also explored the modern-day world of the

The State finally is repairing Sudderth

TO THE EDITOR:

Finally, an announcement in *The Ruidoso News* of Monday, April 7, on page one states "Detour: State starts work on Sudderth."

Sudderth Drive (SD) is an unusual arterial street. It would be difficult to live in the corporate limits of the Village of Ruidoso and never use SD. In recent months, we have bounced and rattled down SD with local residents complaining "Why doesn't the Village repair SD? It's in terrible shape!" I believe that the poor condition of SD has been reflected in the current local belief that street maintenance by the Village of Ruidoso is at a very low level.

Over the 45 years of the life of the Village of Ruidoso, more and more paved streets have been put in place with many, many miles to be maintained. From my experience, the maintenance program over these years has stayed about the same; not changing to improve.

The Village of Ruidoso does not

bear the responsibility for maintenance on SD. In order to have SD widened to the present four driving lanes with two parallel parking lanes, it was necessary for the Village of Ruidoso to turn over legal control of SD to the State of New Mexico Highway Department. The New Mexico State Highway and Transportation Department (HTD) quite often does things by fits and jerks. This is because of the many demands on HTD in a low population state with a large land area and an enormous number of miles of highway to be built and maintained. Generally speaking, when the HTD does get around to doing a job, they do it in an acceptable fashion.

The intended message of this letter is: When Sudderth Drive gets bad, don't blame the Village of Ruidoso. Blame the New Mexico Highway and Transportation Department.

DOE leads an assault on Native Americans

TO THE EDITOR:

Some recent letters have objected to local opposition to the Mescalero MRS study, and have cited "rights of the sovereign Mescalero Apache Tribe" to do as it pleases within reservation borders.

American history is replete with accounts of how European immigrants to New England seduced Six Nations Iroquois peoples with beads, trinkets and blankets (which introduced deadly European diseases) into believing the new arrivals were peaceable and benign. As immigration to the New World increased, Native Americans were pushed off their lands and traditional ranges either by similar "peace offerings" and frequently broken treaties, by force of arms, or both.

Southern Atlantic tribes, Cherokee, Chickasaw and Choctaw, were "given" lands in western Arkansas and eastern Oklahoma; the alternative to moving being total annihilation by land-grabbing whites. After many made the long trek to relocate, the U.S. government, bowing to pressure from land-and-resource-

greedy settlers and the railroads, moved the boundaries of tribal lands out of western Arkansas into Oklahoma Territory entirely.

Treaties governing boundaries of Indian lands repeatedly were broken by the government to accommodate "white interests" and the Oklahoma land-rush.

Nothing was said in the aforementioned letters about historical exploitation of Native Americans by the U.S. government in pursuit of "white interests."

The Department of Energy's campaign to locate nuclear waste dumps on Indian reservations is but the latest in a long tradition of inflicting "white interests" upon virtually powerless Indian people.

Not only is this manifestation of that tradition improper from economic, scientific, health and safety, States' rights and national security perspectives. It also is a continuation of the patently immoral abuse of the politically and economically powerless position of Native American tribes in order to serve "white interests," to the Indians' detriment.

If we, as a nation, continue to foul our own nest, we cannot morally require others to permit us also to foul theirs. If "white interests" continue to generate nuclear and other hazardous wastes, let "white interests" store and manage them on their own territory, to their own detriment.

Native American traditions, despite the distortions and corruption of a few of their "leaders," have preserved and protected large areas of our lands from pollution and destruction.

We must insist that our government breaks the tradition of exploiting and abusing Native American peoples for the sake of profits to a greedy few.

As neighbors to the Mescalero Apaches, we must demand that our Department of Energy stop its efforts to site a high-level nuclear waste dump on their reservation, and we must join Mescalero Apaches who oppose MRS, adding strength to their struggle to protect their lands from further misuse.
