
fall, Bingaman noted that Lincoln County was the only county he lost in his last bid for re-election.

# Chamber of Commerce budget shortfall is only temporary

Although it will probably end this fiscal year in the red, the Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce is looking forward to digging itself out of the hole by the end of the next fiscal year.

With just a few days left in this fiscal year, the chamber will likely end it with a \$10,000 to \$17,000 deficit because of too high an estimate in revenues from membership dues. Jack Muhn, chamber staff accountant, said they are a little shy on cash but he has billed about \$25,000 this month and had received about \$15,000 of it by the chamber board meeting Wednesday night. He said they hope to collect another \$7,000 to \$10,000 by the end of the fiscal year, which is June 30.

The main reason for the shortfall is that last year's budget included a 13 percent increase in revenue from membership dues, but dues had been falling off. The group has been able to get by this far by using revenues from the upcoming Ruidoso Arts Festival, one of the biggest money makers for them.

"By borrowing from next year, we should be able to squeeze by," Muhn told the board of directors.

Ex-officio member Ron Wicker said he realized there is no hard and fast rules about budgets, but usually if the money is not coming in, the organization backs off on ex-

penses.

"There are ways to ensure you don't overspend. You tighten or loosen your belt. You build in contingencies. You over-estimate expenditures and under-estimate revenues. We are trying to build credibility and part of it is financial," Wicker said.

Board president Paul Crown said it isn't a matter of having bills to pay, but there isn't any money left in the bank account. They aren't looking at going to the bank and getting money, he said. He said in the next year or two they will be able to have money left in the account.

Chamber director Joan Bailey said if the group can do some special events and continue to receive membership dues they should be able to improve the finances.

"None of us are happy about it (the deficit), but it could take a couple years to get us out of the red," she said.

Director Valerie Miller pointed out that last year's operating budget was not a fat budget. She said in her work at the hospital she works with budgets all the time and there is only a certain margin that she can cut from. If she operates in the red she still needs to keep the doors open as does the chamber.

"There aren't many things you could cut and not affect the chamber," she said.

After the May financial statement was approved, discussion began on how the situation is projected to look at the end of next fiscal year. Muhn gave an overview of the budget for the next fiscal year, which is estimated to have a \$900 positive bottom line. They need to maintain the current membership revenue of \$55,000 as well as add \$500 of new members each month to meet the need for revenue. Bailey and the staff have discussed the amount and say it is a reasonable goal.

The group also needs to see a profit in its three special events, the Aspenfest, Oktoberfest and the Connoisseur Classic III. Muhn said committees are already in place for these and the staff has also been thinking of ways to make these successful.

Expenditures are about the same as last year with the main ones being salaries with a small merit increase included, but not mandatory, insurance and the accounting contract. Muhn said the expenses are pretty well set, so the revenue is the thing to worry about. He said the budget could go \$200 to \$300 either way. The group vote to approve the budget.

In discussion on the dues, director Danny Austin said the structure for charging dues needed to be looked at because the banks in the area provide about 25 to 30 percent of the amount because they are

charged more than a lot of other businesses although they may not have as high a revenue. Crown agreed that the way they are now looks good in theory, but when businesses are compared it doesn't work out as well. He said as word gets out on the streets on how well the chamber is doing they may want to consider increasing some, but at this point he couldn't see raising them.

James Hobbs, who will officially take his position on the board next month, said when he pays dues to some organizations there is an increase each year based on the percentage of inflation. Muhn said he could also do that if the board wanted too.

Crown said they haven't increased dues for quite awhile, and had even reduced them in recent years. He said they may look at it though in January if things continue to go well.

With the Ruidoso Art Committee less than a month away, committee chairperson Frank Sayner asked board members to volunteer time for the event, which is a big money maker for the group. He said they are going to start setting up the seven tents July 20, and he will need help all week with extra workers on the days of the event, July 24-26. To sign up to do help people may come by the chamber office and write their name in under what they want to do.

He said promotional posters have been made and are going up around the community. Sayner said things are going smoothly, but it takes a lot of people to make it successful. Crown also pointed out how important it is to make this event work and encouraged everyone to spend a day at the festival to help out.

The chamber board voted to transfer the bank account to First Federal Saving after the festival because that bank is unable to host it, but Ruidoso State Bank has agreed to. Each year the account is rotated to a new financial institute and it will be transferred to First Federal in August.

Bailey also updated the group on a letter she received from the Oktoberfest committee. They have asked the chamber to take the event back over, but the committee will stay in place.

Also approved by the board was a request by Bailey to become a member of the Friends of Smokey group. The cost is \$75, and Bailey said she has felt the chamber needed to get back into the community and the area. Austin pointed out the group is expecting a large crowd when it celebrates the 50th anniversary of Smokey Bear, and many will be visit and stay in Ruidoso.

In the membership report Bailey said they had seven new members

in June and 75 renewals for a total of 316 members. She reminded board members that Muhn was still expecting funds in for the dues billing this month, so the collection still looks good.

She also reported that the chamber received \$20,000 in state matching funds for advertising. That amount is down from last year, but this year the civic events center received \$10,000 and the relocation services earned \$5,000, so the community as a whole received at least \$35,000.

Ruidoso has been selected as a top vacation spot in two magazines. Earlier this month, Bailey said, they were listed in Vacation Magazine as one of the top ten small towns for vacations, along with Branson, Missouri. On Friday she found out Ruidoso was also in the top bargain sports vacations in Women's Day magazine which is circulated in this area.

The board of directors gave unanimous support to a presentation by Dub Williams, Lincoln County Medical Center board president, on the county mill levy that will be voted on in a special election on September 15. The group also heard presentations from Aubrey Dunn on the Sunbird Treasure Fest planned to draw RV people to the area this fall, and Alden Deyo on the progress in MainStreet Ruidoso.

And the little calf voices calling in answer, as they make their way running and jumping in their last play-time before they lie down in the cool grass of the meadow, with their mothers close by.

### New Yucca Plants


Our state flower the Yucca plants blooming in late June and helps the children of Mother Earth welcome July, the patriotic month.

Through the years the Yucca plants by the wayside are like old friends, bringing in their great clusters of pearly blooms on their graceful stalks—on their plants in certain places, long familiar year after year, much as to say: "Hello, here I am. Cheer up. Summer is here."

You look for these blooms, on these same plants year in and year out.

What a surprise to see brand new little Yucca plants with long pointed leaves bunched together, sending up a small stalk with a little clump of blooms coming into bloom.

Where there used to be one or two Yuccas, here you see 10 or 12 young ones—some high on the steep banks or by the wayside and some even perched on the edge of a small cliff. The seeds had been waiting all these years, it seemed, waiting for the right year to make their move and form more of the "Candles of



God," as they were named by the Spanish pioneers. "Las Velas De Dios."

### Cactus Blossoms

Now here we are just at high noon on June 25. The American flag is floating in a breeze out of the east carrying the flavor or ripening fruit down the way, and carrying rain clouds overhead. It is warm and balmy in the bright sun and cool in the shade.

As you glance down the road the river, a flash of bright color, half way between crimson and purple, greets your eye. This is the Cholla Cactus out in full bloom all in a day, cheering the green world with its shining colors. The Cholla is a true child of the southwest blooming all the way from Colorado to Texas and down into central Mexico. It full bloom is a cheerful sight on the desert, foot hills and up into the mountains of the Southwest.

And over here in a sunny spot you see the pure sunlight yellow of the large blooms on the Prickly Pear, among the soft green of the rounded leaves. The Prickly Pear bears fruit, called "Tuna" by the Spanish. This is food for all kinds of wild creatures, and can be eaten by folks also.

Down in Old Mexico a giant form of the Prickly Pear is cultivated for its fruit and for fences.

It is one of the charms of the land of the piñon and pine that we have the fruits and flowers of the desert along with those of the mountains and foot hills.

Ready to welcome July in the high country are the sky blue Forget-Me-Not, the state flower of Alaska, right on the edge of the stream.

The Scotch Blue Bell ringing silently on its slender stem, is blooming beside the Golden English Buttercup, all through the mountain lands.

Here under the giant Spruce and Douglas Fir the white bloom of the wild strawberry shines along the green moss and ferns. Mountains cousins of our state flowers are everywhere below the maturing aspen and the whispering pine—like the lavender Wild Iris, pink Wild Rose, the Wild Wallflower, Wild Snapdragon, white and purple Violets, and wild Geranium.

In the orchards of Mother Earth, the fruit is beginning to ripen—the two or three kinds of wild cherries, raspberries, elderberries, and wild strawberries.

### Looking Forward To The Fourth

We will have one more visit before the Fourth, and already my thoughts are going back 82 years to other fourths of July's, including the day we arrived in Mescalero on July 2 our mother's birthday, and stayed all four days during the Mescalero Indian celebration. There was a bond of friendship formed in those days which grows stronger with the years.

### Let Us Have A Safe Fourth

Let us all help each other to have a glorious and safe Fourth of July season. Be careful in traffic, and along the river, remembering that July is the rainy month and that the river may flood very suddenly.

Let us remember the opening words of Thomas Jefferson in the Declaration of Independence:

"We hold these truths to be self evident—that all men are created equal—that they are endowed by their creator with certain unalienable rights—that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

Let us all join together in gratefulness to God that we live in our beloved country, and for all our other many blessings.

## Scout is on the lookout for a home

A soft ball of reddish, blonde hair with a wet nose and a gentle heart, Scout is searching for a new home.

Picked up as a stray two weeks ago and brought to the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter, Scout appears to be a chowshelty cross, said manager Randy Basch. He's about one-year-old, weighs 40 pounds and shouldn't get any larger.

"He's smaller than the average chow and just a little bigger than the average sheltie," Basch said.

The pint-size pal is a little timid, Basch said. "But once he's adjusted to a new situation, he's outgoing and friendly."

Not a big barker, he's good with children and other dogs.

"He's very alert, so in addition to being a good companion, he'd be a good watchdog," Basch said.

Shelter workers are not sure whether Scout is housebroken, but with his thick hair, he is well-suited to life outdoors, except on the hottest days.

The shelter is temporary home to five other chow crosses. They have Labrador or golden retriever as the other half of the mix, Basch said. All are adults and there are males and females.

The shelter desperately needs donors for spaying and neutering dogs and cats eligible for adoption.

The cost of the altering procedure is the major expense connected to adoption.

Many people who would make caring and thoughtful owners find it difficult to pay for altering an animal in addition to the regular upkeep, Basch said.

"Sometimes they come in and are immediately attracted to one animal, but end up taking another because it is sponsored," he said. "Although we're happy to see any of our residents find new homes, I'd like to see people able to choose an animal without worrying about the difference in cost."

Donations for the sponsorship fund can be for any amount of money. Procedures run from \$18 to \$55, depending on whether the pet is a cat or dog, male or female. Several donations may be combined to cover one procedure. A

donor may send money for general sponsorship or it can be earmarked for a particular animal.

Spaying and neutering are the cornerstone of the human society's effort to reduce the population of unwanted and abandoned animals. Members consider the destruction of animals an inhumane solution. Preventing reproduction could end the suffering, pain and deaths now experienced by 14-million animals a year in shelters and pounds across the nation.

Although Ruidoso has passed a mandatory spay and neutering ordinance, it will take a broader effort and much more public education before a significant impact is felt, Basch pointed out.

Two more communities have approved similar ordinances since Ruidoso, bringing the total to four, Basch said.

For every human born, 15 dogs and 45 cats are brought into the world, according to the humane society. The supply of pets will not run out, Basch said. Spayed females lead healthier lives and neutered males do not lose their hunting or herding instincts.

Basch also cautioned owners to be prepared for their pets to react to loud fireworks on July Fourth.

"Even though fireworks are illegal, occasionally one will go off and dogs who have no history of problems, may get scared and bolt from their owners," he said. "When walking, be sure dogs are on leashes, as required by law. Lot of hazards and temptations are here for visiting and resident pets. They could get lost, they could be caught in a steel jaw trap or have encounters with skunks and porcupines."

"If your pet strays from home, don't wait. Contact us and the county impounding officer immediately (because animals picked up in the unincorporated areas of the county often go to an impound facility in Fort Stanton) and are put down within 72 hours). Give me a description so that I have a report on file."

A shepherd-collie mix named Ernie was lost in the Glencoe area last Wednesday evening.

But there's more to the story than just a lost dog report. Ernie suffers from seizures and often foams at the mouth, but he is not dangerous. He has been given all of his protective shots.

However, the seizures cause him to become temporarily disoriented and he may be wandering aimlessly without access to food, water or his medicine.

The one-year-old dog was being treated for his condition when he was put into a courtyard to work off the after effects of a convulsion. But a side gate was opened and he wandered off, possibly following the stream down into Hondo Valley or up into Ruidoso Downs. Complicating the situation, the seizures affect Ernie's eyesight and hearing, making him more vulnerable to

cars or predators.

Ernie wears a royal blue nylon collar with his Ruidoso city license and his rabies tag. He is very timid, but if he has not succumbed to his seizures, he should be hungry and forced to come into contact with humans for food. He is not aggressive, but do not approach him during a seizure. Speak to him calmly and offer food when he has regained his bearings.

He has a tan face, black back with tan and gray underhair, and a tail that curls when he is alert. He is the size of a small shepherd.

# Arts market is the place to buy and sell unique arts and crafts

Many people in the Ruidoso area make creative arts and crafts but have had a hard time finding a market for them until now.

June Berridge opened the Arts and Crafts Market at 2818 Sudderth Drive in the Pine Tree Square on Friday to give people the opportunity to sell their hand-made items, such as decorated sweat-shirts, hand-drawn silver jewelry and quartz carvings. The market is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Friday, Saturday and Sunday, now through Labor Day weekend.

People can reserve one of 19 spaces, ranging in size from five feet by six feet to 12 by 12. The craft makers may choose a table by the walls to take advantage of the peg board or by the window to display items. The spaces are available on a first come, first serve basis, and she is offering special prices for those who commit to selling through the last weekend.

The sellers need to bring their own tables and backdrops, and there are electrical outlets for many of the spaces. Some people may want to share a space and split the time being there to sell the items. Berridge said she would like to get a variety of different crafts to keep customers interested in coming back.

Berridge is also offering free space for charitable groups such as school groups, church groups, and scout groups to use as to sell crafts or for bake sales.

"People who make crafts need a place to sell them. Buyers also like to meet the person who made the items. I think it will be a lot of fun and people will enjoy it," she said.

She got the idea while in Phoenix, Arizona, at an RV park during the winter. They had an arts and crafts fair each weekend, and it went over well. She thought Ruidoso would be a wonderful place to do a market in the summer. Besides serving the local people with a market, it may also be an activity visitors may want to do if they are going to be here for awhile. They could bring their items to sell and possibly make enough to pay for the vacation.

So far Berridge has gotten a lot of calls from creators from El Paso, Texas, Lovington and Artesia as well as from many other communities in a 500-mile radius. People are interested because they know they aren't going to be in a flea market atmosphere, but in a safe, comfortable market with other truly, hand-made arts and crafts, she said.

The market offers the area people more than the two annual fairs that are scheduled here during the summer. Having it indoors also gives people protection from the wind and sun, both as sellers and buyers looking at the crafts. Berridge said it is also in a perfect location at the intersection of Sudderth and Mechem Drives because


it seems residents and visitors all pass through the area during the day.

She said she thinks it may be slow going at first, but people can do well if they stick with it. She is going to be patient and see how it goes this first summer, she said. The market also offers an opportunity for craft makers to meet others and get to know what crafts are available. Berridge said she is

trying to offer something that other shops in Ruidoso can't and doesn't want to compete with any of them.

If craft makers are interested in getting a space at the market, they may stop by the building or call her at 258-5410.

"I just wanted to get something started for the locals. I hope it will draw more people to Ruidoso," Berridge said.


She enjoys working with long hair and giving spiral perms. Jordan also does facial bleaching and lashes.

# New mechanic is ASSET to Ruidoso Ford shop

Having a good mechanic in today's computerized automotive world can be quite an asset for a dealership who needs to keep

customers satisfied. Richard Cajé, Ruidoso Ford Lincoln-Mercury's ASSET, Automotive Student Service Educational

Training, graduate who was able to get his associate's degree in auto mechanics with the help of this dealership and the Mescalero

Apache Tribe.

Cajé was working in the parts department here when he decided he wanted a change in careers, and owner Christopher Carusona pointed him toward the program.

Although Ford has had ASSET for seven years in 54 sites across the United States, the program at New Mexico Junior College in Hobbs was the first one for a rural area. Cajé was one of its first 13 graduates in April at a ceremony where Lieutenant Governor Casey Luna, who owns a Ford dealership and had a person graduating, was the guest speaker.

Cajé was one of seven people from the area who took a test at the college several years ago to be able to enter the program. When he passed the test and was accepted for the training, he and Carusona approached the Mescalero Apache Tribe to ask them to help sponsor Cajé, who is Mescalero.

The tribe agreed to help him with room and board, tuition for other classes he needed to get his degree and his tools, which are a major investment for a mechanic.

No student housing was available for the mechanics in the program so Cajé had to stay in a motel during his time there. Ford provides the facility, the professors, and the vehicles the students need to work on. No tuition is charged for this part of the program.

The students go to school in Hobbs for eight weeks, working on certain skills, and then they come back to the sponsoring dealership for eight weeks to do jobs that require that specific skill. The dealership then pays them during that time, but working just eight weeks wouldn't give them enough money for the boarding and the tools, Carusona said.

While he was at the junior college, Cajé said the Ford education program had done a lot for him and the students from other dealerships. He also said he owes a great deal to his instructor Gary Faatz and Carusona. His plans are to stay with the Ford dealer network to eventually become a head service technician at a dealership.

Cajé is now working full-time as

a service technician at Ruidoso Ford with nine other people in the parts and services department. One of his co-workers, Marvin Yuzos, has also been accepted to begin ASSET this fall. Carusona said Yuzos didn't pass the test the first time, but the Mescalero tribe arranged for tutoring and night school for him so he passed with high scores the second time.

Yuzos has been working at Ford for about a year and is now a mechanic's helper.

"The tribe has been very supportive. They have bent over backwards to help these two through this program," Carusona said.

Going through the program has been a benefit for all three. The dealership now has another mechanic who can work on the new computer-driven cars, while Cajé has a degree in a field with a very high demand, and Yuzos will begin this fall.

"Dealers are always crying for a good mechanic. If you are selling a Ford product, you better know how to fix it," Carusona said.

## Bumper cherry crop attracts tourists, boosts area economy

Otero County's bumper cherry crop is expected to attract tourists and give area farmers an economic boost.

Mild spring weather allowed the cherries to flourish this year, said Gary Hathorn, Otero County Extension agent.

"We had just slight freeze damage, just enough to kind of thin the trees," he said.

Hathorn estimates the 100 acres of cherry orchards in the area will

produce up to 300,000 pounds of fruit.

"As far as the growers go, of course, it is a big dividend," Hathorn said. "Even a 10-acre orchard can bring in as much as \$30,000 which really helps to pay the bills."

What it does economically for Otero County is it brings a lot of people from all over New Mexico and West Texas into the com-

munity to pick cherries."

Early harvesting began June 6. Most orchards are expected to open June 20 for about five weeks of picking.

'Bing,' 'Black Tartarian,' 'Van,' and 'Royal Ann' cherries are grown primarily in the High Rolls and La Luz Canyon areas.

Some pie cherries also are produced.

Most orchards offer "u-pick"

cherries for about \$1 a pound, Hathorn said.

"There is nothing better than mountain cherries, particularly if you pick them yourself," he said.

**All about the All Stars**

The New Mexico All-Stars began with 24 players in 1990 as a stroke play tournament, hosted by the Ruidoso Municipal Schools and Ruidoso Downs Race Track.

Beginning last season, the field was expanded to 32 players and was switched to Match Play because of the tremendous popularity of the Ryder Cup Matches.

The All-Stars is similar to the

Ryder Cup Matches in at there are two teams participating against each other and the title will be decided after a series of partnership and singles matches are played between the two teams.


The NM version roughly divides the state geographically (East and West) for the All-Star teams. Each team is made up of (if possible) the best 8 AAA players and the best 8 AAAA players on that side of the state. Example Farmington and Silver City play on the West team, while Clovis and Santa Fe play for the East.

At the State High School Championship, each coach is given a ballot in which he must nominate any deserving player that might play on his team. That player is sent a letter, requesting information about his season and notifying him about his (or her) nomination. If interested, after the player returns the requested information, he or she is screened by the committee, and the top 32 players are selected.

The team members are seeded according to their past scoring averages and knowledge of Ruidoso's courses. These seedings are compiled and partners are set up for the following day's matches to make the competition the best possible.

There are 48 matches over the three-day tournament, thus 48 possible points. The first team that reaches 24 1/2 points is the winner. Each team receives one point for a win and one-half point for a tie. There are no playoffs.

The first-round morning matches, at Cree Meadows Country Club, are Medal-Matchplay, this is also called "Low Total". Each partnership simply adds up their total score and which ever team is lowest is one up. Example: The East team scores are 4 and 5, while the West

team scores are 5 and 6. The East team would then be one hole up on the West team. The first-round afternoon matches are held at Alto Lakes Golf and Country Club. The same format is used although each player will have a different partner.

The second-round matches are held at The Links at Sierra Blanca. The morning matches are called "Foursomes" or in the United States, Alternate Shot. Each team member hits every other shot until

the hole is completed. The afternoon round is called "Fourball" or Best Ball. Each player completes the hole and the lowest score of the two shall be the team score. Example: East player makes a 4 and East player B makes a 6. West Player A makes a 4 and West Player B makes a 3. The West team won that hole and is 1-up.

The third-round matches are held at The Inn of the Mountain Gods Golf Course.

Take special note of the results of the day's early races. Does the track have a "fast lane" (giving a certain post position an advantage) or a "slow lane" (hampering a favorite)? Does the track change as it gets hotter or cooler? Has wind direction changed? Watch for any such trends, and handicap your wager accordingly.

## Six To Five scores first big victory

Six To Five stamped his credentials with his first graded stakes victory when he won Sunday's Grade III \$30,000-added Jet Deck Stakes at Ruidoso Downs.

Aptly named, Six To Five was sent off as the even-money favorite in the 440-yard-race for 3-year-old and older quarter horses. The gargantuan grey raced sluggishly from the gate, but was gaining with every stride by midstretch.

Jockey Larry Chavez was so confident in his mount that he only resorted to the whip once, giving Six To Five a tap for good measure about 25 feet from the finish line.

The colt prevailed by a nose over runner-up Very Special Tip with a time of 21.52 seconds. Easy Sabra was third a head back.

"I knew once we walked out on the race track that he had a good chance to win," said Jimmy Jones who trains Six To Five for Steven Duran of Santa Fe. "Last time he raced here he warmed up flat even though he did win. This time he was chomping at the bit."

Although the horse nabbed the lead in the final strides, Jones never flinched.

"Larry never did get into this horse," Jones said. "He just kinda sat there keeping him awake. It was close, but he won and that's all that matters, whether it be by a mile or a nose."

A multiple stakes winner, Six To Five paid \$4 to win, \$3 to place and \$2.60 to show. Longshot Very Special Tip paid \$16.60 to place and \$6 to show. Easy Sabra paid \$7.80.

## Last Don B. sets new track record Saturday

Last Don B. not only extended his stakes win streak to three when he won Saturday's Ruidoso Budweiser Breeders' Cup at Ruidoso Downs, he did so in track record time.

Last Don B. and jockey Manny Ortiz covered the one mile in 1:37.4, just sneaking past Glory Rain's old record of 1:38.0 set in 1988. Last Don B. remains undefeated at Ruidoso Downs having won the Mescalero Apache Handicap two weeks ago and the Governor's Handicap last month.

Last Don B. raced just off the pace early on, but raced to the lead with a quarter of a mile to go.

Last Don B. was in complete control heading into the stretch and won the race by more than six

lengths. Longshot Gold Medley and jockey Nancy Summers raced way back early on, but slowly gained ground to finish second.

The Ruidoso Budweiser Breeders' Cup was the first time Summers had ridden Gold Medley which was very rambunctious in the paddock.

"They could barely get the saddle on 'em and that's usually a bad sign, but he sure ran well," Summers said.

Sent off as the 3-2 favorite, Last Don B. paid \$5 to win, 4.60 to place and \$3.40 to show. Gold Medley went off at 20-1 and paid \$24.80 and \$12.60. Jack Wilson paid \$4.20.

Total attendance was 5,153, with total handle, \$530,658.

## Deceptively demolishes competition in Thursday's Rainbow trials

Deceptively took another step forward in her quest to win the Quarter Horse Triple Crown Thursday when she posted the fastest qualifying time in the Rainbow Futurity trials.

The 10 fastest horses in Thursday's trials advance to the July 13 finals for the Grade I, \$230,000 Rainbow Futurity.

The Rainbow Futurity is the second leg of the Quarter Horse Triple Crown for 2-year-old quarter horses.

Deceptively and Yoakum already won the first leg, the Kansas Futurity on May 24. The All Amer-

ican Futurity on September 7 is the final leg.

Deceptively and jockey Jerry Yoakum devastated their competition by winning their trial by more than three lengths while posting a time of 19.48 seconds for the 400 yards.

Trained by Bruce Bell, Deceptively could do no wrong in the running of the 14th race. The bay filly behaved like a lady in the paddock, stood perfect in the gate, and broke on top leaving the gate and never looked back.

"She was running so hard that I wanted to stand up and pull her

back," Yoakum said following the race. "But you just can't do that in a trial 'cause you never know for sure how fast you're going."

Deceptively did have the advantage of a tail wind, not that she needed it. Yoakum never uncoiled his whip.

Four other horses, however, benefited from the tail wind with each making it into the finals.

Owned by Roger Knight Jr. of Madisonville, Texas, Deceptively went off as the 1/1 favorite and paid a meager \$2.20 to win \$2.10 to place and \$2.10 to show. Finishing second behind Deceptively was Mr

Webster and J.R. Valenzuela who posted second-the fastest time of the day, 19.79 seconds.

Deceptively's overwhelming performance overshadowed the fact that trainer Jack Brooks qualified four of the 10 finalists including Mr Eye Opener who posted the third fastest time, 19.83 seconds. Brooks started 20 horses in the trials and won five races. Brooks' qualifiers were Mr Eye Opener, Dash Through Traffic, It Aint No Bull and Choculo.

"I feel good about my day," Brooks said. "When ever you qualify that many you have to feel

good. Brooks was more than pleased with Mr Eye Opener's performance. "He ran one heck of a race considering he stumbled leaving the gate," Brooks said.

The qualifiers for the Rich Rainbow Futurity, in order of qualifying time, are: Deceptively, 19.48; Mr Webster, 19.79; Mr Eye Opener, 19.83; Time Bender, 19.87; Dash Through Traffic, 19.89; Speed I Zevi, 19.94; It Aint No Bull, 19.97; Choculo, 19.97; Miss Bunny Bullion, 19.97; Lady Bugs Gypsy, 19.97.

Total attendance was 3,358, with total handle, \$468,800.

## Organ Mt. Man is two for two after heart-stopper feature race on Friday at Ruidoso Downs

Organ Mt. Man almost gave his owner and trainer "heart attacks" in Friday's feature race, but the colt was forgiven after winning the 5 1/2-furlong race at Ruidoso Downs. It was the Organ Mt. Man's second race in his lifetime and his second

win. A longshot, Organ Mt. Man and jockey Vickie Smallwood won the 10th race the hard way. The pair broke from the gate slow, trailed the field down the backstretch and circled the field seven horses wide

in the turn for home to win in a rush.

"When they turned for home I didn't think there was any hope at all," said Simon Buechler, who trains the colt for Mike Weatherly of Las Cruces. "We knew he could

run on the end, but we didn't expect a move like that."

Organ Mt. Man ran down Lucky Lubbock in the final strides to win the race by about one length in 1:06.2.

"It had been a long time between races and I really didn't expect a move like that."

The favorite, Silver Cinders, looked like she would win the race moving into the stretch, but she tired and finished fourth.

Organ Mt. Man paid \$17.20 to win, \$8.20 to place and \$5.60 to show. Lucky Lubbock paid \$12.40 and \$5. Eagle Style was third and paid \$5.20.

Total attendance Friday was 3,080, with total handle, \$320,657.



## There's plenty of gold left in these hills

The shiny new yellow mining bus dropped off a full load of smiling faces that just returned from the Nogal-Bonito mining districts with a bit of new found gold in their pockets.

"Over 90 percent of the people we take out, come back with gold," said Gene Turner, president of the Lincoln County Gold Mining Company.

Turner has been mining for several years before he started his new venture. He said some streams haven't been worked in decades, so the buildup of gold in streams and in the dry river bed rock is substantial at this time.

Turner's gold panning trip starts at the gold bus terminal just east of the downtown area.

For 15 bucks, Turner's bus will take you to the gold fields, supply you with pans, classifiers, vials and furnish an instructor to help you pan properly.

The bus leaves twice a day, 8 a.m. and 1 p.m., for two four hour tours, seven days a week.

Turner said miners can bring a lunch if they want and old shoes are suggested for wading in the stream. He will rent rubber boots and the gold bus stops at an old fashioned grocery store on the way for provisions.

And if a day in the mountain fresh air, panning for gold, gives you a fever for bigger and better claims, Turner has equipment from pans to dredges to dry washers.

Turner is the authorized dealer in New Mexico for Keene and Gold King Mining Equipment.

For a gold panning trip or any of your gold mining needs, miners can call Turner at 257-4070.

For tourists new to the area and unfamiliar with the areas past gold explorations, Turner has written a brief history.

The glitter of gold has drawn prospectors and adventurers to Lincoln County for more than 100 years.

In the "old days" (before 1865) the whole area from Sierra Blanca to the Jicarillas was known as the Sierra Blanca Region. Today the area is divided into several districts.

The Nogal District lies northwest of Ruidoso and is overlooked by Nogal Peak, which rises to a height of 9,983 feet above sea level.

Many early prospectors lost their lives in search of the "yellow metal." The first authentic discovery of gold was in 1865 on a dry gulch, which heads above the American and the Helen Rae Mines.

The Helen Rae Mine, one of the most profitable mines in the area, was discovered in 1880. John Rae, the owner, mined \$100 to \$300 per day! And in one instance, a single pan of ore yielded \$1,100 in gold!

Over the divide from Nogal toward the south a few miles is the Bonito Mining District. Near the divide which separates the two districts, you are able to view old workings, presumably done by the Spanish. The rock formations in this area are the same as in the Nogal District. The most noted mines in the Bonito District are the old Parsons and the Maude Mines.

Among the early prospectors of the Bonito district were R.C. Par-

sons, Ed Beard and Col. G.W. Prichard.

The Eagle Creek and Rio Ruidoso district has had little or no production. The area was first prospected in 1885 by John C. Hightower, Charles Berg, Capt. Breyell and John A. Holder.

The White Oaks district is perhaps the best known of the area. In 1879 a rich discovery was made on Baxter Mountain.

Three men: George Wilson, Jack Winters, and George Baxter were eating dinner when Wilson took his lunch and walked up the side of Baxter Mountain. With his pick, he chipped a piece of rock, and found that it contained gold. This was to become the North Home-state, which was the first lode location in White Oaks.

Wilson sold his rights to Jack Winter for \$40, a horse and a bottle of whiskey.

It is said that in two days the mine yielded \$35,000.

During the winter of 1879, the most famous mine of White Oaks was discovered, the Old Abe. The main vein was found in 1890 in the first 35 feet the ore average was 30.50 a ton.

With a total depth of 1,375 feet, the Old Abe is the deepest mine in New Mexico. Almost no water has been found and it is said to be the deepest dry mine in the world. By the year 1904 the production was more than \$875,000.


The Jicarilla mine district is located 10 miles northeast of White Oaks. Ancho Peak is the highest peak in this district.

Placer mining was done as early as 1850 by native Mexicans. It was not until 1880 that a large number of prospectors appeared.

## Johnny Rodriguez to perform here

Johnny Rodriguez, whose country-western recordings have earned him recognition, awards and gold records, will perform at the Brass Horse Barn in Ruidoso on Thursday, July 2.

Rodriguez will sing at 10 p.m., but the fun will begin much earlier when the house band, the Hatch Brothers, takes to the stage at 8 p.m. Thursday.

Tickets, \$10 advance and \$12 at the door, are available now at the Brass Horse Barn and at the Four Seasons Mall.

The Brass Horse Barn has the biggest dance floor this side of Dallas, Texas, and the remodeled but still "country" club also has plenty of pool tables upstairs.

Rodriguez is the first of what has been billed as a top lineup of headliners to perform at the new

Brass Horse Barn in the old Barn on U.S. Highway 70 west.

Rodriguez is best known for his topselling recordings that include "You Always Come Back to Hurting Me," "Pass Me By" and "That's the Way Love Goes." Those three hits, as well as "We Believe in Happy Endings," have been revived by other artists in the last few years.

Music has always been a driving force in the life of Juan Raul Davis Rodriguez, born ninth in a family of 10 children. Rodriguez, known simply as Johnny in his professional career, grew up in a four-room house in Sabinal, Texas, a small town about 90 miles from the Mexican border and 60 miles west of San Antonio, Texas.

"My parents favored Latin music; my brothers preferred country; and My friends were into rock

and roll," says Rodriguez in his biography. "But, I loved it all!"

Juan, or Johnny, became the first Mexican American to achieve international stardom without having to change his name.

The young Rodriguez was a good student and an all-star athlete in high school, as well as an altar boy at his church. But his life didn't continue on that straight path that was rocked by the loss of his father to cancer and his older brother in a tragic accident during the same year.

"Success kind of found him — it found him in jail at age 18. Johnny saw the wrong side of the jail bars before his 18th birthday. Oddly enough, it was being in jail that gave him his first big break."

Rodriguez, who says he took the rap for his friends when they were

caught stealing and barbecuing a goat, spent four years in jail.

His jailhouse singing enthralled his arrester, Texas Ranger Joaquin Jackson, who told a "wild West Town" promoter about Rodriguez. The promoter hired Johnny to perform as a cowboy to wrangle horses, do gunfight skits and sing.

It was while singing at alamo village Park that Rodriguez was discovered by country music artists Tom T. Hall and Bobby Bare.

Hall encouraged Rodriguez to give Nashville a try, so, guitar in hand and \$14 in his pocket, the 20-year-old Texan made his way to Tennessee.

The doors will open at 4 p.m. Thursday at the Brass Horse Barn, and the band will tune up at 8 p.m. with Rodriguez to begin his lively musical show at 10 p.m.

able to get the job done.

Andrews' recollections, some police say, were embellished with bravado and faulty memory, that he wasn't there during the heat of battle.

Councilors, often timid when discussing the sensitive biker issue in front of their fellow member, also are aware that the rally carries mixed reviews with various businessmen in town.

Councilor Jerry Shaw recently asked if Andrews might pay a portion of the extra security needed for his event.

Andrews did not say he would pay, but said he would consider it if promoters of two other events, requiring primarily traffic control, also paid.

In the past, Andrews has suc-

cessfully lobbied the council to eliminate a protective \$5,000 bond requirement for events.

Swenor is also expected to speak on gang activities in the school system.

## PUBLIC HEARING

Ordinance 92-15 relating to Lodgers and Occupancy Tax will be acted upon by the council.

The ordinance contains the changes required by legislation adopted earlier this year, including:

-Mandatory annual random audits as reflected in proposed subsections A and C of Section 7-4-8.1.

-Minimum penalty of \$100 on delinquent taxes.

-Requiring payment of all lodgers taxes due when there is a judicial sale of the property involved.

-Mandatory criminal sanctions for failure to pay tax.

## REGULAR ITEMS

Karen Kopp, new executive director, will formally request funding from the village for the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County (EDCLC) for fiscal 1992-93.

The village has set aside \$34,000 for EDCLC.

The village planning commission recommended approval of the site development plans for the Ruidoso Gymnastics Association with the following conditions:

1. That parking be increased to 44 spaces with one acre reserved for future parking as needed.

2. That terms and conditions of lease agreement be determined by village council.

3. That financial guarantees for development be determined by vil-

lage council.

Village planner Cleatus Richards said information regarding site grading is to be made available and interior layout should also be available for discussion.

The village will discuss a working agreement with the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce that represents, for the most part, a renewal of the existing agreement.

The council will discuss a revised agreement with United Helicopter. The council will consider the following changes:

-Limit of \$400 per year on the rental.

-Limit of rental changes upon renegotiation to changes in consumer price index.

-Clarification of lessee's right to remove the building upon expiration or termination of lease.

## WIPE THE SLATE CLEAN

Past utility accounts totaling \$52,834.74 may be written off Tuesday night by the council.

Neither a certified letter notifying the owner of a filing of lien against the property, nor a professional collector has been able to collect from the nearly 125 accounts.

The accounts range from five to 1 years old. Most delinquent accounts are prior to 1986.

Village manager Ron Wicker notes accounts prior to 1986, may have been incurred by tenants after letters of non-responsibility by owners.

In other cases, the properties were sold to bona fide purchasers. Because of these possibilities, and because of potential other risks in filing liens on accounts this old, the filing of liens is not an option, according to Wicker.

## CONSENT REGULAR ITEMS

The council will initiate its plan to save time by presenting the first set of consent regular items. These items, considered approvable, will be discussed and grouped for a single vote.

1. Agreement renewal with MainStreet Ruidoso, Inc.

2. Fourth addendum to agreement with the chamber of commerce.

3. Agreement with Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority.

4. Agreement with the village of Ruidoso Downs for adult detention services.

5. Agreement with the counseling center for funding.

6. Approval of line-item budget changes policy.

The council will adjourn to a closed session to discuss the acquisition or disposal of real property by the village.

### Hail to the Chief!


Ruidoso Police Chief Richard Swenor deserves a gold medal!

A second call was made for addition assistance by on-scene officers, and instantaneously, as if by magic, an influx of highly trained personnel, to include EMS, firemen, law enforcement officers from other agencies, and community citizens, appeared.

All these individuals worked as a finely trained unit, to help these children.

In my 12 years with the Ruidoso Police Department, this was not the first time I've witnessed this "total cooperation" between our public safety agencies and citizens, but this was, without a doubt, one of our best efforts and my heart-felt thanks to each and everyone for your caring!

### BLM land exchange is chance in a lifetime

#### TO THE EDITOR:

We the people of Lincoln speak out to those who are opposing a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to save our heritage through the proposed Rio Bonito land exchange. Those opposing this action say the following:

1. All of Lincoln is against the exchange: On the contrary a good majority of the people in Lincoln support the exchange. The Lincoln Historic Preservation Board has gone on record publicly supporting the exchange.
2. No tax money will be generated on the proposed parcel: On the contrary Lincoln is recognized as one of the best preserved frontier village environments in the southwest and the center of Billy the Kid country. Tourism is on a steady increase, yielding taxes for food, services, goods and overnight accommodations.
3. This exchange places more private land in the federal government's ownership: On the contrary

36,718.88 acres in trade minus 1,115.06 acres to the BLM in the Rio Bonito valley gives private ownership plus 35,000 acres.

4. Our water rights in this valley will be taken away: On the contrary the EA states no such plan.
5. Land and property in the Lincoln area will be condemned and taken over by the government: On the contrary land and property, if anything, will increase in value and continue to be one of the greatest assets for its citizens. Lincoln, including a five mile strip on either side of the village, is a National Historic Landmark.
6. The BLM never allowed public input: On the contrary the BLM met twice in Lincoln at a publicly announced meeting asking for input. As a result of those meetings they changed their proposals from maximum public use to low usage with a riparian area.
7. The BLM went after this land for their use: On the contrary the BLM was approached by a private land corporation with the proposal.

8. There has been no consideration for the Historic and Cultural integrity of this valley: On the contrary BLM listened to Lincoln's input changing its initial plans to a proposal of minimal impact because Lincolnites saw open space as an integral part of the historic and cultural value in this valley.

9. You can control growth and development through your zoning ordinance: On the contrary since the Lincoln Historic Preservation Board is appointed by the county commissioners, is it always wise to count on only one entity or political group?

10. The BLM will not maintain the land: On the contrary more concentrated BLM lands will make maintenance more efficient. At the public meeting a volunteer corp of citizens was proposed by the Lincolnite. Lincoln is a well kept, refuse free community and takes pride in its surroundings.

11. New endangered species will be introduced: On the contrary the EA states no such plans.

12. Acquisition by the BLM takes opportunities for hunting away: On the contrary laws prohibit hunting in most of the historically zoned area, due to housing and population density.

13. The valley will be inundated with people: On the contrary the EA states usage to be of minimal impact. There are no such plans for large stated at a public meeting that they will abide by our historically zoned ordinance.

14. The government is taking away our rights as private citizens: On the contrary the County Commissioners are asking that a private citizens rights in a land transaction be questioned.

15. If the BLM proposes little change there's no point in having an exchange: On the contrary preservation of green open space is part of the historic and cultural aspect of this very special Rio Bonito valley and Historic Lincoln.
