Opening day nears for civic center

Opening day for the massive Ruidoso Civic Events Center (CEC) is just around the corner and some big wrinkles need to be ironed out, according to village officials.

While planning and zoning director Cleatus Richards is concerned about the final touches and landscaping the common area, CEC director Kathleen Michelena's problems are just beginning.

"In all probability, we won't have

all our furnishing needs for several of the upcoming events," Michelena said. "Those improvements are tied to Department of Finance Administration (DFA) money and they won't let us go out for bids until July 28."

Village manager Ron Wicker made the village council aware of Michelena's dilemma at last Tuesday's regular meeting.

Mayor Victor Alonso, in a show of support, said he could live with any problems at this time.

One of those problems stems from the cancellation of the hotel. In last year's planning, the council had discussed a warming kitchen for the new center.

Plans called for the hotel's kitchen to be located near the warming kitchen as a convenience to the hotel.

Councilor Al Junge held lengthy discussions at the time about installing proper ventilation for a hood in case the village wanted to expand the kitchen.

When hotel plans were canceled, plans for the warming kitchen were upped to a costly full kitchen.

"Most people don't know that furnishings purchased through DFA money also include the kitchen improvements," Michelena said.

In addition to tables, chairs and desks, furnishings include a walk-in refrigerator-freezer, two heavy duty gas ranges, a stack oven, exhaust hood, grease trap, commercial grade dishwasher, warming trays, a reach-in refrigerator, a

reach-in freezer and two commercial microwave ovens.

Michelena asked how she could possibly furnish the CEC on such a small budget.

She indicated some furniture, like chairs and desks, would probably be borrowed from village hall.

Audio visual equipment will have to be contracted from request for proposals, she said. The rest will have to wait until after July 28, according to the DFA's require-

ments.

Events using the facility during August will reap special benefits with free rent, according to Michelena.

"Those events will enjoy a rental break while we work toward smoothing out the operation," Michelena said. "It's going to take some time to get the center furnished the way it's supposed to be," Michelena said. "No one is more anxious for that time to come, than I am."

MainStreet searches for an assistant project director

The search for an assistant project director for MainStreet is under way. The group is looking for someone to help with the day-to-day operations of the project.

The job description for the two positions at the Ruidoso office are fairly similar, but the person will work from one

of the offices, he said. Deyo said he has asked for recommendations to make the list of potential candidates. She had to be a MainStreet board member and have a strong background in project management.

The group is advertising the opening two times in The Ruidoso News and had set August 1 as a deadline. See MainStreet, page 2A.

LCMC board plans for hospital mill levy vote

Making the rounds of service clubs and organizations, Lincoln County Medical Center administrator Valerie Miller and other officials are informing everyone they can about the hospital mill levy that supports the hospital and its clinics.

Miller told the hospital board at

a meeting Thursday that she has probably talked to more than 100 people already in July about the mill levy and the special election in September for its continuation. She also gave the group a copy of meetings she or other hospital officials are planning to attend the rest of July and August.

The presentation to a group and answering questions takes about 45

minutes, Miller said. It is hard to get it all said in a short period of time in a meeting and not leave anything important out, she said.

Board president Dub Williams, who has also made presentations to ask for support, told board members to look at the schedule and see if any meetings are planned for their area because it is important to them. Please see LCMC, page 2A.

Streetscape to change the face of Midtown

Final plans for the MainStreet Ruidoso streetscape improvements have been submitted to the state highway department, but Ruidoso residents can take a look at them at the village hall.

MainStreet project director Mary Maul reported at a board meeting Thursday the construction phase one will cost about \$600,000, not including contingencies. The group should be able to pay for the amount it has to spend. Adding in the extra costs it will have to pay, the amount will be about \$1 million, which the group has earned from state and federal grants. The amount does not include the group's property tax share.

The group will receive about \$1 million from state and federal grants. The construction management contract is about \$100,000 and three.

Phase one covers the area from First Street and Country Club Road and will include widened sidewalks, handicap access and

designated crosswalks among other improvements. One copy of the plans is at village hall with Cleatus Richards and people may stop there to look at them. They may also call the MainStreet office to come look at the plans.

Maul said they were a little bit behind schedule with the plans, but there shouldn't be a problem because the state highway department has put them on the fast track. She has been in contact with highway officials since the beginning of this project about two years ago and has kept them informed on changes. The plans should be approved by the department in six to eight weeks, she said.

Maul said she also gave an update on the improvement plans to the village council Tuesday night and got an unexpected question. One of the councilors asked about restrooms. Maul told the councilors that the group had looked into restrooms in the past and found two possible sites, but they weren't part of the streetscape improvement. The cost for building the

restrooms would be almost \$60,000, and as something MainStreet couldn't do alone, she said.

The MainStreet board of directors will back that up with a letter to the mayor and councilors. Board president Aiden Deyo said the letter will essentially state that MainStreet is willing to help the village on its plans to eventually have public restrooms.

MainStreet's village councilor J.D. Deyo said that the mayor and councilors should understand the problems with building and constructing public restrooms. They are also aware of whom the two projects should be done by, he said.

Funds to begin construction on the first phase of the streetscape project would be available after the first of October. The group should then be ready to start building restrooms.

Although the streetscape project has been at the top of the village priorities for the past two years, it hasn't been the only project. Please see Streetscape, page 2A.

Joe Hayhurst to name trustee in special meeting Tuesday

A new trustee will be selected for the village of Ruidoso Downs board of trustees at 7 p.m. Tuesday night at the city hall.

After the resignation of trustee Ray Fredrickson before a regular board meeting Monday night, Mayor Joe Hayhurst said he would place a suggestion box at the village hall for people to nominate a new board member. Fredrickson had two years left of his term, but said he thought the village was not being run by the people. The mayor thanked him for his two years of service and accepted the resignation.

Hayhurst will appoint a person for the remaining three trustees to vote on. The trustees are Jackie Branum, Charlotte Craig and Judy Miller.

County garbage authority is shopping for a new attorney

The Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority will meet at 1:30 p.m. today (Monday) July 20, in the recycling center at 222 Second Street in Ruidoso Downs.

On the agenda is a request for professional services of an attorney to represent the authority.

J. Robert Beauvais has been fulfilling that function as attorney for the county and three of the member municipalities. He suggested last month that it's time for the authority to open the position for proposals from other firms that may be interested.

Authority manager Gene Green is scheduled to give a financial report, expected to cover in more detail what's been happening with the agency in the last few months.

Green also will report on a joint power agreement for solid waste among Otero County and its municipalities.

Water training offered here by state environmentalists

The New Mexico Rural Water Association is planning a training session in Ruidoso this week, that will include discussion on lead and copper testing.

The session will be from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Thursday at the Ruidoso Inn. The program is designed for water system managers, operators or board members, but also for anyone who would like to be educated on water problems. The event is free of charge and people may register at 8 a.m.

New Mexico Environment Department regional officer Jim Edwards will be speaking at 1 p.m. about the lead and copper testing that may be required for all water systems within the next year. The testing has been mandated by the Environmental Protection Agency along with about 80 other substances. Each village will be required to take a certain number of samples and to do treatment, which could be costly to users.

Also to be discussed are lead and copper corrosion and vulnerability studies, which can be done as a replacement for some of the testings. The state has requested a delay in implementing the testings until a less costly way can be found.

Heartworm screening could save dog's life, owner's cash

Mosquitoes in Ruidoso? Not many or for very long. That's still no guarantee a dog hasn't picked up a heartworm from the penetrating bite of a female mosquito.

Once a dog is infected, if the condition is not treated, it can result in death after doing serious damage to the heart, lungs and other vital organs.

In a dog's heart, the worms can grow to as long as 14-inches, said Dr. Earl R. Leslie, Mountain View Clinic veterinarian.

Leslie is offering reduced fee heartworm screening from 3 to 8 p.m. Thursday, July 30, at his clinic at 665 Sudderth Drive.

The regular charge is \$12 for the screening. The charge Thursday will be \$8.

It doesn't matter whether a dog is an inside or outdoor pet, Leslie said.

"The female mosquito is very tiny and easily can slip through cracks around windows, door or screens," he said. "No breed of dog is immune to the condition. One bite from an infected mosquito is all it takes for a dog to become infected with the parasite."

"The only way to know whether your dog is infected is to have your dog tested. If your dog gets heartworm disease, treatment can be dangerous for him and expensive for you. Once tested and you know that your dog is free of heartworms, prevention is easy and convenient."

deadline for people to send in resumes. The advertisement states they are looking for someone with education or skills in areas such as public relations, community planning, business administration, architecture and historic preservation.

A consultant committee of Line, Bill Carrigan and Tom Rigsby will meet with Maul to negotiate her salary so the group will know what it has available in funds to offer the office administrator. A selection committee of Carrigan, Audean Franklin, Herb Brunell and J.D. James will then review applicants and make a selection for the position.

Deyo said he would anticipate giving a recommendation to the

board at the meeting in August but would have to wait to see when that person could begin work.

In other business Maul said MainStreet is working with the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County, the Chamber of Commerce and Eastern New Mexico University to offer courses for the business community. She said ENMU approached her to ask if they would like to help, but she thought it would be good if all the groups could pull together to offer these.

One of the courses MainStreet may help with is a seminar on the Americans with Disabilities Act, because the national MainStreet Center has a consultant who makes these presentations. Other courses will cover writing a small business plan, using a business plan and customer services and retail plans

among others.

Some of the courses are just one night, while others are part of a series that will be for four weeks. The classes will be this fall, but the cost has not yet been determined on each of them. Helping provide the courses will not cost MainStreet, Maul said.

"It is exciting that we can offer these to business people," she said.

Also in the spirit of cooperation, Deyo asked the board members if they would like to have a member of the Chamber of Commerce serve as a liaison on the MainStreet board. He said the chamber is getting more and more involved and MainStreet needs to maintain close contact with the group.

MainStreet does not currently have a liaison serving on the chamber board, but Maul had for two years until several people were

serving on both. Vice president Carrigan said he had been contacted by the chamber several weeks ago and asked to serve on chamber, but he said he didn't have time.

Rigsby, who is a chamber director, said chamber president Paul Crown can appoint five ex-officio members and had wanted to have a member from MainStreet. He said he hasn't talked to Crown lately but Crown wanted to work closer with MainStreet.

Deyo will write a letter to the chamber asking for a liaison member.

He also up-dated the board members on the down town directories. Directors Jacqueline Bentley and Herb Brunell have been working on it and have a lay-out ready. He said it may be about to contact Ruidoso Printing about printing it.

have them there to support the speaker.

LCMC has been receiving 3.25 mills from the county levy for the past eight years, while the Carrizozo and Corona clinics received one mill. The special election will be to get voters' approval to continue at this amount, but with some of the money going to a newly established Hondo clinic.

Lincoln County Television and On-Track have donated time for television advertising, and the group is also planning to do radio spots and advertising in the newspaper, Miller said. She and Williams have also made appearances on a local television talk show and have been invited to speak again. She said the plan is to do some advertising now and then pull back until the last couple weeks of August.

Miller said she has not heard any negative comments, but that does not mean they are not out there. She said if any board members hear of any negative concerns a person has, they should direct the person to her if they can't answer it themselves. As she talks to groups and gets their support, the individuals then let others know about the levy too.

Emeritus member Ruth McGuire said people have commented to her that they were glad the issue is in a special election by itself. The board was originally denied permission from the Lincoln County Commissioners to have a special election, but on a second request they agreed to it. The election is being paid for through a general fund at Presbyterian Healthcare Services, which LCMC is an affiliate.

Miller said she has had trouble getting access to a few groups but will continue to try to get in contact with them.

"They may think this is a political issue and it is not political. It is an economic issue for the county," Miller said.

Things are going well, she said, and an updated brochure on the hospital should be out soon. A mill

levy committee, made of individuals from across the entire county, has been meeting to help with the strategy. At the committee's next meeting, Miller said they plan to discuss a phone system to call and remind people to vote. They may also want to do a dial-a-ride system to make sure people have transportation to the polls. She encouraged board members to also use the phone later in August to remind friends of the issue and to vote.

The hospital board does not traditionally meet in August, but emeritus member Dr. Don Simms suggested because it is only one month before the election they should go ahead and meet. Williams agreed that if they didn't meet they may wish they had when it comes down to election day. The group decided to meet with the mill levy committee, but not cover any of the regular monthly items.

Also concerning the mill levy, Miller said county treasurer Janice Ware notified her that the county had been audited by the state and there was a question about whether the interest should go back into the mill levy fund or the general fund. Miller said they currently have a law firm investigating it. If they find it should go into the mill levy, it will start from that day, she said.

"This is really not a big deal. If they find it should go into the mill levy, it will go in from then on. If not, nothing happens," she said. Not much was happening at the hospital during the first part of June, which resulted in a net loss of \$59,000 for the month even though activity picked up at the end. Miller said the loss was in part because of the low volume the first few weeks but also because of a pay raise for employees. She said they were not able to get a cost impact from past years and underestimated the cost for June. The loss and pay raises also covered the Carrizozo Health Center.

Although this puts the hospital behind budget by \$83,000 for the year, Miller said she is not overly concerned because they have had a booming business since the middle of June. The number of patients

have been in the high teens to 20s during most of that time. She said this is the most number of days in a row that the volume has been that high.

The Carrizozo Health Center lost \$15,982 this month, but part of this deficit was because of a couple of one-time items, such as fees, and the pay raise. Miller said the center's volume has also decreased to less than it has been for several months.

"I have learned not to panic over one month if we can show a strong recovery. It isn't an issue of lost patients, there are just lower numbers of people in town. The numbers at the track are also down. As the weather has improved the visitors have picked up too," Miller said.

Also in the administrator's report Miller told the board members about House bill 441 concerning Medicaid. The bill calls for a contribution from the county and the county would then receive a two-thirds match from the state. The plan will be to expand service to women and children, she said.

The bill would not impact the \$1 million in free care given at LCMC because the people who receive the care do not fit the requirements, Miller said. Most of the people who get the care are working two to three jobs just to have food, but then they make too much money to be eligible, she said.

Revising the payment schedule for Medicaid is also planned, but this won't help the hospital either, Miller said. She said if the payments are improved it could help the individual physicians and the pharmacists, but it wouldn't help the Ruidoso Base Center.

Miller said Lincoln is a unique county because it only has a mill levy to support the hospital, while others have taxes or indigent funds too. Whether the county could take the match out of the mill levy is still a question, but they may have no alternative, she said.

"I wish I could be more definite about the bill, but I can't right now because it is so complex," she said.

In other business the MedNet telelink from Texas Tech is up and

running, through the generosity of the hospital auxiliary, Miller said. They first had problems with the satellite receiving and are now working the bugs out of the program. The link offers courses for people in every area at the hospital, except engineering and housekeeping, and earns them one hour of credit in continuing education, she said. Because of the problems earlier in the session, the hospital has bought the tapes of past lectures so the students don't miss anything.

Ace Hardware installed the satellite, but specialists from Tech will be coming to Ruidoso to see if they can fix the problem, Miller said. Without the link, hospital employees would have to go out of town to get the courses and continue their education or renew certifications.

Miller also gave board members a copy of a strategic plan from the past year for them to review before discussing it at a future meeting. She said the bottom line analysis is that the revenues over deficits continue to go in the right direction, in part because of more out-patient activity. Director of nursing Julie Duffalo will begin working on the plan for next year soon, and members of the board who would like to assist may let Miller know. She plans to involve the board, the auxiliary, the staff and the medical personnel in creating it.

Miller said it was easy to come up with the first strategic plan because the problems were obvious. Looking for exact problem areas will be harder for this plan, she said.

In the hospital auxiliary report, president Inez Tanner said they have gotten a number of new outstanding members who have put in a lot of work. She said new officers will be installed at a meeting the first of September with Betsy King, the president elect for the state organization, presiding.

In the medical staff report the board approved credentialing for Dr. Paul Gulbas, ophthalmologist; Dr. Deborah Hewitt, obstetrician; and Dr. Jack Ramsey, Dr. Clare Colombo and Dr. Joseph Frerkes as consulting radiologists.

project on the agenda. The directors reviewed a program of their outline for 1992-1993 that included two annual promotions, the Halloween party and the Community Update luncheon.

Deyo suggested they may want to change the update to a spring event since the two events are so close together. The update is on November 1, and activities for Halloween usually last into the evening on October 31.

Director Don Dutton said he prefers the update at the time it is because it is at the end of the calendar year. He said he sees them as two distinctly different activities, and they do the work to get speakers for the update well in advance. He suggested the group keep the event at about the same time, but maybe a week later, without running into Thanksgiving.

Deyo said he was also concerned that Maul has taken the burden of arranging these events. Maul said they may be able to improve the situation by having the costume contest earlier in the day, instead of at 6:30 p.m. She said last year's Bizarre Bazaar had to be moved because of snow but a lot of kids still

came to it.

The community update is sponsored by The Ruidoso News and Deyo will be contacting them to be sure a new date will be OK.

Also on the program of work for the new year will be a continuing membership drive, coffees, updating by-laws, newsletters and establishing block captains throughout the village. Also under the concept of organization they would like to get a new accounting software program for the office. Director Tom Rigsby, with Dan Austin and Bert Brunell, will head a committee to do this.

Director Audean Franklin said she would like to see the group do a Christmas party and possibly a summer festival of down town, like during the Fourth of July. Director Madeline Shackelford said the plaza her shop is in did get together and have one of its own.

Deyo said the reason they have stayed away from too many promotional activities is that some are not allowed under the group's 501(c)3 non-profit status. He said they are in the advanced ruling period under the Internal Revenue Service until April, and things may loosen up after that.

Dutton said the group may want

to work with the All-American Festival to put something together for the downtown. He said Lara Johnson, the director of the program, is putting together a month of activities, culminating with the All-American race at the track. The All-American is currently trying to form its own 501(c)3 organization to be able to do this, Dutton said.

Maul said a couple years ago they did a coloring contest for children. She said it is hard to get business people to volunteer for activities during this time because it is so busy.

Deyo said at the next meeting in August they will be appointing committees to try to organize these different events. People can be thinking about what committee they would like to help with in the upcoming year.

Another project the group will keep its eyes on this year is the River Trail system. Maul said the village has started the process of getting easements along the trail. She said Councilor Bill Karn had sent out letters to property owners along the proposed trail. If the owners had any questions they were to contact Maul or engineer John Shaw.



Maul said she has talked to a

few owners, but she can't really tell them what can or can't be done. One property owner has already said no, but in that case they could either go on the other side of the river or do a condemnation of property. Another property owner has asked for other concessions in return, she said.

Dutton said he has been approached by some business people who would like to foot the bill of implementing the program, but they would need a commitment by the village to follow through on this project. Maul said they could also apply for grants through the Soil and Land Conservation Service that could pay for about 80 percent.

Deyo said they need to keep this in the program of work, but MainStreet's precise involvement at this time is limited. Where the project will go after the easements is hard to tell, he said.

The group will also continue with an on-going membership drive that started late last month. Maul created a list of potential new members for directors to make calls on to encourage them to join. Deyo said memberships are a continuing effort and they need to keep the momentum going to add members through the summer.

Kentucky Fried Chicken has always been finger lickin' good, but it has never been more popular than in Ruidoso's pilot KFC program.

It's simply the best bargain in Ruidoso.

All the famous chicken you can eat for \$4.19 is packing residents and tourists in the small franchise dining area off Sudderth Drive near the "Y."

Just about as popular as the chicken are the cobblers. Huge platters of peach, cherry and blackberry cobblers disappear as fast as a breast, wing or thigh.

No artificially dyed red cherries

or scant fruit here. These cobblers are loaded with fruit, fresh as farm picked yesterday and as hot as grandma used to serve. It may be years before you find another place that will sell this good of cobbler.

Hot dishes other than chicken, include hominy, green beans, corn, mashed potatoes and milk or brown gravy, okra, mixed greens, gizzards and livers.

Cold dishes include puddings, potato salad, three bean salad, that famous Cole slaw, and bowls of fresh lettuce with all the stuff you like to put on salads.

Then there's hot rolls and cold drinks with free refills.

That's just a sampling of a few

dishes. In this case, there really is much, much more.

A word of caution, the earlier you can arrive to eat before noon, the better the chance for good seating. The good word is spreading fast and the busy dinner hour is spreading with the word.

It's the same great menu in the evening for a buck more.

Owner Joe Farr said the buffet line is the first for a KFC in New Mexico, but it has enjoyed a two-year successful track record in Arkansas.

Farr owns five KFC stores — Alamogordo, Hobbs, Carlsbad, Clovis and Ruidoso. He said he is thinking of introducing the popular

buffet in Alamogordo this fall.

"It's the best thing we've ever done for our business here," he said.

Farr is cautious about all of his newfound success and said he particularly is aware that a restaurant has to be concerned about off seasons.

"We will need to level out," he said. "We always do real well, like many businesses in Ruidoso, in the summer and then feast or famine for the rest of the year. We just hope this will keep the locals coming in on a regular basis. We love the tourist seasons, but we realize we've got to make the Ruidoso residents happy first."

The Zuni features native American treasures

Authentic Native American art is a treasure visitors will find at The Zuni, the newest business at Le Claire's Mountain Village in Midtown.

The shop has an abundance of artistic creations including jewelry, pottery and furniture all made by members of the Zuni pueblo in Northern New Mexico. Owner Linda Kakuska, who is a Zuni, said she opened the shop to let people

know that Zunis are very artistic. "Showing the Zuni is a great opportunity. You just can't beat the artistic work," she said. Much of the work in the shop has been done by Kakuska's family members. She said her mother, Ruby Gchachu, does a lot of the jewelry with the help of sisters, Jeannie and Audrey, who brought new items to the shop from the pueblo for the grand opening on Friday. What hasn't been made by relatives, has been made by friends, former classmates and other acquaintances from the pueblo.

Most of the pieces are signed by the creators which gives them higher value, Kakuska said, and gives buyers assurance that it is authentic. Everything in the shop is strictly Native American and mostly Zuni, but she said they may branch out into pieces done by other pueblos or tribes.

Besides delicately crafted jewelry, the shop has miniature kachinas, stone carvings, a few beaded dolls and pottery. Not only will shoppers at The Zuni find beautiful artwork, but also Kakuska can tell them about the rituals and symbols of the Zuni people. She said when her grandmother use to go out to gather clay for pottery she would always say a blessing for the earth first. The animals, drawings and colors on the pottery also have meanings

that Kakuska can explain so people understand more about the culture.

The newest enterprise for members of the Zuni pueblo is furniture, and Kakuska also has a few of these items on hand. Creators are barely finished with crafting and hand-painting on the designs before the tables, benches, chairs and coffee tables are sold, but orders can be taken for the items.

A few paintings adorn the walls of the shop, and Kakuska said she is planning to get more by Native Americans. One she just received on Friday was by Sam English, a Native American from Albuquerque.

Kakuska also plans to get a workshop set up in the back of the business so they can do minor repairs on jewelry and other things. She said in opening the shop she also wants to educate people on the time, effort and patience required to do each individual piece. She said some times her mother will sit and work on a piece continuously for several weeks before it is completed.

The shop will be a great opportunity for Ruidoso visitors because although there are great shops around the area there is not one place specializing in one field, she said.

"It is an honor to present the artwork the Zunis do," Kakuska said.



Tom and Jerry are two of the many throw-aways at local animal shelter

They're the left-overs. The two brothers came to the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter as what remained from a litter the owner didn't want, but apparently was too negligent to prevent.

Tom and Jerry look alike and both are a bit timid, said shelter manager Randy Basch. "But they eat up any attention that comes their way and they are making rapid progress. They're starting to become inquisitive and would respond to someone willing to give some of their time to the little guys."

A mix of shepherd, hound and labrador, they show no aggressive traits, but would make good alarm

dogs.

"Because they're still timid, they probably would do better with no other dogs in the home," Basch said. "They get along fine with other dogs, but they're intimidated easily."

The brothers have been at the shelter for three weeks and are about six months old. They will need to be neutered.

The society welcomes donations earmarked for spaying and neutering. The contributions may be designated for particular animals at the shelter or in general for spaying or neutering. Such sponsorships greatly improve a dog or cat's chances for adoption, since the procedure is the major cost associated with leaving for a new home. The society requires that all adopted

animals be rendered incapable of reproducing more unwanted offspring that may end up abused, abandoned or killed.

Vacationers or seasonal visitors who miss their own animals or would like to help the shelter, may send in contributions of money or donate their time, which also benefits the animals.

Volunteers are needed to walk the dogs and play with the cats, hand out treats or even pitch in with some cleaning.

Posters homes also are needed to help give young puppies a chance to survive. Although they receive shots for distemper and parvo when they arrive at the shelter, it takes 10 days for the inoculations to take effect. Left at the shelter, the pups often become ill from disease ex-

posure and die.

Poster parents keep the pups for 10 days to two weeks longer (something that Basch seldom is able to convince the owners who bring the pups to do). They then are returned to the shelter with a better chance at life.

Editorial

Elected officials set the community standards

Municipal officials take on a solemn public trust when they are elected to lead. Councilors and the mayor ask for their jobs and they are elected to serve the people, not just themselves.

The mayor says he doesn't expect any special treatment, but he doesn't believe he or his councilors should have to jump through any additional hoops when they're dealing with municipal government (themselves). He says he wants to be treated EXACTLY like everyone else.

But, once a citizen steps into public life by taking on an elected position, that person is no longer just a private individual and his or her dealings are open to scrutiny. The mayor is ALWAYS the mayor, even when he's making enchiladas, and councilors are ALWAYS councilors no matter where they sit.

People have a right to expect even more of elected officials than of other citizens. Their behavior, because they have set themselves apart as leaders, should set the community standard.

That's why it's so important for those elected officials to separate themselves from their own personal interests by declaring a conflict before voting on issues involving their businesses and enterprises. That elected person is the only one who knows of a personal or business conflict, and that's why the burden is on that person to speak up. State law is very clear on that question, and it doesn't take a law school education to read statute 3-10-5. It states that any member of the governing body shall disclose a financial interest or possible interest in the outcome before a vote. The majority of the council has a right to bar that member from voting or the member can voluntarily disqualify himself. Judge Wheeler says violating this state law is a petty misdemeanor carrying a penalty of a \$300 fine and/or six months in jail.

Mayor Alonso says "in seven years I don't guess we've ever had to use that prerogative." If that's true, it's alarming.

It's a sad thing when elected officials have to be reminded to obey state laws.



Policies are too important to be set by mob

TO THE EDITOR:

When the "Great Mysterious Unknown," call it Allah, God, Yaweh, Manitou, providence, nature, or whatever you want, made the animal to come down from the tree, and to walk on its two hind legs thus giving the back bone a mostly vertical bearing, the stage was set for a vast development of the neurocranium and with that of an enlargement of the hind brain, the cerebrum, to an extent unmatched (relatively, of course) by other animals.

It provided the animal with the ability to explore, to invent, to judge, in short to think better than any other animal (relatively speaking, of course.) Together with the enlargement of the neurocranium the jaw region also developed to allow for communications with others of its kind of a higher level and more sophisticated than other animals can (relatively speaking, of course.) Over millenia the animal became Homo erectus and with some further development, in a presumptuous fit, Homo called itself "sapiens" which is Latin and means "wise." one can argue about that. However, it is Homo's curse or blessing, however one wants to merit this ability, to use his brain, to think. If Homo quits thinking he becomes someone else but Homo, and certainly not sapiens.

According to his destiny Homo explored and invented. The progress of this development is termed by archaeologists as Stone Age, bronze Age, Iron Age, etc. But every

time exploration or invention occurred Homo paid for it. He managed to handle the fire. But in doing so he got burned. Primitive weapons and tools provided food and protection but also caused injury. The handling of domesticated animals caused not only injury but also disease. Molten metal alloys caused burns. The invention of the wheel had its victims. Since the beginning, Homo has suffered sickness, injury and death as a consequence of his inventions and explorations. And it is not the invention itself which is to be blamed but rather carelessness and—so sorry—stupidity.

Roughly two hundred years ago Homo invented the energy slave, i.e. instead of enslaving other animals and Homines, he put his mind in gear and enslaved the machine. The daily traffic toll tells us that Homo is still not sapient and pays for it. A cynic may call part of that "natural selection" which is only one half true because the victim is quite often innocently involved.

A slave needs food, energy. The energy slave needs energy, fuel, electricity etc. In the course of applying his cerebral power for the purpose of exterminating his enemy Homo detected the atomic energy and later put it to better use in energy generating power plants. And Homo got burned again. In uranium mines, in plants using or refining the nuclear radiation producing material, in his environ-

ment, at Three Mile Island, at Chernobyl and other sites. All these instances, however, occurred because those in charge violated the very claim nature has imposed on Homo: They failed to think, they acted carelessly.

We are Homo. Biologically, any regression in the application of our brain would cause the extinction of our species as it is. We cannot return to the caves or to the trees. It is unimportant whether we can do well as athletes: Every other animal in its characteristic physical specialty does it better. In opposite: We are compelled by our nature to further invent, explore, better the conditions under which we are living, to increase the range of our knowledge and vision. The cry to restrict the way we live for the sake of conservation (in the sense of prevention from loss) in this context is self destructive. Instead our goal must be to compensate a possible loss through new inventions and methods.

During the past OPEC generated energy shortage everyone was able to see what lack of energy does to our economy and to our way of life. Any oil or coal geologist can reasonably closely predict when there will be no fossil fuel any more available for spaceship Earth. New energy sources have to be employed. Fission (nuclear) energy is at hand. Let's use it. Our future may probably be fusion energy. Thus, everyone has to be educated what these processes are, what

radiation is, what it does to the biogon Homo as well as to his environment. Honestly, not headline producing, but calmly, so that the presently existing hysterical fear is substituted by a necessary deserving respect.

One of the subject matters in this respect which has stirred up the emotions in Lincoln County is the project to store temporary high level radiation nuclear waste on Indian lands. Let us assume that a location could be found on this land, would it do any harm to anybody in Lincoln County? Certainly not. Properly handled, it would not do anything. But it just so happens that the Mescalero Reservation is located to a great extend on the Permian San Andres formation which has numerous faults and is known to contain limestone which is subject to Karst formation. By environmental regulations such area would not even qualify for a landfill. That is the reason why such a project should not be considered for the area. Subjects of atomic/radiation safety and waste storage and disposal must not be decided by opinionated mob movement on the street but by knowledge of experts in the corresponding fields and by weighing coldly the pros and cons. The decision must be based on the involved facts, not on sit-ins.

We must become Homo "sapiens."


