## Better late than never Summer season arrives

The summer tourist season has taken a while to get warmed up, but local attractions and lodgers are expecting August to lead the way into a hot Labor Day.

It hasn't been a great year for Ruidoso Downs Race Track but business has been improving since about the middle of July. As one of the biggest attractions for summer visitors to Ruidoso and the surrounding area the race track has gotten off to a slow start.

Mark Doth, marketing director at the track, said the season, taken on the average, is nearly identical to last year, although by this time last year they had had more race days because they raced on Mondays in July 1991.

Starting on the fourth, July has been the best month so far, which is usual for the track, he said. Doth said the handle at the track is still down by about 6.74 percent from last year. Attendance on week days at the track has been about 2,500-3,000 each day and on Saturday and Sunday it has been about 4,000-5,000 per day.

Doth said there have been several factors that have affected the attendance and the money that people bet this year. Earlier this

season they were going against some of the worst weather they had seen in years, not only here but across New Mexico and Texas. Farmers' crops had been devastated and so had cities, such as Hobbs which was flooded earlier this year.

The per capita for attendance and betting was \$65 on Friday, which was one of the lowest Doth has seen. Whether it is the economy causing people to have a wait-and-see attitude or the fact that it is an election year, Doth said he didn't know.

"People are just not spending as much as they have in the past," he said.

Although he has not done any surveys on it, Doth said the \$4 million Texas has put into the lottery has had an effect on the track. People from Texas are stopping at convenience stores along the way to try their luck with lottery tickets. He said people are also coming to the track one day and then going out to the Inn of the Mountain Gods the next to do video gambling.

"People are splitting their money between lottery or video gaming. We (the track) are getting a smaller piece of the pie," he said.

Doth said he has probably seen more families and younger people

at the track than in the past. He said these visitors aren't as experienced as horse racing, and they don't bet as much. The old money from retired people isn't coming as often either, he said.

The racing industry nationwide has been in a cut-back mode for the past five to 10 years, so there are less horses to go around all of the race tracks, which means fewer trials and smaller fields, Doth said. The indications are that it isn't going to get better right away, he said.

The New Mexico breeding program is in as good a position as it was in the past, but people are seeing shorter fields regardless of where they go, he said.

"There is no easy way to diagnose the situation because there are so many indicators to consider. There is not going to be a quick solution either," Doth said.

One thing that has had a positive impact on the track's attendance is the opening of the Museum of the Horse next to the track and the Ruidoso Downs Sports Theater. Doth said they have run visitor promotions between the two attractions to provide incentive for people to attend both while they are here.

He said the museum has

received overwhelming response both regionally and nationally in the media, which should result in long-term benefits for the whole area.

Laura Doth, marketing director for the Museum of the Horse, said they have been real pleased with the response they have gotten since opening in May, although they have nothing to gauge it by. During August the museum will display a children's art show and a photography contest so that should draw in more different visitors than would normally come, she said.

Most of the visitors have been traveling from northern New Mexico cities such as Albuquerque and Santa Fe or the West Texas market of El Paso, Midland, Odessa and Lubbock.

She said the local people are just now starting to come in as their company comes to town. The summer is a real hectic time for people here, and they don't have a lot of time to go to the attractions in the area, she said.

Jay Chase, director of admissions at the museum, said the average attendance per week is 850-900 people with a year-to-date total of more than 7,200 people. The busiest week for the museum was

## Carrizozo case ends in mistrial

A Lincoln County jury failed to reach a unanimous verdict Thursday in the embezzlement trial of former Carrizozo deputy town clerk Kathy Palomarez.

The jury deadlocked 9-3 about 10:30 a.m. Thursday after deliberating since Wednesday afternoon. The majority favored acquittal. A mistrial was declared by Twelfth Judicial District Judge Richard A. Parsons.

Palomarez, 26, had been accused of taking \$749.60 while working with car registrations and titles in the town clerk's office during an eight-month period in 1990.

Clyde Morgan, a retired contractor from Ruidoso who served on the jury, said Friday those voting for acquittal thought the state just didn't have enough evidence against Palomarez.

"I thought she definitely was innocent," Morgan said. "It seemed she was set up. They tried to hide evidence. Even the judge said they couldn't get their hands on some documents. And when they got a court order, the documents disappeared, then turned up the next day."

Morgan said he had never heard anything about Carrizozo's municipal operation before the trial. But after hearing the testimony, "I think there should be a thorough investigation from top to bottom."

He said the three people voting for conviction seemed to pin their decisions heavily on testimony that

Palomarez had signed a statement of responsibility when confronted by town clerk Carol Schlarb, her boss.

Those papers relating to title registrations and license applications never filed with the state allegedly were found by Schlarb behind a drawer.

Another juror, who asked not to be identified, said a key point seemed to be whether Palomarez previously had told other people that she was concerned because Schlarb allegedly directed her to handle some transactions in an unconventional manner.

The jury requested a tape recording of testimony by Municipal Judge S.M. Ortiz to determine whether he said Palomarez confided her concern to

him.

But it turned out that the conversation was about money in a cash box, not about improperly handled paperwork and fees, the juror said.

"So it came down to whether or not you believed her," the juror said. "It wasn't obvious to us (the three voting for conviction) that she had told anyone something was going on."

The Attorney General has six months to refile the embezzlement charge, which had been reduced by the state from a third degree felony (in excess of \$2,500, punishable by up to 10 years in prison) to a fourth degree felony (in excess of \$250, which carries a maximum sentence of 18 months).

Two other computer-related charges previously were dropped by the state, but also could be refiled. Parsons dismissed a fourth charge of misuse of public money.

"The jurors didn't know that the state had dismissed two other charges (relating to \$18,000)," said defense attorney Gary Mitchell of Ruidoso. "They picked their best shot. It would surprise me if they refiled. I'd be pretty upset. I may be a country lawyer, but they don't want to mess with me. I may get aggravated."

"I've known Kathy since she was a baby. I grew up north of Corona. This is the type of family that's never been in trouble. It's easy to see how she could be set up. I agree with the jurors. She didn't deserve

this."

Palomarez was disappointed that the jury didn't acquit her, he said.

"She wanted it to be over with," Mitchell said. "She wanted to be able to walk out of the courtroom and get on with her life."

"She was offered several plea bargaining deals and turned them all down. I'm proud she hung in there."

Mitchell said he has received correspondence from other former employees who heard about the trial and said similar experiences happened to them.

"I know something is wrong over there in Carrizozo," he said. Besides one computer being stolen from the municipal building, many of the accounts were messed up on the other computers, he said.

Mitchell complimented Parsons for presiding over a fair trial and the jurors for paying attention.

"All 12 of them really listened even though it's the type of trial, one with a lot of figures, that could be boring."

His paralegal, Freda McSwane, was the backbone of his case, Mitchell said.

"She turned out a better investigation than the attorney general's office with all of its personnel," he said.

Prosecutor Carol Clifford from the Attorney General's office in Santa Fe could not be reached for comment Friday. Palomarez also was unavailable for comment.

## Council considers controversial issues

A Ruidoso Village Council agenda, chocked full of a fascinating local government, will be the best act in town beginning at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday in Village Hall.

At least 20 letters have been received in protest regarding Councilor Ron Andrews' attempt to amend an annexation that prevents subdividing his tract into smaller than one-acre lots.

During the last meeting on the issue, Mayor Victor Alonso angrily denounced any criticism to say he and Andrews should have equal treatment, no more, no less. State statutes agree with "no more."

Rick Evans, who sells and rents mountain bikes, will take issue with the village sign ordinance that he feels is ambiguous, at times discriminatory and inconsistent in enforcement.

He says the village apparently raised the stakes by threatening him with a criminal complaint. An action he views as intimidation to drop the issue.

Non-motorized boating on Grindstone Lake, yes or no?

Most of the staff and council have voiced opinions against allowing boating on Grindstone Lake showing concern over liability and

a small staff. Politically, it could be a tough issue to turn down completely. A compromise is expected.

Ruidoso, playground of the southwest, doesn't have a lot of this type of playground and the U.S. forestry service, with a main office in Alamogordo, pampers the Cloudcroft area.

To purchase the property around Grindstone area may get mention. Disposition of old and new fire trucks is on the agenda. The "new" fire truck was built in 1983.

A status on the \$50,000 River Trail Project that will utilize the village work force will be discussed.

## Mescalero meeting set

Opponents of further studies of the proposed Monitored Retrievable Storage site will speak beginning at 9 a.m. Wednesday at the Mescalero Community Center.

Meeting organizers Rufina Laws and Francine Magoosh said Friday they would provide beverages and asked people to bring sack lunches.

The U.S. government has granted the tribe \$300,000 for feasibility studies on the project that would store spent fuel rods.

# Long-term investment in future county roads backfires

For nearly 20 years, Ralph Saylor has been paying an annual assessment for road maintenance in a Lincoln County subdivision.

But the developer never completed the subdivision and the county has never maintained the roads.

It's an unfortunate story repeated far too often throughout the unincorporated areas of the county. Promises made, but never fulfilled by developers; lax control and follow-up by the county. Those ingredients spell smashed dreams for buyers and possible lawsuits for the county.

When a new county commission was elected nearly two years ago, members placed the resolution of the problem at the top of their list. Former county manager Nick Pappas started the process.

After months of legal research by county attorney J. Robert Beauvais and record searches by the county staff, the commissioners late last month decided to back away from maintenance in some of those unfinished subdivisions and to refund the money collected.

They were following a recommendation by new county manager Andy Wynham.

Last week, maps put together through the research of county secretary Patsy Sanchez and others over the last year were spread over the conference table in Wynham's office. They were being refined by Roddy Taylor, who previously handled the rural addressing system for the county.

"Every road on the maps will end up being identified as to whether it's a potential road, has been built, or is being maintained," Wynham said.

He estimated between 1,200 to 1,800 lots will be involved in the final disposition. The cost should be closer to \$100,000 than the "worst case scenario" of \$180,000 he gave

the commission last month, Wynham said.

"Every day I work on this, my number goes down," he said. "When I first came to the county, I was told it could be \$320,000."

The subdivisions being dissected by the staff are Alto Crest Unit II, Bakkers Acres, Lincoln Hills Country Club, Lincoln Hills First Addition, Los Corralitos, Rio Bonito and Wolf Creek Estates.

Portions of eight others may be affected. They are A.N. Runnels, Buck Mountain, Clara A. Skinner, Deer Park Meadows, Captain North units one and two, Mesa Verde, Paradise Canyon and Roblito Ridge.

While ferreting out lots that shouldn't have been assessed, Wynham also has found ones that should have been and were not assessed: about 62,000 feet in 11 subdivisions that will bring in \$6,000.

Saylor is not pleased with the recommendation from Wynham and Beauvais.

"If they decide to refund, I'll immediately press forward with a suit," he told *The Ruidoso News* from his home in Lemon Grove, California.

He's not interested in getting his money back. Saylor wants the county to maintain about a mile and a half of Rockwood Road, the service he thought was being rendered for his annual assessment.

For the past few months, he's been lining up other property owners in the same situation who may join him in a class action against the county.

## BUYING A DREAM

"In 1969, I purchased seven and a half acres in the Capitan North subdivision," Saylor said. "In 1971, the county began assessing one-cent per front footage. I checked with the county assessor and was told that was normal."

Saylor was not an impulse buyer.

"Before we bought the land, we drove the entire subdivision," he said. "In 1969, the roads were transversable with a normal car. They had been bladed and graveled."

Saylor said he selected a well-respected person in local land sales who told him that if the commission approved and accepted the subdivision with roads dedicated to the county, that meant the roads met specifications and the county would provide maintenance.

"I checked with the county clerk and the commissioners had signed the plat (subdivision design) as accepted," Saylor said. "I even got copies of the minutes where the plat was submitted for approval. There was no discussion by the commission."

But Beauvais pointed out that the plat of the subdivision containing Saylor's property clearly states that it is the road rights-of-way, not the roads that are being dedicated.

State law requires right-of-way dedication because the roads usually are not built when a subdivision plat is accepted, he said. It represents a commitment on the part of the developer.

Under current county subdivision regulations, when roads are constructed, they must be inspected and then put on a two-year trial basis before the commission votes to officially accept them for maintenance, Beauvais said. But that regulation only went into effect in November 1984.

"That's one of the biggest problems in straighten out all this," he said. "There have been three reordifications and two amendments (of the subdivision regulations) over the years. If someone presses us to maintain roads, we have to look at the regulations that were in effect at the time of the land transaction."

A recent Court of Appeals decision states that developers can't be held to current standards, only to the standards in effect at the time a subdivision plat was accepted.

About the same time the assessments began on his property, Saylor, an aerospace engineer, was transferred from Alamogordo to the San Diego area.

"But before moving out, every chance we got, we went up to the property," he said. "We cleared off the cactus and planned our vacation cabin."

In 1981, the assessment on his property for road maintenance was increased from one cent a front foot to 10 cents.

"I checked the minutes and the commission said they expected the money to cover about half of the cost of maintenance and the rest would be covered by general taxes," Saylor said.

"If you add up the assessments, plus the commission's part, \$35,000 was collected on one and a half miles of road that was never touched."

Saylor contends the past commission's motivation for showing all those unfinished miles of roads on county maps may have been to collect the money paid each year by the state for every mile of improved roads.

"They've been collecting on upwards of 300 miles that were never improved," he said.

In the last few months, the commission has moved to close (on

paper) more than 200 miles of roads never or no longer maintained by the county. Saylor said he has added up more than 400 miles closed, but his road was not among them.

"Until 1985, we drove back once or twice a year and we still had no difficulty getting up to the property, although we didn't see any maintenance on the road," Saylor said.

"The new subdivision ordinance says the county won't accept a road until two years after it is constructed. Here we were 19 years later and the road still was passable. They were done well."

But in 1986, the road couldn't be traveled.

"We couldn't get up, but I didn't call the county," Saylor said. "I thought surely inspection people have been here because I saw a road sign had been put up, the road had been named for the first time. I thought they were getting ready to maintain it. But I waited and nothing happened."

About two years ago, Saylor was in New Mexico again and he stopped in to see former county manager Nick Pappas.

"He said he wasn't aware of that particular road, but that the subdivision was considered incomplete and probably was filed as such," Saylor said.

Last November 1, Saylor and 15 other property owners in Capitan North petitioned the county for road maintenance and threatened to sue if the county didn't comply.

"I look forward to coming back to New Mexico and building on the property," Saylor said. "I could walk away, but the injustice of the thing bothers me. Basically, they've been discriminating against us."

## COMMISSION VIEW

Pappas said the problem first surfaced about two and a half years ago when he was confronted by a person who owned a subdivision off of a main highway due to be widened by the state.

A subdivision with improved roads would result in higher compensation by the state if land had to be taken. He wanted the county to maintain the roads.

"We attempted to tell him the roads had never been accepted, but he insisted because a commission had accepted the subdivision, the roads were to be done," Pappas said.

The county ended up improving the roads.

"I felt a dangerous precedent was set," Pappas said. "I realized we had (similar subdivisions) all over the county that had been approved 20 or 30 years ago. Almost nothing was in the files on them. In some cases, we couldn't find a record of any commission action."

"I started getting concerned," Saylor came into the commission office about one year before Pappas left this past January.

At one point, Pappas recommended that the commission either reimburse the affected landowners or stop assessing them.

According to Wynham, in 1991-92, the county collected about \$106,000 from the road assessments.

It was at that point, Sanchez, who mans the county's sub-office in

Ruidoso and also is a member of the county planning and zoning board, was directed to start researching the subdivision records.

"Mr. Saylor has access to his property by another road. It just isn't the more attractive side," Pappas said. "The covenants of the subdivision say there will be water and other improvements. Those things were never done. It's my attitude the developer never fulfilled his side. Then why is the county obligated?"

Beauvais said the problem is not simple to solve.

"I told Nick more than a year ago that so many technical questions were involved, we should talk to someone who has dealt with this type of issue," Beauvais said. "He authorized me to proceed. I called a former assistant attorney general who was in the consumer protection division for some guidance. It was at no cost to the county."

In making a recommendation to repay the assessments, Beauvais contends the county has done nothing wrong in collecting the money over the years.

"The statute wording (covering the situation) allows a commission to pass along the cost of maintenance to property owners based on the prospective (expected) density," Beauvais said. "The past commissions did just that."

"They thought if a developer spent all of the preparation money, he would follow through and complete the improvements. They assessed based on the assumption the roads would be built to specifications."

"It's our position that the (developers) never brought the roads up to standards (required at the time of plat acceptance) and now we are cleaning up the books and eliminating those roads from the assessment. We were collecting until the roads were brought up to standard and we have determined that these particular roads never will be maintained by the county."

In all cases being refunded, the roads were never dedicated to the county, he said.

"We have never accepted these roads," Wynham said. "People just assume the government is taking care of roads and drainage because that's a government thing."

He doesn't know why someone didn't pick up on the situation years ago.

"When the subdivisions were not built, there was no follow-up to make sure no one was being assessed," he said.

"It's not a fault that can be pinpointed. It falls back on a hole in the system," Wynham said. "The assessor's office was doing its job over the last 20 years, there just wasn't any communication between the two branches. No one was watching the store."

From now on, he plans to present the assessor each year with an updated list of lots that should be assessed, he said.

Initially several of the commission discussions were conducted during executive sessions behind closed doors because of Saylor's threats of litigation.

For nearly one year, Beauvais had been talking with general counsel and officials in the local government division of the Department of Taxation and Revenue.

"They said they didn't consider it

to be an ad valorem (property) tax and that we couldn't apply the protest and time limit provisions (associated with tax appeals)," he said.

Next, the commission and its staff looked at the situation if the money collected was a fee or assessment.

"The law says the county has to define the specific benefit to the person's road (who was assessed)," Wynham said.

Beauvais said state officials called his attention to a similar situation in Sierra County.

"They told me there was something similar in Sierra County where they nearly subdivided the entire county and advertised all over the nation," he said.

"The commission (years later) in that case said since the roads were never brought to the standards of that (approval) time, it had no obligation to maintain and gave the money back."

Lincoln commissioners felt the Sierra County interpretation, that they had been holding the money in trust until the roads were brought up to standards, was the most accurate. Since the roads never were built to standard, the money should be refunded.

Next the commission had to come up with a definition of the term "maintained," Wynham said.

"We decided it would be that a road was kept in passable condition, not that it had seen a blade each and every year," Wynham said. "Once we had that definition, we could determine what truly had been maintained. Obviously those roads that were not built had not been maintained."

## REFUNDS

"Trying to find out who (including past owners) is owed exactly what is nearly impossible," Wynham said. "The effort would cost more than the amount to refund. We will contact the current property owners. We will offer payment if they can show they paid the fee."

"The action won't prevent future lawsuits, but it will meet the moral obligation of the county to pay back the money not used for the stated purpose."

The money to repay the fees will come from the county's general operating budget surplus, Beauvais said. "We in essence have been assessing to hold the money in trust to be applied if the roads were brought up to standard. But now we are cleaning up the books since the developers never built them to standards in effect when the subdivision plats were approved."

People who think they may be owed a refund should not call the county at this point.

"We will send letters out by the end of August informing people how to apply for a refund," Wynham said. "They will have about 90 days to file and will have to show proof that they paid the fee."

"I'd like to pay it all back the first year, but if the figure is higher than I thought, it may take two years on a first-come, first serve basis."

His office is rushing to get records in order to ensure correct information is contained on tax bills to be assembled in mid-October.

"I don't want to duplicate the error," he said.

July 20-26 when they had 1,100 visitors.

The Smokey Bear Museum in Capitan has also had a steady flow of visitors to their attraction. Lena White, curator at the museum, said they get a lot of tour buses and families, not only from the United States but foreign countries too. She said they have had visitors from Germany, Korea, Norway, England and Japan among other places.

"Some people make a special trip here because everybody knows Smokey," she said.

Lodgers from Alto to Ruidoso Downs are seeing some improvement in their numbers since about the middle of July with most being full on the weekends, but at only about 50 percent during the week.

The Ruidoso Inn has just picked

up in the last few weeks and is now about normal for this time of year. One difference manager Brian Martin has noticed is that people are only staying one or two days this year, while last year people stayed a minimum of three to four days.

Mary Smith, owner of the Sitzmark Chalet, said her summer has been considerably better than last year. She said she has also had more families who are going hiking and fishing, instead of people who are just going to the race track.

"It is good to know that it isn't all racing visitors," she said.

Because they are families, though, they bring in their own food and drinks so they don't have to eat out three meals a day, Smith said.

Both High Country Lodge and the Inn at Pine Springs are having a good year, but it hasn't been much improved over last year. Tim

Campbell, owner of the Downs Motel, said he has had a great year and his rooms and recreational vehicle spaces have been full since before the racing season started because they are mostly workers at the track.

All agree that Labor Day will take care of itself, but they will need a good August to keep going.

Chamber of Commerce executive director Joan Bailey said the increased number of inquiries the staff has seen at the chamber office isn't necessarily translating to sales in the downtown retail business. She also agreed with Doth that the weather and the economy have been part of the reason for the slow start this year. The temperatures in West Texas didn't get as hot as they usually do earlier this summer, so residents didn't feel the need to escape the heat.

The trend throughout the county has been for people to cut down

on spending, even those who are in the upper income brackets, Bailey said. People can't afford to buy as many disposable goods as they have in the past.

"Ruidoso should not take this personally. People are still taking vacations and having fun, but they aren't taking as many souvenirs home that use to be a big part of vacations," she said.

When people call the chamber asking for information about Ruidoso, the first thing they ask about is what there is to do for children, but they also want to know about camping, fishing, golfing and horseback riding as well as the race track. Bailey said these are all activities that generations of visitors have been doing, and it may be that people are returning or bringing their families here for sentimental reasons.

Much of the reason Ruidoso is

here and is so known is because of Ruidoso Downs Race Track, she said. As a business community Ruidoso needs to support the track to help themselves, because there are visitors that never go down to the track but came here because they heard of the area from information on the track.

Bailey compared the track to a picture frame that holds together and outlines the picture, which is all the other activities in the area. Although such things as Ski Apache, the Western heritage of Billy the Kid and the scenery itself, have been part of the picture, she said there are many other aspects that can be promoted.

In talking to lodgers Bailey said they seem to be on the right track now, but they could use more visitors during the week.

"Summer in the past has usually generated business seven days a

week. For the most part the weekends pay the bills, and the profit is generated during the week," she said.

Weathering the storms of the economy may be a task facing some Ruidoso businesses this summer, but Bailey said she is confident that the community will come out of it OK in the long term. She said Ruidoso has never been the "in" or "now" place, such as Vail, Colorado, but it has become a real tradition with visitors. People are having a good time here and are coming back again, which is complimentary for Ruidoso because it shows businesses are giving a good welcome.

"Having owned a business here for 16 years, I have never doubted Ruidoso's future. I would rather be in Ruidoso now and for the future instead of a place where movie stars go," Bailey said.

# EDC re-elects Paulger as president

Ronnie Paulger will remain on as president of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County for one more term after being re-elected at a belated election Thursday.

Scott Shafer of Carrizozo will serve as vice president and Dr. Jim Miller will be secretary/treasurer for the year. After accepting these candidates by vote, Paulger was nominated to continue in his position as president. Elections are regularly done at the annual membership meeting in the spring, but because so many of the directors were new they delayed voting in new officers. Paulger said he wanted to be sure that the directors were comfortable with their positions on the board before taking on more responsibilities as officers.

Getting down to business, the group then reviewed and approved the proposed budget for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993. The total revenue budgeted for the year is \$96,799.96 with about \$34,000 coming from the Village of Ruidoso. No funds were budgeted in from memberships or from the county.

One new source of revenue on the budget was fund raising in the amount of \$35,000. Paulger said they have tailored a fund raising program after the United Way to help the EDCLC establish a five-year commitment from area businesses. The businesses in the community are divided up into lists by professions, such as doctors, lawyers, retail or financial institutions, with a team chairperson in each division to approach these businesses. The captain and team members will have training sessions about the EDCLC before going out to meet with the businesses on the list.

A packet of information will also be made to suit each business division. It will tell what benefits the EDCLC's efforts have given to that particular business and why the business should support EDCLC.

"The team members have to be knowledgeable and professional and tell the story of how the EDC has effected the businesses," Paulger said.

The fund raising will probably begin in October after the businesses aren't as busy. He said the division chairperson will help determine what is realistic for the businesses to contribute during the five-year plan. By having these long-term commitments, the corporation could rely less on the village for funds or not even have to ask for money, Paulger said.

"We want to be able to say we have a commitment from the public sector," he said.

Paulger said they are not trying to compete with other organizations in the village, such as the chamber of commerce, for membership funds, but EDC's program should enhance what the others are doing. Chamber executive director Joan Bailey, who is on the corporation's board, said the program is complementary to what the chamber is doing, and it would work more like a partnership.

The second largest amount of funding, \$34,000, will come from a contract with the Village of Ruidoso. A director asked if other villages in the county, such as Carrizozo and Capitan, would be contributing to the revenues. Paulger said it isn't that they won't help, but they haven't been asked to make that commitment.

EDCLC has had a contract with the village since July 1, 1990, and the first year they were given \$37,500. In an amendment to the first contract, EDCLC was given \$20,000 from June 30, 1991, to September 31, 1991. In a renewal they were given \$37,500 from October 1, 1991, to June 30, 1992, and then this contract for \$34,000 was approved to continue through June 30, 1993.

The contract states the corporation will advance business and economic welfare in Lincoln County. One change in this year's contract is that the group will also help locate a hotel to undertake a lease on the village's old airport property near the Civic Events Center. Paulger said he thought there would be no problem in making that one of the group's goals in the upcoming year.

EDCLC executive director Karen Kopp said she has already begun to work on finding a hotel by getting the addresses of 12 corporate hotel headquarters. She is also getting the specifications and regulations that will be placed on the hotel and has been working with Civic Events Center director Kathleen Michelena to get slides of the area that it is to be built in.

All of this information will be included in a letter to these corporations to see if they would be interested in coming to this area, Kopp said.

On the expense side of the budget, the biggest cost will be in salaries for Kopp and a secretary, especially compared to the last fiscal year when they did not have a director. The biggest increase will be travel for prospect development which Paulger said is a good sign because it shows the group is active in getting new businesses here. The budget total for expenses is \$96,206.38.

In the executive director's report, Kopp told the group about her recent trip to California

with the Southwest Public Service Business Quarter to deliver an audio tape on relocation to prospective new businesses. She and J.J. Johnson of the economic development group in Roswell visited 11 businesses, and she has since sent specific information about Ruidoso to eight of these.

Kopp said these businesses want out of California because of the economic climate there and because of the regulations set by the air and water quality management offices. Most of these are looking to leave California in the next one and a half to two years so that is good for this area, she said.

"Ruidoso needs to make itself known to these people because they are starting to look now," she said.

One disadvantage this community has is that there are few large commercial buildings for these businesses to lease, Kopp said. The largest one available is the True Value building in Sierra Mall. She said she has been working on getting a list of commercial buildings from real estate agents, but because she is not a licensed Realtor she cannot tell the prospective businesses about these buildings.

The businesses, though, don't want Realtors to call them. Kopp is going to meet with the local Multiple Listing Service to see what can be worked out to get the information out.

"Realtors have their policies and systems. We just need to learn how to work this out. These businesses don't want everyone calling them," Paulger said.

Paulger, in the president's report, cleared up some misinformation about a topic that was discussed at the group's last meeting on June 25.

Director Glen Crane had said that the high cost of deposits on utilities at Otero County Electric Cooperative was an obstacle for businesses getting started in the area. Paulger said he got a call from the cooperative after this discussion appeared in The Ruidoso News in an article about the EDCLC meeting. The high cost for the business that was discussed was not a general deposit, but the cost required to bring electricity to the facility.

"We did not mean to show disrespect to Otero Electric for doing their industry. And they did was standard in the industry, and they went by their procedure," he said.

Paulger also told board members that the Iron Horse Railroad has repaid EDCLC an \$8,000 loan from the last fiscal year that had been used along with contributions from the village to do a \$40,000 feasibility study on that project.

### Trustees to meet on Monday

The Capitan Board of Trustees will meet at 7 p.m. today (Monday) in village hall to hear updates on the wetlands sewage treatment project and new solid waste collection system. Appointments also will be made to the Eagle Creek water board.

### Board grapples with gangs

The Ruidoso School Board will meet at 7 p.m. Tuesday, August 11, in the administration complex next to Ruidoso Middle School. Board members will receive an update on the gang prevention guidelines and will give a report on the board/administration retreat. Fees for extra-curricular events will be discussed, as will board goals for the 1992-93 school year.

### Downs police chief resigns

Two resignations will top the list of items to be discussed at the Ruidoso Downs Board of Trustees meeting at 7 p.m. tonight. Police chief G. L. "Skip" Hazel submitted his resignation to the village and will be leaving August 21. Hazel has been chief for about eight years and said he just needs to get out of the profession for a while, but he will still live in Ruidoso Downs. He said his resignation is not because of any hard feelings against the current mayor and trustees.

Trustee Jackie Branum is also resigning from her position on the board. She had about a year and a half left on her present term. She said she has accepted a new job, which will require her to commute so she would be unable to attend a majority of the council meetings.

Also on the agenda for the meeting is the condemnation of the property located next to the old village hall site on Highway 70.

Mike Warren, chairperson of the Village Hazardous Waste Advisory Board, will also be making requests for approval of funding recommendations. Ladies Auxiliary president Shirlene Fitzner will also bring the board up to date on a sign for the village park. Chief Hazel is requesting an inter-departmental transfer for dispatcher Minerya Davalos to police officer to replace officer Robert Layher who resigned July 31. Davalos has been with the department two years.

# Lincoln County could pull the plug on Alamogordo water

The city of Alamogordo should meter the water it extracts from Bonito Lake at the source in Lincoln County, not when the water arrives in Otero County.

That's the point of view of a group of residents in Lincoln who want the State Engineer to step in and monitor the flow to Alamogordo. Led by former county commissioner Ralph Dunlap, the group also believes Alamogordo receives too much water under the current allotment formula.

They're taking their concerns to the Lincoln County Commission Tuesday. The meeting will begin at 9 a.m. in the county courthouse in Carrizozo.

"As residents of Bonito Valley, we feel the city is overusing its (water) allotment and if they're not, they should prove it," Dunlap told The Ruidoso News. "We want a working meter there at the lake

and a monthly reading by the state engineer.

"We feel if more water was put down the Bonito River, it would be a live stream and of more benefit to the valley."

Dunlap said he has talked to the state engineer's office and was told the request would receive more attention if it came from the Lincoln County Commission.

"To my knowledge, although there's a meter there, it's non-functional. It hasn't been metered at the lake in 15-20 years," Dunlap said. "It's their line to Alamogordo and they should be responsible for any leaks. But when it's metered down the line, those leaks aren't counted against Alamogordo's allotment."

The city has been pulling water from Bonito Lake since the 1950s, Dunlap said.

Jose Miramontes, public works director for Alamogordo, told The News that the city already is

monitoring at reservoir.

"Everything is metered at the source," Miramontes said. "We have a main line meter that meters water out of lake into our pipeline that we share with Holloman Air Force Base. There's a second meter for Fort Stanton. All others are metered at the source where they tap in. We submit monthly reports to the State Engineer's Office in Las Cruces."

Miramontes acknowledged that the city has experienced metering problems in the past.

"We have individual at the lake to insure that all meter are operable and to check the pipeline and other equipment," Miramontes said.

Any leakage would go against the city's allotment, he said.

But Dunlap would like the state or county to take their own readings for backup.

Alamogordo submits its reports to John Nixon at the Las Cruces of-

fice, but Nixon said the Bonito Dam is not within his district and he has never been there to check the accuracy of the meter or of the readings.

"That line is entitled to five cubic feet of water per second. Their readings and numbers are in chronological order when I receive them," Nixon said. "But it would be the Roswell drainage district's responsibility to ensure it was in working order."

Glenn Brim, supervisor of the Roswell office of the State Engineer, said the state has never calibrated the meter to check its accuracy.

He suggested the county work with the city if it has concerns in that area.

"With the old pipeline, we had lots of reports that it was sustaining huge losses and we made field investigations," Brim said Friday.

"It was our concern that it be monitored. But once a water line is

established, it's up to the owner to make sure the water is delivered properly."

As far as the state physically checking monthly readings, Brim said, "Fine, if they furnish the additional people. We cover an area from Las Vegas to the state line to the south and I have three people to handle it."

The state wouldn't have a problem with a county official taking independent readings, he said. "I'm sure the city wouldn't object, at least, they shouldn't."

Other items of interest on the commission agenda include:

—a response from Sheriff James McSwane on the cost of ammunition for his department.

—a request for final plat approval on River's Edge subdivision in Glencoe. Being developed by Jerry Deal of Law Cruces, the 48.57-acre subdivision is west of Nosker's Meat Market along the river and up the side of the hill.

The size of the lots range from one acre to 5,158 acres and sell for \$15,000 to \$25,000, according to information submitted by the petitioner.

The planning and zoning commission has recommended the plat (physical layout) be approved. The roads within the subdivision would be private. Board member Patsy Sanchez said the zoning commission has expressed some concern that one access is not enough in cases of flooding or fire.

—consideration of an ordinance that would set up fees for installation of utility lines that require excavation on county rights of way.

—an agreement with the U.S. Forest Service to pay \$600 for the Sheriff's Department to assign an extra deputy for the four-day Labor Day holiday weekend patrol, September 4-7. He will work the Smokey Bear District, primarily around Bonito Lake.



Their mother was adopted right away and then their two siblings, but Ricky and Lucy still are waiting for new homes and the attention they deserve.

The tan and white cocker spaniel mixes are lively and loving, said Randy Basch, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter.

"They're about five months old and eating well. I don't think there is any possibility of illness and seldom can I say that," Basch said. "They have had their whole series of shots except rabies."

The pups are playful and bark enough to be home alarm dogs, but not excessively to be a nuisance. Luckily, they are sponsored for their spaying and neutering, the

major cost associated with adoption.

"They eat up attention and are very intelligent," Basch said. "They should be easy to train, but they need to find new home now. Dogs that spend too much time here can become timid and unsure how to interact with humans."

"Human companionship is very important, especially at this stage."

Basch said people don't realize that as pet owners their affection and attention is as important to their animals as food and water.

"I've seen pets pine to death because their owner of six years leaves them behind when they move, like a piece of furniture," Basch said. "They literally starve themselves to death. No matter what you tell animals, they don't understand why they have been

abandoned.

"Right now, Ricky and Lucy are normal puppies, but in a few more months, they could become nervous and lack confidence. They may lose their ability to interact with humans."

Full grown, Ricky and Lucy should each weigh about 30 pounds.

Moogie and Cranky, two lap-size dogs with chihuahua blood and medium-length hair, who look a lot like last week's featured pet Ringo, still are waiting for new homes. They are cute, perky and full of personality. They're the kind of companions who would travel well and not be much bother. Take a look at them and at the variety of medium and large size dogs, as well as the many cats at the shelter on Gavilan Canyon Road.




director of the pageant for several years.

His father, Stanley Thomas, played many parts in the show as did his uncle, John Jr. He brought down the house when he played Tunstall and took a back flip off his horse.


Nathan is following in the footsteps of his well-beloved grandfather and grandmother — a true westerner. He has inherited the million-dollar smile of his grandfather and father.

# Waterfowl seasons set for the state

The State Game Commission reduced the bag limit on common moorhens and lengthened dark goose season in the Central Flyway by almost two weeks in a meeting July 22 in Farmington.

Waterfowl seasons set by the commission may change slightly to accommodate federal guidelines to be released in August.

The Central Flyway dark goose season is October 17-January 31 with a bag limit of three per day. Season is closed in Sandoval, Sierra, Valencia, Socorro and Bernalillo counties. Light goose season starts November 14, 12 days later than last year's season, and extends through February 28 (the 1991-1992 season ended February 9), with a bag limit of five.

There is no separate season for light geese in Socorro and Valencia

counties. In the Central Flyway, bag and possession limits for other waterfowl are according to the point system: 100 points for each female mallard, northern pintail, redhead, hooded merganser and mottled duck; 50 points for each male mallard and wood duck; and 35 points for all other ducks for which season is open. There is no hunting for canvasbacks.

Limit is reached when the point value of the last bird taken reaches or exceeds 100 points. Central Flyway seasons are:

North Zone (north of I-40 and U.S. 54): Ducks, October 17-November 1 and November 30-January 3, bag and possession limits are according to the point system. Virginia rail and sora, common moorhen, American coot and

common snipes, October 17-November 1 and November 30-January 3. Bag and possession limits are 10 rail and sora (singly or a combination of the species), one moorhen, 15 coots and eight snipes.

Seasons in zone two (south of I-40 and U.S. 54) are November 14-January 3, with bag and possession limits according to the point system.

Goose seasons in the Pacific Flyway are October 17-January 10 south of I-40 and January 2-17 south of I-40 for light and dark geese, with bag limits of two dark geese and one light goose per day.

Pacific Flyway seasons are October 3-18 and November 29-January 10 for ducks, Virginia rail and sora, common moorhen, American coot and common snipe. Bag and possession limits are 10 rail and sora,

singly or in the aggregate of the species, one moorhen, 15 coots and eight snipes.

Daily bag limit on duck is four, including no more than three mallards, of which no more than one can be female, one redhead, one northern pintail and one canvasback. Possession limit is twice the daily bag.

Some state waterfowl areas are open to hunting. Up to 60 permits per day at Bernardo and up to 30 permits per day at Casa Colorado will be available for light goose hunting on a random drawing basis, with applications due by October 15. Those hunters must have completed a species identification course. Season information and hunting details will be provided in the 1992-93 Waterfowl Proclamation.



## Magic of the West on Film comes to the new Museum of the Horse

In a continuing series of presentations, the Museum of the Horse invites the public to attend Dr. Richard Etulain's "The Magic West On Film".

The presentation will be at 7 p.m. Friday, August 14, at the Museum of the Horse in Ruidoso Downs. Admission is free.

Americans have had a nearly century-long love affair with the Western. This slide lecture furnishes an overview of the Western from its beginnings around 1900 to the Westerns of the 1980s. Along the way, Dr. Richard Etulain will try to demonstrate how shifting socio-cultural conditions have helped to bring about changes in Western films. Roles of heroes and heroines, uses of historical events, and the treatment of Indians and women are spotlighted topics.

Dr. Richard Etulain is a professor of history at the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque. Professor Etulain specializes in the history and culture of the American West and modern United States. He received his Ph.D from the University of Oregon in 1966 and has taught at Idaho State University and the University of New Mexico. He has also lectured abroad in several countries.

Etulain is an author or editor of

20 books and more than 70 essays. His writings have won several honors. "The American Literary West and Its Interpreters: The Rise of a New Historiography" was selected the best essay in Western history by the Western History Association in 1976. More recently, "The American West: A Twentieth-Century History" (coauthored with Michael P. Malone) was named a Main Selection of the History Book Club and nominated for a Pulitzer Prize in the Fall of 1989.

Etulain is currently researching a book-length study of "Culture in the Modern American West: 1900 to the Present."





### Looking forward to civic center opening

Who can speak "officially" for the Village of Ruidoso?

Is it the mayor? the councilors? the village manager? chairmen of boards and commissions? members of boards and commissions? the public? any citizen? any taxpayer? anyone with an interest in this little village?

The Ruidoso Village Council, pushed into "loaning" its new, but unfinished, civic events center for a new event, an art show, stated emphatically that the center opening will be staged with the proper "pomp and circumstance" when the \$2 million facility is finished — probably in September. That's why it was a big surprise to many when a regional television station reported that the "official" opening would be on Friday before the art show.


The village manager, the guy we count on to have the straight scoop on village business, was perplexed. He didn't know who could have put out that misinformation, but admitted that he can't control all the mouths involved. He stressed that the "official" opening still remains in the future just as the council said earlier this week. It must be frustrating to try to manage this village.

Wicker recalled that this isn't the first time misinformation has been disseminated about the village's new civic events center. A couple of months ago, Councilor Ron Andrews printed in his motorcycle rally brochure that the village had built the center specifically as a home for his event. Apparently that statement was made without being cleared through the Convention and Visitors Bureau, the village manager or the council.

A few people have been instrumental in the development of this civic events center — people like councilors Jerry Shaw and J.D. James, who have been involved as the plans evolved from an old hangar to a showplace; former Mayor Lloyd L. Davis Jr., who helped set the whole development process in motion; state elected officials, who helped with funding; and other former municipal employees and officials, who kept the project on track.

We expect to be right there with those folks when our village's civic events center "officially" opens.


