Sheriff closes pot farm

While tracking down a Carrizozo man to serve a magistrate warrant, officers with the U.S. Forest Service and Lincoln County deputies discovered an illegal crop of 25 marijuana plants.

After staking out the crop area on national forest land near Nogal, the officers last Tuesday arrested Ray L. Gwaltney, 45. He was charged by the forest service with possession with intent to distribute marijuana and manufacturing a controlled substance.

"We had a magistrate warrant for Gwaltney for defacing tombstones in White Oaks," Lincoln County Sheriff James McSwane said Monday. "In the process of trying to locate him, we found the plants. He was going back and forth from Alamogordo into Dry Gulch Canyon, where he had a mining claim."

"We knew the plants were there, but we had to sit on it to make sure we had enough to connect him with it."

The arrest was the result of a joint investigation of the sheriff's department, the forest service and the White Mountain Narcotics Task Force.

Gwaltney was taken into federal custody and confined at the Doña Ana County Detention Center in Las Cruces, then was transferred to a federal facility in Sandoval County.

According to the forest service, he could face up to a maximum of five years imprisonment and a \$250,000 fine on each charge.

The service maintains a 24-hour, national hotline for reporting marijuana cultivation on national forest lands and offers up to \$5,000 rewards for information.

The identity of those reporting narcotics activity will be kept confidential. The toll-free number is 1-800-78-CRIME.

MainStreet Ruidoso is going to stay out of the Chamber of Commerce's business concerning a community guide a publishing company is creating for Ruidoso.

Louis Adney, a sales representative from Southern Star Publications of Las Cruces, made a presentation to MainStreet directors Thursday at their meeting about the guide and asked for comments on it. Adney said his company is working with the chamber and the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County to make the guide, which will include information on the history of the area, events planned and general information on the area.

It will also include advertisements and a business directory for all chamber of commerce businesses and those who have advertisements in it, Adney said. He said now the chamber has to send out a large packet of information for visitors interested in relocating to the area, but this guide would be an official yearly publication for the chamber to use.

The EDCLC would use it for businesses that request information about relocating here, he said.

About 10,000 of the guides would be printed and about 2,500

extra copies of a special pull-out section of important information and statistics, such as the location of the hospital, the cost of utilities and the variance in the weather, would also be given to the chamber.

Adney said he first contacted MainStreet president Aiden Deyo to discuss the benefits this guide would have for the MainStreet association.

Since the main street relies on tourism this guide would help direct more visitors to the down town area, he said. Adney had sketched a design for a page for the MainStreet association, which would have a picture, copy on the past and present of the main street and other information that would give people a better idea of what to expect of the area.

The bottom portion of the page would be a list of supporting MainStreet businesses with addresses and phone numbers. A full page advertisement would cost \$1,323. Director J.D. James asked if the group had that kind of money to spend, but Adney explained how it could be paid for. He said he would contact the individual business members to divide the costs among for a cost of \$22-\$23 per business if all participated.

If the MainStreet association itself wanted to contribute it could

too, but Adney said he just approached the group because he wanted the directors' thoughts and comments on the project.

James said in his opinion there is a chamber of commerce and there is a MainStreet program, but this would look like MainStreet is an arm of the chamber. When MainStreet was started its goal was to revitalize the down town and that is a dream coming true, he said.

"I can't see us getting into advertising now," James said.

Adney said he just thought it would be more beneficial to the group to approach the businesses with a package promoting MainStreet instead of just as individuals. He said he would like to utilize the group's membership list to contact businesses in the community.

Council to hear from Bill Karn Tuesday

The long awaited return of Ruidoso Councilor Bill Karn gets star billing for this Tuesday's Village Council meeting.

Karn, missing from his council table for about six weeks, will speak on the stalkers law, MRS-earthquakes and environmental tax law.

Funds for continuing engineering services for the River Trail project is an information item. Karn may shed some light on the project and the willingness of residents to allow the village to cross their property.

Under regular items, the council will discuss:

—non-motorized boating on Grindstone Lake. Before he resigned, deputy manager Gary Jackson submitted a report to the council that contained more conditions to be met prior to the insurance becoming effective on Grindstone boating.

Conditions include: a required

attendant city employee shall be a certified lifeguard; scuba-diving should be prohibited; entry and exit points for windsurfers and boaters should be designated; A boat limit should be enforced; life vests shall be required.

Other considerations for the windsurfer group would be handicapped accessible restrooms, trash removal and added parking.

The plan, if enacted, is expected to cost from \$6,000 to \$10,000 in additional insurance coverage.

—a revision to their plans for concessions at the Civic Events Center.

The village recently sought proposals for concessions. Out of 50-60 RFPs mailed, no bids were received.

A letter attached from one vendor said the criteria called for a sizable capital outlay with too short a time period to recoup the investment, let alone make a profit.

Advertising proposal falls flat with MainStreet board

MainStreet Ruidoso is going to stay out of the Chamber of Commerce's business concerning a community guide a publishing company is creating for Ruidoso.

Louis Adney, a sales representative from Southern Star Publications of Las Cruces, made a presentation to MainStreet directors Thursday at their meeting about the guide and asked for comments on it. Adney said his company is working with the chamber and the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County to make the guide, which will include information on the history of the area, events planned and general information on the area.

It will also include advertisements and a business directory for all chamber of commerce businesses and those who have advertisements in it, Adney said. don't feel this is our goal for MainStreet," Mattox said.

Vice president Bill Carrigan agreed with Mattox.

"It would be great if we were set up to do this type of thing, but that really isn't our purpose," he said.

Adney said if he approached businesses with an advertisement about the association he just wanted to go through the association first. He said businesses are usually more capable of doing advertising if they go together on a project such as this or if they go together as members of a plaza or shopping area.

Southern Star Publications is managed by John Jeffries, former Ruidoso chamber of commerce executive director. The guide will not cost the chamber or EDCLC any funds but will be paid for from advertising.

Chamber executive Joan Bailey and EDCLC director Karen Kopp will be reviewing the guide before publication, but most of the copy will be written by someone hired by Southern Star. The company has put out several guides for cities including one for Las Cruces.

In other business project director Mary Maul reported that she and state MainStreet director Julie Johncox have been working with Eastern New Mexico University-

Ruidoso director Dr. Jim Miller on a workshop the two will sponsor together.

The visual merchandising workshop is being planned from 8 a.m. to noon on November 5 and will include such information as the basic elements of design and creating an effective window display.

Maul said Cynthia M. McBurney, a professional in the field, will be presenting the workshop and it will be promoted through MainStreet and the Small Business Administration centers in Roswell and Alamogordo. She said they hope to have attendance from the whole state, including other MainStreet communities.

More information on the event as it comes closer to the date, she said.

Deyo said he received a letter from the chamber of commerce stating it has named Tom Rigsby as the liaison member to MainStreet, since Rigsby is a member of both groups. In return Rigsby will be MainStreet's liaison with the chamber.

He said he also got a letter from The Ruidoso News stating it will be pleased to sponsor the annual Community Update with MainStreet, so committee chairperson Don Dutton will begin working on that project.

Cattle Baron unveils waterfall plans

Stern measures are recommended by the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Department for lounge owner Jock Tallman's property behind Handi Hanks.

The planning commission meets today, Monday, at 2 p.m. to discuss what action to take.

It appears the village planning department is miffed at what director Cleatus Richards has called "numerous complaints regarding lounge operation and inadequate parking."

In a staff review submitted to the planning commission, director Cleatus Richards said Tallman was notified that parking plans had not been submitted as required under the January 6, commission approval.

Richards said Tallman expanded the lounge area to add a game room without approval by the commission. He said Tallman has also been notified of other violations regarding use of storage areas for commercial purposes not approved by the commission and developed without building permit or inspection.

Richards recommends that the commission formally act to declare previous approvals under PSD92-002 void and withhold any further approvals until Tallman submits development plans

in full accord with code regulations.

Richards said the commission action to nullify previous approval will have the effect of making the lounge operation an illegal activity on the premises. If necessary, Richards said the staff will institute appropriate legal procedures in this regard.

Other requests include:

—Kurt Schussler, Jr., is requesting to amend a commercial site development to allow a sandwich shop at 2717 Sudderth.

Planning staff recommends approval subject to arrangement for additional parking on adjoining lot or within 3000 feet of the site.

Cattle Baron Restaurant agent D.T. Collins is requesting approval of a 16 feet by 116-foot addition to the existing restaurant for additional seating and kitchen remodeling.

Planning staff recommends approval of development plans. However, the parking plans are not considered acceptable as submitted and should be revised to incorporate the following.

Robert Kakuska is requesting a variance for his front and side yard in Country Club Estates to construct a garage to within 11 feet of the front property line and on the side property line.

Pedestrian hit on Sudderth

Mark Langston, 24, of Ruidoso Downs was in satisfactory condition Sunday after being struck by a vehicle last Friday night as he was running across the street from the Winner's Circle.

Robert O'Connell from Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, was driving eastbound on Sudderth Drive about 11:20 p.m. when, according to a witness, Langston came out of the Winner's Circle and entered the crosswalk running, not looking either way.

O'Connell, driving a 1992 Pontiac, hit Langston on the left side and knocked him about 53 feet down Sudderth Drive.

Officers and a witness at the scene said that O'Connell was driving within the speed limit and no ticket was issued.

Langston sustained head injuries and was airlifted by Life Guard Helicopter Service to the University of New Mexico Hospital

MainStreet hires Don Miller as new office administrator

MainStreet Ruidoso selected Donald D. Miller as the new office administrator for the group at a meeting Thursday morning.

A selection committee for the office reviewed 35 applications before recommending Miller for the position. After an executive session the board of directors accepted the recommendation from committee chairperson Bill Carrigan. Carrigan said they used a 27-point rating system during the interview process to select Miller.

The group refused to release the names of the other candidates who were interviewed as well as names of applicants.

Miller will begin work at the office on September 1 and former project director Mary Maul will begin as project consultant in Santa Fe on that date. Maul will continue to

come to Ruidoso three days each week to help train Miller, and board directors will also be available to assist him until he gets familiar with everything, according to president Alden Deyo.

Miller said he is excited about getting started in the position because it allows him to use skills he has developed in his 32-year career in real estate management and development.

Currently he is the president and principal partner in Parnegg and Miller, a firm in Albuquerque that develops and manages income properties.

He said the company has recently developed and put into use historic properties in Albuquerque. Historic preservation through the National Historic Trust is one of the goals of the national, state and regional MainStreet programs.

Miller's firm is being sold in September so this opportunity was very timely, Miller said. Since his wife, Valerie, has been the administrator of the hospital, he has been commuting between Ruidoso and Albuquerque.

"I feel that Mary (Maul) and the board have done an outstanding job, and I want to build on that," Miller said.

MainStreet Ruidoso decided to hire an office administrator, who will eventually advance to the position of project director in about six months, after Maul planned to move to Santa Fe this spring. Maul wanted to continue to be involved in the group and will consult with the legislature and state highway department on behalf of MainStreet Ruidoso.

A consultant negotiation committee met with Maul to determine her contract fee so the group could

decide how much it could pay for Miller's position.

The group's main source of income for operating the program and paying salaries is the Village of Ruidoso, which gave it \$41,000 for this fiscal year.

The board thanked Carrigan and his committee of Audean Franklin, Herb Brunell and J.D. James for the work they did to select Miller.

In an update on the group's major goal, the streetscape project, Maul said she met with Ed Moore, the right-of-way agent for the state highway department and gave him all the information she had on it so the right of way can be determined.

She said that problem has to be resolved before they can continue with the necessary joint powers agreements with the village. This is just one of the many hurdles to keep the project going, but it is

moving right along as expected, she said.

In a financial statement, treasurer Tom Rigsby said the group is maintaining its budget to within \$15 of what had been estimated. He said they have a year-to-date net revenue of \$7,235.84. By the time MainStreet gets its next quarterly payment from the village, the group will have expended most of that revenue, he said.

After receiving approval for the financial statements, Deyo reported that accountant Ron Hemphill is working on the final totals for the last fiscal year. When they are complete, the final balances for income and expenses will be available, he said. Rigsby had estimated that they began the year with a \$980 carry-over from last year.

In appointments to committees

the group approved Audean Franklin as chairperson of a Christmas open house and Don Dutton for chairperson of the Community Update.

Deyo had asked Bonnie Mattox to serve as the chairperson for the downtown Halloween party, but she will be unable to so he is looking for someone else to organize this event. He congratulated Madeline Shackelford, chairperson of the MainStreet coffees, for doing a fantastic job in lining up hosts for the event for an entire year.

Concerning the Christmas decorations for the downtown, J.D. James said the village parks and recreation department is taking inventory of the decorations and will let him know what is available. Maul said Franklin's committee will help the department recycle the decorations and get them ready to put up before Christmas.

Care center names Best to director's job

Horizon Healthcare Corporation has named a new administrator for the Ruidoso Care Center and both are positive he is the right person for the job.

Darrin Best began his duties as administrator last week after an orientation session with Horizon's district director Kay Rogers, who has been serving as the interim director for the last few weeks. Rogers had accepted the resignation of former administrator Patrick Taylor on July 21, after he had been at the center four months.

Best moved to Ruidoso from Las Vegas, Nevada, where he had lived for six years. He graduated from the University of Nevada in Las Vegas with a degree in administration before getting into Horizon's administrators training program.

His performance in the program was the main reason they selected Best for this position, Rogers said. She said in the Horizon program, the administrators are in an actual facility, which in Best's case was a 144 bed unit. They work directly with each department head to see what each person goes through, she said. Horizon then tries to place the

administrators in positions they are suited for.

He was most recently the administrator at a 189 bed unit in Butte, Montana. The Ruidoso Care Center is an 85 bed unit with 24 of those as Alzheimer's living units, 12 in the mental retardation unit and eight skilled beds, said.

He said he visited Ruidoso a week before he began his duties, saw the facilities, and then drove back Sunday from Las Vegas to begin in the position on Monday.

After living in the desert for so long, Best said he was pleasantly surprised by the scenery of the mountains. He is looking forward to getting the opportunity to go fishing, hiking and skiing in the area.

"I am really excited to be a part of this community. Our staff has a strong dedication to providing quality care which means a quality life. I want this facility to get more involved in the community. I want people to understand what we are all about," Best said.

Rogers said nursing homes are part of the community, and the residents of the care center are still members of the whole community. She said they would like to draw

the care center and the Ruidoso area closer together in the future and are discussing creating a community council to help reach this goal.

Best said the support of the community would be for the good of the care center residents.

Best has a compassion for people and his ideas on motivation and keeping people motivated are very good, Rogers said. He also works with the Ruidoso community because of his interest in the outdoors, she said.

Horizon was also impressed that he was the only one in his college class to chose to go into long term care administration.

"That shows that he is dedicated to long term care," she said.

Best said while he was going through college he worked as an orderly in a hospital and that got him interested in this career choice.

"This is a very challenging field, but the rewards are also overwhelming. This is a great staff, and they are very dedicated. I am also enjoying working with the residents and their families," Best said.

The care center also has a new qualified mental retardation professional, Dan Bolin.

Bolin, who was the former administrator for the Hobbs care facility, began at the center on August 10. He is originally from Portales and received a degree in special education at Eastern New Mexico University.

Bolin has also worked at the state facility at Los Lunas and has done rehabilitation work too.

Rogers said Bolin is going to be a positive addition to the center.

Carmen Bolin, his wife, has a degree in musical therapy and will be starting as the new activities director soon.

Apache Trails board members take group's tourism message to state information center

When people call into the state tourism department's toll free number, they may find out a little more than usual about this part of the state.

Apache Trails representatives made sure the people who answer the telephones, inmates at the correction facility at Los Lunas, know about everything visitors can do in this region. Ruidoso's visitors information director Lisa Storey and Ruidoso Downs marketing director Mark Doth took packets of information to the center and made a presentation on the area to the supervisor of the telephone operators on August 12.

Storey reported on the trip at the Apache Trails meeting on Wednesday in Alamogordo. She said it is a very professional operation and they really loved getting the extra information. The only other attraction in the state to make a presentation to the supervisor has been the Museum of Natural His-

tory in Albuquerque, she said.

Because of the turnover in inmates, Storey said they should probably go back about every six months to remind the new people of what is available in this region. She said the operators work all in one room under the supervision of Edwin Esquibel, who has fought hard to keep the program growing. Funding has already been approved for a new facility for them to expand into, Storey said.

Doth had suggested at an Apache Trails meeting two months ago that representatives of the organization make the trip to the center. Members were receptive to the idea and were excited to hear that it had gone so well.

In other business at the meeting the Apache Trails brochures were finalized and will be changed to the printer with the changes the group had made in the sites on the map. A ski picture on the brochure was also changed.

Storey said she got a new picture from Ski Apache and if they put a

photo credit on it, Ski Apache will help pay the production costs of preparing it for the brochure. The brochure should be ready to send out in about two months.

The group had 200,000 printed originally but was already down to 50,000 when this summer began. Getting the brochure reprinted has been one of the high priorities of the group to do with the funding it has received this fiscal year.

Group secretary Ed Way is reviewing the film taken of the area for free air time on KZIA TV, an independent television channel seen on five cable systems in the Las Cruces and El Paso markets. Representatives of the station had offered the group \$1,000 of free advertising at the June meeting and plan to run the piece on the area in September.

Way is also planning to meet with state highway department officials to discuss signs for Apache Trails. The group had considered two types of signs, small ones that could be put near the village limits

and larger ones that could be placed along the highways in the Apache Trails region.

The organization is starting to receive the funds that had been approved by villages during a funding campaign in May and June. They have also sent out letters to prospective new members in the Apache Trails region and will be going out to meet with these people after Labor Day for a follow-up visit. Even without a personal visit the group has already added three associate memberships, Storey said.

The group is still waiting to find out about the non-profit status that president Mariann Schweers applied for. She said the group also had to file for both a trademark and a tradename from the state. After they receive approval on these, they will apply for them on the federal level.

Next month's meeting of Apache Trails will again be in Alamogordo, but they will be doing a brown bag lunch and touring Eagle Ranch Pistachios' new visitors center.

—a request by Sue Carlidge to vacate off-way in East Brady Canyon Road.

The applicant objected to one of the conditions, payment for the area vacated at a rate of 50 cents per square foot. Planning director Cleatus Richards said the village can't give away village property, no matter how bad the property may be.

—a request from James Porter, acting for Carrizo Condo Homeowners Association and C-Net Resorts, Inc., that Carrizo be tied into the village water system, with Carrizo supplying the material and the village to supply labor for the installation of the line.

Porter wrote that he hopes a line could be laid sometime between September and November.


—budget approval requested by Joan Bailey, executive director of the chamber of commerce.



Ruidoso Downs board of trustees to meet tonight in the fire station

Ruidoso Downs trustees will be meeting at 7 p.m. tonight in the Downs fire department station behind the maintenance building off of Highway 70.

they received total last year, and the staff can't respond to them quickly enough.

In discussion at the advisory board meeting members said the chamber has been doing a good job of promoting the whole area and working together to get visitors here would be a good idea.

Warren will also be requesting approval for \$1,000 for the Golden Aspen Rally.

Rally promoter Ron Andrews, a Ruidoso village councilor, will also be available to answer questions from the trustees.

The trustees will also vote on hiring a full-time dispatcher and several part-time dispatchers also. A clean-up resolution for the fiscal year budget is on the agenda.

LaDonna House of the Alamogordo youth center will give a presentation to the board about how to start a youth club and center. Trustee Judy Miller had visited the Alamogordo center and was impressed by what House had done and asked her to help Ruidoso Downs get one started.

The board will have its meeting at the fire station until further notice. The village hall offices are being moved from the old Redmens Club to the modular building beside the senior citizens center. The building, though, does not have enough room for meetings.

The trustees hope to begin soon on plans to build a new village hall on the site of the old one on Highway 70.

Charmin' Norman's stormin' into your heart

A face that promises he'll be your special friend for life, Norman is looking for an owner this time who will return that loyalty and love.

The two-year-old spitz/shelty mix was brought to the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter as a stray about one month ago. He needs a new owner who will take care of him and make sure he is secure at home whenever he/she is away.

Since he arrived, Norman has won the hearts of all the shelter workers for his good nature and his protectiveness toward puppies at the facility.

"He's a very protective dog and would guard kids and animals smaller than he," said shelter manager Randy Basch. "Norman has a

terrific disposition. He appears to be housebroken, but he will need to be neutered."

With the end of the summer visitors' season approaching, Basch is steeling himself for the usual heavy load of abandoned pets like Norman that will be picked up by animal control.

"I wish there was some way to make people understand what they're doing to these dedicated and loyal animals," Basch said. "Dogs have no way of understanding why they've been abandoned."

"When they are left behind, they believe they have been ostracized by their pack. And that means they have done something horrible."

"I have ones that sit in the kennel and pine. They won't eat and eventually they have to be destroyed because they won't do what they need to do to stay

healthy." Basch said when the Ruidoso Downs racetrack closes for the season and workers and race enthusiasts leave the area, the strays turn up everywhere.

"If you've been feeding a stray, you need to call animal control to have them picked up before you leave," Basch said. "To feed them all summer and then abandon them as winter approaches is cruel, not to mention that if they survive, next year you'll have the puppies or kittens to feed too."

All dogs and cats adopted from the shelter must be neutered or spayed as part of the society's commitment to reduce the unwanted pet population through cutting the rate of reproduction instead of euthanasia.

More than 14-million animals are killed nationwide each year in

shelters and municipal impounding facilities.


"The society believes that killing unwanted animals is not a humane solution, even though it is a method we are forced to use because so many owners continue to be negligent," Basch said.

Anyone interested in enhancing a particular animal's chance for adoption may donate to the shelter's spay and neuter fund, earmarked for that pet. Or it can be designated for the use of any animal up for adoption. The expense of altering an animal is the major cost associated with adoption.



Gold miners propose selling water to City of Alamogordo

Water pumped from the craggy depths of a Lincoln County gold mine may be sold to the city of Alamogordo.

An application to that effect has been submitted by American Lode Corporation to the New Mexico State Engineer for approval.

The Ruidoso-based firm wants to reactivate a mine about two to three miles south of Noyal that dates back to turn of the century, according to John Nixon, supervisor of the state engineer's Las Cruces office.

Letters of objection have been received from three people to date, Nixon said. The protest period will run until August 27.

If the application is approved, the mine area would be the only private well used by Alamogordo,

Nixon said.

"The city owns a few wells itself and pumps from Lake Bonito (in Lincoln County), but this would be the first private well.

"(The mine owners) need to pump water out of a mine to use it. They told me they felt they could recoup some of the expense of pumping by selling the water, otherwise it would be pumped into an arroyo and eventually would go out of the area."

Don Huband, one of the principals in American Lode, told The Ruidoso News that Alamogordo city officials have been contacted but nothing can move forward until the state engineer makes a determination.

"Yes they have been contacted and they are interested," he said.

"The thing is, the mine has water in it to dispose of and

Alamogordo's pipeline is within two miles of us," Huband said. "The city can use it for five cubic feet of water per second, but is only pumping 2 1/2 cubic feet.

"If we have a product somebody needs, why not proceed? We're not locked into Alamogordo and would be open to others. But Alamogordo is in the Tularosa Basin (as is the well) and it's the one that needs the water the most."

Nixon said a few people up and down stream from the mine irrigate out of the stream that runs through Noyal Canyon. Three have filed objections.

"They claim it would be detrimental to their surface water rights," he said.

M.G. Zumwalt has lived on his farm for 50 years and in the canyon for 83 years.

"I think the pumping could af-

fect domestic wells throughout the canyon area," he told The News. "I objected to it and sent a letter with my son, Lloyd. I think Lincoln County ought to keep the water it's got. Alamogordo (in Otero County) already pumps out of Bonito Lake."

Tom Guck also filed a letter of objection.

"I believe it would be detrimental to the performance of my own (two) wells, which are right below it," Guck said. "I also think it would be a bad precedent. If you approve one, you might get applications on several more. There are many more mines up there."

Guck also questioned whether Alamogordo could obtain the necessary easements to reach the well if it required crossing land owned by people who object to the proposal.

Tom Valverde, a water specialist with the state engineer's Las

Cruces office, said, American Lode "is a mining corporation that has declared a couple of wells for use for mining."

Declaring is a term used by the state to designate a claim by a water user for the use of water by diversion from a well or a body of surface water.

Valverde explained the application process.

"We don't accept or reject a claim," Valverde said. "However, we do regulate permits."

"The application must be advertised three separate weeks and then a 10-day protest period is allowed. After that, the state engineer evaluates the application and action is taken."


If the application is approved, it becomes a recognized right for the amount of the claim or less, he said.

"It will be subject to certain con-


ditions such as proof of beneficial use submitted generally within four years."

Specifically, the application by the company on Mechem Drive, proposes to divert for consumptive use 1,450 acre feet per annum of the ground water of the Tularosa Underground Water Basin from a well 420 feet in depth with 12-inch casing, located in the southwest quarter of the northwest quarter of Section 13, Township 9 South, Range 12 East, for the sale of water to the city of Alamogordo via existing pipeline.

To file a protest to application T-1901-Enlarged, a person must state how it might infringe on existing water rights. An objection must be in writing, in triplicate and sent to Eluid L. Martinez, State Engineer, 133 Wyatt Drive, Suite 3, Las Cruces, NM 88005.







A vote for the mill levy is a vote for good medical care

Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC) is more than just a "little country hospital." It's a multi-faceted treasure that area voters have supported in the past. Voters will have a chance on September 16 to renew their commitment to high quality health care.

Here are some reasons to vote "yes" on a new 4.25 mill levy on September 16:

1. The hospital mill levy will NOT increase taxes. The current 4.25 mill levy is running out, and the new one will keep costs down.

2. LCMC keeps pace with the fast-paced medical technology and enhances that with a fine medical staff. LCMC management has maintained low costs without sacrificing quality or efficiency, with the last rate increase implemented in April 1990. As a matter of fact, LCMC's rates are among the lowest in the region.

3. Besides the hospital in Ruidoso, LCMC operates primary care clinics in Carrizozo, Corona and Hondo. That means that good quality care is available close to home, and that keeps costs down for everybody.

4. LCMC contributes to the economy of Ruidoso and the county. As an employer and local business, LCMC puts nearly \$8 million a year into the economy in salary and benefits for its 100 or so employees. Those staff members live here, spending as much as \$400,000 on local purchases.

5. LCMC doesn't turn people away. The hospital provides medical care to everyone without regard to their ability to pay, and that resulted in a million dollars in free care last year. In a state where a high percentage of people can't afford healthcare insurance, it's important to note that the burden falls on hospitals, like LCMC, that have no other choice but to provide a safety net.

This list could go on and on, and it will. This upcoming mill levy will be in the news for the next month, and we'll be among the people making sure that voters get plenty of information before they go to the polls. Meanwhile, it's not too soon to start spreading the word that LCMC is a vital part of this community and we need to support it.

LCMC and its staff take care of the people of this community when they're sick, injured or in need of treatment, let's be sure that good care will continue to be available by voting for the mill levy.

A vote for the mill levy is a vote for good medical care

Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC) is more than just a "little country hospital." It's a multi-faceted treasure that area voters have supported in the past. Voters will have a chance on September 15 to renew their commitment to high quality health care.

Here are some reasons to vote "yes" on a new 4.25 mill levy on September 15:

1. The hospital mill levy will NOT increase taxes. The current 4.25 mill levy is running out, and the new one will keep property taxes for the hospital at the current level. Remember (and tell your friends) the mill levy on the September 15 ballot is NOT a tax increase.

2. LCMC is a high-quality rural facility that has kept pace with the fast-paced medical technology and enhances that with a fine medical staff. LCMC management has maintained low costs without sacrificing quality or efficiency, with the last rate increase implemented in April 1990. As a matter of fact, LCMC's rates are among the lowest in the region.

3. Besides the hospital in Ruidoso, LCMC operates primary care clinics in Carrizozo, Corona and Hondo. That means that good quality care is available close to home, and that keeps costs down for everybody.


