The rally and the Chamber of Commerce present Hospitality Night from 6-9 p.m. Thursday at


rally headquarters, followed by the night light parade at 9 p.m.

Police to patrol football games

It's a sign of the times and not a good one.

Security at Ruidoso High School football games this year will be provided by officers with the Ruidoso Police Department.

"What we did before was hire security guards (from a private firm)," district superintendent Mike Gladden told The Ruidoso News. "But with the concerns raised at the end of the school year about gang activities and such, we wanted to make sure we had an official presence at the games."

"The security people couldn't make arrests. If there was an altercation, they'd have to call the police for backup. We felt it would create a better climate to have two policemen visible."

The new official presence seemed to accomplish the desired

effect at Ruidoso's game with Tularosa, Gladden said.

Under an agreement approved by the Ruidoso Village Council last week, officers will work on overtime to assist the school district at games.

But since the village doesn't have overtime money budgeted for that purpose, the school district will reimburse the village. The officers will be paid time and a half. From August 28 to October 30, they will attend seven games. Besides the salary reimbursement, the district will pay any other benefits applicable and "a reasonable amount for overhead," the agreement specifies.

Approval was recommended by village manager Ron Wicker during a special village council meeting last week.

"We need to work together on

this," Wicker said. "We're not making money on this, only covering the cost."

Councilor Ron Andrews questioned whether it would be more appropriate for the district to use one of the private security firms in the county.

"I think it's a question that may be asked in the future," he said, adding that the village shouldn't compete with private enterprise.

Wicker at that time apparently wasn't aware that the school board already had tried the private security approach and had opted for a change.

He said the arrangement had been done for years. Mayor Victor Alonso told Andrews the answer to anyone who asks is "We've always done it."

The council approved the agreement unanimously.

Lodgers taxes talks take center stage in meeting

After months of successful, smooth sailing in calm waters, Ruidoso Mayor Victor Alonso warned the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce rougher times were ahead.

"Every meeting we have that deals with the chamber of commerce, deals with lodgers tax advertising. It gets so bogged down and complicated. If you (lodgers tax committee) have a plan to keep it simpler, I would be very eager to hear it. If it means cutting out the chamber completely, and having one body, being lodgers tax, that might be a very simple way to approach it," the mayor said.

Alonso also asked lodgers chairman Jay Francis to keep his proposal alive for next year to hire a contractor or a director for lodgers tax.

At first, Francis was not sure what the mayor was talking about when he said "proposal." The mayor was recalling events resolved months earlier.

"You're not prepared at this meeting to talk about the proposal that I heard you make about ...

maybe that's next year," Alonso said.

"I don't know what you're talking about," Francis said. "A proposal for (what)?"

"Did I not understand that you proposed that we hire a contractor or a director from lodgers tax, that's no longer viable for this year," Alonso said.

"That's a dead issue, this year, right," Francis said. He then tried to steer the meeting back to its intended purpose.

The mayor, however, wanted to clarify his position. He did it in a way that indicated he wanted to investigate a change with the chamber's handling of the advertising budget after this fiscal year.

"The point is, we've got a budget and they've been funded and it's in the middle of the year," Alonso said. "This is not a meeting where you're going to propose some drastic deep changes in the philosophy. I'm very anxious to hear that proposal. I don't want that to die in the back of your mind."

But Francis was more concerned about getting current council guidance, which was the intent of the meeting.

The meeting was called by the council, lodgers tax and the chamber to discuss the proper format to bring lodgers-chamber business before the council.

Alonso's opening statements were surprising to both lodgers and the chamber representatives.

Francis said part of the present confusion stemmed from the time the council dropped the Regional Advertising Board (RAB).

He said the RAB and lodgers tax were virtually the same board. Without direction from council, Francis assumed the two boards had been incorporated as one and business was as usual, which was an in-depth study of the advertising program.

However, Joan Bailey, chamber director, was given different advice from the council when she and chamber president Paul Crown appeared before it prior to the new fiscal year.

The council voted on Bailey and the chamber to handle the advertising program for one year. Apparently, no one from the council had a discussion with the lodgers tax board to clarify how the two boards

No easy answers in landfills

The availability of federal land for use as sanitary landfills probably won't have much impact on Lincoln County's search for a regional garbage disposal site.

That was the assessment of Ruidoso Village Councilor Ron Andrews in his capacity as treasurer of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority.

Andrews attended a meeting last week with representatives from the newly-formed Otero County solid waste group.

"That group actively is looking at three or four locations for a landfill," he told The Ruidoso News. "They've run tests, but the data still is insufficient to select a site."

"As far as the BLM (Bureau of Land Management) land is concerned, yes, it's possible, but we've been told that it could be a 16-18 month process after a site is selected."

Since the city of Alamogordo faces a two-year time limit (before closure) on its Dog Canyon landfill, the BLM land timeframe just wouldn't work, Andrews said.

The new rule, an amendment to the Recreation and Public Purposes Act, becomes effective February 1. It will provide procedures for permanent conveyance of public lands for solid waste disposal or related purposes "which may result in or include the disposal, placement or release of any hazardous substance," according to a news release from Guadalupe Martinez of the BLM office in Santa Fe.

The act authorized the Secretary of the Interior to convey public land by patent for new solid waste disposal sites with a limited reverter clause, to convert existing leases into patents without the reverter provision; and to remove the reverter provision from existing patents.

Both the Otero and Lincoln

County solid waste authorities are coalitions of each county governing body and their municipalities.

"It doesn't appear they are nearly as organized as we are," Andrews said of the newly-formed Otero authority.

"Alamogordo seems to be the only one ready to bring its environmental gross receipts tax to the organization," he said. "We have a group with assets and gross receipt taxes committed by its members."

The Lincoln authority was formed two years ago and its members have been urging Otero to follow suit and join in developing a regional landfill.

However, concern was expressed by some Lincoln members at the last authority meeting that Otero may rush ahead with tests on sites without enough preliminary study and then ask Lincoln County to kick in some money.

Andrews said apparently that's not the case.

Hunters make a grisly discovery

Hunters walking a fence line north of Capitan Peak near Boy Scout Camp Road Sunday morning, stumbled on parts of a human skeleton.

"These muzzle loader hunters out of Roswell found a skull and some other pieces scattered in the area off Forest Road 130 (about 17 miles northeast of Capitan)," said Lincoln County Sheriff James McSwane.

"What they and the deputies gathered has been shipped to Albuquerque to the office of the state medical examiner for identification and any possible cause of death.

"The speculation that the death may have occurred four years ago is more 'guesstimate' than estimate," said McSwane.

His department will be reviewing all reports of missing persons for the last few years.

Insurance in question for 'cycle rally

As of last Friday, Councilor Ron Andrews Golden Aspen Motorcycle Rally was still without proper insurance to protect the village, according to village manager Ron Wicker.

The council and staff have known for more than two weeks that the insurance submitted by Andrews did not adequately cover the rally.

In fact, village attorney David Thomsen last week wrote, "as things stand now, it (civic event center) is not covered."

Since that opinion by the attorney, the mayor and council have

met twice without discussing the matter.

Wicker promised The News he would call the newspaper when insurance was obtained.

He said the attorney was still waiting for information from Naughton and that a rider was being considered.

Thomsen wrote that motorcycle promoter, Ruidoso Village Councilor Ron Andrews, had signed the standard rental agreement for the Civic Events Center.

"It (agreement) includes an indemnity clause which ... would protect the village if it was adequately backed by insurance. As things stand now, it is not covered."

The insurance Andrews submitted was from Naughton Insurance, a respected motorcycle insurance company specializing in racing.

State insurance commission representative David Cox called the policy narrow in scope and doubts that it would cover much more than a parade.

Thomsen noted at least two questionable paragraphs that excepted from coverage bodily injury or property damage arising out of the use of any motorcycle (ATV) which is not authorized to actually perform and compete in a named event. And another paragraph that Thomsen said if allowed to remain

would make the village's indemnity agreement worthless.

Wicker called The News Monday and said that Gerald Carr of Naughton Insurance faxed the village a statement that read "convention is covered under policy, even though terms refer to racing liability at race meet."

Wicker said he showed that information to Dave Parks, village insurer, who seemed to think the information was adequate.

Wicker said the village is still waiting for more information from Carla Merrick of the American Empire Surplus Lines Insurance Company, listed with Naughton as the insurance company.

Downs trustees to hear from chamber

Ruidoso Downs trustees will have several old items of business to take care of as well as some new ones at their board meeting at 7 p.m. tonight at the Ruidoso Downs Fire Station.

Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce executive director Joan Bailey will be returning to request approval for lodgers tax funds for a part-time person at the chamber office to respond to visitor inquiries. Bailey received preliminary approval for \$5,800 for the Lodgers Tax Advisory Board, but when the recommendation was tabled by the board of trustees until she could give

them some additional information.

Trustees asked Bailey for a job description for the person and also a list of chamber members from the village of Ruidoso Downs. Bailey had made the request because of the increase in numbers of people requesting information on the area or stopping by the office for information. She approached Ruidoso Downs with the idea of helping to fund the person because many of the village's businesses benefit from what the chamber of commerce is doing.

Also on tonight's agenda will be a presentation by Ladona House,

director of the Alamogordo youth center. House had been scheduled to speak at last month's meeting but could not attend. Trustee Judy Miller had visited the center in Alamogordo and was impressed by it. She asked House to come to Ruidoso Downs to give the presentation to help the village get a youth club or center started.

The trustees will get an update on the E911 system. The board will also consider a request to remove a street light near a residence and will open bids on police units and a salt box. Certificates of appreciation will also be awarded to mem-

bers of the police department for a recent arrest.

The board is also expected to give approval to go out for bids for gravel and hauling for Wood Lane. They also plan to amend an ordinance pertaining to the lodgers tax concerning the terms of officers and a reserve fund for economic development. Trustee Miller will also be appointed to the lodgers tax board to replace Karen Stevens, who resigned.

A Downs resident will also be asking the trustees' assistance with a contaminated water well.

Village hires Tucumcari man as deputy manager

Alan D. Briley of Tucumcari beat out nearly 90 applicants to become Ruidoso's new deputy manager.

Briley is a new Mexico registered professional engineer with more than eight years experience in municipal government.

According to his resume, Briley is experienced in a wide variety of areas including engineering design, project administration, personnel management, budgetary proce-

dures, scheduling, federal and state grant management and public interaction.

Briley's last job was as city engineer for Tucumcari, working as a department head. His responsibilities included scheduling, personnel, expenditures and annual budget.

As city engineer, he provided the technical assistance as required for all departments including: solid

waste, streets, water, waste water and planning.

Briley, graduated in 1981 from New Mexico State University in Las Cruces with a bachelor of science degree in civil engineering.

He also attended New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology in Socorro, taking pre-engineering courses in environmental engineering.

Briley also worked as a resident

engineer in El Paso, Texas; development coordinator for Tierra del Sol Housing Corp., Las Cruces; design engineer, city of Las Cruces; and civil engineer II, city of Roswell.

Ruidoso village manager Ron Wicker said Briley's starting pay will be the same as Gary Jackson, over \$39,000. Jackson resigned from the position to take a city manager's job in Texas.

The case of the missing Councilor Bill Karn continues into month #3

When an elected Ruidoso councilor misses seven of the last eight council meetings, do the residents of Ruidoso have a right to know why?

Councilor Bill Karn has been missing from his council seat all but one time since last July 14.

His one recent time was on August 25. That was an important meeting for Councilor Ron Andrews. Andrews had lost his bid to eliminate a clause that would allow unrestricted R-1 (residential) use on some property he was purchasing.

Mayor Victor Alonso had said he and Andrews weren't being treated like ordinary people.

The issue was tabled. And unless it came off the table by the next meeting, it would have been a dead issue.

Councilor Barbara Duff, who had been keeping in contact with Karn and who says he's in California, said Karn would be at the August 25 meeting to discuss, among other things, a stalker's law. Duff also had a rambling statement about the MRS and Tennessee that Karn had told her.

Andrews, sometime after the August 17 council meeting, wrote a letter to the mayor that the hearing regarding his property had been unfair.

Among his reasons, he listed that councilor Duff didn't know what she was doing. Duff agreed

with Andrews that she had been confused and she made a motion to bring it off the table the next meeting.

Karn returned for that meeting. Some of the material Karn had wanted to distribute to the council wasn't ready, he said.

Karn seconded Duff's motion and the hearing on Andrews property came off the table for further discussion.

The problem apparently was resolved to everyone's satisfaction.

That was Karn's last council meeting.

On Labor Day weekend, the village experienced a terrible sediment problem in the drinking water.

The Ruidoso News called the councilors for comment. A message was left on Karn's answering machine.

Tuesday, before the last council meeting, Karn called The News and asked what the call on the "brown water" meant.

The News told Karn it had been a major problem and was surprised that Karn had not received any calls.

The News said it would be an item of discussion at the council meeting, and asked Karn if he would be there.

He said he "might" make it.

The News asked if he was calling from New Mexico. He said he was.

But when The News asked the

council that night the whereabouts of Karn, the mayor said he didn't know and Duff answered that he was still in California.

The News also asked Karn if he was feeling well and mentioned that he looked pale at the council meeting for someone living in sunny California.

Karn said he had not felt well for that last meeting. He said he was pale because he was working under houses in California.

What is the true story on councilor Karn? Is he in California or New Mexico? Is he sick or healthy? Does the mayor really not care that Karn has lost so much time on the council? Do voters have a right to know?

would synchronize.

Bailey, with the chamber's own advertising board, worked on a hands-on approach, that was a variation of a former plan by advertising agent Phil Price.

Performing more in-house duties, the chamber has been able to cut production charges while increasing reach and frequency with major advertising buys such as Texas Monthly.

Francis contends, since placement through Texas Monthly is handled by Phil Price, Price gets a 15 percent agency discount that the chamber could use.

The chamber contends that Price is used sparingly and that he represents professional consultation and research at no costs other than allowing placement of some advertising.

Francis also has a long-standing philosophical disagreement with the spending of lodgers money for relocation. He feels relocation advertising is an economic development obligation and that any money used from lodgers, is lodgers money lost.

Although the ordinance allows for such expenditures, he says there is state documentation that

states otherwise.

Francis said as a lodgers tax advisory board member he wants to be able to review the budget, go over the numbers and make sure the advertising is spent in the proper area.

Bailey agrees with Francis to a point.

If the lodgers-RAB board of the past made decisions in ad placement or methods of productions, that is no longer the case in Bailey's view.

She said the lodgers tax advisory board should not block her advertising program. It should agree or offer dissenting views and let the council make the ultimate decision.

Francis said he thought that was a workable solution, but wanted the council to counsel.

One of the central issues of the meeting was advertising for retirees.

Councilor J.D. James said that advertising not only helped bring retirees to Ruidoso, but they also spend a week or two in Ruidoso before deciding where to relocate, staying in motels and eating in restaurants.

James said that was advertising and it should be used from lodgers tax.

Councilor Jerry Shaw said that she checked with the Roswell cham-

ber of commerce. It is made up of four divisions: retirement, conventions-visitors bureau (CVB), economic development and the chamber.

Shaw said the chamber is funded by memberships; economic development receives its money from general funds; CVB from lodgers tax; and retirement raises money through several funds including CVB, which is lodgers tax money.

Shaw said use of lodgers tax for retiree advertising is perfectly legal. She said the chamber has experienced success the way they want to run the program. Francis disagreed, contending it could be better.

The mayor argued with Shaw over the roles of the lodgers tax committee and the chamber, although no one but Francis spoke for the lodgers tax committee.

"I don't want Jay (Francis) necessarily to lose sight of the fact that it's possible that we can restructure the way we've been doing things and cut the chamber out," Alonso said.

"The chamber of commerce has a representation of the population at large with all the political ends and outs, all the democrats, all the pro-Davis, all the pro-Alonso. And, boy, they get in there and they jam it up

and mix it up and they have differing opinions. Why do that?", the mayor asked.

But the mayor seemed to contradict his own words 10 minutes later when he told Francis to continue to mix it up with differing opinions.

"I feel more comfortable saying I want to hear your viewpoint, I heard Joan's viewpoint. Keep doing exactly what you're doing. Keep challenging and stimulating and asking those questions as to the dollars ought to go here, or the dollars ought to go there," he said.

Apparently, the mayor still didn't understand that "differing opinions" wasn't the problem. The principal concern was that "differing opinions" were not allowed to proceed to the council level for a decision.

Shaw said internal difference of opinions probably exist on both the chamber board and the lodgers tax committee. However, the mayor appoints the lodgers tax advisory board.

The mayor said the council can influence the lodgers tax.

"What influence do we have over the other population out there of the chamber?" the mayor asked.

"The chamber of commerce is responsible to us also," James said.

James then explained how the chamber submitted its advertising ideas to the lodgers. The lodgers would then see that the money was spent according to the approval of the council, not the approval of the lodgers tax board. And the lodgers tax committee would collect supporting documents to see that the money was spent as approved by the council.

Shaw said it is done that way all over the state, and she couldn't understand why there is a problem in Ruidoso.

The mayor and James asked the lodgers tax advisory board, all present but Ed Hyman, if they agreed with Francis that money should not be used for relocation.

Before any committee person had an opportunity to respond, Francis said he didn't want to speak for the committee, but indicated the committee had made no decision. Members didn't respond.

Chamber director Bailey said the responses came from young retirees and families who wanted to relocate in Ruidoso.

She said she looked upon tourism and economic development as one and the same.

Bailey then asked the council for a clarification of duties.

Although Alonso and Francis dominated the meeting with leng-

thy explanations and promotion philosophy, the mayor twice cautioned Bailey to limit her discussions.

He said this started from a lodgers disagreement that was escalated by the chamber director.

"The director of the chamber of commerce has chosen to escalate it (problem) and disagree with you and bring her case directly to the board," Alonso said.

The council then voted on spending the \$6,000 for retiree advertising. Councilors Shaw and James voted for advertising to retirees to locate in Ruidoso. Councilor Duff voted against advertising for retiree relocation.

Councilors Bill Karn, Ron Andrews and Frank Cummins were absent. Andrews had to leave on village landfill business halfway through the meeting.

Shaw made the successful motion for chamber officials to present their budget in a timely manner to the lodgers tax committee for input. If there is any difference of opinion, chamber representatives should present that budget to the council with a member of the lodgers tax committee present to give reasons for disagreement.

Under those circumstances, the council will make the final decision. James seconded the motion.



Arkansas woman tells GOP women "the rest of the story" on Clinton

Carole Baker told Federated Republican Women of Lincoln County (FRWLC) that Bill Clinton's flying record doesn't fit with his attempted moderate mask.

According to a news release provided by the FRWLC, Baker, a member of the Arkansas Federation of Republican Women who served as a delegate and platform committee member to the Republican National Convention in Houston, Texas, spoke to Republican women at their August meeting.

She quoted newspaper and magazine articles on the Democratic presidential candidate's record on education, taxes, his wife and their personal lives.

"He calls himself the education governor, but last year the National Assessment of Educational Progress ranked Arkansas students be-

low the national average. Arkansas is 25th out of 28 states that use the ACT (American College Test) for college placement, and 70 percent of public school graduates need remedial classes when they get college."

Arkansas is rural state that has a popular home school program, said Baker, "yet Clinton has come out against both home schools and private schools."

According to one magazine article, Clinton has also spoken against the Balanced Budget Amendment, saying it would "place too many restrictions" on federal spending, continues the news release.

"He says he's for the poor," continued the Arkansas resident, "but he taxed food, used cars and mobile homes, items frequently used by the poor," Baker was quoted as

saying.

"Both Clintons want the government to take over the rearing of children," Baker continued.

Baker finished by reviewing both Clintons' college activities.

"He dodged the draft and was a protege of J. William Fulbright, who protested the war with Jane Fonda. Fonda is on Clinton's side now. Hillary was involved with left-wing causes at Wellesley."

According to the news release, as a delegate, Baker became appalled by the "hostile attitude of the TV reporters to us. They sought us out for interviews then asked leading, negative questions."

During the business meeting, FRWLC pledged total support of all Republican candidates in the upcoming general election.





NMMI stalls Warrior offense

Although the defense seems to be coming together for the Warrior football team, the offense still has a few problems to iron out after Friday night's 0-7 defeat by New Mexico Military Institute.

The Warrior offense was not able to get a first down on its opening drive, but the blue and gold had the ball back soon when NMMI quarterback Greg Robertson didn't get a good handle on the ball on the first snap. Jeff Cox recovered the ball for the Warriors but the offense was again unable to convert it to a first down.

One problem plagued the Warriors all night, negative yards. In 45 plays, the ball carrier was tackled for negative yards nine times. Coach Mike Gaston said they need to eliminate the negative yardage plays and the penalties that drove them back into their own territory several times Friday night. The team also had a few problems with

the kicking game and broken assignments, but the players are still learning the system, he said.

"We can't be starting off deep in our own end all the time. We also need to straighten out our assignments on offense. When our defense plays that well, our offense has to execute and take advantage of opportunities," Gaston said.

Twice NMMI's center snapped the ball over the head of the punter to put Ruidoso near the goal line, but the Warriors could not make it in for any points. The Warriors recovered three fumbles from NMMI, while the Colts had one interception. The Warriors' goal has been to have one or less turnovers, and this game they were able to do just that.

Gaston said the defense has been working hard on its fundamentals, and it started to show during the NMMI game. The Warrior defense only gave up 88 yards and

nine first downs to NMMI.

The Warrior offense had only 19 total yards in the game and made just two first downs. Quarterback Victor Cocchiola had eight pass attempts and three completions, while new punter John Echols had to punt nine times for a 26-yard average. The Warriors had six penalties for 48 yards, while NMMI was penalized six times for 45 yards.

Mario Sanchez had 13 rushes for 33 yards and Anthony Torres ran six times for 24 yards. NMMI's only touchdown came in the second quarter when quarterback Robertson made it into the end zone on a 14-yard run. Gaston said NMMI was just a big, strong team with plenty of players to send in to keep the offense and defense fresh.

Coach Gaston said he and the other coaches were proud of the players for keeping up their spirit throughout the game and after the loss. He said he was impressed by the great senior leadership shown by Sanchez and Cox, among others. Cox had an outstanding game on both offense and defense, and besides recovering a fumble he also caused one. Torres also had a solid performance on both sides of the ball.

The coaches were also impressed by the whole team's attitude because it is easy to put blame elsewhere, but these kids didn't.

"Winners find a way. Losers find excuses. We are going to find a way. When the opportunity comes, we've got to do it," he said.

"It was a disappointing loss, but seeing them pull together makes me feel good because it is going to pay off. They have a lot of heart and pride in their school and that is

part of what pulls them together. They are working too hard to get the rewards," he said.

"I was proud to see they had the emotion and fire in the game and we will build on that this week," he said.

The Warriors will be facing rival Tularosa here Friday, with one of the teams coming out of the battle with its first victory of the season and Gaston says it will be Ruidoso. Tularosa has been defeated by Cloudcroft, Hatch and Santa Rosa.

"We are both 0-3 and the Warriors are accepting the challenge. That first win will be for us," he said.

Gaston said rivalry, such as this, is one of the exciting things about football, and it adds a little more fun to the game. He said Tulie is about the same size, as far as number of players, and the team is also adjusting to a new coach, like Ruidoso. Wildcat players also play both offense and defense like the Warriors, so it should be a good match-up.

The Warrior freshman team played Tularosa earlier this season and won 41-0, but a junior varsity game Saturday went to Tulie's win column with a final score of 6-20. Although this provides Warrior coaches an opportunity to see what the Wildcats are up to, Tulie coaches also know what approach the Warriors have taken this season.

"We don't want to spend too much time worrying about what the other guy does, instead of what we need to do. It will come down to who wants it more, who plays harder and who takes advantage of the opportunities in the game," Gaston said.

Freshmen look for third win


The future of the Warrior football team looks fairly promising if the young freshman team can keep rolling over its opponents like it has the last two.

Exercise means feeling good, looking good, for all ages

Every year at about this time the Ruidoso Athletic Club has a visitor who is a prime example of what exercise can do for a person.

Bob Beaumont is a 68-year-old from Tucson, Arizona, who lives by the theory that exercise makes life more enjoyable. This is the third year Beaumont and his wife, Sheila, have spent a few weeks exercising at the RAC and hiking in the hills. Each time he comes to the RAC, he gets more than one or two surprised looks as he tells people his age.

Since it is not good to work out every day, he runs six to 10 miles five days a week, and then he works out on weights or a Nautilus machine three to four times a week. He and his wife also get up in the morning to hike on the trails in the national forest. He said his wife keeps up with him on the trails, but she is just a youngster at 60. They both head for the roughest, steepest trails to make it challenging.

"It is not an accident that I look like this. You will look good if you take care of yourself. It means a lot of exercise and that takes a lot of will power to keep doing it," Beaumont said.

His exercise kick began when he was small and got picked on by bullies. Beaumont and a friend decided to do something about it so they went to the YMCA. They were taught boxing and judo among

other things, and were ready to whip the bullies in about eight months, he said.

Beaumont maintained his interest in judo and is now a sixth dan and teaches it to children and senior citizens.

During World War II Beaumont served in the Marines, and he continued to exercise and lift weights. He said no matter how much he worked out, though, he still felt bad because he smoked so he quit that habit.

"I enjoy the fact that I feel so good all the time. I am never sick. I never get headaches and I am never depressed," Beaumont said.

He said the problem with people is that they are greedy for money, but money gets them nothing if they don't have good health too. He describes himself as a go-aholic, who has to be doing something all the time.

The Beaumonts love the climate, the friendly people and all the activities available here. After leaving Ruidoso they plan to spend three weeks in the mountains of Colorado with a stop in Durango, Colorado. He also has a house near Branson, Missouri, and visits there, too.

"There is no one too old to benefit from exercise. There is no limit to how good you can feel. If you have good health, age is just a number," Beaumont said.



Many people are surprised that Beaumont is 68 years-old, and Beaumont says that by exercising he feels younger and can do any physical exercise he wants. His exercise plan while in Ruidoso includes hiking and then working out at the RAC.



One woman injured in early Sunday morning bar fight

A vicious fight broke out early Sunday morning at the Winner's Circle bar in Ruidoso that sent one woman to the hospital with severe lacerations to the face.

Melissa Baldonado, 21, of Ruidoso Downs was severely cut about the face with a beer bottle in an altercation with Debbie Denise Jones of Ruidoso Downs.

Officers said Baldonado spent four hours in the emergency room at the Lincoln County Medical Center where she was treated and

released.

The fight allegedly was over a boyfriend.

Officers Laura Standridge and Rocky Reynolds arrived at the Winner's Circle about 1:45 a.m. Sunday morning.

Police reports indicate Reynolds approached Baldonado, who was bleeding profusely, while Standridge broke into the crowd surrounding Jones.

Jones told Standridge that Baldonado was mouthing off and threw a punch. She said she ducked the punch and hit her over the head

with a beer bottle, according to police.

Standridge said that the beer bottle broke over Baldonado's head and then Jones allegedly gouged or raked the bottle down the girl's left cheek from her eye area to the corner of her left lip, then from the center of the lip down the chin and then gashed her forehead.

Officers said Baldonado was losing a lot of blood.

Standridge wrote in her report that the crowd in the bar was beginning to get unruly, so she in-

formed Jones she was taking her into protective custody until an investigation could be made and to clear the crowd.

She wrote that she placed Jones in her unit and started back inside when a male shouted, "How would you like this bottle busted in your face, bitch."

Standridge wrote that she decided to bring Jones to the station to get her out of the area. Back up officer Bob Layher had arrived. Standridge took Jones to the police department and then returned to

the Winner's Circle.

Standridge wrote that as she approached the parking lot, four males were outside with beer bottles. She then joined the paramedics inside the bar as they prepared to transfer Baldonado to the hospital.

Citations were issued to both subjects for disorderly conduct. No one would agree to press charges.

The two women were to appear before Municipal Judge Chuck Hawthorne at 9 a.m. today (Monday).

Clarification

Winner's Circle co-owner Neva Roche objected to a story in last Thursday's edition about a series of arrests made by the White Mountain Drug Task Force.

Investigators confirmed that the story was accurate, but only three of the four drug cases originated in the Winner's Circle. Two of the four arrests were made in the Winner's Circle parking lot.

Roche stressed that she favors strict drug enforcement, but contends vehemently that the "where" in a news story is irrelevant.

Angler can fish free in New Mexico on National Hunting and Fishing Day

New Mexico anglers can fish "free" September 26, National Hunting and Fishing Day.

The one-day-only activity, when anglers can fish without a license, is to encourage the sport of fishing in a state that has numerous warm- and cold-water fisheries, said Steve Henry, chief of the Game and Fish Department's Fisheries Management Division.

While no license is required to fish on September 26, anglers must abide by all other regulations gov-

erning fishing, including bag limits and bait or lure requirements.

To fish at other times requires a license that costs \$14 for a resident and \$41 for a nonresident.

The 1991 New Mexico state legislature established two "free" fishing days twice each year in New Mexico, and the State Game commission this year set the days as June 6, National Fishing Day, and September 26.

Fishing proclamations outlining

regulations are available from Department of Game and Fish offices in Santa Fe, Albuquerque, Raton, Roswell and Las Cruces, and from about 220 vendors statewide.

Proclamations for the fishing season 1991-92 are valid, but some amendments to regulations have been made for 1992-93, including creation of a special trout water along the Rio Penasco in Chavez County. Limit there is two trout per day. Artificial flies and lures with single, barbless hooks must be used

on any special trout water.

The theme for this year's observance of National Hunting and Fishing Day is "Even Old Traditions Need New Beginnings...Start Tomorrow's Sportsmen Today." The theme signals a major shift in focus for the annual event, according to the National Shooting Sports Foundation, sponsor of the event.

The theme calls on individual sportsmen and clubs to plan programs and one-on-one activities to introduce today's youngsters to

their American sporting heritage, the NSSF said.

During the 20-year history of NHF Day, sportsmen's groups and individual hunters and anglers, manufacturers, state and federal wildlife agencies and sporting goods retailers have played an important role in the event.

Local gun clubs and other outdoor sporting organizations hold open houses with demonstrations, exhibits and shooting competitions.

Conservation agencies often offer their facilities to the public or offer "free" fishing days as the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish is sponsoring.

Many sponsor week-long celebrations featuring displays, demonstrations, game-calling contests, decoy carving and wildlife art exhibits.

National Hunting and Fishing Day was established by Congressional Resolution in 1971.

"She's good with other dogs and she's housebroken," Basch said.

"She'd be good for a single or couple who live in an apartment."

A past featured pet who has not been adopted but stirred the heart of one reader enough to offer to sponsor him (pay for his neutering) is Norman. The adorable white spitz mix with the swirl of brown and black around one eye also is looking forward to bonding with someone who really cares.

Sponsoring one of the cats or dogs at the shelter vastly improves its chances for adoption since spaying and neutering is the major cost connected to taking an animal home from the facility.

All animals adopted from the society must be altered to ensure they will not contribute to the production of more unwanted animals who might be abused or have to be destroyed.

A good example is a recent litter of kittens brought to the shelter.

A female barn cat owned by workers at Ruidoso Downs Race Track gave birth just days before the end of the racing season.

The owner instructed a family member to put the kittens in a dumpster where they would have died slowly of dehydration and starvation, or might have been smothered by more debris or crushed by the garbage compactor.

Instead, the person brought the newborn kittens to the society.

Without the mother cat (which the owners kept, but still didn't spay — more kittens to come) their chances of survival were very slim. Knowing there was no way she could hand feed and care for all four kittens every few hours, a shelter worker picked out the one

she felt had the best chance for survival. She put the other three with another female cat who recently had kittens. She hoped the female would allow them to nurse, but they died within two days.

The fortunate fourth kitten still seems to be doing all right.

The worker was able to save one, but the society kennels are full with puppies and kittens that won't be so lucky. Even if they manage to avoid the diseases that befall so many, few will find homes. In the end, the animals the shelter workers try so hard to help may have to be destroyed anyway.

The message needs to be repeated over and over, especially to children so that the practice of euthanasia someday only will be used for extremely ill and elderly pets, Basch said. The message is

Vrrrooom! 1992 Golden Aspen Rally roars into town!

Two-wheelers take to the streets and highways in and around Ruidoso for the Golden Aspen Rally's 23rd annual Southwest Tour beginning this Wednesday.

The fun begins on Wednesday and continues through Sunday with rally headquarters in the new Ruidoso Civic Events Center.

But the festivities are not limited to the civic events center. The Golden Aspen Rally is a community event, and it has been since Tim Thompson came up with the idea more than 20 years ago.

Thompson called it Ruidoso Aspencade, in honor of the beautiful trees that turn gold throughout this mountain resort area. Thompson knew that nature would provide a feast for the eyes of bikers who tour the mountains and slopes around Ruidoso.

When Thompson left the Ruidoso area in the 1970s, he took the name Aspencade with him, but

the rally continues under a new name and new ownership.

For some years the motorcycle rally was the same weekend as another community event, the Aspen festival. Both weekends draw so many visitors to Ruidoso that they were separated to extend the fall season offering more opportunities and activities for locals and visitors.

Golden Aspen Rally leads off the fall parade this weekend.

WE LOVE A PARADE!

And a highlight of the week for motorcycle watchers will be the Saturday parade down Sudderth Drive. Riders will begin lining up at 9 a.m. Saturday, September 19, in the parking lot of Furr's on Mechem Drive, and the caravan is scheduled to roll at 9:30 a.m.

Pick a spot early for the Golden Aspen Rally parade, because crowds line both sides of Sudderth

Drive from one end to the other.

The parade is the feature of the day on Saturday, and motorcycles can join the fun with no fee or registration required. The parade will be led by the 1992 Golden Aspen Rally queen, king and court, followed by last year's royalty and the Permian Basin Motorcycle Association.

Awards will be presented for the best dressed club, the largest club, best dress fraternal organization and largest fraternal organization.

But that big parade will be the second of the week.

The night light parade will light up the streets at 9 p.m. Thursday, September 17. Fancy cycles and trailers with their lights aglow will be led south on Highway 48 (Mechem) and then east on Sudderth Drive to the Y-Knot Amusement Park at the "Y."

Admission is free on Thursday night with free snacks available.

NEW, IMPROVED

The new Golden Aspen Rally, revitalized under the ownership of

Ruidoso Village Councilor Ron Andrews, includes a trade show, two parades, exhibits, competitions, tours and entertainment.

It all begins at 8 a.m. Wednesday with registration and free donuts at the rally headquarters in the Ruidoso Civic Events Center.

The Trade Show officially opens at 1 p.m., with a movie, field events and bike judging on Wednesday afternoon.

The trade show will be open until 8 p.m. Wednesday, from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Thursday, Friday and Saturday and from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. Sunday.

THRILLS, NO SPILLS

Bob Duffey, the man who has broken the records of both Evil Knievel and Knievel's son, will thrill audiences this week with his stunt and safety show.

Duffey, the American Motorcycle Association champion cycle jumper, will perform at 7:30 p.m. Thursday and at 2 p.m. and 8 p.m. Friday and Saturday.

Duffey holds the 1/4 mile speed record backwards and a 60 mph average on 1/2 mile oval backwards. His show will be in the parking lot of the Civic Events Center.
