Warriors tame Tularosa Wildcats

By believing in themselves and their teammates, the Ruidoso Warrior football team overcame several setbacks early in the game Friday night for its first victory of the season against Tularosa.

Tularosa made a quick strike on the opening kick-off return and then recovered a Ruidoso fumble as the Warriors were about to score. Coach Mike Gaston said the players could have panicked at that point, but they didn't. They kept their poise and didn't get down, he said.

The Warriors were back in busi-

ness just a few minutes later and got ahead for good in the second quarter for a final score of 34-19. Gaston said he was pleased with the fundamental performance of the offensive line during the game. They had only one fumbled snap. The line gave the quarterback more time to execute and opened more holes for the running backs than in the past three games.

Gaston said each week the team sets goals and the first goal for the offense was to score. The first goal for the defense was also to score

and both sides were able to accomplish that when Billy Austin intercepted a pass and ran it in for a touchdown on the last play of the game.

"The goal for the whole team was for the kids to believe in themselves and their teammates. We knew we had to do that to win. That first kick-off pumped up the other team, but we never stopped believing in ourselves," he said.

Scott Stricklin had four quarterback sacks and stopped the ball carrier behind the line of scrimmage two times for a great blocking

game, Gaston said. Mario Sanchez and J.R. Chino had a good game on defense, while Sanchez was also the leading rusher on offense with 153 yards. The team was also ignited by a hit made by junior varsity player Patrick Kazhe on a kick off return in the first half.

Gaston was also impressed by freshman Byron Soules, who did the kicking for the Warriors. He said Soules was nervous at first, but by the end of the game he was getting the ball down to the Tulie five yard line. He kicked well and it also gave Chino, the regular kicker,


a break between going from offense and defense.

Gaston said the coaches have plans to give the starting players rests throughout the game so they can be fresh in the fourth quarter but it isn't always possible.


He said the players are beginning to understand practice time is paying off and they have begun to practice with more intensity, which is showing in the games. Gaston said they haven't had a week yet that everyone attended each day of practice, which would lead to more consistency for the team. After the

game senior players encouraged their teammates to make that happen.

"It was a real tribute to the kids to keep playing away after the adversity, but nothing helps like a win. This was my first win here and to have it come against Tularosa was a good feeling. We are looking forward to even more, now that we are starting to get the system together. I am encouraged about the future and the future is going to happen real quick," he said.

Law and order reins over motorcycle rally

Ruidoso law enforcement aided by county and state officers flexed its muscle this weekend and kept the peace in a village crowded with hundreds of motorcyclists.

With their hands politically untied for the first time in two years, officers threw offending bikers in jail, diffused potentially dangerous situations and set the tone for the 1992 Golden Aspen Motorcycle Rally.

Public pressure had demanded the two years of village council denial be replaced with solid police control.

The message was clear: there's a new sense of law and order in town. Officers openly embraced the new guidelines, which allowed them to do the job.

Riders and officers contacted by The Ruidoso News, both agreed that the many arrests this year did not mean it was a bad rally. Just as no arrests last year did not mean it was a good rally.

Ruidoso police said the tone for this year's control was set early at Lincoln County borders where Sheriff James McSwane stationed officers at road blocks.

Bikers had to present their license and proof of insurance.

After word was passed, bikers started approaching the road blocks with license and insurance held high for examination.

At one Thursday road block, deputies cited 80 bikers and motorists, many local.

Once the bikers reached Ruidoso, there was high visibility of many state and local police in the downtown area.

Blinking red and blue lights flashed warnings along Mechem and Sudderth.

As one dispatch officer put it, "This year we had a big dog sitting in our front yard."

Police chief Richard Swenor said there were 48 drinking arrests in Ruidoso.

Ruidoso Downs chief Will Hogard said he processed about four arrests and 20 citations.

McSwane said his deputies wrote more than 150 citations over the weekend, mostly at the front end. "There were some arrests, but the majority were processed through the Ruidoso Police Department," he said.

"We proved that the different law enforcement agencies can work well together this weekend. It was nice knowing that there was an officer around the corner if you needed him. I actually enjoyed it. It really went smooth."

"The whole effort, state police, ABC agents (Alcohol Tobacco and Firearm), county sheriff's department, my guys, Ruidoso Downs, everything went as smooth as clockwork. The team work was totally outstanding," said an elated Swenor.

"You could see it when they brought the people to jail. It looked like an assembly line."

Swenor was reflecting on the holding area outside the dispatch office where a line of handcuffed persons waited their turn to get printed, photographed and sent to a cell, while another line of prisoners departed from a cell, paid their fine and left.

The line didn't diminish until sometime after 3 a.m.

At that time the streets were empty and they also were clean. Last year's littered highway of beer cans and bottles was no where to be found. A testament to the strict enforcement of the open container.

The parks, a haven for drinkfests last year, were left immaculate this year. The obvious difference was the appearance every hour of patrol cars.

A strong mid-day odor of beer hops hung heavy throughout midtown, although no drinking could be seen.

Swenor said it emanated from empty beer cans and bottles dropped into dumpsters and heated by the sun.

"It's that same odor that draws bears in the summer," he said.

Barricades were placed at the entrances and exits of the golf course. Police said the barricades could have been circumvented; however, no biker chose to do so.

Police said the well behaved bikers seemed to know that if the rally was to continue for another year, things couldn't be like they were for the past two years.

The local police knew they were in control this year. They had the numbers in back up and for this, they were happy.

As Swenor stated, for the past two years dollars were scarce and not enough police were placed on the job.

In their assessment a two-day compilation of quotes was taken from many officers covering the rally.

"This year was a good plan. That's the way it used to be up until two years ago when politics started playing a hand in it. That's where it got all screwed up.

"There was no big gathering in any certain area, except in the bars and we watched those easily."

Sheriff feels fenced in by commission

The rift between Lincoln County Commissioners and Sheriff James McSwane appeared to widen even further Friday.

Although McSwane, Commission Chairman Stirling Spencer and county manager Andy Wynham all maintained their cool, it was clear they were irritated during a discussion of sheriff's department staffing.

McSwane said he had requested that Wynham advertise for a records coordinator two weeks ago, but no ad has been placed.

The position of coordinator was cut from his McSwane's budget as part of the reorganization of personnel when the commission took over the operation jail earlier this month.

Commissioners contended that with the jail removed as one of his responsibilities, McSwane didn't need three administrative as-

sistants. The salary for the coordinator was used to offset the cost of a new jailer.

But they offered to consider other alternatives, if McSwane came up with a proposal.

He did that Friday. Commissioners said they would review his proposal and come back with a response at their meeting in October.

Spencer said he was stopped Wynham from placing the advertisement for the records coordinator because there was no longer a salary for the job in the budget.

"I'm the one who put a damper on it until I saw the budget encumbrances and the plan you came with today," he said. He added that McSwane could place the ad on his own, but the commission would not authorize hiring until he could show the money was available.

"So you're telling me today that you're not going to rehire a records

coordinator, that the position has been deleted?" McSwane asked Spencer. "I have not deleted the job. She has resigned her position."

"You can advertise out of your budget," Spencer said. "I'm not telling you you can't advertise."

McSwane told commissioner Monroy Montes and Spencer that to generate the money he would need to rehire his records coordinator and to add some salary to a vacant deputy position, he would delete a part time transport officer and a paper server in Ruidoso. He also would cut about \$1,000 from each of three part-time dispatchers.

"The adjustments would allow me to advertise for a new deputy with five years experience and 500 additional hours of training," McSwane said.

But he warned that when commissioners sit down in December to review the budget, he probably will be there asking for more money to bring a paper server and transport

officer back on board.

"I believe at budget adjustment (time) I will be in asking for these again," McSwane said. "I can't afford to delete any positions, including my records coordinator. I need that position more than those I am eliminating."

Meanwhile, he will use volunteers, a woman who is a full-time officer or an administrative secretary for transport. Regular deputies will pick up the duties of the (court) paper server.

He estimated the savings produced by the cuts at \$11,117.

Spencer and Montes (Commissioner Bill Elliott was absent) both recalled that at budget time McSwane said he needed the paper server. Commissioners also have expressed concern over the build-up of compensatory time by dispatchers. Cutting their paid hours would only result in more comp time, Spencer said.

Long list of presidential candidates costs the county

A flood of presidential nominees from minor parties will force Lincoln County to lease a new voting machine system for the November general election.

"Because of the number on the ballot, we can't use the lever machines we have," County Clerk Martha Proctor told county commissioners Friday.

To accommodate those extra names, the county will have to fork over nearly \$15,000 for paper ballots and the machines that read and record them.

"It's a turnkey operation," Proctor said. "They'll program the machines, train the workers and supply a technician on election day."

The elections division under the Secretary of State selected the type of machine. Officials arranged for the rentals at \$500 per unit.

"I don't know how the state can mandate which (type to use) but we have to go that way because the ballots are ordered," Proctor said.

The price originally quoted was \$350 a machine, she said. But the state ordered too many and had to increase the amount to pass along the extra cost.

The county would need only one machine for each of its 16 precincts. Privacy booths, as simple as cardboard dividers, could be set up for voters marking their ballots, she said. Or the county could rent two for each precinct at \$12 each.

On the cost reduction side, the county would save \$680 for a reduced number of election workers and \$1,200 in programming charges.

County manager Andy Wynham said with a new system, county voters may take longer to mark their choices.

"We should take that into consideration," he said. "We may want more machines and booths instead of less."

Proctor said she wasn't worried about using paper ballots.

"The instructions are plain," she said. "You use a card and kind of connect the arrows."

"Many here may trust that system more (than the lever or elec-

tronic) because they remember the time when all we had were paper ballots. Absentee ballots are similar."

With the paper ballot, the county also has the physical evidence of how a person voted if the counting machine malfunctions, she said.

Commission Chairman Stirling Spencer agreed with Wynham that some extra machines should be leased.

"I think the county should stand the expense of some extra machines because I agree with Andy that it may take longer to vote," he said.

Proctor said the only other alternative would be to buy a new and different electronic voting system, something that she anticipated doing in four to five years, anyway.

"Our lever machines will be fine for the next four years after this election," she said. "But the time will come when we will need to convert to electronic machines."

Wynham said moving into an electronic system would cost the county about \$110,000. An agent probably would give them free to the county for use in the November election if a purchase was part of next year's budget.

"The problem is (this year) the state didn't fund the revolving account set up to help counties finance new voting systems over a 10-20 year period at no interest," Wynham said. "No one foresaw this situation. It would have been a \$10,000 to \$11,000 a year expense (for Lincoln County under the revolving fund)."

"About three days before the States Legislative session was over, they realized the revolving fund had been forgotten. There is only enough for three counties ready to upgrade. Most larger counties already have upgraded. Now with only a dozen smaller counties left, it will take less money."

Wynham estimated the fund would need \$2-million to complete the state's conversion. The legislature probably could budget \$1.5-million in one year.

"Perhaps we could lease now and

next year apply for the revolving fund," Proctor said.

She has enough money in her budget to cover the extra cost for the lease of machines this November, Proctor said. She's in better shape than many other counties.

"I think the thing that needs to be changed is the law that allows minor parties to qualify their candidates so easily," Proctor said.

Besides President George Bush, Arkansas Governor Bill Clinton, and independent millionaire businessman Ross Perot, seven other minor party candidates are running for president on the ballot.

In other business, the commission:

—held off approval of a joint powers agreement with the County Solid Waste Authority until Spencer can verify that the county will be served properly.

—approved a project with the U.S. Forest Service on Bonito Canyon Road. The service will provide material at a cost of about \$1,500 and the county will come up with the labor, valued at \$300.

—heard from Commissioner Monroy Montes that more than 40 applications for housing rehabilitation have been submitted for the Community Development Block Grant project.

"A scope of work write up has already been done on eight," he said. "I am seeing a great need, not only in Hondo Valley, but throughout the county, especially with widows."

—approved opening Pine Road in White Oaks for county maintenance, contingent on submission of the signatures of 10 land owners who would be affected.

—approved closing county road D-017 from the intersection of CR D-019 to the intersection with CR D-018 on the condition that the county be allowed to extract 15,000 cubic yards of caliche (a gravel type material) from each of two pits on the ranches of Mack Bell and Mel Gnatkowski.

"The reason we're asking is that we have tremendous problems with trespassers who just drive pass our signs and fences," Gnatkowski said.

"Cochera had a party, but the rain kept them inside. The Hun (outlaw bike gang) was policing their own party, they even had a metal detector checking for weapons."

"The biggest thing that saved our buns this year was no drinking in the parking lot."

"They weren't trashed out this year."

"What happened to that insurance deal?" (Naughton Insurance faxed the village a statement that it would honor the insurance policy taken out by councilor Ron Andrews, rally promoter, although it was written for a race meet.)

Police offered their views on picnic licenses, now banned because of the violence associated with last year's event:

"Once they had those open air dances, we caught hell. And you can't enforce what they won't let you. It was awful to be sitting across the street, seeing things and gritting your teeth because there was nothing you could do about it. But it was a good rally this year, it really was."

"They'll be back next year. As long as we set the ground rules, it'll run all right."

"There was a lot more Gold Wings this year. The Gold Wings were tickled to death about things. Last night we were getting all kind of good calls, even from the Banditos."

"There wasn't as many bikers this year as last year."

"McSwane, those road blocks really helped."

"The dirty bikes want to come up here, they want to party and they don't want a problem. So when we set the ground rules, we know what's going to happen, they know what's going to happen. That's fine."

"You could walk into a crowd of 20 or 30, we've done it, with one guy (illegally) drinking a beer and the 20 or 30 will back away and say, you know the rules. It wasn't like that last year."

"We kept hearing as they were coming out of the bar that they were heading for their camp site, it was too hot for them. They were talking about us. We're the heat."

"Some of them just took their beers and went back to their room

to party." Swenor said Cliff and Carol Macias of Hamburger King put up an all night buffet with pie, coffee and sandwiches for the officers.

"We all took advantage of it throughout the night. We really appreciated it, because situations like this, a lot of time you end up not eating for an entire shift," Swenor said.

Hoggard and Swenor said there was a narcotics bust outside the Inn of the Pines Springs in Ruidoso Downs.

"They had to be three of the dumbest people in the world," Swenor said. "Seven or eight state police cars parked there and they're sitting there messing with cocaine. They might as well have been sitting in the parking lot of the police station."

There was a note of caution by the police. They hoped that this year's peaceful rally would not cause the village council to think there should be any less protection next year.

It was clear that this year's insurance policy wasn't written on paper as much as it was handed out in police protection.

"So your position is not to take another deputy or someone and put them into records work," Spencer asked.

"There's no one available with the background," McSwane responded. "At no time did I present to the commission that I could delete one administrative position. I'm presenting what I need."

"I think the commission acted on the decision to cut the records clerk very quickly."

Wynham explained that in the budget presented to the commission to take over the jail, the records coordinator's position was deleted from the sheriff's department.

"We indicated it could be your choice which post was deleted," he said to McSwane. "You never forthright said (which post). Your records clerk indicated to me it

would be hers because her tenure was the shortest. Until this plan today, no alternative was presented."

"I think I did approach the county manager that I could make sacrifices in other areas," McSwane said. "He indicated the commission would not listen."

"I'm not here to play politics," Spencer said. "I'll listen to anything you have to say. I don't blame you for fighting for the best department you can, but I'm elected to keep a hand on the throttle. The voters will tell me in November whether I'm doing what they want."

Spencer said he worried about compensatory time when putting together a budget because it is an encumbrance.

Wynham agreed, pointing out that if an employee quits and has accumulated unused comp time, the county must pay for those hours. Auditors are pushing the county to

budget in dollar amounts anticipated comp time obligations, he said.

"How are you going to pay for it?" Spencer asked McSwane.

"I have to decide down the road when I can let them off," he responded. "My deputies are working 12 hours a day during the (Golden Aspen Motor Cycle Rally). The department is accumulating 80 hours of comp time a day. It's a decision I had to make to keep the community safe."

Not having a records coordinator will only add more comp time to the dispatchers division, he said.

"I know you know your own business," Spencer said. "Everyone could do better with more, but we've got to work within the budget to get things done."

"Comp time under this administration is probably one-third of what occurred before I took office,"

McSwane said. "Some deputies had 500 hours accumulated."

The sheriff said he probably would do a "study on comp time and present it to commissioners during the budget review (in December)."

"We are in no way trying to run your office," Spencer told McSwane. "But we are trying to manage the budget to make sure the taxpayer's buck is spent prudently."

McSwane pointed out that since he has been in office, he has not exceeded his budget and he has brought in several grants for special programs.

"Basically, there has been no increase in staff for three years," he said. The unsatisfied need for more jailers was one of the reasons cited by McSwane for passing the jail to the commission.

"I don't want to get into a fight with you," Spencer said. "I think you have done an excellent job get-

ting pass-through money to augment the operation of the department. I think you should be praised for it."

Montes said his major concern is that by deleting the process server, "you will be giving deputies more work with no pay and I don't want to be responsible for that."

"If you can't find another deletion, maybe we better look for more money now than have you come back in a few months."

"I don't want to plug one hole and plug in at the next meeting have to plug more."

McSwane said the records coordinator was more important to the department than any of the positions recommended for deletion.

Spencer said he found it difficult to understand why cutting one of three administrative assistant positions was a hardship when one-third of McSwane's operation, the

courtroom.

Judge Doughty ordered a presentencing report; meanwhile, Najjar is free on bond.

The sheriff said the assistant kept track of grants and handled a great deal of non-jail related items.

"I don't think the secretarial staff spent much time on the jail," he said. "With only one records person in the main office and one in the Ruidoso sub-office, records work has to be shut down if McSwane needs to send one of the assistants somewhere, he said."

Spencer said Otero County operates with 26 deputies (about twice the size of Lincoln), no sub-office and only two secretaries. McSwane countered that there are smaller sheriff's departments in the state that have larger support staffs.

"I'm obligated by law to perform certain duties," McSwane said. "If the commission doesn't budget for them, I have to perform them anyway."

LCMC board praises county voters

Lincoln County Medical Center got a pat on the back from county residents and from other state hospital supervisors in the past few weeks.

In the county, voters cast 1,491 votes in favor of the hospital mill levy to 82 against and hospital board of trustees president Dub Williams said it shows they are doing the job people need them to do. At the board's meeting Thursday night he said the results of the election were phenomenal in that he didn't remember ever seeing a ballot issue get such overwhelming support and other long-time residents agreed.

"We know our county is behind us, and we just need to keep our direction forward and our attitude caring toward the people," he said.

Williams said considering the 82 no votes maybe there are some things the hospital can address and try to improve on. He said the many people who worked on letting voters know about the hospital and boosting it did a good job of pointing out the good things. He and hospital administrator Valerie Miller thanked all of the people who helped them have a successful campaign, including the board members, the mill levy committee, the hospital staff and the hospital auxiliary among others.

In Miller's report to the board she said the hospital's management team received two awards at a Presbyterian Healthcare Services supervisor's retreat at the Ghost Ranch earlier this month. The first award was for the public relations

work the group did on the mill levy campaign this summer. The group was also recognized as having the best team work at the event.

Mike Funk, regional administrator for Presbyterian who attended the sessions and was visiting the board Thursday night, said the LCMC group was the most impressive team in attendance for enthusiasm. The team embodied the kind of attitude and cooperation Presbyterian is seeking to develop in each of their hospitals, he said.

Besides Funk, the group had an other guest, Larry Stroup, a Presbyterian Services regional board representative. He said the main reason he wanted to come to the meeting was to get a better feel for what the board is dealing with now. It is difficult for him to assist the regional hospitals if he hasn't heard the items that are being discussed, he said. He encouraged board members to attend as many of Presbyterian's regional meetings as possible because there may be things they have gone through that they could help others get through.

In more good news, Miller reported hospital activity levels were up in July compared to previous months and for the first time gross revenues exceeded \$1 million.

The board members reviewed both the July and August financial statements at the meeting because they did not officially meet in August.

Net revenue in August was down from July but up from a year ago by \$99,000. Without the support of the mill levy the loss for the month would have been \$36,382. Miller said they also had the expense of

relocating two physicians, Dr. Joe Allegretto and Dr. Deborah Hewitt. The hospital also had an expense for cataract equipment but received no revenue when the equipment failed.

In year-to-date performance the net revenue is \$248,157 ahead of this time last year, but it is \$134,163 under budget. Miller said the hospital got off to a slow start in May and June when the weather was bad, but with a good ski season it should be able to meet the budget for the year. She said in the past two years they have over-budgeted revenues for certain times of the year and will be able to correct those now that she has three years under her belt in budgeting.

"I'm relatively confident that we will be able to meet the budget after we go through the ski season," she said.

The Carrizozo Health Centers have had a year-to-date loss of \$6,629 despite mill levy funding of \$76,747. The loss puts the centers at almost \$14,000 behind budget for the year. The Ruidoso EMS is about \$32,000 ahead of budget, year-to-date. Board president Williams said they have worked long and hard to get this service to this point.

Miller also informed the group about House Bill 441, which provides for Medicaid for women and children. She gave the members an article from the Albuquerque Journal and explained that if the program is approved, Lincoln County's contribution would be \$156,000.

Under the bill the state would use the money from the counties to get a federal match to help shrink

the state's Medicaid deficit, which could approach \$37 million for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1993, according to the newspaper article.

The proposal has been sent to the federal Health Care Financing Administration and should be decided on within 90 days, she said.

The funds are to come out of a county's indigent fund, but Lincoln County is the only one that doesn't have such a fund, Miller said. Because they have no indigent fund, she said she is expecting they will be asked to contribute the money out of the mill levy, although that is prohibited under the Hospital Funding Act. She also expects the legislature to change it so they can.

The reality is that it won't help the hospital, the pharmacists or the Ruidoso Care Center, but it may help the area clinics and some physicians, she said. At the hospital only 16 percent of the revenues come from Medicaid and the free care that they do provide is for people who earn too much to qualify for Medicaid but can't pay.

"If money is returned to the county in one form or another under this, we will probably end up writing a check for the amount. This program will bring considerable federal money into the state, but we are just trying to protect our resources in this county," Miller said.

Miller asked and received the board's approval on a radiology contract with Radiology Associates of Albuquerque for a one-year term with a 90-day-out clause. She said it is in the hospital's best interest to do this because they have an extra small department.

Kieth and Mariann Rawlings have opened a new sporting goods store with some of the best prices for brand name articles.

Tee and Ski Sporting Goods at 1086 Mechem Drive isn't just for golf or ski enthusiasts, but for members of the entire family whether they need shoes or shin guards.

Rawlings said the store has been open about a month, and they have tried to cater to local people's sporting needs, including golf clubs, shoes, balls and tees. The ski items will be arriving in the next 30 days, but the store will only have rentals for this first year. The good thing about that, Rawlings said, is that the rental skis will still be new since the store has never done rentals before. If you get skunked, help is just a phone call away

Wild critters running around your house and yard got you skunked? If you live in Ruidoso that may mean calling a professional to get rid of them.

If Ruidoso residents are concerned about skunks, raccoons or other wild life and would like them removed, the village animal control department refers the calls to a private business owned by Mike Free.

Village manager Ron Wicker said the village isn't trying to side step anything, but the animal control officer has so much to do with domestic animals he can't deal with wild animals too.

Free said he has live trap cages to catch the animals and then he releases the animals into an area away from people. He said most of these animals only go two or three miles in their whole lives so if they are out in the forest they should be OK.

Usually spring and summer are the busiest for picking up skunks, while raccoons are more of a problem in the winter, he said. Free said many of his customers are people who only come up once or twice a year and find animals have taken over their attic or have gone

under their cabin. He said before he sets any traps he crawls under the building or into the attic to see what damage the animal has done, and he can also repair that.

Some people who have problems with skunks or other animals may set out mothballs to drive them away, but that can only make the problem worse, Free said skunks like the taste of the mothballs, but the chemicals in it kill the animal and it may go under a person's house to die. All people can do, without calling him, is seal off the holes so animals can't go under a house, he said.

Free charges a \$25 service charge to make a preliminary check of the area and to see what has to be done. This also covers his gas costs if he has to come back to check a trap several times. He also charges \$10 per animal to remove the ones he does catch. He said he and his partner are the only two that trap and remove the wild animals.

People may call Free directly or if they call the animal control department they will be referred to Free.

Warrior offense tears up Wildcats

The Ruidoso Warrior football team had two things to prove Friday night, that they could score and they could win, and when the final horn sounded they had done both.

The Warriors didn't have a helpless victim, though, as the Tularosa Wildcats took the lead just seconds into the first quarter when Josh Allen dashed through Warrior defenders for a touchdown on the opening kick-off. On its first possession the Warrior offense executed well and marched to within inches of the first touchdown of the season but fumbled.

The team did get its first touchdown just minutes later when Tularosa was stopped on four downs and had to punt the ball to give Ruidoso good field position. The Warriors again broke through the Tulie line with running plays until Mario Sanchez bulldozed his way across the goal line for the TD.

Tulie's second kick-off return was beginning to look like the first one until the runner fumbled the ball and the Warriors recovered. Just a few plays later Jaime Ordorica caught a 30-yard pass from John Echols to take the lead from the Wildcats. The Wildcats weren't down for long, though, and on their next drive Pablo Mendez broke a 59-yard run for the tying touchdown.

Later in the first half Scott Stricklin made two tremendous defensive plays to help stop the Wildcats from earning a first. Anthony Torres made the only score in the second quarter when he ran in from seven yards out. Sanchez then made a two point conversion to make the score 22-13. Tulie didn't waste its change to even things up on the returning kick-off, but Ordorica made a touchdown-saving tackle before both teams went in for the half.

The Warriors continued to roll in the first minutes of the third quarter when quarterback Echols made a one-yard run for the only

score in the third quarter. Adam Chavez's point after kick was good. The defense stopped Tularosa's attacks several times before the Wildcats scored on a one-yard run with just three minutes left in the game, but the Warriors did stop the two-point conversion attempt.

The Wildcats got the ball back with a short time remaining on the clock and tried to make something happen when on what would have been the 1st play of the game, the Warriors were called on face mask penalty.

The game can't end on a defensive penalty so Tularosa lined up again with no time left on the clock and tried to throw a pass. Warrior Billy Austin intercepted it and ran 42 yards for six more points for the Warriors and a final score of 34-19.

Sanchez led the Warriors in

rushing with 153 yards, while Torres had 119 yards to contribute to the 305 total offensive yards. Echols had four pass attempts and one completion to Ordorica for the touchdown.

The Warriors made 20 first downs compared to Tulie's eight. Tularosa had 198 total yards, none were passing. Ruidoso was called for four penalties for 29 yards, while the Wildcats had nine penalties for 50 yards.


On defense Sanchez had 12 tackles and Stricklin had 11, four of which were quarterback sacks. Lance Roe also had nine tackles on the defense. The Warriors punted four times for an average of 30 yards and had one fumble recovery.

outstanding running back and also a strong front defensive line, so the Warriors will have to be in top shape on both sides of the ball to add another win.

Their record is now 2-1, but they hope to improve on that Thursday at 4 p.m. in a game here against Santa Teresa.





Tiger is tame as a kitten

The disposition of a Labrador and the sleek, solid beauty of an American Staffordshire terrier, this good-looking stray was dubbed Tiger for his brindle markings, not his personality.

The seven-month-old male has been at the shelter for about two months.

Boris is a two-year-old Staffordshire terrier, commonly called a pit bull.

History buffs to gather for seminar

Recursos de Santa Fe, an educational non-profit corporation, and the Lincoln County Heritage Trust, are co-sponsoring a gathering October 4 through 7, in Ruidoso.

The two have gathered a distinguished group of historians, folklorists and working ranchers to explore the history, myths, and tall tales surrounding that most famous of western characters — the American cowboy.

In the heart of the country that spawned countless legends, participants will learn about cattle-king John Chisum and the early days of the open range, about the famous Lincoln County War, about women ranchers and cowgirls, about cowboy saloons and entertainments, and about the modern western ranch.

Expert faculty members include Hal Canon, artistic director of the Western Folklife Center and the founding director of the Cowboy Poetry Gathering in Elko, Nevada.

Byron Johnson, curator of history at the Albuquerque Museum and Sharon Johnson, writer and artist, will lead sessions. Their numerous publications include "The Wild West Bartender Bible: Saloon Keeping in the American West, 1862-1906."

Another speaker will be Teresa Jordan, author of "Cowgirls; Women of the American West, and Riding the White Horse Home," a memoir about the Iron Mountain ranch in southwest Wyoming where she was born and raised.

Leon Metz is noted authority on violence in Western history. Among his many publications is "Pat Garrett: Story of Western Lawman."

Darlis Miller is a scholar and professor of history at New Mexico State University.

Byron Price is director of the National Cowboy Hall of Fame and Western Heritage Center in Oklahoma City.

Other speakers from the Lincoln County area include Morgan Nelson, John Meigs and Elvis Fleming. The local citizens will share their ranching expertise and bring local history alive at the beautiful South Springs Ranch.

Hurricane uproots families

When Hurricane Andrew plowed into the Florida's southeast coastline in late August, it wasn't just private homes and shopping centers that were destroyed.

The storm devastated housing at Homestead Air Force Base, leaving hundreds of military families stranded.

One of its smallest victims will be living in Ruidoso for the next three to six months.

Two-year-old Justin Seamans and his mother, Sgt. Alice Seamans, were evacuated from base housing as the storm hit and were moved to a grade school shelter in Kendall.

But before Andrew had finished with the area, the roof of the school started to collapse and they were re-evacuated to another shelter.

Settling her grandson Justin in her lap, Natalie Williams of Ruidoso recently related her daughter's frustrating flight to find refuge after the storm.

Sgt. Seamans, who is a single parent, discovered when the winds died down that she has lost her car, their clothes, everything, Mrs. Williams said.

"It was amazing that their dog, Misty, survived," she said.

"They had practically no cash and no checks, and the base's credit union was destroyed."

Her daughter left the Homestead area and went to Fort Lauderdale to stay with friends. That respite was shortlived. Pointing to the policy prohibiting children and pets, the landlord gave Seamans and her son just two days to find another temporary home.

"She called Patrick Air Force Base and they said to check in at the Holiday Inn near the stadium in Tampa," Mrs. Williams said. "They would pay for lodging for Alice, Justin and their pet Chow for up to 30 days until my daughter was reassigned."

But without money about all they could do was buy a sandwich at McDonalds once a day, she said.

Soon after, Seamans' orders came through. She was reassigned to Kendall AFB near Panama City in northwest Florida.

"But there was no room for Justin, no base housing for three to six months," Mrs. Williams said. "My daughter has to live in a dormitory as a single person until something opens up."

When Seamans called with the news, the Williams were distressed for her situation, but delighted at the idea of having their grandson with them possibly through Christmas.

Misty stayed in Florida with Sgt. Seamans.

The Williams understand the mechanisms of the military as

retired members of the U.S. Air Force.

"We were fortunate that Jack's daughter, Karyn Williams, works for United Airlines and was able to arrange a flight over the Labor Day weekend to Florida and back," Mrs. Williams said. She headed east to bring her grandson back to a comfortable and safe home.

"It took three separate flights on stand-by to Albuquerque and then a five-hour drive back to Ruidoso," she said.

Justin didn't have much to pack and clung to his special teddy bears throughout the trip.

Since he arrived, new clothes, new toys and the Disney Channel have brightened his spirits.

"My grandson was so dehydrated that he drank a half gallon of Gatorade when he arrived," Mrs. Williams said.

Her daughter was able to take Misty with her to Panama City. She flew back to Homestead to gather whatever she could salvage. Unfortunately, their clothes and even items donated later, were saturated. They became mildewed and had to be thrown out, Williams said.

Homestead looked "like a bomb had hit," Mrs. Williams said. "We lived in Florida for 15 years and went through many hurricanes, but there was nothing as destructive as this one."




By midday, with the clouds all floated away, the sun shone down through a pure blue sky and late summer returned in all its green and golden glory.



It shouldn't hurt to be a child

Parents who take out their anger on young children do little besides prove they're bigger and stronger. Dealing in anger with a child shows a lack of self-discipline on the part of the adult.


A trip to a local restaurant was marred for at least one diner Thursday when a young mother took her child into the ladies room to spank her, threatening more of the same if the crying continued. A similar incident at Wal-Mart last Saturday was distressing for the little victim and witnesses as well.

Marriage and family counselors almost universally agree that there are other, safer and better ways to discipline children. A parent can cause physical harm when using physical force as a form of discipline. Besides physical damage, such treatment at the hands of an authority figure can cause repressed anger, frustration and can even encourage the youngster to use force in dealing with others, according to some sources. Children who are hit by their parents learn to use violence to deal with violence, and the consequences of that behavior last for years and years, and are manifested in later years in school fights and domestic disputes.

In her book, Nancy Samalin, author of "Love and Anger: The Parental Dilemma," offers some better ways to discipline a child without anger. Samalin's book, quoted in a Gannett story, suggests the following:

- Exit when you're too angry to deal with the problem.
- Stay in the present; don't dredge up events from the past.
- Stay short and to the point. Children need specific instructions, such as make your bed, not just clean up your room.
- Focus on the essential; what really is worth arguing about.
- Give time-outs and make your child stay in his or her room.
- Take away privileges.
- Restore good feelings. Time and distance can heal wounds, but a simple apology can reduce resentment.

Remember, discipline is meant to teach and promote good character, and spanking or hitting just doesn't reach that goal.

County law officers oppose Brady Bill

TO THE EDITOR:

We, the undersigned members and associate members of Sierra Blanca Lodge #26, Fraternal Order of Police wish to respectfully take exception to the sentiments of our national president, Dewey Stokes, as printed in the August 27 issue of *The Ruidoso News*. Mr. Stokes, in his contributed comment, called for the passage of the Brady Bill which would provide for a waiting period for handgun purchases, ostensibly to provide time for a background check of the would-be purchaser. However, it should be noted that the Brady Bill itself does not provide a mechanism for such a background check.

Our first objection is that the Brady Bill will not do what it is touted to do. Criminals are not going to stand still for a background check when they can buy a firearm on the black market or simply steal it. Criminals, by definition, don't obey the law! Further, trying to determine if a purchaser is addicted or mentally ill would be extremely difficult because that information is not normally of public record. Indeed, most supporters of the Brady Bill

agree that only a small portion of legally purchased firearms are used in criminal activity. The major effect of the Brady Bill on the general population of law abiding citizens would be to simply be another source of governmental harassment.

Our second objection is that the Brady Bill would put the citizens of the nation in danger. The Bill is predicated on the assumption that no law abiding citizen would have an emergency use for a firearm. The recent riots in Los Angeles have proved this assumption to be devastatingly wrong. When the riots began, the police were ordered away from the scene and shopkeepers and home owners were left to fend for themselves. Those seeking to purchase firearms for personal defense ran headlong into California's waiting period. People were crowding four and five rows deep in the suburbs of Los Angeles seeking to buy firearms to defend their lives and property only to be told that they could have their gun in 15 days. On the other hand, those who had arms and ammunition were able to successfully defend themselves and their prop-

erty. It is estimated that there are 150,000 gang members in the Los Angeles area and 8,000 policemen. Expecting a police department to cope with those odds is, to say the least, unrealistic.

Our third objection is that the Brady Bill is an ominous portent of the future. Supporters of the Brady Bill have often said that they don't think it will be very effective by itself, but that "it is an important first step."

Our question is, "first step to what?" Some observers have held that it is the first step toward confiscatory legislation. Giving credence to that view is the fact that there is now a bill before the House of Representatives calling for the repeal of the second amendment to the U.S. Constitution which guarantees the right of the people to keep and bear arms.

In addition, there is a bill before the Senate to simply ban all private ownership of handguns. One might ask, why not ban handguns?

The reason is that private ownership of handguns prevents a great deal of crime. Criminologist Professor Gary Kleck of Florida State University has recently com-

pleted a study of private use of firearms entitled "Point Blank: Guns and Violence in America" (1991, Aldine de Gruyter Press). Professor Kleck's statistics indicate that victims use handguns to defeat crime about 645,000 times each year as opposed to about 580,000 handgun crimes annually. If handguns are banned, such statistics would suggest that our law enforcement agencies would have to deal with an additional 645,000 crimes a year!

We are committed to cooperating with the public in the fight against crime. We certainly do not want to fight the law abiding public on this issue. The first shot of the American Revolution was fired because the British troops were seeking to confiscate arms and ammunition cached by the Minute Men.

As law enforcement officers we seek to serve and protect — we don't want to be the Red Coats of the 20th century.
