News wins!

What do taxes and law and order have in common with the Highland fling?

For The Ruidoso News, stories and pictures on those subjects led to three top awards this weekend at the New Mexico Press Association's annual meeting.

The News won second place for its summer visitors guide, close behind The Taos News, which is published once a week.

Chuck Stallings won first place among large weeklies for investigative reporting, Dianne Stallings won first in photo series, and Frankie Jarrell won the public service award.

Stallings' extensive series of news analyses, stories, columns and editorials on the Golden Aspen Rally netted him the top honor for investigative reporting for New Mexico weeklies with circulations of 3,000 and more.

Taos News reporter Mike Stauffer won second in that category, which includes the Santa Fe Reporter, Valencia County News Bulletin, Rio Grande Sun, Cibola County Beacon, Las Cruces Bulletin, Rio Rancho Observer and other large weeklies.

Dianne Stallings' win came on a full-page photo series about John Meigs' colorful highland fling party at his meadow in the valley.

Jarrell's series of news stories, editorials and features in favor of the Ruidoso schools' successful mill levy campaign brought home NMPA's public service award for large weeklies.

The judges, members of the South Dakota Press Association, were impressed with Stallings' efforts and the impact his research had on the village.


Over the last 30 years, Charles Stallings successfully has focused his energy on a series of ventures.

In college, he directed and acted in plays. During the summers, he appeared in a television series filmed in Denver and in summer stock in North Dakota.

He owned an import shop while acting as assistant manager of the Canyon Courier in Colorado. But cold weather pushed him to the southeast and Florida, where he started a new career in public relations. Within a few years, he garnered international publicity for a planned community on the west coast of Florida by promoting the World Championship Chicken Pluckin' Contest, Meatless Day and other events.

His work resulted in appearances on the national television show, "To Tell the Truth."

Two trash groups team up on dump

Each side struggled to overcome the uneasy feeling that goes with the loss of autonomy, but Lincoln and Otero county officials have agreed to move forward with a regional landfill.

A legal agreement has yet to be hammered out between their attorneys, but it appears the two counties are ready to join hands.

Ron Wicker, Ruidoso village manager, was one of five representatives from the county Solid Waste Authority to meet Thursday with counterparts in Otero County.

"We determined that there was substantial interest in going forward with a regional landfill and it

would be to all of our advantage," Wicker said.

"The ownership arrangement was a stickler, but we finally resolved it by agreeing that Lincoln County and Otero would be equal partners in control of a regional landfill. We would have 50 percent say.

"With that understood, we agreed that Alamogordo was going to take the lead doing things that need to be accomplished on a timely basis."

A contractual agreement between the two county groups will be considered at the next joint meeting set for 6 p.m. Thursday, October 22, in the Tularosa Senior Citizens Center.

Tribe studies MRS with or without feds

Federal funding or a lack of further federal funding will not dissuade the Mescalero Apaches from pursuing a temporary nuclear waste storage facility, according to Tribal Secretary Fred Peso.

"As a sovereign Indian Nation, we have responded to the invitation of the U.S. Congress, along with 20 other communities across America, to study the MRS (monitored retrievable storage)," said Peso.

An MRS will be built somewhere in the United States as a temporary storage site for high level nuclear waste in the form of spent fuel rods from nuclear power plants.

It's the job of the nuclear negotiator, David Leroy, to locate a site for the planned MRS. His office is funded through special taxes collected from the nuclear plants.

"Although available grant funds have been expended, the Tribe has requested additional funds for community outreach and inter-governmental coordination. This application is pending," said Peso.

So far, the tribe has been allocated \$300,000 in grants to study taking on the job of storing the nuclear waste in an above-ground facility (an MRS).

"In the meantime, we look forward to working with the governor and other elected officials, including our congressional delegation, in exploring the MRS and the opportunities it offers to New Mexico," continued Peso.

New Mexico's congressional delegation, Governor Bruce King and nine communities surrounding Mescalero have all said they oppose building an MRS in New Mexico.

Senator Jeff Bingaman (D-NM) said Wednesday he does not believe the Mescalero tribe will receive more money and that it is "almost certain" the nuclear waste storage site will not be built in southern New Mexico.

Congressman Joe Skeen (D-NM), in Ruidoso last week to campaign for re-election, restated his position that the MRS will not be built in his district. Skeen has continued to assure MRS opponents that the nuclear waste isn't going to be stored in this area, meanwhile the study process has continued, using federal grants.

"The Tribe's continued participation in the feasibility study is not dependent on an expanded grant," said Skeen in his letter.

"The Tribal Council is currently organizing a Citizens Advisory Group in order to jointly consider with our neighbors the potential impacts of an MRS on the region.

"We are particularly concerned with building an economic and educational infrastructure which can lead to prosperity for our children. We expect these discussions to move forward with or without DOE financial support.

"Prior to its recent adjournment, Congress extended the Nuclear Waste Negotiator's Office for two years. We believe this expression of support speaks to the continued commitment of the United States Government to the MRS siting process."

No decision has been made on whether to give Mescalero more money for studies on the federal level.

HeadStart is here!

Three sessions are scheduled under a new Headstart program set to begin next January in Ruidoso and Capitan.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services awarded \$841,905 to the Region IX Cooperative Center (RCC) to establish the program for low-income pre-school children. The RCC serves Lincoln County as well as Tularosa and Cloudercroft in Otero.

"Only 20 percent of the Headstart programs nationwide are administered by public school agencies, so we're rather unique," said Sandy Gladden, director of Region IX.

"The reason RCC applied for the award was to allow continuity. The government won't award to another Please see HeadStart, page 2A

Don't dump in my backyard!

Six weeks ago, he saw the pickup bumping down Hale Lake Road and immediately became suspicious.

Illegal dumping is a favorite pastime of most drivers who turn south on dirt roads off U.S. Highway 70 outside of Ruidoso Downs.

The roads lead to stands of pines and junipers, to fields of wildflowers and to unpatrolled gullies and wooded areas where appliances and rotting garbage already litter the landscape.

"This pickup load is only a drop in the bucket. It's really nasty back there," said Clyde Eanes, who lives on the road.

This time, Eanes wrote down the license plate number and followed the route of the pickup to pinpoint where the newest pile of trash had been added to the land managed for the public by the U.S. Forest Service.

He'd already tried unsuccessfully on several occasions to push service officials into prosecuting people who have illegally tossed their trash on public land.

This time he was optimistic.

But many weeks have passed and no one has been cited.

Service officials say it's not that they don't care. But they point to budget cuts that eliminated an enforcement officer in the Lincoln National Forest that surrounds Ruidoso.

Forest ranger Jerry Hawkes said he must depend on an enforcement officer from the Mayhill area to handle complaints.

Before that officer was dispatched, however, a preliminary interview was conducted with Eanes.

"I called them and they sent a man out here," Eanes said. "He found the trash and came back to talk to me. There were fresh tracks on the closed road. We walked right to the cardboard and debris, general yard cleaning stuff. He said it looked fresh. The flowers hadn't even wilted."

Eanes not only had the license plate number and description of the vehicle, a GMC tan pickup, he also could describe the driver.

"I stood in the road when he went by and asked him 'How's it going?'" Eanes said.

Hawkes told The Ruidoso News that his agency checked the license number and came up with a name, then turned the case over to enforcement officer Edison Ashley from Mayhill.

"He'll follow up and decide if there is enough evidence (to issue a citation)," Hawkes said.

He referred future contacts to forester Sam Tobias in the Ruidoso office.

While Tobias has been accessible and forthcoming with information, nothing much has happened in the last month.

The owner of the pickup apparently doesn't have a telephone and used a post office box address on his vehicle registration.

"We don't know for sure he was driving that day and need to interview him before a citation can be issued," Tobias said. "(An employee) met with Clyde and obtained a formal witness statement."

Edison apparently has worked in the Ruidoso area on weekends this past month, spending some of that time trying without success to run down the location of the pickup owner. The owner has moved recently, but still is in the area, Tobias said.

Once a citation is issued, the offender could either pay a \$100 fine or go to magistrate court to plead his case.

Tobias assured The News that the service would like to catch a few

offenders and make the charges stick to put people on notice about what could happen if they illegally dump.

"It's virtually impossible to catch them in the act," Tobias said. "It's fortunate there's someone like Clyde who cares enough to get involved."

Eanes said he's heard the argument about the lack of money for a local enforcement officer before and he thinks the service's priorities are skewed.

"I recommended they cut back on the office buildings and pay the guys who actually do the work," he said.

The service closed several forest roads in Eanes' area after he pointed out abuser. Realistically however, the thin pipe shoved into the ground with a closed notice attached does little to prevent access.

Less than 100 yards beyond one of those closed road notices, the discarded ribcages and hides of elk are visible. In other areas, the carcass of a dead horse was rotting, a rusting dishwasher had been riddled with bullets, a mattress laid in a field surrounded by cardboard cartons. Unwanted television sets, cans, plastic and construction materials are scattered throughout the underbrush.

Welcome to one of the country's national forests.

P&Z peruses plans for used car lot on Sudderth Drive HeadStart

A rocky road is recommended for three applicants on Monday's agenda during the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning meeting at village hall.

A used car sale lot is being proposed by Dan Smith for his property nearby Arby's on Sudderth.

Smith says he wants to develop the site for a lease-purchase arrangement.

The lot has been used to sell cars recently.

Planner Cleatus Richards said the site development plan was reviewed with Tim Basler of the New Mexico Highway and Transportation Department on October 2. Richards said Basler advised that the driveway plan as submitted would not be approved by the highway department.

The P&Z packet didn't define the problem and there doesn't appear to be any difficulty moving on to the property with the house that is currently located on the lot. The property is elevated, however, the

transportation department has not been strict in the past, allowing a number of infractions along Sudderth to exist.

Planner Richards recommended denial of a variance for Greg Carey and his property in Country Club Estates Subdivision.

Carey wants to put a carport in the front of his house at 105 La Luz Lane.

The carport would cover an existing circular driveway and have a hotel effect with a car driving in the circular driveway, then exiting by going through the carport and out the other side.

The carport would require 18 feet, allowing construction to within two feet of the front property line.

Richards recommends denial of the variance because an accessible area is available on the rear portion of the lot. A single vehicle carport can be constructed on the south side of the property within required setbacks. And the variances are ex-

treme for the area and not justified by any hardship as required by the zoning code.

Construction of a new restaurant to be built in the Midtown area vacant lot at the corner of El Paso and Sudderth, with an attached deck and building, existing trees, has been rejected by the planning staff.

Richards said the primary issue is village code requirements for parking in the Midtown area.

"There is not sufficient on-site area to provide parking required," he said. "Assessing 50 percent walk-in trade, applicant would still need to provide 15 spaces, seven more than proposed."

Richards recommended rejection based on code requirements for the following reasons:

1. Parking is requested at 27 percent of required.

2. Parking lot grade requested exceeds three percent code regulation and would accelerate run-off

from parking lot area.

3. Increased runoff from development can be handled on site and plans should be adjusted accordingly.

During the last planning and zoning meeting, one resident recommended ridding the Sudderth area dumpsters in favor of poly-carts.

Past deputy manager Gary Jackson said the poly-carts would be one way of getting rid of dumpsters that are in view in the commercial areas. The vacant dumpster areas also would create new parking spaces.

Another resident suggested mandatory offstreet municipal parking for employers and employees of Midtown, using a sticker system like other small towns that have parking problems.

Ray Edison, owner of Funtrackers Amusement Park, is improving his amusement park again with a bumper boat pond.

The bumper boat pool is not

within the flood plain area and within developable area. Parking is at the rate of one space for each three rental units.

Eidson proposes to develop additional parallel spaces to the east of the restaurant along Carrizo Creek Road.

Richards recommended approval with the following conditions:

1. That specific plans for additional parking be submitted within 15 days and developed within 60 days of approval.

2. That parking previously approved be completed and striped within 60 days of approval.

Owners of Cattle Baron Restaurant completed its site development plan showing revised parking, landscaping and drainage.

Richards said he has no objection to the plan as submitted and recommends approval subject to highway department approval.

Danny Fenton is requesting a replat for lots 21 and 22 of Block L, in the Ruidoso Springs Subdivision.

ready operates a Headstart program. But under the umbrella of RCC, we can apply in the spring for RCC, and Hondo would be the first on the list.

"Hondo was in the original application, but we couldn't get enough students. There's a 15 minimum. We hope also to be able to do something for Carrizo and Corona."

Coupled with RCC's existing program for three- and four-year-old developmentally disabled children and its pre-school testing project, Gladden said the community's pre-school children should be covered.

The newly established Headstart program is designed to reach children at the most critical time of their development; between birth and five years of age.

He next was drafted by a development company to promote the opening of their \$20-million resort hotel on Marco Island. That experience propelled him into his second association with show business. He handled promotion and media appearances for such well-known performers as Milton Berle, Phyllis Diller and Steve Allen.

Along the way, he formed lasting friendships with some of the nation's top photographers including Arnold Newman and Ozzie Sweet. In his free time, he wrote a book analyzing hospital services in Florida that was published in 1986.

During that same period, he

opened an advertising firm, specializing in resort hotels and substance abuse rehabilitation facilities.

Looking for a change and a drier climate, in 1988, he took a year off to travel and landed in Ruidoso.

In the past two years with The Ruidoso News, he has won first place awards in sports photography, sports column and regular column writing. His photographs have appeared in New Mexico Magazine and Triple A Magazine. Recently, he was published in The New Mexico Business Journal.

Dianne Stallings, a former licensed psychologist in Florida, started writing for the St. Petersburg Times in 1970.

While with The Times, she was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize for

her work on the generationally poor on the West Coast. Her story on a narcotics sweep involving the search of a district judge's boat resulted in a court ruling with national impact on the handling of public officials by newspapers during their non-working hours.

Another story exposed a potential threat to young animals of a flea dip produced by a leading producer of animal products. The problem, referring to her story, later was featured on the national television program, "20/20."

Suffering from increasing asthma-related problems, she retired from The Times in 1989 and moved to Ruidoso, where she joined The Ruidoso News in 1991.

Her free lance work includes ar-

ticles and pictures in the New Mexico Magazine, The St. Petersburg Times and several other publications.

Last year, Dianne Stallings was awarded first place in News Writing for Class I papers by the New Mexico Press Association. She considers her greatest work raising three children, Gabrielle, Rachael and Aaron.

Frankie Jarrell, editor and general manager of The News, set her sights on a career in journalism as a seventh grader in Lubbock, Texas. But after editing school papers and attending Texas Tech on a journalism scholarship, she put her newspaper dreams on the back burner while raising three children.

Jarrell joined The News staff in 1984 as a people reporter. Jarrell was named editor just in time to take on a new publication, the Reporter, that is published Wednesdays.

She was named general manager last November, and has worked closely with publisher Sammy Lopez in a series of new special sections and endeavors. This year The News was successful in gaining the contract to publish the Sunburst for Holloman Air Force Base.

Jarrell, who is active in civic activities, has won the top column award from NMPA for four years, as well as awards in photography and writing.

The Ruidoso News, a Rajlon

newspaper, and its staff have been consistent winners among that category. Lopez, who publishes The Ruidoso News and The Deming Headlight, is regional manager for the Rajlon group.

Other Rajlon publications that won awards include the Valencia County News Bulletin with a first and three seconds, and the Socorro Defensor Chieftain, competing among smaller weeklies, winning two second place awards.

A reporter for Carrizozo's Lincoln County News, Doris Cherry, won a first place award among small weeklies, those with circulations of less than 3,000. Cherry won a first for investigative in that category, with the Union County Leader winning second.

Animal shelter pets perk up to impress prospective owners, visitors

Bager little faces press to the kennel fence as visitors walk through the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter.

"Choose me, pick me, I'll be your pal," they seem to plead.

When someone stops, stoops down to pat a bobbing head and to give a word of encouragement, a howl of expectation shoots through the kennel.

Unfortunately, not everyone leaves with a new pet. Unfortunately, there are new people who discard their long time pets or new puppies, or who let them run loose.

Sienna, her brothers and sisters

were discards, the product of an unexpected pregnancy of a family pet the owners failed to have spayed. The pups were left at the shelter to become society's problem and another potential heartbreak for shelter workers.

The five, in colors from off white to black, with rusty-tan Sienna in the middle, were dropped at the shelter about three weeks ago.

The Airedale-yellow Labrador mixes are about 2 1/2 months old.

"They all seem to be outgoing," said shelter manager Randy Basch.

"They all jump to the fence when I come by, but when I open the gate, they sort of move back like they're surprised the door isn't there

anymore."

Because puppies need more attention and cannot be spayed or neutered right away, the society will accept an initial \$20 payment for adoption, with the balance due in 60 days.

All animals adopted from the shelter must be altered at the proper time to prevent more unwanted litters.

"As with any puppies, there'll be plenty of opportunity to train them from the ground up," Basch said. "All Labrador breeds generally have good dispositions and learn easily. Training should not be a big problem for anyone willing to take the effort."

Some interesting residents in the cattery next door also are waiting for new owners.

The Judds, tortoise shell litter mates, with adorable faces and personalities, want a home all to themselves.

A two-year-old tortoise shell tank of a cat called Shiner also would be an excellent apartment pet. She is spayed and declawed but her owners said she didn't like their other animals. However, she doesn't seem to mind the dozen or so other cats in the shelter.

As cold weather approaches, Basch had a few suggestions for dogs that are kept outside. His first is to bring them inside, at least at night so that they feel like part of the family and don't think they are being punished with isolation.

But if a dog is going to be staying outside, introduce him to that environment during mild weather to allow his coat and system to

adapt as the seasons change.

Ruidoso ordinance requires outside dogs have doghouses that are weather tight on three sides, the top and the bottom.

"The house should be big enough for the dog to stand up and turn around, but it doesn't have to be huge," Basch said. "Smaller houses trap body heat inside and with a rug nailed to the front as a flap, they can stay warm. Our winters aren't as severe as areas to the north."

Doghouses also should be posi-

tioned to get the maximum sunlight and with entrances away from the wind. The floor should be raised off the ground.

"Nine-tenths of the problems dogs incur are connected to sleeping on the ground, especially older animals," Basch said.

Adding insulation to the walls is a good idea, but not necessary if the house is built to the right dimensions, the floor is off the ground and the dog has a blanket on which to sleep, he said.

Owners should crawl inside the

pet's dog house to check for drafts and protruding nails, Basch said. "I often see a nicely built house from the outside, only to find sharp nail points inside."

The plans for a simple, easy-to-clean, but effective doghouse that uses a wind flapper at the entrance instead of a flap are available at the shelter for a small donation.

Forest service awards funds to county

Lincoln County will receive an estimated total payment of \$45,376 in national forest receipts this year.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Forest Service this week published a list detailing the amount of money counties across the country can expect by the end of the year, as well as interim payments.

Lincoln will pick up a check for \$34,032 as its interim share.

Forty-one states and Puerto Rico share in the interim payments of \$236-million and the projected final tally of \$314-million, according to F. Dale Robertson, chief of the service.

New Mexico can expect an interim payment of \$1,433,963, Arizona's share is nearly three times as high at \$4,352,380. Their final tally should be \$1,911,950 and

\$5,803,174.

The interim payment represents 75 percent of the estimated amount each state will receive as its share of money collected during the fiscal year ending September 30, 1992, from the sale and use of a variety of national forest products and services. The remaining portion of the receipts will be sent in December.

The forest service is required by law to pay 25 percent of the revenue it collects from timber sales, grazing, recreation, minerals and land uses to states in which national forest lands are located.

The money is used for schools and roads. Last year, the states received total payments of more than \$346-million. Of that amount, New Mexico and Arizona saw more than \$6-million.

The interim payments do not reflect revenues collected from the national grasslands. Those receipts are calculated on a calendar-year basis and are shared with the states in the spring.

The largest interim payments will go to Oregon, \$105-million; California, \$41-million; Washington, \$26-million; and Idaho, \$14-million. New Mexico ranks seventeenth in total interim payment.

New Mexico counties leading in money collected are Catron, which will receive an estimated total payment of \$694,827; Rio Arriba at \$313,899; Grant at \$120,125; Sandoval at \$110,329; and San Miguel at \$105,458.

Lincoln ranked eleventh out of the 22 counties receiving payments.

Local doc earns state leadership award

Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC) board of trustees breezed through a quick agenda Thursday night that included news of an award for an area doctor.

Hospital administrator Valerie Miller announced that Dr. Christopher Robinson earned the Presbyterian Healthcare Services Outstanding Leadership Award at a fall leadership retreat here earlier this month.

Robinson is credited with speeding up recovery after a tough period the hospital experienced in 1990. What would have taken an average hospital about three to five years, took only about a year with Robinson's support and leadership, said Miller.

"Without Chris we wouldn't have gotten anywhere," she said.

Board president Dub Williams said Robinson has done a tremendous job for the hospital and the community, and his efforts mean a lot to the board.

Miller said Betty Testerman also received recognition during the retreat for her work with living wills.

In the financial reports, Miller said September showed a better month for activity than August, but compared to last month revenue was down \$7,866. The amount was almost \$8,000 more than a year ago. Without the mill levy September showed a gain of \$1,032, Miller

said, but they are still about \$128,900 under budget in revenues for the year.

She said that is somewhat of a concern for her, but they are only halfway through the fiscal year. With the addition of Dr. Joe Allegretto and Dr. Paul Gaulbas, who have gotten off to a strong start, it should work out by the end of the year, she said.

Miller also reported that the ambulance service is about \$43,000 ahead of budget because it had been budgeted to lose about \$20,000. This is only the fourth month of the service's fiscal year. She said their volume is very unpredictable with the biggest revenues coming from transfers.

Williams reminded the board members of how just a few years ago they dreaded to hear about the emergency service because it was usually bad news. Hearing that they are doing so well is refreshing, he said.

Miller also announced to board members that Dr. Michael Carbuto, M.D., D.O., is leaving private practice and will change status from active staff to courtesy staff. She said Carbuto plans to pursue a career in psychiatry. The ideal situation would be if someone could move into his practice soon so he could work with the new doctor in getting started with his patients, she said.

She said four physicians have expressed an interest in relocating here, including one that visited last

week. Miller will keep the board posted on the progress of finding someone to fill the hole.

Along with approving Carbuto's change to courtesy staff, the board also agreed to a change for Dr. Don Wolfel from consulting to active staff. The board also recredentialled 27 doctors and staff members in a two-year mandatory approval. Miller said they will have another large group to approve next month too under the two-year category.

Officers for the medical staff for 1993 have also been nominated but won't be voted on until the next medical staff meeting. Chief-of-staff will be Dr. Gary Jackson and Dr. Wardlaw will be vice-chief. Dr. James Wardlaw was nominated for secretary and Dr. Arlene Brown as member-at-large.

In other business Miller updated the group on the contract with the Radiology Association of Albuquerque. She said they have a draft of the contract prepared, and it has

been reviewed by both parties. She does have a few questions on it but should be able to work those out through the attorneys.

Miller also made the board members aware of a PHS sexual harassment policy because of the increasing number of suits nationwide related to harassment. She has informed the staff of it and will be meeting with department managers about it too.

She reported that the LCMC auxiliary is still selling its spring bulbs and has also begun selling its cookbook at the Thrift Shop. Auxiliary members worked 2,177 hours in September, and four new members joined the group. The group received a letter from Senator Pefe Campos in appreciation of the work it does. He said the organization is making a difference in the community.

The next board of trustees meeting will be November 19 at the hospital conference room.

Jack Frost Arrives in the Vale

This is being sent to you just at high noon on October 14. Just outside the sun room, half the leaves of the small apricot have turned sunlight yellow, with the rest turned half way between gold and green and, some pure green.

Out under the cedar tree and all around the yard the snowbirds are flying in and out, flashing their white tail feathers as feed and drink at the drinking rocks, singing their little chirping songs of a approaching Indian Summer.

This is the largest band of snow birds to arrive in the vale this early in the fall, arriving to cheer me during my birthday month.

The leaves on the bushes of the wild rose in the yard have turned very light gold and pink, reminding you of their flower colors back in May.

South of the house the blue bird meadow is



touched with light gold, light crimson and pink — with the large apricot tree all shining gold with only a few green leaves left. Beyond the American flag, away to the south, the oak brush is light orange among the evergreens. Down by the riverside you see the rounded form of an oak tree out in pure light gold.

All these colors have been brought in by Jack Frost just this morning. This is just his first painting here, as he moves down the Valley.

Bands of clouds are floating overhead in a blue sky, casting the valley below into a pageant of autumn leaf and meadow colors of moving sunshine and shadow.

Early Indian Summer

Now here are with a message to you just at high noon on October 15, the next day, with Jack Frost's coloring just a little brighter. The small apricot tree, with its branches reaching around one entire corner of the sun room like leafy arms in a fond embrace, sends in golden light reflected upon its leaves by the sun. Very little green is now left on these leaves, which are larger this year than in any year in the past.

And here is something that could explain why the leaf pageants in the valleys are brighter than in any year I can remember. This is the year of the leaf, with leaves larger and more numerous than in any time in

memory — maybe because of the unusually heavy spring rain, just at the time the trees were beginning to leaf out.

Here in the Vale it is still early fall, while just the way beginning at the upper end of "The arrows" we have early Indian Summer.

Indian Summer is the time after the first hard frost when the world moves into a little season within a season of sunny days, with the leaves of the last trees to turn color are at their brightest, the mountains in a dreamy purple haze, and the world in happy dreamy lull of peace and serenity.

I keep telling you about that spot just at the upper end of the "narrows," there on that steep high hillside where the mountain comes right down to the river, and you get the closest view of the mountain side of anywhere in the valley.

This year the leaf colors are a spectacle to behold, with the picture now changing rapidly from day to day.

The oak brush, some clumps unusually tall is a solid pattern all along the mountain wall with a hardly any trees, so that the brush can put on a show mostly all its own. With the sun just right — about eleven o'clock — the colors are at their rest, all shades of orange blending into scarlet and ruby crimson, and lavender and purple, with touches of pink.

Down along the bordering cliffs to one side near the bottom of the hill there is a kind of oak, halfway between the largest oak brush and the river oaks — that you might call cliffs oaks. These are out in solid color — all in a row — along the cliff out in pure gold. Near the river at the very bottom of the hill here we have the river oaks in solid orange gold and pumpkin yellow.

Let us thank God for early Indian Summer and all our other many blessings.







Roe answered the call once again and made another first to end the half. Although they didn't score during the game, the Warriors proved they could move the ball against one of the toughest competitors in the state.



Inside The Outdoors

Oh give me a home, where the elk can roam

The hunter freezes as he hears the long, drawn out whistle followed by the deep grunts of a big bull elk.

He looks around to find a good hiding place. He locates a good spot with a clear field of view and crouches down. He puts a call to his mouth and sends out a shrill challenge to the big bull.

He waits breathlessly until the call is answered. After a few minutes he sends out another challenge which is also answered by the big bull, but this time the elk sounds a lot closer.

The hunter readies his rifle and anxiously scans the tree line and meadow. As the elk moves closer he can hear the brush snapping and then a ripping sound as the bull tears up a young sapling with his antlers.


The hunter's heart is pounding and his breath is hard to catch. This is the thrill of a lifetime, a big bull elk coming into the call. Maybe this year the elk will be his.

There are a lot of folks out there having a dream like this with the fall rifle hunts for elk approaching. Some will even experience the real thing as hunters head for the rugged mountains of New Mexico after the monarch of the woods.

Fortunately, folks have the opportunity to go through this experience in our state, at one time it was very doubtful.

In 1874 trapper and guide J.A. Allen reported that a Mr. Mechem had seen elk in New Mexico as far south as the border with Mexico. He also spoke of having met with herds of elk numbering as many as 2,000 animals in southern New Mexico.

The abundance was short-lived. Even though elk were given protection six years



later by the territorial legislature, hunting was only allowed from September 1 through April 30 instead of year-round, elk numbers continued to decline.

A combination of market hunting, subsistence hunting, competition with domestic livestock and an influx of people led to the demise of elk in New Mexico in 1909.

Fortunately, efforts began almost immediately to restore elk in New Mexico. In 1910 and 1911, the Bartlett Ranch (now Vermejo Park) bought 15 elk and placed them in a game park.

The State of New Mexico started restocking elk in 1911 with the purchase of 12 elk from Colorado. Four of the animals, one bull and three cows, were relocated in each of three different areas of northern New Mexico.

After this initial effort, many elk were transplanted over the years to extend their range and numbers in our state. The last transplant was done in 1967.

These efforts have paid off for the state and the people of New Mexico. We now have elk roaming in areas that weren't historically known to have elk. Estimates show that we have about 35,000 elk in our state, but the fight isn't over yet.

It seems that we have two different points of view on the elk situation.

Of course, we have the hunters who wish to see more and more elk roaming the state. There are organizations such as the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, a hunting organization that is raising big dollars to set aside large tracts of land and fund habitat improvement projects all over the western states to benefit elk.

On the other hand, there are some people claiming that we have too many elk. We receive complaints from folks that elk are invading alfalfa fields and eating from hay stacks which is definitely true. Some ranchers are also complaining that elk are eating too much graze on our public lands. These folks would like to see elk numbers reduced in the state.

That's the position faced by the Department of Game and Fish right now.

It is our job to try and develop a management scheme so that both sides are satisfied. A balance between hunters and landowners on the elk question is no easy task, but hopefully both sides can be brought together for the benefit of the resource.

Fortunately though, elk are back in New Mexico and it is hoped to stay. This is good news for the person who wishes to experience the thrill of hunting for and bagging a big bull elk because they have the opportunity in New Mexico.

Even more important, there are now elk roaming areas where they disappeared at the turn of the century, not only for the hunter, but for the camera buff or the person that just wants the thrill of hearing the call of the majestic bull elk.

Ruidoso twins inseparable at ENMU

Imagine walking down the street in a crowd of people, hundreds of faces passing by, and suddenly you see a person who looks exactly like you.

Scary thought. But for Ginger and Misty Parker, elementary education majors at Eastern New Mexico University, it has been a reality for 22 years.



Three cheers for Ruidoso Municipal Clerk Tammie Maddox!

It's not easy telling your boss when he's been doing something wrong, but Maddox spoke out when she learned that the mayor's little kitchen meetings preceding regular council meetings might not comply totally with the Open Meetings Act. Maddox, after attending the Attorney General's workshop on open meetings, told the mayor those informal pre-meeting get-togethers should be changed to comply with the spirit and substance of open meetings.

Thanks to Maddox, those study sessions will now be conducted in council chambers where the public can comfortably attend, and she's going to take minutes as a permanent record.

As a certified municipal clerk, Maddox is trained in the rules and orders of conducting official open meetings, but as an appointed official she serves at the pleasure of the mayor. It's a tough position to be in, but Maddox takes her responsibilities seriously enough to speak out when she knows she's right even when the mayor might disagree.

Maddox, with her extensive training through the Municipal League, could help the mayor conduct Village Council meetings in a more businesslike and efficient manner if he would just let her.

Thanks, Tammie! It's good to have a municipal clerk with the right stuff to ensure that the business of the village is conducted in the open.

Upon Reflection

Where's the Grand Old Party this year?

It is unprecedented in recent memory. So look closely at your general election ballot when you go to the polls some three weeks hence. What you find is apt to startle you. It might also, quite understandably, alarm those who think of elections as exercises in democracy allowing voters to choose between competing candidates for important public office.

Simply put, our choices are severely limited this year.

Altogether 137 separate state offices of considerable power will be filled at the November election. They include all 112 seats in the legislature, numerous judicial and district attorneys' positions, a slot on the state corporation commission, as well as five state board of education members.


Incredibly, however, in well over one-half of those cases (77 out of the total 137) the election is over — settled at the June primary when either the Democrats or the Republicans neglected to field candidates to carry their banners into the fall election.

by far the greatest abdication of responsibility in this respect is to be found on the Republican ballot. It is nothing short of shocking. Consider this partial breakdown:

—Roughly one-half of all state house seats will go to Democrats for lack of Republican opposition.

—One-third of the state senate is being uncontested by the GOP.

—Five out of six state district judgeships are without Republican nominees, as are nine of this year's 14 state district attorney's races. We are holding an election the state GOP

seems barely interested in attending! According to state Bureau of Elections chief Hoyt Clifton, "We would have to go back at least 20 years to the early '70s to find anything like it."

Privately many GOP stalwarts blame party leaders for the paucity of candidates this year. Some contend the party's conservative leadership is more interested in maintaining control of the state organization than in supporting the kind of moderate candidates it would take to win many of these uncontested elections.

Others complain that the party has devoted too much time and effort to the re-election of an unpopular George Bush and too little on the nuts and bolts of strengthening Republican fortunes here in New Mexico.

Top party honchos in the state hotly reject these charges. Former GOP Governor Garrey Carruthers says he personally attempted to persuade qualified candidates to run in legislative races this year, but to no avail.

"A critical news media have diminished people's desire to hold public office," Carruthers argues, and many potential candi-

dates "were simply unwilling to make the sacrifice and put up with the abuse."

State GOP director Tim Wigley further contends that the financial costs of public service, notably legislative service, make "it very difficult to get small business people and others to walk away from their sources of livelihood for 30 or 670 days a year, not to mention interim committee work, only to be frustrated and criticized."

Carruthers and Wigley have a point. New Mexico's news media have become more aggressive in scrutinizing public officials — especially members of the legislature — in recent years.

Moreover, public service can involve financial sacrifice, particularly in the legislature where expenses far exceed a lawmaker's per diem compensation. (New Mexico voters can and should remedy that problem in November by approving a proposed constitutional commission to set legislators' compensation without a direct vote by the public as is presently required.)

What cannot be denied, however, is that with few exceptions New Mexico Democrats somehow found a way around these impediments and managed to field a nearly full slate of candidates for this year's elections.

Nor can it be denied that the state Republican party, by abandoning so many major electoral contests, has simultaneously diminished the choices we will have on November 3, and dashed any hopes it might have had to play a major role in defining this state's public policy agenda for the immediate future.

New Mexico Perspective

Isn't living in the land of enchantment enough?

What a relief!

In the September 19th Albuquerque Journal, Governor's spokesman John McKean, U.S. Senator Pete Domenici, former Governor Garrey Carruthers and other authorities assured us that all those grim statistics about New Mexico aren't serious.


"We love to bash ourselves with these figures," McKean explained patiently. "Without taking into account other factors."

You know what he's talking about. Nagging national studies keep saying we're worst or near-worst in the U.S. in little items like teachers' salaries and educational expenditures, illiteracy, prenatal care, an imbalanced economy and on and on. Picky critics are always citing the numbers.

Now, thanks to our leaders, we know the "other factors." McKean and Domenici pointed out shrewdly to the Journal that the poverty and education numbers are unreliable simply because we have so many schoolchildren, and kids are "heavy users" of resources (like books and lunch), while earning no money and paying no taxes.

"I'd say New Mexico would move up five or six notches if we just counted the wage earners," the Journal quote Senator Domenici.

But most important, say the experts, New Mexicans just don't mind being poor, don't

care that much about making an average of only \$14,000 a year or ranking 46th in the nation in per capita income. After all, one economist told the journal, we've got "psychic income" from living in such a wonderful place.

"We used to call it eating a lot of sunshine," said ex-Governor Carruthers.

This is clearly a creative new approach to public policy. Imagine the possibilities.

First, we could solve the unproductive schoolchildren statistical problem by (a) deporting them, (b) putting them to work, or (c) nipping it all in the bud with an efficient sterilization program.

But it's the fiscal prospects of "psychic income" that are really exciting. The next time corporations come to the Legislature for spe-

cial subsidies, we can give it to them in psychic funds. The 700-plus lobbyists that now swarm the state capitol can all get day jobs. It's good enough for ordinary folks, we'll cite the experts, it's good enough for the big boys.

In the best New Mexico tradition, our politicians can benefit from the same treasure. Senator Domenici can substitute psychic dollars for some of the million he usually raises in campaign contributions. Garrey Carruthers can collect psychic checks for his expected 1994 race for the statehouse. Governor Bruce King can pledge to forego any questionable windfall on that land swap with the BLM for high-priced development acreage outside Santa Fe, taking it all in psychic profits.

Eventually, of course, especially with the kids put in their place, you can take psychic script to the bank, the race tracks, Santa Fe's most expensive hotels, even to pay utility bills.

"Public Service Company Executives Take Psychic Bonuses," the headlines will read. "Refund millions to rate-payers and shareholders."

You must realize, of course, that there will always be those who carp about nasty numbers, bankrupt policies and failed, often ludicrous leaders. But some people will never understand New Mexico politics. I say, "Let 'em eat sunshine."
